



Texas Tech Lady Raiders vs. Washington State Cougars

Game Two

Starting Out

- Kristy Curry used her second starting lineup of the season of Maria Moore (g), Tiny Henderson (g), Maddy Brown (g), Dominic Seals (f), and Kierra Mallard (c). The starters for Washington State were April Cook (g), Katie Appleton (g), Jazmine Perkins (g), Rosie Tarnowski (f), and Ebonee Coates (c).

Seals on a Streak

- Senior Dominic Seals scored eight-straight points from 17:25-14:32 in the first half.

Physical Matchup

- Washington State committed 13 fouls to Tech's five in the first half.

Doing It Again

- Senior Dominic Seals scored 13 in the first half putting her in double digits for the second straight game.

Tale of the First Half

- Despite being outscored 37-36, the Lady Raiders outshot the Cougars 48 percent to 39 percent. Both teams shot 67 percent from the free throw line as Tech outrebounded Washington State 23-17.

Big Time Scorers

- Three Lady Raiders finished in double figures. Dominic Seals had 21, Jordan Barncastle and Tilmila Martin each had 14.

Career Day

- Freshman Jordan Barncastle and junior Tilmila Martin each scored a career high 14 points, and shot 100 percent from the free throw line. Freshman Kierra Mallard tallied a career-high four steals.

- Dominic Seals scored 21 points, going over the 20 mark for the first time this year.

Double-Double

- Freshman Jordan Barncastle recorded her first double-double of her career scoring a career-high 14 points and grabbing a career-high 13 rebounds.

Big Run

- After being tied at 58 with nine minutes left, the Lady Raiders went on a 24-11 run to close out the game, 82-69.

With the Win

- Tech moves to 2-0 on the season.
- The Lady Raiders move to 3-0 all time against Washington State.

Odds and Ends

- Tech shot 49.1 percent for the game compared to 37.1 percent for Washington State.
- The Lady Raiders attempted 37 free-throws and connected on 78.4 percent for the game.
- Tech outrebounded the Cougars 43-35.
- Washington State had three players foul out.
