



Texas Tech Lady Raiders vs. Baylor Bears

Game 15

Starting the Game

• For the 14th time this season, Kristy Curry started the contest with Jordan Murphree (g), Maria Moore (g), Keisha Walker (g), Erin Myrick (c) and Dominic Seals in the starting lineup. With the 72-67 loss, Tech is 11-3 and 0-1 on the season when this group gets the starting nod. Baylor called on Angela Tisdale (g), Jhasmin Player (g), Danielle Wilson (c), Rachel Allison (f) and Jessica Morrow (f) to start the game.

Battling the Bears

• Tonight's game marked the 65th game in the series between the two in-state foes. Even with the defeat, the Lady Raiders lead the series 46-19.

Tech and the Top 25

• The game marked the Lady Raiders' third contest with a ranked team this season. Tech won its first game against a ranked opponent when it upset then No. 18/19 Arizona State 73-69 back on Dec. 18. It dropped a tough 80-57 decision at the hands of then No. 25/21 Arkansas this past Saturday. With the loss, the Lady Raiders are now 1-2 against ranked teams this season.

Big 12 Openers

• With the win/loss, Tech is now 8-4 in Big 12 openers. They are now 0-2 in conference openers under Curry. The Lady Raiders have now played Baylor four time in conference openers and are 2-2 in those games.

With the Loss...

- Tech falls to 12-3 on the season and 0-1 in conference play.
- Tech drops its third-straight conference opener.
- Tech is now 8-2 when playing in the United Spirit Arena.

Dominique Does it Again

• Seals is quickly establishing herself as one of the premier players in the Big 12. The two-time Conference Rookie of the Week scored a career-high 22 points and picked up her seventh double-double of the season. It also marked the 12th time she has scored in double figures and the fourth time in five games she has had 20-plus points. It is her seventh game of the season with double-digit rebounds.

Odds and Ends

- The Bears picked up 20 points off of 21 Tech turnovers.
- Baylor's eight three-pointers was the most by an opponent this season. The Bears' 47 percent shooting from behind the arc was also the highest three-point percentage by an opponent on the season.
- The loss to Arkansas marked the first time this season that the Lady Raiders did not have three players score in double figures.

Odds and Ends Cont...

- After being behind through the first part of the game, a Moore jumper at the 15:24 mark tied the score at nine apiece.
- The Bears went on a 7-0 run over 3:07 (11:11-8:04) in the first half.
- A 9-4 Tech run cut the lead to 23-21 with 4:49 left in the first half.
- The Lady Raiders opened the second half with a 9-2 run over the first 4:02 to take a 38-35 lead. A Moore three-pointer gave Tech its first lead of the game with 18:15 left.
- A Morrow three put the Bears back on top 43-42 with 14:32 left.

Record With

- Seals (22), Myrick (11), Ashlee Roberson (10), Murphree (10) and Moore (10) all scored in double figures. It marks just the second game this season five Lady Raiders have scored in double digits. Tech has now had at least three players in double figures in all but two games. The Lady Raiders had a streak of 13 games with at least three scoring double digits, until the loss to Arkansas. Tech is now 12-3 on the year when three score in double figures
- The Lady Raiders won the rebounding battle 50-36. They are now 11-2 when outrebounding the opposition.
- With the 33-29 halftime deficit, Tech trailed going into the lockerroom for just the fifth time on the season. With loss, the Lady Raiders are 2-3 when the opposition leads at the half.
- With its 21 turnovers, Tech is now 2-1 when turning the ball over more than 20 times.
- Baylor's eight three-pointers drops the Lady Raiders to 6-2 on the season when giving up five-or-more threes.

Individual Highs

- Seals tied her career-best 22 points.
- Myrick's 4 blocks ties a career high.
