TULANE HOSTS ARMY ON HOMECOMING AT TAD GORMLEY STADIUM

Green Wave Goes for Third Straight Win for First Time Since 2004

The Tulane football team (2-2, 1-1 C-USA) concludes a four-game home stand this Saturday, Oct. 4 at 2 p.m. when the Green Wave hosts Army (0-4) on Homecoming at Tad Gormley Stadium. The Tulane-Army contest will air live on Cox Sports Television of New Orleans, channel 37.

The Wave has won its last two games entering this weekend's outing and will look to capture its third straight victory for the first time since the 2004 campaign. Tulane is 2-1 at home this season and is averaging 27.3 points per home game.

Army marks the final non-conference home contest of the year for the Green Wave and Tulane is 18-14 vs. non-conference opponents (at the time of the competition) since the 2000 season, including 10-4 at home.

TULANE AT TAD GORMLEY STADIUM

Located in City Park, Tad Gormley Stadium will host the Green Wave for the fifth time since 2002. The Wave will play its fourth Homecoming game at Tad Gormley and has a record of 2-1 in those games at the outdoor venue. Tulane's overall record at Tad Gormley is 3-1, with a Homecoming win over Navy in 2002, a 27-24 overtime win over Northwestern State in an early-season night game and a 45-42 loss to Houston (Homecoming) in 2003, and finally a wild 59-55 shoot-out victory over UAB on Homecoming in its last game at the facility in 2004. The storied stadium has been the site of events like the 1992 U.S. Olympic Track & Field Trials, the 1993 NCAA Division I Outdoor Track and Field Championships and concerts by the Beatles and the Rolling Stones.

FORMER STANDOUT PATRICK RAMSEY, 1998 UNDEFEATED FOOTBALL TEAM TO BE INDUCTED INTO THE TULANE ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME

This Friday, former standout quarterback **Patrick Ramsey** will join his 1998 Undeclared Football team during induction ceremonies to the 2008 Tulane Athletics Hall of Fame. The event will take place at the Doubletree Hotel on Canal St. in the International Ballroom on the 16th floor of the hotel from 12-2 p.m. The inductees will also be honored at halftime of TU's homecoming game against Army at Tad Gormley Stadium the following day.

The 2008 class features Pam Buff (women's golf), Perry Clark (men's basketball coach), John Olagues (baseball) and Ramsey (football) along with the Green Wave's 1998 undefeated football team.

TULANE MAINTAINS HOLD AS THE NATION'S TOP SACK UNIT FOR THE THIRD STRAIGHT WEEK

For the third straight week, the Tulane defense continues to lead the nation in total sacks with 15 for minus -98 yards. Tulane is averaging 4.00 sacks per game

The Wave registered four sacks (-29 yds) in the season opener at #13 Alabama, produced five sacks (-26 yds) against #14 East Carolina, finished with four sacks (-28 yds) vs. ULM and notched a season-low two sacks (-15 yds) against SMU. TU has registered 43 sacks over the past 16 games (2.70), including 28 total sacks in 2007, the seventh-best single season total in school history.

Individually, junior linebacker **Logan Kelley** leads TU with a team-best four sacks (-31 yds). Kelley's 1.00 sacks per game ranks first among C-USA players and is tied for sixth nationally.

NOTING THE GREEN WAVE

- Tulane leads Conference USA teams in eight of 10 defensive categories, including total defense, scoring defense, rushing defense, pass defense, pass defense efficiency, opponent first downs, opponent third down conversions, sacks, and ranks third among the league's teams in red zone defense and is 10th for opponent fourth down conversions.

- Tulane's defense is not just the best in Conference USA, but ranks among the nation's top units in three categories, including sacks (1st), rushing defense (9th), total defense (9th) and is the second-best unit in the country on third down, allowing opponent offenses' just nine conversions in 43 attempts (20.9 percent).

- Sophomore quarterback **Kevin Moore** has been efficient through four games, completing 61 percent of his attempts for 987 yards and five touchdowns. He has also connected on 14 plays of 20+ yards, including a 57-yard strike to senior **Brian King** vs. ULM.

- Junior **Jeremy Williams** leads Tulane is receiving with 24 receptions for 356 yards and four touchdowns, and he ranks second on the team in all-purpose yards with 140.75 yards per outing (356-rec./195-kickoff return/12-rushing). His all-purpose yards rank seventh among C-USA players and 35th nationally.

- Junior **Andre Anderson** is currently the top ground gainer among the league's running backs with 122.5 yards per game, which is good enough for the eighth-best total in the nation. Anderson's attempts (120) and total yards (490) are also tops among C-USA backs.

- Junior **Ross Thevenot** is second among C-USA kickers for field goals per game with 1.50, is tied for first for PAT percentage with a perfect 1.000 and is fifth among kickers in scoring with 7.0 points per game.

- Thevenot, who also handles TU's punting chores, ranks second in the league with a 46.6 average on 12 punts for 559 yards. His 71-yard punt against SMU is the longest by a C-USA punter this season.

ABOUT THE ARMY BLACK KNIGHTS

Army has stumbled to a 0-4 start to begin the 2008 season, but is coming off its best offensive performance of year despite coming up short on the road at Texas A&M, 21-17. However, the Black Knights have been outscored this season, 106-37.

Sophomore quarterback **Chip Bowden** leads Army's multiple option attack with 58.0 rushing yards per outing (232), while senior fullback **Collin Mooney** is the team's second-leading rusher with 57.2 yards per game (229). As a team, the Black Knights are averaging 204.8 rushing yards per contest. Bowden is coming off a 128-yard effort on 34 attempts at Texas A&M.

Junior quarterback **Carson Williams** has completed 55.9 percent of his passing attempts for 221 yards and one touchdown against two interceptions.

Sophomore wide receiver **Jameson Carter** leads the team in receptions (7) and receiving yards (116) and has a season long catch of 59 yards from Williams against New Hampshire.

Defensively, sophomore linebacker **Josh McNary** leads the team in total tackles with 30 stops (20 solo), including four tackles for lost yardage and a sack.



SERIES & NOTES:

- Saturday's game marks the 16th all-time meeting between Tulane and Army, and the Green Wave leads the series, 8-6-1.

- Tulane has an all-time mark of 5-1-1 against the Black Knights in New Orleans.

- The last Army win in New Orleans was a 14-10 victory in 2002.

- The two teams played to a 0-0 tie in the first-ever meeting in 1953. Army, the nation's 15th-ranked squad at the time of the meeting, was held scoreless for the only time that season.

- Army was a member of Conference USA from 1998 to 2004, and the Green Wave had a league mark of 4-3 against the Black Knights.

- Tulane has an all-time record of 2-0 against Army on homecoming. The Wave upended the Black Knights, 23-10, in 1976 and topped Army 42-28 in 2006.

- The Green Wave is 1-0 on homecoming under current head coach Bob Toledo. In his first homecoming game at Tulane, Toledo led TU past UTEP, 34-19.

THE LAST TIME AGAINST ARMY

Senior running back **Matt Forté** ran for 202 yards and two scores, but it was not enough as the Tulane University football team dropped a 20-17 overtime decision to the Army Black Knights at Michie Stadium.

The Green Wave led 17-10 with four seconds remaining when Army quarterback **Kevin Dunn** threw a Hail Mary pass into the endzone. The ball was tipped around, but **Mike Wright** snared the ball on the way down and managed to keep his left toe in bounds to set up the game-tying PAT with no time remaining in regulation.

With the score knotted at 17-all at the end of regulation, Army place kicker **Owen Tolson** kicked a 25-yard field goal during the opening possession of the overtime to provide the Black Knights with their final points of the ballgame. The Green Wave had a chance to tie or win the game with a touchdown during their possession of OT, but after being stopped on third down, sophomore place kicker **Ross Thevenot's** 34-yard field goal try sailed just left of the upright to spark the Army celebration.

THE COACHES:

Tulane: Bob Toledo (San Francisco State, 1968) is in his second season as the head coach of the Green Wave. Toledo has a 6-10 mark at Tulane and a career record of 84-78 in 15 years as a Division I head coach. He became the 37th head coach in school history on Dec. 11, 2006, and has coached in 13 bowl games, including seven traditional New Year's Day bowls.

Toledo led TU to a 4-8 record during his rookie season with the Wave. However, three of Tulane's losses were by a combined total of nine points. His previous head coaching stint was at UCLA (1996-2002), where he led the Bruins to two Pac-10 titles, a school-record 20-game win streak, two final top-10 national rankings and was twice named the Pac-10 Coach of the Year.

Army: Stan Brock (Colorado, 1980) is in his second season as the head coach at Army, and has a mark of 3-13 at the United States Military Academy. He spent three seasons as the Black Knights' offensive line coach (2004-06) before becoming the 35th head coach in school history on Jan. 29, 2007.

Prior to Army, Brock was the head coach for two different Arena Football League teams: L.A. Avengers (2000-01) and Portland Forest Dragons (1997-99). He spent 16 seasons in the NFL, including 13 years as a member of the New Orleans Saints where he helped the team to 66 victories while playing in 186 games. He was elected into the Saints Hall of Fame in 1998. Brock spent his final three seasons with San Diego and was a member of the Chargers' 1994 Super Bowl team.

FROM ONE EXTREME TO ANOTHER

Last week, Tulane's defense had to defend against SMU's pass-happy Run & Shoot offense. This week, the defense must focus on stopping Army's run-oriented multiple-option attack.

Army has run the ball on 226 of its 270 total plays this season and is averaging over 200 yards on the ground per game, and has three rushing touchdowns. Thirteen different players have carried the ball one or more times this season.

On the other end of the spectrum, the Black Knights average just 59 yards per game through the air and has thrown for just one score this season.

ANDRE THE GIANT

Junior **Andre Anderson** continues to carry the load for the Green Wave in his first season of full-time duty. Anderson has set career-high totals the last three weeks after posting a career high 219 yards and a touchdown on 36 carries against SMU. Anderson previously had 82 rushing yards against #14 East Carolina and 157 against Louisiana-Monroe.

Over the last two games, Anderson has carried the ball a combined 74 times for 376 yards (5.1 apc) and has scored two touchdowns.

Anderson's 219 rushing yards marked the seventh-best in Tulane single-game history, while his 36 carries, meanwhile, ranks eighth in Tulane single-game history.

Anderson also posted a career-best 257 all-purpose yards vs. SMU with 219 rushing yards and 38 receiving yards on four catches. His all-purpose total ranks seventh in Tulane single-game history, surpassing 271-yard performances by Jerome McIntosh against Vanderbilt (Nov. 18, 1989) and Mewelde Moore against Southern (Sept. 29, 2001).

TULANE RUNNING GAME PROSPERS UNDER TOLEDO

Tulane's rushing attack has found new life since head coach Bob Toledo took over the program. During Toledo's 16 games at TU in his West Coast offense, the Green Wave has averaged 186 rushing yards per game with 2,412 in 2007 and 564 yards this season.

Individually, a Tulane running back has either led Conference USA or ranked among the nation's top 10 players in rushing over the past two years. Last season, All-American **Matt Forte** rushed for 2,127 yards, the second-best effort in the country in 2007, while junior **Andre Anderson** is currently the league's top back with 490 yards on the ground, and his 122.5 yards per game ranks eighth nationally.

ALONE AT THE TOP

Tulane has done a good job keeping the opponent's offense on the sidelines this season with consistent ball control. In fact, the Green Wave ranks first nationally in time of possession with a per game average of 36:09 minutes per game.

Tulane has dominated time of possession in all four games this season and holds better than a 12 minute edge this season, 36:09 to 23:51.

Tulane has held the ball for 144:36 minutes out of 240 this season.

BALL-HAWKING

The Green Wave has forced 15 three-and-outs this season, and has been responsible for eight turnovers (4-Int; 4-FF), while the Tulane offense has suffered just five turnovers (4-int; 1-F). Thus, Tulane has a 0.75 turnover margin, which ranks fifth best among C-USA teams and 31st nationally.

The Wave recovered one fumble at #13 Alabama, came away with three fumbles and an interception against #14 East Carolina, recorded an interception vs. ULM, and picked off a pair of passes vs. SMU.

By limiting Louisiana-Monroe to 182 yards of total offense, the Tulane defense posted its second game of holding a foe to less than 200 yards. In the season-opener against Alabama, the Green Wave allowed just 172 yards.

FIRST HALF DOMINANCE

Tulane's defense has been a stonewall during the first two quarters of the last four games and has surrendered just seven points (SMU) over the course of 180

In the first half of the last three games, the TU defenders allowed just 38 yards (0-rush; 38-pass) to #13 Alabama, 76 yards (19-rush; 57-pass) to #14 East Carolina, 58 yards (2-rush; 56-pass) to ULM, but gave up 159 yards to SMU (55-rush; 104-pass).

Through the first half of its four contests this season, TU's opponents have ran 107 plays for 331 yards (76-rush; 255-pass), or 82.75 total first half yards.

TULANE OFF TO A GOOD START ON BOTH SIDES OF THE BALL

Tulane has outgained its three opponents 1558-981 (+577 yards) in total offense, including 564 to 274 in rushing yards (+290) and 994 to 707 in passing yards (+287). The Green Wave offense has put up 88 points, while the Wave defense held its opponents to a combined 65 points (Tulane special teams have surrendered 20 points this season).

THIRD DOWN OPPORTUNITIES

The Green Wave defense is a very stingy unit on third down conversions. In fact, the group ranks second nationally for opponents' third down conversions with a meager 21-percent (9/43) effort. TU's nine allowed conversions are the fewest in the nation this season.

TU held Alabama to a 3-of-11 effort, East Carolina was 3-of-10, ULM was 0-8 before finishing the game just 1-of-10 and SMU finished 2-of-12.

Tulane's offense this season has converted on 47-percent (32/68) of its third down conversions, and ranks fourth among Conference USA schools. Tulane's offense has had nearly twice as many chances to convert (68-43), while the Green Wave owns a 32-9 edge in third down conversions.

DRIVING DISTANCE

The Tulane offense has a combined 51 drives this season and has put together 32 drives of five or more plays, including nine drives of 10 or more plays.

In its fourth game against SMU, Tulane notched 24 first downs to the Mustangs' 16 and put together eight drives of five or more plays, including one 11-play march.

The Green Wave had 24 first downs with eight drives of five-plus plays, including two 12-play possessions, against ULM.

In its second game against East Carolina, the Wave offense totaled 16 first downs and eight drives of five-plus plays, including a pair of 10+ play drives.

The Green Wave registered 18 first downs and put together eight drives of five or more plays, including four double digit play drives, in the season opener at #13 Alabama.

THE RUN STOPS HERE

Tulane's defense has been very good against the run over the last two seasons. The Green Wave led Conference USA in rushing defense a year ago, giving up just 132.6 yards per game on the ground.

This season, Tulane's opponents have managed a combined total of 274 yards through the first four games, or an average of 68.5 yards per contest, and once again the Wave defense has found its way to the top of the league chart for the top rushing defense and ranks ninth nationally.

Tulane has not allowed a 100-yard rusher or a 300-yard passer this season.

MORE FIRST TIMERS

Through four games, a total of 18 freshmen, including 11 true rookies, have earned playing time.

In the season opener at #13 Alabama, the Wave had 16 freshmen make their first collegiate appearance. True freshmen **Chris Asumnu, Nathan Austin, Harris Howard, Eric Jones, Alex Lauricella, Sule Osagiede, Kristofar Rhymes, Kasey Stelly, Rafael Vazquez, Troy Wainwright** and **Albert Williams**, joined redshirt freshmen **Logan CoBell, Charles Gaspard, Josh Smith, Joey Ray** and **Taylor Echols** in making their Green Wave debuts.

Junior **Reece Thomas** and redshirt freshman **Cedric Wilson** saw their first action against #14 East Carolina, while redshirt freshman **Dominique Dade** took the field for the first time in his career against ULM.

Of the 18 freshmen to play, three walk-ons- **Reece, Gaspard** and **CoBell**- have earned playing time for their practice performances.

ANDERSON, THEVENOT NAMED LOUISIANA PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

- A pair of Tulane football players were named Player of the Week by the Louisiana Sports Writers Association after the Green Wave's 34-27 win over SMU Thursday. Junior running back **Andre Anderson** was named Offensive Player of the Week, with junior kicker/punter **Ross Thevenot** taking home Special Teams honors.

Anderson racked up a career-high 219 yards on 36 attempts with a touchdown. It was the fourth straight game that Anderson has finished with a career-high in rushing yardage.

Thevenot averaged 56 yards per punt on three attempts for 168 yards, placing one inside the 20. He also connected on field goals of 32 and 43 yards while converting all four PATs. His 43-yard field goal with 4:01 to play was a season-long and his 71-yard punt was the longest by a Green Wave player since 2003.

THURSDAY NIGHT HEROES

- Sophomore quarterback **Kevin Moore** posted the first three-touchdown day of his career, throwing for three scores in the first half. The last time a Tulane quarterback threw for three touchdowns in a game was back on Oct. 28, 2006, when Lester Ricard had three touchdown passes in a 42-28 victory over Army in the Louisiana Superdome - a span of 21 games.

- Redshirt-sophomore wide receiver **Alan Mitchell** made his collegiate debut Thursday night against SMU and made it a memorable day as he not only caught the first pass of his career but also his first touchdown when he caught a 23-yard pass from Kevin Moore 6:27 into the ballgame.

- **Jeremy Williams'** 124-yard receiving day was the second 100-yard effort of the 2008 season and the fifth of his career. The five 100-yard receiving days ranks Williams tied with Jerome McIntosh (1986-89) for eighth in Tulane career history. His yardage total marks the 143rd time a Tulane receiver tallied a 100-yard receiving day and ranks 71st in school single-game history.

- Senior safety **David Skehan's** interception against SMU was the ninth of his career, which moves him a five-way tie for ninth place in Tulane history joining Tra Boger (2001-05), David Lee (1972-74), Joe Bullard (1969-71) and Jimmy Glisson (1948-49).

LEFTOVERS FROM THE SMU GAME

- The last time Tulane scored more than 31 points in a half was on Oct. 23, 2004 when the Green Wave tallied 35 second-half points against UAB in a 59-55 win at Tad Gormley Stadium. The last time Tulane scored 31 points in the first half was on Oct. 13, 2001, when the Green Wave did so against TCU en route to a 48-22 win the Louisiana Superdome.

- With the win, Tulane improves to 2-2 on the year and evens its Conference USA record at 1-1. The victory marks the first time since the 2005 season that the Green Wave sports a non-losing record four games into the season and the first time Tulane has ever sat .500 in the Bob Toledo era.

LEADERS OF THE PACK

Seniors **Michael Parenton** and **Reggie Scott** were voted by their teammates as the permanent team captains for the Green Wave this season. Tulane will have two additional captains on a per game basis.

This season the duo is keeping a weekly diary called "Down & Dirty: In the Trenches of Tulane Football" which has already received national notoriety from *USA Today*. In their chronicle of the football team's evacuation, *USA Today* featured it in the Sept. 2 edition, titled "Writing out the Storm."

GELHARDT NAMED TO 2008 AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM

Senior deep snapper **Craig Gelhardt** became the Green Wave student-athlete to receive individual honors this year as he was named to the 17th Annual Allstate AFCA Good Works Team.

A three-year letterman on the gridiron, where he has handled snapping duties on nearly every punt, field goal and point-after-touchdown play, Gelhardt earned the honor after serving as an active member of SAFER (Student Advocacy For Equitable Recovery), Habitat For Humanities and Tulane's Student-Athlete Advisory Council.

As a member of SAFER, Gelhardt has assisted in the continued recovery effort in the New Orleans area following Hurricane Katrina in 2005. Among the activities carried out by SAFER, Gelhardt has helped gut houses, hang drywall and other maintenance to help bring families back to the city and help them return to the life they knew before the storm. He served as the community service representative on TU's Student-Athlete Advisory Council in 2007-08.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES

- Sophomore offensive guard **Andrew Nierman** prepped at John Curtis High School and blocked for highly-touted USC freshman running back Joe McKnight. Together the two offensive players led JCHS to a combined record of 50-3 with three state championships during his final three seasons. During his senior season, he helped lead the way for one of the nation's top prep offenses as the Patriots amassed 4,310 yards and 58 touchdowns.
- Freshman **Rich Bell's** father, Richard, was an All-America football player at Rhode Island and had NFL stints in the NFL with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and San Diego Chargers.
- Freshman **Alex Lauricella's** uncle, Hank, was an All-America football player at Tennessee.
- Freshmen **Chris Asumnu** and **Emmanuel Aluko** are not only classmates at Tulane, but were also prep teammates at Houston's (Texas) Alief Elsik High School.
- **Chris Asumnu** brings a talented athletic lineage to Tulane. His sister, Gloria, was a multi All-America track athlete for the Green Wave, while his brother, Richard, played both football and basketball at Tennessee and is a member of the Rio Grande Valley Vipers of the NBA Developmental League.
- Tulane assistant coach **Greg Jackson** was a four-year letterwinner at LSU from 1985-88, and garnered first-team All-SEC and All-America honors in 1988. He helped lead the Tigers to two conference titles and four straight bowl appearances. Jackson was drafted by the NFL's New York Giants in 1989 and helped that team to a Super Bowl title in 1991. He spent 12 years in the NFL and played with the Giants, Philadelphia Eagles, New Orleans Saints and San Diego Chargers.
- Tulane offensive line coach **Mark Hutson** has spent 16 years in collegiate coaching. However, he is most noted for scoring a touchdown on a Fumblerooski in the 1988 Orange Bowl against Miami (Fla.). As an All-America guard at Oklahoma against Miami in the fourth quarter of the 1988 Orange Bowl, Hutson picked up the ball after Sooners quarterback Charles Thompson had taken the snap and laid it on the ground and rambled 29 yards for a touchdown. However, OU lost the game for the national championship 20-14.
- Tulane wide receivers coach **Thomas "TD" Woods** completed his collegiate career at Tennessee as the Volunteers' single-season and career receiving leader. Woods was a two-time All-Southeastern Conference selection.

TULANE UNIVERSITY

• Named the 37th head coach in the 112-year history of the Tulane football program on Dec. 11, 2006.

• Has a 6-10 record at Tulane.

• Sports an overall record of 84-78 in 15 seasons as a collegiate head coach.

• Coached in his 150th game on Sept. 29, 2007, against No. 2 LSU.

• Since Toledo took over at Tulane, the Green Wave has averaged 186 rushing yards per game with 2,412 in 2007 and 564 yards this season.

• Despite a 4-8 record during his first season at Tulane, Toledo still managed to lead the Wave into the national spotlight. Under his offensive philosophy, senior tailback Matt Forté rushed for a school record 2,127 yards, the seventh-best single season total in NCAA history, and he became the 12th player to surpass the 2,000-yard rushing plateau in a single year. Forté earned numerous All-America honors, including second team All-America honors, and was among the contenders for the Heisman Trophy, the Doak Walker and Maxwell Awards, and was named the national player of the week twice in his lone season under Toledo.

• Brings more than 30 years of collegiate coaching experience to the Green Wave football team, including head coaching stints at Cal Riverside (15-6 with two championships from 1974-75), University of the Pacific (14-30 from 1979-82) and UCLA (1996-2002). He has coached in 13 bowl games during his career, including seven of the traditional New Year's Day bowls.

• Spent seven years (1996-2002) as the head coach at UCLA where he compiled a 49-32 record overall. The Bruins produced a school-record 20-game winning streak, plus two Pac-10 titles, one Rose Bowl appearance and non-conference victories over Texas (twice), Alabama (twice), Michigan, Ohio State and Texas A&M.

• Under Toledo, UCLA went 10-2 in 1998, climbing to No. 2 in the national polls. The Bruins finished the regular season ranked fifth nationally in scoring offense (40.5) and eighth in total offense (482.6). They set school records for total offense (5,487 yards), passing yards (3,658) and passing touchdowns (29) and Toledo was a finalist for three Coach of the Year awards.

• The 1997 UCLA team finished 10-2 and ranked No. 5 in the nation after rallying to defeat Texas A&M in the Cotton Bowl. The Bruins trailed the Aggies 16-0 before making a dramatic second-half comeback to win 29-23. UCLA averaged 40.7 points and more than 430 yards during the regular season.

• Prior to becoming UCLA head coach in January of 1996, Toledo was the Bruins' offensive coordinator for two seasons (1994-95) under Terry Donahue. Offensive tackle Jonathon Ogden won the Outland Trophy and tailback Karim Abdul-Jabbar was first team All-America in 1995.

• Served as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for R.C. Slocum at Texas A&M for five years (1989-93). During that span, the Aggies posted a gaudy 49-12-1 record with three Southwest Conference titles and five straight bowl games, including three consecutive Cotton Bowl appearances. His 1990 Aggie offense still holds the school record for total yards in a single game (774 yards on 76 plays against Louisiana-Lafayette) and season game average with 471.1 yards per game that year.

• Toledo served as the offensive coordinator at Oregon for six seasons (1983-88), and helped tutor two of the Pac-10's most productive quarterbacks - Chris Miller and Bill Musgrave.

• Before his head coaching stint at Pacific, Toledo guided the secondary under John Robinson at Southern Cal from 1976-78. The Trojans went 31-6 in three seasons and were co-national champs after the 1978 campaign. Toledo's most heralded pupils included Dennis Thurman, Ronnie Lott and Dennis Smith.

• Toledo's first collegiate head coaching position was at Cal Riverside from 1974-75. The Highlanders were 15-6 and captured a pair of California Collegiate Athletic Association championships.

Tuscaloosa, Ala. - What could have been a special night for the upset-minded Tulane Green Wave became a missed opportunity thanks to the Alabama special teams units. The No. 13 (AP/No. 17 USA Today) Crimson Tide used a pair of returns from their punt team to hold off Tulane, 20-6, Saturday at Bryant-Denny Stadium in Tuscaloosa.

The Green Wave (0-1) held the Alabama offense to just one touchdown, but two mistakes on the first quarter -an 87-yard punt return for touchdown by Javier Arenas and a 17-yard punt block return for touchdown by Chris Rogers- were the difference making plays for the Crimson Tide (2-0).

Tulane held a 318-172 advantage in total yardage over an Alabama team which racked up 419 yards against No. 9 Clemson last weekend. The Green Wave defense turned in four sacks and a forced fumble while holding the Crimson Tide to under 100 yards rushing.

"First, my hat's off to Alabama," Toledo said. "They are a great football program. Nick's (Saban) is doing a nice job and he has a lot of good young football players. I'm proud of our team's effort. Our kicking game really let us down tonight. They returned a punt for a touchdown. They blocked a punt and returned for a touchdown, and we missed two field goals. Our red zone offense wasn't very good either and that's a credit to them. They did a good job of keeping us out of the end zone."

Redshirt sophomore quarterback Kevin Moore completed 28-of-49 passing attempts in his first career start for 225 yards without an interception. Eleven different players caught passes for the Green Wave, which was led by senior wide out Brian King's six receptions for 51 yards. Junior wide receiver Jeremy Williams and junior tailback Andre Anderson each caught four passes. Anderson led the Green Wave on the ground, with 32 yards, while freshman running back Nathan Austin chipped in 24 yards on five carries.

In the first half, Tulane owned a 166-38 advantage in total offense, and held an 8-5 edge in first downs. Tulane also led in time of possession, but it was the special teams' play that put the Wave behind the Tide. Arenas broke Alabama's single-game return yardage mark in the first half.

"All in all, I think we did pretty well but we have some work to do," Burks said. "We know the car is running and now we just need to tune it up. We made some mistakes that people in the stands probably wouldn't have noticed, but for us it was a big blow. We need to do better. I think Alabama held some things back that we prepared for during the week. I think we had a pretty good game plan against them and we came out and executed, but we didn't come out on top."

Alabama rolled up 262 return yards, 171 off of seven punt returns, and the 'Bama defense kept the Green Wave out of the end zone in three red-zone attempts.

Junior safety Corey Sonnier, senior linebacker Evan Lee, and sophomore linebacker Devin Holland led Tulane with seven tackles each, while Burks, junior end Logan Kelley, sopho-

more tackle Justin Adams and senior corner Josh Lumar each put Alabama quarterback John Parker Wilson on his back for a sack. Lumar also added a pair of pass breakups. NEW ORLEANS - For the second-straight week, the Tulane football team went toe-to-toe with a top 15 team, but once again Tulane failed to deliver the knock-out blow. The Green Wave led 24-21 in the fourth quarter against No. 14 East Carolina, but a 24-yard touchdown pass with 1:41 remaining in the game helped the Pirates escape the Superdome with a 28-24 victory.

Tulane junior running back Andre Anderson ran for two touchdowns, and gained 82 yards on the ground while red-shirt sophomore quarterback Kevin Moore threw for a career-best 236 yards, including a touchdown.

Three times, Tulane answered Pirates touchdowns with touchdowns of their own before finally taking the lead in the fourth quarter on a field goal by junior kicker Ross Thevenot. But the Pirates responded in the waning minutes with their late score to drop the Green Wave to 0-2 overall and 0-1 in Conference USA. East Carolina improves to 3-0 on the season, 1-0 in C-USA. The Pirates were led by Patrick Pinkney's 260-yard passing effort, which included two touchdowns on 22-of-32 attempts.

The Tulane defense pounded Pinkney for five sacks by five different players, and the Wave forced four fumbles, recovering three. Senior defensive end Reggie Scott led the Green Wave defense, turning in a sack and his first career interception. Senior linebacker Evan Lee recorded a sack and a fumble recovery, while sophomore linebacker Logan Kelley forced two fumbles.

But once again, an early special teams' play bit Tulane. After a scoreless first, the Pirates' C.J. Wilson blocked a field goal attempt from Thevenot, and Quentin Cotton scooped it up and returned the ball 44 yards for a touchdown for a 7-0 lead early in the second quarter.

Kelley forced the ball free from ECU running back Jon Williams and Lee recovered the fumble for the Wave at the 10 yard line. On third and one, Anderson took the ball up the middle untouched for his third career rushing score, to tie the game at 7-7. For the second-straight week, Tulane kept a top 15 team's offense out of the end zone in the first half. The Wave held East Carolina to just 76 yards in the first half, and owned a 21:46 to 8:14 edge in time of possession.

East Carolina opened the second half with a 10-play, 49-yard drive capped by a three-yard touchdown run by Brandon Simmons. But the Wave struck back, as Williams got behind the ECU safety for a 47-yard touchdown reception from Moore. Williams hauled in the second-and-10 pass at the five and trotted in to tie the game at 14-14 with 8:04 left in the third quarter.

Four plays later, the Pirates' Norman Whitley took a screen pass from Pinkney, and with a caravan traveled 51-yards to the house for a 21-7 lead, on what capped a string of 11 consecutive completions from Pinkney. Moore found Williams again for a 50-yard gain to the ECU 19, splitting double coverage with a catch in traffic. Anderson took in his second touchdown of the day, also from one yard out, to knot the game once again, at 21-21 with 2:51 left in the third.

On a swing pass to the outside, senior corner Josh Lumar forced an ECU fumble, and senior safety David Skehan recovered the ball at the ECU 31. After Anderson's 13-yard rush, Moore found sophomore fullback Jordan Stephany on an 11-yard gain down to the six, setting up first and goal as the third quarter came to a close. The East Carolina defense held their ground, holding the Wave to a field goal. Thevenot's 28-yarder gave Tulane its first lead of the game, 24-21 with 13:40 left.

After a 27-yard Pinkney pass to Darryl Freeney, Pinkney ran a keeper down to the Tulane 34-yard line. The Pirates converted on third down for just the third time in the game, keeping the

NEW ORLEANS - Junior running back André Anderson ran for a career-high 157 yards and a touchdown and junior safety Corey Sonnier posted a career-high 10 tackles as the Tulane University football team used a complete-team effort to defeat Louisiana-Monroe, 24-10, Saturday afternoon in the Louisiana Superdome.

Anderson posted his first career 100-yard game, while sophomore quarterback Kevin Moore threw for a career-best 272 yards on 19-of-32 passing. Sonnier, meanwhile, paced a Green Wave (1-2) defense that posted four sacks on the day while limiting the Warhawks (1-3) to 182 yards of total offense. In addition, the Green Wave defense held ULM to a 1-for-10 performance in third-down conversions.

The Green Wave got off to a fast start as junior Jeremy Williams brought the opening kickoff back 44 yards, Moore connected with sophomore tight end Cody Sparks for a 37-yard gain on the first play from scrimmage, and Anderson scored from nine yards out three plays later to put Tulane on top 7-0 just 1:50 into the ballgame.

Two drives later, Tulane doubled its advantage when freshman running back Albert Williams took an end-around handoff from Moore, darted up the right sideline and broke a couple of tackles along the way for a 37-yard score. A 24-yard field goal by junior kicker Ross Thevenot put the Wave on top, 17-0, with seven seconds left in the first half to give the home team the lead at the break.

Junior cornerback Charles Harris thwarted UL-Monroe's first drive of the second half with an interception, but the Warhawks were able to put together a seven-play, 50-yard drive during their second possession to give kicker Radi Jabour the opportunity to split the uprights from 47-yards out to make it a 14-point ballgame.

The Tulane offense, however, all but sealed the win in the opening drive of the fourth quarter when Moore connected with Williams from 19 yards out to give the Green Wave a commanding 24-3 advantage. ULM cut the lead back to 14 with a 10-play, 74-yard drive on the ensuing possession, which culminated with a direct snap to Darrell McNeal for a four-yard touchdown, but that was the last time the Warhawks touched the football.

Tulane took over at its own 13 yard line following a Green Wave penalty with 5:36 left to play, and Anderson put the game away almost single-handedly. Anderson ran the ball on nine of the next 10 plays to account for 40 yards before Moore took a knee twice to spark the home team's celebration.

Anderson's rushing total came on a career-best 38 carries, which ranks tied for fifth in Tulane single-game history. He also hauled in a pair of passes for 20 yards to give him 177 yards of total offense for the day.

Williams led the Green Wave aerial attack with six receptions for 49 yards and a score,

NEW ORLEANS - Junior RB André Anderson ran for a career-best 219 yards and sophomore QB Kevin Moore posted the first three-touchdown performance of his career as Tulane defeated Conference USA foe SMU, 34-27, at the Louisiana Superdome. The Green Wave scored 31 points in the first half courtesy of Moore's three scoring strikes, an Anderson touchdown jaunt and a 32-yard field goal by junior Ross Thevenot to take a 24-point lead into the locker room at the break. In the second half, the Mustangs rallied for a pair of touchdown passes by Bo Levi Mitchell and two field goals by Thomas Morestead. The first-half advantage, however, proved to be the difference in the ballgame.

For the third consecutive week, Anderson was the Green Wave's workhorse as he carried the ball 36 times and finished the day with 257 all-purpose yards - the seventh-most in Tulane single-game history - after hauling in four passes for another 38 yards through the air.

Ninety-three of his rushing yards came in the first half on 17 carries, while Anderson galloped for another 126 yards after halftime. With Tulane clinging to a seven-point lead late in the ballgame, Anderson put the game away with a 40-yard run to give the Green Wave a first down, which allowed the team to run out the clock.

Moore's favorite target on the evening was junior WR Jeremy Williams, who hauled in six passes for 124 yards and two touchdowns. Williams' 51-yard touchdown reception two and a half minutes into the second quarter put Tulane on top 17-0, but SMU got on the board just over two minutes later when Mustang QB Bo Levi Mitchell found Aldrick Robinson streaking down the left sideline for a 45-yard scoring strike.

The Green Wave responded with a six-play, 71-yard drive on the ensuing possession with culminated on a one-yard touchdown plunge by Anderson, and Moore found Williams again - this time from 21 yards out - with 2:15 remaining in the first half to give Tulane a commanding 31-7 lead.

The second half, however, was a much different ballgame as SMU capitalized on a pair of Tulane turnovers to claw their way back into the ballgame. A fumble on the opening possession of the third quarter led to a 25-yard Morestead field goal. Tulane had something going on its next drive, but SMU LB Justin Smart cut a route at the Mustang 10 yard line, and that led Morestead's second field goal of the stanza.

SMU's defense forced a Tulane punt, and the Mustang offense methodically moved 80 yards on six plays to cut the lead to 11 when Mitchell found Emmanuel Sanders from 18 yards out to make it a 31-20 ballgame. Tulane stretched the lead back to 14 on a 43-yard Thevenot field goal with 4:01 left in the game, but Levi connected
