



## **Texas Tech Lady Raiders vs. Colorado Buffaloes Game 20**

### **Starting the Game**

• For the third time this season, Kristy Curry started the contest with Maria Moore (g), LaVonda “Tiny” Henderson (g), Ashlee Roberson (f), Erin Myrick (c) and Dominic Seals in the starting lineup. With the win, Tech is 2-1 on the season when this group gets the starting nod. Colorado called on Susie Powers (g), Hanna Skildum (g), Brittany Spears (f), Aija Putnina (f) and Jackie McFarland (f) to start the game.

### **Battling the Buffaloes**

• Today’s game marked the 19th game in the series between the conference rivals. With the win, the Lady Raiders lead the series 14-5.

### **With the Win...**

- Tech improves to 14-6 on the season and 2-4 in conference play.
- Tech breaks a two-game losing streak to the Buffaloes.
- Tech is 10-2 this season when playing in the United Spirit Arena.
- Tech’s Kristy Curry gains her first career victory over Colorado.

### **Running the Floor...**

• Tech’s 14 fast breaks points is the most by the Lady Raiders since having 20 against Houston earlier this season.

### **Tough Defense**

• Backed by a tough defensive performance, the Lady Raiders were able to hold the Buffaloes scoreless through the first eight minutes of the second half. During that stretch, Tech went on a 15-0 run. Colorado finally broke the scoreless streak on a Jackie McFarland bucket at the 11:04 mark. Colorado’s 44 points is the fewest surrendered by Tech this year. The previous low was 45 at Washington State.

### **Dominic Does it Again**

• With 21 points, Dominic Seals led the Lady Raiders in points for the 11th time this season. Seals neared her ninth double-double of the season, but she fell a rebound short as the South Plains College Transfer finished with nine boards. Seals now has six 20-point outings this season.

### **Odds and Ends**

- After being tied at 10 midway through the first half, the Lady Raiders went on a 7-0 run beginning with a Dominic Seals jumper at the 13:29 mark and lasting until Bianca Smith’s bucket at the 11:03 mark.
- With eight dishes, junior Tiny Henderson set a new career high in assists.
- Before her early departure because of foul trouble, Ashlee Roberson set a new career high in blocks with three.
- Stanecia Graham scored in double figures for the first time since facing Oral Roberts December 18th.
