Four-year letterwinner and three-year stater who was one of the top scoring wing players in school history ... finished his career ranked eighth on the UT career scoring list (1,582 points) ... tied for third on the school's career games played list, as he saw action in 133 of a possible 134 games ... ranks fourth on the UT career three-point field goal percentage chart (.389) and fifth on the school's career three-pointers made list (198) ... upped his level of play in UT's run to the 2003 Final Four, averaging a team-best 17.8 ppg while hitting 11-of-26 (.423) three-pointers ... named to the 2003 NCAA South Regional All-Tournament team ... earned one of 12 spots on the 2003 USA Basketball Pan American Games Team during the summer prior to his senior campaign ... started all five games for Team USA and ranked second on the team in rebounding (4.2 rpg), third in minutes (24.4 mpg) and sixth in scoring (7.2 ppg) while helping the Americans to a fourth-place showing ... co-team MVP as a junior and senior ... led the Longhorns in scoring as a sophomore and as a senior and ranked second in his junior season.

As a Senior in 2003-04: First-team All-Big 12 choice (media) ... second-team All-Big 12 pick (coaches) ... first-team NABC All-District 9 selection ... one of 10 players named to the USBWA All-District 7 team (includes Texas, Arkansas and Louisiana) ... earned the team's Jay Arnette Award, presented to a player for his selfless contributions to the team ... started all 32 games he played (missed the UT-Arlington game on Jan. 2 due to injury) ... led the team in scoring (13.9 ppg), double-digit scoring games (22) and 20-point performances (nine) ... the lone Longhorn to average double-digit scoring during Big 12 Conference play (12.9 ppg) ... led the squad in scoring in a team-best 11 games ... also led the team in minutes (30.0 mpg) ... started season averaging 15.1 ppg during the first six games ... recorded 20 points against Sam Houston State (Nov. 24) and Wofford (Dec. 4), connecting on 17-of-32 (.531) field goals and 5-of-11 (.455) from three-point range in those two games ... sat out the only game of his career against UT-Arlington (Jan. 2) with an injury, breaking strings of 109 consecutive games played and 75 consecutive games started ... returned to action with 20 points (6-of-14 FG) and seven boards at No. 25 Providence (Jan. 5) ... averaged 22.8 ppg while hitting 41-of-77 (.532) field goals and 14-of-31 (.452) three-pointers during a five-game stretch late in the regular season (Feb. 14 at Iowa State through

Feb. 28 vs. Texas Tech) ... recorded a career-best 29 points (14-of-23 FG, 4-of-9 threes) to go along with seven boards and three assists at Iowa State (Feb. 14) ... scored 20 points (8-of-13) against Texas A&M (Feb. 18) ... followed with 25 points (9-of-16 FG, 4-of-9 threes) at Oklahoma (Feb. 21) ... garnered his first career Big 12 Player of the Week honor (Feb. 23) for his performances against Texas A&M and Oklahoma, averaging 22.5 ppg over the two games ... registered 23 points (7-of-13 FG, 6-of-6 FT) against No. 20 Kansas (Feb. 23) ... added 17 points against Texas Tech (Feb. 28) ... one of five players named to the Big 12 All-Tournament team, averaging 13.3 ppg and 4.3 rpg in the three contests ... tied for the team lead with 16 points and added six boards in the quarterfinal win against Oklahoma (March 12) ... converted a three-point play with 26 seconds left to give Texas a one-point lead, before sealing the win against the Sooners by hitting two free throws with five seconds remaining ... posted a game-high 18 points (3-of-6 threes) in the semifinal victory against No. 18 Kansas (March 13) ... scored 10 consecutive points over a three-minute span in the second half against the Jayhawks to turn a two-point advantage into an eight-point lead by the 4:41 mark ... averaged a team-high 18.7 ppg while hitting 21-of-42 (.500) field goals and 8-of-12 (.667) three-pointers in UT's three NCAA Tournament contests ... posted a game-high 23 points (18 in the second half) while hitting 5-of-6 threes in the NCAA First Round win against Princeton (March 18) ... registered a team-high 21 points (9-of-15 FG, 2-of-4 threes) and seven boards in the NCAA "Sweet 16" contest against Xavier (March 26).

As a Junior in 2002-03: Second-team NABC All-District 9 selection ... third-team All-Big 12 choice (by league's coaches) ... honorable mention All-Big 12 pick (by league's media) ... shared the team's MVP award with T.J. Ford ... also named the team's Most Improved Player ... one of the most underrated players in the Big 12 Conference ... smooth swingman who has elevated all phases of his game during his junior season ... started all 33 games ... second on the team in scoring (14.8 ppg), minutes (30.1 mpg), assists (57), 3-point FG percentage (.413) and steals (33) ... his 3-point FG percentage ranked sixth on the school's single-season list ... fourth on the squad in rebounding (4.2 rpg) ... reached double figures in scoring in a team-high 28 games ... tied for the team lead with seven 20-point showings ... led

(head coach Danny Broussard) ... three-time first-team Class 4A all-state selection ... three-time All-Acadiana County and all-parish choice ... nominated for a spot on the McDonald's High School All-America team ... averaged 24 points, eight rebounds and 2.5 blocks per game during his senior season ... led his team to a 32-5 overall record and the Class 4A quarterfinals as a senior ... ranked as the 32nd-best high school prospect in the nation by *Bob Gibbons' All-Star Report* heading into his senior year ... averaged 21.1 points and 9.8 rebounds per game as a junior, leading his team to a runner-up finish in the Class 4A state tournament ... played on the New Orleans Jazz AAU team in the summer before his senior year ... scored 33 points to lead his AAU team to the title at the adidas Big Time Tournament in Las Vegas.
