STARTING OFF...

After winning their first conference match of the season, the Texas Tech Soccer team faces its first true weekend on the road in Big 12 play, traveling to Kansas for a 4 p.m. Oct. 3 match and Missouri Oct. 5, beginning at 1 p.m.

LOOKING AHEAD

The Red Raiders return to the John Walker Soccer Complex next weekend to defend the Battle for the Brand trophy against Baylor Oct. 10, before hosting the nationally-ranked Texas Longhorns Oct. 12.

SCOUTING KANSAS

Kansas enters the weekend 7-3-0 overall and 1-1-0 in the Big 12, having defeated Iowa State, 3-2, and falling to Nebraska, 2-1, last weekend. The Jayhawks took last season's match, winning, 4-1, in Lubbock. The Red Raiders have not defeated Kansas since 2003 and have never won in Lawrence. Kansas is led by the combination of Monica Dolinsky, Emily Cressy and Kortney Clifton who combine to have 34 of the Jayhawks' 68 total points. Julie Hanley leads KU in goal as the junior has allowed 14 goals for a 1.43 goals-against average, while collecting 30 saves. The Jayhawks are coached by Mark Francis, who is in his ninth season at KU with a career record of 111-73-10.

SCOUTING MISSOURI

After splitting its matches to open conference last weekend, Missouri sits 6-3-0 overall and 1-1-0 in the Big 12. The Red Raiders fell to the Tigers twice last season, a 3-0 loss at home and a 4-3 double-overtime loss in the first round of the Big 12 Championship. In its last trip to Missouri in 2006, Tech defeated a then No. 17-ranked Tigers, 3-1, its first victory in Columbia since 1996. The Tigers are led offensively by Kristin Andrighetto and Alysha Bonnicks, who combine for seven of MU's 17 goals. Tasha Dittamore has played every minute in goal, allowing only ten goals, while collecting four shutouts, which is tied with Tech's Tina Rincon for the conference lead. The Tigers are led by reigning Big 12 Coach of the Year Bryan Blitz, who is in his 13th season at Missouri.

KEEP AN EYE ON...JUNIOR SARABETH CLOPTON

The vocal leader on the Red Raider backline, junior Sarabeth Clopton has already set career-highs in goals with three, totaling six points. A year after recording the second-highest total minutes, Clopton has started in all ten matches for Tech, playing a team-high 874 minutes.

RED RAIDERS EARN FIRST VICTORY OVER OKLAHOMA SINCE 2000

With Tech's 2-1 double-overtime win over Oklahoma last Sunday, the Red Raiders earned their first victory over the Sooners since 2000. Tech had also not won in overtime since 2005 and had never previously defeated a Big 12 opponent in overtime.

RINCON AMONG ALL-TIME BEST TECH GOALKEEPERS

Already the Tech all-time leader in career shutouts, senior goalkeeper is quickly making her way up another list for career saves. With 42 on the season, Rincon is now seven shy of Megan Knauss' 266 saves set from 2002 to 2005. Rincon's 42 saves is third in the Big 12, while her four shutouts are tied for the conference lead.

MIHELICH SEES FIRST ACTION OF SEASON

Sophomore transfer Leanne Mihelich saw her first action of the season last Sunday against Oral Roberts as she played a total of 60 minutes. Mihelich joins the Red Raiders from the University of Arkansas-Little Rock where she led the Trojans in goals (9) and points (22) as a freshman. Mihelich had previously been recovering from an ankle injury sustained in preseason practices.

McCALL MAKING HARRISON DECISION EASIER FOR STONE

Freshman defender Casey McCall is making Tech head coach Tom Stone's life easier not just by her play on the backline, but in his decision to keep Brittney Harrison playing forward for the time being. Known for her speed and aggression, McCall is one-for-one on shot attempts this season, netting her first career goal against Alabama A&M, while Harrison leads the Red Raiders with a Big 12 second-best seven goals.

TECH REMAINS No. 15 IN SOCCER BUZZ CENTRAL REGION

The Red Raiders remained ranked No. 15 in the Soccer Buzz Central Region poll for the fourth-consecutive week. Tech has been ranked as high as No. 13 in the poll this year. The Big 12 holds six of the top 10 spots in this week's poll with Texas sitting atop the rankings. Tech has also received votes in the NSCAA/Adidas Central Region poll this season.

TECH SURPASSES 2007 GOAL TOTAL

Through 10 matches, the Red Raiders have netted 28 goals, which is already higher than their 2007 total of 22. The 18th-best scoring offense in the nation, Tech has had a player with multiple-goals in four matches, a feat only accomplished twice in 2007.

YELINEK AMONG NATIONAL ASSIST LEADERS

Freshman Lauren Yelinek has a team-high five assists on the season, which is tied for second in the Big 12 and tops among conference freshmen. Making her figures look more impressive, Yelinek has done all this playing left-back, a position not naturally designed for high assist numbers.

RED RAIDERS OFF TO BEST START SINCE 1996

Tech resumes Big 12 play last weekend on its best start since the 1996 season that saw the Red Raiders begin the year 6-1-0. Tech entered last weekend at 5-2-1 overall and 0-1-0 in the Big 12. The Red Raiders' 5-1-1 non-conference schedule is a vast improvement of their 2-3-1 record last season, a goal of Tech head coach Tom Stone prior to the season. Tech has one non-conference match remaining, Oct. 26 against TCU.

STARTING QUICKER, SCORING MORE

The Red Raiders have scored 16 goals in the first half this season, 14 more than all of last season. The Red Raiders have scored within the first five minutes of the match five times this season, including Brittney Harrison's school-record goal only 12 seconds into the Alabama A&M match. Tech has scored in the first half in six of eight matches this season and is 5-1 in those matches.

HARRISON COMPLETES HAT TRICK AGAINST NORTHWESTERN STATE

A week after connecting on the quickest goal in school history, Brittney Harrison completed the quickest hat trick in school history against Northwestern State as the junior netted three goals within the match's first 15 minutes. Entering this weekend, Harrison is second in the conference with six goals.

EVERYTHING COMES IN MULTIPLES FOR HINDS

Katie Hinds not only scored her first career goal against Alabama A&M, but she also added another one in the second half. A week later, Hinds added two assists against Northwestern State, which had previously not been accomplished in a single match by a Red Raider since Amy Reinhart in 2006. In the Oral Roberts match, Hinds added her second multiple-goal match of the season as the sophomore connected on Tech's first two goals en route to a 4-0 victory.

TECH LEADING AT THE HALF

After not leading a match at the half once in 2007, the Red Raiders have entered halftime with the lead in all six of its eight matches this season. Prior to the start of the season, Tech had not gone into the half with a lead since Oct. 10, 2006, when the Red Raiders led 1-0 over Texas State. The Red Raiders ended up defeating the Bobcats, 3-0.

LYTLE STARTING SEASON STRONG

Finally healthy after sitting out the entire 2007 season because of injury, redshirt freshman Taylor Lytle has begun the 2008 campaign off strong, totaling 12 points off four goals and four assists. She scored her first career goal in Tech's 3-0 win over UTSA. Lytle also connected on her first career game-winning goal in Tech's 5-0 victory over Alabama A&M earlier this season.

FRESHMEN CONTRIBUTING EARLY

Prior to the 2008 season, Tech head coach Tom Stone said he knew he would have to rely on his incoming class of 12 freshmen. Already eight matches into the season, the freshmen have contributed 28 of 78 total points. Ten matches into the 2007 season, the Red Raiders had only six points coming from freshmen.

HOME STREAK COMES TO THE END

Dating back to the 2007 season, the Red Raiders were riding a four-match home winning streak entering to the Colorado match. The streak was Tech's longest such streak in Lubbock since the beginning of the 1996 season when the Red Raiders opened the year with four-consecutive home victories.

STONE LOOKING FOR STRONG PERFORMANCE IN NON-CONFERENCE

After getting over the learning that was his first season, Tech head coach Tom Stone is looking to strengthen the one part of Tech's 2007 record that was less than desirable, the non-conference. The Red Raiders opened last season with a 2-3-1 non-conference schedule, but had two matches against Stephen F. Austin and Jackson State cancelled.

JOHN WALKER SOCCER COMPLEX

Tech's newest facility on campus, the John Walker Soccer Complex, officially opened in Tech's season-opening 4-0 victory over Lamar. Named after Tech alum and donor John B. Walker, the stadium is not expected to be completed until Sept. 12, when the Red Raiders face Arizona. Complete with seating for around 1,400 fans, an awning and a pressbox, the John Walker Soccer Complex will quickly become one of the nicest soccer facilities in the country. Prior to the 2009 season, the Red Raiders will move into a new field house that will be equipped with state-of-the-art locker rooms, coaches' offices, a players' lounge and athletic training facilities. The John Walker Soccer Complex is located on 10th Street off the Texas Tech Parkway, which is west of University Medical Center.

RED RAIDERS SELECTED SEVENTH IN PRESEASON CONFERENCE POLL

If the Texas Tech soccer team is going to finish in the top half of the Big 12 for the second-consecutive season, it will once again have to defy the odds as the Red Raiders were selected to finish seventh among the league's 11 participating schools in a preseason poll of conference coaches. The Red Raiders were predicted to finish 11th in 2007 before finishing fifth and advancing to the Big 12 Championship for the first time since 1999. Texas led the poll with 94 points, while Texas A&M and Missouri completed the top three with 93 and 77 points, respectively.

RINCON, SIMS NAMED TEAM CAPTAINS

Prior to the season, the Red Raiders voted seniors Shannon Sims and Tina Rincon to serve as the team's captains. Sims, a midfielder from Plano, Texas, started all 17 matches last season, while Rincon added to her already impressive career numbers, adding 97 saves and five shutouts in 2007. Rincon is third all-time in career saves and shutouts with 217 and eight, respectively.

MIHELICH JOINS THE RED RAIDERS

Sophomore Leanne Mihelich joins the Red Raiders this season after transferring from the University of Arkansas at Little Rock. Mihelich led the Trojans as a freshman in both goals with nine and points with 22. She will miss the first several weeks of the season with a foot injury.

STONE ADDS 12 FRESHMEN FOR SECOND SEASON

In his first recruiting class, head coach Tom Stone found much needed depth to an already talented Tech roster, adding 10 freshman - Lexi Castellano, Maggie Fete, Hope Hanson, Kacy Hardie, Casey McCall, Kendyl Mygatt, Madison Terry, Erin Villareal, Dawn Ward and Lauren Yelinek - on signing day last February. Both Lauren Clary and Jordan Johnson walked-on to the team during preseason practices.

DE LEON, WARD OUT FOR SEASON

Both sophomore Karen De Leon and freshman Dawn Ward will miss the entire 2008 season with injuries. De Leon, one of Tech's top freshman a year ago, connected on two goals and provided two assists in 2007, while Ward was the top prospect in the 2008 recruiting class.

TECH TO HOST TEN MATCHES IN 2008

The Red Raiders will find a more favorable schedule in 2008 as Tech will host 10 home matches. Tech will also lose its "Lone Ranger" status from a year ago where the Red Raiders had to play a Big 12 opponent on both Fridays and Sundays, while each other conference opponent had an open date within its schedule. On top of five non-conference home matches, Tech also hosts national-powers and in-state rivals Texas (Oct. 12) and Texas A&M (Oct. 24). Four of Tech's five road conference matches are against Big 12 North opponents, Kansas (Oct. 3), Missouri (Oct. 5), Iowa State (Oct. 17) and Nebraska (Oct. 19).



Tech Head Coach Tom Stone
Second Season
Duke, 1987

Known nationally first as a player, and now as a coach, Tom Stone enters his second season as Texas Tech head coach, after a first year that saw the program rise to new heights.

With essentially only two months before the 2007 opener following his May hiring, Stone had little time to evaluate his new players, let alone get to really know them, making the non-conference portion of the season a learning experience both for Stone and the players. In October, however, things finally came together as the Red Raiders won four out of five conference matches down the stretch to qualify for the Big 12 Championship for the first time since 1999, while also matching the most conference wins in school history.

Following his inaugural season, Stone was named the assistant coach of the U.S. Under-20 National Team that traveled to Puebla, Mexico. Stone will rejoin the team following the 2008 season for the FIFA U-20 World Cup.

Prior to his arrival at Tech, Stone spent the 2006 season at Clemson as an assistant coach, where the Tigers finished 11-8-5 and earned a birth into the Final Eight in the NCAA Tournament.

Several of Stone's greatest accomplishments as a coach, however, may have come from his time leading the Atlanta Beat of the WUSA for all three years of its existence from 2001-2003. Being the first coach hired when the league formed, Stone proved his worth quickly, claiming the inaugural WUSA regular season title. The Beat advanced to the Founders Cup title match in both 2001 and 2003. In his three seasons with the Beat, Stone finished with the highest winning percentage among WUSA coaches, finishing 13 games over .500, while also being named an all-star coach twice.

Soon after the league's fall, Stone was named the technical director of the Tophat Soccer Club in Atlanta, which is one of the top girls youth programs in the southern region. While with Tophat, Stone was primarily involved in all areas of club and player development and the College Prep Program that prepares top players for college soccer opportunities. He was also the head coach for the 2007 Gold Team that won the Georgia State Championship in 2004 and the Southern Regional Premier League in 2005.

Before beginning his professional career, Stone was the founding director of coaching at the Colorado Rush Soccer Club from 1991 to 2000. Under Stone's direction, the Rush would go on to win 35 state cups along with 12 regional championships and seven national championships, becoming arguably the most successful youth girls program in the U.S. from 1997 to 2000.

Stone has also served as a volunteer assistant coach at Duke in 1997 and the University of Denver in 1996.

When not coaching, Stone has served as an analyst for various national television networks, covering everything from the NCAA Championship to the World Cup. He has worked as the lead soccer analyst for both CSTV and Fox Sports, while also joining ESPN for its coverage of the 2003 Women's World Cup. Stone has also written guest columns for various soccer websites.

Stone holds a USSF "A" License. He and his wife, Lindsey, currently reside in Lubbock with their one-year-old son, Leyton, and are expecting their second child in September 2008.
