IT'S TULANE AND LSU FOR THE 98TH INSTALLMENT OF THE HISTORIC RIVALRY

• Tulane (2-5, 0-4 C-USA) makes its shortest trip of the year this Saturday and renews the oldest rivalry in school history when the team busses the 80 miles from New Orleans to Baton Rouge to take on No. 9/9 ranked LSU (6-1, 4-1 SEC) at Tiger Stadium in the 98th edition of the rivalry. The contest will kick-off at 7 p.m.

Saturday's game marks the Wave's third road game of the season and Tulane is 1-1 following a 17-16 win at Army on Oct. 4 and a 43-6 loss to Conference USA rival Southern Miss last week. The LSU match-up will be the final non-conference game of the year for the Wave and Tulane is 2-1 in non-league games in 2009, and has a mark of 20-17 against non-conference opponents (at the time of the competition) since the 2000 campaign.

LSU marks the third nationally ranked opponent for the Green Wave this season and Tulane is 0-2 after falling to No. 9/12 BYU (54-3) and No. 23/23 Houston (44-16).

TULANE-LSU BATTLE FOR THE RAG

The winner of the Tulane-LSU game traditionally received a banner known as "The Rag". The Rag is decorated half Tulane and half LSU with each school's logo on the respective sides. The Rag exchanged hands with each team's victory from the first game of the series in 1893 until 1981. The original "Rag" was lost between LSU's victory in 1980 and Tulane's win in 1981. Some speculate that "The Rag" was delivered to Tulane following the Green Wave's 1981 victory, but was destroyed in a fire at the Tulane Student Center prior to the 1982 game. A replacement flag was created in 2001 and was present in 2008 at Tiger Stadium.



TULANE-LSU GAME AVAILABLE ON TIGERVISION

• The Tulane-LSU rivalry game will be available to watch on a pay-per-view basis on TigerVision, LSU's school in-house pay-per-view network. Kickoff for the LSU-Tulane game on Oct. 31 in Tiger Stadium is scheduled for 7 p.m. The TigerVision pregame show starts at 6:45 p.m. The cost to purchase the game will be \$34.50.

Residents in Louisiana can purchase TigerVision through their local cable television system or through The Dish Network or DirecTV. Cable customers are reminded that they must have digital cable capabilities to order the games.

Residents outside the state may purchase the TigerVision broadcast through ESPN's Game Plan package. The ESPN Game Plan package will be blacked out in Louisiana.

ANDERSON RANKED FOURTH AMONG C-USA BACKS

Andre Anderson currently ranks fourth among the league's backs for rushing yards per game with 92.29. Anderson finished with 92 yards on 19 carries (6.0 ypr) last week at Southern Miss. He has two 100+ rushing games, including a season-high 199 yards vs. McNeese State.

Anderson is third on the team in receptions (20) and receiving yards (168) and is averaging 116.3 all-purpose yards per outing.

NOTING THE GREEN WAVE

- Senior running back **André Anderson** rushed 19 times for 92 yards and a touchdown last week at Southern Miss. Anderson's rushing total gives him 1,639 for his career, which moves him into 12th place in the Tulane record book. He surpassed Jovon Jackson, who rushed for 1597 from 2002-05, for 12th place and trails Terrence Jones (1,761 from 1985-88) by 122 yards for 11th place in Tulane career rushing yards.

- Redshirt-freshman quarterback **Ryan Griffin** started for the first time on last Saturday at Southern Miss and became the first rookie to start under center for Tulane since Scott Elliott started at Rice on Nov. 12, 2005. Griffin finished the day 21-of-33 for 158 yards and an interception.

- Senior safety **Chinonso Echebelem** leads the Wave in tackles with 10.0 per game (70 total; 42 solo), which ranks fourth among C-USA players and 15th nationally. Echebelem has four games with 10 or more tackles this season, including a season-best 13 vs. No. 23 Houston.

- Echebelem leads all C-USA players and ranks second nationally in forced fumbles with four. He is the first Tulane defender to force at least four fumbles in a season since Israel Route had four in 2006.

- Senior **Jeremy Williams** has caught at least one pass in his last 20 games. The last time Williams failed to record a catch was against LSU on Sept. 29, 2007, in the Louisiana Superdome. During his current streak, Williams has hauled in at least three passes on 16 occasions.

- After playing five of its first six games of the season at home, Tulane began the tough task of playing five of its last six games of the year on the road last week at Southern Miss. Following the contest at LSU, Tulane returns home on Nov. 7 to host UTEP on senior day and then will play Rice, UCF and SMU on the road to conclude the 2009 regular season.

- Junior **Andrew Nierman** has started every game of his career and will make his 32nd consecutive start vs. LSU, while the duo of senior **Adam Kwentua** and junior **Pete Hendrickson** will each make their 18th consecutive start and junior **Casey Robottom** will make his 14th straight start.

ABOUT THE TIGERS

LSU (6-1, 4-1 C-USA) jumped out to a 5-0 start and ranked as high as No. 4 nationally before the Tigers suffered their first loss of the season at the hands of top-ranked and defending national champion Florida, 13-3, at home on Oct. 10. Following a bye week, LSU dispatched Auburn, 31-10, last week. The Tigers have not lost a non-conference home game since Conference USA member UAB slipped out of town with a 13-10 victory in 2000.

Sophomore quarterback **Jordan Jefferson** spearheads the LSU passing attack, completing 112-of-176 attempts (.636) for 1,258 yards and nine touchdowns against just three interceptions.

Senior running back **Charles Scott** leads the ground game with 347 yards on 85 carries (4.1 ypr) and has two scores.

Junior **Terrance Toliver** has proven to be the team's top receiving threat with 34 catches for 442 yards and three touchdowns, while senior **Brandon LaFell** has hauled in six scores.

Junior linebacker **Kelvin Sheppard** has a team-best 57 tackles (27 solo), including 4.5 stops for lost yardage.

Green Wave Game Notes

SERIES & NOTES:

• Saturday's game marks the 98th all-time meeting between Tulane and LSU and the Tigers lead the series, 66-24-7, and has won the last 17 games with TU, including the last 10 meetings at Tiger Stadium.

• This is the oldest rivalry for Tulane. The two teams first played in 1893, the first football season for each school. Tulane and LSU met in November of that year, with the Greenies winning that game 34-0.

• Tulane's last win in the series came in 1982 when the Green Wave capped a 4-7 season with a 31-28 upset of the Orange Bowl-bound Tigers. TU trailed 28-24 late in the fourth quarter, but quarterback Mike McKay found fullback Reggie Reginelli open in the flat on fourth down for a 31-yard game-winning touchdown.

• One of the biggest Tulane win in the series came in 1981 when the Wave downed LSU, 48-7. TU blocked a punt to set up a touchdown and recovered another block in the end zone for another score. Tulane Hall of Famer and longtime NFL tight end Rodney Holman capped his career with a touchdown reception in that ball game.

• Tulane and LSU played every year from 1911-94 (with the exception of 1918 when LSU did not field a team due to World War I). The teams played single games in 1996 and 2001 and began a 10-year, home-and-home deal in 2006. However the contract will end this season as both Tulane and LSU have mutually agreed to discontinue the football series following the 2009 campaign. The two teams will play one more game in New Orleans at a future date.

THE COACHES:

Tulane: Bob Toledo (San Francisco State, 1968) is in his third season as the head coach of the Green Wave. Toledo has an 8-23 mark at Tulane and a career record of 86-91 in 16 years as a Division I head coach. He became the 37th head coach in school history on Dec. 11, 2006, and has coached in 13 bowl games, including seven traditional New Year's Day bowls.

His previous head coaching stint was at UCLA (1996-2002), where he led the Bruins to two Pac-10 titles, a school-record 20-game win streak, two final top-10 national rankings and was twice named the Pac-10 Coach of the Year.

LSU: Les Miles (Michigan, 1976) is in his fifth season at LSU and has record of 48-12 at the school and has a nine-year coaching mark of 76-33. Miles has seven bowl game appearances and one national title in nine seasons as a head football coach.

He came to LSU from Oklahoma State, where he led the Cowboys to a record of 28-21 in four seasons with three bowl game appearances. He was a two-year letterman at Michigan (1974, 1975) and helped the Wolverines to consecutive Big 10 titles and to the 1976 Orange Bowl.

TIES THAT BIND

• Two Green Wave players will be going home this Saturday when Tulane battles LSU in Baton Rouge, including senior defensive end **Adam Kwentua** (University HS) and redshirt receiver/quarterback **D.J. Ponder** (Catholic).

• Tulane linebackers coach **Greg Jackson** was a four-year letterwinner for the Tigers from 1985-88 and helped LSU to a mark of 36-10-2. He capped his collegiate career by claiming first team All-Southeastern Conference and All-America honors in 1988.

• Senior **Andre Anderson** teamed with a pair of LSU Tigers doing his prep career at Stephenson High School in Stone Mountain, Ga. Anderson and the LSU linebacker duo of **Perry Riley** and **Kelvin Sheppard** led SHS to a 12-2 record during their senior year.

TULANE AGAINST IN-STATE SCHOOLS

• When Tulane takes the field against LSU this Saturday, it will mark the 155th time in school history that the Green Wave has faced an in-state opponent. TU has a record of 75-72-7 against 12 current or former Louisiana schools with match-ups against the following teams:

TULANE-LSU: A LOUISIANA TRADITION

• The crowds at the Tulane-LSU games have been tops in both programs history as the 1973 (86,958 in Tulane Stadium) is the largest crowds to ever to see a home Tulane athletic home event. The 1979 attendance of 73,496 still stands as the largest college crowd in Tulane-LSU Superdome history. The announced crowd of 92,136 in Tiger Stadium in 2008 is the second-largest largest crowd to see a Tulane athletic event.

SEC TEAMS ARE COMMON OPPONENTS FOR TULANE

• Tulane has a rich history against the SEC. From 1933 to 1965, the Green Wave was a member of the SEC and captured the conference crown three times (1934, 1939 and 1949). When the Wave meets LSU this Saturday, it will mark the 488th all-time meeting against an SEC opponent. TU has an overall record of 184-279-24 against SEC members. Tulane has regularly scheduled SEC teams throughout its existence, including two current SEC members during TU's inaugural season of college football in 1893. TU hosted both LSU and Ole Miss that season and finished 1-1 with a 34-0 win of the Tigers and a 12-4 loss to the Rebels.

THE GREEN WAVE AGAINST RANKED OPPONENTS

Tulane has an all-time record of 19-110-2 against nationally ranked opponents. TU's last triumph over a ranked team was in 1982 against the then 12th-ranked LSU Tigers, 31-28, in Baton Rouge. Since then, the Green Wave is 0-37 against the Top-25. In its last game against a nationally-ranked opponent, Tulane fell in at home to No. 23 Houston, 44-16. TU is 0-4 all-time against No. 9 ranked opponents.

THE ONE-TWO PUNCH OF ANDERSON, WILLIAMS

• The Tulane duo of **Andre Anderson** and **Jeremy Williams** has each played a key role in leading the Wave this season. To date, Anderson and Williams have totaled 1,726 (Williams- 912; Anderson- 814) all-purpose yards on 211 combined touches, or 8.2 yards per play.

PLAYING WITH A PURPOSE

• Tulane's **Jeremy Williams** has evolved into one of the nation's top all-purpose players this season. Williams is averaging 130.3 all-purpose yards per outing, which ranks sixth among Conference USA players and is 44th nationally.

Williams is averaging 94.6 receiving yards (662 total), 3.5 rushing yards (95 total) and 22.1 per kickoff return (7 returns for 155 yards) per contest. He has touched the ball 80 times for 912 yards for an average of 11.4 yards per play.

Williams totals through seven games: 159 yards (139-rec/20-rush) vs. Tulsa, 60 yards (56-rec/4-rush) vs. No. 9 BYU, 232 yards (222-rec/10-rush) vs. McNeese State, 221 (108-rec/16-rush/97-kor) vs. Army, 70 (53-rec/-12-rush/29-kor) vs. Marshall, 108 yards (63-rec; 45 rush) vs. No. 23 Houston and 62 (21-rec/12-rush/29-kor). He also has two pass attempts and two solo tackles.

RUMBLIN', STUMBLIN' THROUGH THE DEFENSE

• Prior to the Army game, sophomore **Antoine Duplessis** had never touched the football in a game and had always been the primary blocker for the Tulane running backs. However, Duplessis has become very offensive from his fullback spot with 78 (52-rush/26-rec.) total yards and a score.

Duplessis made his first career reception in the second quarter of the Army game and then was handed the ball three times and turned 32 yards, including a career-long 26-yard gallop on Tulane's touchdown drive in the fourth quarter.

The following week ago vs. Marshall, the 6-2, 262-pounder rushed four times for 19 yards and caught one pass for a career-long 15 yards.

Two weeks ago against No. 23 Houston, Duplessis caught his first career touchdown on a four-yard pass from quarterback **Ryan Griffin**.

WILLIAMS PLAYS HIS WAY ON TO BILETNIKOFF LIST

• Tulane senior flanker **Jeremy Williams** is among the top-20 receivers listed on the Biletnikoff Award Watch List, which is presented annually to the nation's top receiver, for his performance this season.

Williams continues to burn opponents' secondary's this season with 44 receptions for 662 (15.0) yards and three touchdowns, and he has two 100-yard and one 200-yard receiving games. He currently ranks second among C-USA players and ranks 18th nationally for receiving yards per game with 94.47, while his 6.29 receptions per game ranks third in the league and is 25th nationally.

WILLIAMS WORKING HIS WAY UP THE RECORD LADDER

• **Jeremy Williams** continues to climb his way up the TU record book. He currently has 2,356 receiving yards on 157 catches (15.0 ypr) and 15 touchdown receptions.

- He ranks ninth for both receptions and receiving touchdowns and is sixth for receiving yards, while his eight 100-yard receiving games ranks fifth and his yards per reception is currently the fifth best in the TU annals.

- Williams needs one reception to move up to eighth place and is one score short of eighth place and is 103 yards shy of fifth place.

- He is the ninth player in school history to surpass 2,000 career receiving yards.

HEADING UP THE D-FENCE

• The Tulane defense starts with the foursome of senior linebacker **Travis Burks**, freshman linebacker **Shakiel Burks**, junior safety **Alex Wacha** and senior safety **Chinonso Echebelem**. The group has combined for 219 tackles (132 solo), including seven stops for lost yardage (-28 yards), and one quarterback sack. The group has also amassed six forced fumbles and four pass breakups.

Echebelem leads the team with 70 tackles and has a one interception, two PBUs and four forced fumbles.

Wacha is second in tackles with 56, while Burks is third in total stops with 54.

The newcomer Smith has been a pleasant surprise as a rookie with 39 tackles, which is the fourth-best effort on the team, and has a team-best three stops for lost yardage, one sack and one PBU. In fact, he was named the Louisiana Co-Defensive Player of the Week, as selected by the Louisiana Sports Writers Association on 10/6.

TULANE'S YOUTH MOVEMENT

• In a recent nationwide poll conducted by Sports Information Directors, Tulane has played the most true freshmen of any school in the nation this season with 18 rookies seeing playing time, including five who have at least one start this season.

In fact, a total of 24 freshmen (18-true; 6-redshirt) have played. Twelve true freshmen saw action in the season opener: **D.J. Banks**, **Ryan Grant**, **Jordan Garrett**, **Payten Jason**, **Shakiel Smith**, **Kevin Burris**, **Devin Figaro**, **Cody Ledford**, **Ryan Travis**, **Brock Sanders** and walk-on **Devon Walker**. Also making their Tulane debuts were redshirt freshmen **Darryl Farley** and **John Edwards**.

In the second game of the season, six more true freshmen saw the field for the first time in their collegiate careers, including **L.J. Abrams**, **Stephen Barnett**, **Shane Delery**, **Hunter Howden**, **Zach Morgan** and **Jordan Sullen**, while a pair of redshirt freshmen earned playing time for the first time: **Ryan Griffin** and **D.J. Ponder**, while **Austen Jacks** came off the bench against McNeese State.

A total of 70 Green Wave players have played this season and of the 70, 13 are sophomores and 23 of those are either true or redshirt freshmen, which means 36, or 56 percent of the team, are either first or second year players.

FRESHMEN PAY IMMEDIATE DIVIDENDS FOR GREEN WAVE

- Linebacker/Nickelback **Shakiel Smith** is the only freshman on the team to start every game this season and ranks fourth on the team in tackles with 39.

- Offensive guard **Zach Morgan** made his first collegiate start vs. McNeese State and has started the last four games.

- **Hunter Howden** made his first career start vs. McNeese State and also started at Army. He has played in five games this season.

- **Austen Jacks** was expected to redshirt this season, but injuries to the linebacking group forced him into action against McNeese State and he started the following game at Army and has played in four games. Jacks has 11 stops this season, including one sack.

- Running back/returner **Stephen Barnett** has returned 13 kickoffs for 259 yards (19.9), including a career-high 34-yarder vs. Southern Miss.

- Safety **Jordan Garrett** has eight stops (6 solo) in five games.

- Tight end **Kevin Burris** has four receptions for 39 yards in seven games.

- Receiver **Ryan Grant** has caught seven passes for 28 yards in four contests.

- Prior to suffering his season ending injury, running back/kickoff returner **Payten Jason** rushed 19 times for 85 yards, returned eight kickoffs for 158 yards (19.8 ypr), including a 38-yard return, and caught seven passes for 36 yards.

- Receiver/quarterback/running back/returner **D.J. Banks** has rushed four times for six yards, has five receptions for 53 yards, completed his 1-of-3 pass attempts for 39 yards, returned 10 kickoffs for 157 yards (15.7 ypr) and has three punt returns. Perhaps Banks' biggest play of the season so far came as a holder. On the game-winning field goal at Army, he took a bad snap that landed flat on the ground and quickly recovered in time for **Ross Thevenot** to boot the game-winner.

RUNNING BACKS THRIVE IN TOLEDO'S WEST COAST SYSTEM

• Throughout his career as a head coach, **Bob Toledo** has been a running backs' best friend. Dating back to his days as the head coach at UCLA and through two years at Tulane, running backs have thrived in his West Coast system as both runners and receivers. Toledo's last four prominent running backs- **Skip Hicks** and **DeShaun Foster** at UCLA and **Matt Forte** and **Andre Anderson** at Tulane- have combined for 9,808 rushing yards and 1,817 receiving yards.

Foster registered the most career yards under Toledo with 3,194 rushing yards and 548 receiving yards for 3,742 total yards, while Forte produced the most single season yards for a Toledo-led squad with a school record 2,127 rushing yards and 282 receiving yards for 2,409 total yards. Forte's total remains the sixth-best single season effort in NCAA history.

In 2008, Anderson was well on his way to taking his place among Toledo's greatest backs before a shoulder injury sidelined him the seventh game.

- Tulane's **Jeremy Williams** and **Reggie Scott** have each already earned their bachelor's degrees and are working on separate degrees. Williams earned his bachelor's degree in media arts and is headed toward a master's degree in liberal arts, while Scott was an exercise science major and is working towards a double major in liberal arts.
- Eight TU players were on the team in 2005 when Hurricane Katrina devastated New Orleans and forced TU to play 11 games during an 11-week span in 11 different stadiums. The players include: **Reggie Scott** (DT), **Charles Harris** (CB), **David Kirksey** (LB), **John Landa** (OL), **James McMurchy** (LB), **Tyler Rice** (OL), **Corey Sonnier** (S) and **Jeremy Williams** (WR).
- Seniors **Andre Anderson** and **David Kirksey** were selected by their teammates as the permanent team captains for the 2009 season.
- Tulane 2009 roster features a pair of identical twins in **Kendrell** (#23) and **Kendrick Washington**. Both players play the same position (cornerback) and are the height (5-9) and weight (160).
- Freshman **Jordan Sullen's** cousin, Craig Davis, played football at LSU and is currently a member of the San Diego Chargers.
- Freshman **Derrick Strozier's** has two cousins, Mike Jones and Art Strozier, who are former NFL players.
- Freshman **Brock Sanders'** father, Eric, enjoyed a 12-year NFL career with the Atlanta Falcons (1981-86) and Detroit Lions (1986-92).
- Freshman **Devin Figaro's** father played college basketball at UL-Lafayette and played professionally in the NBA for the Atlanta Hawks, while his uncle Cedric played for four teams during a seven-year NFL career.
- Junior center **Andrew Nierman** prepped at John Curtis High School and blocked for highly-touted USC freshman running back **Joe McKnight**. Together the two offensive players led JCHS to a combined record of 50-3 with three state championships. During his senior season, he helped lead the way for one of the nation's top prep offenses with 4,310 yards and 58 touchdowns.
- Redshirt-freshman **Rich Bell's** father, Richard, was an All-America football player at Rhode Island and had NFL stints with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and San Diego Chargers.
- Redshirt-freshman **Alex Lauricella's** uncle, Hank, was an All-America football player at Tennessee.
- Sophomores **Chris Asumnu** and **Emmanuel Aluko** were also prep teammates at Houston's (Texas) Alief Elsik High School.
- Chris Asumnu** brings a talented athletic lineage to Tulane. His sister, Gloria, was a multi All-America track athlete for the Green Wave, while his brother, Stanley, played both football and basketball at Tennessee and is a member of the Rio Grande Valley Vipers of the NBA Developmental League.
- Assistant coach **Greg Jackson** was a four-year letterwinner at LSU from 1985-88, and garnered first-team All-SEC and All-America honors in 1988. He helped the Tigers to two league titles and to four straight bowls. Jackson was drafted by the NFL's New York Giants in 1989 and helped that team to a Super Bowl title in 1991. He spent 12 years in the NFL and played with the Giants, Philadelphia Eagles, New Orleans Saints and San Diego Chargers.
- Offensive line coach **Mark Hutson** has spent 17 years in collegiate coaching. However, he is most noted for scoring a touchdown on a Fumblerooski in the 1988 Orange Bowl against Miami (Fla.). As an All-America guard at Oklahoma against Miami in the fourth quarter of the Orange Bowl, Hutson picked up the ball after Sooners quarterback Charles Thompson had taken the snap and laid it on the ground and rambled 29 yards for a touchdown. However, OU lost the game for the national championship 20-14.
- Tulane receivers coach **Thomas "TD" Woods** completed his collegiate career at Tennessee as the Volunteers' single-season and career receiving leader. Woods was a two-time All-Southeastern conference selection.

TULANE FOOTBALL REMEMBERS ANDREW VILLAR WITH HELMET STICKER

The Tulane football team will remember football student-athlete **Andrew Villar** this season by wearing a special helmet sticker with Villar's No. 16 for the entire year. Villar died on Thursday, April 30, 2009, in his hometown of Gonzales, La., of unknown causes. A 6-0, 174-pound kicker, Villar walked on to the Tulane football team in the spring of 2008 and was a member of the squad during the 2008 campaign. He completed his second spring season as a Green Wave player. He had also tried out for the Wave baseball team in the fall of 2007.

BOB TOLEDO

Head Coach
Third Year
San Francisco State, 1968



- Named the 37th head coach in the 115-year history of the Tulane football program on Dec. 11, 2006.

- Has a 8-23 record at Tulane.

- Sports an overall record of 86-91 in 16 seasons as a collegiate head coach.

- Coached in his 150th game on Sept. 29, 2007, against No. 2 LSU and his 175th game on Oct. 10, 2009, vs. Marshall.

- Despite a 4-8 record during his first season at Tulane, Toledo still managed to lead the Wave into the national spotlight. Under his offensive philosophy, senior tailback Matt Forté rushed for a school record 2,127 yards, the seventh-best single season total in NCAA history, and he became the 12th player to surpass the 2,000-yard rushing plateau in a single year. Forté earned numerous All-America honors, including second team All-America honors, and was among the contenders for the Heisman Trophy, the Doak Walker and Maxwell Awards, and was named the national player of the week twice in his lone season under Toledo.

- Has more than 30 years of collegiate coaching experience to the Green Wave football team, including head coaching stints at Cal Riverside (15-6 with two championships from 1974-75), University of the Pacific (14-30 from 1979-82) and UCLA (1996-2002). He has coached in 13 bowl games during his career, including seven of the traditional New Year's Day bowls.

- Spent seven years (1996-2002) as the head coach at UCLA where he compiled a 49-32 record overall. The Bruins produced a school-record 20-game winning streak, plus two Pac-10 titles, one Rose Bowl appearance and non-conference victories over Texas (twice), Alabama (twice), Michigan, Ohio State and Texas A&M.

- Under Toledo, UCLA went 10-2 in 1998, climbing to No. 2 in the national polls. The Bruins finished the regular season ranked fifth nationally in scoring offense (40.5) and eighth in total offense (482.6). They set school records for total offense (5,487 yards), passing yards (3,658) and passing touchdowns (29) and Toledo was a finalist for three Coach of the Year awards.

- The 1997 UCLA team finished 10-2 and ranked No. 5 in the nation after rallying to defeat Texas A&M in the Cotton Bowl. The Bruins trailed the Aggies 16-0 before making a dramatic second-half comeback to win 29-23. UCLA averaged 40.7 points and more than 430 yards during the regular season.

- Prior to becoming UCLA head coach in January of 1996, Toledo was the Bruins' offensive coordinator for two seasons (1994-95) under Terry Donahue. Offensive tackle Jonathon Ogden won the Outland Trophy and tailback Karim Abdul-Jabbar was first team All-America in 1995.

- Served as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for R.C. Slocum at Texas A&M for five years (1989-93). During that span, the Aggies posted a gaudy 49-12-1 record with three Southwest Conference titles and five straight bowl games, including three consecutive Cotton Bowl appearances. His 1990 Aggie offense still holds the school record for total yards in a single game (774 yards on 76 plays against Louisiana-Lafayette) and season game average with 471.1 yards per game that year.

- Toledo served as the offensive coordinator at Oregon for six seasons (1983-88), and helped tutor two of the Pac-10's most productive quarterbacks - Chris Miller and Bill Musgrave.

- Before his head coaching stint at Pacific, Toledo guided the secondary under John Robinson at Southern Cal from 1976-78. The Trojans went 31-6 in three seasons and were co-national champs after the 1978 campaign. Toledo's most heralded pupils included Dennis Thurman, Ronnie Lott and Dennis Smith.

- Toledo's first collegiate head coaching position was at Cal Riverside from 1974-75. The Highlanders were 15-6 and captured a pair of California Collegiate Athletic Association championships.

NEW ORLEANS - Joe Kemp threw for a career-high 278 yards and a touchdown in his first collegiate start and Casey Robottom snared a personal-best six passes, but it was not enough as Tulane dropped the season opener to Conference USA foe Tulsa, 37-13.

The Golden Hurricane stormed out to a 17-0 lead over the first nine minutes of play and withstood the Green Wave offense's best efforts to cruise to the 24-point victory.

Kemp completed 16-of-26 passes, but was sacked five times and finished with minus -37 yards rushing on six carries. Robottom posted 82 yards receiving, including a 20-yard touchdown grab with 5:19 left in the third quarter, while Jeremy Williams had five catches for 139 yards. André Anderson finished the day with 86 yards of total offense after posting 49 yards on 19 carries on the ground and hauling in two passes for another 37 yards through the air.

Chinonso Echebelem led the Green Wave defense with 12 tackles and Tulane posted four sacks on the day: one each by Kirksey, Logan Kelley, Justin Adams and Shakiel Smith.

The Green Wave got off to a rough start in the first quarter. Offensively, Tulane suffered three sacks and had a pass intercepted. The defense was forced to play against a short field and Tulsa took advantage with a 22-yard field goal by Kevin Fitzpatrick with 4:31 into the game, a 15-yard touchdown run by G.J. Kinne just over four minutes later, and a five-yard scoring gallop by Charles Clay with six minutes left to play in the opening stanza to stake the Golden Hurricane to a 17-0 advantage.

Tulane's offense began to click from there, but saw a 10-play, 63-yard drive produce a goose-egg as Ross Thevenot's 31-yard field goal was blocked by Tulsa Odrick Ray. The Wave drove 46-yards on its next possession but was forced to punt. Tulane finally got on the board with 55-seconds remaining in the half when Thevenot split the uprights from 27 yards out to make a two-score game.

Tulsa, however, stretched its lead back to 17 just before halftime as Damaris Johnson returned the ensuing kickoff 39 yards and Fitzpatrick was true from 33 yards away as time expired to cap a five-play, 38-yard drive to make it 20-3 at the break.

The Golden Hurricane padded the advantage in the opening drive of the second half when Fitzpatrick capped a 63-yard drive with a 24-yard field goal. Tulane got a big play from Williams on its first possession of the third quarter as he hauled in an intermediate pass from Kemp and broke a pair of tackles for a 68-yard gain to give the Wave first-and-goal from the four. Tulsa defense, however, stiffened and stopped four straight running plays.

Tulane's defense forced a three-and-out, and following a 16-yard punt return by Robottom, Anderson scampered for 21 yards before Kemp found Robottom from 20 yards out to make it a 23-10 ballgame.

The Golden Hurricane appeared to answer Tulane's score with a touchdown of its own, but Echebelem forced a Clay fumble at the one-yard line and Charles Harris recovered it in the end

NEW ORLEANS - It started out a close game and ended a rout as Tulane dropped a 54-3 decision to No. 9 BYU.

BYU held a slight 6-3 lead following a 29-yard field goal by Tulane's Ross Thevenot with 6:03 left in the first half. From there, however, it was all Cougars as BYU got a pair of touchdowns later in the period and scored on four of its first five possessions in the second half.

BYU quarterback Max Hall completed 24-of-31 passes for 309 yards and two touchdowns. J.J. DiLuigi ran for 71 yards and two scores on 12 carries, while Bryan Kariya was close behind with 63 yards and a touchdown on 12 carries. Dennis Pitta and O'Neill Chambers hauled in four passes each for 47 and 38 yards, respectively.

Joe Kemp, one of four passers used by the Green Wave on the day, led the team with 101 yards on 14-of-19 passing. Jeremy Williams and Ryan Grant each hauled in five passes apiece, and André Anderson led the Tulane ground effort with 36 yards on 12 carries.

BYU got on the board first as Mitch Payne capped a 10-play, 45-yard drive with a 31-yard field goal less than nine minutes into the ballgame and put the Cougars on top 6-0 with a 20-yarder 45 seconds into the second quarter. After getting just a pair of first downs on their first two possessions, the Green Wave offense got things going in the second stanza and drove from their own 32 down to the Cougar 12. BYU's defense kept Tulane out of the endzone and Thevenot's field goal made it a 6-3 ballgame.

From there, the Cougar offense turned things up a notch, driving 67 yards in just 2:35 capped by a one-yard touchdown jaunt by Brian Kariya and turned a Tulane interception into another score as Hall connected with Kariya for 12 yards with 25 seconds to play in the first half to go into the locker room on top, 20-3.

Chinonso Echebelem picked off Hall on BYU's first possession of the second half, but that was perhaps the Green Wave's lone highlight the rest of the way.

DiLuigi scored his first touchdown of the day on a three-yard run to cap a 13-play, 89-yard drive with 6:24 left to play in the third quarter, and Hall found McKay Jacobson deep for a 38-yard touchdown strike just over three minutes later to stretch the Cougar lead to 34-3. DiLuigi found paydirt again 1:53 into the fourth quarter.

The Cougar defense, meanwhile, forced a pair of fumbles, including one returned by Jordan Pendleton for a 12-yard touchdown early in the fourth quarter. NEW ORLEANS - André Anderson and Jeremy Williams combined for 431 all-purpose yards as Tulane picked up its first win of the 2009 season with a 42-32 victory over McNeese State.

Williams snared a career-high 10 passes for 222 yards and two touchdowns - and carried the ball four times for 10 yards on the ground - while Anderson finished the day with 199 rushing yards and a personal-best four touchdowns on 28 carries.

Williams posted the seventh 100-yard receiving day of his career. His total against the Cowboys ranks third in Tulane single-game history, 16 behind second-place Marc Zeno against then-Southwest Louisiana on Nov. 14, 1987 and 49 off the Green Wave record of 271 set by Jerome McIntosh vs. Vanderbilt on Nov. 18, 1989. Anderson, meanwhile, posted his fifth 100-yard rushing game of his career and his Saturday total ranks 14th in school history.

Joe Kemp completed 10-of-13 passes - all to Williams - with a pair of touchdowns and two interceptions. Travis Burks paced the defense with 11 tackles (six solo, five assists) and the Green Wave forced a season-high four fumbles, including two by Alex Wacha.

The Cowboys got on the board first, taking the opening kickoff and driving 54 yards down the field capped by a 29-yard field goal by Josh Lewis 3:38 into the ballgame. The advantage lasted just 1:24 as Anderson ran for 12 yards on the Green Wave's first play from scrimmage, Kemp found Williams for a 44-yard gain and Anderson plunged in from two yards out two plays later to give the Green Wave a 7-3 lead.

McNeese State answered Tulane's score with a touchdown of its own as Cowboys' tailback Todd Pendland capped a 10-play, 81-yard drive with a one-yard touchdown run with 6:07 left to play in the opening quarter.

Neither team scored on their next possessions, but Tulane took the lead for good when on Anderson's second scoring run of the day - an 11-yard jaunt 2:49 into the second stanza. The Green Wave defense forced a three-and-out, and the offense picked up where it left off as Kemp found Williams for a 34-yard touchdown pass to cap a four-play, 59-yard drive and give Tulane a 21-10 lead.

The Cowboys got back some momentum with a clock-eating 16-play, 86-yard drive on the ensuing possession which culminated with a one-yard Pendland score but Tulane went into the locker room at the break on top by four.

It took the Green Wave just 2:41 into the second half to pad its lead as Kemp found Williams from 40 yards out to push the lead back to nine. Two McNeese State drives later, however, the Cowboys sliced the lead to three as Derrick Fourroux connected with Richard Connor for a seven-yard touchdown and found Wes Mangan for a two-point conversion to make it a 28-25 contest.

WEST POINT, N.Y. - Ross Thevenot's connected on a 23-yard field goal with 2:20 left in regulation and Army kicker Alex Carlton pushed a 37-yard attempt wide right in the game's final seconds as Tulane rallied late to defeat the Black Knights, 17-16.

Tulane trailed Army for the majority of the game and was behind by nine with 11:44 left in the fourth quarter. The Green Wave, however, got a one-yard touchdown run by senior running back André Anderson 2:34 later and Thevenot made amends for a 30-yard miss earlier in the ballgame on what proved to be the game winner.

On the ensuing kickoff, Army's Damion Hunter returned the ball 46 yards and looked to have the Black Knights in great position with less than two minutes to play. Army passed twice for 15 yards followed by a Kingsley Ehie run down to the 20-yard line. After a pair of stops by the Tulane defense, Army and Tulane each traded timeouts and the Black Knights sent Carlton onto the field with 16 seconds left on the clock. Carlton was a perfect 3-for-3 entering the moment, including a 37-yarder back in the first quarter. This time, his kick was off line and the Tulane sideline erupted in celebration.

The opening minutes of the game were the mirror image of last year's contest at Tad Gormley Stadium in New Orleans as Christopher Swain blocked a Thevenot punt and Christopher Swain fell on the football at the Tulane 10.

Three plays later, Trent Steelman capped off a three-play drive with a one-yard touchdown run to give the home team a quick 7-0 lead. Following a Tulane punt, the Black Knights extended their lead to 10-0 on a 37-yard Carlton field goal.

Tulane got on the board with its next possession when the Wave marched 54 yards in 10 plays. Joe Kemp rang up his favorite receiver with a 15-yard touchdown strike to Jeremy Williams on the second play of the second quarter.

On the ensuing possession, Army ran the ball down to the Tulane 15-yard line and looked to increase its lead. But on third and six, the Black Knights attempted their first pass of the day and Harris made them pay with an interception near the goal line. Tulane and Army each had two possessions during the final 9:41 of the second quarter, but neither team was able to capitalize and the contest remained 10-7 at the break.

The teams continued to trade punts in the third quarter before Tulane put together a 10-play, 52-yard drive that took the Wave deep into Army territory. Following Kemp's six-yard completion to Casey Rottobom that fell three yards of a first down, Thevenot attempted to tie the game but his 30-yard attempt was wide left.

Following a pair of three-and-outs by both teams, the Tulane defense stopped Army's option attack and forced yet another punt. Jordan Garrett, however, was flagged for roughing the punter and the Black Knights made the most of their second chance and Carlton connected on a 32-yard field goal to give Army a 13-7 lead 28 seconds into the fourth quarter.

Williams once again gave Tulane great starting possession with a 35-yard return, but on Tulane's next play from scrimmage, Kemp mishandled the snap and Army recovered at the Green Wave's 33-yard line. Three plays later, Carlton booted his third field goal of the contest with a 36-yard attempt to push the Army advantage to 16-7 at the 11:44 mark.

From there, Tulane marched 61 yards on seven plays and Anderson capped the drive with one-yard scoring plunge to cut the deficit to a pair. Army moved into Green Wave territory on the ensuing possession, but the Tulane defense held on fourth down to set up the winning drive.

Taking over at its' own 37-yard line, Tulane got 47 yards from Anderson on six carries, and Kemp found Rottobom for a 10-yard gain. Army's defense held inside the 10-yard line, but Thevenot's kick proved to be the difference.

NEW ORLEANS - André Anderson tallied 135 all-purpose yards and Jeremy Williams snared a game-high eight passes, but it was not enough as Tulane dropped a 31-10 Homecoming decision to Conference USA foe Marshall at the Louisiana Superdome.

The Green Wave dominated the stat sheet, running for 189 yards to Marshall's 116 and posting 215 yards through the air to the Herd's 207 and commanding a 7:44 advantage in time of possession. The difference in the game, however, was turnovers where Tulane gave away the ball four times - two fumbles and a pair of interceptions - and Marshall turned that into two touchdowns and a field goal.

Trailing 14-7 with 41 seconds left in the first half, Tulane had a chance to tie the ballgame as the Green Wave drove from its own 18 all the way to the Marshall one. A two-yard Anderson run gave Tulane third-and-goal from the one, but the Thundering Herd defense stopped Anderson cold on third down and nailed Antoine Duplessis on fourth down to send the Green Wave away scoreless despite a 19-play, 81-yard drive that chewed 10:59 off the clock.

To make matters worse for Tulane, the Marshall offense marched 99 yards down the field over the next 4:08 and capped the drive when Brian Anderson found Chuck Walker down the middle for a 21-yard touchdown with 34 seconds left in the opening half to take a commanding 21-7 lead in the ballgame.

The Green Wave defense held Marshall running back Darius Marshall - the NCAA's leader entering the ballgame with a 159.75 yard-per-game average - to just 98 yards on 20 carries. Marshall, however, found the endzone twice and Anderson had a solid day under center, completing 18-of-22 passes for 207 yards, one touchdown and one interception.

Alex Wachua led the defensive effort, tying a career high with eight tackles (five solo, three assists) and a pass break-up. Travis Burks had seven tackles, and Chinonso Echebelem was next with six.

Tulane drew first blood on Saturday, taking the opening kickoff and driving 67 yards on eight plays for a touchdown. Facing a second-and-six situation from the Herd 32-yard line, Tulane head coach Bob Toledo reached into his bag of tricks with a swinging gate that saw Joe Kemp snap the ball to Anderson. Anderson darted left initially before handing off to Jordan Sullen who ran untouched into the endzone for his first collegiate score.

While his first trick play turned into a touchdown, Toledo's second did not fare as well as a surprise on-side kickoff attempt was recovered by Marshall's Pete Culicerto at the Tulane 44-yard line. The Herd took advantage of the short field and Marshall capped a six-play drive with an 11-yard by the running back of the same name to tie the score.

The two teams traded punts, and Tulane had something going late in the opening quarter as the Green Wave converted a pair of third downs to get into Marshall territory. A sack pushed the Wave back to their own 45 and Albert McClellan forced a fumble on the next play. Ashton Hall scooped up the ball and run 29 yards to give the Herd a 14-7 lead they would not relinquish.

Tulane went into the locker room at halftime down by two scores, but it became a three-score ballgame early in the third quarter as an Anderson fumble gave Marshall the ball at its own

38 yard line. Eight plays, 47 yards and a 32-yard Craig Ratanamorn field goal later, the Thundering Herd were on top by 17.

NEW ORLEANS - The Green Wave defense held the high-powered Cougar attack in check in the first half and trailed by just three at 9-6 at halftime, but Houston piled up 295 of its 516 yards of total offense and scored touchdowns on five straight possessions to hand Tulane a 44-16 defeat in the Louisiana Superdome.

André Anderson ran for 108 yards on 18 carries and Jeremy Williams posted over 100 all-purpose yards on the day with six catches for 63 yards while running eight times for a career-best 45 on the ground.

Cougar quarterback Case Keenum, however, countered with 371 yards and two touchdowns on 33-of-46 passing and Houston ran for 145 yards as a team on 33 totes. Chaz Rodriguez was Keenum's favorite target on the day, hauling in six passes for 84 yards. James Cleveland and L.J. Castille both caught touchdown passes while Bryce Bealle and Justin Johnson each had a pair of scoring runs.

The Cougars converted 9-of-13 third-down opportunities and blocked a punt early in the second half to spark the second-half onslaught.

Houston scored the game's first points on a 22-yard field goal by Ben Bell with 9:09 left to play in the opening quarter, but Tulane tied things up quickly as Ross Thevenot capped a 12-play, 42-yard drive with his season-long boot. The defense forced the Cougars to punt on their next possession, and Tulane found a rhythm for another scoring drive. The Wave held first-and-10 at the Cougar 22 before Houston stiffened and forced the home team to settle for a 35-yard Thevenot kick to give Tulane a 6-3 lead.

The advantage did not last long as Houston took the ensuing kickoff and capped a 10-play, 63-yard drive with Bealle's first touchdown run of the game to take a 9-6 lead. Bell's PAT plunked off the right upright and he later missed a 25-yard field goal attempt, and the two teams went into the locker room at the break in a three-point battle.

The second half, however, was all Houston as the Cougars scored early and often over the final two frames. Johnson capped an eight-play 60-yard drive with a three-yard touchdown run to open the third quarter, and the door appeared to be left open for the Green Wave as Bell's point-after try ricocheted off the left upright to keep it a 15-6 ballgame. Tulane went three-and-out on the ensuing possession, and Jeremy Smith blocked a punt to give Houston a short field at the Tulane six. One play later, Keenum found Cleveland in the endzone to give the Cougars a 22-6 advantage.

Bealle scored his second touchdown of the day with 3:19 left in the third quarter to push the lead to 23, and Toledo decided to make a switch at quarterback as Ryan Griffin replaced Joe

Kemp under center. Griffin breathed a bit of life into the Tulane offense, drove the team 75 yards in 11 plays, and threw a touchdown pass to a leaping Antoine Duplessis from three yards out to cut the deficit to 16.

HATTIESBURG, Miss. - André Anderson posted 116 all-purpose yards and hauled in a career-high six passes, but it was not enough as Tulane dropped a Conference USA contest to Southern Miss, 43-6, at M.M. Roberts Stadium.

The Golden Eagles scored in nearly every phase of the game as Southern Miss posted four offensive touchdowns – two rushing and two passing – returned a fumble for a score, and blocked a field goal that turned into a 77-yard touchdown return. The Eagle defense, meanwhile, posted six sacks on the day and held the Green Wave offense to 54 yards on the ground.

Ryan Griffin completed 21-of-33 passes for 158 yards and an interception, and was on the receiving end of all six Southern Miss sacks. He completed passes to seven different receivers – finding Anderson six times for 24 yards, Casey Robottom five times for 61 yards and Jeremy Williams four times for 21 yards.

The Southern Miss defense forced four turnovers – three fumble recoveries and a pick – and halted Tulane on fourth-down to give the Southern Miss offense a short field late in the ballgame. The USM offense, meanwhile, turned the turnovers and the fourth-down hold into a pair of touchdowns while the defense found pay dirt themselves when Jamie Collins scooped up a second-quarter fumble and rumbled 16 yards to the end zone.

Southern Miss' Martavious Young completed 13-of-15 passes for 127 yards and two scores and ran five times for another 38 yards on the ground. As a team, the Golden Eagles tallied 253 yards on 43 carries – including a 93-yard effort by Tory Harrison. DeAndre Brown was Young's favorite target on the night, hauling in four passes for 41 yards and two touchdowns.

The Golden Eagles opened the scoring in the first quarter when Young found Brown from 21 yards out to cap a nine-play, 56-yard drive with 5:25 left on the clock.
