RED RAIDERS OPEN 87th SEASON AT HOME AGAINST TEXAS STATE

Texas Tech will open up the 2011 college football season and the 87th in school history on Saturday evening when the Red Raiders play host to the Texas State Bobcats. The Red Raiders are coming off an 8-5 season in 2010 which culminated with a 45-38 win over Northwestern (Big Ten) in the TicketCity Bowl in Dallas. Texas Tech enters the season riding a streak of 18 consecutive bowl eligible seasons which is the fourth longest in the nation. Saturday's game against Texas State will mark the first-ever meeting between the Red Raiders and the Bobcats and is part of a two-game series between the schools. The Red Raiders will travel to San Marcos in 2012 for the season opener in what will be the first season for Texas State as members of the Western Athletic Conference (WAC).

Kickoff on Saturday has been set for 6 p.m. (CT) and the game will not be televised. The Texas Tech Sports Network featuring Brian Jensen (play-by-play), John Harris (analyst) and Chris Level (sidelines) will have complete coverage beginning with the pregame show at 5 p.m. For a complete list of network affiliates, log on to www.texastech.com.

LAST TIME OUT: TEXAS TECH 45, NORTHWESTERN 38

DALLAS (AP) - Taylor Potts threw four touchdown passes and scored another on a trick play, and Eric Stephens ran 86 yards for a TD to carry Texas Tech to a 45-38 victory over Northwestern in the inaugural TicketCity Bowl.

The Red Raiders (8-5) led by 22 points early in the second half, then had to sweat it out.

The Wildcats (7-6) got within a touchdown twice in the fourth quarter, with freshmen quarterbacks Evan Watkins and Kain Colter combining to lead three straight touchdown drives and Jordan Maybin returning an interception 39 yards for a score with 5:37 left.

The game wasn't decided until the final play, a heave by Watkins that was intercepted.

Northwestern remains winless in a bowl since 1949. The Wildcats have lost eight in a row, including three straight close ones.

It turned out to be quite a contest - 927 yards of total offense and an inspired comeback by the Wildcats.

There were all sorts of oddities and game-changing plays, from a flubbed hold on an extra-point kick to Tech coach Tommy Tuberville trying an onside kick while leading 38-17 late in the third quarter. Soon, Northwestern was within 38-31.

Potts held them off, though, going 43 of 56 for 369 yards. He ran twice for 19 yards, 13 coming when he threw the ball to Austin Zouzalik on the right side of the field and Zouzalik threw it back to him. Potts scored easily behind a convoy of blockers. The throwback was ruled a lateral, so it went down as a rushing play.

Fresh off an eight win season and a win over Northwestern in the TicketCity Bowl, Texas Tech head coach Tommy Tuberville begins his second season.

In year one, Tuberville led the Red Raiders to an 8-5 record and became the first coach in school history to win a bowl game in his first season. Armed with a prolific offense and an improving defense, the Red Raiders secured their 11th consecutive bowl bid by ending the regular-season with back-to-back wins. Tuberville's strong bowl history proved beneficial for the Red Raiders as he led them to a 45-38 win over Northwestern, which gave Tech its third consecutive win over a Big Ten foe. His successful debut led to a one-year contract extension that will keep him on the Tech sideline through the 2015 season.

The excitement for Tuberville's first season was historic as a new single-season school record for season tickets was established with sales peaking at 46,565. Along the way, Tech also set a new standard for home attendance as an average of 57,107 fans attended the six home games at Jones A&T Stadium.

Tuberville inherited a program (Jan. 10, 2010) that had been bowl eligible for a Big 12 record 16 consecutive seasons and won 29 games in the last three seasons.

In 10 seasons at Auburn, Tuberville led the Tigers to 85 overall wins, which ranks fourth in school history. The Tigers also won 49 Southeastern Conference games, a number that is the fourth-best mark in the SEC. Tuberville led Auburn to seven straight bowl appearances, including New Year's Day bowl games in four of those years.

In 2007, Tuberville led Auburn to an 9-4 mark, including a 5-3 record in the Southeastern Conference with wins at No. 4 Florida and a record-setting sixth consecutive win over Alabama in the Iron Bowl. The Tigers concluded the season with an overtime victory over Clemson in the Chick-fil-A Bowl, marking the program's fifth bowl victory in the last six seasons. For the second consecutive year, Tuberville was a finalist for the Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year award for his efforts on and off the field.

The 2006 season saw Tuberville direct the Tigers to their second season with at least 10 wins in the previous three years with an 11-2 record after a 17-14 victory over Nebraska in the AT&T Cotton Bowl Classic. One of three finalist for the inaugural Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year award, Tuberville's 2006 squad was the only program in the country to defeat two teams ranked in the top five nationally - National Champion Florida and LSU.

Coming off a perfect 13-0 season in 2004, expectations for Tommy Tuberville's 2005 Auburn squad were modest after the Tigers lost four players to the first round of the NFL draft, including their entire starting backfield. But Auburn surprised many of the experts, finishing 9-3 and earning a share of its fifth Southeastern Conference Western Division title in six years. Auburn ended the regular season with back-to-back victories over Georgia and Alabama - two teams ranked at the time in the top 10 - setting a new school record in the process with 22 victories over a two year period.

In 2004, Tuberville led Auburn to its best season ever as the Tigers won a school-record 13 games and captured the SEC Championship and the NOKIA Sugar Bowl title. Auburn won its first conference title since 1989 including its first outright championship since 1987.

Auburn defeated five top 15 teams, becoming just the 10th NCAA Division I-A team to finish 13-0 or better. The Tigers earned their first ever berth in a Bowl Championship Series game and defeated VirginiaTech, 16-13 in the Sugar Bowl. For his efforts, Tuberville was named the AFCA, Associated Press, Paul "Bear" Bryant, FCA, SEC and Walter Camp Coach of the Year.

The season before Tuberville's arrival, Auburn finished with a dismal 3-8 overall record and a last place finish in the SEC Western Division. Tuberville guided the program back to the top of the league standings, leading Auburn to an SEC Championship, five Western Division titles including outright championships in 2000 and 2004 and co-championships in 2001, 2002 and 2005. Tuberville directed Auburn to eight consecutive bowl appearances, including five New Year's Day bowl berths and three consecutive January 1 bowl games from 2005-07.

In 2006, 11 players had graduated before the start of the season, and Auburn had 16 graduates on its 2007 AT&T Cotton Bowl roster. In 2005, 12 players graduated prior to the Capital One Bowl, while in 2004, nine players who had already earned their degrees played in the Nokia Sugar

Bowl. In 2003, linebacker Dontarrious Thomas, a three-time SEC Honor Roll selection, was one of eight Division I players named a National College Scholar-Athlete which awarded him a \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship from the National Football Foundation and College Football Hall of Fame.

While at Ole Miss from 1995-98, Tuberville posted a 25-20 record. Inheriting a Rebel program plagued by NCAA sanctions and probation, he guided Ole Miss to a winning record in his first season in 1995, despite having just 61 players on scholarship. He did not have a full compliment of scholarship players to work with in any of his four years at Ole Miss.

By the time he had three recruiting classes under his belt, Tuberville led Ole Miss to an 8-4 mark and a victory in the inaugural Motor City Bowl in 1997. His efforts earned him Associated Press SEC Coach of the Year Honors and American Football Quarterly magazine selected him as runner-up for its Schutt Sports Coach of the Year honor.

Prior to becoming head coach at Ole Miss, Tuberville served as defensive coordinator and line-backers coach at Texas A&M for one season. In 1994, he helped lead the Aggies to a 10-0-1 record and No. 8 final ranking by the Associated Press. Under his direction, the Aggie defense finished fourth nationally in scoring defense (13.1 ppg), fifth in total defense (265.5 ypg) and sixth in rushing defense (92.4 ypg).

Tuberville served as a member of the University of Miami staff for eight seasons from 1986-93, taking over as defensive coordinator in 1993. While serving on the staffs of Jimmy Johnson and Dennis Erickson at Miami, Tuberville was a defensive coach on teams which won three national championships, posted an 87-9 record and played in nine consecutive New Year's Day bowls.

As defensive coordinator for the Hurricanes in 1993, Tuberville directed a Miami defense which was ranked No. 3 nationally in scoring defense (12.6 ppg) and No. 5 nationally in pass defense (91.15 ypg). Tuberville began his collegiate coaching career at Arkansas State in 1980, coaching various segments of the Indians' defense over the next five seasons. During a five-year stay at Arkansas State, Tuberville coached defensive backs, nose guards and linebackers. During his final year at ASU, the Indians advanced to the second round of the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs.

He began his coaching career at Hermitage (Ark.) High School where he spent two years as an assistant and two as a head coach. After three straight four-win seasons, Tuberville guided HHS to a 7-3 mark in 1979 before moving to Arkansas State.

A 1976 graduate of Southern Arkansas University, Tuberville was a letterman at free safety and a two-year member of the golf team at SAU. He is a 1972 graduate of Harmony Grove High School in Camden, Ark.

Tuberville is married to the former Suzanne Fette of Guilford, Ind. They are the parents of two sons, Thomas Tucker and Troy Allen.

SEASON OPENERS

Texas Tech will kick off the 87th season of Red Raider football on Saturday evening against in-state opponent Texas State. The Red Raiders hold an all-time record of 57-26-3 in season openers and have won each of their last eight, dating back to the 2003 season. In home season openers, Texas Tech boasts an all-time mark of 65-18-3. Texas Tech defeated SMU in last year's season opener at Jones AT&T Stadium by a final score of 35-27. Oklahoma is the last team to defeat the Red Raiders in a season opener in Lubbock as the then No. 15 Sooners prevailed in 1992 by a final margin of 34-9.

ON A ROLL

Texas Tech is one of just two Big 12 schools that will enter the 2011 season on a win streak. Oklahoma enters the year on a 5-game win streak while the Red Raiders are riding a three-game streak. Oklahoma defeated UCONN in the Fiesta Bowl to end the season while Tech picked up a win over Northwestern in the TicketCity Bowl. Oklahoma State is the only other school in the league that will enter the 2011 season having won its final game of 2011 as they defeated Arizona in the Alamo Bowl.

INJURY REPORT

Justin Keown - Knee injury will keep him sidelined for the first few weeks of the season.

Tony Morales - underwent season-ending shoulder surgery during fall camp.

DOEGE TAKES OVER

The keys to the Texas Tech offense now belong to junior quarterback Seth Doege. Doege enters the 2011 season with one previous start under his belt as he got the nod in a 2009 home game against Kansas (threw for 159 yards [14-of-28] and one touchdown). Back-to-back knee injuries forced him to miss his junior and senior seasons in high school, so the 2011 season will mark his first full year of play since 2005. MARQUEZ SIGNS BASEBALL CONTRACT

Freshman runningback/receiver Bradley Marquez has signed a professional baseball contract with the New York Mets. Marquez will remain with the Tech football team in both the fall and spring and will play baseball for two months during the summer. The NCAA allows student-athletes to keep their amateur status in one sport despite being a professional in another. Marquez was drafted in the 16th round of the 2011 MLB Draft and received a signing bonus of \$325,000.

LARGE AND SMALL

The largest player on this year's team as well as the smallest can both be found on the same side of the ball. LaAdrian Waddle, the starting left tackle, stands at 6-6 and weighs in at 332 pounds making him the largest player on this year's squad. On the other side of the scale stands freshman receiver Jakeem Grant. Grant reported to training camp weighing 151 pounds and stands at 5-6. Grant is expected to contribute as a true freshman and also owns the distinction of being the fastest player on this year's team.

EARLY OFF WEEK

Texas Tech finds itself with an early off week as the Red Raiders won't hit the field again until Sept. 17 at New Mexico. Tech's off week in week-two of the season is the earliest for the Red Raiders since the 2001 season when Tech also took week No. 2 off. The Red Raiders will go 11-straight weeks beginning with that road trip to New Mexico and will conclude the season at Cowboys Stadium on Nov. 26 against Baylor.

NOTABLES

- Saturday's game against Texas State will mark the 950th all-time contest in program history. In 86 years of football, the Red Raiders have compiled an overall record of 519-398-32 along with 53 winning seasons. Tech is currently riding a streak of 18 consecutive winning/non-losing seasons.

- A total of 12 new faces to the Texas Tech football program (meaning they have arrived on campus since Jan. of 2011), are listed on this week's depth chart. Of the 12, nine are true freshman.

- Head coach Tommy Tuberville awarded scholarships to four players during training camp that were previous walk-on's: Sawyer Vest, Omar Ontiveros, Eugene Neboh and Jesse Smitherman.

- Offensive coordinator Neal Brown is expected to redshirt Marcus Kennard, a junior college transfer from Butler Community College. Kennard enrolled at Tech in the spring of 2011 and was ranked as a four-star prospect by Rivals.

- Freshman defensive lineman Delvon Simmons has been cleared to play immediately by the NCAA. Simmons is arguably one of the highest rated defensive players to come to Texas Tech as he was a five-star prospect out of high school by Scout.

- Texas State head coach Dennis Franchione has not found much success at Jones AT&T Stadium in five previous trips. Franchione has never been victorious as a head coach at the Jones and his teams have been outscored 187-83.

WE CAN TAKE THE HEAT

Much of the southwest has been under an extreme drought and heatwave for most of the summer and Lubbock is no exception. In fact, Lubbock was named the "Hottest City In America" by the online magazine The Daily Beast. At the time the article was released on July 20, Lubbock had experienced temperatures that were six degree warmer than average for the month of July. Lubbock recorded 43 consecutive days of temperatures over 100 degrees, including a high temperature of 112 in June.

BEST SIGNING CLASS IN SCHOOL HISTORY
