Starting the Game

• Lady Raider coach Kristy Curry used her 10th different starting lineup this season, going with Tiny Henderson (g), Keisha Walker (g), Jordan Murphree (g), Dominic Seals (f) and Erin Myrick (c). Oklahoma countered with Danielle Robinson (g), Jenna Plumley (g), Courtney Paris (c), Amanda Thompson (f) and Ashley Paris (f)

Sooner Showdowns

• The two squads met for the 37th time in the history of the series tonight. Even with the loss, Tech leads the series 21-16.

With the Loss...

- Tech has lost six-straight games to the Sooners.
- Tech falls to 16-12 and 4-10 in conference play.
- The Lady Raiders are now 2-8 against teams ranked in the Top 25 this season.

Spirit Arena Send Off

• Erin Myrick played her final regular season home game as a Lady Raider. She finished with eight points and five rebounds in 29 minutes. Tech also said farewell to injured senior Teddy Griffin and two student managers.

An M&M Half

• Murphree and Maria Moore combined for 21 of Tech's 36 first half points. Murphree scored 12 and Moore chipped in nine, all in the first 10 minutes of play.

Close Contests

• This was the Lady Raiders' 10th game this year decided by 10 points or less. They are 4-6 in these games.

Dominic... Again

• With her 10 points, Seals has now scored in double figures 21 times on the season.

Odds and Ends

• Murphree's free throw with 8:37 left in the first half gave Tech its first lead of the game.

• Tech went on a 13-3 run over 6:20 (12:24 to 6:04) in the first half.

• With its 36-29 halftime lead, the Lady Raiders have now led 16 times going into the lockerroom. With the loss, they are now 12-4 when leading at the half.

• The Lady Raiders' bench outscored the Sooner bench 13-0 in the first half and 19-2 on the game.

• Oklahoma All-American Courtney Paris recorded her 92nd career double-double with 19 points and 22 rebounds.

Odds and Ends Cont...

- Murphree has now scored in double figures 15 times this season. Her 18 points ties her season high, which she set previously against UNLV in the fourth game of the season.
- Murphree (18), Moore (12) and Seals (10) all scored in double figures to mark the 17th time this season that three Lady Raiders have scored in double figures. Tech is now 13-4 on the season when this happens.
