No. 4 Texas is off to a 5-0 start for the second consecutive year heading into a four-game series against the Penn State Nittany Lions at UFCU Disch-Falk Field. Texas and Penn State have played six games, including three at the College World Series. UT owns a 4-2 edge in the all-time series.

QUALITY STARTS

Texas starting pitchers have worked at least six innings in all five games this season. The rotation has handed the ball to the bullpen with the Horns leading or the score tied in all five games. The starting pitchers own a 3-0 record with a 0.82 ERA, yielding only 12 hits and three runs over 33.0 innings. The rotation has issued just eight walks while striking out 24.

THE PENN STATE SERIES

Texas owns a 4-2 edge in the all-time series against Penn State. The teams have met at the College World Series on three occasions with the Nittany Lions winning in 1952 (5-3) and 1957 (4-1) and the Longhorns posting a 6-4 win in 1963. The other three meetings came in Austin, where Texas won a regular season game, 4-1, in 1994 and swept a best-of-three Super Regional in 2000. Texas is 101-31 all-time against Big 10 schools, including 5-4 vs. Illinois, 2-0 vs. Iowa, 6-3 vs. Michigan, 65-21 vs. Minnesota, 6-0 vs. Northwestern, 9-1 vs. Ohio State, 3-0 vs. Purdue and 1-0 vs. Wisconsin.

RUFFIN EARNS NCBWA PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA HONOR

Sophomore RHP **CHANCE RUFFIN** was named to the 2009 National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association Pro-Line Athletics Preseason All-America Team. He was tabbed a third-team starting pitcher.

Ruffin was arguably the best freshman starting pitcher in the nation in 2008. In 10 starts, he went 7-0 with a 1.56 ERA, while striking out 60 over 57.2 innings. Ruffin was named the Big 12 Conference Freshman Pitcher of the Year, posting an 8-3 record with a 1.96 ERA and 82 strikeouts in 78 innings. He held opponents to a .191 batting average for the season.

The northpaw was one of just two freshmen nationally to earn All-America honors from Baseball America in 2008. Ruffin was also named to the Louisville Slugger's Freshman All-American Team by Collegiate Baseball and the Pro-Line Athletics Freshman All-American Team by the NCBWA.

Ruffin was one of just three Big 12 players to be named to one of the three All-America teams, joining second-team SP Tyler Lyons (Oklahoma State) and third-team OF Aaron Senne (Missouri).

FOUR NAMED TO WALLACE WATCH LIST

BRANDON BELT, **CHANCE RUFFIN**, **CAMERON RUPP** and **BRANDON WORKMAN** were among the athletes named to the initial 2009 Brooks Wallace National Player of the Year Award Watch List by the College Baseball Foundation.

Belt earned All-Big 12 honorable mention as a first baseman last season and picked up Big 12 Championship Most Outstanding Player accolades. He hit .319 with 41 runs, 20 doubles, two triples, six home runs and a team-high 65 RBI on the season. He also developed into one of the best defensive first basemen in the Big 12 Conference.

Ruffin earned third-team All-America honors from Baseball America as a freshman in 2008. He was arguably the best freshman starting pitcher in the nation in 2008. In 10 starts, he went 7-0 with a 1.56 ERA, while striking out 60 over 57.2 innings. Ruffin was named the Big 12 Conference Freshman Pitcher of the Year, posting an 8-3 record with a 1.96 ERA and 82 strikeouts in 78 innings. He held opponents to a .191 batting average for the season.

Rupp was a Freshman All-America catcher in 2008, hitting .309 with 17 doubles, two triples, four home runs and 32 RBI. He also earned All-Big 12 honorable mention.

Workman posted a 5-2 record with one save and 49 strikeouts in 53.1 innings as a freshman in 2008. He also enjoyed a stellar summer in the prestigious Cape Cod Baseball League.

TWO FRESHMAN ALL-AMERICANS RETURN

The Longhorns return a pair of Freshman All-Americans, including RHP **CHANCE RUFFIN** and C **CAMERON RUPP**. The duo were both members of the 2008 Louisville Slugger's Freshman All-American Team named by Collegiate Baseball. Ruffin was named a first-team starting pitcher and Rupp was the second-team catcher on the Pro-Line Athletic National Collegiate Baseball Writers Freshman All-American Team.

Ruffin posted an 8-3 record with a 1.96 ERA, three saves and 82 strikeouts in 78.0 innings as a rookie. He stifled opposing hitters, limiting them to a .191 batting average. Rupp hit .309 with 17 doubles, two triples, four home runs and 32 RBI in 54 games.

HORNS TABBED FOURTH IN BASEBALL AMERICA POLL

The University of Texas landed in the fourth spot on the Baseball America 2009 pre-season rankings.

The Longhorns return four of their top five hitters from 2008, including **RUSSELL MOLDENHAUER** (.355), **MICHAEL TORRES** (.354), **BRANDON BELT** (.319) and **CAMERON RUPP** (.309).

Texas also returns starting pitchers **CHANCE RUFFIN** and **AUSTIN WOOD**. Ruffin was the Big 12 Conference Rookie of the Year last season with an 8-3 mark and 1.96 ERA. He was also named a third-team All-American by Baseball America. Wood went 7-3 last season with a 4.43 ERA.

Texas A&M earned the top spot followed by Louisiana State, North Carolina and Texas. Cal State Fullerton was ranked fifth, followed by Mississippi, Rice, Baylor and UC Irvine.

2008 MLB FIRST-YEAR PLAYER DRAFT

Four members of the Longhorns baseball squad were selected in last June's Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. Freshman RHP **TAYLOR JUNGSMANN** headlines the group as a 24th-round selection by the Los Angeles Angels. Freshman IF **BRANDON LOY** was picked by the Baltimore Orioles in the 32nd round. Freshman LHP **SAM STAFFORD** was a 40th-round choice for the Boston Red Sox and junior **RILEY BOENING** was picked in the 42nd round by the Minnesota Twins.

LONGHORNS PICKED SECOND IN LEAGUE POLL

The Texas Longhorns were ranked second in the Big 12 Conference in the league's coaches' poll. It marked the first time in the last eight years that the Longhorns were not named the league favorite.

Texas A&M, the defending Big 12 regular-season champion, was tabbed the league favorite to win the 2009 title. The Aggies (81 points) received nine of the possible 10 first-place votes to edge out reigning postseason champion Texas, which earned 69 points. Baylor and Oklahoma State were tied for third followed by Missouri, Oklahoma and Nebraska. Texas Tech, Kansas State and Kansas filled the remaining spots in the poll.

WOOD BACK IN FIREMAN ROLL

After spending the last two seasons as a starting pitcher, senior LHP **AUSTIN WOOD** is returning to the closer roll he assumed as freshman. Last season, Wood went 7-3 with a 4.43 ERA in 85.1 innings, making 17 appearances, including 14 starts. As a freshman, the southpaw posted a 4-3 record with seven saves and a 3.15 ERA. For his career, Wood owns a 21-7 record with nine saves. This season, Wood has racked up a 2-0 mark and one save in three appearances. He owns a 1.35 ERA allowing one run on three hits and one walk while striking out three over 6.2 innings.

TWO OF A KIND

AUGIE GARRIDO is one of only two head coaches to ever amass 500 or more wins at two separate Division I schools. Garrido logged 928 wins as head coach at Cal State Fullerton and owns 522 wins as the Longhorns head coach. Jim Morris of Miami [Fla.] entered the season with 695 victories with the Hurricanes and registered 504 wins at Georgia Tech.

YOUNG GUNS

The Longhorns' early season five-pitcher starting rotation is slated to include three sophomores and two freshmen. Spearheaded by 2008 Big 12 Conference Rookie of the Year RHP **CHANCE RUFFIN**, the weekend rotation to start the season will also include freshman RHP **TAYLOR JUNGSMANN** and sophomores RHP **COLE GREEN** and RHP **BRANDON WORKMAN**. Freshman RHP **AUSTIN DICHARRY** is expected to start during the week. Ruffin posted an 8-3 record with a 1.96 ERA to earn Baseball America All-America honors in 2008. Green was 3-7 with three saves and a 5.28 ERA while Workman went 5-2 with one save and a 5.06 ERA as freshmen.

POSITION CHANGES

A pair of Longhorns are making position changes for 2009. **TANT SHEPHERD** is moving from third base to the outfield while **MICHAEL TORRES** who spent most of 2008 as a second baseman and designated hitter is slotted to play third base. Shepherd hit .357 with four doubles, two home runs and 18 RBI in 27 games, including 13 starts. Torres batted .354 with 12 doubles, three triples, four home runs, 46 RBI and 16 stolen bases.

LONGHORNS NAMED TOP PROGRAM SINCE 1999

Prior to the start of the 2007 season, *Baseball America* named The University of Texas the top collegiate baseball program since 1999, the season the NCAA expanded the tournament field to 64 and instituted the change in rules governing the performance of aluminum bats.

In the survey, Texas earned 321 points to edge out Miami (319) and Stanford (314). Cal State Fullerton (306) and Rice (303) rounded out the top five.

Baseball America awarded points for winning percentage, Regional appearances, Super Regional appearances, College World Series appearances, CWS titles, tradition, All-Americans, players drafted in the top 10 rounds of the MLB first-year player draft and Major League alumni to play during the period.

During the eight-year period, Texas is tied for the lead for most CWS titles (2), CWS appearances (5) and ranks fifth in All-Americans (11) and sixth in most players picked in the first 10 rounds of the MLB first-year player draft (25).

TAKING ONE FOR THE TEAM

Second baseman **TRAVIS TUCKER** has been hit by a pitch three times this season and currently fourth on the Longhorns' career hit-by-pitch list with 32. He currently trails only Jeff Ontiveros (74 - 1999-2002), Nick Peoples (34 - 2004-07) and Matt Rosenberg (33 - 1998-2002). Last season, Tucker was hit by a pitch on 16 occasions, which ranked seventh on the Longhorns' single-season list.

Catcher **PRESTON CLARK** ranks 10th on the career list with 20. He was plunked 12 times in 2008.

QUICK DRAW

Texas is outscoring its opponents 13-1 in the first two innings and have scored more than half of its 24 runs in the first two frames. Longhorns hitters are batting .545 (12-of-22) in the first inning with seven runs and six RBI. They are also hitting .400 (6-of-15) with a .520 on-base percentage in the second inning to account for six runs. The UT pitching has been equally impressive in the first two innings. Texas has yet to yield a hit and have allowed just two baserunners in the first inning and are holding opponents to a .118 batting average and a 1.80 ERA in the second inning.

DIFFERENT BRAND OF BASEBALL

After putting on a power display the last two years with a school record 69 home runs in 2007 and 60 dingers in 2008, the Longhorns returned to small ball with 10 sacrifice bunts in the first five games. Freshman **BRANDON LOY** has led the way with four sacrifice bunts. In 2007, the Longhorns had 69 home runs and 76 sacrifice bunts in 63 games. In 2008, the Longhorns logged 60 home runs and 64 sacrifice bunts in 61 games. This season, the Texas has two home runs and 10 sacrifice bunts in five games.

SETTING THE TABLE

Longhorn hitters leading off an inning have reached base 18 times in 400 frames (.450). Spearheading the assault is **TRAVIS TUCKER** who has reached base nine times in the 13 innings he has lead off. In fact, he has reached base to start four of the five games for the Longhorns in 2009.

LONGHORNS STARTING ROTATION

Texas starting pitchers have worked at least six innings in all five games this season. The rotation has handed the ball to the bullpen with the Horns leading or the score tied in all five games. The starting pitchers own a 3-0 record with a 0.82 ERA, yielding only 12 hits and three runs over 33.0 innings of work. The rotation has issued just eight walks while striking out 24.

LONGHORNS BULLPEN

The Texas bullpen is 2-0 with one save on the season. The Horns' relievers have allowed just three runs on eight hits and four walks while striking out eight over 11.0 innings. Senior **AUSTIN WOOD** leads the way with a 2-0 record with one save and a 1.35 ERA. **AUSTIN DICHARRY**, **ANDREW McKIRAHAN** and **STAYTON THOMAS** have each worked one scoreless inning.

UP NEXT...
