



Texas Tech Lady Raiders vs. Idaho Vandals

Game One

Starting the game

- Tech coach Kristy Curry called on Jordan Murphree (f), Dominic Seals (f), Maria Moore (g), Tiny Henderson (g) and Maddy Brown (g), to start the first game of the season. Amy Eisses (f), Yinka Olorunnife (f), Charlotte Otero (g), Shaena-Lyn Kuehu (g), Rachele Kloke (g), got the start for Idaho.

Red Out

- Tonight marked the first time in history of women's basketball that the Lady Raiders have worn red uniforms at home during the regular season.

Tipping It Off

- Senior Dominic Seals grabbed the opening tip for the Lady Raiders and scored the first basket.

3-3-3

- Maria Moore, Jordan Murphree and Maddy Brown all connected on three-pointers within the first three minutes of play.

Solid Start

- Tech led 45-27 at the half, shooting 55 percent from the field and 85 percent from the free throw line.

Hot First Half

- Jordan Murphree and Dominic Seals each reached double digits in the first half with 11 and 12 points, respectively.

In the Zone

- Maddy Brown tied her career-high five three-pointers, and was the game-high scorer with 18. The 18 points marked the most she has scored at Texas Tech. Her career high is 21 which she had against Duquesne when she was a freshman at Pittsburgh.

Coming Out Party

- In her first regular-season game, freshman Kierra Mallard had 16 points and eight rebounds in 21 minutes of play, while fellow freshman Jordan Barncastle added 13 points and eight rebounds in 19 minutes of action. Junior Tilmila Martin chipped in seven points, five rebounds and three assists in her debut as a Lady Raider.

With the win

- Tech moves to 23-11 in season openers, and making it 3-0 during the Kristy Curry era.
- The Lady Raiders also improve to 31-3 in home openers, 3-0 under Curry.

Odds and Ends

- The Lady Raiders shot 46 percent from three-point land in the first half.
- Tech shot 53 percent for the game, and 67 percent from the charity stripe.
- There were five Lady Raiders in double digits: Maddy Brown with 18, Kierra Mallard with 16, Dominic Seals with 14, Jordan Murphree with 13 and freshman Jordan Barncastle with 13.
- Maria Moore had seven assists and Tiny Henderson had five.
