## TULANE HOSTS IN-STATE RIVAL NICHOLLS STATE:

• The Tulane basketball team (1-1) returns home this Saturday to host its second in-state school in the span of one week as the Nicholls State Colonels (1-0) invade Fogelman Arena for a 2 p.m. contest.

Tulane opened the season last Saturday with a 68-62 victory at home against McNeese State. The Wave will face four Louisiana schools this season (McNeese State, Nicholls State, New Orleans, Grambling State) and is off to a 1-0 start.

TU is 1-0 at home this season and notched a 10-6 overall record on its home floor a year ago, including 7-1 in non-conference games, and has won its last five straight decisions at home against non-league opponents.

Through two games this season, junior **Kevin Sims** leads the Wave in scoring with 14 points per game, while classmate **Asim McQueen** is the team's top rebounder with 8.5 boards per outing.

The Green Wave dispatched McNeese State in the 2008-09 season opener at Fogelman Arena, 68-62, behind 17 points each from guards **Kevin Sims** and **Kris Richard**, while **Robinson Louisme** added 11 points.

Tulane fell at No. 7/8 Texas this past Tuesday, 76-51. Sims led the way with 11 points.

Tulane returns two of its top three scorers from last season in **Kevin Sims** and **Robinson Louisme**. Sims, who averaged 12.2 points and 3.8 assists per game, is the team's top returning scorer and assists leader, and also led the team in three-pointers (46), while Louisme, who averaged 9.8 points and 5.4 rebounds, is the Wave's top returning rebounding leader.

The Green Wave returns seven total letterwinners for the 2008-09 campaign, including three starters (Sims, Louisme, **Daniel Puckett**) and will feature two players who sat out last season and four newcomers.

TU's roster breakdown includes three seniors, three juniors, four sophomores, one redshirt freshman and two true freshmen.

## SCOUTING THE COLONELS:

• Nicholls State (1-0) got the 2008-09 campaign off to a fast start with a decisive 79-62 home win over in-state rival New Orleans this past Wednesday.

Ryan Bathie and Fred Hunter each scored 19 points and were two of four Colonels to reach double figures. NSU shot 51.7 percent in each half and forced the Privateers into 21 turnovers, while committing just 10.

The Colonels were 3-15 overall on the road a year ago, including just 1-9 in non-conference road games.

Nicholls returns nine letterwinners, including four starters, and welcomes six newcomers. The Colonels completed last season with a 10-21 overall record.

## McQUEEN HAS SOLID OUTING AT TEXAS:

• Junior **Asim McQueen** has been productive as a first-year starter this season. McQueen is coming off a career-high 11-rebound performance at No. 7/8 Texas last Tuesday and also added nine points, narrowly missing his first career double-double.

McQueen started in the opener against McNeese State and finished with five points, six boards, one block and one steal.

## SERIES & NOTES:

• Tuesday's game marks the 17th all-time meeting between Tulane and Nicholls State and the Green Wave leads the series 16-0.

• Tulane has an all-time record of 14-0 against the Colonels at Fogelman Arena.

• The last time these two schools met was a year ago at Fogelman Arena and the Green Wave extended its lead in the overall series to 16-0 with a 73-51 victory.

• Tulane will face a modern in-state school for the 373rd time this Saturday when it hosts Nicholls State. The Green Wave has a record of 205-167 against in-state schools in Louisiana, which includes Dillard, Loyola, LSU, Nicholls State, Southern (N.O.), Southern (B.R.), Centenary, Louisiana College, Louisiana-Lafayette, Louisiana-Monroe, Louisiana Tech, New Orleans, Northwestern State, Southeastern Louisiana and Xavier (La.).

• Tulane has an all-time record of 34-5 against teams from the Southland Conference. The Wave's last contest against an SLC squad was a 68-62 victory over McNeese State exactly one ago at Fogelman Arena.

## LOOKING AHEAD

• Tulane will play its next two games at home (Nicholls State, Albany State-11/25) before departing for the two-hour bus trip to the 2008 USA Basketball Classic in Mobile, Ala.

The event will take place Nov. 28-29 at the Mitchell Center (10,000) and features a four-team field including Maine, host South Alabama, Tulane and UC-Davis. The Green Wave opens the event with a first time meeting against UC-Davis at 5 p.m. on Nov. 28 and will play the winner of the South Alabama/Maine game the next day. TU is 1-0 against Maine and 1-2 against the Jaguars.

## TU IN FOURTH YEAR UNDER DICKERSON

Tulane sets sail in its fourth season under head coach **Dave Dickerson** in 2008-09, and will look to notch its third straight winning season for the first time since the mid 1990s. Dickerson, who has an overall record of 47-46, was named the NABC District 8 Coach of the Year after leading the Wave to its second straight 17-win season last season.

One constant for Tulane during Dickerson's tenure has been its success in opening round games of the Conference USA Tournament. Last season, the Green Wave moved to 3-0 under Dickerson when it dispatched Marshall in the first round of the 2008 Conference USA Men's Basketball Tournament.

### SIMS NAMED TO BOB COUSY AWARD WATCH LIST

Tulane junior point guard **Kevin Sims** is one of 34 players from around the nation, and the lone representative from Conference USA, that have been named to the 2009 Bob Cousy Award Watch List. Sims has started 52 of 62 games and has produced 690 points and 222 assists over the past two seasons, and is one of the top guards in C-USA.

The Bob Cousy Award presented by The Hartford is given to the top collegiate male basketball point guard annually spanning across all divisions within the game by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. The selection criteria emphasize leadership, team work, success, and fundamentals as being critical parts for the game of basketball as a point guard.

### WELCOME TO THE SHOW ROOKIES

A pair of freshmen signees from the state of Texas will make their debuts this Saturday against McNeese State. **Kendall Timmons** (6-5) is a guard from Southwest High School in Fort Worth, while **Trent Rogers** (6-3) is a combination guard from Houston's Strake Jesuit High School. Timmons, the Texas 4A Player of the Year, averaged 18.2 points, 7.4 rebounds, 5.1 assists and 3.9 steals led his team to the state title game, while Rogers, one of the top players in the Houston area, averaged 12.6 points per outing and guided his team to a district championship.

### INSIDE THE 2008-09 GREEN WAVE

- The Wave has notched back-to-back seasons with 17 victories, which marks the school's first stretch of consecutive winning seasons in 11 years.
- During its 17 wins last season, the Green Wave put together three or more straight wins on four occasions, including a stretch with four and five victories.
- TU has a record of 28-13 (.683) at Fogelman Arena and a mark of 18-5 (.783) against non-conference teams in New Orleans under **Dave Dickerson**.
- Tulane was once again one of the top shot blocking teams in the country last season with 171, which ranked No. 19 in the nation with 5.3 per game. Over the last two years, TU has been tough in the paint, rejecting a combined 359 of its opponents' field goal attempts, or 5.8 per outing.

## INSIDE THE 2008-09 GREEN WAVE (CONTINUED)

• **Robinson Louisme** hit 60.2 percent of his field goal attempts (127-211) last season, which led all Conference USA players in field goal percentage, and was the fourth-best single season effort in school history. Louisme hit his first 13 field goal attempts of the year before suffering his first miss in the fourth game, and he shot 60 percent or better from the field in 19 of 32 games.

• **Kevin Sims** accomplished a feat not seen at Tulane in over 10 years. Sims put together back-to-back seasons with 100+ assists with 102 as a freshman and 120 during his sophomore campaign, which ranks ninth on Tulane's single season charts. Sims is the first player to record consecutive 100+ assists seasons since Jerald Honeycutt with 120 in 1995-96, and 131 in 1996-97.

• When Sims wasn't dishing the ball to his teammates he was taking it away from the opposition. Sims' 44 steals was not only the best by a Tulane player last season, but ranked eighth among C-USA players. Sims' six steals at Syracuse tied for the best single game effort in the league in 2007-08.

• One year ago, the Green Wave outscored its opponents in the paint, 932 to 700, and won 15 of its 17 games when dominating the lane.

• Tulane played 32 games during the 2007-08 campaign, which marked the most in a single-season since the 1995-96 campaign.

• **Kevin Sims** did not have to worry about playing time last season. He not only led the team in minutes played with 34.6 per game, but his 1,108 total ranks as the fifth most on the school's single season list for minutes played.

• Despite nagging injuries last season, **Daniel Puckett** started 18 of 31 games and averaged 5.1 points and 1.5 assists per game.

• **Eric Vianney, Johnny Mayhane** and **Kris Richard** combined for 48 three-point field goals last season.

• **Asim McQueen** showed a flash of his potential last year on the road at Rice when he notched a career-high 15 points. In 16 minutes of action, McQueen hit his first career three-pointer in the first half and then torched the nets for 12 points and two highlight reel dunks in the second half. He finished a perfect 7-of-7 from the field.

## FORMER TU STAR LEWIS RETURNS HOME AS AN ASSISTANT COACH

Former Tulane basketball standout **Kim Lewis** returned to his alma mater when head coach **Dave Dickerson** added the Louisiana native to his staff as an assistant coach on Sept. 9.

Lewis, 35, begins his third tour with the Green Wave in 2008-09. He was a four-year letterwinner for Tulane from 1990-95, and later served an assistant coach from 1996-98. Lewis spent the last two seasons at Duquesne under head coach Ron Everhart, a former Tulane assistant coach under Perry Clark who recruited and coached Lewis during his playing career with the Green Wave.

Following the 2007-08 season with the Dukes, Lewis was hired by Centenary head coach Greg Gary as the top assistant for the Gents. Lewis and Gary each served as assistant coaches at Duquesne and were teammates at Tulane from 1990-92. Prior to Duquesne, Lewis had coaching stints at Northeastern (2004-2006), McNeese State (2002-03) and Xavier (La.) (2001-02).

As a collegian, Lewis played at Tulane from 1991-95 and led the Wave to 78 wins and three postseason tournament appearances during his career

### TULANE SIGNS A PAIR OF STANDOUT GUARDS TO NATIONAL LETTERS-OF-INTENT

Tulane University head men's basketball coach **Dave Dickerson** signed of two standout basketball players- **Jordan Callahan** and **Aaron Holmes**- to national letters-of-intent on Nov. 12, the first day of national signing day.

Callahan is a 5-11, 170-pound point guard who graduated from Blessed Trinity in Roswell, Ga., in 2008 and is currently enrolled at The New Hampton School, a prep school in New Hampton, New Hampshire. As a high school star at Blessed Trinity under head coach Brian Marks, he led the team to a 48-10 overall record during his final two years and earned honorable mention all-state and team MVP honors both seasons. During his senior campaign, Callahan averaged 14.3 points and 4.8 assists per game and set the school's single-season scoring mark with 443 points.

A 6-5, 195-pound shooting guard from St. Petersburg, Fla., and 2006 graduate of St. Petersburg Catholic, Holmes originally signed with Florida State out of high school, but transferred to South Florida following his first semester. After sitting out one full year due to NCAA Transfer rules, he played in 18 conference games with the Bulls, but left USF after the 2007-08 campaign due to a coaching change. Holmes is currently enrolled at Santa Fe Community College in Gainesville, Fla., and will have two years of eligibility remaining.

Rated as a top 50 national prospect as a senior, Holmes scored 2,748 career points, the most in school history, and led St. Petersburg Catholic to four straight district titles and three trips to the state Final Four. He is the only player to be named All-Suncoast Player of the Year three times by the St. Petersburg Times (2004-06), and was also runner-up for Florida's Mr. Basketball in 2006. He also led his AAU team to the Showtime National title.

### GOMEZ NAMED TO ALL C-USA SECOND TEAM:

• **David Gomez** has been named to the 2008 Conference USA Second Team, according to a vote by league head coaches and media members.

A 6'8" forward from Baton Rouge, La., Gomez is a repeat performer to the conference's postseason team as he garnered third team accolades a year ago. He is the first Tulane player to receive second team recognition since Brandon Brown in 2002, and is just the third Green Wave player to earn Conference USA honors in back-to-back seasons since the school became a member in 1995-96. Gomez joins Jerald Honeycutt (1st) and Rayshard Allen (2nd), both of whom earned All C-USA honors during the in 1996 and 1997 campaigns.

### DICKERSON NAMED NABC DISTRICT 8 COACH OF THE YEAR:

• Tulane men's basketball coach **Dave Dickerson** was one of 15 head coaches from around the nation to receive all-district coaching honors from the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC). Dickerson was named the NABC District 8 Coach of the Year, and was the only coach from Conference USA to receive the national award.

Dickerson, who is a first time recipient of the award, guided Tulane to a 17-15 overall record last season that included wins over Southeastern Conference members Auburn, Georgia and LSU, and TU also has a win over St. John's from the Big East Conference.

### TULANE POSTS BACK-TO-BACK WINNING SEASONS FOR FIRST TIME IN 11 YEARS:

• Tulane notched its second straight winning season for the first time in 11 years with its 77-75 win over East Carolina in the regular season finale.

TU produced a 17-13 overall record in 2006-07 and followed that season up with a 17-15 mark in 2007-08.

The last time the Wave registered back-to-back winning seasons was during the 1995-96 (22-10) and 1996-97 (20-11) campaigns under Perry Clark.

### A FORMIDABLE FRONT COURT:

• One of Tulane's strength during the 2007-08 campaign was the frontcourt play of David Gomez, Robinson Louisme, Donnavan Stith and Asim McQueen.

Together this group averaged 33.4 points and 18.3 rebounds per game, and produced a combined shooting percentage of 52 percent (393-756). Gomez led the team in scoring 19 times, while Louisme has been TU's top scorer four times and Stith was in the season opener. The group has scored in double figures a combined 51 times in 2007-08.

### SIMS CAN SCORE TOO:

• **David Gomez** isn't the only Green Wave averaging double figure scoring on a consistent basis. **Kevin Sims** has a team-leading 25 double figure scoring games, and finished with 10 or more points 12 times in 16 conference games.

**GOMEZ NAMED TO ALL-DISTRICT FIRST TEAM:**

• Senior **David Gomez** was named to the National Association of Basketball Coaches All-District 8 First Team. Gomez was among 150 players from 15 districts selected.

Gomez is a repeat performer to the all-district team, but is a first time member of the first team. Last season, he was named to the second team, and is Tulane’s first back-to-back selection since Brandon Brown in 2002 and 2003 and also garnered first team honors for the first time since Brown in 2003.

**A PERFECT EFFORT:**

• After not attempting a free throw in the first half of its last game at Syracuse, Tulane drained all 15 attempts in the second half and finished 15-of-15 from the charity stripe, which marked the first time TU had finished perfect from the free-throw line since Jan. 7, 1998, when the Wave connected on all 10 attempts against Saint Louis.

**GREEN WAVE WINS FIVE STRAIGHT:**

• Tulane posted an 84-77 win at Rice on Feb. 2 to increase its win streak to a season-best five straight, which marked the first time in eight years that Tulane has strung together five consecutive wins. The last time was in 1999-2000, when the Wave had a stretch of nine and five straight wins.

Prior to its loss at UTEP, Tulane reeled off its five wins over Tulsa (67-65), SMU (67-52), East Carolina (72-56) and two over Rice (61-56/84-77).

**SPEAKING OF OVERTIME:**

• With its overtime win at Tulsa, Tulane now has an overall record of 32-32 in overtime games.

Prior to the Tulsa game, the last team to take Tulane to overtime was Rice last season in Houston before prevailing, 75-70, over the Green Wave.

In its 97-year history that spans 2,155 games, Tulane has been involved in 53 single overtime contests, seven double overtime affairs, two three overtime games and two four overtime marathons.

- Dave Dickerson is in his fourth season as the head coach on the Up-town campus, and has an overall record of 47-46 and a Conference USA mark of 21-25.
- Tulane is 3-1 all-time in season openers under Dickerson.
- Named the 2008 National Association of Basketball Coaches District 8 Coach of the Year.
- Tulane has a record of 27-13 (.675) at Fogelman Arena and a mark of 17-5 (.772) against non-conference teams in New Orleans under head coach Dave Dickerson.
- Has a record of 3-3 in the Conference USA Tournament and has never lost a first round game.
- Registered his 40th career win (at Tulsa) a little over midway through his third season (76 games) and joined Clifford Wells (67 games), Charles Moir (71 games), Ned Fowler (61 games) and Perry Clark (84 games) as the only coaches in the 97-year history of Tulane basketball to win 40 games in under three seasons. The 76 games are the fourth fewest games in school history needed to attain 40 wins, and he currently ranks seventh for career coaching victories.
- Under his tutelage, three Green Wave players have earned all-conference honors, including All-Conference USA third-team performers Quincy Davis (2006) and David Gomez (2007, 2008), and Kevin Sims, who was selected to the All C-USA Freshman team in 2007.
- During his second season, Dickerson led Tulane to a 17-13 overall record and TU recorded its best conference finish in nine years with a 9-7 league mark, which was good enough for fourth place. TU's 17 victories marked the most wins in seven seasons and the program's first winning season in four years.
- Dickerson's 29 wins in his first two seasons puts him in third place for the most wins by a Tulane coach in the first two seasons.
- Became the 22nd head men's basketball coach in Tulane history on April 1, 2005.
- Despite the challenges brought on by Hurricane Katrina, Dickerson led Tulane to a 12-17 overall record and a 6-8 Conference USA mark, which tied the Wave for sixth place.
- Dickerson came to Tulane from alma mater of Maryland, where he spent nine years as an assistant under Gary Williams. In 2004-05, he was the program's associate head coach. He helped the Terrapins to nine straight postseason appearances, five Sweet Sixteens, two Final Fours and one National Championship in 2002.
- Accolades for Dickerson have included his recognition as an AFLAC Assistant Coach of the Year in 2003, the ACC's No. 1 Assistant Coach as named by Basketball News (2003-04), Athlon Sports' No. 4 Assistant Coach in the nation (2003-04), and an "Assistant Coach on the Rise" as tabbed by ESPN's Andy Katz.

# RICHARD, SIMS LEADS TU PAST McNEESE STATE, 68-62

TU guards combine for 34 points

New Orleans – Tulane junior Kevin Sims and sophomore Kris Richard each scored 17 points and senior Robinson Louisme added 11 points to lead the Green Wave to a 68-62 victory over McNeese State in the season opener for both teams at Fogelman Arena.

Tulane (1-0) appeared to be pulling away when sophomore Johnny Mayhane jump started a 10-5 run early in the second half. However, the Cowboys rode the sharpshooting of Stephan Martin and Patrick Richard to scrape back into contention. Martin scored five consecutive points during an 8-2 run and Patrick Richard's three-pointer at 8:24 brought the visitors from Lake Charles to within three points, 44-41.

The Wave answered with a trey of its own from senior Daniel Puckett to extend its lead to six points and eventually pushed its advantage to eight points on several occasions, but the scrappy McNeese State team continued to chip away and would not let Tulane off the hook. With TU leading 53-45 at the 5:34 mark, Diego Kaplan caught fire with back-to-back three-pointers that trimmed the deficit to four points.

Freshman Kendall Timmons and Louisme each hit their two free charity shots to give the Wave another eight point lead. Martin brought the Cowboys to within six points and looked to have an opportunity to get even closer following a Kris Richard turnover, but Richard came right back and stole the ball from Kaplan and finished the play with a two-handed dunk.

Tulane converted five of seven free throw attempts down the stretch, including two by Sims with 0:07 remaining, that iced the first win of the season for the Wave.

# TU FALLS AT NO. 7/8 TEXAS, 71-51

Sims scored 11; McQueen grabs 11 rebounds

Austin, Texas – Junior Kevin Sims scored a team-high 11 points and classmate Asim McQueen grabbed a game- and career-high 11 rebounds, but the No. 7/8 ranked Texas Longhorns used an 18-4 run in the first half to take control of the game and hand Tulane a 76-51 loss in the road opener in front of 10,800 at the Erwin Center.

Texas (2-0) jumped on Tulane early and led 6-0 in the opening minutes. However, the Green Wave (1-1) responded with a 6-0 run of its own, which was sparked by a pair of Sims free throws and he tied the game with a lay-up at 16:23. The teams traded baskets over the next few minutes and TU trailed 13-10 following a finger roll lay-up from sophomore Johnny Mayhane.

However, the nationally-ranked Longhorns flexed their muscle and ran off an 18-4 run to take a commanding 31-14 advantage with 7:43 remaining in the first half. Tulane pulled to within 13 points on a trey by sophomore David Booker, but couldn't get any closer and trailed 42-25 at intermission.

The Green Wave was plagued by poor shooting (.321) and turnovers (12) in the opening period and was whistled for eight fouls, which resulted in a 10-of-15 effort from the foul line by the Longhorns.

Texas left no possibilities for a Tulane comeback by opening the second half with a 17-2 run to extend its lead to 59-27 with 15:41 remaining in the game. The Wave made a late run in the final 10 minutes, outscoring Texas, 16-7, with most of the players on the floor for the Wave coming off the bench.
