TULANE OPENS 2008 WITH RIVALRY GAME AGAINST LSU AT NEW ORLEANS ARENA:

• The Tulane Green Wave (9-4) opens the New Year in style with its annual rivalry game against in-state foe LSU in the 208th renewal of the series that spans 97 years. For the second straight season, the two schools will battle at New Orleans Arena for bragging rights in the series.

TU brings a three-game win streak into the contest and will look to snap the Tigers' five straight wins in the series that dates back to 2002 (two of the wins have come at NO Arena).

The Green Wave is coming off wins over Southeastern Conference member Georgia, 70-69, St. John's out of the Big East, 79-71, and Alabama State (69-60) to match its longest win streak of the year.

Tulane is 7-1 at home this season and has won its last four contests in New Orleans.

The Green Wave owns a 16-5 (.762) record against non-conference teams in New Orleans under head coach Dave Dickerson.

Tulane has won six out of its last seven games and the TU defense has held its opponents to 64.8 points per outing, while the Green Wave offense has averaged 73.4 points over the same duration.

For the year, Tulane is averaging 69.8 points and 35.5 rebounds per game and is shooting 46.4 percent from the field, 34 percent from behind the three-point line and 73.8 percent from the free-throw line.

Kevin Sims and **David Gomez** are two of three Green Wave players scoring in double figures with 12.8 points per game apiece while **Robinson Louisme** is third with 11.2 points per outing.

Louisme is also the team's top rebounder with 5.9 boards per game, while Sims leads the squad in assists and steals with 4.5 and 2.0 per contest, respectively.

SCOUTING THE TIGERS:

• LSU (7-5) enters the Tulane contest coming off its first home loss of the year, a 73-65 setback to Washington last Saturday, and was just 2-3 during the month of December.

The Tigers are 0-2 on the road and 1-2 on neutral courts this season. LSU's lone win away from home came against Chaminade (78-72) at the EA Sports Maui Invitational.

Since that game, the Bayou Bengals are 0-3 away from Baton Rouge.

For the year, the Tigers are averaging 72.8 points and 36.3 rebounds per game and are shooting 45.5 percent from the field, including 34.1 percent from beyond the arc, and 74.2 percent from the foul line.

Marcus Thorton paces four LSU players in double figure scoring with a team-best 18.8 points per game, while Anthony Randolph is the team's top rebounder with 7.8 boards per clip.

ROLLING WAVES:

• Tulane has won six out of its last seven games, including three straight on two different occasions. The Wave's lone loss during the run was to Saint Mary's, 64-57, in the first game of the 2007 Outrigger Hotels Rainbow Classic in Honolulu, Hawaii.

Although the loss snapped its first three-game win streak of the month, the contest proved to be a turning point. Tulane then defeated Georgia on a buzzer-beater (70-69) and handled St. John's (79-71) to post the most impressive wins of the Classic and claim the consolation title.

Meanwhile, Saint Mary's rolled to the tournament title with wins over East Tennessee State and Ohio.

NEXT UP:

• After a week off, Tulane opens Conference USA play at home against UAB at 7 p.m. on Wednesday, January 9 at Fogelman Arena.

SERIES & NOTES:

• Wednesday's game marks the 208th all-time meeting between Tulane and LSU, and the Tigers lead the series, 124-83.

• This year's contest marks the 102nd meeting between the two in-state rivals in New Orleans and LSU holds a narrow 53-48 advantage in the Crescent City. Tulane's last win vs. LSU in New Orleans came on Feb. 3, 1971, a 93-86 victory at Fogelman Arena.

• Tulane is 0-2 vs. LSU at New Orleans Arena, falling 74-67 last season and 74-62 during the Sugar Bowl Classic in 2002-03.

• The Green Wave has lost five straight decisions to LSU, and its last win in the series was on March 12, 1982 in the first round of the postseason NIT in Baton Rouge, 83-72.

• LSU is Tulane's most common opponent with 207 games. TU's second most common opposition is Mississippi State with 93 contests for a difference of 114 fewer games.

• Tulane and LSU met at least twice a year for 63 seasons, and as many as five times in 1940 when both schools were members of the Southeastern Conference.

• The teams did not play during the 1912, 1918-19, 1981, and 1983-2001 seasons.

• After a one-year hiatus in 1981, the series resumed and Tulane dispatched LSU with its 1982 postseason NIT win and LSU put the series on hold for 20 years.

TULANE AT NEW ORLEANS ARENA:

• Since its opening in 1999, Tulane has played 19 games at New Orleans Arena and has an all-time mark of 8-11. TU's last game at NO Arena was a year ago when it fell to LSU, 74-67. The Wave's last win came against Vanderbilt, 87-77, during the 2001-02 campaign. Since then, TU has dropped its last six straight at the downtown facility.

TU VS. THE SEC:

• A former member of the SEC from 1932-66, Tulane has played 785 games against past and current SEC opponents and has an all-time record of 341-444 against past and current teams.

Tulane, along with Alabama, Auburn, Florida, Georgia, Georgia Tech, Kentucky, LSU, Mississippi, Mississippi State, Sewanee, Tennessee and Vanderbilt were the founding members of the league in December, 1932.

Sewanee left the league in 1940, while Georgia Tech exited in 1964 and Tulane in 1966. Both Tech and TU left to become members of the Metro Conference. Arkansas and South Carolina each joined the SEC in 1990.

GREEN WAVE OFF TO BEST START SINCE 1999-2000:

• Tulane has chalked up nine wins through its first 13 games this season and is off to its best season in eight years.

The last time the Wave reached nine wins in December was during the 1999-2000 campaign, the school's last postseason appearance (NIT), with a 10-1 mark.

A DECEMBER TO REMEMBER:

• Despite losing its first game of the month of December on the road at Syracuse and later to Saint Mary's, Tulane rolled to a 6-2 mark and put together its most wins during the final month of the year since the 1999-2000 season when TU chalked up a perfect 6-0 record.

SEC CHAMPS?:

• The Green Wave is 2-0 against teams from the SEC this season with wins over Auburn and Georgia. Tulane will host LSU, its final SEC opponent of the year, at New Orleans Arena on Jan. 2.

Should Tulane get past LSU, the Green Wave will finish with a perfect record against the SEC for the first time since the 1943-44 season when TU was a league member and captured the conference title with a 4-0 record.

TU also has a win over Gardner-Webb, who defeated SEC member Kentucky earlier this season.

THE POWER OF THREE:

• Tulane's wins this season have come in threes and the Green Wave will look to extend its current three-game win streak to four for the first time this season against LSU.

TU opened the season with three straight wins before suffering three consecutive losses. However, the Wave then rebounded with three more wins to improve to 6-3. Following a loss to Saint Mary's, Tulane has once again reeled off three straight victories.

Of the Green Wave's four losses this season, two have come to teams who had previously been nationally ranked the previous week and were coming off losses.

Both Syracuse and Saint Mary's reached as high as No. 24 in the polls before suffering their first losses of the season and next up on their respective schedules was the Green Wave.

RPI UPDATE:

• Tulane entered the Rainbow Classic with a Rating Percentage Index (RPI) in the 130s. However, the Wave posted a 2-1 record with a narrow loss to Saint Mary's (currently No. 4 in the RPI) and wins over Georgia and St. John's. The result: Tulane moved up into the top 100 and is No. 68 in the current RPI listing according to RealTimeRPI.com.

LOUISME'S HOT HAND:

• Tulane junior **Robinson Louisme** started the season with the hot hand, hitting his first 13 field goals before suffering his first miss in the fourth game.

Through 13 games, Louisme has hit 57 of 79 field goal attempts this season for an unheard of 72.2 field goal percentage. Here's a breakdown of Louisme's game-by-game field goal makes/attempts:

NOTING TULANE:

• In its four home games during the month of December, TU averaged 77 points per outing, while holding opponents to 62.5 points per contest.

• Seniors **David Gomez** and **Donnavan Stith** each ranked among the top shot blockers in school history. Gomez is fourth with 116, while Stith is fifth with 115.

• **Kevin Sims** has reached double figures in 11 of 13 games this season, and has finished in double digits 27 times in 43 career games.

• Tulane's 32-point victory over Huston-Tillotson marked the largest margin of victory since a 46-point, 87-41 win over Loyola (La.) on Feb. 7, 2006.

• The last time the Wave held an opponent to less than 50 points was Southern Miss in a 50-47 win at home on March 1, 2006.

SIMS' GEMS:

• Sophomore **Kevin Sims** narrowly missed out on his first career game with double digit assists, finishing with nine against Alabama State. Sims' previous high was eight against Nicholls State earlier this season.

Tulane has a 6-0 record this season when Sims dishes out five or more assists.

A FORMIDABLE FRONT COURT:

• Tulane's strength this season has been the frontcourt play of **David Gomez**, **Robinson Louisme**, **Donnavan Stith** and **Asim McQueen**.

Together this group is averaging 33.3 points and 18.5 rebounds per game, and has a combined shooting percentage of 57 percent (164-289).

This season, Gomez has led the team in scoring four times, while Louisme has been TU's top scorer three times and Stith was in the season opener.

The group has scored in double figures a combined 15 times in 2007-08.

PASSING THE BUCK:

• In Tulane's game against Alabama State, a total of four players dished out three or more assists, including **Kevin Sims** with a career-best nine dimes, while **Daniel Puckett** (4), **Matt Wheaton** (3) and **Eric Vianney** (3) contributed to 19 of TU's 21 total assists.

TU also registered 21 assists vs. Indiana State with nine of 10 players chalking up an assist.

GOMEZ, STITH SET TO REACH CENTURY MARK VS. LSU:

• Seniors **David Gomez** and **Donnavan Stith** will each reach an important milestone in their careers when they step on the court to face LSU.

Both Gomez and Stith have played in 99 career games and will reach the century mark on Wednesday. Each player will need to earn minutes in every remaining regular season game and the opening round of the 2008 Conference USA Tournament to break into the school's top-10 list for games played which is 117. The school's career mark is 125 and is held by three different players.

THREE-POINT THREESOME:

• Tulane's trio of **Kevin Sims**, **Eric Vianney** and **Matt Wheaton** has proven to be the top three-pointer shooters on the team this season. Sims leads the club with 20, while Vianney has 12 and Wheaton has nailed 11 treys. The group is shooting a combined 38 percent (42-111) on the year.

Wheaton is the team's top shooter percentage-wise, knocking down nearly 46 percent of its attempts.

EN FUEGO:

• Tulane sophomore **Kevin Sims** took his game to the next level at the Rainbow Classic. In three games, Sims averaged 18 points, nearly seven points above his average entering the tournament, shot 48 percent from the field (14-29), including 78 percent (7-9) from behind the three-point line and 70 percent (19-23) from the free-throw line.

One of his defining moments came during the win over Georgia when he recorded his lone assist of the day on what proved to be the game-winning basket by senior **David Gomez**.

Sims' final performance of tournament was a 21-point outburst in TU's win over St. John's. For his efforts, Sims was named to the Rainbow Classic All-Tournament team.

EN FUEGO II:

• In its 64-57 loss to Saint Mary's, Tulane shot a miserable 30 percent from the field in the first half. However, the Green Wave rebounded in the second half with a 50 percent effort and has been on fire ever since. Heading into the LSU contest, the Wave has finished 50 percent or better from the field in six out of its last eight halves.

GOMEZ RECORDS HISTORY ONCE AGAIN:

• Senior **David Gomez** achieved two career landmarks last month. First, in Tulane's game against Huston-Tillotson on Dec. 5, Gomez became the 29th player in school history to reach the 1,000-point plateau.

In the final game of the month, Gomez became the 14th player in the 98-year history of Tulane basketball to register career marks of 1,000 career points and 500 rebounds.

Gomez currently has 506 career boards and is just five rebounds shy of breaking into Tulane's Top-25 list for career rebounds.

CATCH HIM IF YOU CAN:

• **Kevin Sims'** 26 steals this season is not only the best by a Tulane player, but leads all Conference USA players. Sims' six steals at Syracuse is tied for the best single game effort this season.

INSIDE THE PAINT UPDATE:

• Through 13 games this season, Tulane has outscored its opponents in the paint, 396 to 310, and has a record of 9-2 when the Green Wave wins the scoring battle inside the lane.

LAST SECOND HEROES:

• Tulane senior **David Gomez** joined classmate **Matt Wheaton** in Tulane's "Last Second Hero Club" with his game-winning shot against Georgia.

Gomez, who finished with 24 points, drained a three-pointer with 0:09 remaining against Georgia to give the Green Wave a 70-69 come-from-behind victory, which marked his first career game-winning shot on the collegiate level.

Wheaton has two career game-winners and both game-changing shots happened last season, including a put-back in the final seconds against Arkansas-Pine Bluff, and a three-pointer at UAB with 10 seconds remaining that gave the Green Wave a first round bye in the 2007 Conference USA Tournament.

TICKLIN' THE TWINE:

• Through 13 games, Tulane has five players shooting better than 45 percent from the field, and two players are hitting better than 50 percent per clip.

Leading the way is **Robinson Louisme**, who is shooting 72.2 percent from the field (57-79) on the year. Here's a breakdown of TU's hot-handed shooters:

The group is hitting on a combined 55 percent (186-338) of their attempts.

A PERFECT EFFORT:

• After not attempting a free throw in the first half of its last game at Syracuse, Tulane drained all 15 attempts in the second half and finished 15-of-15 from the charity stripe, which marked the first time TU had finished perfect from the free-throw line since Jan. 7, 1998, when the Wave connected on all 10 attempts against Saint Louis.

BEST IN THE NATION:

• Tulane's perfect game against Syracuse from the free-throw line is tied for the best performance in the nation this season.

TULANE CONTINUES BLOCK PARTY IN 2007-08:

• Tulane averaged 6.3 blocks per game last season and concluded the year with a school and Conference USA record 188 blocks, which ranked as high as 10th nationally.

The Wave already has 70 blocks for a 5.4 average, which ranks second to only in Conference USA, and is 20th nationally.

David Gomez leads TU with 22, while **Robinson Louisme** has chalked up 17 and **Donnavan Stith** has 12. TU's total has been a team effort with all but two players (Mayhane/Henderson) having at least one block this season.

SMOTHERING D-FENCE:

• One constant for Tulane last season was its defense. The Green Wave held 17 of 30 opponents to a field goal percentage of 40.0 percent or lower. In its 17 wins, TU's opponents combined for a shooting percentage of 37.8 percent (385-1018).

Through 13 games, Tulane is holding its opponents to 38.3 percent (291-760) shooting from the field, including just 30.7 (85-277) percent from behind the 3-point line. TU's field goal percentage defense ranks first in the league and 37th in the country.

WORTH THE WAIT:

• Tulane's 77-62 win over Auburn was more than just a victory in the season opener. The victory marked TU's first win over an SEC school since 2001-02 when the Green Wave upended Vanderbilt, 87-77, at New Orleans Arena, but was the first win over an SEC opponent at Fogelman Arena since the 1976-77 campaign when the Wave slipped past Ole Miss, 64-59.

FOGELMAN MAGIC:

• Tulane head coach **Dave Dickerson** has turned the Green Wave into a very selfish team on its home floor. Through 32 games at Fogelman Arena under Dickerson’s direction, TU is 24-8 (.750), including a 6-1 record this season, an 11-4 mark last season and a 7-3 home mark in 2005-06.

Since Fogelman (then Tulane Gym) opened in 1933, the Green Wave has posted a 543-263 (.673) record in the venerable arena. TU’s 77-62 victory over Auburn in the 2007-08 season opener marked the 800th game played at Fogelman Arena.

TULANE TABBED SEVENTH IN CONFERENCE USA PRESEASON COACHES’ POLL:

• The Tulane men’s basketball team was selected to finish in seventh place in the 2007-08 Conference USA race according to the preseason coaches’ poll.

Despite a fourth-place finish as year ago and the return of seven letterwinners, including four starters, the Green Wave was picked to finish near the middle in this year’s race by the league’s coaches. One year ago, Tulane notched a 17-13 record, the most victories since the 1999-2000 season, and the Wave’s 9-7 league mark was marked the program’s most conference wins since 1996-97. The finish also earned the Green Wave a first round bye in the conference tournament for the first time since 2000.

TULANE INKS TWO TEXAS STANDOUTS:

• Tulane head coach **Dave Dickerson** announced signed two prep standouts from the state of Texas- **Trent Rogers** and **Kendall Timmons**- to national letters-of-intent during the early period of national signings for high school players.

A 6’3” combination guard from Houston’s Strake Jesuit High School, Rogers was an all-district choice for head coach Wayne Jones as a junior when he averaged 10 points and 3.4 rebounds per game and shot 59 percent from the field, and led the Crusaders to a 17-11 overall record. An all-district performer, Rogers served as team captain and was named to the Houston Chronicle All-City second team.

As a sophomore, he earned all-district honors and was tabbed as the district Newcomer of the Year. Rogers has played on AAU and BCI championship teams with the Houston Hoops and Houston Heat, respectively

Heading into his senior year, Rogers was named to the Houston Chronicle’s All-Greater Houston preseason second team, and was also selected as one of the top players in District 17-5A. He ranks as the 17th-best player in Texas’ 2008 Class by Texas-Hoops.com and is rated as a three start shooting guard and 11th in the state by Rivals.com.

Timmons is a 6’5” guard from Southwest High School in Fort Worth, Texas. During his junior season, he averaged 18.2 points, 7.6 rebounds, 3.1 assists and 2.8 steals per game, and was named the District 7-4A Player of the Year. Timmons was also selected to the Fort Worth Star-Telegram All-Area second team, and to the Texas Association of Basketball Coaches All-Region team. He claimed MVP honors at the Whattaburger Holiday Classic after leading his team to the championship game in the White Division. Timmons concluded the season ranked No. 29 among “Top Juniors” in state of Texas’ 2008 class by HoopScooponline.com

Entering his senior campaign, Timmons was named to the Star-Telegram’s “Starting Five” and is rated as the 27th-best player in the state of Texas’ 2008 class by TexasHoops.com.

- Tulane has a record of 24-8 (.75) at Fogelman Arena during Dickerson's tenure.

- Currently has Tulane off to its best start in eight years with a 9-4 record.

- Under his tutelage, three Green Wave players have earned all-conference honors, including All-Conference USA third-team performers Quincy Davis (2006) and David Gomez (2007), and Kevin Sims, who was selected to the All C-USA Freshman team in 2007.

TULANE ROLLS AUBURN, 77-62

Stith Leads the Green Wave with 12 points

New Orleans – Senior Donnavan Stith led three Tulane players into double figures with 12 points and all 10 Green Wave players that saw action reached the scoring column to take out Southeastern Conference member Auburn, 77-62, in the season opener for both squads at Fogelman Arena.

Both teams stormed out of the gates and blis-tered the nets from behind the arc. Auburn (0-1) buried its first three three-pointers to take a 9-4 lead, but Tulane (1-0) roared back and tied the game on a trey by sophomore Eric Vianney.

Sophomore Asim McQueen came off the bench to hit a free throw and Vianney followed up with his second trey to ignite a 12-2 run and the Wave never looked back. McQueen knocked down two more free throws to give TU a 28-18 advantage with 6:07 remain- ing in the opening period.

Auburn managed to slice the lead to seven points on a pair of charity shots from Rasheem Bar-rett with under four minutes remaining, but Tulane connected on six straight free throws and freshman Johnny Mayhane drained his third trey of the half to give TU a 38-27 advantage at intermission.

Tulane continued to pressure the Tigers with its smothering defense and extended its lead to as much as 21 points in the second half. However, the Tigers made one last run at the Green Wave with a 20-7 spurt that closed the gap to eight points, 63-55, when Barrett hit a jumper with 4:05 left on the clock.

Following a timeout, sophomore Kevin Sims hit a three-pointer that gave the Wave a double-digit lead, and Auburn never threatened again.

Stith led the Wave with 12 points and several spectacular dunks and a wrap-around jump shot under the basket that brought the Tulane faithful to its feet. Sims contributed 11 points and six assists, while Vian-ney added 10 points in his Tulane debut.

GOMEZ LEADS TULANE PAST CHARLESTON OUTHERN, 66-60

TU Senior leads all scorers with 22 Points

Charleston, S.C. – Senior David Gomez led all scorers with 22 points and Tulane outlasted Charleston South-ern, 66-60, at the North Charleston Coliseum.

Playing in its first road game of the year, Tulane (2-0) had to withstand a late rally in the final minutes to improve to 2-0 for the first time since 2003-04.

Tulane only trailed once in the game, but never led by more than 10 points until midway through the second half when freshman Johnny Mayhane jump-started a 9-2 run with a jumper at the 11:02 mark. eric Vianney hit 1-of-2 free throw attempts to increase the lead to 11 points, the Wave's largest of the game.

Facing its largest deficit of the game, Charleston Southern (1-1) refused to go quietly. The Buccaneers, who hit 11-of-23 three-point attempts for the game, used a 10-1 spurt in the waning minutes to climb to within two points, 59-57, with 1:53 remaining.

CSU continued its run with a free throw by Giedrius Knyzas and Jamarco Warren drilled one of his five three-pointers . Chris Moore brought the home team to within a bucket with a lay-up at the 1:53 mark.

Following the timeout, senior Matt Wheaton was fouled and nailed both of his charity shots to increase the Wave lead to four points with just 65 seconds remaining. On the ensuing possession, CSU's Omar Carter got an open look, but his three-point attempt missed its mark and Gomez was there for the crucial rebound and was immediately fouled. Gomez walked to the other end of the floor and sank both attempts to increase the visitor's lead to six. However, the Buc-caneers sliced the deficit in half on a Warren trey with 0:16 remaining. Sims was fouled on the inbounds pass and hit 1-of-2 free throw shots, and CSU couldn't find the mark in the closing seconds.

LOUISME POWERS TULANE PAST NICHOLLS STATE, 73-51

Four Green Wave players each double figures

New Orleans – Junior Robinson Louisme led four Tulane players in double figure scoring with a team-best 14 points and the Green Wave won its 16th straight game against Nicholls State with a 73-51 victory in front of 1,935 at Fogelman Arena.

Tulane improved to 3-0 for the first time since the 2003-04 campaign and the Wave extended its home win streak against non-conference opponents to eight straight. TU also improved to 20-7 at Fogelman Arena under third-year head coach Dave Dickerson.

Nicholls State (1-2) stole the show early by jump- ing out to a 12-point lead on two occasions during the opening 10 minutes of the first half. The Colonels drilled three treys and held Tulane to just four points during a 16-4 run. Senior Matt Wheaton hit two free throws at the 10:22 mark to give the Wave just its sixth point. NSU followed Wheaton's free throw up with a Dominic Friend lay-up that extended the lead back to 12 points. How- ever, Friend's bucket would be the last for the Colonels for the next six minutes.

Facing its largest deficit of the young season, Tu- lane dug in defensively and ignited on the offensive end behind Louisme's 10 points and Wheaton's eight points. The Green Wave reeled off a 20-1 run and took the lead for good on a lay-up by freshman Kris Richard. By the time Michael Czepil nailed a short jumper to snap the run, the Colonels were trailing 26-21. TU built its lead to seven points four different times in the final 10 minutes and sophomore Kevin Sims followed a Nicholls State lay-up with 0:07 remaining by going coast-to-coast in the waning seconds and beat the buzzer with a floating jumper to give the Wave an improbable 35-28 lead at the break. In the second half, the Green Wave increased to its lead and led by as many as 25 points in the closing minutes.

TULANE'S COMEBACK BID FALLS SHORT AGAINST UNO, 74-67

David Gomez leads the Wave with 15 points

New Orleans – Senior David Gomez scored 15 points and Tulane shot 51 percent for the game, but the Green Wave suffered 19 turnovers and its attempt to come-back from a 17-point deficit fell short in a 74-67 loss in front of 3,074 at Fogelman Arena.

Tulane (3-1) suffered its first loss of the year, and much like the last time the Green Wave opened with a 3-0 mark in 2003-04, New Orleans (3-0) was there to hand TU its first loss of the season on its home floor.

Tulane fell behind early and trailed by as many as seven points on several occasions during the first half of the opening period. The Wave shot 47.8 percent in the first half, but surrendered an uncharacteristic 13 turnovers. TU scraped back and trailed by just four points on baskets by Gomez and a three-pointer by junior Daniel Puckett that pulled the Wave to within four points. However, UNO's Kechan Myers and James Parlow connected on consecutive three-pointers to give the Privateers an 11 point lead. Myers drilled another trey and Kyndall Dykes broke free for a lay-up with 13-seconds remaining and the Privateers took an 11-point lead into the break.

New Orleans continued to play well during the early minutes of the second half and used a 12-4 run to build a 17-point advantage, its largest of the game, on a pair of Dykes free throws at the 13:35 mark. However, Tulane refused to go quietly to its inner-city rival, and shored up its defense with some gritty play over the next 6:40 to climb back into the game using a 21-2 run.

UNO's Ben Elias banked in a jumper from the right side to help the Privateers regain the lead, but Vianney tied the contest for the third time with a lay-up with 6:05 remaining. On the ensuing possession, Elias missed a short jumper, but Bo McCaleb grabbed the offensive carom and was fouled. McCaleb connected on 1-of-2 free throws to give his team a one-point lead that it would not surrender.

POOR FIRST HALF PERFORMANCE DOOMS TULANE, 65-51

Kevin Sims paces the Wave with 15 points

Buffalo, N.Y. – Senior David Gomez and sophomore Kevin Sims combined for 28 points, but a dismal first half shooting performance was too much to overcome in the second half and the Green Wave fell to Buffalo, 65-51, in front of 1,887 at Alumni Arena.

For the third straight game, Tulane (3-2) fell behind early and for the second consecutive contest the Green Wave was unable to overcome its first half woes. TU suffered its worst shooting performance of the season with a 34 percent effort and committed 19 turnovers in its second straight outing.

Trailing by 17 points at halftime to Buffalo (4-3), Tulane slowly mounted a comeback, much like it did in its last game against New Orleans when the Wave overcame a similar 17-point setback to tie the game late before eventually falling to its cross town rival.

The Wave trimmed the Buffalo lead to 11 points when Gomez broke free with a turn-around jumper in the lane. Minutes later, Sims was fouled on a layup and he hit the free throw for the conventional three-point play to bring TU to within eight points. Tulane would eventually pull to within six points on a Gomez break-away dunk with 8:23 remaining and the Green Wave looked to be back into contention.

However, the biggest obstacle all night continued to plague the Green Wave. UB's Sean Smiley came off the bench and hit all five of his three-point attempts and a total of 8-of-10 field goals to fuel the Buffalo offense. Smiley was the Bulls' answer each time Tulane threatened throughout the game. With Tulane trailing by just six points, Smiley hit a pull-up jumper in transition and then knocked down his fifth trey of the night to extend Buffalo's lead to 11 points and Tulane never threatened again.

Syracuse, N.Y. – Junior Daniel Puckett came off the bench to score 17 points, but Syracuse countered with four players in double figures and used its size advantage to dominate the boards on both ends of the floor in a 73-60 Orange victory in front of 21,173 at the Carrier Dome.

LOUISME, TULANE BLITZES HUSTON-TILLOTSON, 75-43

David Gomez surpasses 1,000 career points

NEW ORLEANS – Junior Robinson Louisme led three Tulane players into double figures with 14 points and the Green Wave snapped a three-game skid with a 75-43 victory over Huston-Tillotson in front of 1,149 at Fogelman Arena.

Tulane (4-3) never trailed in the game and used a 10-2 run early in the contest to sprint out to a double-digit lead and never looked back. Sophomore Asim McQueen, who scored a career-best 10 points, hit two free throws to spark the spurt and later hit a lay-up during the run. The Green Wave needed less than nine minutes to reach double figures and put the game away.

Senior David Gomez entered the night just eight points shy of the 1,000-point plateau, and he managed to hit the mark at the 5:29 mark in the opening period when he was fouled on a made lay-up. He connected on the free throw and became the 29th player in school history to surpass 1,000 career points.

Gomez's conventional three-point play gave Tulane a 20-point lead, its largest of the first half, and the Wave took a 34-17 lead into the break.

The second half turned into a track meet with TU outscoring Huston-Tillotson (0-6), 41-26. The Green Wave's lead was never less than 17 points, while its largest advantage of the game came with 4:20 remaining when freshmen Johnny Mayhane knocked in a lay-up for a 39-point lead.

Along with Louisme and McQueen, Gomez topped off his milestone night with 12 points on 4-of-5 shooting from both the field and free-throw line. Louisme tied the Rams' Titus Butler for game-high rebounding honors with eight apiece. Louisme also rejected four of Tulane's six blocked shots, and collected three steals.

NEW ORLEANS – Sophomore Kevin Sims scored a team-high 19 points and senior Donnavan Stith came off the bench to produce a double-double with 15 points and 10 rebounds, and the Green Wave outlasted a feisty Gardner-Webb squad, 84-79, in front of 1,195 at Fogelman Arena.

GOMEZ'S 19 POINTS LEADS TU PAST INDIANA STATE, 80-68

Three Green Wave reach double figures

NEW ORLEANS – Senior David Gomez led three Green Wave players into double figures with a game-high 19 points and Tulane dispatched Indiana State, 80-68, to notch its third straight win at Fogelman Arena.

Tulane (6-3) took control of the game late and never looked back once it gained a large lead. Much of the Green Wave's success was its balanced scoring and distribution of the ball. All 10 players that saw action for TU reached the scoring column and the Wave combined for 21 assists, including a game-high from sophomore Kevin Sims. Tulane shot 5 miserably 11 percent from the foul line in the first half, but was electric in the second half, hitting 20-of-23 for 87 percent, which essentially was the difference in the game.

The contest was back-and-forth for much of the way with 10 lead changes and four ties. Much like the first half, Tulane looked solid during the first five minutes of the second period and managed to build a 10-point lead on two different occasions. TU led by three-points at the break and used a 9-2 run to take a 44-34 lead on a lay-up by Gomez in the opening moments of the second half. Indiana State stayed close and cut the lead to single digits several times, but Tulane answered the call and maintained its 10-point lead for a majority of the first 10 minutes of the period.

Gomez gave the home team some breathing room when he knocked down a three-pointer to give Tulane a 71-57 lead, its largest of the game, with just over four minutes remaining.

TU's defense took over in the latter stages of the contest with several key blocks and held ISU to without a field goal for a just over a three minute stretch. Moore's three-pointer broke the drought, but the Sycamores still trailed by double figures with 1:52 remaining.

SLOW START PLAGUES

TULANE VS SAINT MARY'S, 64-57

Kevin Sims leads TU with 18 points

HONOLULU – Sophomore Kevin Sims scored 16 of his team best 18 points in the second half and junior Robinson Louisme added 12 points, but Tulane couldn't overcome 19 turnovers, a poor shooting first half and a game-high 23 points by Saint Mary's Patrick Mills in a 64-57 loss to the Gaels in the first round of the 2007 Outrigger Hotels Rainbow Classic at the Stan Sheriff Center.

It was a tale of two halves for the Green Wave. Tulane shot just 30 percent in the opening half, committed 13 turnovers and trailed Saint Mary's (8-1) by 12 points at halftime. In the second period, the Wave came alive, outscoring the Gaels, 37-32, and shooting 50 percent from the field, including 50 percent from behind the three-point line.

Tulane played well during the first 4:29 of the second half, outscoring SMC, 8-4, and had sliced the deficit to single digits, 36-29, by the first media timeout. But a Carlin Hughes three-pointer at the 13:04 mark gave Saint Mary's a double-digit lead once again. The Wave managed to scrape back to it is closest margin of seven points on a Sims lay-up that brought the score to 39-32 with plenty of time remaining for a comeback.

However, TU's chances and its three-game win streak evaporated into the breezy Hawaiian night when Mills drained a three-pointer that increased the Gaels' lead to 11 points with 8:19 remaining. From there, Saint Mary's held on to its double digit lead until the waning moments of the contest. Tulane erased a 12 point deficit behind Sims' seven straight points in the final minute and freshman Kris Richard capped off the night with a three-pointer at the buzzer.

GOMEZ'S LATE 3-POINTER LEADS

TULANE PAST GEORGIA, 70-69

Gomez leads TU with 24 points

HONOLULU – Senior David Gomez's long wait for his first collegiate game-winning shot is finally over. Gomez nailed a three-pointer from the top of the key with nine seconds remaining to lead Tulane to a 70-69 come-from-behind victory over Georgia in front of 6,077 in the consolation bracket of the 2007 Outrigger Hotels Rainbow Classic at the Stan Sheriff Center.

Trailing by a single point, Tulane's Donnvan Stith was forced to foul Dave Bliss with 19 seconds remaining. Bliss, a 76 percent free throw shooter this season, connected on his first attempt, but misfired on his second, leaving Tulane with a two-point deficit (69-67), and the Green Wave called timeout to set up its last second shot.

On the winning play for the Green Wave, sophomore Kevin Sims took the inbounds pass and was immediately contested by UGA's players. Sims then dribbled down the right side toward the baseline and the Bulldog's defense quickly enveloped TU's 5'10" guard. However, Sims alertly looked back to the top of the key where Gomez was standing all alone with no Georgia player within eight feet. Sims popped a quick pass to Gomez and the Baton Rouge, La., native squared up and launched the ball in one motion, and sank his first game winner with nine ticks on the clock.

Georgia dribbled the length of the floor and did get a shot off, but the desperate attempt hit the rim and bounced away as the buzzer sounded.

The game featured seven ties and 14 lead changes. Tulane trailed for much of the second half, but never by more than five points. The Green Wave stayed within striking distance and trailed by two points or less nine times during the first 10 minutes of the second half.

TU takes home consolation title

HONOLULU – Tulane sophomore Kevin Sims and junior Robinson Louisme each scored 21 points and the Green Wave blew open the game with a 16-4 run in the second half to dispatch St. John's, 79-71, in the consolation title game of the 2007 Outrigger Hotels Rainbow Classic at the Stan Sheriff Center.

Tulane (8-4) trailed St. John's (5-4) 52-50 when senior David Gomez, the team's leading scorer and rebounder, fouled out of the game with 8:16 remaining. GOMEZ, SIMS LEADS TU PAST

ALABAMA STATE, 69-60

Green Wave catches fire in second half

NEW ORLEANS – Senior David Gomez matched his season high with 24 points and sophomore Kevin Sims dished out a career-best nine assists to lead Tulane to its third straight win with a 69-60 victory over Alabama State in front of 1,355 at Fogelman Arena.

Playing its fourth game in eight days, Tulane (9-4) overcome a sluggish start in the first half with a near perfect shooting performance in the early minutes of the second period to put away the Hornets (4-5). The Green Wave turned the paint into a lay-up contest by hitting its first seven shots of the second half inside the lane. TU's hot hand extended its two-point half time lead into an 11 point advantage via an 11-2 run with just 3:30 expired in the second half. Tulane led by as many as 11 points on three different occasions in the second half. The hot-shooting Wave canned 10 of its first 13 field goal attempts of the second half en route to a 61.9 percent performance in the final 10 minutes

However, Alabama State never gave up and used a 10-0 run near the midway point to pull to within three points on a three-pointer by Andrew Hayles that brought the score to 47-44 at 10:52.

The Green Wave regained its momentum through with the courtesy of a three-point play which ignited a 7-0 spurt. Freshman Johnny Mayhane was fouled driving to the basket and his field goal attempt found its mark. Mayhane sank his first career free throw for the conventional three-point play. Minutes later, junior Robinson Louisme converted a lay-up and Gomez made two free throws to extend the lead back to double figures.

Alabama State scraped to within six points, but a timely Sims three-pointer helped the Green Wave build a 13-point lead and sprint to the finish.
