Hurricane Katrina

Hurricane Katrina slammed into the Gulf Coast and delivered a devastating blow to New Orleans on Monday, Aug. 29, 2005 forcing the evacuation of the entire city. As the levees broke and the extent of the damages to the city and the Tulane campus became known, University President Scott Cowen gave the word that the Green Wave athletic teams would continue to compete - carrying the torch, the name and the face of Tulane University - even though the university would not hold classes on its campus for the fall semester. In an unprecedented move, the entire Tulane athletic department has relocated to four locations for the fall. The men's basketball team is based in College Station, Texas, on the campus of Texas A&M. In addition to Texas A&M, Louisiana Tech, SMU, and Texas Tech are hosting Green Wave teams:

Tulane is expected to return to New Orleans in December with the spring semester slated to begin on January 17th. The Tulane campus escaped serious damage from flooding and the University has had work crews on campus since mid-September, bringing things back on line.

While the Wilson Center, Tulane's main athletic building did sustain serious flood damage, Fogelman Arena was located in an area of campus which appears to have escaped major damage and it is hoped the building will be available for the Green Wave's conference home schedule.

Tulane's 2005-06 men's basketball schedule was not available at the publication deadline. The original schedule was set for release on August 29th, however, due to the team's relocation, much of the non-conference schedule is being modified.
