► Set the Tulane career record for lowest interception percentage (INTs per attempts) in school history with a mark of 2.73 (27 INTs in 987 attempts). Finished his career

ranked in the Tulane all-time Top 10 in 18 categories, including third in TD passes (60), completions (570) and passing efficiency (129.81). In the career top four on 13 different lists after just two seasons as a full-time starter. Also ranks in the Top 10 all-time in Conference USA in 10 different passing and total offense records. Served as team captain his junior and senior years.

2003: Completed one of the top three seasons by a Tulane quarterback by picking up second team All-Conference USA honors at quarterback. An honorable mention choice to the All-Louisiana team. One of seven finalists for the 2003 Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award given to senior quarterbacks. Led C-USA in passing and touchdown passes; his 33 TD passes are the second-highest Tulane single season total and ranked among the Top 10 in the country. Second in the league in total offense. Posted just the third 3,000-yard passing season in Green Wave history with 3,077 yards while completing nearly 60 percent (.595) of his passes. Completed 251 passes (third-best single season) on 422 attempts with just 14 INTs. Threw at least one TD pass in each of Tulane's 12 games in 2003. Gained 293 rushing yards on the year but netted just 80 with a pair of rushing TDs versus Houston (10/11). Career-long rush of 36 yards came versus TCU (9/1). Successful throwing deep in 2003 with passes of 50 yards or longer in five games, including completions of 68, 77, 78 and 87 yards. Hit Chris Bush in stride for a career-long 87-yard touchdown pass versus East Carolina (11/22) in the season finale. That was the second-longest completion in Tulane history and the fourth-longest in Conference USA. Completed 14-of-20 passes in that game for 227 yards with four touchdown passes. Versus UAB (11/8), hit Roydell

Williams with a 78-yard TD pass, and added scoring passes of 25 and 35 yards while totalling 255 passing yards. Threw nine TD passes and just two INTs in the last three games of the season. Recorded four straight 300-yard passing games to start the year and had nine 200-plus yard passing days. Threw for 350 yards versus Army (9/20) on 26-of-34 passing while tying a school record with five TDs. Named LSWA Offensive Player of the Week for that effort. Completed 13-of-17 passes for 146 yards with two TDs in the last 8:22 of the Miss. St. (9/13) game to bring Tulane back from a 28-14 deficit, and finished the game hitting 29-of-47 passes for 349 yards, four TDs and no INTs. Earned C-USA Offensive Player of the Week honors following that contest. Threw for 353 yards and four TDs versus Northwestern State (9/6), hitting 29-of-48 passes, including the 23-yard game-winner in overtime. Completed 25-of-42 passes for 303 yards with two TDs in the TCU game, including a 68-yard completion. Totalled 32-plus rushing yards in three games and finished with positive yardage in eight of 12 contests on the year.

2002: With 230 completions in 401 attempts for 2,468 yards and 19

TDs, posted one of the top passing and total offense seasons in school history. Finished his first season as a starter with a victory in the Hawaii Bowl where he completed 20-of-39 passes for 240 yards, rushed for a pair of touchdowns and a two-point conversion and threw for another PAT. Completed 58% of his passes on the year and threw touchdown passes of 64 (vs. Southern Miss), 54 (vs. Navy), 43 (vs. ULM) and 44 (vs. Southern) yards. Finished the year with six rushing TDs. Threw 13 TD passes with just two interceptions and two 300-yard games during Tulane's four-game winning streak. Gained more rushing yards (236) than anyone on the team except Mewelde Moore. Ranked fourth in Conference USA in passing efficiency and total offense. Hit Nick Narcisse with a season long 64-yard touchdown pass to seal the win over Southern Miss (11/23). Earned C-USA Co-Offensive Player of the Week honors after tying a TU school record with five TD passes while completing 25-of-35 passes for 329 yards versus Navy (10/26). Rushed for a score versus Army (11/16) while completing 24-of-40 passes. Had a pair of 300-yard passing games, versus Navy and UL-Monroe (10/5), when he completed 21-of-35 passes. His season-long rush of 22 yards came at Memphis and scampered for 19-yard gains in both the Texas and Southern Miss games. Threw four touchdown passes at ULM. Completed 31-of-48 passes (both career highs) for 236 yards versus East Carolina (9/14) to record the ninth-most completions in Tulane history.

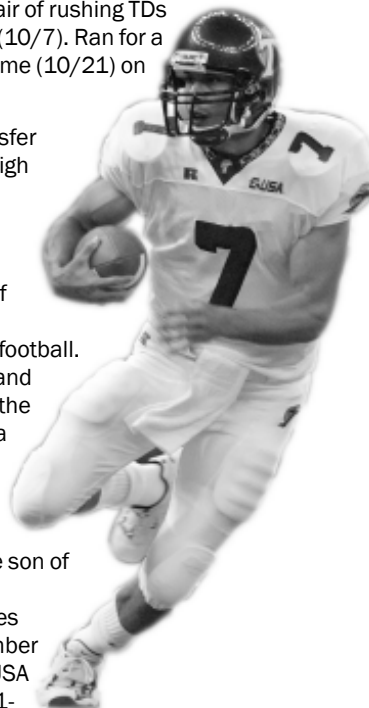
2001: Played in three games as the backup to current Washington Redskins quarterback Patrick Ramsey. Made his only start of the year against Army (10/27) with Ramsey injured, tallying three touchdowns and 384 yards on 25-of-39 passing. Also had a three-yard touchdown jaunt. His 384 passing yards is the eighth-best single-game total in school history, bettered by just three quarterbacks all-time. Played late in the East Carolina game (9/8), connecting on three-of-four passes, including a 50-yard touchdown strike to Roydell Williams. Suffered a knee injury in practice during Tulane's open week in September and did not return to play until the Army game.

2000: Saw action in 10 games, completing 58-of-115 passes for 722 yards. Also rushed 59 times for 133 yards, third on the team. Was selected as the top freshman quarterback in Conference USA. Made his first career start against East Carolina (9/16), completing 20-of-35 passes for 299 yards and a pair of touchdowns. Also had a season-long rush of 24 yards in that contest and added a 21-yard scamper versus Southern Miss. Notched a pair of rushing TDs in the win over Louisiana-Lafayette (10/7). Ran for a career-best 82 yards in the Army game (10/21) on 13 carries.

1999: Redshirted due to NCAA transfer regulations. Graduated early from high school and spent the spring 1999 semester at UCLA before opting for Tulane.

HIGH SCHOOL: A 1999 graduate of Venice High School in Venice, Calif., where he lettered for three years in football. Earned Parade All-America honors and was rated the No. 3 quarterback in the nation by *PrepStar Magazine*. Also a member of the *Dallas Morning News National 100*.

PERSONAL: Jonathan Paul Losman. Born March 12, 1981. The son of Greg and Tricia Losman. Earned his bachelor's degree in classical studies with a minor in media arts in December 2003. Selected to the Conference USA Commissioner's Honor Roll for 2001-02. Last name is pronounced LOSS-men.
