A Glance At The Green Wave

• Tulane vs Jackson State

Tulane leads the all-time versus Jackson State, 1-0. The lone meeting came in the First Round of the 2007 WNIT, in which Tulane won 76-43.

• Home Cookin'

Tulane's two wins are at home, where the Green Wave are averaging 77.5 PPG at Fogelman Arena, but 52.5 PPG on the road this season

• All About This Benzio, Baby

'Diaper Dandy' **Brett Benzio** has been no baby in the paint, as the 6-3 forward leads Tulane in rebounding with 10.0 per game. She hauled in 12 rebounds in her debut vs Illinois State, and recorded her first double-double against Louisiana-Lafayette with a career high 15 rebounds and a career-best 12 points.

• Chassity's Scoring Virtue

Chassity Brown has recorded back-to-back season highs with 16 points in each of the last two games. She nailed her first four attempts from three-point range against Louisiana-Lafayette, and has also grabbed 11 rebounds in the last two contests to go with eight assists.

• Power Drain

The Green Wave shot a blistering 59-percent in the first half, at Louisiana-Monroe, literally shoot lights out: a power outage knocked out the lights at Fant-Ewing Coliseum, delaying the game for over two hours just after halftime. Following the delay, Tulane shot 31.8 percent, and saw its 12-point lead disappear before holding on for the 62-60 victory.

• Brett's Boarding

Leading Tulane in rebounding, **Brett Benzio** has 60 boards on the season, more than a quarter of Tulane's total (27%). She ranks third in C-USA in rebounding individually at 10.0 RPG.

• Out Shoot 'Em

Tulane is 13-0 dating back to last season when connecting at a higher field goal percentage than its opponent, 3-0 this year, and just 5-17 when posting a lower one (1-0 when same).

• Get to the Line

In Tulane's win over Illinois State, the Wave got to the free throw line 30 times. Tulane is 3-0 when attempting 17 or more free throws, and 0-3 when attempting less.

• Lindsey's Hot Hand

In her last four games, **Brittany Lindsey** has connected on 25-of-43 attempts (.582), for 14.8 points per game. At ULM, she hit on five of seven shots. Her .532 FG percentage leads the Wave.

• Chass' Glass Half Full

Chassity Brown's last two first halves have resulted in 12-of-14 shooting (.857), including six-of-six from behind the three-point line, for 16.0 PPG. She also added six rebounds and five assists.

• Offense Gets Going

After scoring 26 points in the first 33 minutes against LSU, Tulane finally got its offense going late with 21 points in the final seven minutes. Tulane then scored 80 points at home against Louisiana-Lafayette, giving them 101 points in 47 minutes. In the previous 83 minutes, the Wave had totalled 103 points.

• Assisted Living

Tulane's 28 field goals versus ULL were the product of 23 Green Wave assists. **Ashley Langford** led the way with six, but **Megan Valicevic** added a career-high five dimes, while **Chassity Brown** added a season-best five. Three other players, including **Tia Jackson**, each handed out a pair of assists in the win.

• Getting Defensive

Tulane held Illinois State Redbirds to 62 points, over 14 points below their average last season (76.9). The Green Wave also held VCU to 65 points and LSU to 63. In five of Tulane's six games, the Wave have held opponents to 65 points or less.

• Deuce's Dimes

Ashley Langford is now third on the Conference USA all-time assist list with 558. In her last three games, Langford has doled out 16 assists.

• Mo' Experience, Mo Points for Ro'

In two games, **Roshaunda Barnes** has passed her totals for all of last season in points. Her first game of 2008-09 brought her to within one of her 2007-08 totals in points and rebounds (seven vs Illinois State). Barnes' six points in the opener were one shy of the seven points she totalled all of last season as a freshman.

• Next Up: Tulane vs Indiana State

On Saturday, the action moves to Fogelman Arena, as the Wave take on Indiana State (30 minutes following Tulane men's 2 p.m. game with Western Kentucky), with UNO versus Jackson State to follow 30 minutes after the completion of the Tulane-ISU game.

Lisa Stockton: 2006-07 Conference USA Coach of the Year

The winningest coach in Conference USA, Lisa Stockton concluded her 13th season at Tulane much like her first: with a conference Coach of the Year award and a trip to the post-season. The 2006-07 Conference USA Coach of the Year led her team to the regular season title, and a 26-7 overall record, and a trip back to the post-season with a second round appearance in Women's National Invitational Tournament.

In 13 seasons as a head coach of the Green Wave, Stockton has compiled a 266-127 overall record, including a 114-66 Conference USA mark. Her lifetime record of 327-152 in 16 seasons as a head coach is good for a winning percentage of 74.5 percent.

Her teams have made nine NCAA Tournament appearances (1995-2003). She guided the Green Wave to C-USA regular season titles during the 1996-97, 1998-99 and 2006-07 seasons, and won C-USA Tournament crowns in 1997, 1999, 2000 and 2001.

With 266 wins at Tulane, Stockton has more wins than the previous five Green Wave coaches earned in 19 years.

Five Tulane players have gone on to play in the WNBA, including two -- Barbara Farris with the Detroit Shock in 2003 and Janell Burse with the Seattle Storm in 2004 -- who have earned WNBA championships. Others have joined the professional ranks in other leagues, most recently 2007 graduate Jami Montagnino.

Blending athletic achievement and academic success, every student-athlete to play all four years with the Green Wave has completed their degree. In 1994-95, Stockton took the reigns of the Tulane program and led her first team to a 19-10 record and the first NCAA appearance in school history while earning Metro Conference Coach of the Year honors.

That season kicked off a string of nine consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances, as her 1995-96 squad turned in her first of eight 20+ win seasons at Tulane. In 1996-97, her squad set a school record with 27 wins, earning its first C-USA title, and winning the program's first-ever NCAA Tournament game as the Green Wave advanced to the second

round. The Green Wave tied its school record with a 27-5 mark in 1999-2000, winning the Conference USA tournament and advancing to the NCAA Second Round again. Stockton's 2000-01 squad finished 22-10, won the C-USA tournament again and the Green Wave won 24 games in 2001-02. The ninth-straight NCAA Tournament trip followed in 2002-03.

Tulane leads the all-time versus Jackson State, 1-0. The lone meeting came in the First Round of the 2007 WNIT, in which Tulane won 76-43 on March 14 at Fogelman Arena. Tulane advanced to the second round, where the Wave fell at Mississippi State on March 17, 2007.

All About This Benzio, Baby

'Diaper Dandy' **Brett Benzio** was no baby in the paint as the 6-3 forward leads Tulane in rebounding with 10.0 per game. She hauled in 12 rebounds in her debut vs Illinois State, and recorded her first double-double against Louisiana-Lafayette with a career high 15 rebounds and a career-best 12 points.

She blocked two shots and added eight points on three-of-four shooting with a pair of free throws vs Illinois State. Against Arizona State, Benzio held her own with eight rebounds and five points and three assists. Benzio also turned in a nine-rebound, eight point effort at LSU.

Boardin' Brett

Leading Tulane in rebounding, freshman forward **Brett Benzio** has 60 boards on the season, more than a quarter of Tulane's total (27%). She ranks third in C-USA in rebounding individually at 10.0 RPG and ranks 37th in all of NCAA Division I in rebounds per game.

Power Drain

The Green Wave shot a blistering 59-percent in the first half, at Louisiana-Monroe, literally shoot lights out: a power outage knocked out the lights at Fant-Ewing Coliseum, delaying the game for over two hours just after halftime. Following the delay, Tulane shot 31.8 percent, and saw its 12-point lead disappear before holding on for the 62-60 victory.

The outage, which knocked power out all over the ULM campus, occurred at 3:02 p.m., with 19:16 to go in the second half of the game. ULM was inbounding after a foul on Tulane's **Megan Valicevic**. Power to the building was restored at 4:49 p.m., with the teams warming up before the game resumed at the point of interruption at 5:59, a delay of 2:08.

Lindsey's Hot Hand

Redshirt sophomore forward **Brittany Lindsey** has connected on 25-of-43 attempts (.582) in her last four games, averaging 14.8 points per game. Her .532 FG percentage leads the Wave. The hot streak began as she connected on 7-of-12 from the field at VCU for a team-high 17 points. She followed that up with a 7-for-13 shooting performance to lead Tulane with 15 points at LSU. She added a 6-of-11 outing vs Louisiana-Lafayette and at ULM, she hit on five of seven shots.

Chass' Glass Half Full

Chassity Brown's last two first halves have resulted in 12-of-14 shooting (.857), including six-of-six from behind the three-point line, for 16.0 PPG. She also added six rebounds and five assists.

She has posted back-to-back 16 point games, will all scoring coming in the first half. The 16-points per game are tied for her season high.

Finally, Some Rest For The Weary

The Green Wave played four-games in eight day stretch at one point. Tulane opens the season with six games in 15 days in November, including the Preseason WNIT. The Green Wave enter a down period for finals which will see them play just four times in the first 27 days of December.

Out Shoot 'Em

Tulane is 13-0 dating back to last season when connecting at a higher field goal percentage than its opponent, and 5-17 when posting a lower one (1-0 when same). This season, Tulane stands at 3-0 when outshooting opponents.

Chassity's Scoring Virtue

Chassity Brown recorded back-to-back season highs with 16 points in each of the last two games. She nailed her first four attempts from three-point range against Louisiana-Lafayette, and has also grabbed 11 rebounds in the last two contests to go with eight assists. With an 11-point outing versus Illinois State, Tulane is 3-0 when Brown hits the double-digit mark in points.

Tulane's two wins are at home, where the Green Wave are averaging 77.5 PPG at Fogelman Arena in two wins: a 75-62 win over Illinois State, and a 80-65 win over Louisiana-Lafayette. But the Green Wave are averaging a mere 49.3 PPG in three road losses. Tulane scored 62 points in a road win over ULM, raising their road scoring average to 52.5.

Getting Defensive

In five of Tulane's six games, the Wave have held opponents to 65 points or less. Tulane held Illinois State Redbirds to 62 points, over 14 points below their average last season (76.9). The Green Wave also held VCU and Louisiana-Lafayette to 65 points, LSU to 63, and Louisiana-Monroe to 60.

Scoring Balance

Tulane has been led in scoring by four different players in six games (**Ashley Langford's** 18 vs Illinois State, **Indira Kaljo's** 13 at Arizona State and **Brittany Lindsey's** 17 at VCU and 15 at LSU, and **Chassity Brown's** 18 against Louisiana-Lafayette and Louisiana-Monroe). Seven different players have hit double-figures (**Megan Valicevic** twice, **Brett Benzio** vs Louisiana-Lafayette, **Tiffany Aidoo's** season-high 10 against Louisiana-Monroe).

Offense Gets Going

After scoring 26 points in the first 33 minutes against LSU, Tulane finally got its offense going late with 21 points in the final seven minutes. Tulane then scored 80 points at home against Louisiana-Lafayette, giving them 101 points in 47 minutes. In the previous 83 minutes, the Wave had totalled 103 points.

Assisted Living

Tulane's 28 field goals versus ULL were the product of 23 Green Wave assists. **Ashley Langford** led the way with six, but **Megan Valicevic** added a career-high five dimes, while **Chassity Brown** added a season-best five. Three other players, including **Tia Jackson**, each handed out a pair of assists in the win.

Indira is Kal-iente

Junior **Indira Kaljo**, a transfer from Ventura College, has drained nine of her 19 three-point attempts for a .474 percentage, after starting the season with eight made threes in her first 11 attempts.

She hit two first-half three pointers to erase an early 7-2 deficit and put Tulane ahead of Illinois State 13-10. Anticipated to step into the three-point shooting role left by graduated senior Nikki Luckhurst (who ranks second all-time at Tulane in made threes), Kaljo connected on both of her three-point attempts and finished with 10 points. At Ventura, she connected at a .374 clip from long range, averaging over 16 points per game.

Her .474 three-point percentage is fourth in Conference USA

Get to the Line

In Tulane's win over Illinois State, the Wave got to the free throw line 30 times. The Wave attempted 17 free throws in the win over Louisiana-Lafayette, and 24 against Louisiana-Monroe, giving them a 3-0 record when attempting 17 or more free throws, and 0-3 when attempting less.

Langford's Longevity

PG Ashley Langford will make her 96th consecutive start for the Green Wave against Jackson State one of the longest active streaks in the country. Only four players in Division I have started more consecutive games for their teams: UConn's Renee Montgomery, followed by Shalee Leining of Kansas State, Kendra Reed of Southern Miss, Sha Brooks of Florida and then Langford.

Declawing a Tiger

In Tulane's last three meetings with LSU, the Green Wave have held the Tigers to 55, 52 and 63 points (56.7 PPG).

Rebounding Ro'

While Tulane's tallest player (the 6-3 Brett Benzio) led Tulane in rebounding vs Illinois State, the Wave's second-most rebounds were grabbed by its shortest player: the 5-5 Roshanda Barnes. Barnes picked up seven boards to go with six points and five assists. Her seven rebounds were one less than the eight she accumulated all of last season (in 16 games).

Mo' Experience, Mo Points for Ro'

Barnes' six points vs Illinois State were one shy of the seven points she totalled all of last season as a freshman. In her first 12 games last season, primary as backup point guard to Ashley Langford, Barnes attempted just eight shots. Friday, she came off the bench as a shooting guard, sharing the floor with Langford.

In just two games in 2008-09, Barnes has topped her 2007-08 season totals for: points, field goals, steals, rebounds, and free throws.

Valicevic's Victory Dance

Senior Megan Valicevic scored all of her 12 points in the second half of Tulane's win over Illinois State, including the back-breaker: a three-pointer with the shot clock expiring. With Roshanda Barnes tied up in a scramble at the free throw line, Barnes regained possession on the floor and found Valicevic as the shot clock reached three seconds. Valicevic drained the trey, putting the Wave up comfortably, 66-54, with two minutes to play. She hit five of six free throws, all down the stretch, as Tulane held on to the win.

She added 13 points in Tulane's loss to VCU, and another 12 in a win over Louisiana-Lafayette

Tulane in the Preseason WNIT

The Green Wave finished their third Preseason WNIT appearance with a 1-2 record. Tulane is now 2-4 all-time in the tournament, and 0-4 on the road. Tulane lost at Louisiana Tech in the first round of the 1996 tournament. In 2000, the Wave defeated Grambling at home before falling in the second round at Texas.

Deuce's Dimes: Langford is Fifth to 500 in Conference USA

Senior PG Ashley Langford now ranks third all-time in C-USA career assists with 555 in 94 games (5.90 APG), taking over that position with seven assists at VCU. Only Sara Nord (852 at Louisville, 2000-04) and K.B. Sharp (623 at Cincinnati, 1999-03) have more in the history of the conference.

She became Tulane's career assist leader in only 69 games and ranked 26th in the NCAA in assists per game (5.33) last season. She owns the top three single-season assist marks in school history, as her junior campaign (160) ranked behind only her freshman and sophomore seasons.

In 94 career games, Langford has had at least three assists in 91. She recorded one assist against Arizona State, the lowest number in her career until she was held without a helper at LSU. Tulane is 51-26 all-time when Langford hands out four or more assists, and 6-10 when she has three or fewer.

In her last two games, she's handed out 13 assists.

The Bench Hits Back

Instead of hitting the bench, Tulane's bench hit Illinois State up for 24 of Tulane's 75 points Friday. Green Wave's five subs who saw action also grabbed 22 rebounds, including 12 by Brett Benzio and seven by Roshanda Barnes.

Back for the Wave

The Green Wave return nine letterwinners from last season, including six of the top eight scorers from last season. Seniors Ashley Langford (a three-time All-Conference point guard), F/G Megan Valicevic, and F Kendra Barnes return, as well as Tulane's second leading scorer and rebounder Brittany Lindsey.

Tulane has added two freshman post players for 2008-09, as well as a junior conference transfer at guard. 6-3 F/C Brett Benzio joins the Wave from Palm City, Florida, where she was an all-state selection for Jensen Beach. Jennifer Nwokedi, a 6-1 forward, hails from St. Agnes Academy in Houston. Guard Indira Kaljo joins Tulane from Ventura College in California, where she averaged 16.3 points per game. Danielle Nunn, a guard from TCU, will sit out this season due to transfer rules.

Pre-Season Prognostication

The Green Wave, 16-14 last season, were picked fifth in Conference USA in the preseason poll of the C-USA coaches. Southern Miss was predicted to win C-USA, followed by SMU, 2008 champion UTEP, and East Carolina. After the Wave in fifth, the coaches tabbed Marshall to place sixth. The bottom half of the projection was not released as per league guidelines.

Lifted By Langford

Senior PG **Ashley Langford** is now eighth all-time in career steals at Tulane with 185, including the second six-steal performance of her career last Valentine's day against Rice.

Langford Sets C-USA Longest Free Throw Streak

Ashley Langford made 43 consecutive free throws, the eighth longest streak in NCAA history and longest in C-USA history. It began with her final throw against Kansas State on Nov. 21, and ended 11 games later with her first free throw against UTEP on Jan. 12. The NCAA record is 66 by Richmond's Ginny Doyle (1991-92).

Ashley's Single-Season & Single-Game Assists Records

Ashley Langford owns the top three single-season marks in Tulane history. The 5-5 point guard set Tulane's single-season assist mark with 171 as a freshman and broke that mark this season with 207 as a sophomore. She tied her own school record for assists in one game against UTEP on January 20, with 14 dimes against the Miners. Her performance ties her mark at SMU on February 26, 2006. She now has nine games with 10 or more assists in her career. Those nine games are all in the top 12 marks in school history. Her performance is also tied for the second-most ever in Conference USA history, and the most ever in a C-USA league game.

Final Four Comes To New Orleans

Tulane could be considered Tourney Town USA by the end of 2013. Tulane University will host the NCAA Men's Basketball First & Second Rounds in 2010, the Men's Basketball Regionals in 2011, the Men's Basketball Final Four in 2012, and the Women's Basketball Final Four in 2013.

Tulane Adds Pair of Commitments for 2009-10

Head Coach Lisa Stockton received a pair of commitments for her 2009-2010 Tulane women's basketball team as forward Brittany McDonald and guard Olivia Grayson signed National Letters of Intent.

"Brittany and Olivia each fit in well with what our needs for the future," Stockton said. "Both have a great work ethic, are excellent students, and come from highly competitive, winning programs."

McDonald will fill a position coveted by the Green Wave: a true power forward. At 6-1, she led her team and was one of the top rebounders in the state of Georgia. The Gwinnett Daily Post named the Berkmar High School senior to their preseason Super Six on Thursday, as she led Berkmar to the state tournament, ending a 30-year drought for the school.

The two-time all-county player also excelled off the court as a two-year all-academic team honoree.

"Brittany's a player we need: She can step out and hit the outside shot, really runs the floor well, and is an excellent rebounder. She plays in a very tough high school league and they've been successful, making the state tournament last season."

Grayson, a 5-8 guard from Chapelle High School in Metairie, La., was the Louisiana High School 5A Most Valuable Player last season. The all-district, all-Metro and all-state selection led Chapelle to the state championship game and carries a career scoring average of 16.2 points per game to go with 8.3 rebounds and 4.2 assists per contest.

"Olivia is one of the best guards in the state. She is someone we've been watching for years, so it's quite rewarding to receive her commitment," Stockton said. "Olivia (a.k.a. "Turtle") can score, defend, and she is also a great passer - she can play both the point and shooting guard positions. Olivia will be a very successful player in C-USA."

Grayson also has a history with Tulane, as her half brother, Andrew Niermann, is the starting right guard on the Green Wave football team.

The duo will join Danielle Nunn, a transfer from TCU sitting out this season due to NCAA transfer rules, as newcomers for next season. Nunn will be junior with two years of eligibility remaining. The Green Wave are slated to lose three players to graduation at the end of the season: forward Kendra Barnes, guard Ashley Langford, and guard/forward Megan Valicevic.

Third Commitment to Tulane Women's Basketball Signs NLU

Head Coach Lisa Stockton received her three commitment to the 2009-2010 Tulane women's basketball team as guard Tyria Snow signed a National Letter of Intent.

Snow is a 5-8 true point guard out of Southwood High School. The Shreveport, La. native has won two 5A state championships in the last three seasons, bookended around a state runner-up finish in 2007. The All-District selection dished out 158 assists last season.

"She is a true point guard with great court vision, good defensive skills, and has the right mentality to lead her team," Stockton said. "She's been to three state championships, so she knows how to win. Coming from one of the strongest high school programs in the state, she's very well coached and extremely competitive. Tyria's background will help her make the transition from high school to college basketball."

Snow rounds out the three-person class for Tulane, which announced two other signees on Saturday.

Two of the three signees for Tulane already have a previous history on the court. In the Louisiana 5A State Championship game, Chapelle High School's Olivia Graystone attempted a game-winning drive in the waning seconds, but Snow stepped in and drew a charge, sealing the win for Southwood.

"It's great to get players out of Louisiana, especially one of this caliber," Stockton added. "Our incoming class is full of winners. They have been highly competitive in high school and had great success. They are the type of student-athlete we are looking for at Tulane: skilled on the court, smart both on the court and in the classroom, and bringing a strong work ethic and winning attitude to our program."

Last Time Out: Tulane 62, Louisiana-Monroe 60

The Green Wave literally shot the lights out. After posting a 59-percent shooting performance in the first half, Fant-Ewing Coliseum went dark early in the second half. When play resumed following a two-hour break, the Tulane women's basketball team lost its 12 point-lead over Louisiana-Monroe, but held on for a 62-60 win.

Playing in front of a large contingent of family and friends which made the trip from Shreveport, junior guard Chassity Brown led the Green Wave with 16 points, while Brittany Lindsey added 15 for Tulane.

Brett Benzio was one point away from a double-double, posting 12 rebounds to go with nine points. Lindsey connected on five-of-seven shooting, while blocking three shots. Tiffany Aidoo added 10 points while picking up four steals.

The Green Wave shot 57.7 percent (15-of-26) before the delay, but only 31.8 percent (7-of-22) once the lights came back on as their 12-point lead evaporated. Lottie Moore keyed the comeback for ULM with all 12 of her points coming in the second half. Sumar Leslie led the Warhawks with 19.

"It was a tough situation," head coach Lisa Stockton said. "We shot the ball so well in the first half, it was really tough to get that momentum back. But I'm proud of how intense we were in the second half, and how we played in getting this road win."

Tulane won its first road game of the season, improving to 3-3, and broke ULM's streak of two-straight wins over Conference USA schools, dropping the Warhawks to 4-2 overall.

Tulane shot 58.6 percent in the first half, connecting on 14-of-24 attempts. The Wave held ULM to 35.5 percent in the first half, led by eight points from Sumar Leslie

As the second half began, Megan Valicevic picked up her third foul, and as ULM just put the ball in play with 19:16 left, darkness enveloped the arena with Tulane leading 37-26.

Following the two-hour, six-minute delay, the game resumed with ULM inbounding at the point of interruption. Louisiana-Monroe scored the first six points after play resumed, cutting the margin to 37-35.

Lindsey blocked a shot inside, and then scored at the other end to restore a 57-56 Tulane lead with 4:13 left in the game. The two teams traded the lead back and forth three times, as the Wave led 61-60 with one minute to go.

Lindsey sealed off the baseline and Aidoo came away with the loose ball. ULM fouled, sending Langford to the line, where she hit one free throw for a 62-60 lead with 16.5 to go. Tulane's defense held off a last second three-attempt from Moore, and Benzio came down with the rebound as the horn sounded.

Next Up: Tulane vs Jackson State

On Saturday, the Big Easy Classic moves to Fogelman Arena, as the Wave take on Indiana State (approximate tip of 4 p.m.), with UNO versus Jackson State to follow. The Tulane men's team starts Saturday's action at 2 p.m. against Western Kentucky.

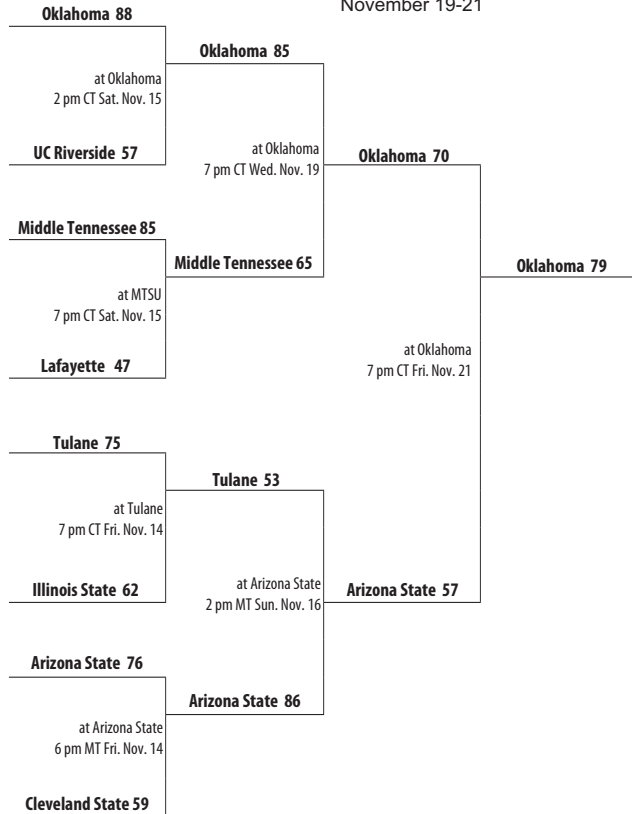

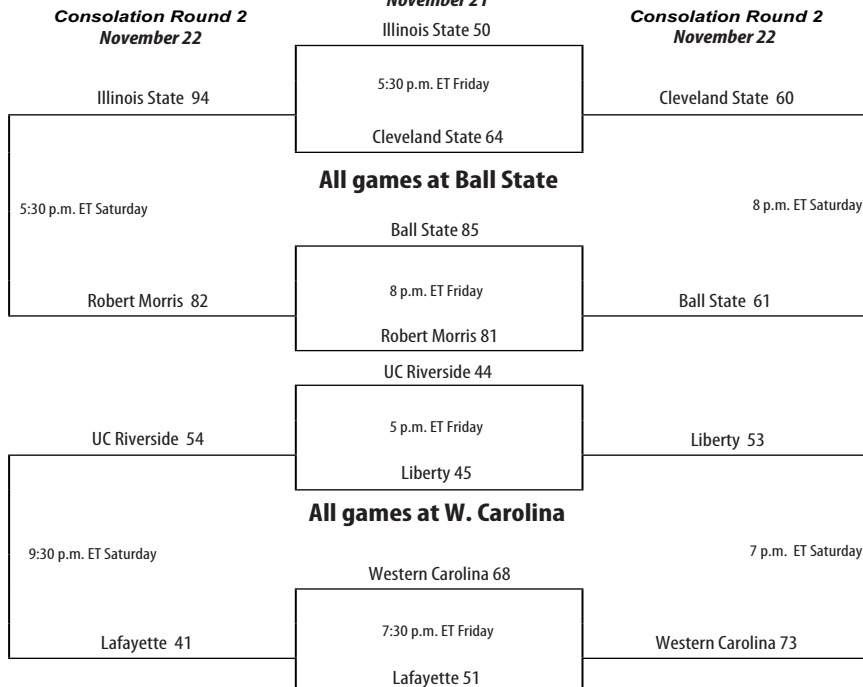
