Game 12

Starting the Game

• For the 11th time this season, Kristy Curry called on a lineup of Jordan Murphree (g), Maria Moore (g), Keisha Walker (g), Erin Myrick (c) and Dominic Seals to start the game. With the 91-61 win, Tech is 10-1 on the season when this group gets the starting nod. Oral Roberts opened the contest with Rachel Watman (g), Mariana Cargamo (g), Jenny Hardin (c), Whitney Wehmeyer (f) and Janae Voelker (f).

Dates with the 'Devils

• The game marked the 13th meeting between the two schools. Tech has now taken six games in a row against the Golden Eagles, all of which have been played in Lubbock.

Scoring High

• Tech's 91 points marks the second time this season it has scored 90 points in a game. The last time the Lady Raiders had two 90-plus-point games in a season was the 2003-04 campaign.

• Tech has scored 80-plus points six times this season and at least 70 in all but one game, the lone time coming in its loss to Houston. The last time the Lady Raiders had at least six games with 80-or-more points was the 2004-05 season.

Tech Goes Beyond the Summit

• With the victory, the Lady Raiders are now 12-3 against Summit League opponents (previously named the Mid Continent Conference until this past summer).

Myrick Roars Back

• After scoring a combined eight points on just one field goal in the last two games, Myrick hit her first six shots from the field and scored 13 first-half points. The Duarte, Calif. product finished the contest with 18 points on 7-10 shooting from the field.

Burning the Nets Early

• Tech blistered the nets to start the game, hitting seven of its first nine shots from the field. The Lady Raiders also hit their first three attempts from behind the arc.

Wearing out the Paint

• The Lady Raiders had their way inside in the first half, scoring 22 of their 54 points inside the painted area. They finished with 38 points in the paint on the night.

Chalking Up the 40's

• Tech's 54 points over the first half marked a season-best first-half output and the sixth time this year with at least 40 points going into the lockerroom. In comparison, the Lady Raiders scored 40 points in the first half just three times last season. They have now had two 50-point first halves this year. They did not have any last year.

Double Digits in 10 for No. 41

- Seals' 20 points gives her 10 games this season in which she has scored in double figures. With her 13 rebounds, it gives her four double-doubles on the year. It is her fifth game of the season with 15-plus points.

Odds and Ends

- The Lady Raiders went on an 11-0 run over a 5:16 span, 11:07-5:51, during the first half.
- After falling behind 5-4 at the 18:28 mark, Tech outscored the Golden Eagles 50-19 for the remainder of the half.

Record With

- Seals (20), Myrick (18), Murphree (12) and Graham (13) all scored in double figures. It marks the eighth time this season with four players scoring in double figures. The Lady Raiders are 7-1 on the year when this happens.
- Tech has had at least three players record 10-or-more points in every game this season. The Lady Raiders are now 11-1 when three players score in double digits.
- Tech's 50 percent shooting (31-62) marks the Lady Raiders' third game shooting at least 50 percent from the field. They are 3-0 on the year when this happens.
- With its six three pointers, Tech has knocked down five three-point shots in six games this season. The Lady Raiders are 5-1 when this occurs.
- With a 48-30 advantage on the boards, Tech is 9-0 when winning the battle on the boards.
- The Lady Raiders are now 7-1 on the season when playing in the friendly confines of the United Spirit Arena.

Individual Highs

- Seals' 20 points ties a career high. Her eight free throws made was both a season and career high.
