Game Four

Starting the game

- Kristy Curry used her fourth starting line-up of the season with Jordan Barncastle (f), Kierra Mallard (c), Tilmila Martin (g), Tiny Henderson (g) and Alana Rumph (g) getting the start for the Lady Raiders. Shalyn Martin (f), Candice Champion (f), Erin Dixon (f), Meghan Nelson (g) and Tamara Simmons (g) and got the call for Texas-Arlington.

First Career Start

- Senior Alana Rumph and junior Tilmila Martin both got their first career starts against the Mavericks.

Roberson Returns

- Junior Ashlee Roberson entered the game midway through the first half to see her first action of the season. She finished the game with five points and four rebounds. Roberson had been suspended for the first three regular-season games.

At the Half

- The Lady Raiders were led by seniors Dominic Seals and Tiny Henderson with eight points a piece.
- Junior Tilmila Martin had four steals, and seniors Maria Moore and Tiny Henderson each had three assists.
- Tech shot 38 percent from the floor, 29 percent from the three-point line, and 80 percent from the charity stripe.
- Texas-Arlington had 13 turnovers to Tech's six. The Lady Raiders converted 13 points off the turnovers.

Runnin' Raiders

- The Lady Raiders went on a 10-0 run from 15:54-13:30 in the second half to pull ahead by 12, 51-39.

The Seals Show

- Senior Dominic Seals continued her strong play Sunday with 15 points. She also tabbed one assist, one block and three steals to tie her season highs.

Breaking Out

- Senior Maria Moore scored a season-high 10 points, and tied a season high with one steal. She also tied her career-high two three-pointers.
- Junior Tilmila Martin had a career-high six steals against the Mavericks to go with her 10 points, two rebounds and three assists, which also tied a season high.
- Senior Tiny Henderson had a season-high six assists to go with eight points and a season-high six rebounds.

Four in Double Digits

- Four Lady Raider's scored in double-digits: Dominic Seals with 15, Tilmila Martin with 10, Maria Moore with 10 and Maddy Brown with 10.

Odds and Ends

- The Lady Raiders had a season-high 16 steals
- Tech had 33 points off of turnovers compared to 14 by Texas-Arlington.
- Tech shot 40 percent for the game and 57 percent from the free throw line.

With the Win

- The Lady Raiders move to 4-0 on the season.
