### TULANE CONCLUDES 2010 CAMPAIGN AT MARSHALL

• The Tulane football team (4-7, 2-5 C-USA) concludes the 2010 season this Saturday with a nationally televised contest on CBS College Sports against the Marshall Thundering Herd (4-7, 3-4 C-USA) at Joan C. Edwards Stadium in Huntington, W.Va. Kick-off is slated for 11:04 a.m. Roger Twibell will describe the action while former Texas Tech head football coach Mike Leach will serve as the color analyst.



Tulane is 2-2 overall on the road this season, but is just 1-2 in Conference USA road games. TU picked up its last win away from home at UTEP (34-24) on Oct. 23. The Wave's only other road win was at Rutgers, 17-14, on Oct. 2.

### C-USA FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR CANDIDATE ORLEANS DARKWA IS C-USA'S, NON-AQ TOP FRESHMAN RUSHER, RANKS SEVENTH NATIONALLY IN ALL-PURPOSE YARDS

• **Orleans Darkwa** is making a late run toward C-USA Freshman of the Year honors and has established himself as one of the top freshman running backs in the nation in 2010.

Darkwa has rushed for 860 yards on 161 carries (5.3 ypc) and nine touchdowns. His rushing average of 86.0 yards per game ranks second overall among C-USA's top backs but is the most in the league by a rookie back.

On the national level, Darkwa's yards per game is the fourth-best effort by a freshman running back this season, ranking only behind South Carolina's Marcus Lattimore (106.6 ypg), San Diego State's Ronnie Hillman (104.7 ypg) and Wisconsin's James White (89.50), and is the most by a player from a non-automatic qualifier program.

With 110.10 all-purpose yards per contest, Darkwa leads all C-USA freshmen and ranks third among non-automatic qualifier teams and is sixth overall among the national freshman all-purpose yardage leaders.

### DARKWA MARCHING TOWARDS TULANE'S FRESHMAN RUSHING MARK

• **Orleans Darkwa** has his sights set on breaking Tulane's single season record for rushing yards by a freshman. With 860 yards, Darkwa needs 31 yards on Saturday to break the current mark of 890 yards set by **Mewelde Moore** during the 2000 season. Darkwa is also 140 yards shy of becoming the first TU rookie to rush for 1,000 yards.

### TWENTY FRESHMEN EARN PLAYING TIME THIS SEASON

• Twenty Tulane players, including 12 true freshmen and eight redshirt freshmen, have earned playing time this season and that total is the 15th most in the nation this season. ### NOTING THE GREEN WAVE

- In 11 of 12 games this season, all but one Tulane opponent has entered its match-up against the Green Wave coming off a loss. The only exception was Southeastern Louisiana in the 2010 season opener.

- Senior QB **Kevin Moore** started for the 13th time of his career last Saturday against UCF and it marked his first start since the 2008 finale against Memphis on Nov. 29, 2008. In the UCF game, Moore recorded his first career rushing touchdown on a six-yard run in the second quarter, which capped a 99-yard drive.

- Tulane defenders have registered nine interceptions on the year, which is the most since the Green Wave snared 14 in 2003.

- Tulane has forced 21 turnovers this season (12 fumbles recovered; 9 int.) and has made the most of its opponent freebies by turning 14 of the 21 turnovers into points, including 10 touchdowns and four field goals. TU has forced an opponent turnover in nine of 11 games with Tulsa and UCF as the only exception.

- LB **Trent Mackey** has 111 tackles (60 solo) to lead the Green Wave this season. Mackey's total are the most by a Tulane player in a season since **Evan Lee** had 99 (48 solo, 51 assists) in a 12-game effort in 2007. With one game remaining in the regular season, Mackey will become the first TU defender to register 100 tackles in a season since LB **Anthony Cannon** totaled 114 in 2005.

- Senior DT **Justin Adams** recorded a sack against Rice and increased his team-leading season total to 7.5 for the year and also leads the team lead in tackles for loss with 11.5. Adams sack total ranks seventh among the school's single season leaders and his 12 career sacks ranks ninth among TU's career leaders. Adams sack total this season is the most since Floyd Dorsey recorded 9.5 in 2002.

- Senior C **Andrew Nierman** is a three-year starter who has started all 46 games he has played in during his career. His lone absence was last season against LSU due to a back injury. Since that game, Nierman has started 12 consecutive games for the Green Wave.

- Several Tulane players extended their double-digit starting streaks - senior OT **Pete Hendrickson** with 35 straight, senior CB **Phillip Davis** with 22 and sophomore WLB **Darryl Farley** with 14. In addition, senior DT **Justin Adams**, sophomore DE **Austen Jacks**, sophomore MLB **Trent Mackey**, sophomore FS **Shakiel Smith**, sophomore DB **Ryan Travis**, senior SS **Alex Wacha** have each started every game this season.

### SCOUTING THE THUNDERING HERD

- A pair of 4-7 teams closes out their respective seasons this Saturday. Marshall (4-7, 3-4 C-USA) saw its three-game win streak come to an end last week on the road at SMU (31-17). The Thundering Herd has won two straight home games and is 3-2 overall at home, including 2-1 in C-USA home contests.

- Quarterback **Brian Anderson** has started every game this season and has completed 57.9 percent (209-of-361) of his attempts for 2,196 yards and 18 touchdowns but has 14 interceptions.

- Running back **Martin Ward** has a team-best 345 yards on 96 attempts (3.6 ypc) and one touchdown, while receiver **Aaron Dobson** has a team-high 44 receptions for 689 yards and five scores.

- Linebacker **Mario Harvey** ranks seventh nationally and second among C-USA players in tackles with 122 (56 total) this season, while teammate DL **Vinny Curry** has a team-best 16.0 stops for lost yardage, including a C-USA best 14 sacks.

# Green Wave Game Notes

## SERIES & NOTES:

- Saturday's game marks fourth all-time meeting between Tulane and Marshall and the Thundering Herd lead the series, 3-0.

- Marshall joined Conference USA in 2005 and is the only C-USA team the Green Wave has never defeated.

- The last meeting in Huntington, W.Va., was during the 2006 campaign. Marshall broke a 21-21 deadlock with three fourth quarter touchdowns to win, 42-21.

- The Green Wave has an overall mark of 2-7 against teams from the Mountain State. TU is 0-3 against Marshall and has a mark of 2-4 against West Virginia Univ.

## THE COACHES:

**Tulane: Bob Toledo** (San Francisco State, 1968) is in his fourth season as the head coach of the Green Wave. Toledo has a 13-34 mark at Tulane and a career record of 91-102 in 17 years as a Division I head coach. He became the 37th head coach in school history on Dec. 11, 2006, and has coached in 13 bowl games, including seven traditional New Year's Day bowls.

His previous head coaching stint was at UCLA (1996-2002), where he led the Bruins to two Pac-10 titles, a school-record 20-game win streak, two final top-10 national rankings and was twice named the Pac-10 Coach of the Year.

**Marshall: Doc Holliday** (West Virginia, 1979) is in his first season as a collegiate head football coach at Marshall and has a record of 4-7 at the school. Holliday was named the Thundering Herd's 29th head football coach on December 17, 2009.

Holliday, a Hurricane W.Va. native, is widely regarded as one of the top recruiters in the nation and he brings with him 31 years of collegiate coaching experience to Marshall that includes stops at Florida, N.C. State and West Virginia.

## EVERYBODY WANTS TO THROW A TOUCHDOWN

- This season, four different players have thrown a touchdown pass for Tulane, including 13 by quarterback **Ryan Griffin**, two by quarterback **Kevin Moore**, two by running back **Orleans Darkwa** and one by receiver **D.J. Banks**.

## DARKWA IN RARE AIR FOR ROOKIE RUNNING BACKS AT TULANE

- Freshman RB **Orleans Darkwa** has nine rushing touchdowns this season, putting him one shy of the freshman rushing touchdown record of 10 set by Jamaican Dartez in 1995. Darkwa's nine touchdowns also move him into a sixth-place tie in single-season rushing touchdowns with **Marvin Lewis**, who scored nine in 1981.

With 129 rushing yards last week vs. UCF, Darkwa surpassed the 100-yard rushing mark for the fifth consecutive game. He becomes the first Tulane player to post five consecutive 100-yard rushing efforts since **Matt Forte** recorded eight straight 100-yard rushing games in 2007 and now owns the freshman record for consecutive 100-yard rushing outings. He is tied with SMU's Zach Line for the most 100-yard rushing games among C-USA backs this season (five).

## SUPER SOPHS COME UP BIG FOR TULANE AGAINST RICE

- Four sophomores came up big for Tulane in its 54-49 win over Rice. Quarterback **Ryan Griffin** completed 21-of-34 passes for 314 yards and three touchdowns, **D.J. Banks** had two rushing touchdowns and a receiving touchdown, **Ryan Grant** had 140 receiving yards and two touchdown catches, and safety **Shakiel Smith** had two interceptions and logged a career-high 18 tackles. Griffin received an ESPN non-AQ helmet sticker and was recognized by the Manning Award as a Player to Watch for his effort.

## WAVE-HERD CONTEST FEATURES TWO OF THE NATION'S TOP LINEBACKERS

• This week a pair of the nation's top linebackers will meet on the same field. Tulane sophomore Trent Mackey has 111 tackles (60 solo) this season and ranks third among Conference USA players and ranks 19th nationally, while Marshall's Mario Harvey has 122 stops (56 solo), which ranks second among C-USA players and seventh nationally. Mackey and Harvey each have a single-game best 17 tackles this season.

## DAVIS RANKS 11TH NATIONALLY FOR PASSES DEFENDED; FIRST AMONG C-USA DEFENDERS

• Senior CB **Phillip Davis** has been tough on opposing quarterbacks. Davis has registered 10 pass breakups and three interceptions this season and ranks 11th nationally for passes defended and his total is first among C-USA players. Davis' interception total is fifth among league players. Davis registered a career-high three breakups at Tulsa.

## WAVE DEFENSE RANKS FIRST IN PASS DEFENSE, FIFTH IN TOTAL DEFENSE

• The Green Wave's pass defense leads Conference USA teams in pass defense, surrendering just 195.90 yards through the air per game. Among its season highlights was holding Army to 31 total passing yards, slowing UTEP to just 102 passing yards and 128 yards to Southern Miss and 177 to UCF.

As a collective group, TU's secondary has eight interceptions and 26 pass breakups and has allowed just one 300-yard passing game this season (SMU-358).

Tulane's total defense comes in this week ranked fifth among C-USA teams, giving up 400.91 yards per outing. In the sack department, TU ranks fourth in the league with 2.00 per outing, which also ranks 59th nationally. TU defenders have logged a combined 22 for minus 161 yards this season.

## SHAK SMITH COMES THROUGH WITH CAREER EFFORT VS. RICE

• Sophomore **Shakiel Smith** played an instrumental role in leading Tulane to a 54-49 conference win over Rice. Smith started and produced a career-high 18 tackles (14 solo), including one for lost yardage from his safety position, and came up with a pair of interceptions in the first half that led to 14 points.

During the waning seconds and Rice facing a third and seven from the Tulane 11-yard line and the Green wave clinging to a five point advantage, Smith came up with a crucial play when he broke up a Rice pass attempt in the end zone.

## WHAT'S GOING ON HERE?

• Two weeks ago, the Tulane offense was cruising along with 512 total yards and 54 points, but Tulane's scoring methods seemed out of whack. First, there was receiver **D.J. Banks** running for a pair of scores and then there was running back **Orleans Darkwa** throwing two touchdown passes. Finally, a tight end was hogging all the limelight with **Cody Sparks** hauling in a pair of touchdown passes in the second quarter. Things finally returned to normal in the second half with quarterback **Ryan Griffin** throwing two touchdown passes to **Ryan Grant** and one to Banks.

## BANKING ON THE D.J.

• Tulane super sophomore **D.J. Banks** has turned into a do-it-all performer this season. Banks has been productive as a runner, a receiver or as a passer. He spends most of his time at receiver where he is second on the team in receptions (44) and yards (399) and has three touchdowns. He has 18 rushing attempts for 83 and two scores and he has also moonlighted at quarterback where he has completed 3-of-4 attempts for 52 yards and a score. Banks has been responsible for six scores and is the only player on the team to catch, rush and throw a touchdown this season.

## DRIVE TIME

• The Tulane offense has been able to sustain several long drives this season and the majority of those have resulted in touchdowns. Through 11 games, Tulane has 20 drives with 10+ plays and 16 of the 20 have resulted in points, including 10 touchdowns and six field goals. TU has scored a touchdown on all but one of the series that went 78+ yards, including a pair of 92-yard drives and engineered a season long 18-play drive against Army for a score. Last week against UCF, Tulane went on a season-long 99-yard drive on 15 plays for a touchdown. The 99-yard drive tied the school record.

## CAIRO SANTOS ON OF NATION'S TOP KICKING FRESHMAN

• Freshman **Cairo Santos** as emerged as one of the nation's top kickers this season. Santos ranks 47th nationally in field goals per game (13-of-16; .812) but his total places him sixth in the nation and first in C-USA for freshman kickers.

Along with his field goal totals, Santos has connected on 29-of-30 PATs this season for a team-best 68 points, the sixth-best total among C-USA players and the second-most in the league by a rookie kicker.

## SPARKS REACHES MILESTONE AGAINST RICE

• TE **Cody Sparks** continues to become a high value target in the Tulane offense this season. Sparks ranks third on the team in receptions (37), yards (328) and is first for receiving touchdowns (6). He has caught at least one pass in 10 of Tulane's 11 games this season.

Two weeks ago vs. Rice, Sparks tied his career receiving mark with seven receptions and grabbed a pair of touchdowns. Sparks' six scores this season is a Tulane single-season record for TD catches by a tight end. The former mark of five was previously held by former NFL All-Pro Rodney Holman with five in 1979. Sparks' six career scores - all of which have come during the 2010 season - is the most by a Tulane tight end since Larry Route had eight from 1983-86.

Sparks' efforts this season and the past two seasons ranks him as one of the top five most productive tight ends in the last 30 years. He needs just one more catch to move into fourth place on TU's single season reception for tight ends and is 21 yards shy of catching Wade Elmore's 1984 total of 349, which ranks sixth on TU's single-season charts.

## GRANT HAS BREAKOUT SOPHOMORE CAMPAIGN

• After getting off to a slow start with three receptions in the first four games, sophomore WR **Ryan Grant** is making sure he concludes the 2010 season on a strong note. Grant ranks fourth on the team in receptions (25), but is second in yardage (447) and third in receiving touchdowns. He does own the best yards per reception average (17.9) and has the longest receiving score of the year with a 73-yard game-winner against Rice.

Grant has hauled in three or more catches in five games, including a career-best six receptions at Tulsa and finished with a career-high 140 yards and a pair of TDs vs. Rice.

## ORLEANS THE PASSER?

• Freshman running back **Orleans Darkwa** added another weapon to his arsenal against Rice. Darkwa twice demonstrated his passing ability and both attempts found the endzone. His first career pass was a 40-yard scoring strike to WR **Ryan Grant** in the first quarter. In the second quarter near the goal line, Darkwa lined up in the Pelican formation and found TE **Cody Sparks** for a three-yard touchdown pass. Darkwa now has a passer rating of 610.60.

## THE FACTS ABOUT SACKS, PENALTIES AND TURNOVERS

• Other than the obvious fact that Tulane outscored its opponent in its three wins this season, there are several other trends that stand out when the Green Wave is able to sing the Hullabaloo in the locker room after a win.

In its four wins, Tulane is plus eight in the turnover margin, has allowed just seven total sacks and has committed just 20 penalties for 143 yards, or an average of 5.0 penalties per game.

On the flip side, in its seven losses the Wave has a minus seven in turnover margin, has allowed 17 sacks and has been flagged a total of 25 times for 260 yards.

## ADAMS CONTINUES TO TEAR UP ON OPPONENTS' BACKFIELD

• Through 11 games, **Justin Adams** has doubled his career totals in nearly every defensive category. Adams has 41 tackles and has surpassed his career tackle for loss total with a team-best 11.5 stops for lost yardage, along with 7.5 sacks, five hurries, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. Adams ranks third among Conference USA players and 29th nationally with his .68 sacks per game and he ranks eighth in the league and 72nd nationally for tackles for loss per game with 1.05 per outing.

## ROBOTTOM RANKS AMONG C-USA'S TOP RECEIVERS

• Prior to his injury against Southern Miss, WR **Casey Robottom** was making a strong run toward the top receiver spot among Conference USA players this season. Robottom has a team-best 56 receptions for 663 yards (11.8 ypr) and four touchdowns. His receptions per game ranks fifth in C-USA and 31st nationally, while his 66.30 receiving yards per game ranks ninth in the league and 59th in the country.

In C-USA games only, Robottom has 31 catches for 440 yards and two scores and ranks sixth among conference players in receptions per game (5.2), eighth for receiving yards per game (73.3) and his 10 receptions vs. UTEP is tied for the third most by a C-USA player in league games this season.

### ROBOTTOM CONTINUES CLIMB TOWARD RECORD BOOK

• **Casey Robottom** continued his climb toward the record book and has a chance to finish his career in the Top 10 in both receptions and receiving yards. Despite a hamstring injury, he caught one pass for 30 yards and now has 133 for 1,632 career receiving yards. Those numbers each rank 11th in the Tulane career record book, respectively. He is currently two catches behind Rodney Holman (135 from 1978-81) for 10th place on the Tulane career reception chart.

### ROBOTTOM A DO-IT-ALL PLAYER FOR THE WAVE

• Senior WR **Casey Robottom** does a lot more than catch passes. The LaPlace native leads the team in receptions (56), receiving yards (663) and receiving touchdowns (4). Robottom also is the team's top punt returner 6.1 yards per return, which ranks seventh in the league and he is second on the squad in all-purpose yards (749).

### DEFENSIVE SECONDARY BECOMING PRODUCTIVE, OPPORTUNISTIC

• Tulane's secondary has been very productive this season. Among the group is the sophomore duo of S **Shakiel Smith** and NB **Ryan Travis** and senior tandem of CB **Phillip Davis** and S **Alex Wacha**. Smith is tied for Wacha for second on the team in tackles with 84 (56 solo) and has three interceptions, while Travis is fourth in tackles with 66, including 8.0 stops for lost yardage, two sacks and he also has forced three fumbles, has one recovered a fumble and posted three pass breakups.

Davis has 29 tackles, is tied for the team lead with three interceptions and has also recovered a pair of fumbles and has 10 PBUs, while Wacha has 84 tackles (40 solo) and has forced a fumble and recorded game-saving interceptions at Rutgers and UTEP.

### TU LINEBACKING UNIT HAVING PRODUCTIVE SEASON

• Tulane's linebackers are a big reason for the improvement in its defense this season. The unit has combined for 207 tackles, including 12.0 stops for lost yardage and 2.5 sacks.

Sophomore **Trent Mackey** leads the team with 111 tackles (60 solo), including 7.5 stops for lost yardage, while sophomore **Darryl Farley** has 50 stops (22 solo) and 2.5 sacks and junior **Kristofar Rhymes** has 4.0 stops, while freshmen **Dominique Robertson** (27 tackles/2 TFL), **Zach Davis** (4 tackles) and **Logan Hamilton** (11) have also contributed.

### THE FOOTBALL BOOK ACCORDING TO MOSES

• Junior DE **Dezman Moses** has made a huge impact on the Tulane defense both in run-stopping and pass rushing. Moses has started the last nine games and has 42 tackles (17 solo), including 9.0 stops for lost yardage (second on the team), four quarterback sacks (second on the team) and also has two forced and one fumble recovery, a pass break up and six hurries. Moses ranks second among TU's defensive linemen in tackles this season.

He currently ranks 10th among C-USA players in tackles for loss (1.00 per game) and is ninth in sacks per game (.44) in the league.

In his Tulane debut at Houston, he tallied career-high tackle totals with 10 stops (2 solo, 8 assists), 3.5 tackles for lost yardage and 1.5 sacks against the Cougars.

A week later at Rutgers, Moses recorded six tackles (2 solo), but more importantly recorded a team-high 2.5 tackles for minus 10 yards and tied for a team-best 1.5 sacks for minus 8 yards. He also was responsible for two quarterback hurries on the day.

• Tulane's much-improved defensive line has accounted for 34.0 tackles for lost yardage and 14.5 sacks through 11 games this season. A big reason is the steady play of DE **Austen Jacks** (53 tackles/4.5 TFL), DT **Cedric Wilson** (8 tackles/0.5 sack), DT **Justin Adams** (41 tackles/11.5 TFL/7.5 sacks leads team) Tony Bruany (5 tackles/1 TFL/1 sack) and DE **Josh Smith** (14 tackles/1.0 sack), along with DT **Chris Asumnu** (17 tackles/1.0 sack/2.5 TFL) the addition of DE **Dezman Moses** (42 tackles/9.0 TFL/4.0 sacks).

### GREEN WAVE KICKOFF RETURN TEAM RECEIVES A YOUTH INFUSION

• Sophomore KR **Jordan Sullen** is giving TU's kickoff return unit a much-needed boost. Two weeks ago vs. Rice, Sullen set a career high with 158 yards on six kick-off returns. Sullen recorded a season-best and career-long 33-yard return vs. Rice. For the year Sullen leads the team with 24 returns for 493 yards (20.5 avg).

### WACHA COMES TO THE RESCUE...AGAIN

• For the second time this season, Tulane senior **Alex Wacha** came up for the Green Wave when his team needed his most. Playing on the road at UTEP, Wacha recorded seven tackles from his safety position, but it was his play with the game on the line that proved to be the difference.

With Tulane nursing a 34-24 lead in the final two minutes, UTEP was driving and on the Tulane 30-yard line when Wacha made to decisive plays. The first came when UTEP quarterback Trevor Vittatoe threw to Marlon McClure in the endzone, but Wacha came from behind to knock the ball away at the last second. One play later on a similar play, Wacha intercepted Vittatoe's pass in the endzone to turn away any chance of a Miner comeback.

Wacha also came up with a late game interception on the road at Rutgers when the Scarlet Knights were also in the midst of a game-winning drive.

### SIXTEEN GREEN WAVE EARN FIRST CAREER STARTS

• Sixteen Tulane players have started the first game of their respective careers this season. Sophomore WR **Ryan Grant**, sophomore RT **Eric Jones** and junior RB **Albert Williams** earned their first starts for the offense while freshman DE **Julius Warmlesley**, sophomore LB **Trent Mackey**, sophomore NB **Ryan Travis** and sophomore CB **Alex Lauricella** made their first starts for the defense against Southeastern Louisiana in the season opener. Freshman LB **Dominique Robertson** earned the starting nod at linebacker vs. Ole Miss, while junior DE **Dezman Moses** and freshman RB **Payten Jason** earned his first career starting nod vs. Army, while sophomore **Kendrick Washington** earned the starting nod for the first time vs. SMU.

The latest players to earn their first career starts was OL **Pat Husain** and DE **Josh Smith** against **Southern Miss**, freshman WR **Brent Comardelle** vs. Rice and freshman LB **Zach Davis** vs. UCF.

### FOUR GREEN WAVE EARN C-USA PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS THIS SEASON

• Senior WR **Casey Robottom** was named the Conference USA offensive Player of the Week after he posted career highs with 10 catches and 151 receiving yards, the 24th-best receiving day in school history, and tied a career-high with two touchdown grabs in the Wave's 34-24 victory on the road at UTEP. His 151 receiving yards is the fifth-best effort by a C-USA player this season, while his 10 catches ties are the second-most by a league player in 2010. Robottom also received an ESPN Helmet Sticker for his efforts.

• A pair of Tulane newcomers were honored as the Conference USA Players of the Week as junior **Dezman Moses** received C-USA's Defensive Player of the Week award and freshman **Jonathan Ginsburgh** was selected as the C-USA Special Teams Player of the Week. Both players are first time recipients of the C-USA Player of the Week award.

Moses started and recorded six tackles (two solo) from his defensive end position, but more importantly recorded a team-high 2.5 tackles for loss (minus 10 yards) and tied for a team-best 1.5 sacks for minus 8 yards. He also was responsible for two quarterback hurries on the day.

Ginsburgh turned out to be one of the Wave's biggest weapons in its win at Rutgers. He punted nine times for 382 yards for a 42.4 average and tied the school record for the seventh-longest punt in school history with a 73-yard effort in the second quarter and also placed a pair of punts inside Rutgers' 20-yard line.

Ginsburgh came up with two plays that ultimately helped pave the way for the Wave win. With his back to the goal line and Tulane trailing by seven points, he corralled a high snap, ran to his right with a Rutgers defender in pursuit and kicked a

46-yard effort to turn away a potential disastrous play. In the final minute and half of the game, Tulane was facing a fourth and nine from its own 37-yard line and Rutgers placed 10 men on the line of scrimmage and came with an all out effort to block the punt. However, Ginsburgh saved the Wave once again with a punt that pinned Rutgers on its side of the field.

• **Trent Mackey** was named the Conference USA Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 6. Mackey is the first Tulane player to earn C-USA Defensive Player of the Week honors since **Israel Route** on Nov. 20, 2006, and he is the first TU linebacker to win the league's defensive POW award since **Wesley Heath** on Oct. 15, 2001.

A Louisiana native and transfer from Duke, Mackey earned the start in his first game at Tulane and chalked up a career- and game-high 13 tackles (5 solo), including 2.0 stops for minus eight yards and also forced a fumble in leading the Green Wave to a 27-21 home victory over Southeastern Louisiana in the 2010 season opener. It was the first time Mackey stepped on the field for competition since the 2008 season when he played mostly special teams for the Blue Devils. He sat out the 2009 season due to NCAA transfer regulations.

• Six former Tulane University football standouts made NFL rosters for the 2010 season as running backs **Matt Forté** (**Chicago Bears**) and **Mewelde Moore** (Pittsburg Steelers), offensive tackle **Troy Kropog** (Tennessee Titans) and wide receiver **Roydell Williams** (Washington Redskins) made the 53-man roster while running back **André Anderson** (Buffalo Bills) and wide receiver **Jeremy Williams** (Philadelphia Eagles) earned spots on the practice squads.

The Green Wave half-dozen are six of 83 former Conference USA student-athletes to make it in the NFL this season. UCF leads all league teams with 12 players on pro rosters in 2010, followed by Memphis with 11, East Carolina and Marshall with nine each, Houston and UTEP with eight apiece, Southern Miss with seven and Tulsa with four, while the trio of Rice, SMU and UAB have three each.

## BOB TOLEDO

Head Coach  
 Fourth Year  
 San Francisco State, 1968



- Named the 37th head coach in the 116-year history of the Tulane football program on Dec. 11, 2006.
- Has a 13-34 record at Tulane.
- Led Tulane to its biggest win in 10 years with the Wave's 17-14 road win at Big East Conference member Rutgers on Oct. 2, 2010.
- Sports an overall record of 91-102 in 17 seasons as a collegiate head coach.
- Coached in his 150th game on Sept. 29, 2007, against No. 2 LSU, his 175th game on Oct. 10, 2009, vs. Marshall and his 185th vs. Houston on Sept. 25, 2010.
- Despite a 4-8 record during his first season at Tulane, Toledo still managed to lead the Wave into the national spotlight. Under his offensive philosophy, senior tailback Matt Forté rushed for a school record 2,127 yards, the seventh-best single season total in NCAA history, and he became the 12th player to surpass the 2,000-yard rushing plateau in a single year. Forté earned numerous All-America honors, including second team All-America honors, and was among the contenders for the Heisman Trophy, the Doak Walker and Maxwell Awards, and was named the national player of the week twice in his lone season under Toledo.
- Has more than 30 years of collegiate coaching experience to the Green Wave football team, including head coaching stints at Cal Riverside (15-6 with two championships from 1974-75), University of the Pacific (14-30 from 1979-82) and UCLA (1996-2002). He has coached in 13 bowl games during his career, including seven of the traditional New Year's Day bowls.
- Spent seven years (1996-2002) as the head coach at UCLA where he compiled a 49-32 record overall. The Bruins produced a school-record 20-game winning streak, plus two Pac-10 titles, one Rose Bowl appearance and non-conference victories over Texas (twice), Alabama (twice), Michigan, Ohio State and Texas A&M.
- Under Toledo, UCLA went 10-2 in 1998, climbing to No. 2 in the national polls. The Bruins finished the regular season ranked fifth nationally in scoring offense (40.5) and eighth in total offense (482.6). They set school records for total offense (5,487 yards), passing yards (3,658) and passing touchdowns (29) and Toledo was a finalist for three Coach of the Year awards.
- The 1997 UCLA team finished 10-2 and ranked No. 5 in the nation after rallying to defeat Texas A&M in the Cotton Bowl. The Bruins trailed the Aggies 16-0 before making a dramatic second-half comeback to win 29-23. UCLA averaged 40.7 points and more than 430 yards during the regular season.
- Prior to becoming UCLA head coach in January of 1996, Toledo was the Bruins' offensive coordinator for two seasons (1994-95) under Terry Donahue. Offensive tackle Jonathon Ogden won the Outland Trophy and tailback Karim Abdul-Jabbar was first team All-America in 1995.
- Served as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for R.C. Slocum at Texas A&M for five years (1989-93). During that span, the Aggies posted a gaudy 49-12-1 record with three Southwest Conference titles and five straight bowl games, including three consecutive Cotton Bowl appearances. His 1990 Aggie offense still holds the school record for total yards in a single game (774 yards on 76 plays against Louisiana-Lafayette) and season game average with 471.1 yards per game that year.
- Toledo served as the offensive coordinator at Oregon for six seasons (1983-88), and helped tutor two of the Pac-10's most productive quarterbacks - Chris Miller and Bill Musgrave.
- Before his head coaching stint at Pacific, Toledo guided the secondary under John Robinson at Southern Cal from 1976-78. The Trojans went 31-6 in three seasons and were co-national champs after the 1978 campaign. Toledo's most heralded pupils included Dennis Thurman, Ronnie Lott and Dennis Smith.
- Toledo's first collegiate head coaching position was at Cal Riverside from 1974-75. The Highlanders were 15-6 and captured a pair of California Collegiate Athletic Association championships.

# 2010 Game Recaps

## Game 1 • Tulane 27, Southeastern La. 21

Louisiana Superdome • New Orleans, La.

Sept. 2, 2010 • 20,258

Orleans Darkwa ran for 75 yards and three touchdowns as Tulane opened the 2010 season with a 27-21 win over Southeastern Louisiana at the Louisiana Superdome.

The Green Wave opened the game with a 16-play, 75-yard touchdown drive that chewed 8:25 off the clock, but the game would come down to the final seconds when Justin Adams sacked Lions' quarterback Tyler Beatty to clinch the victory.

Tulane was penalized nine times for 79 yards, and the flags on the Green Wave came at inopportune moments. Two penalties came on fourth down when the Lions were punting, but a pair of offside calls gave Southeastern Louisiana the ball back.

Midway through the fourth quarter, a third-down play incompleteness turned into a first down when pass interference was called following an overthrown ball. The measure hurt as the Lions scored two plays later when Beatty connected with Kory Theodore for a 41-yard touchdown which turned a 27-14 Tulane lead into a six-point ballgame.

On the final drive of the game, Beatty threw what appeared to be a game-sealing incompleteness on fourth down. Another pass interference call gave the Lions new life, but Adams' sack with the clock showing all zeroes to send the home crowd home happy.

All 27 of the Green Wave's points came from true freshman as Darkwa scored 18 points courtesy of his three rushing touchdowns while rookie kicker Cairo Santos connected on field goals of 29 and 27 yards and was true on all three of his PATs.

Darkwa's first touchdown came on the game's opening possession, but the Lions answered Tulane's long drive with an eight-play, 57-yard drive of their own capped by a Beatty-to-Theodore 23-yard scoring strike to tie the game at 7-all. Following a three-and-out, Darkwa put Tulane on top for good with an eight-yard touchdown run four plays later.

Santos closed out the first-half scoring with his first field goal of the contest to make it 17-7 at the break, but Southeastern shifted momentum a bit as the Lions drove down to the one-yard line and were poised to make it a one-score ballgame. Devon Walker, however, jarred the ball loose from Zeke Jones and Phillip Davis recovered the fumble in the endzone for a touchback.

Tulane gave the ball back on the ensuing possession, however, when Ryan Griffin's pass was intercepted by Re'Keem Wilson, and Beatty hit Simmie Yarborough for a 29-yard touchdown strike two plays later to make it a 17-14 affair.

The Green Wave answered with a 13-play, 61-yard drive on the ensuing possession and Santos gave Tulane a six-point lead with a 27-yard field goal. Trent Mackey gave Tulane the ball back one play later when he ripped the ball from Yarborough and Darkwa put Tulane on top 27-14 with 11:15 left to play. Theodore's touchdown catch 1:46 later made things interesting but it proved to be the final score of the ballgame.

## Game 2 • Ole Miss 27, Tulane 13

Louisiana Superdome • New Orleans, La.

Sept. 11, 2010 • 36,389

D.J. Banks had a career-high 85 yards on six catches and Trent Mackey posted a personal-best 14 tackles (10 solo, 4 assists), but it was not enough as Tulane dropped a 27-13 decision to Ole Miss at the Louisiana Superdome.

Trailing 24-3 at halftime, the Green Wave outscored the Rebels 10-3 over the final 30 minutes of play. A fumble on the opening drive of the second half and big plays by the Ole Miss offense throughout the game, however, cost Tulane in the long run.

For the second consecutive game, all of Tulane's points came via true freshmen as Orleans Darkwa scored the Green Wave's lone touchdown on a one-yard plunge with 1:51 to go in the third quarter while Cairo Santos drilled field goals of 19 and 38 yards and was true on his extra point try. The difference in the ballgame was big plays by the Rebels who out-gained the Green Wave in total offense, 374-312, and posted five sacks for 40 yards in losses defensively.

Ole Miss wasted little time taking the lead as Jeremiah Masoli capped a seven-play, 42-yard drive to open the ballgame with a one-yard touchdown run on fourth down to give the Rebels a 7-0 lead they would not relinquish. Following a Tulane punt, Ole Miss marched 78 yards on 11 plays and chewed 5:45 off the clock to take a two-touchdown lead when Brandon Bolden touched paydirt from 16 yards out.

The Tulane defense held tough for most of the remainder of the half, and the offense showed signs of life as the Green Wave mounted a 10-play, 77-yard drive midway through the second quarter which culminated in Santos' first field goal of the night.

The defense held Ole Miss to a 41-yard field goal by Bryson Rose on the ensuing drive but a 70-yard scoring strike from Masoli to Markeith Summers with 1:19 left in the half put Tulane down by 21 heading into the break.

After winning the coin toss and deferring until the second half, Tulane took the third-quarter kickoff and marched down to the Ole Miss five-yard line following a seven-yard pass from Ryan Griffin to Casey Robottom. On the very next play, however, Payten Jason mishandled an option pitch, and Jason Jones recovered for the Rebels.

Tulane's defense held Ole Miss to a three-and-out, and the Green Wave followed with a 12-play, 84-yard drive that Darkwa capped with his touchdown to cut the deficit to 24-10. Following an interception by Phillip Davis, the Wave trimmed the Rebels' advantage to 11 when Santos connected on a season-long 38-yard field goal.

Two plays into the ensuing drive, however, Masoli connected with Summes for a 61-yard gain down the right sideline and Rose split the uprights with a 29-yard field goal four plays later to account for the final score. Tulane had its chances to make things interesting late but punted on its next possession and gave up three sacks on its final drive before time expired.

## Game 3 • Houston 42, Tulane 23

Robertson Stadium • Houston, Texas

Sept. 25, 2010 • 32,007

Kevin Moore came off the bench to lead four scoring drives and the defense posted season highs with five sacks among 11 tackles for loss, but it was not enough as Tulane dropped its C-USA opener to Houston, 42-23, at Robertson Stadium.

After falling behind 21-0, Tulane rallied for 14-straight second-half points before the Cougars closed out the half with another touchdown to claim a 28-14 advantage at the break. The Green Wave cut the deficit to five at 28-23 but Houston converted a pair of late Tulane turnovers into touchdowns to thwart the come-back attempt.

Houston wasted little time jumping out to the early lead as the Cougars took advantage of a short field and drove 26 yards on six plays before Bryce Beall scored from three yards out. It was his first of four touchdowns on the day as he put Houston up 14-0 on the first play of the second quarter, made it a 28-14 game with a one-yard plunge just before halftime, and accounted for Houston's final offensive touchdown with 3:58 left in regulation.

The Cougars took a three-touchdown lead less than three minutes into the second half on a one-yard plunge by Michael Hayes. The Green Wave's first five offensive possessions resulted in four punts and an interception, but the defense gave Tulane the ball back at its own 39-yard line when Darryl Farley forced a fumble on a sack of Terrance Broadway which Josh Smith recovered.

From there, Tulane posted back-to-back scoring drives as Moore connected with Cody Sparks for a 13-yard scoring strike and found Devin Figaro streaking down the right sideline for a 36-yard touchdown to make it a one-score ballgame.

Houston pushed the lead back to 14 with a nine-play, 70-yard drive which culminated with Beall's one-yard touchdown run just before the break, but Tulane defense pitched a shutout in the third quarter and kept the Cougars off the scoreboard during the first 11 minutes of the fourth.

In the meantime, the Green Wave crept back into the game with a 29-yard field goal by Cairo Santos with 4:51 to play in the third quarter and a nine-yard run by Payten Jason made it a 28-23 contest with 9:19 left to go in the ballgame. Tulane's try for two was unsuccessful and that would be the Wave's final points of the day.

While the defense continued to play well until the end, Moore injured his thumb on a sack by Kelvin King and floated a pass which was intercepted by Loyce Means to set up the Houston offense at Tulane's 37 with 5:37 left on the game clock. Five plays later, Beall scored his final touchdown of the night and Means picked off another pass which he returned 42 yards for a touchdown to account for the final score.

## Game 4 • Tulane 17, Rutgers 14

Rutgers Stadium • Piscataway, N.J.

Oct. 2, 2010 • 47,963

Alex Wach's first career interception could not have come at a better time for Tulane as he picked off a Chas Dodd pass at the 24-yard line with 36 seconds left in regulation to seal a 17-14 victory at Rutgers Stadium.

Tulane was forced to come from behind to earn the victory as things did not look good early. Rutgers rattled off the longest touchdown run from scrimmage in school history when receiver Mohamad Sanu took the direct snap in a wildcat formation and ran 91 yards on the second play of the game for the opening score. Tulane's defense was then able to slow down the Scarlet Knights' offense, allowing only 80 yards of total offense and just six rushing the rest of the first half.

Tulane got on the scoreboard with a career-long 39-yard field goal by Cairo Santos with 14:19 remaining in the second quarter after an eight-play, 30-yard drive.

On the ensuing kickoff, Rutgers' Joe Lefeged fielded the kick at his own five-yard line and proceeded to dart in an out of would-be Tulane tacklers and scampered 95 yards for a touchdown, but a holding penalty negated the score that would have given the Scarlet Knights a 14-3 lead. Instead, the ball was placed at their own 10-yard line. Tulane's defense then forced Rutgers to punt after a three-and-out that led to the Green Wave getting the ball at the Scarlett Knights' 33-yard line.

Five plays later, Payten Jason made the most of the good field position when gave Tulane the lead on a two-yard touchdown run. Santos tacked on the extra point to make the score 10-7 and the Green Wave would not relinquish the lead.

Tulane expanded its lead to 17-7 on a trick play with 9:28 left in the third quarter. The play, a touchdown thrown by D.J. Banks to Joe Kemp, went for 24 yards into the endzone. With Kemp lined up under center, the former quarterback threw a backwards pass to Banks, who then hit Kemp on the left side flat. Kemp tripped but kept his balance and scampered into the endzone.

Rutgers climbed back to within three, 17-14, when Dodd connected with Sanu on a 10-yard touchdown pass with 2:37 remaining in the third quarter that capped a 15-play, 55-yard drive that ate 5:33 off the clock for what proved to be the final score.

Tulane totaled 245 yards of offense, including 208 passing. Rutgers tallied 353 yards of total offense that included 148 on the ground.

The Green Wave defense gathered four quarterback sacks and knocked Rutgers' starting quarterback, Tom Savage, out of the game late in the second quarter when TU's Trent Mackey tackled him for a two-yard loss on the Green Wave sideline. Mackey, who leads Tulane in tackles, collected 10 in the game for his fourth straight double figure tackles game.

Sophomore quarterback Ryan Griffin threw for 140 yards on 17-of-28 attempts, while Kemp was 1-3 for 31 yards and Banks completed both of his attempts for 37 yards. Jason led the Green Wave running game with 28 net yards on 15 carries. Casey Robottom and Cody Sparks each pulled down six receptions.

# 2010 Game Recaps

## Game 5 • Army 41, Tulane 23 Louisiana Superdome • New Orleans, La. Oct. 9, 2010 • 28,756

Trent Mackey had a career-high 17 tackles and Casey Robottom posted the first multiple-touchdown outing of his career, but it was not enough as Tulane fell to Army, 41-23, in its homecoming contest at the Louisiana Superdome.

The Black Knights ran for 312 yards and four touchdowns on 62 carries (5.0 avg.) and forced three Green Wave turnovers during a 17-0 Army second quarter.

Tulane fell behind 7-0 as Jared Hassin scored from nine yards out on the Black Knights' first possession, but the Green Wave tied the game with some help from their defense which forced a fumble at Army's 27-yard line. The Green Wave offense took advantage of the short field and tied the game at 7-all when Ryan Griffin connected with Robottom for a six-yard touchdown.

The next three times the Green Wave touched the ball, however, it was with disastrous results as Joe Kemp fumbled on the next possession and Jordan Sullen and Wilson Van Hooser both coughed the ball up on consecutive kickoffs.

Army turned the three turnovers into 10 points as Steelman hooked up with Davyd Brooks for an eight-yard touchdown pass and Alex Carlton connected on a 35-yard field goal attempt. Tulane dodged a bullet following its third fumble as Carlton's 40-yard try was off the mark, but a one-yard Steelman plunge with 1:59 left to play in the first half capped a five-play, 66-yard drive and gave the Black Knights a 17-point advantage heading into the break.

Tulane appeared to catch a break on the opening drive of the second half when Mackey stripped Hassin of the ball to give the Green Wave the ball. An Army challenge overturned the call and the Black Knights stretched the lead to 24 when Hassin hit paydirt from seven yards away 15 plays later.

A five-yard touchdown pass from Griffin to D.J. Banks and Robottom's conversion catch cut the deficit to 16 early in the fourth quarter, but Army's Josh Jackson returned the ensuing kickoff 42 yards to the Green Wave 49 and Hassin scored his second touchdown of the afternoon eight plays later to make it a 34-15 contest. Tulane made things interesting when Griffin hit Robottom for a second scoring strike and Orleans Darkwa scored the two-point conversion to make it a 34-23.

Tulane's on-side kick attempt, however, was plucked from the air by Donaovan Travis, who returned it 31 yards to the Green Wave eight. From there, Brian Cobbs put the finishing touches on the contest with a six-yard touchdown run with 50 second left in regulation.

## Game 6 • Tulsa 52, Tulane 24 H.A. Chapman Stadium • Tulsa, Okla. Oct. 16, 2010 • 23,295

Ryan Griffin's career night was not enough for Tulane as the Green Wave fell to Tulsa, 52-24, at H.A. Chapman Stadium in a Conference USA contest.

Griffin threw for a career-high 412 yards with a career-best 36 completions and 53 attempts and led the Tulane to a season-high 527 yards of total offense, but the Green Wave defense was not able to stop the Tulsa offense that racked up 538 yards of total offense, including 332 yards on the ground.

Tulsa jumped out to an early lead in the game, taking the opening drive 58 yards in three plays that ended with a 33-yard touchdown run by Ja'Terian Douglas.

The Green Wave tied the score with a 43-yard pass from Griffin to Ryan Grant with 6:21 remaining in the opening quarter that capped a six-play, 66-yard drive. Tulane did not find the endzone the rest of the first half and Tulsa scored 17 straight points the rest of the half on a Charles Clay 33-yard reception from G.J. Kinne, a Damaris Johnson 29-yard run and Kevin Fitzpatrick 37-yard field goal.

Tulane opened the second half with a 10-play, 78-yard drive resulting in a 28-yard touchdown pass from Griffin to Cody Sparks. The Golden Hurricane quickly answered 33 seconds later with a touchdown score of their own when Johnson scampered 40 yards into the endzone.

Tulane's Cairo Santos added a 25-yard field goal with 5:51 remaining in the third quarter and Albert Williams capped the Green Wave scoring with a one-yard run with 3:09 remaining in the game.

Tulsa, meanwhile, followed Johnson's second score with a five-yard Alex Singleton touchdown run with 3:43 left to play in the third quarter and added a 25-yard Kinne-to-Clay scoring strike four seconds into the fourth quarter. Singleton accounted for the game's final points with a one-yard run with 7:55 left in regulation.

Robottom and Grant each had over 100 of Griffin's yards. Robottom had a career-best nine receptions for 109 yards and Grant had a career-high six catches for a career-best 128 yards. Sparks, meanwhile, had a career evening with seven receptions for 83 yards.

Kinne completed 15-of-25 passes for 206 yards and Johnson accounted for 87 of Tulsa's rushing yards for the evening.

## Game 7 • Tulane 34, UTEP 24

Sun Bowl • El Paso, Texas

Oct. 23, 2010 • 25,007

Casey Robottom (10 catches, 151 yards) and Orleans Darkwa (21 carries, 114 yards) both surpassed the 100-yard mark receiving and rushing, respectively, as Tulane defeated C-USA foe UTEP, 34-24, at the Sun Bowl.

With the score knotted at 24-all early in the fourth quarter, the Green Wave scored 10 unanswered points courtesy of Robottom's 43-yard touchdown grab from sophomore quarterback Ryan Griffin and a 20-yard field goal by freshman Cairo Santos to provide the winning margin.

As a team, Tulane surpassed the 200-yard mark both rushing and receiving with a season-best 260 yards on 51 carries (5.1 avg.) and 201 yards through the air as Griffin completed 19-of-34 passes for two touchdowns and one interception.

With the score tied at 24-24 following a 28-yard touchdown pass from Trevor Vittatoe to Kris Adams 1:21 into the final stanza, the two teams traded possessions before Robottom put Tulane on top for good. On the drive, Tulane ran six times for 21 yards before Griffin found his favorite target streaking down the left sideline for what proved to be the winning score.

Phillip Davis quelled any talks of a Miners' comeback when he stepped in front of a Vittatoe throw and intercepted his third pass of the season. Six plays later, Santos put the final points on the board with his second field goal of the contest.

UTEP made things interesting late, but Alex Wacha picked off a Vittatoe toss with 50 seconds left in regulation and the Green Wave were able to run out the clock.

Tulane opened the scoring as Darkwa scored on a three-yard touchdown plunge with 4:52 left to play in the opening quarter. From there, UTEP found its rhythm and turned its next two possessions into 10 points. Dakota Warren's 26-yard field goal with 18 seconds left in the first half made it 7-3 and a four-yard Donald Buckram touchdown run 8:28 later gave the Miners a 10-7 lead. The Green Wave answered UTEP's second score with a 38-yard Santos field goal to send the teams into the break tied at 10.

The Miners' Travaun Nixon helped UTEP break the deadlock when he picked off a pass and returned it to the Green Wave 26 yard line on the opening drive of the second half. Five plays later, Leilwon Myers scored a three-yard touchdown to put UTEP back on top 17-10. Griffin made up for the interception when he found Robottom from seven-yard out to cap an 11-play, 80-yard drive. The Green Wave defense got a turnover of its own when Austen Jacks stripped a scrambling Vittatoe of the ball which Dezman Moses recovered. Seven play and 56 yards later, Darkwa scored his second touchdown of the day to put Tulane back on top 24-17 and set up the fourth-quarter action.

## Game 8 • SMU 31, Tulane 17

Louisiana Superdome • New Orleans, La.

Oct. 30, 2010 • 18,636

For the first 42:36 of the Conference USA matchup between Tulane and SMU, the Green Wave defense held the Mustang's high-octane offense in check. The final 17:24, however, was a totally different story as Tulane dropped a 31-17 decision in the Louisiana Superdome.

Tulane led 17-3 courtesy of a 23-yard fumble return for touchdown by Austen Jacks with 2:24 remaining in the third quarter before SMU rallied with a touchdown on the final play of the third quarter to spark a 28-0 rally to provide the final margin.

The Tulane defense held SMU to 243 total yards through the bulk of the first three quarters, but the Mustangs rallied for 249 yards over their next five possessions which culminated with four touchdowns and a two-play drive which ended the ballgame.

Lost in the shuffle of the defeat was a career day by Orleans Darkwa who ran for 193 yards on 29 carries and posted 200 yards of total offense with one reception for a seven-yard gain.

In addition, Tulane ran for a season-best 270 yards on 53 carries marking the second time in as many weeks that the Green Wave offense posted a 200-plus yard rushing effort.

Following Jacks' fumble return for a score, SMU marched 60 yards on seven plays to make it a 17-10 ballgame as Zach Line ran in from five yards out on the final play of the third quarter.

The Mustang defense held Tulane a three-and-out on its ensuing drive and the SMU offense answered with a five-play, 74-yard drive which culminated with a seven-yard Line run to tie the ballgame at 17-all. Their next drive took just two plays as Mustang quarterback Kyle Padron hit Aldrick Robinson for an 82-yard scoring strike to take a 24-17 advantage they would not relinquish.

Tulane had a chance to make things interesting as the Green Wave marched down to the SMU five-yard line, but Ryan Griffin's fourth-down pass was intercepted by Chris Banjo in the endzone for a touchdown. From there, the Mustangs marched 80 yards in five plays as Padron scored on a three-yard keeper to account for the final score.

The day started out well for the Green Wave as Tulane drew first blood when Griffin connected with Cody Sparks for a nine-yard touchdown strike 3:59 seconds into the second quarter to stake Tulane to a 7-0 advantage. SMU answered with a 25-yard Matt Szymanski field goal to cut the deficit to four on the ensuing drive and that was the way the first half ended.

Tulane opened the second half with a 17-play, 68-yard drive that chewed 7:54 off the game clock and freshman kicker Cairo Santos gave the Green Wave a seven-point lead when he split the uprights from 25 yards out. That, however, was the final points the Tulane offense scored and set up the SMU comeback.

Orleans Darkwa posted his third consecutive 100-yard rushing effort with 138 yards and two touchdowns on 27 carries, but it was not enough as Tulane dropped a 46-30 decision to Conference USA rival Southern Miss in the Louisiana Superdome.

The Golden Eagles broke a 30-all tie when Quentin Pierce took a lateral pass and found Johdrick Morris for a 26-yard touchdown strike. The Southern Miss defense held Tulane to 72 yards and no points in the fourth quarter while getting on the scoreboard twice courtesy of a safety and a 41-yard fumble return by Alex Walters to account for the final score.

Southern Miss opened the game with back-to-back Danny Hrapmann field goals to stake the visiting club to a 6-0 advantage.

Following a Green Wave punt, the Tulane defense came up big with a turnover and Ryan Griffin connected with D.J. Banks for a 24-yard touchdown strike to stake the Green Wave to a 7-6 advantage.

On the ensuing kickoff, Reggie Hunt broke free for an 85-yard return to the Tulane four and Kendrick Hardy punched it in from one yard out three players later to put Southern Miss back on top, 13-7.

The Green Wave reclaimed momentum of the ballgame with an eight-play, 78-yard drive which culminated with a four-yard Darkwa touchdown run. Cairo Santo's point-after try was no good, but Tulane had a chance to pad its lead late in the first half as the defense held Southern Miss to a three-and-out on the next drive.

Banks, however, mishandled Peter Boehme's punt at the four-yard line and Chico Hunter recovered to swing momentum back to Southern Miss. Two plays later, Austin Davis found tight end Jonathan Massey in the endzone from one yard out to tie the ballgame with 22 second left to play in the second quarter.

Tulane and Southern Miss traded the next 20 points and Pierce's pass to Morris put the Golden Eagles on top for good with 12:35 left to play. Southern Miss pinned Tulane at their own 14-yard line late in the fourth quarter and Cordaro Law hit Griffin as he dropped back to pass and the ball rolled through the enzone for a safety. Two drives later, Griffin hit Devin Figaro for a nine-yard gain, but Walters ripped the ball from his grasp and raced down the left sideline to provide the winning margin.

Orleans Darkwa eclipsed the 100-yard mark for the fourth straight game and Ryan Griffin threw for 314-yards and three touchdowns - including a 73-yards strike to Ryan Grant for the go-ahead score with 1:46 remaining in the game - as Tulane claimed a 54-49 victory over Rice in the Louisiana Superdome.

Darkwa ran for 113 yards on 26 carries and also threw first-half touchdown passes of 40 and three yards. D.J. Banks, meanwhile, scored on a pair of end arounds and hauled in an 18-yard scoring strike from Griffin. Grant and Cody Sparks each had two touchdown grabs to help Tulane snap a two-game losing streak.

Tulane build a comfortable 38-21 lead at the conclusion of the first half, but the Owls scored on their first two possessions after intermission to make it a 38-35 ballgame. Banks' touchdown reception with 3:36 to play in the third quarter put the Green Wave back on top by 10 only to see Rice march 56 yards on 11 plays to make it a 3-point affair again when Turner Petersen scored on a 36-yard run.

Cairo Santos drilled his second field goal of the afternoon with a 23-yard boot with 5:37 left to play to give Tulane a 48-42 lead, but the Owls answered once again with an eight-play, 55-yard drive which culminated with a 29-yard touchdown pass from Taylor Cook to Patrick Randolph to give Rice its first lead of the game at 49-48 with 2:02 on the clock.

The advantage was short-lived, however, as on the very next play from scrimmage Griffin found a streaking Grant down the middle for what proved to be the final score. Rice had a chance to win the ballgame and were in good position to do so as Petersen returned the ensuing kickoff 22 yards to set up the Owls at their own 47-yard line.

Rice marched down to the Tulane 11 when Cook found Sam McGuffie for a one-yard gain on second down. Cooks next two passes, meanwhile, were off the mark and Tulane took over on downs.

Shakiel Smith paced the Tulane defense with a career high 18 tackles and two interceptions. Alex Wachua was second on the team with 12 stops.

Orleans Darkwa rushed for his ninth touchdown of the season and topped the 100-yard mark in the rushing column for the fifth straight game, but Tulane dropped a 61-14 decision to UCF in the Louisiana Superdome. It was the final home game for 17 seniors, but the Knights scored on the first and last play of the game to claim the Conference USA win.

The Knights took control of the game with a 31-point opening quarter, which started when Quincy McDuffie took the opening kickoff 95-yards for a touchdown, and eventually led 38-0 before the Green Wave would close the half with a pair of scores.

McDuffie had the kickoff return and a receiving touchdown for the Knights, while Nick Cattoi kicked a 35-yard field goal. The scoring was capped by off by a pair of rushing touchdowns from Ronnie Weaver and Latavius Murray. The scoring runs went for 29 and 46 yards, respectively.

A 60-yard touchdown pass from Jeff Godfrey to Kamar Aiken opened the second quarter scoring, but Darkwa put the Green Wave on the scoreboard with nine minutes remaining the half.

Kevin Moore, who played the final home game of his Tulane career, capped the first half scoring when he scampered from six-yards out for a touchdown run with nine seconds left on the clock. It was the first rushing touchdown of his career and made it 38-14 in favor of UCF heading to the locker room.

The first half offensive numbers were close, with UCF holding a 239-193 yard edge, and the Green Wave held the Knights without a conversion on third-down (0-3).

UCF would account for all of the second half scoring, with Godfrey posting a pair of one-yard rushing scores, Cattoi kicking a 47-yard field goal and Jordan Ozerities posting a 100-yard interception return for a touchdown on the final play of the game.

It was the first start for Moore since Nov. 29, 2008 and he compiled 156 passing yards and was 15-of-34 throwing the football. He also rushed seven times for 19 yards and a touchdown, while not being sacked in the game.

Ryan Grant and Cody Sparks each caught four passes to pace the receiving corps, with Grant accounting for 63 of the teams 192 receiving yards. Darkwa had 129 rushing yards, with a long of 28, and scored a touchdown in the loss
