HOUSTON – Houston quarterback Kevin Kolb completed 24-of-41 passes for 350 yards and three touchdowns, and the Cougars scored on seven of its 13 possessions, as Tulane dropped its season opener, 45-7, at Robertson Stadium.

Green Wave cornerback Israel Route forced a pair of turnovers and running back Matt Forté posted a career-long 49-yard touchdown reception from quarterback Lester Ricard midway through the second quarter. The game, however, belonged to Kolb who became Houston's all-time leader in passing yards.

Houston jumped out to a 14-0 lead in the first quarter, but Tulane cut the lead in half on Forté's scoring reception with 9:19 remaining in the first half. From there, the Cougar offense rattled off 31 unanswered points while their defense consistently stalled Green Wave drives.

Following the Forté score, the Cougars sandwiched a three-yard touchdown run by Roshawn Brown and an 11-yard Kolb-to-Donnie Avery scoring pass around a 38-yard field goal by Ben Bell to go into the locker room at halftime up 31-7. The Tulane defense limited Houston to just one touchdown in each the third and fourth quarters, but the damage was already done.

The Cougars amassed 621 yards of total offense, including 244 yards rushing. Tulane posted 224 yards of offense. Houston's defense forced a pair of turnovers, and held the Green Wave rushing attack to just 55 yards.

Route set up Tulane's lone score with an interception – the third pick against Kolb of his career – and forced a fumble with a vicious hit with just over a minute left to play in the third quarter. Linebacker Jordan Ellis, who made just the second start of his career, led all players with 11 tackles, seven of which were solo stops.

Forté led the Green Wave with five receptions for 69 yards, while running back Ray Boudreaux paced the Tulane ground game with 28 yards on four carries.

STARKVILLE, MISS.— Running back Matt Forté ran for 170 yards and a touchdown, and quarterback Lester Ricard completed 16-of-23 passes for 298 yards and four scores, as Tulane upended Mississippi State, 32-29, at Davis Wade Stadium.

Tulane jumped out to a 32-7 lead after three quarters of play, but the Bulldogs clawed back into the game with a 22-point fourth quarter. The Green Wave were able to hang on as Tulane snapped a nine-game losing streak and claimed its first win over an SEC opponent on the road since Nov. 18, 1989.

The Green Wave held a 25-point advantage heading into the fourth quarter, but left the door open for the Bulldogs as Tulane had a field goal blocked and missed a pair of PATs. Mississippi State scored touchdowns on all three of its possessions in the frame, including a touchdown and two-point conversion run by quarterback Omarr Connor – who started the game at wide receiver before getting the call to go under center midway through the second quarter – to cut the lead to three with 1:45 left in the ballgame.

Tight end Gabe Ratcliff recovered the ensuing on-side kick attempt, Forté followed with a 12-yard run up the middle and the Green Wave were able to run out the clock.

Lost in the fourth-quarter hype was the overall play of the Green Wave defense. Tulane held Mississippi State to just one first down in the first quarter – and that came via penalty – and held the Bulldogs scoreless in the period. For the game, the Green Wave held the Bulldogs to just 98 yards rushing and 350 total yards of offense on the day. One hundred and sixty four of Mississippi State's total yards came in the fourth quarter.

Tulane also forced a pair of turnovers – while committing none – as defensive tackle Avery Williams recovered a fumble and cornerback Jeremy Foreman picked off a pass and returned it 49 yards to set up a Green Wave score.

The Green Wave got off to a good start as Ricard connected with wideout Kenneth Guidroz for an eight-yard touchdown strike to cap the opening drive, and Tulane added to its lead less than five minutes into the second quarter when Ricard hooked up with running back Ray Boudreaux from 27 yards out to make it 14-0.

The Tulane defense stymied Mississippi State for most of the first half, but the Bulldogs changed quarterbacks – pulling starter Tray Rutland in favor of Conner – and Connor responded by driving the Bulldogs 41 yards on nine plays, capped by a two-yard touchdown run by Anthony Dixon to cut the lead in half with 2:58 left to play in the first half.

The score remained that way until halftime, but Tulane scored on its first three possessions of the second half as Ricard connected with wide receiver Damarcus Davis and wideout Brian King from six and 47 yards away, respectively, and Forté punched one in from one yard away to give the Green Wave a 32-7 advantage.

What seemed like a sizeable lead began evaporating quickly early in the fourth quarter, however, as the Bulldogs turned a botched punt attempt into a nine-yard fumble return for a touchdown by Marcus Washington, and Arnil Stallworth capped a four-play, 87-yard drive with a three-yard touchdown run to cut the Tulane lead to 12 and set up the late-game dramatics.

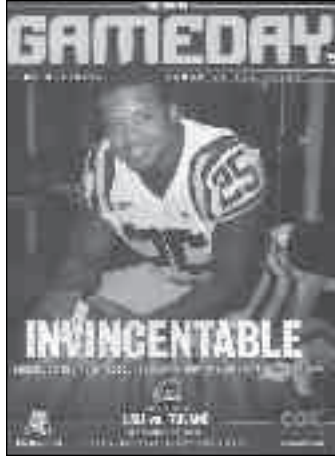

BATON ROUGE, LA.— Tenth-ranked LSU tallied 373 yards of total offense and scored on seven of its 13 possessions to hand Tulane a 49-7 loss in front of 92,135 at Tiger Stadium.

Quarterback Anthony Scelfo rallied the Green Wave for a pair of long drives late in the game, including a one-yard touchdown run of his own, but the game belonged to the Bayou Bengals. While the Tigers' offense was putting points on the scoreboard, the LSU defense forced six punts, a pair of interceptions and a blocked field goal attempt.

Trailing 49-0, Scelfo made his first career appearance in the fourth quarter. He took the field for his second possession of the game and drove the team 41 yards on four plays, culminating with his one-yard touchdown plunge on a quarterback sneak. The score was just the second touchdown allowed all year by the Tigers, and the first in Tiger Stadium since the final game of the regular season last year against Arkansas.

Running back Ray Boudreaux had a solid night for the Green Wave, running for a career-best 47 yards on six carries while adding 17 yards via kickoff return. Wideout Preston Brown was one of eight Green Wave receivers to catch a pass, and led the way with three catches. Jeremy Williams paced the club with 35 receiving yards.

The Tigers wasted little time setting the tone for the game, forcing a three-and-out on Tulane's first drive and scoring nine players later when JaMarcus Russell completed a 12-yard scoring strike to Early Doucet just 4:08 into the contest.

Doucet scored on a 17-yard end around on LSU's next possession to put the Tigers ahead, 14-0, and LSU scored twice more in the second quarter via eight-yard run by Charles Scott and a Russell-to-Doucet four-yard pass to give the homestanding Tigers a 28-0 advantage at the break.

The second half was more of the same, though, as Scott scored from seven yards less than seven minutes into the third quarter, and the Tigers took advantage of a turnover to score again three and a half minutes later when Matt Flynn scored on a five-yard sweep around the left end to give LSU a commanding 42-0 lead.

LSU nickelback Craig Steltz tallied the Tigers' second interception of the ballgame and returned it 76 yards on the final play of the third quarter, and Jacob Hester plunged in from six yards out on the ensuing play to cap the Bayou Bengals' scoring.

Josh Lumar and Joe Goosby paced the Tulane defense with seven tackles apiece, while Louis Thomas and Carlis Jackson followed with six each. Thomas, David Skehan, Avery Williams and Billy Harrison each posted a half a tackle for loss, including a shared sack by Skehan and Harrison.

Russell completed 17 of 23 passes for 198 yards and two touchdowns. Craig Harris paced the Tigers with six catches for 86 yards, and Scott led a 172-yard ground-game effort with 101 yards and two touchdowns on 15 carries.

NEW ORLEANS – Tulane scored touchdowns on four of its final five drives, but a late fumble and a slow start doomed the Green Wave as the SMU Mustangs spoiled its return to the Louisiana Superdome with a 33-28 win in front of a crowd of 21,565.

Quarterback Lester Ricard completed 29-of-48 passes for 394 yards and three scores. The Green Wave fell behind 17-0 early on, but rallied to score 28 points over the final 21:36 of regulation. SMU, however, used a 100-yard kickoff return by Jessie Henderson and turned a Tulane turnover into another score before time ran out on the Green Wave.

Trailing by three scores midway through the third quarter, defensive back David Skehan picked off a batted Justin Willis pass and returned it 30 yards for a touchdown with 6:36 remaining in the third quarter to put Tulane on the board and spark the Green Wave's comeback attempt.

Ricard sandwiched a 35-yard scoring strike to wideout Preston Brown and an 11-yard touchdown pass to receiver Damarcus Davis around a missed field goal attempt by SMU, and with 7:52 left to play, the Green Wave led 21-20.

The crowd got rowdy as the Green Wave took the lead, but Henderson shifted momentum quickly back to the Mustangs' sideline as he returned the ensuing kickoff 100 yards for a score to give SMU a 26-21 advantage it would not relinquish.

Ricard fumbled on the Green Wave's next offensive play, and SMU took advantage of a short field to all but put the game away with a seven-play, 30-yard drive capped by a 19-yard, Willis-to-Emmanuel Sanders touchdown pass with 4:10 left to play.

The Green Wave refused to give in, driving 83 yards on 10 plays, for a nine-yard touchdown pass from Ricard to receiver Jeremy Williams. Tulane attempted an on-side kick, but SMU recovered the kick at the Green Wave 45, and the Mustangs were able to run out the clock.

While the Green Wave battled hard until the end, the first half was all SMU as the Mustang offense put up 17 points while rolling up 138 of their 359 yards in the opening half. Tulane, meanwhile, was limited to 96 yards of total offense over the first 30 minutes of action.

Willis finished the day 23-for-40 for 261 yards and two touchdowns while scrambling for 76 yards and a touchdown on 15 carries. He completed passes to eight different receivers, and his favorite target was Bobby Chase, who snared six passes for 54 yards.

Davis led all receivers, posting career marks with nine catches for 100 yards and a score. He was one of eight Green Wave players to catch at least one pass – seven caught two or more – as Brown hauled in five receptions for 83 yards, while Kenneth Guidroz and running back Matt Forté each caught four for 67 and 53 yards, respectively.

NEW ORLEANS – Tulane University football team tallied 487 yards of total offense and posted 13 pass break-ups and three sacks as the Green Wave defeated Conference USA foe Rice, 38-24, at the Louisiana Superdome.

Quarterback Lester Ricard posted his second consecutive 300-yard passing day, completed 21-of-40 passes for 344 yards and a season-best four touchdowns. Not to be outdone, running back Matt Forté ran for 178 yards and a score and snared four passes for 57 yards and another touchdown.

Defensively, the Green Wave bent at times but never broke. Swarming to the football on almost every down, Tulane posted season-highs in tackles for loss (13), pass break-ups (13) and sacks (three). The defense turned away the Owls on 10 of 16 third-down conversion opportunities and twice on fourth down. Tulane, meanwhile, converted eight of its 14 third-down opportunities, including four of five in the fourth quarter.

Tulane broke a 7-all tie early in the ballgame when Ricard connected with wideout Brian King 11:27 into the ballgame and the Green Wave never trailed again. The Owls trimmed the lead to four on a 25-yard field goal by Clark Fangmeier with 11:39 left to play in the second quarter, but the Green Wave followed with a 45-yard field goal by Ross Thevenot and a 21 scoring strike from Ricard to Kenneth Guidroz to take a 24-10 lead into the locker room at halftime.

Rice scored a touchdown on the opening drive of the second half on a four-yard pass from Chase Clement to Jarett Dillard, but Forté took over from there, sandwiching a one-yard touchdown run and an eight yard TD catch around a late-third quarter scoring strike from Clement to Joel Armstrong to account for the final score.

Things got hairy for the Green Wave early in the second half. Following Rice's Clement-to-Dillard touchdown, the Owls sacked Ricard on the ensuing drive and forced a fumble which was

recovered by DaJaun Cooper. Tulane's defense, however, held Rice to minus-two yards on the drive after the turnover, and Luke Juist's 44-yard field goal attempt sailed wide left.

The ball found its way to Forté from there, and the third-year back from Slidell, La., responded by accounting for all 73 yards of the Green Wave's next drive. After catching an eight-yard pass from Ricard, Forté broke off a career-long 64-yard run on a draw play, and two plays later, scored from one yard out.

Clement's 27-yard pass to Armstrong made it a one-touchdown game, but the Green Wave once again hitched its wagon to its featured back, and Forté responded with four carries for 15 yards and two catches for 17 yards, including an eight-yard scoring reception to put the game away.

Rice did not stop fighting, however, but the Green Wave defense found ways to keep the Owls at bay the rest of the afternoon. Following Forté's second score of the day, Tulane's D forced a punt and a turnover on downs before defensive back David Skehan snared his second interception in as many weeks with 1:42 left in regulation.

Joe Goosby and Louis Thomas led Tulane with 11 tackles each, while Skehan was close behind with eight. Cornerback Israel Route and Goosby posted career-bests with five and three passes defended, respectively, and defensive lineman Taurean Brown led all players with three tackles for loss.

Eight Tulane receivers caught a pass on the day – including five with at least three receptions – and Williams paced the bunch with five catches for 97 yards, both career highs.

EL PASO – Jordan Palmer threw for 230 yards and three touchdowns, including two in the second quarter, as UTEP beat Tulane 34-20 at the Sun Bowl.

The Miners used a 21-point second quarter to pull away from the Green Wave. Palmer, who completed 22-of-29 passes, connected with Joe Weston on a 19-yard touchdown less than two minutes into the second quarter.

A 37-yard field goal by Tulane kicker Ross Thevenot made it a 10-3 game with 10:46 to go in the second quarter. But the Miners scored two touchdowns in the final four minutes of the first half to put the game away.

Palmer hit tight end Jamar Hunt with a 3-yard pass to go up by two touchdowns with 3:21 left in the half. Two minutes later, Johnnie Lee Higgins returned a punt 88 yards for a touchdown, putting UTEP up 24-3 at the break.

The Miners added 10 more points in the third quarter on a field goal by Reagan Schneider and a 39-yard touchdown pass from Palmer to Higgins.

Tulane outgained UTEP 481 yards to 365. But the Green Wave committed five turnovers, including three lost fumbles.

Matt Forté led Tulane with 147 yards on 17 carries. Preston Brown caught 11 passes for 98 yards.

AUBURN, ALA. – Running back Matt Forté galloped for 117 yards and the receiving duo of Preston Brown and Damarcus Davis combined for 265 yards through the air, but it was not enough as Tulane fell to Auburn, 38-13, at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

The Tigers, who entered the game ranked fifth in the nation in scoring defense, forced three turnovers while posting four tackles for loss and two pass break-ups. Offensively, quarterback Brandon Cox completed 16-of-passes for 212 yards and three touchdowns to spearhead the Auburn victory.

The Green Wave accumulated 389 yards on the day – the most allowed by Auburn all season – but turnovers killed drives and potential scoring opportunities and set up a short-field situation for the Tigers' offense.

Tulane trailed 14-7 early in the second quarter, and took over at its own 20. Tulane fumbled on a third-and-two opportunity, and two plays later, Cox completed a six-yard pass to Tre Smith to make it a two-touchdown ballgame. The Green Wave also had a 13-play, 92-yard drive halted at the Auburn five yard line when Jonathan Wilhite forced fumble, and saw an 11-play, 64-yard drive stopped by an interception at the Tigers' six.

The Tigers scored on their opening possession, going 74 yards on nine plays capped by a two-yard run by Brad Lester, but Tulane came right back with an 80-yard drive that culminated with a 23-yard scoring strike from quarterback Lester Ricard to Davis to tie the game at 7-all with 6:05 left to play in the first quarter.

Auburn responded with a five-play, 68-yard touchdown drive to reclaim the lead on the ensuing drive and made it a 14-point contest on Smith's two-yard plunge after the Green Wave's first turnover. Kicker Ross Thevenot cut the lead to 11 on a 21-yard field goal with 16 seconds left in the first half, but following a squib kick attempt, Cox hit Lee Guess for a 22-yard pickup and John Vaughn drilled a 45-yard field goal as time expired in the period.

Following Tulane second fumble of the afternoon, Auburn drove 87 yards the other way and capped a 10-play drive with a 23-yard Cox-to-Courtney Taylor pass to make the turnover hurt. Thevenot kicked his second field goal of the day on the ensuing drive, and Ben Tate closed out the scoring with a one-yard scoring plunge with 9:52 left to play.

Brown led all players with nine receptions for 139 yards, while Davis followed closely behind with eight grabs for 126 yards and a touchdown. Ricard, meanwhile, completed 20-of-39 passes for 283 yards, one touchdown and an interception.

Linebacker Evan Lee and free safety Louis Thomas tied for game-high tackle honors with eight each, while Chinonso Echebelem, Jordan Ellis, Jeremy Foreman and David Skehan posted six stops apiece. Skehan also added a tackle for loss and a forced fumble to help lead the Green Wave's defensive effort.

Auburn's Tate led all players with 156 yards on 26 carries, and Smith followed with 44 yards on five attempts. Taylor led the Tigers' receiving corps with five receptions for 63 yards and a score.

NEW ORLEANS – It was Tulane's first homecoming contest in the Louisiana Superdome since the 2001 season, and the tandem of quarterback Lester Ricard and running back Matt Forté made sure it was a happy one as the Green Wave defeated Army, 42-28.

Ricard threw for a season-best 409 yards – the fourth most in school history – and Forté posted his fourth consecutive 100-yard rushing effort with 124 yards and two touchdowns on 24 carries to pace the Tulane offense. Defensively, strong safety David Skehan and cornerback Jeremy Foreman each posted an interception while the unit limited the Black Knights to 267 yards.

Ricard completed 33 of 43 passes, including touchdown passes of 15 yards to wideout Brian King in the first quarter, 23 yards to receiver Michael Batiste in the third, and five yards to tight end Gabe Ratcliff in the fourth. He completed nine consecutive passes at one point in the first half, and was a perfect 12-for-12 for 161 yards and a touchdown in the third quarter.

While Ricard and Forté helped the Green Wave pile up a season-high 586 yards of total offense, the Tulane defense did more than its share of providing a difference as the Green Wave held the Black Knights to just 267 yards – the fewest yards allowed by Tulane since holding SMU to 127 yards on Sept. 24, 2005, in Dallas.

In addition, the defense held Army without a touchdown in the first half, marking the first time a Green Wave squad has done that since last Oct. 1 against Southeastern Louisiana – a span of 14 games. Skehan paced the defense with eight tackles, including seven solo stops, while defensive

end Antonio Harris and defensive tackle Julian Shives-Sams each recorded a sack.

Skehan's interception of a Carson Williams pass in the first quarter set up King's 15-yards touchdown catch with 7:32 on the clock. Army followed with an eight-play, 47-yard drive, but the Tulane defense stiffened when it had to and held the Black Knights to a 44-yard field goal by Austin Miller to make it a 7-3 ball game.

The two teams traded field goals as Ross Thevenot booted a 27-yarder 17 seconds into the second quarter and Miller connected from 25 yards out with 5:55 on the clock. The Green Wave offense, however, took the ensuing kickoff and marched 79 yards on 12 plays before Forté bolted over from three yards out to give Tulane a 17-6 lead with just 58 seconds to play in the opening stanza.

Army made things interesting early in the second half, as Williams connected with Walter Hill from 16 yards out following a Tulane turnover to make it a four-point ball game less than three minutes into the period. The Green Wave quieted any talks of a comeback, though, as running back André Anderson capped a 79-yard drive with a four-yard scoring plunge and Batiste ended a 93-yard drive with the first scoring play of his career.

The Black Knights used a big play – a 71-yard pass from Williams to tight end Tim Dunn – late in the third quarter to make it a one-score affair, but Tulane followed with a nine-yard run by Forté and Ratcliff's touchdown to put the game out of reach. Williams capped the scoring with a 10-yard pass to Dunn with 4:19 left to play before Tulane snared the ensuing on-side kick and ran out the clock.

NEW ORLEANS – Southern Miss running back Damion Fletcher ran for 136 yards and two touchdowns, and defensive back LeVance Richmond returned a fumble 50-yards for a touchdown to spark a 21-point fourth quarter, as Tulane dropped a 31-3 decision to the Golden Eagles in Conference USA action at the Louisiana Superdome.

The Green Wave defense had a solid outing, stopping Southern Miss on a pair of fourth-down opportunities and blocking a field goal before forcing and recovering a fumble. The Golden Eagles' defense was even better, however, as Southern Miss held Tulane to 85 yards of total offense, including 42 yards on 4-of-16 passing through the air.

Southern Miss took an early 7-0 lead when Fletcher capped a six-play, 60-yard drive with a two-yard touchdown run with 8:12 left to play in the first quarter. The Golden Eagles made it a double-digit lead two drives later when Darren McCaleb booted a 24-yard field goal, but the Tulane defense stepped up and kept the team in the game.

Reserve quarterback Scott Elliot came off the bench to spark a 19-play, 58-yard drive midway through the second quarter to set up a 40-yard field goal by kicker Ross Thevenot to make it a 10-3 ballgame, and Tulane closed out the first half on a high note as defensive lineman Julian Shives-Sams blocked a 44-yard McCaleb attempt at the halftime horn.

The two teams battled to a stalemate in the third quarter, and momentum seemed to shift to the

Green Wave's sideline in the opening minutes of the fourth as McCaleb's 51-yard field goal try bounced off the crossbar two and a half minutes into the period.

A seven- and two-yard run by running back Ray Boudreaux gave Tulane a manageable third-and-one scenario at their own 43 yard line, and Ade Tuyo burst up the middle for a seven-yard gain for an apparent Green Wave first down. A big hit, however, jarred the ball loose and Richmond changed the face of the game with his 50-yard scoring return.

From there, Southern Miss scored touchdowns on their final two possessions as Fletcher plunged in from four yards out with 7:22 left to play and Tory Harrison hit paydirt from two-yards away inside the final minute of the contest to put the game away.

Defensive tackle Frank Morton headlined Tulane's defensive effort with a career-best eight tackles, including six solo stops. He also posted a career high with two and a half tackles for losses totaling 12 yards, including two sacks. Corner Alex Wacha and strong safety David Skehan were next with seven tackles apiece, while cornerbacks Josh Lumar and Israel Route were next with six stops each.

Boudreaux paced the offense with a career-high 51 yards rushing while hauling in a pass for 17 yards. Wide receiver Jeremy Williams was the line receiver to post a multiple-catch outing, snaring two passes for 20 yards.

NEW ORLEANS – Tulane's 17-member senior class was honored before the start of the Green Wave's Conference USA contest against UCF, so it was only right that at least one of those student-athletes would provide the play of the day.

Quarterback Lester Ricard completed a nine-yard touchdown pass to fellow fifth-year player Damarcus Davis with 34 seconds left in the first half, and cornerback Israel Route thwarted a late UCF comeback attempt by forcing a fumble, recovering it and returning it 42 yards in the game's final minute as the Green Wave defeated the Golden Knights, 10-9, in the Louisiana Superdome.

The Green Wave claimed a 10-0 first-half lead courtesy of a 29-yard field goal by Ross Thevenot early in the second quarter and Davis' grab from Ricard in the waning seconds of the period, but UCF got back into the ballgame with 20-, 35-, and 35-yard field goals by kicker Michael Torres.

A Tulane fumble gave UCF a chance to take the lead, but the defense held and forced a 35-yard field goal try and Torres pushed it just wide right. The Green Wave had to punt four plays later, and the Golden Knights had good field position as Joe Burnett returned Chris Beckman's 48-yard punt 16 yards to the Tulane 47.

But once again, Tulane's defense came up with the big play as Route drilled UCF receiver Mike Walker at the 35, recovered the fumble and returned it to the Golden Knights' 23 yard line. Three plays and as many kneel-downs by Ricard let the clock run out, and the Tulane celebration was on.

By limiting UCF to three field goals, Tulane kept an opponent out of the endzone for the first time since Oct. 5, 2002, when the Green Wave defeated Louisiana-Monroe, 52-9, on the road. The game also marked Tulane's first game decided by one point since a 27-26 loss to Marshall last Oct. 29 in a "home" game played in Mobile, Ala. The Green Wave's last one-point victory came on Oct. 7, 2000, when the Green Wave edged Louisiana-Lafayette 38-37 at Cajun Field.

The Green Wave offense rolled up 235 yards in the first half, and appeared to continue that trend in the second half as Tulane drove 43 yards on the opening drive of the third quarter. An interception in the endzone by UCF defensive back Johnell Neal shifted the momentum to the Golden Knights' sideline, and the Knights tallied 216 of their 304 yards of total offense following the pick. Tulane's defense was able to keep the damage to a minimum by giving up field goals rather than touchdowns.

Following Torres' third field goal, the Green Wave was forced to punt, Beckman bobbled the snap and Blake Carter tackled him at the Tulane 24 to give UCF excellent field position for a potential go-ahead score. Tulane held the Golden Knights to just six yards on the ensuing drive, and the miss plus Route's big play turned out to be the difference in the ballgame.

Ricard completed 26-of-43 passes for 267 yards, and Jeremy Williams was his favorite target and posted career-highs with 10 catches for 106 yards. Ray Boudreaux – who started for the second consecutive game for the injured Matt Forté – led the Green Wave ground game with 39 yards on 11 carries.

Cornerback Jeremy Foreman paced the defense with a career-best nine tackles, including eight solo stops, and also broke up one pass. Route followed with eight tackles and team-best two passes defensed.

Kyle Israel – one of two quarterbacks used by UCF on the day – led the Golden Knights with 173 yards on 16-of-20 passing, and sophomore wide receiver Rocky Ross paced the club with a career-best nine catches for 124 yards. Tulane limited the Knights to 74 yards on the ground, as Phillip Smith led UCF with 41 yards on 16 carries.

TULSA, OKLA. – Tulsa's Paul Smith threw for 215 yards and one touchdown and running back Courtney Tennial rushed for 50 yards and two scores and the Golden Hurricane handed Tulane a 38-3 loss at Skelly Stadium.

Tulane never got on track offensively, producing 152 yards, while allowing Tulsa 458 yards of total offense. The Golden Hurricane churned up 191 yards with its rushing attack and Smith was on target the entire game, completing four passes of 20 yards or longer, including a 24-yard strike to Cody Madison in the fourth quarter.

The Golden Hurricane used a 12-play, 77-yard drive on its opening possession and Brandon Diles capped off the drive with a one-yard plunge to give Tulsa a 7-0 lead.

Tulane moved the ball with its first possession primarily with its running game. Ade Tuyó, who earned his first starting assignment of the season and rushed for a career-high 64 yards on 16 carries, received most of the carries early on, but the drive ended when the Wave was called for holding and quarterback Lester Ricard threw an incompleting and was sacked for an 18-yard loss on third down. The sack moved Tulane out of field goal range and Ross Thevenot punted out of a field goal set and the Green Wave did not threaten again until the third quarter.

Tulsa added 10 more points in the second quarter and led 17-0 at halftime.

Tulane opened the second half with an 18-play, 69-yard drive that Thevenot culminated with his ninth field goal of the year and pulled the Green Wave to within two scores at 17-3. But Tulsa reeled off three touchdowns and put the game out of reach, and Tulane's offense was ineffective after its opening drive of the third quarter.

Ricard completed 10 of 21 passing attempts for 78 yards and concluded his career as the school's fifth all-time leading passer with 6,608 yards.

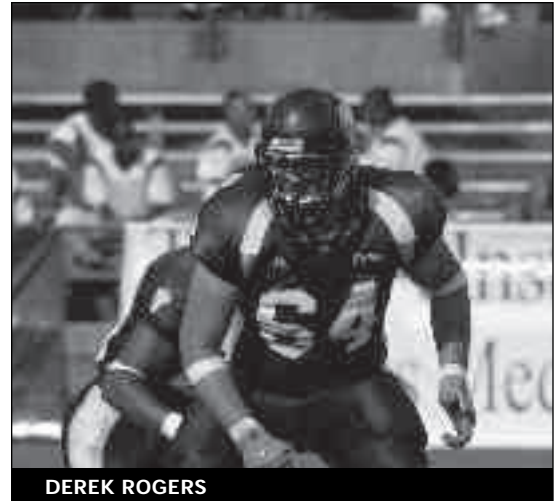
