2008 IN REVIEW

Texas Tech's 2008 season came to an end on Sunday, May 18, as the Red Raiders wrapped up a three-game weekend series against the Baylor Bears. The Red Raiders entered the weekend against Baylor needing a series sweep and some help from the Kansas-Kansas State series and the Oklahoma State-Oklahoma series. Tech got the help they needed across the league but just couldn't get it done on the home front as Baylor won the Saturday contest 13-3 to officially eliminate the Red Raiders from the Big 12 Conference Championship.

Despite the loss to Baylor on Saturday, Tech came fighting back on Sunday to clinch the series and post a 12-5 win in its season finale. The series win over Baylor marked just the second Big 12 series win of the year for the Red Raiders as they took a 2-1 series win over then No. 2 Missouri back in late March. Texas Tech ended the Big 12 season with a 9-18 overall record and ended in a tie for ninth-place with Kansas. Tech's absence from the Big 12 Championship marked its second straight and third overall (2003 and 2007).

The Red Raiders ended the season with a 15-11 record at home after only playing a total of 26 home games due to series' cancellations against Northern Illinois and Illinois at the beginning of year. Tech's home season attendance rose to 2,245 per-game as 58,372 fans came through the gates at Dan Law Field. The 2007 season average was 2,018 over 31 dates.

Texas Tech will open its 2009 season at home against Southern Utah on Feb. 20, 2009.

HAYS REACHES ANOTHER MAJOR MILESTONE IN HIS CAREER

Texas Tech Head Coach Larry Hays added another milestone to his impressive 38-year coaching career on Wednesday, April 2 as he picked up career win No. 1,500. His Red Raiders defeated Texas A&M-Corpus Christi 10-5 and made him just the fourth coach in NCAA history to reach 1,500 wins in a career. Since his first win as the head coach of Lubbock Christian (defeated Artesia, N.M. 14-2 on March 10, 1971), Hays went on to lead the Chaps for 16 seasons and has served as the head coach of the Red Raiders for 22 years. He picked up his 800th win as the skipper of the Red Raiders earlier this year as Tech defeated Texas 7-2 on March 21.

RICHBURG PUTS HIS NAME IN THE HISTORY BOOK

Texas Tech junior left-fielder Chris Richburg did something in Roswell that only four other players in school history had ever accomplished - he hit for the cycle. Richburg went 4-for-4 against New Mexico State on Wednesday, April 23 and became the first player since Jon Weber (vs. Southwest Texas on April 20, 1999) to hit for the cycle. He got his afternoon started with a single in the second, laced a double in the third, added a triple in the fourth and then completed the cycle with a solo home run in the seventh.

RAMOS UNDERGOES ELBOW SURGERY

Texas Tech junior right-hander AJ Ramos was diagnosed with a partially torn UCL (ulnar collateral ligament) in his right elbow on April 21 and missed the remainder of the 2008 season. Ramos has been the steady hand for the Red Raider pitching staff over the last two seasons but had struggled to a 1-4 record this year and a 7.60 ERA. In his last start on Friday night against Kansas, he walked four consecutive batters in the first inning and was pulled with no outs in the top of the second. The injury is believed to have occurred around the first part of March. He underwent successful surgery on Wednesday, April 30 and according to Texas Tech Head Baseball Trainer Shawn Lindsey the rehabilitation will be extensive. If the rehabilitation process goes according to plan, he should be ready in time for the start of the 2009 season.

KIESCHNICK, RUEDA NAMED TO ALL-BIG 12 TEAMS

Juniors Roger Kieschnick and Willie Rueda were Texas Tech Baseball's lone selections to the 2008 All-Big 12 teams that were announced earlier by the league coaches.

Roger Kieschnick, a junior right fielder and native of Rockwall, picked up second team honors as an outfielder and marks the third-straight season that he has earned an All-Big 12 honor. He was named the Big 12 Freshman of the Year in 2006 as well as a first team selection in the outfield and then picked up second team honors last year as a sophomore. Kieschnick finished the season with a .305 batting average, 15 doubles, 65 RBIs and a league-best 17 home runs.

Willie Rueda, a junior second baseman from El Paso, was the final Red Raider to be honored by the Big 12 as he picked up honorable mention honors. Rueda was undoubtedly the team's most valuable player in 2008 as he led the squad with a .361 average along with 14 doubles, three triples, 33 RBIs and a league-best 27 stolen bases. This marks the second time in his career that he picked up honorable mention honors as he earned the same distinction back in 2006 (freshman season). Additionally, Rueda was named to the Dallas Morning News' Second Team All-Big 12 list.

SEASON NOTABLES

- Texas Tech ended its 2008 season with an overall record of 25-30. The 30-loss season is just the second in school history as the 1985 squad finished the year with an 18-33 mark.
- Texas Tech played only 26 home games in 2008 compared to the 34 that were originally scheduled. The season-opening series against Northern Illinois was cancelled after a school shooting on that campus and the Illinois series was halted after the Illini were unable to get to Lubbock due to weather conditions in the Chicago area.
- Willie Rueda ended the season as Tech's team leader with a .361 batting average overall and a .365 clip in Big 12 play. He finished the year with 19 multiple-hit games and picked up 14 of those in the last 25 contests of the year. Rueda ended the season on a hot streak as he hit safely in 22 of Tech's last 25 games.
- Roger Kieschnick has four career grand slams to his credit and two this year. His 17 home runs are the most by a Tech player since Cameron Blair hit 17 back in 2005. He will most likely be taken high in the MLB Draft in early June and thus ending his career at Tech with a .322 average over 168 games along with 54 doubles and 39 home runs. His 54 career doubles ranks second all-time at Tech while his 39 home runs rank fourth.
- Roger Kieschnick ended the year as the team leader in both multiple-hit (22) and multiple-RBI (17) games.
- Junior Chris Richburg recovered nicely from a broken fibula (suffered March 4 against Central Arkansas) and returned to the Tech lineup on April 11 at Kansas. He put up the longest hit streak of the year by any player as he rattled off a 13-game streak starting on April 20 against Kansas State and ended on May 17 against Baylor. He finished the year with a .345 average (second on the team).
- Texas Tech ended its season with a .971 fielding percentage, it's highest since 2002 when that squad also fielded at a .971 clip.
- Texas Tech ended the year with a Big 12 best 272 walks.
- Four seniors played the final game of their Tech careers in the finale against Baylor and were honored in a pre-game ceremony: Jon Capuccio, Owen Broisma, Doug Thennis and Jason Seefeld.
- The Red Raiders ended the year with three wins over an opponent ranked in the Top 10 nationally. Tech won 2-of-3 against then No. 2 Missouri back in late March and then stunned No. 8 Oklahoma State 12-10 in the series finale at Allie P. Reynolds Stadium on May 11.
- Juniors James Leverton, Brian Cloud and Zach Stewart were the catalysts for the Tech bullpen in 2008. Leverton and Cloud had seen limited action in their first two seasons but were instrumental to the Red Raiders in 2008 as they combined for a 3-5 record and three saves. Leverton led the staff with a 3.86 ERA while Cloud was second with a 4.70 ERA. Stewart transferred to Tech in the Fall of 2007 and will most likely be a first or second round draft pick in the upcoming MLB Draft. He ended the year with a 4.98 ERA (third on team behind Leverton and Cloud) and a 3-2 record with three saves. He recorded 17 appearances out of the bullpen and three starts as he was moved into the weekend rotation following the injury to AJ Ramos.
