THE SERIES VS. UTSA

This will be the first meeting between the two schools. Beth Dunkenberg is 9-0 against the Roadrunners while Rae Rippetoe-Blair, in her eighth season in San Antonio, Texas, is 0-0 versus the Hokies.

SEASON TOURNEYS

Including last season's appearances in the Basketball Travelers Classic at LSU, the Pepperdine Thanksgiving Tournament, and Tech's own Lady Luck Classic, the Hokies are 37-11 in regular-season tournaments in the last 11 seasons including nine victories in its own holiday tournament. The Hokies have won 16 of their last 19 in-season tourney games and 23 of the last 27. The four losses include the opening round loss to USC at the Junkanoo Jam, last season at No. 10 LSU (70-40) and against Iowa State (75-69), with the other loss being a 70-56 defeat at No. 14 Minnesota in the championship game of the 2004 Subway Classic. Tech won the 2005 SMU Hoops for the Cure Tournament last year and won both games at the 2004 Caribbean Classic. Since the 1976-77 season, the Hokies are 65-39 in tournaments which are held during the regular season. In 2004-05, Tech lost at 14th-ranked Minnesota in the Subway Classic Championship game, and defeated No. 12 Texas Tech, 71-70 in overtime to win the Duel in the Desert championship in Las Vegas, Nev.

Tech will play in three in-season tournaments this year for the fourth consecutive season. The Hokies played two games in the Junkanoo Jam in Freeport, Grand Bahamas, and later this season in the Tulane DoubleTree Classic in New Orleans, La., and the Tech's own tournament just after Christmas.

THE VERSATILE HASKINS

Junior point guard Laura Haskins has played an important role in the Hokies 8-2 start. Haskins is ranked fourth in the ACC in assists (4.78), seventh in steals (2.56), 10th in assist/turnover ratio (1.54) and 15th in defensive rebounds (4.22). This season, she has set single-game career highs in rebounds (10), steals (7) and has tied for her career high in assists (7) on two occasions.

COOK'S WINNING RECIPE

Brittany Cook, a team captain along with Amber Hall, is off to a hot start this season. Cook followed up her career-tying 23 points in the opener versus High Point with 18 points versus Winston-Salem State and 22 against Liberty. Cook leads the team in scoring (17.8), three-point field goals made (14) and is second in three-point field goal percentage (.412) while ranking second in field goal percentage (.504). She is also 34-of-44 (.773) from the free throw line.

DRYE HAS CAREER NIGHT

Sophomore Utahya Drye had a solid performance in the season-opening win over High Point. Drye set career highs with 23 points and seven rebounds. She followed up that performance with her first career double-double with 12 points and 10 rebounds against Liberty. Drye is third on the team in scoring (10.1) and rebounding (5.3).

LETTING THE KAT OUT OF THE BAG

Freshman Andrea "Kat" Barbour, one of Tech's most highly-touted signees in recent history, is off to an impressive start to her collegiate career. Barbour led Tech with 29 points, tied for the sixth-most points in a game in Tech history, against Liberty. She is second in scoring averaging 16.3 points a game and has scored in double figures in all 10 games this season.

TECH IN NON-CONFERENCE GAMES

In the last 11 seasons, Virginia Tech has enjoyed great success in non-conference games posting a 121-37 (.766) record in non-conference contests overall, 70-9 at home, 28-20 away and 23-8 at neutral sites. Since the 1976-77 season, Tech is 302-210 overall in non-conference games, 175-60 at home, 87-107 away and 40-43 on neutral floors. The Hokies posted a 12-6 non-conference record last season after going 14-1 during the 2005-06 season versus non-conference opponents.

FREE THROW MARKSMEN

Virginia Tech has made the most of its free throw opportunities this season. The Hokies are shooting 75.2 percent (152-202) on the year which ranks second in the ACC. In the last five games, Tech is 86-of-105 (.819) and connected on 15 straight at one point. The Hokies have not missed more than six charity tosses in their last seven games and are 7-0 when attempting more free throws than the opponent. Amber Hall (19-of-22, .864) and Utahya Drye (23-of-29, .793) lead the team in free throw percentage. In fact, seven of the 11 players who have attempted a free throw this season are shooting 77 percent or better.

HOKIES HISTORY

With last year's 19-15 record, Virginia Tech posted its 19th winning season in 31 years of varsity competition. The 2005-06 season marked the Hokies eleventh 20-plus win season in 14 years. Tech has had 10 losing seasons and two break-even campaigns. The Hokies best season was the 28-3 mark in 1999, while Tech's most losses in a season were the 21 defeats in 1996-97. Tech is currently 515-387 (.571) in its 32nd season of varsity competition in women's basketball.

HOKIES ANNOUNCE SIGNEES

The Virginia Tech Athletics Department has announced the signing of women's basketball players Shanel Harrison and Brittany Lewis to national letters of intent for the 2008-2009 academic year.

Harrison, a 6-0, guard from Olney, Md., is rated as the No. 39 prospect by Mike White's All-Star Girls Report and No. 14 at her position. She is also ranked as the 62nd prospect by HoopGurlz. Harrison averaged 14.9 points and 8.9 rebounds last season at Good Counsel High School for coach Tom Splaine where she was a First Team All-Washington Catholic Athletic Conference selection. She also was named the All-Gazette Player of the Year as a junior and has been a Washington Post All-Met selection the past three years. Harrison also played for the AAU Fairfax Stars where she was named to the prestigious 2005 End of the Trail All-tournament team in Oregon City, Ore.

Lewis, a 6-2, forward from Orange, Fla., averaged 14.0 points and 8.0 rebounds as a junior last season for coach Kim Pereira at Fleming Island High School. She averaged 15 points and 11 rebounds as a freshman and 13 points and eight rebounds as a sophomore. Lewis also played AAU for PeachState under head coach Brandon Clay.

"We are extremely excited to have Shanel and Brittany join our program. Both are tremendous athletes who can not only hit the three, but are extremely dangerous off the dribble," said Virginia Tech head coach Beth Dunkenberger. "We were able to find two next level athletes with this class, and both should be able to immediately help us as we strive to climb up ladders and cut down nets."

TRADITIONAL TOUGH SCHEDULE

The 2007-08 schedule will be another challenging one, as the Hokies face 2007 Final Four participant North Carolina, 10 teams (Duke, East Carolina, Florida State, Georgia, Georgia Tech, Maryland, North Carolina, NC State, Prairie View and Robert Morris) that made the 2007 NCAA Tournament field and five (Alabama-Birmingham, Charlotte, High Point, Tulane and Virginia) that participated in the WNIT. In addition, the schedule includes five teams (#3 North Carolina, #6 Duke, #12 NC State, #13 Georgia, #14 Maryland and #19 Florida State) that ended the year in the ESPN/USA Today Top 25.

A LONG AND WINDING ROAD

Last season the Hokies played 34 games, which was the most games played in a season in the program's 31-year history. Tech traveled as far west as Pepperdine, Calif., south to Baton Rouge, La., and north to Boston, Mass. The previous mark for most games played in a season was 32 in the 2002-03 season (22-10), the 2001-02 season (21-11), and the 1997-98 season (22-10). This year the Hokies will travel to the Bahamas to participate in the Junkanoo Jam and later in the season head south to New Orleans for the Tulane DoubleTree Classic. The ACC schedule also has Tech playing two games in Florida against Miami and Florida State.

SUCCESSFUL HOME OPENER

The win over High Point improved Tech to 26-6 in home openers and the Hokies have now won 15 of the 16. In fact, of the six home-opening losses, three occurred during the first three years of the program as a varsity sport after moving up from the club level.

TECH IN CONFERENCE GAMES

In the past ten seasons, the Hokies have posted a 95-59 (61.7%) record in conference games, 54-24 at home and 41-35 on the road. Since the 1976-77 season, Virginia Tech has posted a 185-153 record in conference games, 114-56 at home and 71-97 on the road. Last season in the ACC, Tech was 6-8 in league play, 3-4 at home and 3-4 away.

THREE NEWCOMERS ADD DEPTH

The Hokies have three new faces on this year's squad after signing Andrea Barbour and Elizabeth Basham to national letters of intent during the early signing period last year. Tech also welcomes Brittany Gordon, who sat out last season after signing with the Hokies in 2005-06.

Barbour, a 5-10, guard from Charlottesville, Va., averaged 19.5 points and 13.0 last season in leading Charlottesville High School to the state quarterfinals. She shot 49 percent from the field and 75 percent from the free throw line for the Black Knights. Barbour surpassed 2,000 career points as a sophomore and is nearing the 3,000-point mark entering her senior season. Barbour selected Tech over NC State, Old Dominion, Temple and Vanderbilt. She was named the Most Valuable Player this summer in the VHSL All-Star game. Barbour led Tech with 20 points against Anderson and 16 points versus Athletes In Action.

Basham, a 6-2, forward from Abingdon, Va., averaged 13.1 points and 6.4 rebounds at Abingdon High School where she was named All-Highlands District as both a sophomore and junior. Last season she was a Region IV Honorable Mention and made Top 20 all-star at the 2006 Blue Chip Camp in Louisville, Ken.

Gordon, a 6-4, center from Woodbine, Md., was a 2005 graduate of River Hill (Md.) High School and attended The Blair Academy (N.J.). At River Hill, Gordon was a 1,000-point scorer and became the school's career rebound leader. She was selected as the Fox 45 Player of the Year. At the Blair Academy, Gordon averaged a double-double (20.0 points, 10 rebounds) and was a member of the Mid-Atlantic Prep League Elite team.

POSTSEASON EXPERIENCE

Last year's appearance in the WNIT marked the 10th consecutive season the program has participated in postseason play and the 12th time in the last 14 years. The 2006 appearance also marked the first time Tech had received four straight NCAA Tournament bids in the program's 31-year history. The Hokies had previously received back-to-back bids following the 1993-94 and 1994-95 seasons, the 1996-97 and 1997-98 seasons, and the most recent 2002-03 and 2003-04 campaigns.

HOKIES GET 500 VICTORIES

The victory over UNC Greensboro last season was the 500th victory in 31 seasons of varsity women's basketball at Virginia Tech. The Hokies posted 54 victories as an independent (1976-1981), 218 wins as a member of the Metro Conference (1981-1995), 91 in the Atlantic 10 Conference (1995-2000), 88 as a BIG EAST Conference member (2000-2004), and currently 63 wins since joining the ACC (2004-present). Tech's overall record stands at 514-387 (.571).

OFFENSIVE OPENER

The 103-64 win over High Point set the mark for most points by the Hokies in a season-opening game. The 103 points tied for the fifth most in the history of the program and marked the 12th time Tech has broken the century mark in the 32 year history of the program.

ELITE COMPANY

The Virginia Tech women's basketball program has enjoyed tremendous success the last seven years. Entering the 2007-08 season, Tech ranked 38th nationally in victories and is joined on the list by the nation's top women's basketball teams.

DEFENDING THE CASSELL

Over the last 11 seasons, the Hokies have posted a 134-21 record (.865) at Cassell Coliseum. Overall, the program has posted a 296-116 (.718) home record since the addition of women's basketball as a varsity sport in 1976-77. The Hokies were 15-0 at home in 1999-00 and won 18-straight regular-season home games until the Georgia loss on Nov. 17, 1999. Tech was 13-1 at home in 2002-03, and the Hokies have won 109 of their last 132 home games, including a 11-7 mark last season. More recently, Tech has won 77 of the last 97 home contests over the past five years. The Hokies have defeated 47 of the last 51 non-conference opponents at home and 53 of the last 58. Prior to the Radford, William & Mary and Auburn losses last season, the last two non-conference home losses both occurred on Mar. 23, a 77-72 overtime defeat in 2002 against Houston in the WNIT semifinals and a 61-48 loss to Penn State in the 2004 NCAA Tournament Second Round.

LOVE THOSE HOKIES

The play of the Virginia Tech women's basketball program at home has not gone unnoticed by the Hokie faithful. The following has paid huge dividends for the team for its performances at the Cassell, serving as the team's sixth man on the court.

Three seasons ago, the Hokies had three of their largest crowds in the history of the program. Over 7,200 fans attended the Connecticut

game on Jan. 27, 2004, marking the seventh-largest crowd in the history of Cassell Coliseum while over 7,100 attended the Penn State game in the NCAA Second Round which was the eighth-largest crowd. Tech also drew 6,364 fans, 10th largest, on Feb. 28 for the Pittsburgh contest.

In 1999, Tech set eight of the program's then 10 best single-game attendance marks and averaged a record 5,221 fans per game, ranking 13th nationally. In Tech's first-round NCAA Tournament win over St. Peter's, the Hokies recorded the program's first sellout crowd with 10,052 on hand.

Last year, the Hokies averaged 2,980, which ranked 40th nationally and fifth in the ACC. Tech is averaging 2,519 this season.

SWEET NOVEMBER

The first month of the season has been kind to the Hokies in recent history. In the last 11 seasons, Tech is 39-15 in November contests including 21-3 at home. The road has been tougher with only a 6-8 away mark and Tech is 12-3 in November neutral site games.

STREAKING IN DECEMBER

In the last 10 seasons, the Hokies have had great success in the month of December, including this season, as Tech posted a 2-1 mark. The Hokies are 59-9 (.868) in games played in the 12th month and 37-2 (.949) inside the Cassell. The loss last season at UAB snapped Tech's overall December streak at 26 straight, however, the Hokies have won 43 of the last 46. At home, the Hokies have won 29 straight and 36 of the last 37 December home games with the lone loss coming against No. 20 Duke (70-61) on December 8, 1999.



Hokie fans now have a new way to see the Virginia Tech sports they love thanks to a new broadband network called ACC Select. The ACC Select network will stream Virginia Tech sports like men's and women's soccer, women's basketball, baseball, volleyball, lacrosse, tennis and track that are not available through traditional broadcast and cable television distribution. Never before have such a large number of events been streamed in their entirety, giving fans the opportunity to see home and away games live or on-demand whenever and wherever they want.

The Atlantic Coast Conference, in partnership with Raycom Sports and Lincoln Financial Sports, will offer online video streaming of Virginia Tech and all 12 ACC conference school sports during the 2007-2008 school year. All ACC Championship events not currently televised will also be available on the network. The new network is made possible with the production and technical capabilities of Turner Broadcasting.

Hokie fans can visit vt.accselect.com to sign up or view a schedule of events. Fans can watch events live or on-demand on a per-event basis (\$3.99 per event) or with an all-event pass which will allow unlimited access to Virginia Tech games and will also allow Hokie fans to check out the competition throughout the ACC. The all-event pass will premiere at a charter price of \$5.99 per month.

ACC Select is a new broadband experience that will deliver to ACC fans the teams they care about and the games not available anywhere else. With full-screen video delivered right to the computer, ACC Select will provide access to events whenever fans want-live or on-demand. Go to www.accselect.com for complete details and see sports in a whole new way.

HOKIES ON TELEVISION

Virginia Tech women's basketball once again received great television exposure last year. As part of the ACC Television Package, Tech had six regional telecasts, including three at home. The games were carried on the ACC Regional Sports Network which included FoxSportNet South, Comcast Sports and the SunSport Network. In 2005-06, Tech's game at Miami was televised nationally by ESPNU and the NCAA First- and Second round contests versus Missouri and UConn were carried by ESPN2. The Hokies have six regular season games televised this season including home contests vs. Duke and Maryland and road games at NC State, Duke, Miami and Georgia Tech.

Beth Dunkenberger

Beth Dunkenberger is in her fourth season as the head coach of the Virginia Tech women's basketball team after guiding the Hokies to postseason appearances in each of her first three seasons. Dunkenberger has compiled a 65-39 record at Tech and is 130-89 in her eight-season career as a head coach.

Dunkenberger has a long association with the Virginia Tech women's basketball program, having served on Carol Alfano's staff for nine years (1988-97). She worked as a graduate assistant for two years before being promoted to a full-time assistant position, and helped lead the Hokies to the 1994 and 1995 NCAA Tournaments, the first two appearances in school history. Dunkenberger not only helped lead Tech to two NCAA Tournaments, but also to the Metro Conference Tournament Championship in 1994 and the Metro Conference regular-season championship in 1995. She served three years as recruiting coordinator and was responsible for signing Tere Williams, the first Parade All-American in the school's history. In addition, Dunkenberger assisted in recruiting seven members of the Tech 1,000-point club and four of the top six scorers in the program's history.

Dunkenberger returned to Blacksburg in 2004 after guiding Western Carolina to a 65-50 record, including a 14-17 mark in her final season when the sixth-seeded Catamounts won three games to advance to the Southern Conference Tournament finals. The program had only won a total of four tournament games in its previous 20 years in the conference.

The Catamounts came up with huge wins during the 2002-03 season, including a 73-69 victory

over Chattanooga on the road and clinching second place in the SoCon, heading into the league tournament with a 64-54 win over UNC Greensboro. Dunkenberger's efforts earned her 2002-03 Southern Conference Coach of the Year honors as the Catamounts finished the season with a 21-7 record, the program's best since beginning NCAA Division I competition in 1981-82. It was the first time a WCU women's basketball coach had received the recognition.

In Dunkenberger's first season (2000-01), the Cats posted a 13-15 record, the most wins for the program in 12 seasons. She backed that up with a 17-11 record in the 2001-02 season. Dunkenberger reached 50 wins faster than any other head coach in the program's history.

Not only have her teams been successful, but her student-athletes themselves have garnered several awards and honors during the Dunkenberger era at Virginia Tech and Western Carolina. In 2005, Erin Gibson and Carrie Mason were named to the ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America District III University Division team. Gibson was also selected as one of 29 ACC scholar-athletes to be named as a recipient of the ACC Postgraduate Scholarship, awarded to individuals who have performed with distinction in both the classroom and in their respective sports, while demonstrating exemplary conduct in the community. Mason also received the scholarship following the 2005-06 season. Additionally, several of Dunkenberger's student-athletes received honors at WCU.

Dunkenberger's emphasis on the importance of academics is easily recognized. Her 2000-01 squad finished in the top 25 in the nation for women's basketball programs

academically, ranking sixth with an overall team GPA of 3.313.

During Dunkenberger's three-year tenure as an assistant coach, the last as recruiting coordinator at the University of Florida, she helped the Gators to a 63-36 overall record. The Lady Gators advanced to postseason play all three years with the 1997-98 team making an appearance in the Sweet 16. While in Gainesville, Dunkenberger had the opportunity to help coach five players who are currently, or were previously, on rosters in the WNBA.

Dunkenberger was valedictorian

at Shawsville High School and graduated cum laude from Randolph-Macon College with a Bachelor of Science degree in mathematics in 1988. She was named academic all-district as well as all-conference. She continued her education by earning a Master of Science degree in education at Virginia Tech in 1990 and served as the commencement speaker at both her high school and undergraduate graduation ceremonies. A native of Shawsville, Va., she is the daughter of Tom and Rebecca Dunkenberger.

TECH SUCCESS

Virginia Tech has averaged 22 wins over the past nine seasons. The Hokies have advanced to the postseason each year during the streak, including seven NCAA and two WNIT appearances.

Tech has won 209 of the last 301 games (69.4 percent) dating back to Feb. 14, 1998. During that span, the Hokies have only lost to Auburn, Boston College (two times), Charlotte, Clemson (two times), Connecticut (eight times), Dayton, DePaul, Duke (seven times), Florida State (four times), Florida, Florida International, Georgetown, George Washington (two times), Georgia, Houston, Iowa State, LSU (two times), Maryland (three times), Massachusetts, Miami (five times), Minnesota, North Carolina (four times), NC State (three times), Notre Dame (five times), Old Dominion (two times), Oregon, Penn State, Providence, Purdue, Radford, Rutgers (four times), Syracuse, Tennessee, Texas Tech, UAB, USC, Villanova (three times), Virginia (six times), Wake Forest (two times), West Virginia, William & Mary, and Xavier (four times). Of the 92 losses, 40 were against nationally-ranked opponents and 62 occurred either away or at a neutral site.

BLACKSBURG, Va. - Virginia Tech paired a 6:41 Winston-Salem State scoring drought with a 31-6 early second-half run to pull away from the Rams by a winning score of 67-43 at Cassell Coliseum.

Up by just seven at the half against the over-matched opponent from the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference - which dressed just eight players for the game, seven of which were freshmen and all of which were 6-feet or under - the Hokies embarked on the scoring binge that saw them go 14-of-21 to build an insurmountable 32-point lead that helped them improve to 2-0 on the young season. It was the Rams' season-opener.

The Hokies did indeed come out of the locker room a different team, as they increased their field goal percentage to 51.5 after hitting just 39.3 percent in the first. They limited the Rams to just a 28.6 success rate after the break, and turned 30 Winston-Salem State turnovers into 35 points on the night.

Redshirt-junior Brittany Cook once again paced the Hokies in scoring with 18 points after tying a career-high with 23 on Sunday, and freshman Andrea Barbour netted 17.

Career-highs were set by Eleanor Brentnall with 10 points, Utahya Drye with six assists and Amber Hall with five blocks, but the most impressive stat line may have come from point guard Laura Haskins. The junior from Alexandria, Va., scored just two points, but pulled down six rebounds, tied a career-high for the second straight game with seven assists, and set a career-high with seven steals.

BLACKSBURG, Va. - Virginia Tech passed its first real test of the year at Cassell Coliseum, holding off an impressive Liberty squad by a score of 73-68 in the third game of the season for both schools.

With the score tied with just over two minutes to play, Tech's Brittany Cook was on a breakaway following a steal by Eleanor Brentnall, but Liberty's Allyson Fasnacht intentionally fouled Cook to prevent her from scoring. The move proved costly for the Flames, as the redshirt junior drained both free throws to put Tech up 66-64. The Hokies got the ball back following the charity tosses, and after a series of three offensive rebounds, Andrea Barbour converted a layup at 1:24 to push the lead to four.

BLACKSBURG, Va. – Virginia Tech entered its final exam break on a good note by defeating North Carolina A&T by a score of 85-56 at Cassell Coliseum.

The Hokies won their seventh straight home game and extended their streak of home wins in the month of December to 29 games, a stretch that dates back to 1999. The 85 points was the second-highest total of the season for Tech, as the 29-point differential was also the second highest on the year.

Brittany Cook and Andrea Barbour once again led the way for the Hokies, as both topped their season averages by scoring 21 points each on 9-of-14 shooting. Utahya Drye chipped in 10, and all 11 Hokies who dressed tallied at least two points. Eleanor Brentnall sat out for the third straight game with lower back pain.

However, the Hokies drilled four consecutive shots to begin a 23-5 run over the next eight minutes and take what would prove to be an insurmountable lead.

Once the Hokies did decide to attack the over-pursuing Aggies, they took over the game, building a lead as large as 33 points at one point and tallying a total of 48 points in the paint in the game.

The Hokies out-rebounded the Aggies by a tally of 43-34, and were led by Amber Hall's seven. Laura Haskins tied a career high with seven assists.
