This is Texas Volleyball...



Entering the 2011 season, the Longhorns had appeared in the Top 10 of the AVCA poll for 71 of the last 75 weeks. Texas has been ranked in the AVCA Top 25 for 110 consecutive weeks, dating back to 2004.



Texas is the eighth winningest program in the history of NCAA Volleyball with its 1022-352-14 (.741) record in 37 seasons.



The Longhorns have won 17 conference championships, including four Big 12 titles and 13 Southwest Conference Championships.



UT owns a 51-26 record against ranked opponents over the last seven seasons (2004-10) and boasts a 26-5 mark against ranked opponents at Gregory Gymnasium during that span. (Last home loss to ranked opponent: Sept. 3, 2011, Illinois)



Texas ranks sixth all-time with 58 NCAA Tournament victories and sports the eighth-best NCAA winning percentage with a 62-26 mark (.705). The Longhorns have appeared in 27 NCAA Tournaments, a mark which ranks seventh all-time. Beginning in 1982 - the team's first NCAA Tournament - Texas advanced to 18 straight tournaments (1982-2000).



In its 36 years of volleyball, Texas has produced 32 All-Americans who have claimed a total of 80 All-America awards.



Texas is one of just two schools that have advanced to the NCAA Regional finals in each of the last five NCAA Championships [2006-10] (Penn State). Texas and Penn State are also the only two schools to qualify for the last three NCAA Semifinals [2008-10].



UT is one of five teams that has reached the NCAA round of 16 six times in the last seven seasons. Joining the Horns in this group are Florida, Nebraska, Penn State and Stanford .



The Longhorns are one of just three teams located east of California to win an NCAA Championship (1988), joining Nebraska (1995, 2000, 2006) and Penn State (1999, 2007-10).



Head coach Jerritt Elliott has landed a top-five ranked recruiting class in each of the last six seasons. Elliott brought in the nation's No.1-ranked recruiting class in 2011, its second-ranked recruiting class in 2006, 2007 and 2008, while adding the nation's No. 5 class in 2009 and 2010.



UT has ranked in the top 11 nationally in attendance average in each of the last five seasons (6th in 2009, 7th in 2011, 9th in 2006-07 and 11th in 2008).



Texas entered the 2011 season riding a 15-match home winning streak that dated back to Sept. 4, 2010. In 2010, The Horns capped a 25-match home winning streak (Nov. 1, 2008-Sept. 3, 2011) that ranks as the second-longest in UT history.



Dating back to the 1974 season, Texas has won 81.7 percent of its matches in Austin, sporting an overall record of 457-102-1. The Horns are even more successful in Gregory Gymnasium, boasting a winning percentage of .843 (264-49).



Head coach Jerritt Elliott is just one of five coaches all-time to lead two different programs to the NCAA Semifinals. Elliott has accomplished the feat three times at Texas (2008-10) and once as the interim head coach at USC (2000).



The Longhorns have made seven NCAA Championship, 16 NCAA Regional final and 23 NCAA Regional semifinal appearances in program history. Texas is a perfect 23-0 in NCAA Tournament First Round play.

CREDENTIALS

Media credentials and parking permits for UT volleyball matches can be obtained by contacting Spencer Kitley at (512) 232-9438. Credentials may be picked up in Bellmont Hall 327 on the day of the match. Credentials that are not picked up will be left at the player and media will call table at the entrance to Gregory Gym one hour before the time of the match.

PARKING

Gregory Gymnasium is located at the corner of Speedway and 21st St. The main entrance and media will call entrance is located at the Speedway entrance. Media parking is limited and will be issued on a per-match basis.

PRESS SERVICES

Three telephone lines and several high-speed Internet lines via wired and wireless are available on press row for each match. Radio lines will be installed only upon special request. **Radio lines must be requested at least one week prior to the desired match.**

INTERVIEWS

All athlete and coach interviews must be arranged through the media relations office by calling or e-mailing Spencer Kitley **at least 24 hours** in advance. The Media Relations Office will arrange an interview time that is mutually convenient for both the player and the media representative. Players' home and cell phone numbers will not be given out. Generally, players are also available for interviews one-half hour before practice (typically between 1:00 p.m. and 4:30 p.m. daily) in Gregory Gym.

When Jerritt Elliott was hired as the seventh head coach in Texas Volleyball history in the spring of 2001, he was charged with returning the Longhorns back to national prominence. Ten seasons later, Elliott has accomplished that — and more.

Elliott, who holds a 291-82 career record in 12 seasons as a collegiate head coach and a 241-70 mark in 10 years at Texas, has brought enthusiasm, experience and growing success to UT. That has translated to Top 10 rankings the past five seasons, five consecutive trips to the NCAA Regional finals, three-straight NCAA Championship appearances and capacity crowds at Gregory Gymnasium, the home of Texas Volleyball.

Elliott's 2010 team overcame five season-ending injuries and lineup carousels to play its way to its third consecutive NCAA Semifinal appearance. En route to a 27-6 record, Elliott's management skills earned him co-Big 12 Coach of the Year honors for the third time and his third AVCA Central Region Coach of the Year award. At season's end the Horns were ranked fourth in both national polls and they finished second in the Big 12 standings. Elliott once again coached a pair of players to All-America status with Juliann Faucette and Rachael Adams each collecting AVCA and *Volleyball Magazine* All-America First Team honors.

In 2009, Elliott's Longhorns garnered their greatest success during his tenure at UT, advancing to the NCAA Championship match for the first time since 1995. Texas played one of the sport's all-time greatest championship matches as it fell to two-time defending champion Penn State in five sets. The Horns posted a 29-2 record on the season and claimed their third-straight Big 12 title and first outright championship since 1997. Texas concluded the season ranked No. 2 nationally in both polls, while Destinee Hooker and Ashley Engle garnered All-America First Team honors and Faucette landed on the third team. Hooker was named *Volleyball Magazine* Co-National Player of the Year and Big 12 Player of the Year in 2009 and all three players garnered All-Big 12 and AVCA All-Region lauds.

The 2008 squad returned the Longhorns to the forefront of the national volleyball scene, advancing to the NCAA Semifinals for the first time since 1995. The Longhorns posted a 29-4 record on the year and earned their second straight share of the Big 12 title, while concluding the season ranked No. 4 nationally. The trio of Engle, Hooker and Lauren Paolini garnered All-America First Team honors, marking the most first-team honorees in program history. Elliott coached four players to All-Big 12 accolades and helped setter Michelle Kocher garner UT's third straight Big 12 Freshman of the Year honor.

In 2008, Elliott added another honor when he was chosen to coach the USA Volleyball A2 Team at the USA Adult Open Volleyball Championships in Atlanta, Ga.

Elliott's 2007 squad earned UT's second straight trip to the NCAA Regional finals and claimed its first Big 12 Championship since 1997, sharing the title with Nebraska. Texas' 27-4 record in 2007 marked Elliott's fourth straight season with at least 24 victories.

Elliott garnered AVCA All-Central Region and Big 12 Coach of the Year honors in 2007 after leading Texas to a No. 6 ranking. In 2007, he coached four players - Faucette, Hooker, Michelle Moriarty and Paolini - to All-America honors, while mentoring six players to All-Big 12 accolades.

In 2006, a mix of veteran and freshman talent helped lead the Longhorns to

a 24-7 mark and UT's first trip to the NCAA Regional finals since 1998.

The 2006 squad boasted three returning All-Americans - Leticia Armstrong, Brandy Magee and Moriarty going into the season, but the Horns played the majority of the season with only Moriarty in the lineup. After losing two All-Americans to injury, a pair of sensational freshmen, Engle and Hooker, stepped up to earn All-America honors of their own and lead the Horns to a No. 7 ranking in the final AVCA Top 25 Poll.

Elliott has a keen eye for young talent and he has developed a reputation as one of the nation's best recruiters. All but one of his recruiting classes have been ranked nationally, and he has a total of five top-two recruiting classes (2003, 2006, 2007, 2008 and 2011 classes) on his Texas resume and seven overall, including his classes at USC (2000 and 2001). Elliott's 2011 class was his first top-ranked class at Texas after previously brining in four class that ranked second. His philosophy of recruiting "to win national championships" - not just filling perceived needs of a team - has proven successful, as his last two classes as the head coach at USC went on to win back-to-back national titles in 2002 and 2003.

At Texas, the groundwork for success was laid with his very first signing class in 2001 that included eventual All-Americans Mira Topic and Bethany Howden. The signing of the 2003 incoming class - Armstrong, Jenny Andrew, Magee and Jessica Curtis - solidified the team's depth two years later. Even without the addition of sophomore transfer Dariam Acevedo, the 2003 class was ranked second by *Volleyball Magazine* and helped lay the foundation for Texas' future successes.

A year later in 2004, Elliott and his staff added Moriarty, Jen Christian and Alyson Jennings. In 2005, height and physicality were added with the inclusion of the team's 6-5 middles, Paolini and RuthAnn Feist, and a back-row stalwart in Kiley Hall.

The addition of two more Top 10 prep players in 2006 and 2007 - including the player in the 2006 class whom pundits described as one of the most versatile in her age group, Engle. Texas Volleyball continued on its push toward a deep NCAA Championship run behind the powerful hitting of Engle and Hooker, as well as pair of Top three prep players - Faucette and Jennifer Doris. Texas added No. 3 national recruit Rachael Adams in 2008 and No. 1 national recruit Bailey Webster and No. 5 national recruit Sha'Dare McNeal in 2009 to bolster the already youthful Longhorns' roster. In 2011, Elliott added his best group of Longhorn recruits in No. 2 recruit Khat Bell, No. 5 recruit Haley Eckerman and No. 13 national recruit Madelyn Hutson.

Elliott's ability to develop blue-chip recruits is well documented. Since 2002, Elliott has developed nine student-athletes who have earned 21 AVCA All-America honors.

On a conference level, Texas has seen 10 players earn 30 All-Big 12 nods, including three or more in each of the last six seasons. Hooker and Topic were recognized as the Big 12 Player of the Year in 2009 and 2004, respectively. Engle added UT's first Big 12 Conference Freshman of the Year award in 2006, Faucette followed that feat in 2007, while Kocher completed the trifecta in 2008.

Elliott's peers have taken notice of his work in Austin, voting him the AVCA Central Region Coach of the Year in 2004 and 2007. He also earned Big 12 Coach of the Year honors in each of those seasons.

Additionally, Elliott earned Pac-10 Coach of the Year honors in 1999 and 2000 in his two years as the Women of Troy's head coach, as well as AVCA Pacific Region Coach of the Year accolades in 2000 after leading USC to its first volleyball final four appearance in 15 seasons and first-ever share of the Pac-10 Championship.

In 2004, the Longhorns posted a 26-5 record. The team concluded the regular season with a second-place Big 12 finish. In the postseason, the Longhorns played their way to the NCAA Regional semifinals before falling to eventual national champion Stanford. When the final polls came out, Texas earned a final ranking of No. 11, marking the program's best finish since the 1998 campaign.

Elliott earned American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) All-Central Region Coach of the Year honors, as well as being named Big 12 Coach of the Year. Two players - seniors Topic and Bethany Howden - earned first and second-team All-America honors, respectively, from the AVCA after both garnering first-team AVCA All-Central Region and first-team All-Big 12 accolades. Topic was also Texas' 14th conference player of the year - and the second as a member of the Big 12 Conference.

In 2003, beset by injuries and several off-court family emergencies that forced him to use 11 different lineups, Elliott guided the Horns to a 15-14 overall record and a 10-10 mark in Big 12 Conference matches. While many assumed Texas had written off its season with just three weeks left, Elliott led his team to a 4-1 mark down the stretch, including a season-ending 3-1 victory at home over No. 5 Kansas State. Topic and Howden earned honorable mention All-America honors after both garnering first-team AVCA All-Central Region and first-team All-Big 12 accolades.

Without a senior on the squad in 2002, Elliott led the Longhorns to their second NCAA appearance since his arrival and moved up to a fourth-place finish in the Big 12 Conference. He also developed his first All-American at Texas in Topic, when she was named an AVCA third-team All-American. In addition, Elliott guided 2000 All-Central Region honoree Kathy Hahn's return to the court after a redshirt season in 2001.

In his first season in 2001, Elliott guided the Longhorns to three wins over Top 25 opponents, including a come-from-behind 3-2 victory over then-No. 11 BYU in the team's second match of the season. He also was responsible for developing the nationally-recognized freshmen duo of Topic (Big 12 and AVCA Central Region Freshman of the Year) and Howden (Big 12 honorable mention), who both earned ASICS/Volleyball Magazine Freshman All-America honors.

Prior to his appointment as head coach at Texas in April of 2001, Elliott posted two remarkable seasons as the interim head coach at the University of Southern California. He compiled a record of 50-12 while leading the Women of Troy to their first NCAA Semifinals appearance in 15 years and first-ever share of the Pac-10 Conference title. In 2000, USC finished the season ranked No. 4 nationally by both the AVCA and Volleyball Magazine while going 29-3 en route to the NCAA Semifinals. Elliott was honored as Pac-10 Coach of the Year both seasons, as well as being named the 2000 Pacific Region Coach of the Year.

Under the leadership of Elliott, the Trojans featured two All-Americans in 2000 (April Ross and Jennifer Pahl) and six all-conference players, including the Pac-10 and Region Freshman of the Year (Ross). In both 2000 and 2001, Elliott's recruiting class was regarded as No. 1 in the nation, the school's first-ever No. 1 recruiting classes.

Prior to his two years as interim head coach, Elliott spent four years at USC as an assistant coach under head coach Lisa Love. As an assistant at USC, Elliott helped guide the Women of Troy to finish in the top 15 nationally all four years. He also was instrumental in developing two-time All-American middle blocker Jasmina Marinkovic (1995-98).

Elliott earned another honor when he was appointed head coach of the USA Junior National Team for the summer of 2001. But due to his appointment at Texas, Elliott had to relinquish the role with USA Volleyball. Elliott was an assistant coach on the 1998 U.S. Junior National Team, which won the NORCECA gold medal and qualified for the World Championships.

Additionally, he served as the director/head coach of the Westside Volleyball Club from 1992-95, where he led his 1994 squad to a fourth-place finish in the Nike Volleyball Festival. In 1992-93, Elliott assumed the role as head coach for the Forum Team Cup Volleyball.

He gained his first collegiate level coaching experience as an assistant with the Cal State Northridge men's volleyball program in 1993. That season the Matadors advanced to the NCAA Championship match before losing to UCLA.

Among his high school head coaching experiences, Elliott spent three years (1992-1994) at Marymount High in Westwood, Calif., where he guided his girls' squad to the league championship in 1993. He also spent one year (1991) at his alma mater, Palisades High, in Pacific Palisades, Calif., leading the girls team to a 16-3 record and the Los Angeles city title.

Elliott played collegiate volleyball at Pepperdine in 1986-88 and at Hawai'i during the 1989-90 season. The Pacific Palisades, Calif., native attended Palisades High, where he was high school teammates with 1996 U.S. Olympic beach volleyball gold medalist Kent Steffes. Elliott was an All-L.A. City second-team selection as he helped Palisades to a 36-0 record in his final season.

Born April 28, 1968, Elliott earned his bachelor's degree in kinesiology from Cal State Northridge in 1991. He is married to the former Sarah Silvernail, a two-time All-American at Washington State and former member of the U.S. National Volleyball Team. The couple has a daughter, Kahle (13), and two sons, Parker (6) and Mack (4).

The 2011 season marks Salima Rockwell's third on Jerritt Elliott's staff at Texas after joining the Longhorn family in January 2009. One of the nation's premier assistant coaches, Rockwell came to Austin after spending three seasons on the Penn State coaching staff.

Rockwell works with the team's setters and off the court, she serves as the Longhorns' recruiting coordinator.

During her second season on the Forty Acres, Rockwell's tutelage helped the Horns return to the NCAA Semifinals for the third straight year. She managed the 2010 setter stable of Hannah Allison and Michelle Kocher through injuries and a variety of lineups as they set UT to a .306 team hitting percentage that stood as the fourth-best in the NCAA.

In her first season at Texas, Rockwell helped guide UT to the NCAA Championship match for the first time since 1995, while helping the Horns to their third-straight Big 12 Championship. In 2009, she was charged with transitioning All-America opposite hitter Ashley Engle to the setter position and working with returner Kocher to bolster the Longhorns' offense. In her inaugural season, Rockwell's setters paced Texas to a .338 team hitting percentage, which ranked second nationally.

Rockwell spent the 2007 and 2008 seasons at Penn State as an assistant coach and helped the Nittany Lions to back-to-back NCAA titles. She also served as director of volleyball operations in 2006. Rockwell's primary duties included working with the setters and the offense, recruiting and match preparation.

Under the guidance of Rockwell, setter Alisha Glass directed the 2007 and 2008 Penn State offenses to nation-leading hitting percentages of .350 (2007) and .390 (2008). In Glass' three-year career, the Penn State offense hit at an astounding .352 hitting percentage.

Rockwell returned to Penn State after spending the 2005 season as an assistant coach at Oregon State under legendary head coach Terry Liskevych.

A native of Pittsburgh, Pa., Rockwell was an assistant at the University of Pittsburgh from 2001-03 where she worked primarily with the Panthers' setters. She also was the Panthers' lead recruiter and signed four of their top five recruits in 2002.

Rockwell captained the USA National Team in 1997 and 1998 and served as the starting setter for the Americans. She earned the Coaches' Award, MVP and the Team Award in both seasons.

Rockwell also spent three years in the ultra-competitive world of pharmaceutical sales, consistently ranking as a top-selling representative.

The former Salima Davidson was a three-time All-America setter for the Nittany Lions from 1991-94. She served as a two-time team captain of the U.S. National Team during her time with the squad from 1995-99 and was selected as an alternate for the 1996 Olympics Team.

She still ranks fourth all-time on Penn State's career assists list with 5,455, and sits fourth on the career assists per game list (12.34). She ranks sixth on the career digs charts with 1,278 and sits 15th all-time on the career hitting percentage list (.301). An all-around player, Rockwell also ranks 11th on the career total blocks chart with 382 and was inducted into the Pennsylvania Volleyball Coaches Hall of Fame.

A two-time member of the NCAA Championship All-Tournament team (1993 & 1994), Rockwell also earned All-Big Ten accolades four times, including three First-Team selections. She graduated in 1994 with a Bachelor of the Arts degree in speech communications.

Rockwell and her husband, Jeff, have two sons, Logan (6) and Rylan (2).

The 2011 season marks Erik Sullivan's first season on head coach Jerritt Elliott's Texas Volleyball staff. Sullivan joined the Texas staff after making two previous Big 12 coaching stops at Nebraska and Colorado.

On the Forty Acres, Sullivan will work with the Horns' liberos and middle blockers, while developing Texas' team defensive systems and scouting reports.

During the summer of 2011, Sullivan served as an assistant coach with the U.S. Women's Junior National Team at the FIVB Championships in Lima, Peru. At the championships he coached current Horns Hannah Allison, Haley Eckerman and Madelyn Hutson to a fourth-place finish.

In his three seasons at Nebraska, Sullivan helped the Huskers to a share of the Big 12 title in 2008 and an outright championship in 2010. He also helped NU to three-straight NCAA Regional appearances during his tenure. Sullivan's primary duties included working with the middle blockers, serving as co-recruiting coordinator and handling scouting and match preparation.

Sullivan, a two-time U.S. Olympian, brings a wealth of playing experience into the Texas program, including eight years with the U.S. National Team. He started for Team USA at libero at the 2004 Summer Olympic Games and served as co-captain of Team USA at the 2000 Olympics in Sydney, Australia.

At Nebraska, Sullivan tutored middle blockers Brooke Delano, who twice earned AVCA All-America, and Kori Cooper, a two-time All-Big 12 First Team pick.

A native of Encinitas, Calif., Sullivan was an assistant at Colorado for four seasons from 2004-2007 where he helped the Buffaloes to three straight NCAA appearances and coached a pair of CU outside hitters to All-Big 12 recognition.

Sullivan's playing experience has also stretched to the professional ranks in Europe. His professional resume includes stints in Naefels, Switzerland (1995-97), Malaga, Spain (1999), Apeldoorn, The Netherlands (2000-01) and Odintsovo, Russia (2003). In the United States, Sullivan played professionally on the Four-Man Volleyball Beach Tour in 1996-97.

In addition to his playing experience, Sullivan served as director of the Pikes Peak Volleyball Club in Colorado Springs, Colo., from 2001 to 2002 and served as coach of the club's 17 & Under contingent.

A two-time American Volleyball Coaches Association All-America Second Team pick at UCLA, Sullivan led the Bruins to a pair of national titles during his four-year playing career (1992-95). Sullivan finished his career as UCLA's all-time leader in matches with 10 or more digs (25) and ranked second in career digs (747). As a senior in 1995, Sullivan captained the Bruins to an NCAA title while ranking ninth nationally in digs (2.5 digs per-set). He graduated from UCLA with a bachelor's degree in physiological science in the spring of 1995.

Sullivan is married to the former Amanda Heavner of Santa Barbara, Calif. The couple has a daughter, Shaye (9) and a son, Cade (5).

vs. *PENN STATE* (Dec. 16)

Texas' rousing run to its third-straight NCAA Semifinals ended in straight sets to defending national champion Penn State (25-13, 25-13, 25-22) at the NCAA Championship ... the Longhorns, who entered on a 19-match winning streak, closed their season at 27-6 ... senior All-America outside hitter Juliann Faucette led UT with 14 kills, and Amber Roberson added seven kills. Sha'Dare McNeal and Sarah Palmer each totaled 10 digs in the losing effort.

Texas used a pair of 19-kill efforts from senior outside hitter Juliann Faucette and junior middle blocker Rachael Adams to down eighth-seeded Illinois, 3-2 (19-25, 26-24, 18-25, 25-14, 15-11) in the NCAA Regional semifinals ... Adams hit at a .438 clip in the win and Faucette added 12 digs for her 22nd career double-double ... junior Amber Roberson added 11 kills and senior Jennifer Doris connected for eight kills and hit .571.

vs. *No. 9 UCLA* (Dec. 4)

Texas used a 17-kill performance by senior All-America outside hitter Juliann Faucette and freshman setter Hannah Allison returned from injury to steady the lineup as UT downed No. 9 UCLA, 3-1 (25-23, 20-25, 25-18, 25-24) in the NCAA Second Round ... Faucette headlined the Texas attack with 17 kills on .256 hitting and added six digs and a pair of solo blocks ... junior middle blocker Rachael Adams added 12 kills and hit .611 in the win, while junior outside hitter Amber Roberson connected for 10 kills and collected 11 digs.

vs. *UTSA* (Dec. 3)

Texas swept UTSA (25-11, 25-18, 25-15) in first round action ... junior middle blocker Rachael Adams highlighted the UT with 12 kills on .588 hitting as the Horns posted a .395 team attack mark ... senior outside hitter Juliann Faucette connected for 11 kills in the win and added five digs and five blocks.

TEXAS IN THE NCAA STATS

In the final edition of the NCAA statistics, Texas ranked No. 4 in the country with its .306 hitting percentage ... junior middle blocker Rachael Adams led the nation in hitting with her .443 attack mark, while senior middle blocker Jennifer Doris ranked third in the NCAA with her .426 hitting percentage.

FAUCETTE A HONDA FINALIST

Senior All-America outside hitter Juliann Faucette was named a nominee for the 2010-11 Volleyball Honda Award, becoming Texas third-straight nominee for the award.

Adams ranked third with 1.24 blocks per-set and senior outside hitter Juliann Faucette ranked second with 4.82 points and third with 4.23 kills per-set

ACADEMIA

Gregory Gymnasium

Gregory Gym - the Horns' House - is one of the finest collegiate volleyball facilities in the country. The gym that has hosted some of the most memorable moments in Texas Volleyball history made its much-anticipated return in 1998 after an eight-year renovation.

During the last 13 seasons, Texas has boasted some of the greatest fan support in the country and consistently ranks among the nation's leaders in home attendance. From the families who have supported the team for decades to the more recent Hellraisers (a student support group), Gregory Gym has one of the best fan bases in the nation, making it one of volleyball's toughest venues for visiting teams.

In 2009, Texas welcomed a UT record 3,035 fans per-match into Gregory Gym, marking the highest season attendance average in program history. That mark gave UT the sixth-highest home attendance average in the nation and the second-highest in the Big 12 Conference. The crowd of 4,324 that watched Texas knock off No. 3 Nebraska on Nov. 19, 2008 marked the largest crowd ever in Gregory Gym's current configuration.

Texas has an .849 winning percentage at Gregory Gym (276-49) and has pulled out at least 11 wins at home in each of the last nine seasons under head coach Jerritt Elliott. Overall, the Longhorns are an impressive 457-102-1 at home for a winning percentage of 81.7 percent since 1974.

The state-of-the-art, 4,000-seat facility features a friendly, roomy environment for players, coaches and fans alike. Spacious locker rooms, offices, meeting rooms and a players' lounge were constructed recently, joining other recent updates that include a new sound system. In the summer of 2003, a brand new playing surface was laid down for the Horns.

Texas Volleyball fans are treated to upper-level seating that puts them right on top of the action. Additionally, fans on the floor level are treated to seat-backs for more comfortable viewing.

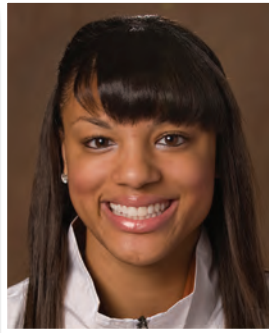
