TULANE TANGLES WITH INNER-CITY RIVAL NEW ORLEANS THIS WEDNESDAY

• The Tulane basketball team (4-2) makes its first trip to Lake Front Arena in over four years this Wednesday when the Green Wave and its inner-city rival, New Orleans (1-4), renew their storied rivalry for the 44th time. The cities only two Division I schools will tip-off at 7 p.m.

The Wave is 1-1 in its last two outings and has won three out of its last four contests. Tulane is 0-1 on the road this season after falling at No. 7/8 Texas (76-51) on Nov. 25.

TU's last two contests came at a neutral site last weekend at the 2008 USA Basketball Classic where the team finished in third place with a 1-1 record.

Junior **Kevin Sims** leads the Wave in scoring with 15.2 points per game, assists with 3.7 per outing and enters the contest with UNO shooting 52 percent from the field (26-50) and from behind the three-point line (13-25), while classmate **Asim McQueen** is the team's top rebounder with 7.0 boards per outing.

Over the past two games, Sims and McQueen have a combined shooting percentage of 51.2 percent (21-41) and a scoring average of 31.0 points, and both players have registered 20-point outings. Sims finished with 20 points vs. Maine, while McQueen tallied a career-high 20 points vs. UC Davis.

Senior **Robinson Louisme** has also been very effective in his last two contests, hitting 11 of 17 (65.0) of his field goal attempts and is averaging 12.5 points and 7.5 rebounds.

SCOUTING THE PRIVATEERS

• The New Orleans Privateers (1-4) returns three letterwinners, including just one starter, from last year's 19-13 squad, and features nine newcomers. The Privateers return to their home court, Lake Front Arena, for the first time since the 2004-05 campaign. The facility was severely damaged following Hurricane Katrina in August 2005, and the team was forced to play in the Human Performance Center the last three seasons.

UNO opened the season with a 0-4 start before picking up its first victory of the year in its last game, a 61-57 win at home vs. Southern.

The Privateers are 1-1 at home this season after falling to North Carolina State, 65-59, in its season opener.

Senior **T.J. Worley** leads the team in scoring with 17.8 points per game, while junior-transfer **Darrian McKinstry** is second with 14.2 points per outing. Another junior-transfer, **Ejike Hart**, is the team's top rebounder with 6.0 rebounds per contest.

UNO's top returning scorer and rebounder, senior **Kyndall Dykes**, made his first appearance of the year against Southern and finished with four points and six rebounds. Dykes, who averaged 13.6 points and 5.3 rebounds per game a year ago, was sidelined for the first four games with an injury.

• Tulane has held three of its six opponents to below 65 points this season, including allowing a season low 56 points to Maine in a 66-56 victory, 59 points to Albany State (W, 87-59) and 62 to McNeese State (W, 68-62).

SERIES RECORD & NOTES

• Wednesday's game marks the 44th all-time and 15th straight meeting between Tulane and New Orleans and the Green Wave leads the overall series, 22-21.

• UNO brings a two-game win streak into Wednesday's night showdown and owns an all-time record of 9-5 against the Wave at Lake Front Arena.

• The Green Wave's last win against UNO came at Fogelman Arena, 78-64, on Nov. 14, 2006, while head coach Dave Dickerson notched his first-ever win as a collegiate coach against the Privateers when both teams faced off on the campus of Texas A&M University on Nov. 22, 2005, due to Hurricane Katrina.

• Tulane will be looking for its first win at Lake Front Arena since Jan. 13, 1992, when the No. 19/19 ranked Green Wave topped the Privateers 83-61. Since that game, TU is 0-3 at the arena. Tulane and New Orleans played their annual game at the Louisiana Superdome (1976-79; 1995-99) or at New Orleans Arena (2000) during the Sugar Bowl Classic.

• Tulane and New Orleans have played one common opponent this season- Nicholls State. UNO fell on the road at Nicholls, 79-62, on Nov. 19, while Tulane dispatched the Colonels on its home floor, 72-70, on Nov. 22.

• Tulane will face a modern in-state school for the 374th time this Wednesday when it battles New Orleans. The Green Wave has a record of 206-167 (.552) against in-state schools in Louisiana, which includes Dillard, Loyola, LSU, Nicholls State, Southern (N.O.), Southern (B.R.), Centenary, Louisiana College, Louisiana-Lafayette, Louisiana-Monroe, Louisiana Tech, New Orleans, Northwestern State, Southeastern Louisiana and Xavier (La.).

• Tulane has an all-time record of 35-5 against teams from the Southland Conference. The Wave's last contest against an SLC squad was a 72-70 victory over Nicholls State on Nov. 22, 2008, at Fogelman Arena.

TU IN NON-LEAGUE HOME GAMES UNDER DICKERSON:

• Tulane has an all-time record of 19-5 (.792) against non-conference teams in New Orleans under Dickerson, including a combined 16-4 the last three seasons. The Wave is currently 3-0 and was 7-1 a year ago and 6-3 in 2006-07 and 3-1 in 2005-06.

DECEMBER SUCCESS

• Over the last two years, the month of December has been a successful period for the Green Wave. Tulane sports a combined record of 9-4, including a mark of 6-2 during the month a year ago and a record of 3-2 in 2006-07.

Last year, Tulane dropped just two of eight games and both the losses were to squads who were receiving votes at the time of the game (Syracuse, Saint Mary's). Among the eight wins were highlight victories over eventual Southeastern Conference Tournament champion, Georgia, Big East Conference member, St. John's, and Gardner-Webb, who upset Kentucky earlier in the season.

Tulane will face six opponents this month, including upcoming opponent Western Kentucky, who knocked off No. 3 Louisville last week, and a George Mason squad that advanced to the Final Four three years ago.

DICKERSON CAPTURES 50TH CAREER VICTORY

• Tulane handed fourth-year head coach Dave Dickerson his 50th career coaching victory last week with its 66-56 victory over Maine at the 2008 USA Basketball Classic. Dickerson has a career mark of 50-47 and became the sixth coach in school history to reach the 50-win plateau.

He earned his first-ever win over UNO (11/22/05) and his 25th win at Marshall (2/17/07).

SIMS NAMED TO BOB COUSY AWARD WATCH LIST

Tulane junior point guard **Kevin Sims** is one of 34 players from around the nation, and the lone representative from Conference USA, that have been named to the 2009 Bob Cousy Award Watch List. Sims has started 52 of 62 games and has produced 690 points and 222 assists over the past two seasons, and is one of the top guards in C-USA.

The Bob Cousy Award presented by The Hartford is given to the top collegiate male basketball point guard annually spanning across all divisions within the game by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. The selection criteria emphasize leadership, team work, success, and fundamentals as being critical parts for the game of basketball as a point guard.

McQUEEN OFF TO SOLID START AS A FULL TIME STARTER

• Junior **Asim McQueen** has been productive as a first-year starter this season. McQueen is the team's top rebounder (7.3) and is averaging 9.5 points per contest. He has scored nine or more points in four of six games, including a career-best 20 points against UC Davis, and has five or more rebounds in every contest this year, including a career-high 11-rebound performance at No. 7/8 Texas.

SIMS IS TU'S STEADY ENGINE

• Junior Kevin Sims has become a force to be reckoned with this season. The 5'10" point guard leads TU in scoring with 15.6 points and assists with 3.7 per game this season, and he already has surpassed the 20-point plateau twice this season with a 22-point outing against Nicholls State and a 20-point finish vs. Maine. He has reached double figures in five of six games.

In TU's last game vs. Maine, Sims hit 6-of-10 field goals, including a 4-of-5 sharp-shooting performance from behind the arc and a perfect 4-of-4 effort from the foul line. He also found time to dish out four assists.

A BENCH-MARK EFFORT

• Tulane's bench has been effective for the Green Wave through three games, outscoring its opponents' bench 114-77. TU's bench outscored Nicholls State bench, 15-3, Texas' reserves, 27-16, Albany State's bench players, 35-12 and Maine (10-0).

BOOKER AN EFFECTIVE INSIDE-OUT PLAYER

• Sophomore-transfer **David Booker** has quickly proven he is as good of a scorer on the perimeter as he is inside the paint. Booker is shooting 52.4 percent from the field, but has heated up from the three-point line where he has canned 3-of-5 treys for a team-high 60 percent. Booker nailed two treys at No. 7/8 Texas and he finished 1-for-1 vs. Nicholls State.

Booker displayed his versatility in his last game vs. Albany State, hitting all four field goals inside the paint to finish with eight points and he also grabbed six boards.

THE .500 CLUB

• Tulane has four players shooting better than 50 percent from the field this season, including **Jon Andersen** (1.000), **David Booker** (.524), **Kevin Sims** (.520) and **Robinson Louisme** (.568). This foursome has combined to connect on 64 of 117 of its field goal attempts for 55 percent.

TIMMONS HAS CAREER OUTING VS. ALBANY STATE

• Freshman **Kendall Timmons** needed just four games to notch a career-high in double figures with 13 points off the bench against Albany State. Timmons was very productive in his 13 minutes, converting 4-of-5 field goal attempts and draining 5-of-6 free throw attempts and nabbing two steals.

TU IN FOURTH YEAR UNDER DICKERSON

Tulane sets sail in its fourth season under head coach **Dave Dickerson** in 2008-09, and will look to notch its third straight winning season for the first time since the mid 1990s. Dickerson, who has an overall record of 50-47, was named the NABC District 8 Coach of the Year after leading the Wave to its second straight 17-win season last season.

TULANE BEGINS SEASON WITH 3-1 START FOR THIRD STRAIGHT YEAR

• Tulane has notched back-to-back 17-win seasons and a big reason for that success was its strong start, and the 2008-09 campaign marks the third straight year the Green Wave has opened the season with a 3-1 record.

TU opened the 2006-07 and 2007-08 campaigns with 3-1 records, but each squad fell in its fifth game. The 2008-09 Green Wave opened the year with a 3-1 mark before falling in its fifth game of the year.

WALK-ON HOGAN MAKES FIRST COLLEGIATE APPEARANCE

• Sophomore **Geoff Hogan** walked on to the Tulane basketball team this past October and needed just a little over a month to earn his first collegiate playing experience. Hogan, who hails from Kalispell, Mont., came off the bench in the first half against Albany State and once again in the second period, and combined to play just one minute, but managed to grab two rebounds (1-off; 1 def) while he was on the floor.

INSIDE THE 2008-09 GREEN WAVE

• The Wave has notched back-to-back seasons with 17 victories, which marks the school's first stretch of consecutive winning seasons in 11 years.

• During its 17 wins last season, the Green Wave put together three or more straight wins on four occasions, including a stretch with four and five victories.

• TU has a record of 29-13 (.690) at Fogelman Arena and a mark of 19-5 (.792) against non-conference teams in New Orleans under **Dave Dickerson**.

• Tulane was once again one of the top shot blocking teams in the country last season with 171, which ranked No. 19 in the nation with 5.3 per game. Over the last two years, TU has been tough in the paint, rejecting a combined 359 of its opponents' field goal attempts, or 5.8 per outing.

INSIDE THE 2008-09 GREEN WAVE (CONTINUED)

- **Robinson Louisme** hit 60.2 percent of his field goal attempts (127-211) last season, which led all Conference USA players in field goal percentage, and was the fourth-best single season effort in school history. Louisme hit his first 13 field goal attempts of the year before suffering his first miss in the fourth game, and he shot 60 percent or better from the field in 19 of 32 games.

- **Kevin Sims** accomplished a feat not seen at Tulane in over 10 years. Sims put together back-to-back seasons with 100+ assists with 102 as a freshman and 120 during his sophomore campaign, which ranks ninth on Tulane's single season charts. Sims is the first player to record consecutive 100+ assists seasons since Jerald Honeycutt with 120 in 1995-96, and 131 in 1996-97.

- When Sims wasn't dishing the ball to his teammates he was taking it away from the opposition. Sims' 44 steals was not only the best by a Tulane player last season, but ranked eighth among C-USA players. Sims' six steals at Syracuse tied for the best single game effort in the league in 2007-08.

- One year ago, the Green Wave outscored its opponents in the paint, 932 to 700, and won 15 of its 17 games when dominating the lane.

- Tulane played 32 games during the 2007-08 campaign, which marked the most in a single-season since the 1995-96 campaign.

- **Kevin Sims** did not have to worry about playing time last season. He not only led the team in minutes played with 34.6 per game, but his 1,108 total ranks as the fifth most on the school's single season list for minutes played.

- Despite nagging injuries last season, **Daniel Puckett** started 18 of 31 games and averaged 5.1 points and 1.5 assists per game.

- **Eric Vianney, Johnny Mayhane** and **Kris Richard** combined for 48 three-point field goals last season.

- **Asim McQueen** showed a flash of his potential last year on the road at Rice when he notched a career-high 15 points. In 16 minutes of action, McQueen hit his first career three-pointer in the first half and then torched the nets for 12 points and two highlight reel dunks in the second half. He finished a perfect 7-of-7 from the field.

FORMER TU STAR LEWIS RETURNS HOME AS AN ASSISTANT COACH

Former Tulane basketball standout **Kim Lewis** returned to his alma mater when head coach **Dave Dickerson** added the Louisiana native to his staff as an assistant coach on Sept. 9.

Lewis, 35, begins his third tour with the Green Wave in 2008-09. He was a four-year letterwinner for Tulane from 1990-95, and later served an assistant coach from 1996-98. Lewis spent the last two seasons at Duquesne under head coach Ron Everhart, a former Tulane assistant coach under Perry Clark who recruited and coached Lewis during his playing career with the Green Wave.

Following the 2007-08 season with the Dukes, Lewis was hired by Centenary head coach Greg Gary as the top assistant for the Gents. Lewis and Gary each served as assistant coaches at Duquesne and were teammates at Tulane from 1990-92. Prior to Duquesne, Lewis had coaching stints at Northeastern (2004-2006), McNeese State (2002-03) and Xavier (La.) (2001-02).

As a collegian, Lewis played at Tulane from 1991-95 and led the Wave to 78 wins and three postseason tournament appearances during his career.

NINE POSTSEASON TEAMS, 15 HOME GAMES HIGH-LIGHT TULANE'S 2008-09 MEN'S HOOPS SCHEDULE

The 2008-09 Tulane Green Wave men's basketball schedule features nine exciting games against 2008 postseason teams, 15 home contests and marquee matchups against national runner-up Memphis, Southeastern Conference member Auburn and pre-season top-five ranked Texas.

Tulane will face five NCAA Tournament teams, including Memphis, "Elite Eight" participant Texas, a Western Kentucky squad that advanced to the "Sweet Sixteen," a George Mason group that advanced to the Final Four in 2006 and South Alabama. The Wave will also battle UAB (NIT) and three teams that played in the inaugural College Basketball Invitational, including UTEP, Houston and champion Tulsa.

Tulane's non-conference home schedule includes Western Kentucky, Albany State, North Carolina A&T, Binghamton and a trio of games against in-state schools McNeese State, Nicholls State and Grambling State. The Green Wave's Conference USA home slate features Tulsa, Southern Miss, UTEP, UAB, Marshall, UCF, East Carolina and Rice.

TULANE SIGNS A PAIR OF STANDOUT GUARDS TO NATIONAL LETTERS-OF-INTENT

Tulane University head men's basketball coach **Dave Dickerson** signed two standout basketball players- **Jordan Callahan** and **Aaron Holmes**- to national letters-of-intent on Nov. 12, the first day of national signing day.

Callahan is a 5-11, 170-pound point guard who graduated from Blessed Trinity in Roswell, Ga., in 2008 and is currently enrolled at The New Hampton School, a prep school in New Hampton, New Hampshire. As a high school star at Blessed Trinity under head coach Brian Marks, he led the team to a 48-10 overall record during his final two years and earned honorable mention all-state and team MVP honors both seasons. During his senior campaign, Callahan averaged 14.3 points and 4.8 assists per game and set the school's single-season scoring mark with 443 points.

A 6-5, 195-pound shooting guard from St. Petersburg, Fla., and 2006 graduate of St. Petersburg Catholic, Holmes originally signed with Florida State out of high school, but transferred to South Florida following his first semester. After sitting out one full year due to NCAA Transfer rules, he played in 18 conference games with the Bulls, but left USF after the 2007-08 campaign due to a coaching change. Holmes is currently enrolled at Santa Fe Community College in Gainesville, Fla., and will have two years of eligibility remaining.

Rated as a top 50 national prospect as a senior, Holmes scored 2,748 career points, the most in school history, and led St. Petersburg Catholic to four straight district titles and three trips to the state Final Four. He is the only player to be named All-Sun-coast Player of the Year three times by the St. Petersburg Times (2004-06), and was also runner-up for Florida's Mr. Basketball in 2006. He also led his AAU team to the Showtime National title.

- Tulane is 3-1 all-time in season openers under Dickerson.
- Named the 2008 National Association of Basketball Coaches District 8 Coach of the Year.
- Tulane has a record of 29-13 (.690) at Fogelman Arena and a mark of 19-5 (.792) against non-conference teams in New Orleans under Dickerson.
- Has a record of 3-3 in the Conference USA Tournament and has never lost a first round game.
- Registered his 40th career win (at Tulsa) a little over midway through his third season (76 games) and joined Clifford Wells (67 games), Charles Moir (71 games), Ned Fowler (61 games) and Perry Clark (84 games) as the only coaches in the 97-year history of Tulane basketball to win 40 games in under three seasons. The 76 games are the fourth fewest games in school history needed to attain 40 wins, and he currently ranks seventh for career coaching victories.
- Under his tutelage, three Green Wave players have earned all-conference honors, including All-Conference USA third-team performers Quincy Davis (2006) and David Gomez (2007, 2008), and Kevin Sims, who was selected to the All C-USA Freshman team in 2007.
- During his second season, Dickerson led Tulane to a 17-13 overall record and TU recorded its best conference finish in nine years with a 9-7 league mark, which was good enough for fourth place. TU's 17 victories marked the most wins in seven seasons and the program's first winning season in four years.

RICHARD, SIMS LEADS TU PAST McNEESE STATE, 68-62

TU guards combine for 34 points

New Orleans – Tulane junior Kevin Sims and sophomore Kris Richard each scored 17 points and senior Robinson Louisme added 11 points to lead the Green Wave to a 68-62 victory over McNeese State in the season opener for both teams at Fogelman Arena.

Tulane (1-0) appeared to be pulling away when sophomore Johnny Mayhane jump started a 10-5 run early in the second half. However, the Cowboys rode the sharpshooting of Stephen Martin and Patrick Richard to scrape back into contention. Martin scored five consecutive points during an 8-2 run and Patrick Richard's three-pointer at 8:24 brought the visitors from Lake Charles to within three points, 44-41.

The Wave answered with a trey of its own from senior Daniel Puckett to extend its lead to six points and eventually pushed its advantage to eight points on several occasions, but the scrappy McNeese State team continued to chip away and would not let Tulane off the hook. With TU leading 53-45 at the 5:34 mark, Diego Kaplan caught fire with back-to-back three-pointers that trimmed the deficit to four points.

Freshman Kendall Timmons and Louisme each hit their two free charity shots to give the Wave another eight point lead. Martin brought the Cowboys to within six points and looked to have an opportunity to get even closer following a Kris Richard turnover, but Richard came right back and stole the ball from Kaplan and finished the play with a two-handed dunk.

Tulane converted five of seven free throw attempts down the stretch, including two by Sims with 0:07 remaining, that iced the first win of the season for the Wave.

TU FALLS AT NO. 7/8 TEXAS, 71-51

Sims scored 11; McQueen grabs 11 rebounds

Austin, Texas – Junior Kevin Sims scored a team-high 11 points and classmate Asim McQueen grabbed a game- and career-high 11 rebounds, but the No. 7/8 ranked Texas Longhorns used an 18-4 run in the first half to take control of the game and hand Tulane a 76-51 loss in the road opener in front of 10,800 at the Erwin Center.

Texas (2-0) jumped on Tulane early and led 6-0 in the opening minutes. However, the Green Wave (1-1) responded with a 6-0 run of its own, which was sparked by a pair of Sims free throws and he tied the game with a lay-up at 16:23. The teams traded baskets over the next few minutes and TU trailed 13-10 following a finger roll lay-up from sophomore Johnny Mayhane.

However, the nationally-ranked Longhorns flexed their muscle and ran off an 18-4 run to take a commanding 31-14 advantage with 7:43 remaining in the first half. Tulane pulled to within 13 points on a trey by sophomore David Booker, but couldn't get any closer and trailed 42-25 at intermission.

The Green Wave was plagued by poor shooting (.321) and turnovers (12) in the opening period and was whistled for eight fouls, which resulted in a 10-of-15 effort from the foul line by the Longhorns.

Texas left no possibilities for a Tulane comeback by opening the second half with a 17-2 run to extend its lead to 59-27 with 15:41 remaining in the game. The Wave made a late run in the final 10 minutes, outscoring Texas, 16-7, with most of the players on the floor for the Wave coming off the bench.

SIMS 22 POINTS LEADS TULANE PAST NICHOLLS STATE, 72-70

Vianney's two free throws seals win for Wave

New Orleans – The Tulane men's basketball team made sure fans in attendance were given a show as the Green Wave edged out Nicholls State 72-70 Saturday afternoon at Fogelman Arena.

With the game tied 70-70 with five seconds to go in the contest, Tulane's Eric Vianney hit two free throws to put the Green Wave up by two. A layup at the buzzer by Nicholls State's Justin Payne was declared too late after review by the officials and the game was ruled final in favor of Tulane.

Sophomore guard Kevin Sims, who scored a team-high 22 points, hit his first trey to open the scoring, 3-0, a minute into the game but Nicholls State's Fred Hunter, who posted a game-high 23 points, answered back with a layup 24 seconds later.

As the clock ticked down, Hunter missed a layup, which Puckett rebounded. A timeout was called with five seconds to play after Hunter received his fifth personal foul, which sent Vianney to the line. His only free throw attempts of the night were good and Tulane went up 72-70, which was enough to secure the victory.

The teams exchanged baskets until the Colonels pulled away, extending their lead 14-9 on a three-point bucket from Dominic Friend with 15:20 to go in the half. Daniel Puckett (two points, five rebounds, two blocks) fed Sims, who hit another trey to bring Tulane within two, 14-12. Sims found his rhythm and followed with two assists, a steal, followed by another assist to spur the Green Wave to a 13-point scoring drive that put them up 25-16 with 11:44 to go in the first half.

RICHARD, LOUISME LEAD TU PAST ALBANY STATE, 87-59

Four Green Wave players reach double figures

New Orleans – Sophomore Kris Richard scored 10 of Tulane's first 15 points and led four Green Wave players into double figures with 18 points as Tulane dispatched Albany State, 87-59, Tuesday night in non-conference action at Fogelman Arena.

Richard exploded out of the gates with seven points in the first five minutes. With Tulane leading 12-8, Richard's three-pointer gave TU a seven-point lead, but more importantly sparked a 13-2 run. By the time Albany State's Sean Glenn hit short jumper at the 7:50 mark to snap the spurt, the Wave had built a 15-point cushion.

When Richard went to the bench for a breather, senior Robinson Louisme picked up the slack and scored 13 points in the first half. Tulane's smothering defense stifled the Golden Rams, limiting them to a 30.8 percent effort from the field in the opening period, while Tulane torched the nets by hitting 53.3 percent of its attempts.

Albany State's shooting improved in the second half, but TU continued to sizzle with a 50-percent effort from the field. The Golden Rams did manage to climb to within 18 points on a three-pointer from James Clark near the midway point, but a pair of free throws from Tulane freshman Kendall Timmons extended the Green Wave's lead back to 20 points, where TU remained for the rest of the game. Timmons gave Tulane its largest lead of the game when he nailed two foul shots to put the Wave up by 30 points with 0:33 remaining in the contest.

TU FALLS TO HOT SHOOTING UC DAVIS, 76-62

McQueen posts career-best 20 points

Mobile, Ala. – Junior Asim McQueen scored a career-high 20 points and grabbed a team-best eight rebounds, but the UC Davis Aggies shot nearly 62 percent from the field in the second half and used a 16-5 run near the midway point of the second period to hand Tulane a 76-62 setback in the first game of the 2008 USA Basketball Classic at the Mitchell Center.

The Green Wave (3-2) took an early four-point lead to begin the second half on a three-pointer from junior Kevin Sims and a lay-up by senior Robinson Louisme. However, the Aggies (2-4), who run a Princeton-style offense, nailed three treys and stormed back to build a six-point advantage at the 15:29 mark.

McQueen reeled off four points and Louisme contributed a lay-up to tie the contest at 43-all and again at 45 apiece on a McQueen lay-up. Tulane took its last lead of the game on a Sims three-pointer at 10:32. UC Davis responded with its deciding run when Joe Harden was fouled on a made lay-up and his ensuing free throw to convert the conventional three-point play gave the Aggies the lead for good. Harden then broke free for a fast break lay-up to give his team a four point cushion.

Sophomore David Booker hit a short jumper to pull the Wave to within two points, but that was the closest Tulane would get to the Aggies for the remainder of the game. UC Davis scored seven straight points and led by 11 points before Tulane hit its next basket.

The Aggies led by double figures for most of the final five minutes of the contest and built its largest lead of 14 points on several occasions. Despite its best effort, the Green Wave could not overcome its shooting woes from both the field (.393) and the free-throw line (.500) in the second half, while UC Davis hit 16-of-26 field goal attempts and 12-of-13 free throws in the final period.

SIMS, McQUEEN LEAD TULANE PAST MAINE, 66-56

Sims scored 20 points to lead Green Wave

Mobile, Ala. – Tulane junior Kevin Sims scored 16 of his game high 20 points in the second half and the Green Wave erased a 15 point deficit with a 25-7 run while holding Maine to without a field goal for over 13 minutes in the second half and cruised to a 66-56 victory over the Black Bears in the consolation game of the 2008 USA Basketball Classic at the Mitchell Center.

Tulane (4-2) trailed Maine (3-4) by 15 points when UM's Gerald McLemore nailed his fourth three-pointer of the game to give his team a 36-21 advantage. Facing its largest deficit of the game, senior Robinson Louisme responded with a lay-up and Sims drained a trey to pull the Wave to within 10 points. Maine's Junior Bernal answered minutes later and put his team back up by 12 points with a lay-up at 16:18.

The Green Wave shored up its defense and held Maine to without a field goal for the next 13:03. Once again, Sims and McQueen responded for Tulane. McQueen tipped in a missed shot and Sims connected on his second trey of the half and TU was within seven points. Sophomore Johnny Mayhane reduced the lead to just four points when he sank a three-pointer on an inbounds play.

Tulane continued to roll behind McQueen's first three-point play that pulled Tulane to within a point. The Black Bears were solid from the charity stripe where they hit nine straight free throws to stay in the game. McQueen's second three-point play in the span of 35 seconds tied the game at 43-all and Sims gave Tulane the lead for good with another timely three-pointer.
