### TULANE CLOSURES OUT 2011 SEASON ON THE ROAD AT HAWAII ON ESPN3

• Tulane (2-10, 1-7 C-USA) closes out the 2011 season this week when the Green Wave makes the 4,211-mile trip to the Hawaiian Islands to face the Hawai'i Warriors (5-6, 3-4 WAC) on Saturday, Nov. 26 at Aloha Stadium. The game will be broadcast live on the Internet on ESPN3 and kick-off is slated for 10:05 p.m. CST.

-The Green Wave is 1-5 on the road this season, including 0-2 in non-conference games

-Tulane posted a 49-10 victory at UAB in its road opener on Sept. 17, but has lost its last five contests away from home.

-The last time the Wave registered a road win in non-league play was last season at Rutgers, 17-14, on Oct. 2, 2010.

-The Hawai'i game marks the end of a run of 13 straight weeks of football for the Green Wave. Tulane did not have a bye week during the 2011 season.

### GREEN WAVE TO TIE SCHOOL SINGLE SEASON MARK FOR MOST GAMES PLAYED

• Tulane will tie the school record for the most games in a single season this week with its 13th game of the year.

-The last time the Wave played 13 games was in 2002 and coincidentally the 13th opponent that season was Hawai'i in the 2002 ConAgra Hawai'i Bowl in Honolulu, Hawaii.

### ROAD TRIPPING

• Tulane played five of its first eight games of the year at home, but has played just one home game since late October. The Green Wave's game at Hawai'i will be the final game of the year, the second game in a two-game road swing and will mark Tulane's fourth road contest in its last five outings.

-The Wave dropped a 34-13 decision at East Carolina and then fell 45-24 at SMU. TU played its last home game against Houston on Nov. 10.

-Tulane returned to its road white uniforms last week at Rice and fell 19-7.

### MACKEY RANKS SECOND AMONG C-USA PLAYERS, IS FIFTH NATIONALLY IN TACKLES

• Junior linebacker **Trent Mackey** currently ranks second among Conference USA players in tackles and tackles per game this season with 145 on the year (96 solo, 49 assists) and Mackey ranks fifth nationally with 12.08 stops per game.

-Mackey's tackle total is the third most in the nation this season, just one stop short of the second most.

-Mackey has finished with double figure tackles in eight of 12 games this season, including 18 stops against Syracuse, which remains the 15th-best single game effort in college football this season, and he has double digit tackles in 16 career games.

### MOSES MAKES MOST OUT OF TWO-YEAR CAREER AT TULANE

• Senior **Dezman Moses** may only play two seasons for the Green Wave, but he has certainly left his mark in the school record book. Moses has 8.5 sacks this season, which ranks fourth among C-USA players and 19th nationally, and also ranks fifth on TU's single season chart. For his career, Moses has 14.5 sacks in two seasons, which is good enough for fifth all-time on the Green Wave's career list.

### NOTING THE GREEN WAVE

• Quarterback **Ryan Griffin** has thrown for exactly 2,400 yards this season and heads to Hawai'i needing just 68 yards to break into Tulane's top-10 chart for single season passing yards. Ranking ahead of Griffin in 10th place is **J.P. Losman**, who tossed 2,468 yards in 2002.

• **Ryan Griffin** is tied for 10th on the school's single season list for completions (215) and eighth for pass attempts (380).

• Sophomore running back **Orleans Darkwa** scored two touchdowns against Houston and ranks tied for second in Tulane single-season history in touchdown runs - tying his mark of a year ago and **Eddie Price's** total from the 1949 season. The school record of 23 was set by All-America running back **Matt Forté** in 2007.

• Rookie **Robert Kelley** ranks first among C-USA players and 31st nationally for all-purpose yards this season with 138.42 yards per game. Kelley has surpassed the 100 all-purpose yards in nine of 12 games. He now has 1,661 all-purpose yards for the season, and currently ranks fifth among TU's single season leaders and enters the Hawai'i game just 22 yards shy of passing **Mewelde Moore's** 1,683 recorded in 2002.

• Two Tulane players have caught a pass in every game this season, including receivers **Wilson Van Hooser** (34) and **Joe Kemp** (28). Dating back to last season, Van Hooser leads the team with a reception in TU's last 16 games.

• **Dominique Robertson** returned a fumble 18 yards for a touchdown at SMU, making him the fourth player to score a defensive touchdown this season and the 12th Green Wave player overall to reach the endzone. The trio of **Trent Mackey**, **Ryan Travis** and **Derrick Strozier** has each returned interceptions for a score.

• Thirteen Tulane players will look to extend their double-digit starting streaks this week: senior offensive guard **Emmanuel Aluko** (16), junior linebacker **Darryl Farley** (13), junior quarterback **Ryan Griffin** (13), senior offensive tackle **Harris Howard** (15), junior defensive end **Austen Jacks** (24), junior offensive tackle **Eric Jones** (14), senior wide receiver **Joe Kemp** (13), junior linebacker **Trent Mackey** (24), senior defensive end **Dezman Moses** (15), senior center **Joey Ray** (12), junior cornerback **Jordan Sullen** (12), junior cornerback **Ryan Travis** (24) and senior defensive tackle **Cedric Wilson** (12).

### SCOUTING THE WARRIORS

• Hawai'i (5-6, 3-4 C-USA) opened the 2011 season with a 5-3 record, but has since lost its last three games, including a 24-21 setback to Fresno State last week. The Warriors are 3-2 at home this season, but have lost their last two outings to Fresno State and Utah State (35-31) at Aloha Stadium.

Quarterback **Bryant Moniz** was lost for the year two weeks ago at Nevada and the Warriors turned to **Shane Austin** last week, but it was **David Graves** who finished the game. Austin has completed 48.1 percent of his attempts (26-of-54) for 306 yards and one score, while Graves is 29-of-49 (59.2) for 322 yards and two scores.

Running back **Joey Iosefa** has a team-best 478 yards rushing and five touchdowns, while **Billy Ray Stutzmann** has hauled in a team-high 66 receptions for 773 yards. **Royce Pollard** leads UH with 884 yards and eight scoring catches.

Linebacker **Corey Paredes** leads the Warriors with 89 tackles (48 solo), while linebacker **Art Laurel** paces the team with 9.0 sacks this season.



## SERIES & NOTES:

- Saturday's game marks the fourth all-time meeting between Tulane and Hawaii and the Warriors lead the series, 2-1.

- The three previous games between the two teams have all taken place at Aloha Stadium, including match-ups in 1989 (Hawaii 31, Tulane 26), 1993 (Hawaii 56, Tulane 17) and 2002 (Tulane 36, Hawaii 28).

- The 1989 contest against the Warriors was the season opener for Tulane, while the 1993, 2002 and 2011 games were all season finales for the Green Wave.

- Hawaii is one of two 2011 opponents that Tulane has faced in a bowl game. The other is Conference USA rival Houston. The Green Wave played the Warriors in the 2002 ConAgra Hawaii Bowl and won 36-28, while TU and the Cougars met in the 1973 Astro-Bluebonnet Bowl in the Houston Astrodome and Houston prevailed, 47-7.

## TULANE VS. THE WAC:

- Tulane has an all-time record of 9-2 against the eight current members of the Western Athletic Conference. The Green Wave is a perfect 7-0 against Louisiana Tech, 1-0 against Nevada and 1-2 against Hawaii. Prior to Saturday's game at Hawaii, the last meeting for Tulane against a WAC member was Hawaii in 2002.

## THE LAST TIME:

- The last time Tulane and Hawaii squared off was in the 2002 ConAgra Hawaii Bowl at Aloha Stadium. Tulane recovered an onside kick on the opening play, and **Lynaris Elpheage** had two long punt returns in the Green Wave's 36-28 victory over Hawaii on Dec. 25, 2002. The Green Wave (8-5) came into the game as a double-digit underdogs to the Warriors (10-4), who led the nation in passing and lost only once at Aloha Stadium in their last 11 games.

**J.P. Losman** ran for two touchdowns in the second half and completed 20 of 39 passes for 240 yards. But Elpheage's returns and the defense sparked Tulane.

Elpheage returned a punt for a touchdown and set up Tulane's go-ahead score with another long run. With the Green Wave down 14-6 in the third quarter, Elpheage scored on a 60-yard return.

## THE COACHES:

**Tulane: Mark Hutson** (Oklahoma, 1990) is in his first season as the interim head coach for the Green Wave and is 0-5 this season and has a career head coaching mark of 8-10.

A 25-year veteran of the college game either as a player or coach, Hutson was named the interim head coach for the Green Wave on Oct. 18, 2011. He is the 38th head football coach in school history. The 2011 campaign marks Hutson's fifth season on the Green Wave coaching staff and he has served as the offensive line coach for the Wave in each of his five seasons.

Prior to Tulane, Hutson was the interim head coach for one season at Eastern Illinois in 2006 and led the Panthers to a co-Ohio Valley Conference championship, a No. 15 national ranking in the final poll and he was credited with a career coaching record of 8-5, 7-1 in the OVC.

**Hawaii: Greg McMackin** (Southern Oregon, 1967) is in his fourth season as the head coach of the Warriors and has an overall record of 28-24 at the school.

McMackin has returned the Warriors back to national prominence. During last season's 10-4 campaign, UH was nationally ranked in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches polls, while leading the Warriors to a share of their fourth Western Athletic Conference title.

UH also secured a berth to the Sheraton Hawaii Bowl in 2010, its second bowl appearance in three years under McMackin, while becoming just the sixth team in the school's history to post double-digit wins.

## TULANE SETS SAIL IN A NEW DIRECTION UNDER HUTSON

- Tulane interim head coach **Mark Hutson** directed the Green Wave program for the first time last week against Memphis and fell to the Tigers 33-17. Hutson, who was tabbed to lead the Green Wave in the wake of former head coach **Bob Toledo's** resignation on Oct. 18, became the 38th head coach in school history.

Tulane has multiple head coaches in the same season for the first time since 1998 when **Tommy Bowden** coached the team to an 11-0 mark during the regular season while **Chris Scelfo** took over for the Wave's 41-27 win over BYU in the Liberty Bowl.

## The Green Dream

In an effort to raise awareness and continue the fight against cancer, Maggie Edwards, the mother of Tulane junior long snapper John Edwards, has created the "Green Dream" initiative for the 2011 football season.

Maggie wants to help children with cancer while also inspiring the Tulane Green Wave football players to bring their "A-game" this season. She has pledged to donate \$10 for every Tulane touchdown, \$5 for every field goal, and \$10 for every interception in the upcoming football season to the Tulane Cancer Center's Pediatric Oncology Patient Relief Fund.

## FREQUENT FLYERS

• Tulane has been all over the map with seven road games this season and will travel a total of 17,120 round trip miles when it returns home from its season finale at Hawai'i. The Green Wave has played three games on the East Coast, including Duke (1,702 miles), Army (2,690) and East Carolina (1,884) and has also made trips to UAB (688), SMU (1,036) and Rice (696). This week, Tulane will make a 8,422-mile round trip to the Hawaiian Islands.

## KELLEY SETS SCHOOL RECORD FOR KICKOFF RETURNS YARDAGE

• Freshman **Robert Kelley** added to his Tulane single-season kickoff return record with two returns and added 46 return yards to his already single season record. He now has 59 returns for 1,243 yards, surpassing the former mark of 44 returns for 1,038 yards by **Jeff Liggon** in 1994.

Kelley has returns of 66, 51, 43 and 32 yards this season. His longest return of 66 yards came in the season opener against Southeastern Louisiana.

## MACKEY NOTCHING HIS PLACE AMONG TU'S TOP DEFENDERS

• Junior **Trent Mackey** already has 145 total tackles this season, which ranks 10th among the school's single season leaders but is the most tackles by a Tulane player in one season since 1983 when **Burnell Dent** established the school record of 172 and **David Jackson** also recorded 163, the fifth-most in one season.

Mackey enters the season finale just seven stops shy of **Ray Hester's** mark of 152 set in 1970.

## DARKWA CLOSE TO PULLING OFF RARE FEAT

• With the season finale on the horizon this Saturday, Tulane, sophomore **Orleans Darkwa** has a chance to pull off a rare feat by a running back that has only been done four times in the last 71 years at Tulane.

Darkwa currently leads Tulane in both rushing attempts (190) and is tied for the team lead in receptions (34). He has a chance to become the first Wave running back to lead Tulane in both rushing attempts and receptions since former Green Wave back **Mewelde Moore** did it twice in 2001 and 2002. Running back **Tommy Mason** pulled off the trick in 1960, **Claude Mason** in 1957 and **Richard Hoot** in 1945.

For the year, Darkwa has 853 yards and 11 touchdowns on 190 carries (4.5 avg.) and has caught 34 receptions for 305 yards (9.0 avg.) He ranks first on the team in rushing attempts, yards and touchdowns and is fourth in receiving yards.

## KICKER SANTOS QUIETLY MAKING HIS MARK

• Tulane sophomore kicker **Cairo Santos** has already established himself as one of the school's top placekickers despite playing less than two seasons.

Santos has nailed 24-of-32 career field goal attempts and converted 63-of-64 career PATs. Santos ranks first for career field goal percentage and third for PAT percentage. He also ranks seventh on the school's career list scoring, field goals made, PATs made and PATs attempted, and is 11th for field goals attempted.

## SULLEN NEARING SINGLE SEASON CHARTS

• Junior **Jordan Sullen** will wrap up his first full season as a cornerback this week at Hawai'i and has 10 passes broken up on the year. Sullen needs just one more PBU to break into the school's single season list. If Sullen can break up a pass against the Warriors, he would tie former Tulane defensive back **Rod McDowell's** 10th place mark of 11 set in 1992.

Sullen's best game came at SMU when he came up with three PBU's against the Mustangs. He has three games with two or more breakups this season.

## WARMSLEY WARMING UP TO OPPOSING QB'S

• Sophomore defensive end **Julius Warmlesley** has 5.5 sacks this season with his sack of No. 11 Houston's Case Keenum two weeks ago. He ranks second on the team in sacks and ranks fourth for tackles for lost yardage with 6.0 on the year. Warmlesley logged a career-best three sacks in the season opener against Southeastern Louisiana, which is tied for the 10th-best single game effort among NCAA players this season.

For the year, Warmlesley has 25 stops (15 solo/10 asst), which ranks third among the team's defensive lineman, and he also pestered quarterbacks into three hurries, recorded three break-ups and has recovered one fumble.



## DO-IT-ALL DARKWA RACKING UP THE YARDS, TOUCHDOWNS

• For the second straight season, running back **Orleans Darkwa** has been featured in several positions on the offensive side of the ball. Darkwa has 1,158 all-purpose yards (853-rush/305-rec), which ranks second on the team.

For the year, Darkwa has 853 yards and 11 touchdowns on 190 carries (4.5 avg.) and has made 34 receptions for 305 yards (9.0 avg.) He ranks first on the team in rushing attempts, yards and touchdowns and is tied for second in receptions and fourth in receiving yards. Darkwa has also completed 1-of-2 passing this season for 34 yards.

For his career, Darkwa has rushed for 1,778 yards and 22 touchdowns, grabbed 44 receptions for 460 yards and has completed 3-of-4 passing attempts for 77 yards and two touchdowns. His rushing total is 12th all-time- 184 yards behind **Jerald Sowell's** 11th-place mark of 1,962 from 1993-96.

Darkwa has 22 rushing touchdowns for his career and stands alone in eighth place, just two shy of tying three players- **Terrence Jones**, **Don Zimmerman** and **Charles Flournoy**- fifth place total of 24.

Darkwa also has seven 100-yard games for his career which ranks fifth all-time.

## THE SIX PICK GROUP

• As a team, Tulane has 10 interceptions this season, which ranks 55th nationally and eighth among C-USA schools, and six players have accounted for the picks, including cornerback **Ryan Travis** with four, cornerback/nickelback **Derrick Strozier** with two, while linebackers **Trent Mackey** and **Darryl Farley** join cornerback **Alex Lauricella** and safety **Renaldo Thomas** each has one interception. Travis, Strozier and Mackey have each returned one pick for a touchdown this season.

## TRAVIS IS ONE OF C-USA'S TOP THIEVES

• Tulane junior cornerback **Ryan Travis** has a team-best four interceptions this season and ranks seventh among C-USA players and 46th nationally. Travis' interception total this season is the most by a Green Wave player since **David Skehan** tallied four in 2006 and again in 2007. The last time a Tulane player had more than four interceptions in a season was back in 2003 when **Sean Lucas** had five.

## BLOWING UP THE DEFENSE

• Although Tulane had just one explosive play last week against Rice, the Green Wave now has 54 for the season. In the passing game, Tulane has completed 33 passes for 20+ yards, including four bombs of 50+ yards with a season long of 60 yards. Against Syracuse, **Ryan Griffin** hooked up with **Xavier Rush** for a season-long 60-yard strike and 58-yard connection. Both went for touchdowns.

In the running game, Tulane has eight rushes of 20+ yards, including a season-long 68-yard scamper by **Orleans Darkwa** against Houston.

Tulane has five kickoff returns of 30+ yards, including a 66-yarder by **Robert Kelley**, while **Derrick Strozier** has four punt returns of 20+ yards, with a long of 44 yards. Strozier also has a season-long 55-yard interception return for a score at UAB.

At ECU, **Trent Mackey** picked up a fumble and returned it 20 yards.

## GRIFFIN CLIMBING THE CHARTS

• Junior quarterback **Ryan Griffin** moved into sixth place on Tulane's career passing list. He now has 6,153 yards, ranking sixth all time and is just 455 yards shy of **Lester Ricard's** fifth place mark. In addition, Griffin ranks third in Green Wave career history with 579 completions and is fifth all-time with 974 pass attempts. His 36 career touchdown passes still sits eighth in Tulane history.

## THE 300

• Junior quarterback **Ryan Griffin** posted season highs with 377 passing yards, 50 pass attempts and 31 completions against Memphis. It marked the second time this season Griffin surpassed the 300-yard passing barrier and the fifth of his career.

He now stands alone in fourth place in Tulane history in 300-yard passing games, one behind fifth-place **J.P. Losman** and **Terrence Jones**. Griffin's best passing day was 412-yard performance on the road at Tulsa (10.16) during the 2010 campaign.

## GRIFFIN FINDS THE ZONE AGAINST SYRACUSE

• **Ryan Griffin** completed 24-of-30 passing attempts for 320 yards and a pair of touchdown tosses against Syracuse and at one point in the game had completed a career-best 15 straight passes. Starting with a completion to receiver **Wilson Van Hooser** with 12:11 remaining in the second quarter, Griffin tossed 15 straight completions to nine different receivers and didn't miss until the 13:28 mark of the fourth quarter when he overthrew **Xavier Rush**.

### PLAYING THE NUMBERS GAME

• A quick look at Tulane's season statistics reveals the Green Wave is very unselfish with the football as five different players have attempted a pass, 14 different players have a rushing attempt and 19 different players have a pass reception.

Meanwhile, 15 different players have reached the scoring column, including three running backs, one fullback, five receivers, two tight ends, one linebacker, two cornerbacks and of course the placekicker.

Sophomore running back **Orleans Darkwa** leads the team in rushing touchdowns with 11, while sophomore **Wilson Van Hooser** has a team-best four receiving touchdowns and quarterback **Ryan Griffin** has tossed 13 touchdowns. Sophomore placekicker **Cairo Santos** has 63 points on 11-of-16 field goal attempts and has converted 30-of-31 PATs.

### FRESHMAN RECEIVERS CATCHING ON

• True freshman tight end **Evan Tatford's** 38-yard catch against Memphis was the first reception of his career. He is one of 19 players this season to catch a pass, including the seventh freshmen to haul in a pass this season (**Robert Kelley, Brandon LeBeau, Matt Marfisi, Xavier Rush, Justyn Shackleford** and **Carlos Wilson**) and the fifth true freshmen to do so (Kelley, LeBeau, Rush and Shackleford).

Together, this group of youngsters has combined to make 102 receptions for 1,282 yards and five touchdowns.

### GINSBURGH PUTTING HIS BEST FOOT FORWARD THIS SEASON

• Tulane sophomore punter **Jonathan Ginsburgh** has punted 60 times for 2,482 yards and has an average of 41.4 for the year. He has placed 13 punts inside the opponents' 20-yard line, 16 have been fair-caught and he has boomed seven attempts 50+ yards with a long of 55 yards. Ginsburgh's average ranks fourth in the league and 46th nationally.

His best day came against Tulsa when he averaged 45.9 yards on seven punts (321 yards). Ginsburgh's average for the day was the highest of his career when punting seven-or-more times. His career-best average is 49.2 after punting six times for 295 yards against Ole Miss on Sept. 11, 2010, in the Louisiana Superdome.

### WALK-ON SUCHY HAS BECOME A GO-TO GUY FOR THE WAVE

• Sophomore walk-on **Stephen Suchy** has fought from anonymity into a versatile tight end for the Green Wave. Suchy, who walked-on the team in 2009 but did not see action beyond the scout team, played in three games during the 2010 season and recorded his first touch with a six-yard return of a squib kick against Southern Miss.

This season, he has played in every game and caught six passes for 109 yards, including a 25-yard snare at Duke. Suchy has caught a pass in five of seven games and hauled in a career-best two catches against Syracuse. He also plays on the field goal unit.

### FROSH CONTRIBUTIONS

• Thirteen true or redshirt freshmen have provided the Green Wave with an immediate impact this season, including eight on offense and five on defense.

Offensively, true freshmen **Robert Kelley** (1,661 yds), **Dante Butler** (315 yds), **Justyn Shackleford** (418 yds), **Xavier Rush** (338 yds) and **Brandon LeBeau** (169 yds), along with redshirt freshmen **Matt Marfisi** (130 yds), **Carlos Wilson** (60 yds) and **Evan Tatford** (44 yds) have combined for 3,135 total yards, or 47 percent of the team's total yards (5,692).

On the defensive side, true freshmen **Renaldo Thomas, Matthew Bailey, Michael Pierce, Sam Scofield** and redshirt freshman **Steven Funderburk** have combined for 86 tackles, one interception (Thomas), once forced fumble (Thomas) and Bailey has two blocked punts and one sack.

## WAVE TRIO RECEIVES PRESEASON ATTENTION FROM NATIONAL MEDIA

• The Green Wave began the 2011 campaign with three of its players receiving notice on the national watch lists, including sophomore **Orleans Darkwa** (Doak Walker), junior linebacker **Trent Mackey** (Rotary Lombardi) and junior **Ryan Grant** (Biletnikoff).

Darkwa leads TU in rushing (853 yds) and has 11 touchdowns, while Mackey has a team-best 145 stops and two touchdowns, while Grant, who is likley out for the season, has one receiving score.

Darkwa is the third Tulane running back since 2007 to be named to the Doak Walker Award Watch List, joining **Matt Forte** (2007) and **Andre Anderson** (2008, 2009). Darkwa was named a third team Freshman All-American by Phil Steele Publications after rushing for a TU freshman record 925 yards and scoring 11 TDs

Mackey led Tulane in tackles with 124 a year ago and was named to the All-C-USA second team and selected as the Louisiana Newcomer of the Year. Grant caught 33 passes for 515 yards and four touchdowns, including the game-winner against Rice.

Grant tallied 33 receptions for 515 yards and four touchdowns as a sophomore during the 2010 season.

## TULANE DISPATCHES UAB FOR ITS MOST LOPSIDED C-USA WIN

• Tulane was a founding member of Conference USA in 1996. Two weeks ago, the Green Wave recorded its largest margin of victory in a C-USA contest with a 49-10 victory at UAB. Before Saturday's win at Legion Field, Tulane's largest league victory was 34 in a 44-10 win at Houston on Nov. 22, 1997. Saturday's win was Tulane's most lopsided victory since defeating Louisiana-Monroe 52-9 (43 points) on Oct. 5, 2002, at ULM's Malone Stadium.

Tulane's 39-point win over UAB was the largest margin of victory in a league game since Nov. 27, 1948, when the Wave defeated LSU, 46-0, in an SEC contest played in Baton Rouge.

## KEMP(ER) FI! TU'S JOE KEMP SPENDS SIX WEEKS TRAINING WITH THE MARINES

• This past summer, senior receiver **Joe Kemp** spent six weeks training but it wasn't for football or college- it was to serve his country.

During the months of May, June and part of July of 2011, he underwent training to become a United States Marine Corps Officer at the Marine Corps Base in Quantico, Va. Kemp's participation was part of Officer Candidate School. All candidates have to go through an intense, three-month acceptance process that takes into account grade-point average, character and conduct, among other criteria.

Kemp is scheduled to be commissioned as a second lieutenant in the Marines on July 8, 2012 – the same day his girlfriend, Tulane student-trainer Abby Harris, also gets commissioned as a second lieutenant in the Navy.

## MARK HUTSON

- Named interim head coach on Oct. 18, 2011, becoming the 38th head coach in school history.
- A 25-year veteran of the college game either as a player or coach, he has been a part of seven bowl teams, three as a coach and four as a player.
- Hutson is no stranger to the interim tag. Prior to Tulane, Hutson was the interim head coach at Eastern Illinois in 2006 and guided the Panthers to a co-Ohio Valley Conference championship and No. 15 national ranking in the final poll. He was credited with a career coaching record of 8-5, 7-1 in the OVC.
- Has an 0-5 record at Tulane and is 8-10 as a collegiate coach (Eastern Illinois).
- The 2011 campaign marks Hutson's fifth season on the Green Wave coaching staff and he has served as the offensive line coach for the Green Wave in each of his five seasons.
- Four of Hutson's pupils on the offensive line have gone on to play in the NFL. **Troy Kropog** was a fourth round selection by the Tennessee Titans in 2008, while senior **Nick Landry**, **Pete Hendrickson** and **Michael Parenton** each signed free agent contracts with NFL teams.

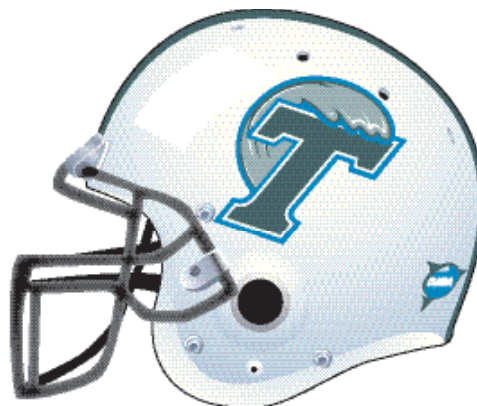

## Game 1 • Tulane 47, Southeastern Louisiana 33

Louisiana Superdome • New Orleans, La.  
Sept. 3, 2011 • 15,912

Ryan Griffin tossed three touchdown passes and six Green Wave players found the endzone as Tulane opened the 2011 season with a 47-33 victory over Southeastern Louisiana.

Albert Williams, Orleans Darkwa and Robert Kelley each scored a rushing touchdown while Griffin connected with Wilson Van Hooser, Ryan Grant and Trent Mackey for scoring strikes of 55, 27 and three yards, respectively. Kelley set a Tulane single-game record with 213 kickoff return yards.

While the offense rolled up 393 yards (126 rushing, 267 passing), the Green Wave defense posted seven sacks among eight tackles for loss, broke up eight passes and picked off another. On special teams, Tulane added a pair of blocked punts by Matthew Bailey, including one that resulted in a safety.

Kelley got the game started on a high note as he returned the opening kickoff 66 yards to help set up Cairo Santos' 36-yard field goal four plays later. Southeastern Louisiana answered with a one-yard touchdown plunge by Zeke Jones on its first possession of the game, but the Green Wave came right back with a three-play, 67-yard drive which ended on Griffin-to-Van Hooser's 55-yard touchdown pass to give Tulane a 10-7 lead it would not relinquish.

On their next drive, the Mackey snared a three-yard Griffin pass with 2:15 left in the opening quarter to put the home team on top, 17-7. The Lions roared back with a Jones five-yard touchdown run, but Griffin found Grant deep for a 27-yard scoring strike. Southeastern cut the deficit to three courtesy of a one-yard Sam Fairley touchdown run. Williams, however, scored on a 30-yard run five scrimmage plays later to send the Green Wave into the locker room at halftime with a 31-21 advantage.

The two teams traded punts to open the second half but Bailey's second stuff off the toe of Beau Mothe saw the ball roll out of bounds in the Tulane endzone for a safety to make it a 33-21 affair.

Darkwa added a two-yard scoring jaunt six plays later and the route was on. Southeastern sandwiched 30- and 38-yard field goals by Seth Sebastian around a Kelley 11-yard touchdown run to make it 47-27, and the Lions closed out the scoring when quarterback Brian Young snuck in from one yard out with 6:34 left in regulation.

## Game 2 • Tulsa 31, Tulane 3

Louisiana Superdome • New Orleans, La.  
Sept. 10, 2011 • 19,752

Trent Mackey and Shakiel Smith had 10 tackles each, and the Green Wave defense tallied three sacks among six tackles for loss, but it was not enough as Tulane dropped its Conference USA opener to Tulsa.

The Green Wave turned a first-quarter interception by Ryan Travis into a 32-yard Cairo Santos field goal to Tulane a 3-0 advantage 8:22 into the ballgame, but the Golden Hurricane rattled off 31 unanswered points - including 14 off Green Wave turnovers - to come away with the victory.

For the second consecutive game, Tulane spread the ball around on offense as seven players had at least one rushing attempt and Ryan Griffin completed passes to 11 different receivers. The Green Wave, however, managed just 235 yards of total offense, including 59 rushing on 35 attempts (1.7 avg.).

Tulane also missed a pair of 40-plus yard field goals and turned the ball over three times. All three turnovers came in Tulsa territory to thwart potential scoring drives. Tulsa, meanwhile, racked up 412 yards of total offense (166 rushing, 246 passing) and averaged 6.0 yards per play.

Following Santos' field goal, Tulsa tied the score on a 28-yard Kevin Fitzpatrick boot 4:34 later, but the Tulane defense kept Tulsa out of the endzone for most of the first half. With 4:08 left to play in the second quarter, G.J. Kinne directed a six-play, 73-yard drive he capped with a five-yard touchdown pass to Bryan Burnham to give his team a 10-3 lead it would not relinquish.

It was the first of two consecutive drives that Tulsa would hit paydirt as the Hurricane opened the second half with an 82-yard march which saw Alex Singleton score on a two-yard run over right guard to make it 17-3. Tulane got the ball down to the Tulsa 22-yard line on the ensuing drive, but Santos was wide left on a 44-yard field goal attempt.

Following a Tulsa punt, the Green Wave appeared to have something going as Tulane took possession of the ball at midfield and drove down to the 15. Tulsa's Cory Dorris jarred the ball loose from Albert Williams and Jack Jewell pounced on the loose pigskin at his own 23. Kinne made the miscue hurt as he lofted the ball deep to Burnham at the goal line three plays later. Burnham, who was facing tight coverage from Jordan Sullen, tipped the ball up over his head, spun around and caught the deflection to extend the lead to 24-3.

The Golden Hurricane closed out the scoring when Kinne rolled right and found Clay Sears alone in the endzone from one yard out to cap a seven-play, 67-yard drive with 8:47 left in regulation to account for the final score. Tulane got the ball into Tulsa territory in each of its next two drives only to see the scoring chances slip away as Dobbins forced a recovered an Orleans Darkwa fumble with 7:29 to play and Griffin's fourth-down pass attempt fell incomplete 4:07 later.

# 2011 Game Recaps

## Game 3 • Tulane 49, UAB 10

Legion Field • Birmingham, Ala.

Sept. 17, 2011 • 17,658

Ryan Griffin tied a career high with three touchdown passes and both Trent Mackey and Derrick Strozier had interception returns for scores as Tulane rolled past Conference USA foe UAB, 49-10.

The 39-point victory was the largest conference win by the Green Wave since the league's inception prior to the 1996 season, surpassing the former mark of 34 established on Nov. 22, 1997, in a 44-10 decision at Houston. The win was also Tulane's most lopsided victory overall since downing Louisiana-Monroe 52-9 on Oct. 5, 2003.

Tulane piled up 540 yards of total offense (262 rushing, 278 passing) and the defense held the Blazers to just 193 (48 rushing, 145 passing). In addition, Tulane ran 76 plays and held the ball for 41:57 compared to the Blazers' 45 offensive snaps and 18:03 time of possession.

Griffin completed 22-of-26 passes for 281 yards, including scoring strikes to Joe Kemp, Wilson Van Hooser and Matt Marfisi. Mackey and Strozier, meanwhile, became the first Tulane tandem to return interceptions for scores in the same game since Bruce Youmans and Tra Boger accomplished the feat against Marshall on Oct. 29, 2005.

After taking the opening kickoff, Tulane squandered a scoring opportunity on the game's first drive on a botched field goal attempt. That, however, was about the only thing that went wrong offensively the rest of the way.

After the defense held UAB to a three-and-out, Orleans Darkwa capped an eight-play, 65-yard march with his first touchdown run from four yards out. The lead was short lived as Nick Adams returned the ensuing kickoff 92 yards to tie the ballgame.

Tulane answered with a 10-play, 66-yard drive that saw Darkwa hit paydirt on a two-yard run and the Green Wave never trailed again. Two Blazers drives later, Mackey picked off an attempted shovel pass by UAB's Bryan Ellis and returned it 39 yards to put the Wave on top 21-7. Van Hooser capped the first-half scoring with a 17-yard touchdown pass from Griffin and Tulane went into the locker room at the break comfortably on top, 28-7.

UAB got something going early in the third quarter as the Blazers marched 48 yards on nine plays and cut the deficit to 18 courtesy of a 32-yard Ty Long field goal. Undaunted, the Green Wave came back with a 10-play, 68-yard drive which culminated with a 19-yard Griffin-to-Kemp touchdown pass.

The next time Tulane got the ball, the Wave went 94 yards on 18 plays as Marfisi scored his first collegiate touchdown on a one-yard grab. Strozier accounted for the final score with a 55-yard pick six from UAB reserve signal caller Joe Bento.

## Game 4 • Duke 48, Tulane 27

Wallace Wade Stadium • Durham, N.C.

Sept. 24, 2011 • 20,138

Despite getting an early defensive touchdown from Ryan Travis, Tulane was not able to spoil the homecoming festivities at Duke University as the Blue Devils rolled to a 48-27 victory at Wallace Wade Stadium.

Tulane found itself down 7-0 early as Duke got on the board first, scoring on their opening possession with a 76-yard drive capped by Juwan Thompson's scored from one yard out. The Blue Devils set up the score with a 44-yard pass and catch from quarterback Sean Renfree to receiver Conner Vernon.

Travis' interception evened the score at 7-7 with 8:22 remaining in the first. Travis jumped in front of a Renfree pass in the flat on the right side and returned it 23 yards for a touchdown. Duke scored on five of its seven first-half possessions. The only two that didn't result in points for the Blue Devils was the interception returned for a touchdown in the first half and the final possession of the half when the clock ran down.

The Blue Devils totaled 484 yards in the game, including 151 on the ground and 333 in the air. Renfree was 21 of 30 for 278 yards. The Green Wave would add a 20-yard field goal with 11:23 left in the second half and the score at the break was 31-10.

Duke opened the second half with a nine-play, 68-yard drive capped by a Jay Hollingsworth 3-yard run. Santos added another field goal, a career-long 49-yarder, with 8:17 remaining in the third. That drive started after Derrick Strozier recovered a fumble by Renfree on the Duke 32 yard line.

The Green Wave added two late touchdowns after Duke expanded the lead to 48-13. Ryan Griffin found Brock Sanders in the endzone from two-yards out. Griffin finished the day 14-29 for 188 yards. He found 10 different receivers.

Tulane then forced Duke to punt for the first and only time in the game on the ensuing possession. The Green Wave took over at their own four yard line, but proceeded to march down the field to score the final points of the game when Robert Kelley scampered in the endzone from seven yards out. The drive was 11 plays for 96 yards and backup D.J. Ponder completed four of his seven passes for 75 yards on the drive.

Justyn Shackelford pulled down three of those Ponder passes for 59 yards, including a 34-yard catch. Joe Kemp also finished the game with a team-high three catches. Tulane totaled 263 yards in the air on the afternoon, but collected only 55 yards on 22 carries on the ground.

## Game 5 • Army 45, Tulane 6

Michie Stadium • West Point, N.Y.

Oct. 1, 2011 • 31,235

Turnovers and penalties plagued Tulane in a 45-6 loss to Army on homecoming at Blaik Field at Michie Stadium at the United States Military Academy. The Green Wave turned the ball over four times that led to 17 points for the Black Knights, and committed 10 penalties that resulted in 92 yards.

Orleans Darkwa was a bright spot for Tulane, running for 138 yards on 16 carries, including the Green Wave's lone score. He rattled off a career-long 67-yard run on the game's second play from scrimmage that set up his 3-yard touchdown run the very next play.

That score put Tulane up 6-0 after a missed extra point by Cairo Santos. Unfortunately that would be the only time Tulane would crack the scoring column as Army scored 45 unanswered points.

Army took the ensuing drive and marched 70 yards on 10 running plays capped by a 2-yard touchdown run by Larry Dixon. The extra point then gave the Black Knights a 7-6 lead, one they would not give up.

Tulane's first turnover of the game, an interception by Army's Josh Jackson, was returned to the Green Wave 13 yard line on the next possession to set up the Black Knights second score of the game, a 2-yard run by Trent Steelman, to go up 14-6. Steelman added another touchdown, from one yard out, with 1:07 left in the second quarter, that secured a 21-6 lead for Army going into halftime.

Tulane had two fumbles in the second half that led to an Army touchdown and a field goal that all but put the game out of reach. The first fumble came right after Tulane's Darryl Farley forced Army's Jared Hassin to fumble on the first play of the second half. That turnover gave the Green Wave the ball on Army's 27-yard line but a bad handoff exchange between Ryan Griffin and Darkwa put the ball on the ground to be recovered by Thomas Hallway at the Black Knights' 11.

Army marched 89 yards in just five plays capped by a 40-yard pass from Steelman to Davyd Brooks to put the Black Knights up 28-6. Darkwa fumbled on Tulane's next play from scrimmage that led to an Alex Carlton 23-yard field goal with 7:47 left in the third quarter.

Army added two more touchdowns, both on the ground. The Black Knights tallied 353 yards on the ground on 62 carries. Raymond Maples led the way with 141 yards on 15 carries.

Griffin completed the afternoon 10 for 19 with one interception and 74 yards. Joe Kemp was once again Tulane's leading receiver with three receptions for 28 yards.

Rookies Matthew Bailey and Sam Scofield each posted career-high 10 tackles in the loss. Scofield collected his during his first career start at safety.

## Game 6 • Syracuse 37, Tulane 34

Mercedes-Benz Superdome • New Orleans, La.

Oct. 8, 2011 • 23,188

Ryan Griffin completed 24-of-30 passes for a 320 yards and Trent Mackey posted a career-best 18 tackles, but it was not enough as Tulane dropped a 37-34 heartbreaker to Syracuse at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome.

The Green Wave trailed by as many as 17 twice, including a 31-14 deficit late in the first half. From there, Tulane outscored the Orange 20-3 courtesy of two scoring receptions by Xavier Rush and a pair of field goals by Cairo Santos to knot the score at 34-all with 2:53 left to play. Syracuse responded with a 12-play, 66-yard drive and Ross Krautman drilled a 21-yard field goal as time expired to account for the final score.

Tulane had a chance to make things interesting as the Green Wave appeared to force a three-and-out on Syracuse's game-winning drive as Matthew Bailey broke up a pass intended for Van Chew on third down. On the play, however, Dezman Moses was flagged for roughing the passer to give the Orange new life. Syracuse got two more first downs later in the drive and following a timeout with two seconds to play, Krautman split the uprights to give the Orange the victory.

Tulane scored first as Orleans Darkwa capped an eight-play, 80-yard opening drive with a 40-yard touchdown jaunt to stake the Green Wave to a 7-0 lead. The advantage was short lived, however, as Jeremiah Kobena returned the ensuing kickoff 79 yards to the Tulane five, and Antwon Bailey hit paydirt one play later to tie the score.

The score was the first of four straight for the Orange as Krautman kicked a 29-yard field goal, Ryan Nassib hit Dorian Graham for a 10-yard touchdown, and Nassib scored on a four-yard keeper to stake Syracuse to a 24-7 advantage. A one-yard Darkwa touchdown plunge cut the deficit to 10, but the Orange answered with a one-yard pass from Nassib to Graham to make it 31-14 with 2:58 to play in the first half.

The Green Wave closed the half with a 10-0 rally as Rush scored his first touchdown of the game 47 seconds later, and Santos connected on a 42-yard field goal as the first half expired to make it 31-24 at the break.

Santos made it a four-point affair after hitting a 49-yard boot with 4:13 left to play in third. Syracuse pushed the lead back to seven courtesy of a 32-yard Krautman kick with 4:19 left to play, but the Wave came right back and Griffin connected with Rush for another long touchdown to tie the game and set the stage for the game final drive.

## Game 7 • UTEP 44, Tulane 7

The Green Wave defense forced three turnovers and Trent Mackey tallied double-digit tackle totals (14) for the fifth time in seven games so far in 2011, but it was not enough as Tulane dropped a 44-7 decision to C-USA foe UTEP at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome.

Tulane committed four turnovers via interception - the most since throwing four picks against UAB on Nov. 15, 2008 - and had a blocked punt result in a touchdown. With the score knotted at 7-7 with 7:57 left to play in the first quarter, the Miners scored 34 unanswered points the rest of the way to account for the final score.

The game, however, came down to Green Wave miscues as UTEP scored 10 points off turnovers in addition to a second-quarter blocked punt by Travaun Nixon which Adrian James recovered in the endzone.

The Miners' first points of the day came following a Ryan Griffin interception three plays into the ballgame. After Nixon's pick and three-yard return to the Green Wave 25, it took UTEP just three plays to hit paydirt as Vernon Frazier went untouched for a 15-yard touchdown to go ahead 7-0.

Tulane responded with a nine-play, 92-yard drive which Orleans Darkwa capped with a seven-yard touchdown run, but UTEP began the route two plays later when Joe Baynard scampered 72 yards for a score to make it 14-7. Leilyon Myers made it a two-score affair with a three-yard touchdown on fourth down one play into the second quarter, and Nixon's block of a Jonathan Ginsburgh punt on the ensuing possession stretched the Miners' lead to 21.

The Green Wave saw a pair of starters forced to leave the game on their next drive as Griffin suffered a bruised hip on a hit by Derrick Morgan, and left guard Zach Ray was sent to the sideline with an undisclosed injury later in the possession. Despite a reshuffled offensive line and with D.J. Ponder under center, Tulane appeared to have something going as the squad drove down to the UTEP three. On third-and-goal, however, Ponder was intercepted in the endzone by DeShawn Grayson.

The Miners' added a 41-yard field goal off the toe of Dakota Warren with 42 seconds remaining in the second half and UTEP went into the locker room at the break on top 31-7.

The onslaught continued early in the third quarter as Nick Lamaison connected with Craig Wenrick for a 66-yard touchdown two plays into the second half to make it 38-7 and Warren added a 39-yard boot on UTEP's next drive to push the advantage to 34. Warren's 42-yard field goal with 12:43 remaining in regulation proved to be the final score of the ballgame.

## Game 8 • Memphis 33, Tulane 17

Trent Mackey hit the 100-tackle plateau for the season and the duo of Orleans Darkwa and Wilson Van Hooser both posted 100-yard receiving days, but it was not enough as Tulane dropped its Homecoming contest to Conference USA foe Memphis, 33-17, at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome.

The Green Wave rallied from a 14-3 first-half deficit to take a 17-14 lead on Van Hooser's 29-yard touchdown reception Ryan Griffin 2:36 into the third quarter. From there, however, Memphis rattled off 19 unanswered points courtesy of a pick six, a touchdown run and a field goal to account for the final score.

Darkwa led all players with 112 yards on a career-high seven receptions while Van Hooser had six receptions for 100 yards and a touchdown. Mackey, meanwhile, paced the Tulane defense with 13 tackles, including a sack among two tackles for loss.

Memphis drew first blood as Taylor Reed capped an 11-play, 75-yard drive on the Tigers' second possession of the game with a two-yard touchdown pass to tight end Justin Henderson. The Green Wave answered with a 23-yard Cairo Santos field goal, but the Tigers came right back with a five-play, 64-yard drive which saw Reed hook up with Tannar Rehrrer from 19 yards out to put Memphis on top 14-3 with 9:46 to play in the first half.

Undaunted, the Green Wave cut the deficit to four as Darkwa scored on a seven-yard run with 2:45 to play in the second quarter, and Griffin found Van Hooser on the opening drive of the second half to put Tulane ahead 17-14. The Tulane defense forced a three-and-out on the ensuing possession and it appeared as if the Wave were about to take control of the contest as Griffin drove the offense to the Memphis 15 four plays later. His screen pass to Darkwa, however, was picked off by Bobby McCain and the Tigers' defensive back returned it 79 yards for the go-ahead score.

The PAT was blocked by Derrick Strozier, but Tulane had a special teams play of its own go awry which set the tone for the rest of the game. Ricky Holloway blocked a Green Wave punt on the next possession and Kendrick Golden recovered it at the seven-yard line. Tulane's defense held for the next three snaps but Reed snuck in from one yard out on fourth down to extend the lead to 26-17 with 4:40 remaining in the third quarter.

The two teams traded turnovers as Kenyata Johnson snared a Griffin offering and Ryan Travis returned the favor with an interception of Reed on the very next play. Following a pair of punts, Tulane had an opportunity to cut into the deficit a bit, but Santos' 46-yard field goal attempt clanged off the upright to keep it a nine-point ballgame. Memphis closed out the scoring on a 22-yard Billy Foster reverse for a touchdown with 6:55 left in regulation.

## Game 9 • East Carolina 34, Tulane 13

Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium • Greenville, N.C.

Oct. 29, 2011 • 49,410

A strong second half, both offensively and defensively, vaulted East Carolina to a 34-13 victory over Tulane at Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium.

Tulane trailed 17-13 at halftime, but ECU (4-4, 3-1 C-USA) managed two second-half touchdowns and a field goal and held the Green Wave scoreless to pull away with their third straight victory and send Tulane home with a sixth straight loss.

The Green Wave collected 178 yards on 33 plays in the opening two quarters, but was held to just 88 yards on 33 plays in the final two quarters. ECU gained 461 yards of total yards for the game, including 336 through the air.

Orleans Darkwa once again provided the bulk of the offense for the Green Wave. The sophomore running back gained 89 yards on 15 carries and scored the only touchdown of the afternoon. Robert Kelley added 31 yards on the ground on seven carries to go with his 111 kickoff return yards for 142 all-purpose yards.

Ryan Griffin connected on 16 of 31 pass attempts with 132 yards for Tulane, while Wilson Van Hooser pulled in four of those passes for 28 yards.

ECU opened the scoring with a nine-play, 69-yard drive that resulted in a five-yard run by quarterback Dominique Davis on the team's second possession of the game with 7:59 remaining in the first quarter. The Pirates' drive started after Cairo Santos' 48-yard field goal attempt went wide right.

Tulane got on the board with a 20-yard field goal by Santos that followed an ECU fumble recovered and returned by Trent Mackey to the Pirates' five-yard line. Mackey finished with a game-high 15 tackles, while Ryan Travis added a career-high 12 stops. Dezman Moses had seven tackles, including 1.5 sacks.

The Green Wave then took the lead with a two-play, 47-yard drive that ended with a seven-yard run by Darkwa. Santos' extra point gave Tulane a 10-7 lead. The drive began after ECU's punter, Ben Ryan, managed only an 11-yard kick.

The Pirates retook the lead on the ensuing drive when Davis found Lance Lewis on a crossing route for a one-yard touchdown strike with 11:09 left in the second quarter.

Santos answered with his second of two field goals of the day, a 26-yarder with 5:48 left in the half, cutting the deficit to one, 14-13.

An ECU 35-yard field goal from the foot of Mike Barbour with 4:32 left in the second completed the scoring for the first half, giving the Pirates a 17-13 lead at the break.

Including that Barbour field goal, ECU outscored Tulane 20-0 the rest of the way.

Davis finished the game for the Pirates with 329 passing yards on 29 of 46 with one touchdown. He also added 43 yards on the ground with two touchdowns on eight carries.

The Green Wave scored a season-best 24 points in the third quarter, but it was not enough as Tulane dropped a 45-24 decision to Conference USA foe SMU at Gerald J. Ford Stadium.

After being held to 39 yards on 6-of-11 passing in the first half, Ryan Griffin bounced back to complete 14-of-25 passes for 175 yards and two touchdowns in the second half. The Mustangs, however, used a 31-point first half to build a comfortable lead and held Tulane scoreless in the final quarter to come away with the win.

Trailing 31-0 at halftime, Tulane got things going early in the second half as Dominique Robertson returned a fumble 18 yards for a touchdown on the first play of the third quarter to put the Wave on the board. Tulane added a 42-yard Cairo Santos field goal and Griffin found Wilson Van Hooser for a 30-yard touchdown strike with 7:43 to play in the quarter to make it 31-17.

SMU answered with a 10-play, 76-yard drive which Zach Line capped with a seven-yard touchdown run, but Tulane came right back as Griffin hit Justyn Shackelford for a 49-yard score to make it 38-24 in the waning seconds of the stanza.

The Green Wave had a chance to make it a one-score affair early in the final frame, but Griffin fumbled on a fourth-and-five play from the SMU 28. The Mustangs put the game away two drives later when J.J. McDermott connected with Terrance Wilkerson from two yards out with 1:39 left to play to account for the final score.

The first half was all SMU as the Mustangs turned a Tulane turnover on the game's opening possession into a four-yard Line touchdown run. SMU added a 12-yard J.J. Merdermott-to-Der'rikk Thompson touchdown pass later in the frame and scored 17 more points in the second quarter courtesy of a 32-yard Chase Hover field goal, a 58-yard McDermott pass to Darius Johnson and a one-yard touchdown jaunt by line.

Trent Mackey led all players with 12 tackles (9 solo, 3 assists) and had a sack among three tackles for loss. Robertson was next with eight stops (7 solo, 1 assist) and Jordan Sullen broke up a career-high three passes.

Xavier Rush led the Green Wave receiving corps with six receptions (for 52 yards) while Van Hooser had five catches for a team-leading 66 yards, including his 30-yard touchdown in the third quarter. Orleans Darkwa led Tulane with 46 rushing yards on 16 carries.

# 2011 Game Recaps

**Game 11 • No. 11 Houston 73, Tulane 17**  
Mercedes-Benz Superdome • New Orleans, La.  
Nov. 10, 2011 • 17,657

Orleans Darkwa ran for 123 yards and two touchdowns, but it was not enough as Tulane dropped a 73-17 decision to No. 11 Houston. The two teams battled to a scoreless tie over the first 16-plus minutes of the contest before the Cougars broke the game open with 35 points in the second quarter.

While Darkwa hit the century mark for the second time in 2011, Cougar running back Charles Sims was even better as he had 199 of his 207 rushing yards in the first half. Sims had two of Houston's four touchdowns on the ground and also hauled in five passes for another 96 yards through the air. Patrick Edwards, meanwhile, had four touchdowns for the Cougars, three on receptions of 23, eight and 66 yards and another on a 70-yard, second-quarter punt return.

Houston rolled up 735 yards of total offense on the night - 292 rushing and 443 passing - and the bulk of the aerial attack came courtesy of Case Keenum, who finished the day 22-of-29 for 325 yards and three touchdowns before exiting the game late in the third quarter.

After a scoreless first quarter, the Cougars wasted little time getting on the board in the second as Bryce Beall capped a four-play, 89-yard drive with an 11-yard run 1:12 into the stanza to give Houston a 7-0 lead it would not relinquish. Edwards' 70-yard punt return made it 14-0, but Tulane answered with a four-play 80-yard drive as Darkwa hit paydirt from three yards out to make it a one-score game.

Houston squashed any hopes of an upset as Sims ripped off a 52-yard touchdown run and Keenum sandwiched a pair of touchdown passes around a Cairo Santos 42-yard field goal to make it 35-10 at the half.

Matt Hogan added to the Cougar tally with a 23-yard field goal on the opening drive of the third quarter. Following consecutive touchdown grabs by Edwards, Chance Blackmon hauled in a 27-yard scoring strike from back-up quarterback Cotton Turner to extend the lead to 59-10 at the end of the third quarter.

Darkwa found the endzone for the second time with 12:53 left to play in regulation to cut the deficit to 42, but that was as close as Tulane would get as Turner scored on a 35-yard scramble and Damian Payne returned a punt 76 yards for a score to account for the final score.

On a day when neither team managed more than 300 yards of total offense, the Tulane football came up short in the defensive battle at Rice, falling 19-7, on Saturday afternoon at Rice Stadium.

The Green Wave (2-10, 1-7 C-USA) defense held Rice (4-7, 3-4 C-USA) to just 237 yards of total offense and was led by Dezman Moses and Trent Mackey who each recorded nine tackles. Moses also collected a pair of sacks and Mackey had another.

Tulane gave up first quarter and fourth quarter touchdowns runs to Rice that sandwiched a pair of 50-plus yard field goals for the Owls, but could not muster any scoring of their own until the fourth quarter.

The Green Wave got on the board when Ryan Griffin found Xavier Rush in the end zone for a seven-yard touchdown with 10:03 remaining in the game. The touchdown capped the 16-play, 75-yard drive.

Griffin finished the day with 163 yards passing on 19 of 39 with that lone score.

Orleans Darkwa added 19 carries for 78 yards on the ground to go with five catches for 23 yards. Tulane as a team collected 289 yards of total offense on 72 plays.

Wilson Van Hooser also had five catches for the Green Wave for 56 yards.

Rice, who's scoring plays in the game all came with less than two minutes remaining in each quarter, opened the scoring with a five-yard touchdown run by Tyler Smith with 1:20 left in the first quarter that capped a nine-play, 52-yard drive.

The Owls then cracked the scoreboard again, with just 11 seconds remaining in the first half, when Chris Boswell nailed a 54-yard field goal that would have been good from at least 60 yards. The field goal capped a three-play, eight-yard drive after Tulane was forced to punt after a three and out.

Boswell then added a second field goal, this one from 51 yards away with 1:20 left in the third quarter. That kick capped a nine-play, 21-yard drive that put the Owls up, 13-0.

Rice iced the game when Smith crossed the goal line for the second time in the game, this time on a seven-yard run with 1:04 remaining in the fourth quarter to put the Owls up 19-7. Rice regained possession after Tulane was forced to punt after a five-play drive stalled out at their own 22.
