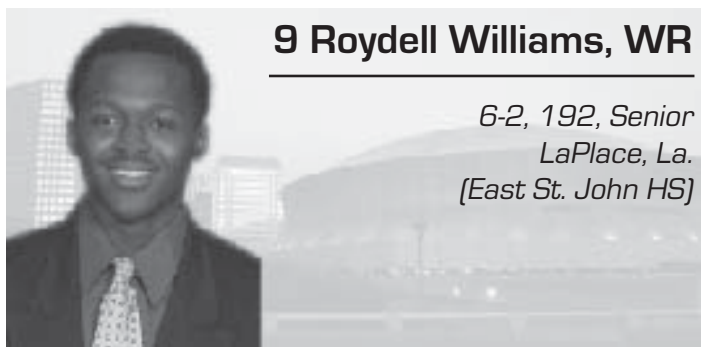

Career: Set the Tulane and Conference USA records for career touchdown catches with 35. Ranks second all-time at Tulane and in the league in receiving yards with 3,207, while his 215 catches are third-most in school history and fifth in C-USA. Compiled 12 100-yard receiving games in his career to tie for third all-time at Tulane. Earned All-Conference USA recognition in each of his four active seasons with the Green Wave. Finished his career with eight TD receptions of 50 yards or more and 16 catches for 40-plus yards.

2004: As a senior, led Tulane in receiving with 52 catches for 826 yards and 12 touchdowns. Became the third player in Tulane history to earn back-to-back first-team All-Conference USA honors. Also voted first team All-Louisiana. CollegeSportsReport.com had him on their fourth team All-American squad. Selected to play in The Villages Gridiron Classic postseason All-Star game. He averaged 14.9 yards per catch and 82.6 receiving yards per game on the year. Finished the season ranked 25th nationally in receiving yards per game, 43rd in catches per contest and 48th in scoring. Second among all C-USA receivers in touchdowns with a career-best single-season mark of 12, which also ranked tied for third on the Tulane charts. Caught at least one touchdown pass in seven of Tulane's last eight games of the season. In those games, averaged 6.4 catches per game and 99.3 receiving yards per contest. Totalled four 100-yard receiving games, with six grabs for a career-high 148 yards versus Navy and a season-high 11 catches for 138 yards versus UAB. Other 100-yard games came at East Carolina, where he had eight grabs for 140 yards in his "breakout" game of the season, and at Memphis with six catches for 114 yards. Caught three TD passes in back-to-back weeks versus Memphis and UAB. Had five catches of 37-plus yards on the year, including a career-long 87-yarder versus Navy. Other long plays came versus Army (63 yards), East Carolina (40 and 36) and Memphis (37). Battled tendonitis early and had just one catch in Tulane's first three games. Served as team captain. Saw his streak of 27 straight games played with a catch broken in season opener at Mississippi State.

2003: Fifth player in TU history to gain 1,000 receiving yards in a season with 1,006 yards on 66 catches (15.2 average). Earned All-Conference USA and All-Louisiana first team honors. Led Tulane with nine TD catches and recorded five 100-yard receiving days. Ranked third in Conference USA in receptions and receiving yards per game. Made five catches for a season-high 129 yards at Texas (9/27), including a 77-yarder and a spectacular 15-yard TD catch. Had a

career-long 78-yard catch and run at UAB (11/8) and finished with 118 yards on four catches. Added 110 yards on five catches versus TCU (9/1) with a 68-yard score. Other 100-yard days came versus Mississippi State (9/13), when he had 10 catches for 114 yards, and Louisville (10/17), when he gathered five passes for 119 yards, including a 54-yard play. Three of his six catches versus Army (9/20) went for touchdowns.

2002: Received a medical redshirt after fracturing the distal tibia bone in his left leg versus East Carolina (9/14). In the first three games of the year, caught 15 passes for 151 yards and one touchdown. Grabbed 10 passes for 87 yards before getting injured in the fourth quarter versus East Carolina. Caught three passes for 51 yards, including a 28-yard TD grab, at Houston (9/7). Made a pair of catches for 13 yards in the season opener with Southern (8/31).

2001: Started all 12 games at wide receiver and caught at least two passes in every game. Earned All-Conference USA second team honors as well as All-Louisiana second team recognition. Collegefootbalnews.com also selected him as a C-USA All-Star. Led Conference USA and was ninth in the nation with 11 scoring catches, which was fourth on the TU single season list. Led team in receiving yards (886) and was second (56) in catches. Averaged a team-leading 15.8 yards per catch. Fifth in C-USA in receiving yards per game (73.8). Caught four or more passes in nine of 12 games. First Tulane player since 1999 to catch three touchdown passes in a game with grabs of 35, 10 and a team season-long 62 yards versus Navy (11/10). Posted his third 100-yard day of the season at Navy with five catches for 134 yards. Scored touchdowns on catches of two and 20 yards at UAB (10/20). Added a 46-yard score versus TCU (10/13). Caught four passes for 118 yards versus Southern (9/29), including a 50-yard TD. Totalled a team season-high 13 catches for 154 yards and two TDs (one of 50 yards) versus ECU (9/8). His 154 yards tied for the 18th-best total in school history while 13 catches tied for the fourth-highest and the most since 1999. Four catches for 86 yards at LSU (9/1) included a 26-yard TD reception and a 43-yard grab.

2000: Selected to the Conference USA All-Freshman Team after a standout rookie year. Played in all 11 games with one start, tallying 26 catches for 338 yards. Tied for third on the team with 13.0 yards per reception. Caught a pair of touchdown passes: a three-yard grab against SMU (9/23) and a 44-yard strike vs. Houston (11/4). Posted a season-best 86 yards receiving (on four catches) at East Carolina (9/16). Logged a season-best five-catch day (56 yards) versus Louisville (10/28).

High School: A 2000 graduate of East St. John High School. Caught 53 passes for 1,101 yards and 23 TDs as a senior. A member of the Times-Picayune Top 20 Blue Chip List. A two-time all-metro player, an All-River Parish pick and the MVP of the district. Listed by SuperPrep Magazine as the 10th-best prospect in the state. Played for Coach Ronnie Stephens. Drafted in the fifth-round of the 2000 Major League Baseball draft by the Cincinnati Reds. Chose Tulane over Georgia Tech, Florida, LSU and Texas A&M.

Personal: Nickname is "Chuck." Born March 14, 1981 in New Orleans. The son of Glenda Williams. Majoring in organizational information technology. Cousin Kinya Lennix plays for the Green Wave women's basketball team.

Developed into a big play receiver as a junior and senior, with a pair of game-winning touchdown catches in 2004. Caught passes in 17 straight games, and 21 of 22 contests, in his final two seasons. Finished his career fourth on the all-time chart for yards per catch with a 16.59 average. Ranked 12th in career receiving yards with 1,543 and eighth in touchdown catches with 16.

2004: Made his second game-winning TD catch of the season, snagging a 12-yard pass in the end zone with 43 seconds left to defeat TCU (11/27). Caught a 45-yard pass earlier on the game-winning drive as part of a six-catch, 136-yard day that included two TDs as he recorded a single-game career high for receiving yards and his second straight 100-yard receiving day. Averaged 18.0 yards per catch to lead Tulane, with career-high season totals of 37 catches for 665 yards, which ranked second on the team. Posted a career-high eight catches for 104 yards versus Army (11/13). Grabbed seven passes for 97 yards and two TDs in the win over UAB (10/23), including the game-winner with 27 seconds left. Caught three passes for 71 yards versus Navy (11/6), including a 38-yard TD. Made four catches for 91 yards at Memphis (10/16) with grabs of 28, 27, 22 and 14 yards. Had two catches for 46 yards at ECU (10/9), including a 24-yard TD pass to give Tulane a late lead. Led Tulane with three catches for 71 yards and a 59-yard touchdown versus Mississippi State (9/4).

2003: Played in 11 games with eight starts at wide receiver. Ranked second on the team in receiving yards with 33 catches for 581 yards while leading the Wave in yards per catch (17.6) which ranked fifth on the single season list. Also snared eight touchdown receptions, including five TD catches in the final three games. Each of his last three receptions went for touchdowns. Registered a career-best 87-yard scoring catch-and-run in the season finale against East Carolina (11/22), finishing the game with a pair of TD receptions. That ranks as the second-longest completion in school history. Had a pair of 100-yard receiving games, including versus Northwestern State (9/6) when he matched his career-best with six catches for 105 yards. Collected four receptions for 107 yards and two touchdowns, including a 42-yarder, against Mississippi State (9/13).

2002: Ranked fifth on the Tulane team in receiving with 20 catches for 254 yards. Caught a 37-yard touchdown pass versus Houston (9/7). Started the first five games of the year. Caught a season high six passes for 68 yards in the East Carolina game (9/14). Grabbed four passes for 45 yards versus Navy (10/26). Had three catches for 43 yards in the bowl win over Hawai'i. Caught passes in eight different games during the season, including each of the first five.

2001: Saw action in 10 games, including the final nine of the year. Caught three passes for 43 yards. Made his first career catch, for 19 yards, against UCF (9/22). Had a 15-yard grab against UAB (10/20) and a nine-yard reception versus Louisville (11/3).

2000: Redshirted the season. A late signee who did not opt for Tulane until the summer of 2000.

High School: A 2000 graduate of East St. John High School. Lettered three years in both football and track. Earned all-parish and all-district honors in football. For his career, made 94 catches for 1,260 yards. Named all-state in track as he won the state championship in the long jump. A high school teammate of fellow Tulane receiver Roydell Williams.

Personal: Born July 22, 1981 in Metairie, La. The son of Cornell and Cassandra Bush. Majoring in organizational information technology. Named one of Cosmopolitan Magazine's "50 Hottest Bachelor's in the U.S." in their November 2004 issue.

6-2, 200, Senior, Gibson, La. (H.L. Bourgeois HS)

Finished his three-year career with 211 tackles, 129 solo, and five forced fumbles. Joined the Green Wave as a walk-on in the spring of 2002 and earned a scholarship by the end of fall camp.

2004: Most consistent player in the Wave defensive backfield as a senior. Ranked second on the team in tackles with 86 and tied for the team lead in solo stops with 48. Broke up a pair of passes, recovered a fumble and tallied 4.5 tackles for loss. Recorded his only sack of the season versus Louisville for a loss of seven yards. Made a season-high 12 tackles, eight solo, and broke up a pass in Tulane's win over UAB. Hit double figures in tackles for the second time this season with 10 stops, a season-high nine solo, at TCU. Recorded nine tackles with a tackle for loss at Memphis. Moved between free and strong safety after the preseason injury to Tra Boger. Recovered a fumble versus Navy to go with eight tackles.

2003: Made seven starts at safety while playing in nine games despite battling injuries. Ranked fifth on the team with 80 tackles, 56 solo. Also tied for the team lead with four forced fumbles (0.44 per game led Conference USA while ranking fifth in the nation). Tallied four double-figure tackle games, including three games with 14 stops. Had 14 tackles, including a career-best 12 solo and one tackle for loss, against East Carolina (11/22). Also made 14 stops against Houston (10/11) and Louisville (10/17). Forced three fumbles against Mississippi State (9/13) while adding seven tackles, three solo. In the win over Army (9/20), posted six tackles, a pass break-up and a fumble recovery which he returned 48 yards for his first career touchdown.

2002: Played in 12 games, including starts in the first two games at free safety. Made 45 tackles (25 solo), including a season-high nine against both Houston (9/7) and Memphis (9/21). Recorded six tackles, including his first career sack, against Southern (8/31). Forced a fumble against Memphis and recovered one against Houston. Added pass break-ups against UL-Monroe (10/5) and Army (11/16). Did not play against Navy due to injury.

2001: Attended Tulane on an academic scholarship.

High School: Played just one year of football at H.L. Bourgeois High School, of which he is a 2000 graduate. Earned valedictorian honors and was his class president for three years.

Personal: Born January 20, 1982 in Houma, La. The son of Frederick and Susan Dawson. Older brother JaJuan, who holds Tulane's record for career touchdown receptions (31), has signed with the New York Giants and is preparing for his fifth year in the NFL. A double major in accounting and finance.
