TULANE HOSTS LONG TIME RIVAL SOUTHERN MISS THIS WEDNESDAY

• The Tulane basketball team (7-8, 1-1 C-USA) hosts its most common rival in Conference USA play as Southern Miss (9-5, 0-1 C-USA) makes its 34th trip to Fogelman Arena for the 67th game in the all-time series this Wednesday at 7 p.m.

Tulane is 6-2 at home this season, including 1-0 in Conference USA play, after posting a 65-54 victory over Rice in its C-USA home opener last Saturday.

The Wave is averaging 73.1 points per game at home this season (11.5 points better than its season average), while holding its opponents to 61.6 points per contest. TU has scored 80+ points twice (87 vs. Albany State; 88 vs. North Carolina A&T) and has held five opponents to 65 or fewer points on its home floor this season.

Tulane has a record of 32-15 (.680) at Fogelman Arena under Dave Dickerson.

Junior **Kevin Sims** leads TU in scoring with 11.5 points per game and assists with 3.9 per outing, while senior **Robinson Louisme** is the team's second-leading rebounder with 6.4 boards per outing.

SCOUTING THE GOLDEN EAGLES

• Southern Miss (9-5, 0-1 C-USA) opened the season with a 4-4 mark after its first eight non-conference games, but reeled off five straight victories and concluded its non-league schedule with a 9-4 mark. However, the Golden Eagles stumbled out of the gates to begin Conference USA play with a 67-58 loss on the road at Tulsa in its lone league game of the 2009 campaign.

USM is 0-1 on the road this season with the Tulsa game marking its lone true road game of the year. The Golden Eagles played seven games at neutral sites and notched a record of 5-2.

Jeremy Wise, a 2008 All-Conference USA Second Team selection, leads the team in scoring with 17.6 points per game and also is the top assist leader with 4.7 per outing. Courtney Beasley is the team's second leading scorer (13.0) and is also the Golden Eagles' top rebounder with 6.6 per contest. R.L. Horton is the third USM player averaging double figure scoring with 12 points per game.

Southern Miss has taken care of the ball this season with just 10.7 miscues per game, which ranks second among Conference USA teams and fourth nationally.

SERIES RECORD & NOTES

• Wednesday's game marks the 67th meeting between Tulane and Southern Miss and the Green Wave leads the all-time series, 39-27.

• TU leads the series in New Orleans, 23-10.

• The two schools have met regularly since 1948 and have been members of both the Metro Conference and C-USA. The Green Wave has faced the Golden Eagles more times than any Conference USA opponent.

• Since the two teams became Conference USA rivals in 1995, Tulane holds a 14-13 lead, including an 8-6 mark at Fogelman Arena. From 1982-83 to 1994-95, the two teams were both members of the Metro Conference, and Tulane held an 11-8 edge in the series.

THE LAST TIME

• The last time Tulane and Southern Miss squared off was at Fogelman Arena on Feb. 23, 2008. In that game, Sophomore **Kevin Sims** scored 17 points and freshman **Kris Richard** added a career-best 15 points, but Southern Miss' **Jeremy Wise** led all scorers with 27 points and the Golden Eagles escaped with a 70-59 victory.

Trailing, 557-51, Sims hit lay-up to draw TU to within four points at 57-53 with less than five minutes remaining, but that basket proved to be the final field goal for the Wave until Richard hit a lay-up with eight seconds remaining.

Southern Miss took advantage of the cold spell when **Craig Craft** hit a jumper to give USM a six point, 59-53, lead with 3:04 remaining. Senior **Donnavan Stith** then connected on 1-of-2 free throws, but his second missed and was rebounded by classmate **David Gomez**. However, Tulane turned the ball over and Wise splashed an NBA-range trey to give the Golden Eagles a 62-54 lead with 1:56 to play.

NEXT UP

• Tulane hits the road for the second time this season during Conference USA play when the Green Wave treks to Dallas, Texas, to face the SMU Mustangs (5-8, 0-1 C-USA) on Saturday, Jan. 17 at 7 p.m. The game will be broadcast live on Time Warner in Dallas. The Green Wave won last year's contest with the Mustangs, 67-52, at Fogelman Arena.

SIMS NAMED TO BOB COUSY AWARD WATCH LIST

Tulane junior point guard **Kevin Sims** is one of 34 players from around the nation, and the lone representative from Conference USA, that have been named to the 2009 Bob Cousy Award Watch List. Sims has started 67 of 77 games and has produced 863 points and 289 assists in three seasons, and is one of the top guards in C-USA.

The Bob Cousy Award presented by The Hartford is given to the top collegiate male basketball point guard annually spanning across all divisions within the game by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. The selection criteria emphasize leadership, team work, success, and fundamentals as being critical parts for the game of basketball as a point guard.

VIANNEY HAS RECORD AFTERNOON VS. RICE

• Junior **Eric Vianney** set the school's single game record for three-point field percentage after finishing a perfect 5-for-5 from downtown against Rice. In fact, Vianney nailed all six of his field goal attempts for the day and contributed six rebounds and five assists.

Vianney surpassed the previous mark of four, which has been reached by four different players, including most recently by Dylan Osean vs. Marquette on March 4, 2000. Vianney's five treys ranks 10th on the school's single game list.

VIANNEY OPENS C-USA PLAY WITH HOT START

• Eric Vianney is Tulane's best offensive player through the first two conference games of the year. He set career highs in scoring the last two games, including 18 points in the Wave's last game vs. Rice.

Vianney leads the team in scoring during C-USA play with 15.5 points, nearly 10 points better than his season average, and he is shooting 70.6 percent (12-of-17) from the field, including 60 percent (6-of-10) from behind the arc, and is averaging a team-best 4.5 assists per outing.

KEEPING THE SCORING TO A MINIMUM

• Tulane has held eight opponents this season to 65 or fewer total points, and the Wave has a record of 6-2 in those contests. TU's top defensive efforts have come against Grambling State (37), New Orleans (49), Rice (54) North Carolina A&T (55), Maine (56), Albany State (59), George Mason (60) and McNeese State (62).

WAVE TRIO HAS CAREER NIGHT AT ECU

• A trio of players registered their career single game scoring mark in Tulane's narrow 69-66 loss at East Carolina in the Conference USA opener for both squads.

Senior **Daniel Puckett** chalked up a career-best 22 points, his third 20-point performance this season, while junior **Eric Vianney** and sophomore **David Booker** registered then career highs with 13 and 9 points, respectively. The trio combined for 44 of the TU's 66 points on 16-of-27 FG att. (.593). Vianney surpassed his single game total in the following game vs. Rice.

PUCKETT NEARS TOP 10 LIST FOR GAMES PLAYED

• Senior **Daniel Puckett** will play in his 106th career game at Tulane this Wednesday vs. Southern Miss and is currently just 11 games shy of breaking into the school's top-10 for career games played. Tulane has 14 league games remaining this season and one guaranteed contest in the Conference USA Tournament. Should Puckett play in all 14 games, he would finish in fifth place for the most games played. The school record for most games played is 125.

ROB THE REBOUNDER

• Senior **Robinson Louisme** re-established his single game mark for rebounds with 13 against Auburn, which was his third career game with 10+ rebounds. Louisme leads the team with 6.4 rebounds per contest and has nine games with at least six rebounds this season. Louisme's previous game high of 11 rebounds came against Rice (1/10/07) and No. 1 Memphis (2/20/08).

SIMS NEARS TU'S TOP-10 ASSISTS LEADERS

• Tulane junior **Kevin Sims** is well on his way to completing his career among the school's top assists leaders. Sims currently has 289 career assists and is just 20 shy of breaking into the school's top-10 leaders.

Sims currently has his sights set on catching **Tom Hicks'** (1974-76) 10th place total of 309.

On his current pace, Sims can complete his junior year with 331 assists, which would place him in eighth place heading into his senior year.

THE MASTER THIEF

• Sophomore **Kris Richard** recorded a total of 29 steals in 31 games during his rookie campaign last season with the Green Wave. This season, Richard already has 25 thefts through 15 contests and currently ranks ninth among the top thieves in Conference USA with 1.7 per outing.

Richard swiped a career-best five steals against NC A&T and has two or more steals in 10 contests this season.

THE TURNOVER TALE

• In its past five home games, Tulane limited its turnovers to nine against Western Kentucky, 10 vs. Grambling State and just 12 vs. North Carolina A&T and Binghamton, and 13 vs. Rice

In four of the team's seven wins this season, the Wave has handled the ball well with 12 or fewer turnovers, including Grambling State, 11 vs. Nicholls State and 12 against both Maine and NC A&T.

Tulane registered a season-low six turnovers on the road at East Carolina,

SIMS IS TU'S STEADY ENGINE

• **Kevin Sims** has become a force to be reckoned with this season. The 5'10" point guard leads TU in scoring with 11.5 points and assists with 3.9 per game this season, and has surpassed the 20-point plateau twice during his junior campaign with a 22-point outing against Nicholls State and a 20-point performance vs. Maine. He has reached double figures 10 times and has five plus assists in six contests.

20 SOMETHING

• This season three different players have already scored 20 or more points in a game. Senior **Daniel Puckett** (20 vs. Binghamton; 21 vs. Western Kentucky; 22 vs. East Carolina) has three 20+ contests, while junior **Kevin Sims** (22 vs. Nicholls State; 20 vs. Maine) has two contests and junior **Asim McQueen** (20 vs. UC-Davis) has one 20-point outing.

Tulane also had three different players reach the 20-point plateau last season and four players in 2006-07.

A BENCH-MARK EFFORT

• Tulane's bench has been effective for the Green Wave this season, outscoring its opponents' bench 270-181. TU's bench outscored Nicholls State (15-3), Texas (27-16), Albany State (35-12), Maine (10-0), Western Kentucky (17-5), North Carolina A&T (44-15), Grambling State (29-3), East Carolina (22-17) and Rice (18-12).

• Tulane's defense notched his finest performance of the season in its last outing against Grambling State.

In the second half, TU allowed Grambling State just two field goals during the final 14:33 and went over nine minutes without surrendering a field goal.

The Green Wave gave up just 37 points, which marked the fewest points by an opponent since Marshall scored 36 points in a 61-36 loss to Tulane in the first-ever meeting between the two schools at Fogelman Arena on Dec. 4, 2006.

PUCKETT'S DECEMBER TO REMEMBER

• Senior **Daniel Puckett** evolved to an opponents' worst nightmare in TU's four home games during the month of December, averaging 15.3 points, 6.8 rebounds, 2.3 assists, and shot 56 percent (20-of-36) from the field, including a sizzling 70 percent (7-of-10) from behind the three-point line.

Puckett finished with 20 points, seven rebounds, two assists and two steals vs. Binghamton, hitting 5-of-10 field goal attempts, including his lone three-pointer.

Puckett torched the nets for a career-high 21 points vs. Western Kentucky, hitting 8-of-14 field goal attempts, including 4-of-6 three-point tries, and grabbed five rebounds to go along with three assists.

Against NC A&T, Puckett rang up his first career double-double with 12 points and 12 rebounds, and once again distributed three assists. He sank 4-of-8 field goal attempts, including his lone three-point attempt.

TIMMONS HAS CAREER NIGHT AT GEORGE MASON WITH 18 POINTS

• Freshman **Kendall Timmons** gave the Green Wave a glimpse of his ability that made him a highly recruited player for Tulane basketball when he finished with a career-high 18 points to lead the Wave at George Mason.

In his third career start, Timmons, nailed 9-of-13 (.692) field goal attempts, grabbed five rebounds to tie his single game record, dished out two assists and swiped one steal during a career-best 24 minutes of action.

PUCKETT HITS 100

• Senior **Daniel Puckett** played in his 100th career game in TU's 60-52 loss at George Mason on Dec. 22. Puckett is the Green Wave's most experienced player with 105 games, while classmate **Robinson Louisme** has played in the second-most games on the team with 93.

THE GREAT CHRISTMAS HEIST

• In its final game on its home floor prior to the Christmas holiday, the Tulane men's hoops team robbed North Carolina A&T of 15 steals en route to forcing the Aggies into 20 turnovers. The 15 steals are the most in a single game for the Green Wave since a similar 15-steal performance in an 88-30 walloping of Morris Brown at Fogelman Arena on Jan. 4, 2003.

DICKERSON CAPTURES 50TH CAREER VICTORY

• Tulane handed fourth-year head coach **Dave Dickerson** his 50th career coaching victory with its 66-56 victory over Maine at the 2008 USA Basketball Classic. Dickerson became the sixth coach in school history to reach the 50-win plateau.

He earned his first-ever win over UNO (11/22/05) and his 25th win at Marshall (2/17/07).

DICKERSON WINS 100TH CAREER GAME AT TU

• Tulane handed head coach **Dave Dickerson** a victory in his 100th career game with the Wave's 81-55 win over North Carolina A&T on Dec. 18, 2008.

"It's been fun. I'm lucky to be a head basketball coach and I am lucky to be at a great institution like Tulane University, and I look forward to my next 100 games here," Dickerson said.

He is the eighth coach in the 97-year history of the school to coach in 100 or more games.

TULANE BEGINS SEASON WITH 3-1 START FOR THIRD STRAIGHT YEAR

• Tulane has notched back-to-back 17-win seasons and a big reason for that success was its strong start, and the 2008-09 campaign marks the third straight year the Green Wave has opened the season with a 3-1 record.

TU opened the 2006-07 and 2007-08 campaigns with 3-1 records, but each squad fell in its fifth game. The 2008-09 Green Wave opened the year with a 3-1 mark before falling in its fifth game of the year.

TULANE SIGNS A PAIR OF STANDOUT GUARDS TO NATIONAL LETTERS-OF-INTENT

Tulane University head men's basketball coach **Dave Dickerson** signed two standout basketball players- **Jordan Callahan** and **Aaron Holmes**- to national letters-of-intent on Nov. 12, the first day of national signing day.

Callahan is a 5-11, 170-pound point guard who graduated from Blessed Trinity in Roswell, Ga., in 2008 and is currently enrolled at The New Hampton School, a prep school in New Hampton, New Hampshire. As a high school star at Blessed Trinity under head coach Brian Marks, he led the team to a 48-10 overall record during his final two years and earned honorable mention all-state and team MVP honors both seasons. During his senior campaign, Callahan averaged 14.3 points and 4.8 assists per game and set the school's single-season scoring mark with 443 points.

A 6-5, 195-pound shooting guard from St. Petersburg, Fla., and 2006 graduate of St. Petersburg Catholic, Holmes originally signed with Florida State out of high school, but transferred to South Florida following his first semester. After sitting out one full year due to NCAA Transfer rules, he played in 18 conference games with the Bulls, but left USF after the 2007-08 campaign due to a coaching change. Holmes is currently enrolled at Santa Fe Community College in Gainesville, Fla., and will have two years of eligibility remaining.

Rated as a top 50 national prospect as a senior, Holmes scored 2,748 career points, the most in school history, and led St. Petersburg Catholic to four straight district titles and three trips to the state Final Four. He is the only player to be named All-Sun-coast Player of the Year three times by the St. Petersburg Times (2004-06), and was also runner-up for Florida's Mr. Basketball in 2006. He also led his AAU team to the Showtime National title.

- Dave Dickerson is in his fourth season as the head coach on the Up-town campus, and has an overall record of 53-53 and a Conference USA mark of 22-26.
- Tulane is 3-1 all-time in season openers under Dickerson.
- Named the 2008 National Association of Basketball Coaches District 8 Coach of the Year.
- Tulane has a record of 32-15 (.680) at Fogelman Arena and a mark of 21-8 (.724) against non-conference teams in New Orleans under Dickerson.
- Has a record of 3-3 in the Conference USA Tournament and has never lost a first round game.
- Picked up his 50th career win over Maine, 66-56, and coached in his 100th career game at TU in a 81-55 victory over North Carolina A&T.
- Registered his 40th career win (at Tulsa) a little over midway through his third season (76 games) and joined Clifford Wells (67 games), Charles Moir (71 games), Ned Fowler (61 games) and Perry Clark (84 games) as the only coaches in the 97-year history of Tulane basketball to win 40 games in under three seasons. The 76 games are the fourth fewest games in school history needed to attain 40 wins, and he currently ranks seventh for career coaching victories.
- Under his tutelage, three Green Wave players have earned all-conference honors, including All-Conference USA third-team performers Quincy Davis (2006) and David Gomez (2007, 2008), and Kevin Sims, who was selected to the All C-USA Freshman team in 2007.
- During his second season, Dickerson led Tulane to a 17-13 overall record and TU recorded its best conference finish in nine years with a 9-7 league mark, which was good enough for fourth place. TU's 17 victories marked the most wins in seven seasons and the program's first winning season in four years.
- Dickerson's 29 wins in his first two seasons puts him in third place for the most wins by a Tulane coach in the first two seasons.
- Became the 22nd head men's basketball coach in Tulane history on April 1, 2005.
- Despite the challenges brought on by Hurricane Katrina, Dickerson led Tulane to a 12-17 overall record and a 6-8 Conference USA mark, which tied the Wave for sixth place.
- Dickerson came to Tulane from alma mater of Maryland, where he spent nine years as an assistant under Gary Williams. In 2004-05, he was the program's associate head coach. He helped the Terrapins to nine straight postseason appearances, five Sweet Sixteens, two Final Fours and one National Championship in 2002.
- Accolades for Dickerson have included his recognition as an AFLAC Assistant Coach of the Year in 2003, the ACC's No. 1 Assistant Coach as named by Basketball News (2003-04), Athlon Sports' No. 4 Assistant Coach in the nation (2003-04), and an "Assistant Coach on the Rise" as tabbed by ESPN's Andy Katz.
- A native of Olar, S.C., Dickerson is married to the former Laurette Newsom, a 1991 graduate of Maryland. The couple has one son, Dave III (8).

RICHARD, SIMS LEADS TU PAST McNEESE STATE, 68-62

TU guards combine for 34 points

New Orleans – Tulane junior Kevin Sims and sophomore Kris Richard each scored 17 points and senior Robinson Louisme added 11 points to lead the Green Wave to a 68-62 victory over McNeese State in the season opener for both teams at Fogelman Arena.

Tulane (1-0) appeared to be pulling away when sophomore Johnny Mayhane jump started a 10-5 run early in the second half. However, the Cowboys rode the sharpshooting of Stephen Martin and Patrick Richard to scrape back into contention. Martin scored five consecutive points during an 8-2 run and Patrick Richard's three-pointer at 8:24 brought the visitors from Lake Charles to within three points, 44-41.

The Wave answered with a trey of its own from senior Daniel Puckett to extend its lead to six points and eventually pushed its advantage to eight points on several occasions, but the scrappy McNeese State team continued to chip away and would not let Tulane off the hook. With TU leading 53-45 at the 5:34 mark, Diego Kaplan caught fire with back-to-back three-pointers that trimmed the deficit to four points.

Freshman Kendall Timmons and Louisme each hit their two free charity shots to give the Wave another eight point lead. Martin brought the Cowboys to within six points and looked to have an opportunity to get even closer following a Kris Richard turnover, but Richard came right back and stole the ball from Kaplan and finished the play with a two-handed dunk.

Tulane converted five of seven free throw attempts down the stretch, including two by Sims with 0:07 remaining, that iced the first win of the season for the Wave.

TU FALLS AT NO. 7/8 TEXAS, 71-51

Sims scored 11; McQueen grabs 11 rebounds

Austin, Texas – Junior Kevin Sims scored a team-high 11 points and classmate Asim McQueen grabbed a game- and career-high 11 rebounds, but the No. 7/8 ranked Texas Longhorns used an 18-4 run in the first half to take control of the game and hand Tulane a 76-51 loss in the road opener in front of 10,800 at the Erwin Center.

Texas (2-0) jumped on Tulane early and led 6-0 in the opening minutes. However, the Green Wave (1-1) responded with a 6-0 run of its own, which was sparked by a pair of Sims free throws and he tied the game with a lay-up at 16:23. The teams traded baskets over the next few minutes and TU trailed 13-10 following a finger roll lay-up from sophomore Johnny Mayhane.

However, the nationally-ranked Longhorns flexed their muscle and ran off an 18-4 run to take a commanding 31-14 advantage with 7:43 remaining in the first half. Tulane pulled to within 13 points on a trey by sophomore David Booker, but couldn't get any closer and trailed 42-25 at intermission.

The Green Wave was plagued by poor shooting (.321) and turnovers (12) in the opening period and was whistled for eight fouls, which resulted in a 10-of-15 effort from the foul line by the Longhorns.

Texas left no possibilities for a Tulane comeback by opening the second half with a 17-2 run to extend its lead to 59-27 with 15:41 remaining in the game. The Wave made a late run in the final 10 minutes, outscoring Texas, 16-7, with most of the players on the floor for the Wave coming off the bench.

Vianney's two free throws seals win for Wave

New Orleans – The Tulane men's basketball team made sure fans in attendance were given a show as the Green Wave edged out Nicholls State 72-70 Saturday afternoon at Fogelman Arena.

With the game tied 70-70 with five seconds to go in the contest, Tulane's Eric Vianney hit two free throws to put the Green Wave up by two. A layup at the buzzer by Nicholls State's Justin Payne was declared too late after review by the officials and the game was ruled final in favor of Tulane.

Sims found his rhythm and followed with two assists, a steal, followed by another assist to spur the Green Wave to a 13-point scoring drive that put them up 25-16 with 11:44 to go in the first half.

Four Green Wave players reach double figures

TU FALLS TO HOT SHOOTING UC DAVIS, 76-62

McQueen posts career-best 20 points

Mobile, Ala. – Junior Asim McQueen scored a career-high 20 points and grabbed a team-best eight rebounds, but the UC Davis Aggies shot nearly 62 percent from the field in the second half and used a 16-5 run near the midway point of the second period to hand Tulane a 76-62 setback in the first game of the 2008 USA Basketball Classic at the Mitchell Center.

The Green Wave (3-2) took an early four-point lead to begin the second half on a three-pointer from junior Kevin Sims and a lay-up by senior Robinson Louisme. However, the Aggies (2-4), who run a Princeton-style offense, nailed three treys and stormed back to build a six-point advantage at the 15:29 mark.

Sophomore David Booker hit a short jumper to pull the Wave to within two points, but that was the closest Tulane would get to the Aggies for the remainder of the game. UC Davis scored seven straight points and led by 11 points before Tulane hit its next basket.

The Aggies led by double figures for most of the final five minutes of the contest and built its largest lead of 14 points on several occasions. Despite its best effort, the Green Wave could not overcome its shooting woes from both the field (.393) and the free-throw line (.500) in the second half, while UC Davis hit 16-of-26 field goal attempts and 12-of-13 free throws in the final period.

SIMS, McQUEEN LEAD TULANE PAST MAINE, 66-56

Sims scored 20 points to lead Green Wave

Mobile, Ala. – Tulane junior Kevin Sims scored 16 of his game high 20 points in the second half and the Green Wave erased a 15 point deficit with a 25-7 run while holding Maine to without a field goal for over 13 minutes in the second half and cruised to a 66-56 victory over the Black Bears in the consolation game of the 2008 USA Basketball Classic at the Mitchell Center.

Tulane (4-2) trailed Maine (3-4) by 15 points when UM's Gerald McLemore nailed his fourth three-pointer of the game to give his team a 36-21 advantage. Louisme leads Wave with 15 points

New Orleans – Baskets were few and far between in Wednesday night's cross-town rivalry contest between the Tulane men's basketball team and the host University of New Orleans, as the Privateers upended Tulane, 49-39.

Tulane (4-3), who shot only 29.3% from inside the arch, was held to under 40 points for the first time since November 10, 2006, when the Wave fell to Butler, 77-37, in the season opener.

A relatively low-scoring first half, the teams headed into the locker room with the Privateers (2-4) only leading by two, 20-18. UNO held Green Wave guard Kevin Sims, the team's leading scorer who was averaging 15.6 points heading into the game, was held scoreless in the first half, while senior Robinson Louisme led Tulane with eight first-half points, finishing the night with a team-high 15. UNO's Darrian McKinstry (game-high 16 points) led all first half scorers with 10 points and was also the only player on either team to hit a trey in the first half.

The Privateers got on the board first when Kyndall Dykes (15 points, four rebounds) missed a layup and Ejike Hart grabbed the offensive board and put it back up a minute into the game. Louisme answered with a layup and the score crawled its way up from there.

UNO broke it open with less than 10 minutes to play in the second half when the Privateers went on an eight-point run that was started with McKinstry's layup to break the 29-all tie. UNO finished the scoring spree with Jaroslav Tyrna's layup, putting the Privateers up 37-29 with 6:05 to go in the contest.

Johnny Mayhane answered with Tulane's first three-point bucket with 4:33 left to play, breaking a six minute offensive drought and bringing the Green Wave within five, 37-32. UNO pushed their offense and put four more points on the board, two of which came via a Dykes dunk. With 2:29 left to play, UNO extended their lead, 42-34, but Tulane wouldn't catch up, even with the help of a three-point play from Sims who sunk the free throw after hitting a layup with just under a minute to play. Tulane's Daniel Puckett hit a jumper to close the lead to seven, but with only 46 seconds left on the game clock, the Green Wave couldn't pull it out.

TU COMES UP SHORT TO HOT

SHOOTING W. KENTUCKY, 82-67

Puckett registers a career-high 21 points

New Orleans – Tulane senior Daniel Puckett scored a career-high 21 points, but all five Western Kentucky starters reached double figures and the Hilltoppers shot 56.9 percent from the field, including a stifling 70.6 percent from behind the three-point line, to hand the Green Wave its first loss at Fogelman Arena during the month of December since the 2003-04 season with a 82-67 victory.

Puckett scored 15 of his team-high 21 points and nailed three three-pointers in the first half, but no other TU player scored more than five points and Tulane (4-4) managed just a 32.4 percent effort from the field. Meanwhile, Western Kentucky (5-2) continued to prove it is one of the hottest teams in the country with a sizzling 61.5 percent performance from the field, hitting 16-of-26 attempts.

The Hilltoppers and Green Wave traded baskets for the majority of the opening minutes of the first half before Western Kentucky's Orlando Mendez-Valdez hit a lay-up and a trey on back-to-back possessions, sparking a 14-3 run, and helping his team take control of the game late in the first half.

WKU, which entered the game on a three-game win streak with impressive victories over No. 3 Louisville and Georgia, led by as many as 15 points before Puckett hit his third trey of the half to pull the Wave to within 12 points. Following a bucket by Steffphon Pettigrew, junior Asim McQueen was fouled on a made lay-up and his free throw at 2:04 for the conventional three-point play drew Tulane to within 11 points once more. McQueen's field goal and free throw proved to be the final points of the first half for the Wave, while the Hilltoppers added a jumper by D.J. Magley to take a 13-point, 41-28, advantage into intermission.

PUCKETT'S DOUBLE-DOUBLE

LEADS WAVE PAST NC A&T, 81-55

Louisme scores 16 points; TU nabs 15 steals

New Orleans – Senior Daniel Puckett notched his first career double-double with 12 points and 12 rebounds and the Tulane defense registered 15 steals during the Green Wave's 81-55 victory over North Carolina A&T at Fogelman Arena.

The Green Wave (5-4) trailed just once in the game, which came during the opening minutes. With the contest knotted at 7-7, Tulane ran off a 14-2 spurt behind five points from junior guard Kevin Sims and a timely three-pointer by Puckett. By the time Brock Moorman sank a jumper at the 11:22 mark to end the run, the Aggies (5-5) were already down by 10 points, 21-11.

Following Moorman's jumper, Tulane's defense held North Carolina A&T in check with just three field goals during the final 10 minutes and Puckett grabbed eight of his game-high 12 rebounds in the opening period. The Wave built a 17-point lead, its largest advantage in the opening period, on two occasions and led 38-23 at intermission.

North Carolina A&T made its final run early in the second half when the Aggies opened the half with a 12-6 run to pull to within nine points, 44-35, on Kam Shepherd's lay-up at 15:32. However, sophomore Johnny Mayhane immediately responded with a jumper for the Green Wave and Louisme answered with 10 points during a 13-2 run that gave TU a comfortable 20-point cushion with 10:09 remaining in the game.

WAVE FALLS AT GEORGE MASON, 60-52

Frosh Timmons leads TU with 18 points

Fairfax, Va. – Freshman Kendall Timmons led all scorers with a career-best 18 points, but George Mason outscored Tulane 18-10 during the final eight minutes to pull out a 60-52 victory in front of 4,508 at the Patriot Center.

Tulane (5-5) trailed George Mason (8-2) by as many as 12 points in the second half, but scraped back using an 18-6 run over a period of 9:19 and junior Eric Vianney knotted the game at 42 apiece with a three-pointer from the left side with 8:02 remaining.

George Mason immediately responded with four straight points before senior Kevin Sims pulled the Green Wave to within two points on lay-up. But the Patriots proved to be too much for Tulane down the stretch by converting 12-of-16 free throw attempts despite hitting just one field goal the final 6:24.

TU got as close as five points during the final minutes but missed several key shots to get back into the game and was forced to foul.

The Green Wave was whistled for 23 fouls, while host George Mason was called for just 11 fouls and the Patriots nailed 23-of-31 free throw attempts, while TU managed just nine trips to the foul line and converted five opportunities. In fact, the Patriots attempted more free throws than Tulane's total number of field goals (22) for the game.

Puckett finishes with 20 points to lead the Wave

NEW ORLEANS – Senior Daniel Puckett led three Green Wave players into double figures with 20 points, but Binghamton's D.J. Rivera scored 22 of his game-high 24 points in the second half to help the Bearcats slip past Tulane, 74-73, in front of 1,104 at Fogelman Arena.

Tulane (5-6) and Binghamton (6-4) traded the lead 16 times and the contest featured 10 ties. The Green Wave took its last lead when Puckett was fouled on a made lay-up and he drained the ensuing free throw for the conventional three-point play to give TU a 60-58 advantage with 5:36 remaining in the game.

However, Tulane's lead was short lived as Emanuel Mayben broke free for a lay-up to tie the game at 60 apiece. However, the Green Wave scraped back into the contest on a pair of Sims free throws and junior Asim McQueen grabbed a missed lay-up by Sims and laid in the uncontested shot underneath the basket to draw Tulane to within two points, 70-68, with over a minute to go.

But Tulane was unable to come up with key rebounds down the stretch and was forced to foul. The Bearcats hit four charity shots to once again lead by six points with 0:09 remaining. Sims fed senior Robinson Louisme for a dunk with 0:08 left in the game and Sims drained a long trey at the buzzer for the final score.

McQueen leads Tulane with 14 points

NEW ORLEANS – Junior Asim McQueen led three Tulane players into double figures with 14 points and the Green Wave defense held Grambling State scoreless for over nine minutes and to just two field goals during the final 13:45 of the second half en route to a 72-37 victory in the first-ever meeting between the two schools at Fogelman Arena.

Tulane (6-6) broke the game early with an 18-6 run during the final 8:45 of the first half to take a commanding double digit lead in which it would not relinquish. The Tulane offense got off to a sluggish during the first 10 minutes of the opening period and led Grambling State (2-9) by just two points, 16-14, when a McQueen steal led to a jumper by senior Daniel Puckett, and ultimately sparked the knockout punch. McQueen contributed six points during the run and the Wave led 34-20 at halftime.

Grambling State was never able to slice the lead to single digits and could only get within 11 points twice during the early stages of the second half. Ibrahim Kpaka's jumper at 14:33 proved to be just one of the Tigers two field goals during the final 14:33. Tulane held the Tigers scoreless for better than nine minutes and took advantage of its opponents' drought with a 22-0 run. By the time Kpaka hit two free throws for his team's first points since his jumper earlier in the second half, the Green Wave had amassed a 32-point lead.

Kpaka hit two more free throws in the waning minutes and Jordan Lemons' lay-up with 0:47 remaining marked the Tigers' first field goal in over 13 minutes. Tulane led by as many as 37 points in the second period and chalked up its first 30-point victory since a 75-43 win over Huston-Tillotson on Dec. 5, 2007.

Auburn native McQueen leads TU with 16 points

Auburn, Ala. – Junior Asim McQueen scored 16 points and junior Kevin Sims added 14 points, but Auburn used a 17-7 first half run to seize control of the game and held off the Green Wave, 75-53, in front of 4,970 at Beard-Eaves Memorial Coliseum.

Puckett posts career-high 22 points

GREENVILLE, N.C. – Tulane rallied from a 12-point second half deficit to tie the game at 61-61 on a three-pointer from junior Asim McQueen with 2:19 remaining, but East Carolina hit eight straight free throws to come away with a 69-66 victory in the Conference USA opener for both teams in front of 4,928 at Williams Arena at Minges Coliseum.

Tulane (6-8, 0-1 C-USA) led by two points at half-time after putting together a solid first half. However, the Wave came out ice cold from the field in the second half and East Carolina (9-5, 1-0 C-USA) was able to run off a 6-0 spurt and build a four-point lead before Daniel Puckett scored TU's first points of the period on a pair of free throws with 3:07 gone by. McQueen scored on consecutive possessions and his basket with 5:17 remaining pulled Tulane to within three points, 58-53. Puckett drew the Wave to within two points, but ECU's Sam Hinnant drained a trey to extend the Pirates' lead back to five points. But TU answered when Vianney scored on a lay-up. Following a turnover by the Pirates, Sims found McQueen wide open on the left side of the floor and the forward swished a trey to tie the game at 61.
