TULANE TREKS TO TULSA TO TAKE ON THE GOLDEN HURRICANE

The Tulane football team (2-8, 1-5 C-USA) hits the road for its final two games of the 2008 season, beginning this Saturday at 2 p.m. against Tulsa (8-2, 5-2 C-USA) in a divisional rivalry game at H. A. Chapman Stadium in Tulsa, Okla. TU will look to snap a six-game skid, the longest losing streak for Tulane since dropping eight straight contests to conclude the 2005 campaign, and the Wave will also look to notch its first road win of the year as well.

The Green Wave is sitting in fifth place in C-USA's West Division, while Tulsa, Rice and Houston are each tied for first. TU is 0-4 overall on the road this season, including 0-2 in league games away from home.

Tulane will conclude the season next week on the road at Memphis at Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium.

TULANE-MEMPHIS GAME TO BE TELEVISED BY COMCAST SPORTS SOUTH

Comcast Sports South has announced that it will televise the Tulane football game at Memphis on Saturday, Nov. 29. The kickoff time has now been changed to 2:30 p.m. CT at Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium. Tulane returns to the Memphis for the first time since 2004, and will be looking for its first win in the Bluff City since the perfect 12-0 season of 1998.

NOTING THE GREEN WAVE

- Last week, redshirt freshman running back **J.T. McDonald** scored three touchdowns (2-rush; 1 rec) and became the third TU running back to score three or more touchdowns in one game in Tulane's last 22 contests. Former All-America running back **Matt Forte** notched three games with 3+ scores in 2007, while junior **Andre Anderson** tallied three TDs earlier this season at UTEP.

- **J.T. McDonald** and true freshman **Nathan Austin** have picked up the load at running back in the absence of Andre Anderson, who was lost for the season with a shoulder injury. In the last three games, McDonald and Austin have combined for 180 yards on 60 carries and four TDs, and six receptions for 105 yards and one score.

- With its top two offensive playmakers lost for the season (**Andre Anderson**, **Jeremy Williams**) because of injury, Tulane's has been forced to become creative in generating offensive production. A total of 18 different players have at least one rush attempt this season, while 19 players have caught at least one pass, and five different players have at least one passing attempt. Quarterback **Kevin Moore**, receiver **Brian King** and running back **Albert Williams** are the only players on the team to achieve the trifecta in all three categories.

- **Ross Thevenot** drilled a career-long 50-yard field goal against UAB last week and became the first TU kicker to connect on 50-yard attempt since Nick Beucher split the uprights with a 53-yard attempt against UAB in 2004. Thevenot's 50-yard field goal tied for the 16th-longest in school history.

-Tulane's defense has forced five turnovers in the last three games with an interception return for a score at No. 15 LSU, two fumble recoveries and an interception at Houston and a fumble recovery at UAB.

- Tulane center **Michael Parenton** has started 28 consecutive games, the longest active streak for the Green Wave. Linebacker **Evan Lee** has started 25 consecutive games, while **Andrew Nierman** made his 22nd consecutive start.

MCDONALD HAS BREAKOUT DAY VS. UAB

Redshirt freshman **J.T. McDonald** was a bright spot for the Green Wave last week in its loss to UAB. McDonald registered career highs in carries (12), rushing yards (43), receptions (3), receiving yards (67) and more importantly scored three touchdowns, including two on the ground and one through the air.

McDonald came into the game with just three career carries for seven yards and had one reception for minus 1 yard. His first career rushing touchdown was a three-yard score that tied the game at 7-7 in the first quarter, while his first career receiving score came on a swing pass from quarterback **Kevin Moore** and McDonald turned the play in to a 27-yard jaunt that tied the game at 14-apiece in the second quarter. McDonald's second TD on the ground and third for the game pulled the Wave to within three points, 24-21 in the third quarter.

A LINEBACKER RETURNING KICKS?

Junior **Travis Burks** has done everything this season but carry the ball for the Tulane offense. Burks, who is a regular starter on defense at weak-side linebacker, is making the Tulane faithful very happy every time he touches the ball. Over the past three games, he has two interception returns (he entered the season with zero) for 74 yards and a touchdown at No. 15 LSU, and he has returned 13 kickoffs for 279 yards (21.5).

Burks returned one interception 31 yards deep into Houston territory that set up a Green Wave touchdown and he returned six kicks for 132 yards including a career-long 33-yard return, last week against UAB.

This week, Burks returns to the place where he returned first kick-Tulsa. As a freshman, he was thrust into the return game in the 2006 regular season finale at Tulsa because of injuries and he returned three kicks for 45 yards.

ABOUT THE TULSA GOLDEN HURRICANE

Tulsa (8-2, 5-1 C-USA) jumped out to an 8-0 start and ranked among the nation's Top-25 teams on two different occasions, but back-to-back losses on the road at Arkansas (30-23) and Houston (70-30) have the Golden Hurricane fighting for the top spot in Conference USA's West Division. Tulsa has scored 50 or more points in five games this season, including 77 vs. UTEP.

Tulsa enters the Tulane game as the nation's leader in total offense (583.80) and passing efficiency (112.90), and ranks first among C-USA teams in rushing (241.70), scoring (51.40), rushing defense (124.60) and sacks (31.0).

Senior **David Johnson** directs the Golden Hurricane offense and the first-year starter has completed 66.2 percent of his pass attempts (190-287) for 3,254 yards and 37 touchdowns.

Senior running back **Tarrison Adams** has rushed for a team-high 750 yards on 137 carries and five scores.

Senior receiver **Brennan Marion** leads the team in receptions (35) and yards (962) and is one of four receivers with 30 or more catches this season.

Defensively, junior linebacker **Mike Bryan** leads the team in tackles with 85 (40 solo), while classmate **James Lockett** has a team-high 11.5 tackles for lost yardage and 7.5 sacks.

Green Wave Game Notes

SERIES & NOTES:

- Saturday's game marks fifth all-time meeting between Tulane and Tulsa and the Golden Hurricane leads the series, 3-1.

- The Green Wave is 0-1 against the Hurricane in Tulsa after falling 38-3 in the 2006 season finale.

- Tulane's only win in the series came during the inaugural meeting between the teams in 1968. The Green Wave topped the Golden Hurricane 25-15 at Tulane Stadium.

- Tulsa is 3-0 against Tulane since becoming a Conference USA member in 2005. The first meeting between the two schools as league rivals was in 2005, but due to Hurricane Katrina the game was played in Monroe, La., where Tulsa topped the Wave 38-14.

THE LAST TIME AGAINST TULSA

A year ago, Golden Hurricane quarterback Paul Smith completed 18-of-27 passes for 319 yards and three scores as the Tulane dropped a 49-25 decision to Tulsa in the Louisiana Superdome.

Senior running back **Matt Forté** saw his string of 200-plus yard rushing efforts halted at four, but still ran for 103 yards on 26 carries. Junior wideout **Brian King** posted a career-high 91 receiving yards and a touchdown on four receptions, and sophomore wide receiver **Jeremy Williams** tied his career high with six catches for an additional 76 yards through the air.

TIES THAT BIND

- Tulane offensive line coach **Mark Hutson** served in the same capacity at Tulsa from 2000-02 under then head coach Keith Burns.

- Tulane Director of Athletics **Rick Dickson** played football and graduated from Tulsa in 1976 and later served as the director of athletics.

- Tulane-ISP Sports Properties General Manager **Marc Tuttle** was an assistant athletic director at Tulsa from 2000-07.

THE COACHES:

Tulane: Bob Toledo (San Francisco State, 1968) is in his second season as the head coach of the Green Wave. Toledo has a 6-16 mark at Tulane and a career record of 84-84 in 15 years as a Division I head coach. He became the 37th head coach in school history on Dec. 11, 2006, and has coached in 13 bowl games, including seven traditional New Year's Day bowls.

Toledo led TU to a 4-8 record during his rookie season with the Wave. However, three of Tulane's losses were by a combined total of nine points. His previous head coaching stint was at UCLA (1996-2002), where he led the Bruins to two Pac-10 titles, a school-record 20-game win streak, two final top-10 national rankings and was twice named the Pac-10 Coach of the Year.

Tulsa: Todd Graham (East Central [Okla.], 1987) is in his second season as the head coach of the Golden Hurricane and has a record of 18-6 at the school, and all-time record of 25-12 in three seasons as a head coach.

Graham was a defensive coordinator for the Golden Hurricane under previous head coach Steve Kragthorpe (now at Louisville) from 2003-05. Graham left Tulsa after the 2005 season to become the head coach at Rice University, where he directed the program to a 7-6 overall record and the school's first bowl appearance in 45 years during his lone season with the Owls. For his efforts, he was named the 2006 C-USA Coach of the Year.

Graham returned to Tulsa following Kragthorpe's departure and has led the Hurricane to a 10-4 record, a runner-up finish in the C-USA Championship game and a victory over Bowling Green in the GMAC Bowl.

TULANE'S KROPOG INVITED TO SENIOR BOWL

Troy Kropog, a three-year starter on the offensive line for Tulane, has been invited to participate in the 60th Annual Senior Bowl, taking place on Saturday, January 24, 2009, in Mobile, Ala. Kropog, an offensive tackle, has started 34 of his 40 career games for the Green Wave. He was also named honorable mention All-Conference USA in 2007. Kropog becomes the 43rd Tulane player to earn an invitation to the Senior Bowl since its inception in 1950, and the eighth since 2000.

Of Tulane's 43 previous Senior Bowl participants, 35 have been drafted by NFL teams and 32 have gone on to play professional football. The game will be nationally-televised by the NFL network and is set for 6:00pm kick-off.

A JACK OF ALL TRADES

A year ago, redshirt sophomore **Cody Sparks** was played in 11 games at line-backer on the Tulane defense and actually earned one starting assignment against Southeastern Louisiana. Fast forward to the 2008 season, and Sparks is Tulane's top receiving tight end with 15 grabs for 173 yards, and he registered his first career rush last week against UAB with a five-yard carry.

Sparks made the transition from defense to offense last spring and has emerged as an additional receiving threat in the receiving corps. He has played in 10 games with three starts and registered his best receiving day with three receptions for 55 yards, including a 37-yard hook up with **Kevin Moore** against Louisiana-Monroe.

THEVENOT QUIETLY HAVING SOLID SEASON AS A PUNTER

Junior **Ross Thevenot's** name isn't mentioned among the nation's best punters, but it's not for a lack of effort, instead it's more of a lack of opportunity. Thevenot has handled the punting chores for the Green Wave since midway through the Alabama game in the season opener and has punted 34 times for 1,574 yards. He has 12 punts of 50+ yards, placed 13 inside the 20 and has a long of 71 yards.

However, despite his 46.3 punting average, Thevenot doesn't have enough attempts to rank among the nation's top punters this week. The NCAA statistics require a punter to average 3.6 punts per game, which would require Thevenot to have at least 36 total punts this season. If Thevenot had two more punts this season, his average would rank third nationally.

KING CONTINUES TEAR

During the first half of the season, senior receiver **Brian King** registered 16 receptions for 183 yards, which placed him third on the team in both receptions and yards. However, over the last four games King has gone on a tear with 17 catches for 240 yards, and now ranks first on the team in receptions and second in receiving yards. King produced the best day of his career with 103 yards on seven receptions vs. Rice and finished with 74 yards on three catches last week against UAB. He has seven receptions of over 20 yards this season, including the longest pass play of the year with a 57-yard strike from **Kevin Moore** against Louisiana-Monroe.

ANDERSON NAMED A DOAK WALKER AWARD CANDIDATE; SUFFERS SEASON ENDING INJURY AGAINST RICE

Tulane junior running back **Andre Anderson** will miss the remainder of the 2008 season after he sustained a season-ending injury to his right shoulder during the second quarter of the Green Wave's game against the Rice Owls.

Anderson was recognized as one of the nation's premier running backs with his selection to the 2008 Doak Walker Award Candidate List, becoming the third Tulane player to be named to the watch list in the last six years, joining 2007 candidate and current Chicago Bears rookie **Matt Forte** and 2003 honoree and current Pittsburgh Steelers running back **Mewelde Moore**.

Despite missing most of the Rice game due to an injury suffered in the first half, Anderson currently ranks eighth nationally and first among Conference USA players in rushing yards per game (123.43) and is 24th in the nation and fifth in C-USA for all-purpose yards per contest (152.29). He rushed for 100 or more yards in four games and owns two of the nation's top 11 rushing performances this season with 255 yards at UTEP (6th) and 219 yards vs. SMU (11th).

MITCHELL EMERGES AS TU'S GO-TO GUY

It took **Alan Mitchell** two years to get on the field, but the redshirt sophomore is making the most of his opportunity. Mitchell, who received a redshirt as a true freshman in 2006 and did not play last season as a redshirt freshman, has played in six games this season and has 14 receptions for 169 yards and a touchdown, and he has carried the ball six times for 49 yards.

Mitchell's first career reception was a touchdown against SMU in the fourth game of the year and he has caught at least one pass in every game he has played (He did not see action against UTEP).

His best game of the year was at Houston, where he led the team with five catches for 72 yards, including a 44-yard grab from **Kevin Moore**, and he carried the ball one time for a career-long 28-yard rush to finish with 100 all-purpose yards. He is averaging 13.7 yards per rush and 12.6 yards per reception this season.



FIRST YEAR SUCCESS

Junior **Corey Sonnier** has blossomed into a solid defender for the Green Wave during his first season as a full time starter. Sonnier entered his third season at Tulane with a combined four tackles as his only defensive statistics through his first two years. However this season, he has started all 10 games and leads the team in tackles with 75 (40 solo), and has added six pass breakups, three forced fumbles and one fumble recovery to his resume.

Sonnier has registered three contests with 10 or more stops, including 13 tackles at UTEP, and he forced two fumbles and made one recovery at Houston.

TULANE'S M-A-S-H UNIT

Tulane's 2008 roster has gone from a team that held the nation's current No. 1 team Alabama to 172 total yards and battled No. 13 East Carolina to the wire to a roster that resembles more of a MASH unit. The Green Wave has lost 13 players to season-ending injuries this season.

WHERE DID ALL THE TOUCHDOWNS GO?

With Tulane devastated with so many injuries, the Green Wave has lost three players who accounted for 15 of the team's 22 total touchdowns. **Andre Anderson** led the team in scoring with eight touchdowns, while **Jeremy Williams** accounted for five scores and **Albert Williams** had two touchdowns. All three players are lost for the season.

J.T. McDonald (2), **Nathan Austin** (2), **Casey Robottom**, **Alan Mitchell** and **Travis Burks** are the only active players who have scored a touchdown this season.

STREAKIN'

Senior **Michael Batiste** might rank fourth on the team with 18 receptions for 184 yards this season, but he is the only player on the team to catch at least one pass in every game in 2008. Batiste's last game without a reception was last year's season finale at East Carolina. He has a season-high three catches in three different games this fall with his best day coming against UL-Monroe (3 rec.; 53 yds).

Junior **Logan Kelley** began the year on a strong note with four sacks and two forced fumbles during the first three games of the season. However, Kelley suffered a mid-season lull with no sacks or forced fumbles in four straight games, but has returned to form in the last three games with three sacks and a forced fumble. He ended his drought with a sack and a FF at No. 15 LSU and then sacked Houston's quarterback twice.

Kelley has 7.0 sacks, the most on the team since Floyd Dorsey's 9.5 in 2002, and Kelley's total this season ranks fifth among C-USA players and 29th nationally.

BALL HAWKS

The defensive trio of juniors **Travis Burks**, **Corey Sonnier** and senior **David Skehan** has a knack for getting their hands on the ball and disrupting opponents' offenses. The group has combined for nine turnovers (3 Int; 3 ff; 3 fr) with Burks (2) and Skehan (1) combining for three interceptions, Sonnier has three forced fumbles and one recovery and Skehan has two recoveries.

Two weeks ago at Houston, Skehan scooped up his fifth career fumble recovery.

Junior **Reece Thomas** and redshirt freshman **Cedric Wilson** saw their first action against #14 East Carolina, while redshirt freshman **Dominique Dade** took the field for the first time in his career against ULM.

Redshirt freshman **Chandler Davis** made his collegiate debut against Army, while true freshman **Emmanuel Aluko** played in his first college game at UTEP.

Of the 20 freshmen to play, three walk-ons- Reece, Gaspard and CoBell- have earned playing time for their practice performances.

FULL HOUSE FRESHMEN BACKFIELD

With injuries to several of Tulane's upperclassmen, the Green Wave has been forced to plug in true freshman and redshirt freshman into the line up. In TU's last three games at 15th-ranked LSU, Houston and at home vs. UAB, TU has started true freshmen **Nathan Austin** (RB) and **Harris Howard** (LG) and **Kasey Stelly** (FB). Redshirt freshmen **J.T. McDonald** saw extensive action vs. UAB, while **Joe Kemp** (QB) also saw significant time against the Tigers and at Houston before suffering a season-ending injury, giving the Wave and all freshmen backfield on numerous occasions.

SEVEN TULANE FOOTBALL STANDOUTS NAMED TO PHIL STEELE'S MID-SEASON ALL C-USA FOOTBALL TEAM

Phil Steele Publications has announced his mid-season picks Conference USA's top performers and Tulane was well-represented with seven candidates. Green Wave anchors running back **Andre Anderson** and guard **Michael Parenton** were named to the first team, while tackle **Troy Kropog**, defensive end **Reggie Scott** and linebacker **Evan Lee** earned second team defense distinctions. **Jeremy Williams** and **Julian Shives-Sams** earned third team offense and defense honors, respectively.

ANDRE THE GIANT

Andre Anderson rushed for 100 or more yards in four straight games, including two 200+ yard outbursts before suffering a season-ending injury.

Anderson' 864 rushing yards (174 att.) placed him 11th place on Tulane's single-season rushing leaders. Anderson finished with 12 yards on the ground before suffering his season-ending injury against Rice but managed to pass **Matt Forte** (2006, 859) and **Marvin Lewis** (1981, 860).

Anderson's 72-yard touchdown run at UTEP was the longest play from scrimmage for the Green Wave this season, a career-long for Anderson and the longest Tulane run since Matt Forte's 77-yard scamper at SMU on Oct. 20, 2007.

TULANE'S PARENTON NAMED TO WUERFFEL TROPHY WATCH LIST

Tulane senior center **Michael Parenton** has been named to the 2008 Wuerffel Trophy Watch List, which marks the second time in his career he has been a candidate for the prestigious award. He was also a consideration in 2006.

A native of Thidodaux, La., Parenton has started every game over the last two years on the offensive line, including every game this season at center. He has started 22 straight games and 42 of 45 games for his career. Parenton is a two-time All-Conference USA performer and was a C-USA All-Freshman team performer in 2004.

Named after former Heisman Trophy winner Danny Wuerffel, the Wuerffel Trophy is presented annually to the Football Bowl Subdivision player that best combines exemplary community service, with academic and athletic achievement.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES

- Sophomore offensive guard **Andrew Nierman** prepped at John Curtis High School and blocked for highly-touted USC freshman running back Joe McKnight. Together the two offensive players led JCHS to a combined record of 50-3 with three state championships during his final three seasons. During his senior season, he helped lead the way for one of the nation's top prep offenses as the Patriots amassed 4,310 yards and 58 touchdowns.

- Freshman **Rich Bell's** father, Richard, was an All-America football player at Rhode Island and had NFL stints with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and San Diego Chargers.

- Freshman **Alex Lauricella's** uncle, Hank, was an All-America football player at Tennessee.

- Freshmen **Chris Asumnu** and **Emmanuel Aluko** are not only classmates at Tulane, but were also prep teammates at Houston's (Texas) Alief Elsik High School.

- **Chris Asumnu** brings a talented athletic lineage to Tulane. His sister, Gloria, was a multi All-America track athlete for the Green Wave, while his brother, Stanley, played both football and basketball at Tennessee and is a member of the Rio Grande Valley Vipers of the NBA Developmental League.

- Tulane assistant coach **Greg Jackson** was a four-year letterwinner at LSU from 1985-88, and garnered first-team All-SEC and All-America honors in 1988. He helped lead the Tigers to two conference titles and four straight bowl appearances. Jackson was drafted by the NFL's New York Giants in 1989 and helped that team to a Super Bowl title in 1991. He spent 12 years in the NFL and played with the Giants, Philadelphia Eagles, New Orleans Saints and San Diego Chargers.

- Tulane offensive line coach **Mark Hutson** has spent 16 years in collegiate coaching. However, he is most noted for scoring a touchdown on a Fumblerooski in the 1988 Orange Bowl against Miami (Fla.). As an All-America guard at Oklahoma against Miami in the fourth quarter of the 1988 Orange Bowl, Hutson picked up the ball after Sooners quarterback Charles Thompson had taken the snap and laid it on the ground and rambled 29 yards for a touchdown. However, OU lost the game for the national championship 20-14.

- Tulane wide receivers coach **Thomas "TD" Woods** completed his collegiate career at Tennessee as the Volunteers' single-season and career receiving leader. Woods was a two-time All-Southeastern Conference selection.

• Named the 37th head coach in the 112-year history of the Tulane football program on Dec. 11, 2006.

• Has a 6-16 record at Tulane.

• Sports an overall record of 84-84 in 15 seasons as a collegiate head coach.

• Coached in his 150th game on Sept. 29, 2007, against No. 2 LSU.

• Since Toledo took over at Tulane, the Green Wave has averaged 172.2 rushing yards per game with 2,412 in 2007 and 1,205 yards this season.

• Despite a 4-8 record during his first season at Tulane, Toledo still managed to lead the Wave into the national spotlight. Under his offensive philosophy, senior tailback Matt Forté rushed for a school record 2,127 yards, the seventh-best single season total in NCAA history, and he became the 12th player to surpass the 2,000-yard rushing plateau in a single year. Forté earned numerous All-America honors, including second team All-America honors, and was among the contenders for the Heisman Trophy, the Doak Walker and Maxwell Awards, and was named the national player of the week twice in his lone season under Toledo.

• Brings more than 30 years of collegiate coaching experience to the Green Wave football team, including head coaching stints at Cal Riverside (15-6 with two championships from 1974-75), University of the Pacific (14-30 from 1979-82) and UCLA (1996-2002). He has coached in 13 bowl games during his career, including seven of the traditional New Year's Day bowls.

• Spent seven years (1996-2002) as the head coach at UCLA where he compiled a 49-32 record overall. The Bruins produced a school-record 20-game winning streak, plus two Pac-10 titles, one Rose Bowl appearance and non-conference victories over Texas (twice), Alabama (twice), Michigan, Ohio State and Texas A&M.

• Under Toledo, UCLA went 10-2 in 1998, climbing to No. 2 in the national polls. The Bruins finished the regular season ranked fifth nationally in scoring offense (40.5) and eighth in total offense (482.6). They set school records for total offense (5,487 yards), passing yards (3,658) and passing touchdowns (29) and Toledo was a finalist for three Coach of the Year awards.

• The 1997 UCLA team finished 10-2 and ranked No. 5 in the nation after rallying to defeat Texas A&M in the Cotton Bowl. The Bruins trailed the Aggies 16-0 before making a dramatic second-half comeback to win 29-23. UCLA averaged 40.7 points and more than 430 yards during the regular season.

• Prior to becoming UCLA head coach in January of 1996, Toledo was the Bruins' offensive coordinator for two seasons (1994-95) under Terry Donahue. Offensive tackle Jonathon Ogden won the Outland Trophy and tailback Karim Abdul-Jabbar was first team All-America in 1995.

• Served as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for R.C. Slocum at Texas A&M for five years (1989-93). During that span, the Aggies posted a gaudy 49-12-1 record with three Southwest Conference titles and five straight bowl games, including three consecutive Cotton Bowl appearances. His 1990 Aggie offense still holds the school record for total yards in a single game (774 yards on 76 plays against Louisiana-Lafayette) and season game average with 471.1 yards per game that year.

• Toledo served as the offensive coordinator at Oregon for six seasons (1983-88), and helped tutor two of the Pac-10's most productive quarterbacks - Chris Miller and Bill Musgrave.

• Before his head coaching stint at Pacific, Toledo guided the secondary under John Robinson at Southern Cal from 1976-78. The Trojans went 31-6 in three seasons and were co-national champs after the 1978 campaign. Toledo's most heralded pupils included Dennis Thurman, Ronnie Lott and Dennis Smith.

• Toledo's first collegiate head coaching position was at Cal Riverside from 1974-75. The Highlanders were 15-6 and captured a pair of California Collegiate Athletic Association championships.

Tuscaloosa, Ala. - What could have been a special night for the upset-minded Tulane Green Wave became a missed opportunity thanks to the Alabama special teams units. The No. 13 (AP/No. 17 USA Today) Crimson Tide used a pair of returns from their punt team to hold off Tulane, 20-6, Saturday at Bryant-Denny Stadium in Tuscaloosa.

The Green Wave (0-1) held the Alabama offense to just one touchdown, but two mistakes on the first quarter -an 87-yard punt return for touchdown by Javier Arenas and a 17-yard punt block return for touchdown by Chris Rogers- were the difference making plays for the Crimson Tide (2-0).

Tulane held a 318-172 advantage in total yardage over an Alabama team which racked up 419 yards against No. 9 Clemson last weekend. The Green Wave defense turned in four sacks and a forced fumble while holding the Crimson Tide to under 100 yards rushing.

"First, my hat's off to Alabama," Toledo said. "They are a great football program. Nick's (Saban) is doing a nice job and he has a lot of good young football players. I'm proud of our team's effort. Our kicking game really let us down tonight. They returned a punt for a touchdown. They blocked a punt and returned for a touchdown, and we missed two field goals. Our red zone offense wasn't very good either and that's a credit to them. They did a good job of keeping us out of the end zone."

Redshirt sophomore quarterback Kevin Moore completed 28-of-49 passing attempts in his first career start for 225 yards without an interception. Eleven different players caught passes for the Green Wave, which was led by senior wide out Brian King's six receptions for 51 yards. Junior wide receiver Jeremy Williams and junior tailback André Anderson each caught four passes. Anderson led the Green Wave on the ground, with 32 yards, while freshman running back Nathan Austin chipped in 24 yards on five carries.

In the first half, Tulane owned a 166-38 advantage in total offense, and held an 8-5 edge in first downs. Tulane also led in time of possession, but it was the special teams' play that put the Wave behind the Tide. Arenas broke Alabama's single-game return yardage mark in the first half.

"All in all, I think we did pretty well but we have some work to do," Burks said. "We know the car is running and now we just need to tune it up. We made some mistakes that people in the stands probably wouldn't have noticed, but for us it was a big blow. We need to do better. I think Alabama held some things back that we prepared for during the week. I think we had a pretty good game plan against them and we came out and executed, but we didn't come out on top."

Alabama rolled up 262 return yards, 171 off of seven punt returns, and the 'Bama defense kept the Green Wave out of the end zone in three red-zone attempts.

Junior safety Corey Sonnier, senior linebacker Evan Lee, and sophomore linebacker Devin Holland led Tulane with seven tackles each, while Burks, junior end Logan Kelley, sopho-

more tackle Justin Adams and senior corner Josh Lumar each put Alabama quarterback John Parker Wilson on his back for a sack. Lumar also added a pair of pass breakups. Ingram led all rusher with 63 yards on the ground for the Crimson Tide on 11 carries. Wilson completed just 11-of-23 for 73 yards and no touchdowns. NEW ORLEANS - For the second-straight week, the Tulane football team went toe-to-toe with a top 15 team, but once again Tulane failed to deliver the knock-out blow. The Green Wave led 24-21 in the fourth quarter against No. 14 East Carolina, but a 24-yard touchdown pass with 1:41 remaining in the game helped the Pirates escape the Superdome with a 28-24 victory.

Tulane junior running back André Anderson ran for two touchdowns, and gained 82 yards on the ground while red-shirt sophomore quarterback Kevin Moore threw for a career-best 236 yards, including a touchdown.

Three times, Tulane answered Pirates touchdowns with touchdowns of their own before finally taking the lead in the fourth quarter on a field goal by junior kicker Ross Thevenot. But the Pirates responded in the waning minutes with their late score to drop the Green Wave to 0-2 overall and 0-1 in Conference USA. East Carolina improves to 3-0 on the season, 1-0 in C-USA. The Pirates were led by Patrick Pinkney's 260-yard passing effort, which included two touchdowns on 22-of-32 attempts.

The Tulane defense pounded Pinkney for five sacks by five different players, and the Wave forced four fumbles, recovering three. Senior defensive end Reggie Scott led the Green Wave defense, turning in a sack and his first career interception. Senior linebacker Evan Lee recorded a sack and a fumble recovery, while sophomore linebacker Logan Kelley forced two fumbles.

But once again, an early special teams' play bit Tulane. After a scoreless first, the Pirates' C.J. Wilson blocked a field goal attempt from Thevenot, and Quentin Cotton scooped it up and returned the ball 44 yards for a touchdown for a 7-0 lead early in the second quarter.

Kelley forced the ball free from ECU running back Jon Williams and Lee recovered the fumble for the Wave at the 10 yard line. On third and one, Anderson took the ball up the middle untouched for his third career rushing score, to tie the game at 7-7. For the second-straight week, Tulane kept a top 15 team's offense out of the end zone in the first half. The Wave held East Carolina to just 76 yards in the first half, and owned a 21:46 to 8:14 edge in time of possession.

East Carolina opened the second half with a 10-play, 49-yard drive capped by a three-yard touchdown run by Brandon Simmons. But the Wave struck back, as Williams got behind the ECU safety for a 47-yard touchdown reception from Moore. Williams hauled in the second-and-10 pass at the five and trotted in to tie the game at 14-14 with 8:04 left in the third quarter.

Four plays later, the Pirates' Norman Whitley took a screen pass from Pinkney, and with a caravan traveled 51-yards to the house for a 21-7 lead, on what capped a string of 11 consecutive completions from Pinkney. Moore found Williams again for a 50-yard gain to the ECU 19, splitting double coverage with a catch in traffic. Anderson took in his second touchdown of the day, also from one yard out, to knot the game once again, at 21-21 with 2:51 left in the third.

On a swing pass to the outside, senior corner Josh Lumar forced an ECU fumble, and senior safety David Skehan recovered the ball at the ECU 31. After Anderson's 13-yard rush, Moore found sophomore fullback Jordan Stephany on an 11-yard gain down to the six, setting up first and goal as the third quarter came to a close. The East Carolina defense held their ground, holding the Wave to a field goal. Thevenot's 28-yarder gave Tulane its first lead of the game, 24-21 with 13:40 left.

After a 27-yard Pinkney pass to Darryl Freeney, Pinkney ran a keeper down to the Tulane 34-yard line. The Pirates converted on third down for just the third time in the game, keeping the

NEW ORLEANS - Junior running back André Anderson ran for a career-high 157 yards and a touchdown and junior safety Corey Sonnier posted a career-high 10 tackles as the Tulane University football team used a complete-team effort to defeat Louisiana-Monroe, 24-10, Saturday afternoon in the Louisiana Superdome.

Anderson posted his first career 100-yard game, while sophomore quarterback Kevin Moore threw for a career-best 272 yards on 19-of-32 passing. Sonnier, meanwhile, paced a Green Wave (1-2) defense that posted four sacks on the day while limiting the Warhawks (1-3) to 182 yards of total offense. In addition, the Green Wave defense held ULM to a 1-for-10 performance in third-down conversions.

The Green Wave got off to a fast start as junior Jeremy Williams brought the opening kickoff back 44 yards, Moore connected with sophomore tight end Cody Sparks for a 37-yard gain on the first play from scrimmage, and Anderson scored from nine yards out three plays later to put Tulane on top 7-0 just 1:50 into the ballgame.

Two drives later, Tulane doubled its advantage when freshman running back Albert Williams took an end-around handoff from Moore, darted up the right sideline and broke a couple of tackles along the way for a 37-yard score. A 24-yard field goal by junior kicker Ross Thevenot put the Wave on top, 17-0, with seven seconds left in the first half to give the home team the lead at the break.

Junior cornerback Charles Harris thwarted UL-Monroe's first drive of the second half with an interception, but the Warhawks were able to put together a seven-play, 50-yard drive during their second possession to give kicker Radi Jabour the opportunity to split the uprights from 47-yards out to make it a 14-point ballgame.

The Tulane offense, however, all but sealed the win in the opening drive of the fourth quarter when Moore connected with Williams from 19 yards out to give the Green Wave a commanding 24-3 advantage. ULM cut the lead back to 14 with a 10-play, 74-yard drive on the ensuing possession, which culminated with a direct snap to Darrell McNeal for a four-yard touchdown, but that was the last time the Warhawks touched the football.

Tulane took over at its own 13 yard line following a Green Wave penalty with 5:36 left to play, and Anderson put the game away almost single-handedly. Anderson ran the ball on nine of the next 10 plays to account for 40 yards before Moore took a knee twice to spark the home team's celebration.

Anderson's rushing total came on a career-best 38 carries, which ranks tied for fifth in Tulane single-game history. He also hauled in a pair of passes for 20 yards to give him 177 yards of total offense for the day.

Williams led the Green Wave aerial attack with six receptions for 49 yards and a score,

NEW ORLEANS - Junior RB André Anderson ran for a career-best 219 yards and sophomore QB Kevin Moore posted the first three-touchdown performance of his career as Tulane defeated Conference USA foe SMU, 34-27, at the Louisiana Superdome. The Green Wave scored 31 points in the first half courtesy of Moore's three scoring strikes, an Anderson touchdown jaunt and a 32-yard field goal by junior Ross Thevenot to take a 24-point lead into the locker room at the break. In the second half, the Mustangs rallied for a pair of touchdown passes by Bo Levi Mitchell and two field goals by Thomas Morestead. The first-half advantage, however, proved to be the difference in the ballgame.

For the third consecutive week, Anderson was the Green Wave's workhorse as he carried the ball 36 times and finished the day with 257 all-purpose yards - the seventh-most in Tulane single-game history - after hauling in four passes for another 38 yards through the air.

Ninety-three of his rushing yards came in the first half on 17 carries, while Anderson galloped for another 126 yards after halftime. With Tulane clinging to a seven-point lead late in the ballgame, Anderson put the game away with a 40-yard run to give the Green Wave a first down, which allowed the team to run out the clock.

Moore's favorite target on the evening was junior WR Jeremy Williams, who hauled in six passes for 124 yards and two touchdowns. Williams' 51-yard touchdown reception two and a half minutes into the second quarter put Tulane on top 17-0, but SMU got on the board just over two minutes later when Mustang QB Bo Levi Mitchell found Aldrick Robinson streaking down the left sideline for a 45-yard scoring strike.

The Green Wave responded with a six-play, 71-yard drive on the ensuing possession with culminated on a one-yard touchdown plunge by Anderson, and Moore found Williams again - this time from 21 yards out - with 2:15 remaining in the first half to give Tulane a commanding 31-7 lead.

The second half, however, was a much different ballgame as SMU capitalized on a pair of Tulane turnovers to claw their way back into the ballgame. A fumble on the opening possession of the third quarter led to a 25-yard Morestead field goal. Tulane had something going on its next drive, but SMU LB Justin Smart cut a route at the Mustang 10 yard line, and that led Morestead's second field goal of the stanza.

SMU's defense forced a Tulane punt, and the Mustang offense methodically moved 80 yards on six plays to cut the lead to 11 when Mitchell found Emmanuel Sanders from 18 yards out to make it a 31-20 ballgame. Tulane stretched the lead back to 14 on a 43-yard Thevenot field goal with 4:01 left in the game, but Levi connected

NEW ORLEANS - In the Green Wave's first game at Tad Gormley Stadium in four years, the Tulane football team was out-rushed 291-156 as the Army Black Knights rolled to a 44-13 win Saturday in front of a crowd of 23,749 outdoors in City Park. Junior running back André Anderson was over 100 yards for the third straight game, finishing with 107 yards on 21 carries with a touchdown, but the Wave couldn't overcome four turnovers and a pair of blocked kicks.

The Green Wave (2-3) gave up a season-high 291 yards rushing against the option offense of the Black Knights (1-4). Army attempted just five passes on the afternoon. Senior fullback Collin Mooney led the Black Knights with 187 yards on 19 carries and four touchdowns.

Army intercepted three Tulane passes, as the Green Wave could only find the end zone twice. Quarterback Kevin Moore was 22-of-35 on the day for 273 yards and a touchdown, but threw a pair of picks as Tulane fell to an unranked opponent for the first time this season.

Running the option, Army quarterback Chip Bowden attempted just five passes, completing four for 39 yards, and ran for another 51 yards.

Army got on the board in the first quarter after blocking a Tulane punt to take over deep in Green Wave territory. Collin Mooney accounted for all 22 yards on the drive, capping it with a four-yard touchdown for a 7-0 lead.

The Black Knights then forced a fumble by Moore, and Stephen Anderson scooped it up and returned it 81 yards for a touchdown with 5:24 to go in the first.

Mooney added a two-yard run to end a 42-yard drive, but Tulane corner Chinonso Echebelum blocked the PAT. Army added a 22-yard field goal with 5:38 to go in the first half for a 23-0 lead.

The Green Wave answered with a 73-yard drive, consuming 3:19 and punctuated by André Anderson's 1-yard touchdown plunge.

In the second half, the Wave opened with an onside kick attempt, but the Black Knights came away with good field position. The Tulane defense was able to force a three-and-out. On the ensuing Green Wave drive, Tulane threw an interception at midfield, but was bailed out by the defense again, which held Army on fourth-down at the 39 yard line.

Tulane then drove 61-yards to pay dirt, as Moore found Jeremy Williams for a 49-yard touchdown reception. The two-point conversion failed, as Army led 23-13 with 7:30 to go in the third quarter.

After holding the Black Knights, Dominique Dade set up the Wave at midfield with a 23-yard punt return to the Tulane 41. But the Tulane field goal attempt was blocked, and on the ensuing drive, Mooney scored on a 35-yard scamper

El Paso, Texas - André Anderson rushed for a career-high 255 yards and two touchdowns, the fourth most yards in a game in Tulane's history, but the UTEP Miners had the last word with a 24-21 win Saturday night at the Sun Bowl. The Miners' Trevor Vittatoe found Jeff Moturi for a 68-yard touchdown late in the fourth quarter to give the Miners a 24-21 victory.

Anderson racked up 255 yards on 29 carries, the second 200-yard rushing game of his career. Only Matt Forte has ever rushed for more yards in a single game. He also added a 28-yard touchdown reception, with four catches.

The Miners converted on seven of 14 third down tries, the most the Green Wave have given up all season. Vittatoe completed 21 of 32 attempts for 296 yards and three touchdowns for the Miners.

UTEP opened the game with an 80-yard touchdown drive, highlighted by a 53-yard pass from Trevor Vittatoe to Donavon Kemp down to the two yard line. On fourth and goal, Vittatoe found Landon Goodwell for his first career catch and a one-yard touchdown for a 7-0 Miners lead.

On fourth and seven, UTEP lined up for a 40-yard field goal and holder Kyle Wright rushed to the marker, but not over it as Tulane took over on downs.

Anderson broke a 72-yard touchdown run to tie the game at 7-7. The Green Wave used four plays to go 83 yards, and give Anderson his fourth straight game with a rushing TD.

The Green Wave's David Kirksey forced a fumble, which Dominique Dade recovered for Tulane in UTEP territory. Anderson then ran in a one-yard touchdown, capping a four-play, 24-yard drive, highlighted by Kevin Moore 14-yard catch, his first career reception. Brian King's found Moore for his first career completion on his first career passing attempt. On the ensuing drive, the Miners travelled 80 yards on 11 plays, scoring on an eight-yard pass from Vittatoe to Daniel Palmer to tie the game at 14-14 with 9:00 to go in the first half.

Anderson took the first play from scrimmage on the next drive and hustled 53 yards to the UTEP 27. On third and 11, Anderson took a screen pass 28 yards to the house, accounting for 81 yards on the 80-yard drive, giving the Green Wave a 21-14 lead. Tulane took that lead into the half. After a Tulane punt, UTEP converted another third-down to keep a drive alive, and then Jose Martinez hit a 28-yard field goal to cut the margin to 21-17.

Freshman fullback Kasey Stelly caught a pair of passes on the next drive, giving him a career-high in reception yards, but the Green Wave 45-yard field goal attempt was blown away in the rainy conditions. The Green Wave defense forced a UTEP punt, taking over at the Tulane 40, but the drive stalled with 5:13 to go at the UTEP 43 yard line. The Miners took over at their own 20, and drove 80 yards in just two plays and 44 seconds.

NEW ORLEANS - Despite a strong second half, Tulane couldn't overcome a poor start in a 42-17 loss to Rice. Redshirt freshman QB Joe Kemp completed 14 of 20 attempts for 201 yards and two touchdowns, all career highs and all in the second half, but the Green Wave couldn't overcome a 35-0 halftime deficit.

Rice quarterback Chase Clement racked up 168 yards through the air, on 20-of-25 with two touchdowns, and added 57 yards rushing and two scores on eight carries. Rice's C.J. Ugokwe carried the ball 18 times for 118 yards, his first career 100-yard rushing game, with one touchdown. Rice improves to 5-3 overall, and 4-1 in Conference USA, while Tulane falls to 2-5, 1-3 in C-USA.

The Owls jumped all over Tulane early, scoring on four of their first five possessions, while its defense held Tulane to just three yards in the first quarter, and 161 in the first half.

Kemp guided the Green Wave to a 17-7 advantage in the second half. Wide receiver Brian King grabbed seven balls for a career-high 103 yards. Casey Robotom added three catches for 66 yards, including a 42-yard touchdown. Nathan Austin added five grabs for 73 yards and led Tulane on the ground with 25 yards on 13 carries. Junior André Anderson had four first quarter carries for 12 yards but did not return to play the second half.

On the opening drive, Tulane's Devin Holland intercepted Clement, returning it 10 yards to the Rice 43-yard line. But the Owls forced a Green Wave punt. Rice then drove 95 yards on 16 plays, taking 8:48 off the clock before Clement found James Casey for a seven-yard TD strike. After the Wave went three-and-out, Rice quickly moved the ball down the field for a four-play, 60-yard drive in 1:26. Clement ran a quarterback keeper for a nine-yard touchdown run and a 14-0 lead. Tulane fumbled the kickoff, and Rice's Brandon Tolbert recovered to give the Owls a first and 10 from the 17. It took one play for Clement to find Casey on a slant pattern and his second touchdown grab of the day. Tulane picked up a first down on an 11-yard completion from Moore to Alan Mitchell. But then Moore threw an interception on the next play as Tulane attempted a flea-flicker pass. The Wave had an apparent sack on Clement, but Tulane was called for a facemask penalty when Clement's helmet popped off on the tackle. The seven-yard loss turned into a 15-yard gain for the Owls, and after a 21-yard run by C.J. Ugokwe, Clement ran the ball in from six yards out to cap the drive. The Green Wave moved the ball 26 yards on eight plays before punting, and the Owls punted the ball back from midfield. On fourth and one from their own 11-yard line, Tulane's Logan Kelley took a direct snap in punt formation, and surged ahead three yards on the fake punt for a Tulane first down on his first career rush. Nathan Austin took a screen pass 49 yards down to the Rice 20. But on the very next play, Robert Calhoun intercepted Moore at the 17-yard line.

After a Rice punt, Tulane moved the ball to the 23-yard line with two seconds left in the half, but Scott Solomon blocked the field goal attempt and Rice's Chris Jones scooped it up and took it 55 yards to the house for a 35-0 halftime lead.

In the second half, Kemp took over for Tulane and completed two of his first three attempts, moving the Green Wave down into Rice territory, setting up a 42-yard field goal by Ross Thevenot.

Kemp moved Tulane downfield after a Rice punt, hooking up with Robotom for a 42-yard touchdown. It was the longest completion and first touchdown of Kemp's career, and tied Robotom's career-long reception.

The Owls answered back as Casey ran for 47 yards on a third-and-one keeper, and Ugokwe punched it in from eight yards out.

Tulane drove 53 yards, highlighted by Kemp's 24-yard pass to Brian King down to the Rice six-yard line. But the Owls stopped Tulane at the one, taking over on downs with 11:11 to go in the game. After forcing Rice to go three-and-out, Kemp hit Albert Williams for an 18-yard touchdown pass off a screen. Williams' first career TD made it 42-17 with 6:45 to go.

The Green Wave defense held Rice again, and the Green Wave played its second-team in their remaining possession, a four-play, six-yard drive. Tulane's defensive backups then played the final 3:18.

BATON ROUGE, La. - The Tulane Green Wave were held to 159 yards of total offense, falling to No. 15 Louisiana State, 35-10, Saturday night at Tiger Stadium. Tulane's Travis Burks returned an interception 43 yards for the Green Wave's lone touchdown.

Burks, a junior linebacker, added three kickoff returns for 62 yards and a sack to go with two solo and two assisted tackles, but the Green Wave offense was kept out of the end zone all game.

LSU's Charles Scott rushed for 114 yards and a touchdown as LSU gained 235 yards on the ground to Tulane's 69. Tulane held LSU to 8-of-20 passing for 99 yards through the air, but the Wave completed 11-of-23 for only 91 yards.

The Green Wave fell to 2-6 overall, while LSU improves to 6-2 overall. The paid attendance of 92,136 was the second-highest in a game featuring the Green Wave, behind only Tulane's season opener at Alabama.

Tulane trailed by just 7-3 with three minutes to go in the first half, before the Tigers put in a touchdown pass and then returned a fumble for a touchdown just before halftime to seize control, 21-3 at intermission. The second half was defensive battle until the final minutes when LSU punched in a rushing touchdown.

"We lost to a really good football team. They are a good team and they are really physical," head coach Bob Toledo said. "I think we played as hard as we could have played, we just made too many mistakes. The turning point - if there was one - was when they took that fumble return in for a touchdown just before the half. Instead of a close game at the half, all the sudden we're down 21-3."

After Tulane went three-and-out on the opening possession, Scott drove the Tigers downfield by rushing for 79 of the Tigers' 86 yards on the drive. He broke a 56-yarder to move into Tulane territory, and then capped the drive with a seven-yard touchdown run.

The Green Wave moved into LSU territory on a 22-yard run by Albert Williams. Alan Mitchell's first career rush picked up 13 yards on an end-around, and gave Tulane a first down at the LSU 28. But the drive stalled, as the Green Wave settled for a 48-yard field goal by Ross Thevenot, tying the longest of his career.

Tulane forced an LSU punt, and after switching ends at the start of the second quarter, the Green Wave picked up a pair of first downs, one via trick play which led to a pass interference penalty. On back-to-back plays, Tulane tried quarterback sneaks, but didn't get the spot, turning it over on downs at the LSU 39 yard line.

The two teams traded punts, and LSU rode Scott down to the red zone, where Jarrett Lee found Brandon LaFell crossing in the end zone for a 14-yard touchdown and a 14-3 lead. After kicking off, LSU's Rahim Alem stripped Tulane quarterback Joe Kemp and Chris Hawkins returned it 24 yards for a touchdown.

Scott rushed for 114 yards in the first half, as LSU out-gained Tulane 174 to 107 in total offense in the first half.

In the second half, LaFell hauled in a 29-yard catch giving the Tigers first and goal, and LSU's Keiland Williams ran in the touchdown from three yards out for a 28-3 lead. LSU had a short field to go as the Wave attempted an on-side kick to open the half.

The Green Wave moved the ball 67 yards to the LSU 14, but missed a 31-yard field goal. LSU answered back with a drive down to the Tulane 30, but Logan Kelley recorded a 21-yard sack and the Green Wave forced a punt before the end of the third quarter.

Tulane thought it had a turnover when Philip Davis leveled the LSU punt returner as the ball arrived, but Trindon Holliday was ruled down before Davis wrestled the ball away. The Tigers drive to the 34 yard line, going for it on fourth down with a 28-3 lead, but Davis broke up the attempted pass as Tulane took over on downs.

The Green Wave punted, and Burks made two key plays on the next drive, first sacking Lee for a 12-yard loss and then intercepting Lee's third down attempt and taking it 43-yards to the house to cut the margin to 28-10.

Tulane held the Tigers to force a punt, but the Wave could get nothing going offensively, giving the ball back to LSU, which ran in a touchdown by Stevan Ridley with 1:18 to pile on the Green Wave.

Freshman running back Nathan Austin led the Green Wave on the ground with 53 yards

HOUSTON - The Houston duo of quarterback Case Keenum and running back Bryce Beall combined for over 500 yards to lead the Cougars over the visiting Green Wave, 42-14 in front of 23,522 at Robertson Stadium. Beall racked up 176 yards on 21 carries and scored three touchdowns, while Keenum finished the night, 29-40 with 384 yards in the air with four touchdowns.

Tulane (2-7, 1-4 C-USA) dropped its fifth straight game and suffered its third consecutive at Houston. Freshman running back Nathan Austin scored both of the Green Wave touchdowns, both of which came courtesy of a Houston turnover. Houston improved to 5-4 overall this season and 4-1 in Conference USA play.

"We played against a good football team tonight and we are a beat up and banged up squad," Tulane head coach Bob Toledo said. "We had a hard time scoring points and we are not stopping anyone right now so that's a bad combination. We had a chance to put some points on the board but we missed field goals and didn't score when we did get into the red zone. Defensively, we couldn't stop them and get them off the field. They had nearly 700 yards of total offense. We just couldn't stop them.

They did everything we practiced, both offensively and defensively. We ran some special plays to manufacture points and that didn't work either. We're a struggling football team right now. Our quarterback (Joe Kemp) broke his collar bone so we're a pretty decimated group as far as injuries go."

The Cougars offensive attack started early as they got on the board in the first possession. Beall skirted into the end zone with 8:34 to go in the first quarter on a six-play, 67-yard scoring drive. A Ben Bell kick completed the PAT attempt for the Cougars and they led 7-0 through the first quarter.

Tulane answered back early in the second quarter when linebacker David Skehan picked up his fifth career fumble, knocked loose by Corey Sonnier, and returned it five yards into Houston territory. The Green Wave offense took over and freshman Nathan Austin recorded his first career touchdown when he scored from 11 yards out to put Tulane on the board with 10:03 in the second quarter, and tied the game at 7-7.

The Cougars regained the lead on their next possession after Tyron Carrier returned Thevenot's kickoff 40 yards to the Houston 41-yard line to begin what would become a seven-play scoring drive. Keenum found Beall in the end zone for a 19-yard TD with 6:33 left in the first half. Bell's kick put Houston up 14-7.

Following a defensive stop, Houston capped off a 68-yard scoring drive when Beall scampered into the end zone after a pass interference call on Tulane gave Houston a first down on the Green Wave 2-yard line. Bell's kick was good and the Cougars extended their lead 21-7 with 3:27 to go in the first half.

Junior Travis Burks tallied his second career interception after picking off a Keenum pass with 31 seconds remaining in the first half. Burks returned the ball back for 31 yards, the second consecutive game in which he picked off a pass. Burks ran back an interception for a 42-yard touchdown last week against LSU.

The Cougars opened the second half with a four-play, 87-yard scoring drive that culminated in a 38-yard touchdown pass. Keenum found Chaz Rodriguez in the end zone and Bell's PAT kick was good, lengthening Houston's lead 28-7 with 13:31 to go in the third quarter.

Keenum became the first quarterback to throw for over 300 yards against the Green Wave this season when he found Mark Hafner in the end zone for a four-yard score with 3:31 to go in the third quarter. Bell's PAT attempt was good and Houston extended their lead 35-7. Trevor Vittatoe of UTEP previously held the record

for most yards in the air against Tulane this season, with 296.

Keenum's offensive show wasn't over, as he hit Tim Monroe for a 49-yard touchdown pass with 17 seconds left in the third quarter. The PAT kick off the foot of Bell made the score 42-7 in favor of Houston.

Austin scored his second career touchdown with 9:17 left in the ballgame on a five-play, 14-yard drive. Thevenot's kick was good, making it 42-14. Austin finished the night with 22 carries for 39 yards to accompany his two scores.

Tulane hosts UAB in their last home game of the season next Saturday, November 15.

NEW ORLEANS - Tulane's last home game of the season didn't prove to be lucky as the Green Wave fell to the UAB Blazers, 41-24 Saturday afternoon in the Superdome, dropping their sixth straight to fall to 2-8 (1-5 in C-USA). Tulane honored their 16 seniors prior to kickoff of the Conference USA match up. The 2008 graduating football class is made up of Michael Batische, James Dillard, Scott Elliott, Jordan Ellis, Craig Gelhardt, Justin Kessler, Brian King, Troy Kropog, Evan Lee, Josh Lumar, Michael Parenton, Reggie Scott, Julian Shives-Sams and David Skehan. Chris Dunn and Matt Harding joined the group as both players are seniors in their degree field.

As pregame honors wrapped up, UAB got down to business, scoring early and often. The Blazers got on the board first when quarterback Joe Webb led his offense 96 yards in 10 plays. Webb, who carried the ball 18 times for 130 yards, picked up 31 yards to get UAB in the end zone with 8:23 left in the first quarter. Swayze Waters' kick put the Blazers up 7-0.

Redshirt freshman J.T. McDonald scored his first collegiate touchdown on the next drive to put Tulane on the board. Ross Thevenot's PAT kick tied the game 7-7 with 4:02. McDonald, a redshirt freshman, surpassed his career carries and rushing yards in a game, finishing the contest with 12 carries for 41 yards, as well as setting new personal bests in a game for receptions (3) and receiving yards (67).

The Green Wave couldn't contain the Blazers' offense, as running back Rashaud Slaughter (15 carries for 58 yards) found the end zone on a 1-yard run with 9:09 left in the first half. The PAT kick was good to give UAB the advantage, 14-7.

"I feel like a broken record. A few things, first of all and they were obvious the turnovers hurt us," head coach Bob Toledo said. "The interceptions really put us in a bind and they ran one back for a touchdown, and they ran one back to the six-yard line. Earlier we had a guy open, but we threw to the wrong side and it got intercepted, and then we had a bunch of ball dropped and that doesn't help you. It takes you out of drives. Kevin (Moore) threw the ball probably as well as he has in a month. When you put the ball on the money, guys have to catch it. That's their job.

"The other thing is defensively, we didn't do a very good job of containing their run," Toledo added. "We had an opportunity to sack their quarterback several times, but he broke tackles behind the line of scrimmage. We missed way too many tackles."

The scoring seesaw continued when McDonald recorded his first collegiate touchdown reception on a 27-yard pass from Tulane quarterback Kevin Moore with 6:07 left in the first half. The PAT kick was good and Tulane tied the contest, 14-14. Two minutes later, a Blazer 41-yard field goal off the foot of Waters gave UAB a three yard cushion, 17-14, with 4:05 left to play in the first half.

The Blazers got their offense going again in the second half on a 3-yard run from Webb. The PAT kick was good, lifting UAB 24-14 with 9:14 left in the third quarter but McDonald wasn't finished visiting the end zone, running in for the score from 13 yards out with 6:47 left in the third quarter of play for his third TD of the game. The score brought Tulane within three, 24-21. The last Tulane player to score three touchdowns in a game was junior running back André Anderson on October 11, 2008 against UTEP.

UAB answered back on the ensuing drive when Webb scampered in on a 2-yard rush after taking the Blazers 65 yards on 11 plays. Webb, who finished the night 15-of-21 passing with 154 yards, extended the Blazers lead 31-21 with 1:44 left in the third quarter.

But Tulane got a chance to put some more points on the board with the help of place kicker Thevenot, who booted a career-long 50-yard field goal. The kick brought the Green Wave within seven, 31-24, with 12:10 left in the contest. The last time a Green Wave kicker connected for a 50-yard field goal was also against the Blazers, on October 23, 2004 by Nick Beucher.

Tulane got another chance to close the gap when junior defensive back Charles Harris recovered a fumble knocked loose by Justin Adams. The fumble recovery was the first in Harris' career. The Green Wave got the ball on the UAB 45 yard line but couldn't convert it into a score and turned the ball over on downs four plays later, which led to a Blazers field goal, putting them up 34-24 with 5:28 to go in the game. The Blazers scored again when Matt Taylor picked off Moore's pass and ran it 36 yards into the end zone, extending UAB's lead. The PAT was good, making it 41-24 with 3:34 left in the game, but that was the Blazers needed to close out the contest and take control of the series against Tulane 4-3.

The Green Wave will travel to Tulsa next Saturday to take on the Golden Hurricane. Kickoff is slated for 2pm.
