



# Texas and The AP Poll



The storied history of Texas football has led to a number of impressive finishes in the national polls. In addition to National Championships in 1963 (AP, UPI), 1969 (AP, UPI), 1970 (UPI) and 2005 (AP, BCS), the Longhorns have finished second in the country twice (1950, UPI/1981, AP). In all, Texas has finished the season nationally ranked by The Associated Press 44 of 73 times. UT has completed the season ranked in the AP Top 10 on 26 occasions. During one impressive 12-year stretch (1959-70), the Longhorns finished the season ranked in the Top Five eight times.

## ALL-TIME FINAL AP POLL

The AP Poll began in 1936. From 1936-61, the wire service ranked 20 teams. From 1962-67, only the top 10 teams were recognized. From 1968-88, The AP again resumed its Top 20 before expanding to 25 teams in 1989. Points were awarded based on a team's finish in the final AP poll each year. Points were awarded on a 20-19-18-17-16-15-14-13-12-11-10-9-8-7-6-5-4-3-2-1 basis from 1936-88 and a 25-24-23-22-21-20-19-18-17-16-15-14-13-12-11-10-9-8-7-6-5-4-3-2-1 basis from 1989-current.

# Texas at No. 1 in The AP Poll



Texas has spent its share of time at the top of The Associated Press Poll. The Longhorns have reached the top spot 14 different times for a total of 45 weeks. UT's longest stint at the top of The AP Poll was nine weeks in 1963. That stay at the top of the poll began on Oct. 15, following a 28-7 win against No. 1 Oklahoma, which upped UT's record to 4-0. The Longhorns remained in the top spot for the rest of the season. Texas was ranked No. 4 by AP prior to the 1964 season, but after a season opening 31-0 win against Tulane, the Longhorns vaulted to the top spot, a position they held for three weeks until a 14-13 loss to No. 8 Arkansas dropped them to 4-1.
