TULANE LOOKS TO REMAIN PERFECT AGAINST NICHOLLS STATE:

• The Tulane Green Wave (2-0) will look to keep a trio of streaks going this Friday when it hosts the Nicholls State Colonels (1-1) at Fogelman Arena. Tip-off is slated for 7:05 p.m.

The first streak for the Green Wave will be to dispatch the Colonels and remain undefeated this season. Secondly, the Wave has won five straight on its home floor and will look to extend that streak as well. Finally, Tulane is a perfect 15-0 against Nicholls State since the series began in 1981. TU will look to increase the total to 16 in a row on Friday.

Through two games this season Tulane is averaging 71.5 points and 36 rebounds per game and is shooting 48.4 percent from the field, 40.6 percent from behind the three-point line and 74.5 percent from the free-throw line.

David Gomez leads the team in scoring with 15 points per game, while **Donnavan Stith** is the top rebounder with 7.5 boards per outing, and **Kevin Sims** leads the squad in assists with 5.5 per contest.

NOTING TULANE:

• Senior **David Gomez** needs 43 points to become the 29th player in school history to surpass the 1,000-point plateau. The last player to score more than 1,000 career points was Quincy Davis (2003-06) with 1,109 points.

• Seniors **David Gomez** and **Donnavan Stith** each rank among the school's top shot blockers. Gomez has 101 rejections to rank fifth, while Stith has registered 105 blocks to rank fourth.

• The Green Wave returns 72 percent of his scoring offense and 68 percent of its rebounding corps.

• Sophomore **Kevin Sims** became the first freshman to lead TU in assists since Waitari Marsh (1998-2004) accomplished the feat during his rookie season of 1998-99 with 92. Sims' 102 assists were the most by a freshman since Pointer Williams dished out 120 during the 1991-92 campaign.

• Tulane has won five straight home games dating back to last season.

• Tulane is off to its best season start since 2003-04 when the Wave opened the year with a 3-0 record.

• The Green Wave owns a 10-1 record against non-conference at Fogelman Arena under head coach Dave Dickerson. TU's lone loss came in last season's home opener to Butler. Since then, Tulane has reeled off seven straight victories against non-league opponents.

SCOUTING THE COLONELS:

• Nicholls State (1-1) opened the season with an 81-58 loss on the road at Florida State, but rebounded with a 92-55 rout at home against Huston-Tillotson in its last outing.

The Colonels are 0-1 on the road this season and the Tulane contest marks the first of a seven game road swing.

NSU is averaging 75 points and 35 rebounds per game and is shooting 51.7 percent from the field, including 38.6 percent from behind the three-point line, and 61.9 percent from the foul line.

Michael Czepil and Adonis Gray are each averaging a team-best 13.5 points per game, while Ryan Bathie is the top rebounder with 7.0 boards per outing and also leads the team in assists with a 3.5 clip.

SERIES & NOTES:

• Friday's game marks the 15th all-time meeting between Tulane and Nicholls State, and the Green Wave owns a perfect 15-0 record in the series.

• Tulane owns a mark of 13-0 against Nicholls State at Fogelman Arena.

• The Wave has an all-time record of 200-167 against Louisiana schools.

THE LAST TIME:

• The last time Tulane hosted Nicholls State, Ben Benfield scored 13 second-half points as Tulane erased a 17-point first-half deficit and defeated Nicholls State, 61-56, in men's basketball action at Fogelman Arena on Dec. 31, 2003.

Tulane (6-4) trailed by as many as 17 points in the first half, but the Green Wave defense held Nicholls State (4-6) without a field goal for the first 10 minutes of the second half. During that stretch, the Wave outscored Nicholls, 23-6, to take a 43-37 advantage midway through the half. Benfield scored eight points in that run.

Benfield led the Wave with his only points coming in the second half, while sophomore Vytas Tatarunas tallied 11 points with six rebounds.

TULANE CONTINUES BLOCK PARTY IN 2007-08:

• Tulane averaged 6.3 blocks per game last season and concluded the year with a school and Conference USA record 188 blocks, which ranked as high as 10th nationally.

The Green Wave has picked up where it left off last season through two games, racking up 15 blocks for a 7.5 average. **David Gomez** leads TU with seven, while **Robinson Louisme** has three.

HOT START:

• Sophomore **Eric Vianney** has begun his career as a Green Wave with a great start. The transfer from Illinois State has started both games this season and ranks fourth on the team in scoring with 9.0 points per game and is averaging 23.5 minutes per outing. However, more impressively, Vianney is shooting 66.7 percent from the field, including 57.1 percent (4-7) from beyond the arc. He is tied with **Johnny Mayhane** for the most three-point field goals.

HEATING UP:

• Tulane has opened the season of fire from the field. The Green Wave is shooting 48.4 percent from the field (46-95) and 40.6 percent (13-32) from behind the three-point line.

TU opened the season with a 46.9 percent (23-49) effort from the field against Auburn, and continued to shoot well in its last game at Charleston Southern, hitting 50 percent of its field goals, including 43.8 percent from long distance.

TICKLIN' THE TWINE:

• Through two games, a total of seven players are shooting better than 40 percent from the field. Leading the way is **Robinson Louisme**, who is perfect from the field (7-7) on the year. Following Louisme is **Eric Vianney** (.667), **Donnavan Stith** and **Kris Richard** (.500), **David Gomez** (.476), **Kevin Sims** (.429) and **Matt Wheaton** (.400).

With the ball in the hands of these seven players, Tulane is hitting 54 percent (40-74) of its attempts.

WELCOME TO THE BIG SHOW KID:

• Freshman **Kris Richard** came off the bench in the season opener for the first collegiate action of his career and gave Tulane 10 quality minutes. Richard, who hails from Beaumont, Texas, scored the first two points of his college career when he took a pass from **Kevin Sims** on a breakaway and converted the pass into an easy lay-up. In the second half, the rookie nailed a short jumper at the midway point to give the Wave a 21-point lead. In addition to his offensive production, he also grabbed two defensive rebounds.

SMOTHERING D-FENCE:

• One constant for Tulane last season was its defense. The Green Wave held 17 of 30 opponents to a field goal percentage of 40.0 percent or lower. In its 17 wins, TU's opponents combined for a shooting percentage of 37.8 percent (385-1018).

Through two games, Tulane is holding its opponents to 38.7 percent (43-111) shooting from the field.

In the opener against Auburn, the Green Wave limited the Tigers to 38.9 percent shooting from the field, including a 35.7 percent effort in the first half. Auburn drilled their first three treys of the game, but Tulane adjusted its defense and held the Tigers to just 4-of-19 shooting from long distance for the remainder of the game.

In its last contest, the Wave held Charleston Southern to just 38.6 percent from the field (22-57).

LET IT RAIN:

• Freshman red-shirt **Johnny Mayhane** missed all of last season with a knee injury, but has proven to be one of Tulane's top outside shooting threats through his first two games. Mayhane has nailed four treys on the year (4-9) for 44.4 percent. He is tied for first on the team in makes and attempts, and ranks third in percentage.

In the opener against Auburn and buried three long-range treys, all of which came in the first half, and finished with nine points. Mayhane played 17 minutes and contributed one assist, one steal and one rebound along with three three-pointers.

Mayhane drained his only three-pointer against Charleston Southern in the waning minutes of the first half to give Tulane a 33-30 lead.

NICE BENCH MARK:

• Last season, Tulane's bench averaged 25.2 points per game and outscored its opponents' bench, 757-496.

Through two games, TU's bench has outscored its opponents' bench, 49-26.

In the opener against Auburn, the Green Wave bench came alive and outscored the Tigers' bench, 30-7. Senior **Donnavan Stith** led the way with 12 points, while **Johnny Mayhane** added nine points.

WORTH THE WAIT:

• Tulane's 77-62 win over Auburn last week was more than just a victory in the season opener. The victory marked TU's first win over an SEC school since 2001-02 when the Green Wave upended Vanderbilt, 87-77, at New Orleans Arena, but was the first win over an SEC opponent at Fogelman Arena since the 1976-77 campaign when the Wave slipped past Ole Miss, 64-59.

WELCOME BACK:

• Tulane returns seven letterwinners, including four starters, from last year's 17-13 squad that posted the most victories since the 1999-2000 season. The Wave's 9-7 league mark was good for a fourth place finish conference play and marked the program's most conference wins since 1996-97. The finish also earned the Green Wave a first round bye in the conference tournament for the first time since 2000.

Among the returners are seniors **David Gomez** (6-8, 235), **Donnavan Stith** (6-6, 215) and **Matt Wheaton** (6-5, 190), along with juniors **Robinson Louisme** (6-7, 265), **Daniel Puckett** (6-7, 190), and sophomores **Asim McQueen** (6-7, 220) and **Kevin Sims** (5-10, 160).

EARLY START:

• Last week's game against Auburn marked the earliest start to a season in school history. This year's Nov. 9 starting date broke the record by one day. Last year, Tulane opened the season on Nov. 10, 2006, against Butler.

REDSHIRTS VIANNEY, MAYHANE READY TO CONTRIBUTE:

• A pair of players already familiar with the team will take the court for their first regular season game in a Green Wave uniform. Sophomore **Eric Vianney** and freshman **Johnny Mayhane** were each forced to sit out their first season at Tulane a year ago for different reasons.

Vianney originally signed with Illinois State and played his freshman year of 2005-06 at ISU before transferring to Tulane following the season. He was forced to sit out the 2006-07 campaign per NCAA transfer rules.

Mayhane was a highly-touted recruit out of Alabama who signed with the Green Wave out of high school. However, he was plagued by a knee injury a year and received a medical hardship for the 2006-07 season.

THREE NEWCOMERS READY FOR ACTION:

• The Tulane line-up will feature three new faces this season. A trio of true freshmen will don a Tulane jersey for the first time including **Jon Andersen**, **Jake Henderson** and **Kris Richard**.

Andersen is a local product from nearby Country Day High School in Metairie, La., while Henderson hails from Baton Rouge, La., and attended Parkview Baptist High School.

Richard is a native of Beaumont, Texas, and prepped at Ozen High School.

WELCOME ABOARD:

• Friday's game will mark the first game on the Tulane coaching staff for a pair of newcomers. Assistant coaches **Dick Bender** and **Chris Hawkins** each joined the Tulane staff over the summer and begin their first season on the Uptown campus.

Although he begins his first season at Tulane in 2007-08, Bender is no stranger to TU head coach **Dave Dickerson**, as both coaches served on the men's basketball staff at Radford University for four seasons (1992-96). Bender came to Tulane from Indiana State University where he completed his 10th overall season on the Sycamores' staff in 2006-07, and his fifth campaign as an associated head coach after being elevated to the position following the 2001 campaign.

Hawkins came to Tulane after spending seven seasons as an assistant coach at the University of Buffalo, where he was instrumental in the Bulls' recruiting efforts and also contributed to the scouting of opponents and coaching the perimeter players.

Hawkins played for current TU assistant coach Dick Bender, who was an assistant coach at Radford.

TULANE TABBED SEVENTH IN CONFERENCE USA PRESEASON COACHES' POLL:

• The Tulane men's basketball team was selected to finish in seventh place in the 2007-08 Conference USA race according to the preseason coaches' poll.

Despite a fourth-place finish as year ago and the return of seven letterwinners, including four starters, the Green Wave was picked to finish near the middle in this year's race by the league's coaches. One year ago, Tulane notched a 17-13 record, the most victories since the 1999-2000 season, and the Wave's 9-7 league mark was marked the program's most conference wins since 1996-97. The finish also earned the Green Wave a first round bye in the conference tournament for the first time since 2000.

AIR TIME:

• Tulane will have five of its games televised this season, including four national games on College Sports Television (CSTV) and one local contest on Cox Sports Television (CST).

TU's four CSTV games include LSU (1/2), at Tulsa (1/16), Rice (1/19) and Memphis (2/20). The Wave's lone CST game will be against cross-town rival New Orleans on Nov. 24.

FOUR POSTSEASON TEAMS, 16 HOME GAMES HIGHLIGHT 2007-08 SLATE:

• The 2007-08 Tulane Green Wave men's basketball schedule features four 2007 postseason teams, 16 home games, including marquee matchups against preseason top-ranked Memphis and Southeastern Conference members Auburn and LSU, and trips to Hawaii and New York.

Tulane will face one NCAA Tournament (Memphis) and three postseason National Invitation Tournament (NIT) squads (Georgia, East Tennessee State, and Syracuse). Memphis advanced to the NCAA Tournament "Elite Eight" a year ago and is expected to be the top-ranked team in many preseason polls. The Green Wave will face either Georgia or East Tennessee State in the second round of the 2007 Rainbow Classic this December.

FOGELMAN MAGIC:

• Tulane head coach **Dave Dickerson** has turned the Green Wave into a very self-ish team on its home floor. Through 26 games at Fogelman Arena under Dickerson's direction, TU is 19-7 (.730), including an 11-4 mark last season. Dickerson led the Greenies to an a 7-3 home mark in 2005-06.

Since Fogelman (then Tulane Gym) opened in 1933, the Green Wave has posted a 538-262 (.672) record in the venerable arena. TU's 77-62 victory over Auburn in the 2007-08 season opener marked the 800th game played at Fogelman Arena.

BIG SHOT MATT:

• A player who has evolved into a silent killer for Tulane is **Matt Wheaton**, who may not have gaudy stats, but has proved to be a difference maker with his gritty play. Last season, he started 21 of 30 games and averaged 4.5 points, 3.7 rebounds and 20.3 minutes per game, and connected on 44.4 percent of his three-point field goal attempts (16-36). However, his biggest contributions of the year came on two different occasions when he accounted for game-winning shots. His three-pointer with 10.7 seconds remaining at UAB wrapped up a fourth-place finish and a first-round bye in the Conference USA Tournament. His first of the year was at home against Arkansas-Pine Bluff when he rebounded a missed shot and banked in a jumper with one second remaining.

75 YEARS AT FOGELMAN ARENA:

• Avron B. Fogelman Arena, one of the most historic facilities in college basketball, celebrates its 75th year as the home of Green Wave basketball in 2007-08. The venerable facility has been the site for many of Tulane's greatest games for both of the Green Wave's men's and women's basketball programs. Fogelman Arena provides Tulane teams and fans with a "true" home court advantage with its size and unique design, which has translated into the many wins by both basketball programs over the years.

Construction for the original facility was funded by the Green Wave football team's appearance in the 1932 Rose Bowl. Some \$80,000 was earmarked toward the building of a gymnasium. Less than two years after the bowl appearance, on Oct. 27, 1933, Tulane Gymnasium was dedicated as part of Homecoming festivities on campus, and play began in the facility for the 1933-34 season. Tulane defeated Southwestern Louisiana, 38-34, in the facility's first game on Dec. 15, 1933. Tulane Gym was one of the largest in college basketball when it opened, even though there were no court level seats at first. Tulane played host to the 1942 NCAA East Regional in the facility. Floor-level seats were added in 1948.

--A LOOK BACK AT 2006-07--

TULANE WINS OPENING GAME FOR THE SECOND STRAIGHT YEAR:

• Tulane head coach Dave Dickerson became just the second coach in school history to lead the Green Wave to back-to-back opening round wins at the Conference USA Tournament with TU's win over Tulsa. Previously, only Shawn Finney (2000-05) has managed the feat.

Last year, Tulane opened the conference tournament play with a 64-58 victory over Marshall. Finney led the Wave to first round victories in 2002 and 2003.

TULANE REGISTERS MOST WINS IN SEVEN YEARS:

• Tulane's 17 victories last season marked the most since the 1999-2000 campaign when the Wave chalked up a 20-11 record. TU also notched 11 home victories, the most since the 2003-04 season, and its five road wins are the most since 2001-02.

TU IN THE C-USA TOURNAMENT UNDER DICKERSON:

• The Green Wave made its second Conference USA Tournament appearance under head coach Dave Dickerson and has a 2-2 mark under Dickerson, who led TU to a 58-56 win over Tulsa in the 2007 C-USA Tourney quarterfinals and joins former Tulane great, Perry Clark (1989-2000) as the only two coaches to lead TU to the semifinal round of the Conference USA Tournament.

In the 2006 postseason classic in Memphis, Tenn., eighth-seeded TU topped ninth-seeded Marshall in the first round, 68-54, but fell to host and eventual champion Memphis in the quarterfinal round, 75-56.

MOORE PULLS OFF RARE FEAT AT TULANE:

• Senior Chris Moore became just the third player in school history to earn Conference USA Player of the Week honors when he picked up the award the first time last season, and became just the second Green Wave player to receive the weekly honor twice in the same season. Moore joins former Tulane All-American Jerald Honeycutt (1994-97) as the only TU players to repeat as C-USA Players of the Week in a single season. Honeycutt earned the weekly award twice during Conference USA's inaugural season in 1995-96.

TU'S KEVIN SIMS NAMED TO ALL-FRESHMAN SQUAD:

• Tulane's Kevin Sims was one of five newcomers named to the 2007 Conference USA All-Freshman Team, as voted by the conference's 12 head coaches and select media.

GOMEZ NAMED TO NABC ALL-DISTRICT 8 2ND TEAM:

• David Gomez was selected to the 2007 National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Division I All-District 8 second team.

Gomez is a first-time member to the all-district team, and joins fellow Conference USA players Chris Douglas-Roberts (Memphis), Morris Almond (Rice) and Jeremy Hunt (Memphis) on the team. Douglas-Roberts and Almond were named to the first team, while Hunt joins Gomez on the second squad.

Last season, Gomez has led the Green Wave to a 17-13 overall record and a 9-7 mark in C-USA play. More importantly, he has helped Tulane to its first winning season in four years.

Gomez is the first Tulane player to receive NABC All-District honors since 2003 when Brandon Brown (2000-03) was also named to the second team.

TU PRODUCES BEST CONFERENCE MARK IN 10 YEARS

• Tulane produced nine conference wins last season and clinched a fourth-place finish in conference play. TU's nine league wins are the most in nine years when the Wave produced a mark of 11-3 and finished first in the C-USA Red Division in 1996-97.

LIGHTING UP THE SCOREBOARD:

• Tulane's offense lit up the scoreboard by dismantling UTEP, 92-67. The Green Wave easily produced its highest scoring total under second-year head coach Dave Dickerson, and the 92 points marked the first time TU has surpassed 90 points since Dec. 23, 2002, when the Wave dispatched Jackson State at home, 94-70.

The 25-point victory tied for the largest margin of victory in C-USA play under Dickerson. Two years ago, TU handed Marshall a 61-36 setback at home.

STITH MAKING OPPONENTS PAY FOR PAINT TIME:

• Tulane junior Donnie Stith turned the opponents' lane into a "no shot" zone by rejecting a total of 52 attempts last season, which led the Green Wave and ranked sixth overall among C-USA players.

Stith swatted a career-best six shots against Southern Miss (2/3), which ranked among the best single game performances by a Conference USA player last season.

TU D-FENCE AMONG C-USA, NATION'S BEST:

• Tulane's stingy defense was smothering last season. TU allowed just 68 points per game and limited its opponents to 39.2 percent from the field. Only 11 teams have managed to score 70+ points on the Wave this season: Butler- 77; LSU- 74; UNO- 84; Rice- 75 (1/10); Tulsa- 79; Memphis- 95/-71; UCF- 80; Houston- 78, Southern Miss (2/24) - 72, East Carolina (2/28)- 72 and UAB (3/3)- 74. TU ranked third among league schools and 14th nationally for field goal percentage defense.

- Dave Dickerson begins his third season as the head coach on the Up-town campus. Dickerson has an overall record of 31-30 and a Conference USA mark of 15-15.

- Tulane has a record of 19-7 (.720) at Fogelman Arena during Dickerson's tenure.

- Under his tutelage, three Green Wave players have earned all-conference honors, including All-Conference USA third-team performers Quincy Davis (2006) and David Gomez (2007), and Kevin Sims, who was selected to the All C-USA Freshman team in 2007.

- During his second season, Dickerson led Tulane to a 17-13 overall record and TU recorded its best conference finish in nine years with a 9-7 league mark, which was good enough for fourth place. TU's 17 victories marked the its most wins in seven seasons and the program's first winning season in four years.

- Dickerson's 29 wins in his first two seasons puts him in third place for the most wins by a Tulane coach in the first two seasons.

- Became the 22nd head men's basketball coach in Tulane history on April 1, 2005.

- Despite the challenges brought on by Hurricane Katrina, Dickerson led Tulane to a 12-17 overall record and a 6-8 Conference USA mark, which tied the Wave for sixth place.

- Dickerson came to Tulane from alma mater of Maryland, where he spent nine years as an assistant under Gary Williams. In 2004-05, he was the program's associate head coach. TULANE ROLLS AUBURN, 77-62

Stith Leads the Green Wave with 12 points

New Orleans – Senior Donnavan Stith led three Tulane players into double figures with 12 points and all 10 Green Wave players that saw action reached the scoring column to take out Southeastern Conference member Auburn, 77-62, in the season opener for both squads at Fogelman Arena.

Both teams stormed out of the gates and blis-tered the nets from behind the arc. Auburn (0-1) buried its first three three-pointers to take a 9-4 lead, but Tulane (1-0) roared back and tied the game on a trey by sophomore Eric Vianney.

Sophomore Asim McQueen came off the bench to hit a free throw and Vianney followed up with his second trey to ignite a 12-2 run and the Wave never looked back. McQueen knocked down two more free throws to give TU a 28-18 advantage with 6:07 remain- ing in the opening period.

Auburn managed to slice the lead to seven points on a pair of charity shots from Rasheem Bar- rett with under four minutes remaining, but Tulane connected on six straight free throws and freshman Johnny Mayhane drained his third trey of the half to give TU a 38-27 advantage at intermission.

Tulane continued to pressure the Tigers with its smothering defense and extended its lead to as much as 21 points in the second half. However, the Tigers made one last run at the Green Wave with a 20-7 spurt that closed the gap to eight points, 63-55, when Barrett hit a jumper with 4:05 left on the clock.

Following a timeout, sophomore Kevin Sims hit a three- pointer that gave the Wave a double-digit lead, and Auburn never threatened again.

Stith led the Wave with 12 points and several spectacular dunks and a wrap-around jump shot under the basket that brought the Tulane faithful to its feet. Sims contributed 11 points and six assists, while Vian- ney added 10 points in his Tulane debut.

GOMEZ LEADS TULANE PAST CHARLESTON OUTHERN, 66-60

TU Senior leads all scorers with 22 Points

Charleston, S.C. – Senior David Gomez led all scorers with 22 points and Tulane outlasted Charleston South- ern, 66-60, at the North Charleston Coliseum.

Playing in its first road game of the year, Tulane (2-0) had to withstand a late rally in the final minutes to improve to 2-0 for the first time since 2003-04.

Tulane only trailed once in the game, but never led by more than 10 points until midway through the second half when freshman Johnny Mayhane jump- started a 9-2 run with a jumper at the 11:02 mark. eric Vianney hit 1-of-2 free throw attempts to increase the lead to 11 points, the Wave's largest of the game.

Facing its largest deficit of the game, Charleston Southern (1-1) refused to go quietly. The Buccaneers, who hit 11-of-23 three-point attempts for the game, used a 10-1 spurt in the waning minutes to climb to within two points, 59-57, with 1:53 remaining.

CSU continued its run with a free throw by Giedrius Knysas and Jamarco Warren drilled one of his five three-pointers . Chris Moore brought the home team to within a bucket with a lay-up at the 1:53 mark.

Following the timeout, senior Matt Wheaton was fouled and nailed both of his charity shots to increase the Wave lead to four points with just 65 seconds remaining. On the ensuing possession, CSU's Omar Carter got an open look, but his three-point attempt missed its mark and Gomez was there for the crucial rebound and was immediately fouled. Gomez walked to the other end of the floor and sank both attempts to increase the visitor's lead to six. However, the Buc- caneers sliced the deficit in half on a Warren trey with 0:16 remaining. Sims was fouled on the inbounds pass and hit 1-of-2 free throw shots, and CSU couldn't find the mark in the closing seconds.
