### TECH OPENS SEASON WITH RED RAIDER CLASSIC

Texas Tech opens up the 2010 season on Friday, Feb. 19, in what will be the second game of the Red Raider Classic when the Red Raiders face Jacksonville State at 4 p.m. The Red Raider Classic is a three team, round-robin tournament that will feature the host Red Raiders along with Jacksonville State (Jacksonville, Ala.) and the University of Michigan. Tournament play begins at 1 p.m. on Friday with Jacksonville State facing off against Michigan while the night-cap will feature Tech against Jacksonville State. The Red Raiders will face Michigan on Friday afternoon (4 p.m.) and both the Wolverines and Jacksonville State on Sunday.

### RANKINGS

None of the three teams participating in the Red Raider Classic are ranked by the USA TODAY/ESPN TOP 25 Coaches Poll, Baseball America or the NCBWA (National Collegiate Baseball Writers).

### THE SERIES

The Red Raider Classic will feature the 149th and 150th different teams to make an appearance in the Texas Tech annals since the school fielded its first baseball team back in 1926. Texas Tech will face Jacksonville State for the first time in its opening game of the classic while the Red Raiders will battle Michigan for the first time on day two of the tournament.

### RED RAIDER CLASSIC NOTES

- Texas Tech will be hosting the Red Raider Classic for the first time since the 2007 season. In 2007, Texas Tech was joined by Northwestern (Big Ten) and Western Illinois (Missouri Valley).
- A total of six games will be played over the span of three days in a round-robin style format. All games will be played at Dan Law Field and an all-tournament team will be announced on Sunday.
- Jacksonville State will be making an appearance in the state of Texas for the first time since 2007 when they dropped a three-game series (0-3) at Texas A&M (Feb. 23-25). Michigan heads south to the Lone Star State for their first appearance since the 2006 Quala-T Imprints Classic at Baylor Ballpark in Waco where the Wolverines went 1-2 (losses against La. Tech and Baylor and a win over Pacific).
- Texas Tech has never faced a team on the diamond from the states of Alabama or Michigan.

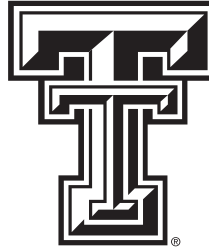

**SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE**

The Jacksonville State Gamecocks will be the first team on the slate for the Red Raiders in 2010 and are members of the Ohio Valley Conference. The Gamecocks ended the 2009 season with a 31-26 overall record and a 10-13 mark in the OVC which landed them sixth place in the final league standings. Jax State returns 20 lettermen off last year's squad, including eight starting position players. As a team, the Gamecocks posted a .297 batting average and a 5.01 staff ERA. Kyle Bluestein, the team's leading hitter from 2009, returns for his sophomore season after posting a .393 average as a freshman. Right-hander Austin Lucas returns for his senior campaign after anchoring the Gamecock pitching staff last season with a 3.93 ERA and a 7-3 record. Jax State is coached by Jim Case who is 226-183 in his eighth season with the Gamecocks.

**SCOUTING MICHIGAN**

The Michigan Wolverines make their inaugural jaunt to the South Plains after finishing the 2009 season with a 30-25 overall record and a 9-15 mark in the Big Ten (seventh place finish). The Wolverines missed out on the NCAA Tournament last season for the first time in five years as they had been to four consecutive postseason tournaments. Michigan has won two national championships and made seven appearances in the College World Series. In 2007, the Wolverines narrowly missed out on a trip to Omaha as they dropped an NCAA Super Regional at Oregon State when Texas Tech head coach Dan Spencer was on the Beaver staff as the pitching coach.

The Wolverines return 19 lettermen from last year's squad, including six starting position players and three starting pitchers. As a team, Michigan tallied a .294 cumulative

batting average along with a 4.82 ERA. Junior centerfielder Ryan LaMarre, a preseason third team All-America selection, was the team's leading hitter a year ago with a .344 average and 12 home runs. Mike Dufek, the team's ERA leader last season, returns for his senior season after posting a 2.70 ERA and 1-1 record in 2009.

**OPENING DAY 2010**

Texas Tech opens up its 61st season on the diamond in 2010 with the Red Raider Classic which is the beginning of a 10-game homestand. Tech baseball falls only behind football and men's basketball as the longest running sport and dates all the way back to the 1926 season. Tech's first collegiate baseball game resulted in an 18-9 win over West Texas A&M. The 1926 squad featured just 14 players and was coached by E.Y. Freeland. The program was disbanded for 25 years before returning to action again in 1954, led by Beattie Feathers. In 60 seasons, the Red Raiders have compiled a record of 1,389-1,086-9 along with two regular-season conference titles and two conference tournament championships. On Opening Day, the Red Raiders have compiled a 37-23 overall record and a 24-5 mark when opening the season at home. Texas Tech won its season-opener last season with a 14-3 victory over Southern Utah.

**TUBERVILLE TO THROW OUT FIRST PITCH**

Texas Tech head football coach Tommy Tuberville, who took over the program on Jan 10, will throw out the ceremonial first pitch for the Red Raiders' 2010 season opener against Jacksonville State. Tech's season opener, coincidentally, comes against a team from the state of Alabama that is probably familiar with coach Tuberville as he spent 10 seasons as the head coach of the Auburn Tigers. Coach Tuberville and the football Red Raiders will begin spring practice on March 22 and conclude on April 17 with the Spring Game.

**10-GAME HOMESTAND**

Texas Tech will open up the 2010 season with a 10-game homestand marking the longest home stint since 2008

when the Red Raiders played 10-straight at home between March 20-April 2. The last time Tech had a 10-plus game homestand to start a season was in 2003 when the Red Raiders played their first 11 games at Dan Law Field.

**2010 SCHEDULE IS NO CAKE WALK**

Texas Tech has a daunting task ahead of them in 2010 as Boyd Nation of boydsworld.com has calculated the Red Raider's strength of schedule at No. 11 nationally. Tech has the third toughest schedule amongst Big 12 schools behind No. 1 Baylor and No. 9 Texas A&M. No. 19 Kansas, No. 20 Texas and No. 25 Missouri round out the top 25 from the Big

**RED RAIDERS THANKFUL FOR EXTRA WEEK**

The NCAA gave schools all across the country a little bit of breathing room in 2010 as the spring schedule will now cover 56 games in 13 weeks as compared to 12 weeks in 2009. The week long extension, opposed by only a few, will reduce the number of two-game series in the midweek and should hopefully increase the amount of time spent in the classroom. As a result, Texas Tech will only play four two-game midweek series in 2010 as opposed to the seven played last season. The future of NCAA baseball could see the extra week being given at the end of the season which would move the College World Series back one week.

**NEW FACES ON THE MOUND**

The 2010 season will bring about several new faces on the mound for the Red Raiders as eight new pitchers will join six returning letterman to make up the Texas Tech staff. A total of five transfers will be called upon to help make an immediate impact and they will be joined by two newcomers from the high school ranks and one who completed a redshirt in 2009. Transfers Bobby Doran, Brett Bruening and Jay Johnson are expected to figure into major roles on the staff with Doran and Bruening taking up starting roles with Johnson serving as the closer. Sophomore Louis Head, who spent most of his freshman season as a middle reliever, is expected to be a midweek starter but could also earn a spot on the weekend.

**BETTIS TO LEAD TECH STAFF**

Junior right-hander Chad Bettis will move out of the closer role in 2010 and move into a new role as Tech's Friday starter. Bettis, a Lubbock native, spent his freshman season as Tech's Sunday starter before moving up a day to Saturday at the beginning of the 2009 season. Tech's struggles in the bullpen forced Dan Spencer and Ed Gustafson to move Bettis to the closer role and it turned out to be a great move for the Red Raiders. He ended the 2009 season with a team-leading 3.59 ERA along with a 6-1 record and seven saves. Bettis, who is draft-eligible, has been predicted by many as a first-round selection in the 2010 MLB Draft and is listed as the second best prospect in the Big 12 this season according to Baseball America. Baseball America also proclaims Bettis to have the best fastball (94-96) in the league and named him to their preseason All-Big 12 team as one of three starting pitchers. He is listed as the No. 21 prospect nationally according to Perfect Game Crosschecker.

**KENWORTHY SET TO ANCHOR TECH INFIELD**

Returning for his fourth and final season, senior shortstop Joey Kenworthy will be looking to build upon his best season as a Red Raider in 2009. Last season, the 5-5, 160lb product from Houston, finished second on the team with a .335 batting average while playing in all 57 games and making 56 starts. He will be the veteran on a Tech infield that is still relatively young with sophomores at both second and third and a junior transfer at first base. In 2009, Kenworthy was a difficult out for opposing pitchers as he struckout just 24 times in 230 at-bats and led the team in runs scored with 77.

**TECH HOPES YOUTHFUL '09 PAYS OFF IN '10**

Texas Tech's rebuilding process under Dan Spencer heads into its second year but the Red Raiders have big goals for 2010, including a return to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2004. Last season, Texas Tech had five freshmen make significant contributions over the course of the season, including three infielders who combined for 113 starts. Garrett Totten and Justin Berry, now sophomores, enter the year as the starters at second and third, respectively, while Scott LeJeune will again serve as the designated hitter. Kevin Whitehead, who made 20 starts behind the

plate his freshman season, will again backup junior catcher Jeremy Mayo but could also see time as the designated hitter. Louis Head, a middle reliever who made 20 appearances his freshman year, is expected to nail down a starting role in his sophomore campaign.

**CLASSROOM SUCCESS**

The Red Raider baseball team got their 2010 season off to a good start but it had nothing to do with anything on the field. During the fall, the Red Raiders made a big splash in the classroom as 20 players were named to the Big 12 Fall Honor Roll after ending the semester with a 3.0 or higher GPA.

**O'CANADA**

For the first time since the 2002 season, the Tech Hecklers will have a good reason to sing "O'Canada." The 2010 Red Raiders will feature two players from north of the border as freshman RHP Brandon Petite and sophomore LHP Jay Johnson hail from Canada. Petite comes to Texas Tech from Vauxhall Academy in Glace Bay, Nova Scotia while Johnson is a sophomore transfer from Prairie Baseball Academy and a native of Sussex Corner, New Brunswick. Chad Ertel, a right-handed pitcher, was Tech's last Canadian born player and played for Red Raiders in 2001 and 2002 and was part of two NCAA Tournament squads. Possibly the most popular Canadian to play for Tech, was second baseman Stubby Clapp who lettered in 1996.

**WE WILL PROTECT THIS HOUSE**

Texas Tech Athletics is in its first year of a department wide apparel contract with Under Armour. Under Armour, one of the fast growing athletic apparel companies in the world, outfits all 17 teams at Texas Tech as well as the administrative staff. The Red Raider baseball team will debut six new uniforms this season: traditional red, traditional black, gray, white pinstripe, gray pinstripe and a throwback. **HOME SWEET HOME**

After an arduous travel schedule in 2009, the Red Raiders are thrilled to be playing the majority of their games in 2010 within the friendly confines of Dan Law Field. Texas Tech will play 32 of its 56 regular-season games at home, including five Big 12 series. Last season, Texas Tech played just 22 games at home and only four conference series. The Red Raiders open up the 2010 season with a 10-game homestand before making their first road trip in early March (5-7) to the Houston College Classic at Minute Maid Park. In 2009, Tech played its first six games at home before embarking on a seven game, 11-day road trip through the state of California. Texas Tech will face Big 12 foes Texas, Kansas State, Oklahoma, Missouri and Baylor all at home.

**FSN HEADED TO DAN LAW FIELD**

FSN (Fox Sports Net) will make its inaugural visit to Dan Law Field in late March when the Red Raiders face the Texas Longhorns in a three-game Big 12 series. FSN announced in late January that Tech's game against the Longhorns on Sunday, March 28 would be part of the Big 12 FSN baseball television package and first pitch would be moved back to noon. The game will mark the first time in history that the network has televised a game live from Dan Law Field.

**PRESEASON PREDICTIONS**

The college baseball prognosticators and league coaches have spoken in terms of how each group foresees the Big 12 will play out in 2010. Texas Tech has been picked to finish sixth by Baseball America, ninth by Rivals, eighth by the [collegbaseballblog.com](http://collegbaseballblog.com), seventh by [collegbaseballtoday.com](http://collegbaseballtoday.com) and 10th by the league coaches.

## HEAD COACH DAN SPENCER



Determined. Aggressive. Champion.

These three words are accurate descriptions of a man hired by Texas Tech to rebuild its baseball program and return the Red Raiders to the national spotlight. These three words are the heart and soul of Dan Spencer.

However, the measure of a coach is not the words used to describe himself but instead the characteristics he instills into his team. In his first season as head coach in 2009, his team showed determination and aggression and now he will use that mentality to lead the Red Raiders down the road to becoming champions.

Hired in the summer of 2008 to replace a Texas Tech legend in Larry Hays, Spencer embraced the challenge and wasted no time in building a foundation for the Red Raider Baseball program in which to build a championship contender. Prior to his taking over the reins, Texas Tech had missed out on the Big 12 tournament in each of the last two years and posted last place finishes in the conference both of those seasons. Spencer's first squad defied all the preseason prognostications and he led the Red Raiders to a seventh place finish in 2009 and a return to Oklahoma City for the conference tournament. In their return to Oklahoma City, the Red Raiders posted an upset win over Missouri and found themselves just one win away from the championship game.

When hired back in 2008, he became just the eighth head coach in school history joining E.Y. Freeland (1925-27), R. Higginbotham (1928-29), Bettie Feathers (1954-60), Berl Huffman (1961-67), Kal Segrist (1968-83), Gary Ashby (1984-86) and Larry Hays (1987-2008). He joined Gary Ashby as the only two head coaches in school history that spent their college playing careers at Texas Tech as he lettered in 1985-87.

Spencer, 44, rejoined the Texas Tech Baseball family back on July 2, 2007 when he was named associate head coach on the staff of former head coach Larry Hays. He spent the 2008 season in that role where he coached the pitchers and catchers and headed Tech's recruiting front. His 2008 pitching staff produced two top-10 round MLB draft picks in juniors Zach Stewart and James Leverton, both of which had never been drafted prior to this season. Stewart was taken in the third round of the draft by the Cincinnati Reds while Leverton was taken in the eighth round by the Chicago Cubs.

Prior to his arrival back at Texas Tech, he spent 11 seasons at Oregon State, the last three as associate head coach where he served as pitching/catching coach and recruiting coordinator. His pitching staffs during the last two seasons of his OSU tenure were instrumental in helping the Beavers become the first back-to-back College World Series Champions since LSU in the late 1990s. In those two seasons, his staffs compiled 3.41 and 3.48 cumulative ERAs while leading the team to 50-16 and 49-18 respective records. His group led the Pac-10 in ERA in both 2005 and 2006 while his bullpen helped pave the way to back-to-back national titles by contributing 20-plus saves in both 2006 and 2007.

Under his leadership, the Beavers had three pitchers and one catcher named to All-America teams and seven drafted in the top 10 rounds of the MLB Draft. Eddie Kunz, the ace of the 2007 staff, and catcher Mitch Canhan, the squad's leading hitter, were both first round draft selections in the 2007 MLB Draft.

His collegiate coaching career began at the junior college level six years prior to arriving at Oregon State as he landed his first job as an assistant coach at Tacoma Community College in Tacoma, Wash., in 1991. After just one season in Tacoma, he picked up his first head coaching position as he took over the program at Green River Community College in 1992. While at Green River, he compiled a record of 131-67 between 1992 and 1996.

He and his wife, Susie, have three children: Wade, Logan and Elizabeth.

□ Sophomore third baseman Justin Berry underwent successful hip surgery in Vail, Colo., in June to repair an impingement and torn labrum. He is at full strength as the Red Raiders open up the 2010 season.

□ Duke Vonschamann (INF/RHP), Robbie Kilcrease (LHP), Nick Hanslik (UTL) and Zach Fowler (LHP) will miss the 2010 season due to injury as all four underwent elbow surgery this fall.

□ Texas Tech is currently in the fundraising process to renovate Dan Law Field. Tech head coach Dan Spencer is trying to raise between \$10-15 million to give the home of the Red Raiders a complete overhaul.

□ The Tech baseball team took part in the annual Susan G. Komen Race For the Cure event in Lubbock for the second consecutive season on Oct. 3, 2009. The squad served as course coordinators for the event which drew 8,000 participants and raises thousands of dollars for breast cancer research.

□ The Texas Tech Department of Athletics announced the formation of an annual baseball tournament to be held each year at Dan Law Field. The Brooks Wallace Memorial Classic will be held on an annual basis and is dedicated to the memory of former shortstop Brooks Wallace (1977-80). Wallace is known on the national level as the College Baseball Foundation honors the nation's top collegiate shortstop with the Brooks Wallace Award. This year's Brooks Wallace Memorial Classic will be held Feb. 25-28 and will feature Bethune-Cookman, Washington State and Texas Tech.

□ Texas Tech announced its 2011 signing class with the inking of 10 student-athletes to national letters of intent or financial aid agreements. The class consists of: Parker Bridwell, RHP, Hereford, Texas (Hereford High School), Daniel Coulombe, LHP, Scottsdale, Ariz. (USC/South Mountain Community College), Hayden Holub, RHP, Seymour, Texas (Seward County Community College), Jordan Lopez, OF, Edmond, Okla. (Santa Fe High School), Trey Masek, RHP/OF, Giddings, Texas (Giddings High School), David Paiz, INF, Austin, Texas (Anderson High School), Mason Randolph, Catcher, Lubbock, Texas (Coronado High School), Hunter Scott, RHP, Lubbock, Texas (Coronado High School), Logan Taylor, RHP, Jenks, Okla. (Jenks High School), Kelby Tomlinson, INF, Elgin, Okla. (Seward County Community College)

□ Former Red Raider pitcher Dustin Richardson (2005-06) made his major league debut this fall (Sept. 28) with the Boston Red Sox. Richardson pitched 1 1/3 shutout innings against the Toronto Blue Jays in his debut while becoming the 20th former Red Raider to earn a major league call-up.

□ Junior transfer Stephen Hagen, the national JUCO home run leader last season at Eastern Oklahoma State, tied the knot in fall as he and his wife Jenny were married on Sept. 19. Hagen is not the only married player on team, however, as senior transfer Bonham Hough is also "hitched." He is and his wife Misty moved to Lubbock this past summer after he transferred from UT-Pan American.

□ Former Red Raider outfielder Jon Webber (1999) earned a spot on the 2009 USA Baseball World Cup Team and helped guide the United States to a gold medal. The U.S. defeated Cuba 10-5 in the IBAF (International Baseball Federation) gold medal game for its second consecutive world title.

□ RHP Chad Bettis earned a spot on the 2009 USA Baseball Collegiate National Team and spent the summer traveling with Team USA across the country as well as to Japan and Canada. Bettis compiled three saves in nine appearances (nine innings pitched) as the staff closer and registered a 3.00 ERA. The team won the 2009 World Baseball Challenge with an 8-1 win over Germany at Prince George Citizen Field in Prince George, British Columbia on July 26.

□ Three Red Raiders were selected in day two of the 2009 MLB Draft. Junior RHP Nate Karns was taken in the 12th round by the Washington Nationals while seniors AJ Ramos and Chris Richburg were taken in the 21st and 23rd rounds, respectively. Ramos was taken by the Florida Marlins while Richburg was selected by the Cincinnati Reds. Two newcomers to the Tech program were also drafted as sophomore LHP Jay Johnson was taken in the 25th round by Baltimore and freshman RHP Brandon Petite by Houston in the 30th round.

## 2009 SEASON IN REVIEW

□ After a missing the Big 12 Conference Championship in Oklahoma City each of the last two years, the Red Raiders put an end to that skid and reached the tournament as the No. 7 seed. Texas Tech was picked to finish eighth in the league in a preseason poll by the coaches but a strong finish

put the Red Raiders in seventh place.

□ While in Oklahoma City, Texas Tech continued to make waves as they shook off an opening game loss to No. 2 seed Oklahoma and defeated No. 3 seed Missouri 4-2. The win over Missouri snapped a six-game losing skid for Tech in the conference tournament and was its first win since beating No. 1 seed Nebraska in the first game of the 2005 tournament.

□ Texas Tech was one win away (needed to beat Texas A&M on Saturday) from reaching the championship game in Oklahoma City.

□ Texas Tech's win over Missouri in Oklahoma City gave the Red Raiders at least one win over every single team in the Big 12. Tech had not accomplished this feat since the 2000 season and it marked just the fourth time overall (1997, 1999, 2000 and 2009).

□ Texas Tech won five Friday night games in the Big 12 and that was the most for the program since the 2002 season.

□ Texas Tech won four Big 12 series during the year and that was the most for the program since 2004.

□ The Red Raiders put an end to a five-year, 23-series road losing skid at No. 10 Kansas State on May 9 with a 12-6 series clinching win over the Wildcats. Tech had not won a three-game road series since dropping Oklahoma State in Stillwater at the end of the 2004 season.

□ Texas Tech snapped a six-game losing skid in Austin as the Red Raiders defeated No. 8 Texas 4-2 on March 28. Tech's last win over the Longhorns in Austin was back on March 30, 2003.

□ Posted double digit wins (12) in the Big 12 Conference for the first time since the 2004 season. Tech finished with nine conference wins in 2008, eight wins in 2007, nine wins in 2006, and nine wins in 2005.

□ Finished the season with 11 wins over teams ranked in the Top 25. That win total ranked fourth in the Big 12 Conference. The Red Raiders also posted four wins over teams ranked in the Top 10.

□ Continued its home dominance over rival Texas A&M as the Red Raiders posted a 2-1 series win over the No. 11 Aggies in early April. Texas Tech has now won or tied the last six series against the Aggies at Dan Law Field.

□ Tech is the only team to hand Kansas State's A.J. Morris a loss this season. Morris was named the Big 12's Pitcher of the Year and led the nation in earned run average when the Red Raiders faced him on May 8. Morris allowed five runs on 10 hits over eight innings and the Red Raiders picked up their only shutout (6-0) of the season against the No. 10 Wildcats.

□ Posted a 15-7 record at Dan Law Field and watched its season home attendance average rise by 200 fans. A total of 53,491 fans came through the turnstiles this season over 22 games for an average of 2,431. Over the span of 26 games last season, Tech averaged 2,245 fans per-game.

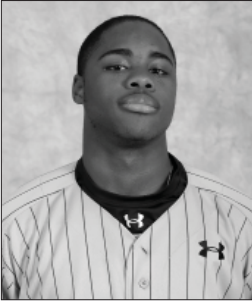

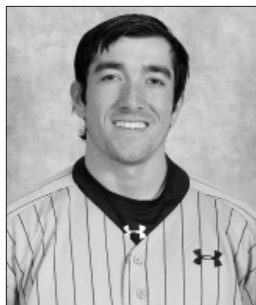
