A Glance At The Green Wave

• Tulane DoubleTree Classic

Tulane is 20-4 all-time in the DoubleTree Classic, winning nine of the 12 events. Providence is now the second team with two appearances in the DoubleTree Classic, joining UNC Greensboro. The Friars finished third in the 1999 tournament.

• Tulane vs the Field

Tulane is 1-0 all-time vs Alabama State (70-57, 12/5/2002). Tulane is 1-0 all-time vs Providence (W, 81-57, 12/27/1999 in the DoubleTree Classic). Tulane and Southeast Missouri State have never met.

• Offense Gets Going

After a three-game stretch in which Tulane averaged 49.3 PPG (all losses), Tulane has scored an average of 77.8 PPG in the last five games (all wins).

• Offense Explodes for 108 vs Nicholls

Tulane's 108 points vs Nicholls State was the fourth-highest point total in school history, and the Green Wave's first 100-point game since a 109-39 win over Puerto Rico-Mayaguez in San Juan in November of 2001.

• Three's Up!

Tulane hit a school record 14 three-pointers in the win over Nicholls State. Tulane nailed 14 of 23 attempts to shatter the old record of 11 (set three times). **Megan Valicevic** (5-6) and **Indira Kaljo** (5-7) led the way, with **Chassity Brown** (2-6), **Tiffany Aidoo** (1-1) and **Ashley Langford** (1-2) adding triples. Valicevic and Kaljo posted the top two three-point shooting nights of the season in C-USA.

• Tulane Sets Top Scoring Half... Twice

Tulane's 53 point first half against Nicholls was its highest scoring half of the season, until scoring 55 points in the second half. The previous best was 49 vs Louisiana-Lafayette Nov. 26.

• Plethora Of Season Highs

Against Nicholls State, 10 individual season-highs were set in points, rebounds or assists, and five individual career-highs were set in those categories (complete list page 4).

• Two Threes for #33

Number 33 **Indira Kaljo** (2.22 3PT per game) has hit two or more three-pointers in six games this season and ranks second in C-USA in 3PT% at .526 (20-of-38). Her trio of three's iced the win over Indiana State, and she nailed 5-of-7 at Nicholls for 21 points, her Tulane high. It was two points shy of her

career best, which she accomplished four times at Ventura College.

• Megan Makes 'Em All

Megan Valicevic sprung for a career-high 21 points (8-11 FG) including 5-of-6 from three-point land at Nicholls State. She ranks 11th in C-USA in field goal percentage at .491, but 20 of her attempts are from three-point range (8-20, .400). Inside the arc, she is shooting 20-of-37 (.541). She also leads C-USA in free throw percentage at .871 (27-31).

• Lindsey's Hot Hand

In her last five games, **Brittany Lindsey** has connected on 45-of-81 attempts (.556), for 14.7 points per game.

• Everyone's Hot Hand

Brett Benzio now leads Tulane with a .536 FG%, while **Brittany Lindsey** is just behind at .530. Benzio ranks sixth in C-USA, while Lindsey is seventh. **Megan Valicevic** ranks 11th in C-USA at .491.

• Field Goals' Up and Good!

Tulane's .643 field goal percentage against Nicholls State was its fourth-highest in program history.

• Out Shoot 'Em

Tulane is 15-0 dating back to last season when connecting at a higher field goal percentage than its opponent, 5-0 this year, and just 6-17 when posting a lower one (1-0 when same).

• Get to the Line

In Tulane's win over Illinois State, the Wave got to the free throw line 30 times. Tulane is 5-0 when attempting 17 or more free throws, and 1-3 when attempting less.

• Getting Defensive

In eight of Tulane's nine games, the Wave have held opponents to 66 points or less, including a season-best defensive game of 48 against Jackson State.

• Deuce's Dimes

Ashley Langford recorded her 10th career game with double-digit assists, handing out 10 in Tulane's win over Nicholls State. She is now third on the Conference USA all-time assist list with 580. In her last six games, Langford has doled out 36 assists.

• Next Up: Tulane DoubleTree Classic

The winners will meet in the Championship game on Sunday, following the 1 p.m. consolation game.

Lisa Stockton: 2006-07 Conference USA Coach of the Year

The winningest coach in Conference USA, Lisa Stockton concluded her 13th season at Tulane much like her first: with a conference Coach of the Year award and a trip to the post-season. The 2006-07 Conference USA Coach of the Year led her team to the regular season title, and a 26-7 overall record, and a trip back to the post-season with a second round appearance in Women's National Invitational Tournament.

In 13 seasons as a head coach of the Green Wave, Stockton has compiled a 266-127 overall record, including a 114-66 Conference USA mark. Her lifetime record of 327-152 in 16 seasons as a head coach is good for a winning percentage of 74.5 percent.

Her teams have made nine NCAA Tournament appearances (1995-2003). She guided the Green Wave to C-USA regular season titles during the 1996-97, 1998-99 and 2006-07 seasons, and won C-USA Tournament crowns in 1997, 1999, 2000 and 2001.

With 266 wins at Tulane, Stockton has more wins than the previous five Green Wave coaches earned in 19 years.

Five Tulane players have gone on to play in the WNBA, including two -- Barbara Farris with the Detroit Shock in 2003 and Janell Burse with the Seattle Storm in 2004 -- who have earned WNBA championships. Others have joined the professional ranks in other leagues, most recently 2007 graduate Jami Montagnino.

Blending athletic achievement and academic success, every student-athlete to play all four years with the Green Wave has completed their degree. In 1994-95, Stockton took the reigns of the Tulane program and led her first team to a 19-10 record and the first NCAA appearance in school history while earning Metro Conference Coach of the Year honors.

That season kicked off a string of nine consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances, as her 1995-96 squad turned in her first of eight 20+ win seasons at Tulane. In 1996-97, her squad set a school record with 27 wins, earning its first C-USA title, and winning the program's first-ever NCAA Tournament game as the Green Wave advanced to the second

round. The Green Wave tied its school record with a 27-5 mark in 1999-2000, winning the Conference USA tournament and advancing to the NCAA Second Round again. Stockton's 2000-01 squad finished 22-10, won the C-USA tournament again and the Green Wave won 24 games in 2001-02. The ninth-straight NCAA Tournament trip followed in 2002-03.

Two Threes for #33

She now ranks second in C-USA in three-point percentage at .526 (20-of-38). Her trio of three-pointers iced the win over Indiana State, as Tulane took a lead they would not relinquish. They Sycamores made one final charge, but after being fouled, Kaljo hit all three free throws and Tulane's lead was never less than three possessions the rest of the way. Kaljo nailed five-of-six from three-point range, setting her career-best for three-pointers made at Nicholls State. Her 21 points was her Tulane high, and two points shy of her career best, which she accomplished four times at Ventura College.

Out Shoot 'Em

Tulane is 15-0 dating back to last season when connecting at a higher field goal percentage than its opponent, 5-0 this year, and just 6-17 when posting a lower one (1-0 when same).

Get to the Line

In Tulane's win over Illinois State, the Wave got to the free throw line 30 times. Tulane is 5-0 when attempting 17 or more free throws, and 1-3 when attempting less. In the lone win when attempting less, Tulane made 10 attempts, but shot .643 from the field in a 108-66 win over Nicholls State.

Plethora Of Season Highs

Against Nicholls State, 10 individual season-highs were set in points, rebounds or assists, and five individual career-highs were set in those categories:

Senior guard **Megan Valicevic** scored a career-high 21 points. She reached her season high of 18 by halftime (in 13 minutes of playing time)

Senior guard **Ashley Langford** set a season-high in assists with 10. It was her 10th career game in double-figure assists.

Junior guard **Indira Kaljo** scored a Tulane-high 21 points, it was two points shy of her career best 23 (four times at Ventura College last season)

Junior guard **Tia Jackson** set a season-high in points (5) and assists (2)

Sophomore forward **Brittany Lindsey** set a season-high with seven rebounds

Sophomore guard **Roshaunda Barnes** set a career-high with seven assists.

Sophomore center **Kiara Slaton** set a season/career-high with eight points, and tied her season/career high with one assist.

Freshman forward **Jennifer Nwokedi** hit season/career highs with four points.

As a team, Tulane set a season high in points (108), field goal percentage (.643), assists (26), three-pointers made (14), three-point percentage (.609)

Tulane set its season-best FG% in a half (.647 in first)

Tulane set team's season-high scoring in half in back-to-back halves: 53 pts in first half, 55 in second.

Getting Defensive

In eight of Tulane's nine games, the Wave have held opponents to 66 points or less, including a season-best defensive game of 48 against Jackson State.

Deuce's Dimes

Ashley Langford recorded her 10th career game with double-digit assists, handing out 10 in Tulane's win over Nicholls State. She is now third on the Conference USA all-time assist list with 580. In her last six games, Langford has doled out 36 assists.

All About This Benzio, Baby

'Diaper Dandy' **Brett Benzio** has been no baby in the paint, as the 6-3 forward leads Tulane in rebounding with 9.9 per game (which would be the second-highest single-season RPG at Tulane). She hauled in 12 rebounds in her debut vs Illinois State, and recorded her first double-double against Louisiana-Lafayette with a career high 15 rebounds. She scored a career-best 17 points against Indiana State.

Brett's Boarding

Leading Tulane in rebounding, **Brett Benzio** has 89 boards on the season, more than a quarter of Tulane's total (26%). She ranks fifth in C-USA in rebounding individually at 9.9 RPG. She's recorded eight or more rebounds in seven of Tulane's eight games.

Power Drain

The Green Wave shot a blistering 59-percent in the first half, at Louisiana-Monroe, literally shooting lights out: just after halftime, a power outage delayed the game for over two hours. Following the delay, Tulane shot 31.8 percent, and saw its 12-point lead disappear before holding on for the 62-60 victory.

We Won't Jinx Megan

Megan Valicevic had hit 17 consecutive free throws between misses. At 27-of-31 for the season, she leads Conference USA in free throw percentage at .871

Assisted Living

The Green Wave handed out a season-best 26 assists in the win over Nicholls State, which tied for the seventh most assists in a game in school history. Ashley Langford handed out 10 for the 10th time in her career, while Roshanda Barnes doled out a career-best seven.

Tulane's 28 field goals versus Louisiana-Lafayette were the product of 23 Green Wave assists. Ashley Langford led the way with six, but Megan Valicevic added a career-high five dimes.

Langford's Longevity

PG Ashley Langford will make her 98th consecutive start for the Green Wave against Alabama State, one of the longest active streaks in the country. Only four players in Division I have started more consecutive games for their teams: UConn's Renee Montgomery, followed by Shalee Lehning of Kansas State, Kendra Reed of Southern Miss, Sha Brooks of Florida and then Langford.

Declawing a Tiger

In Tulane's last three meetings with LSU, the Green Wave have held the Tigers to 55, 52 and 63 points (56.7 PPG).

Rebounding Ro'

While Tulane's tallest player (the 6-3 Brett Benzio) led Tulane in rebounding vs Illinois State, the Wave's second-most rebounds were grabbed by its shortest player: the 5-5 Roshanda Barnes. Barnes picked up seven boards to go with six points and five assists. Her seven rebounds were one less than the eight she accumulated all of last season (in 16 games).

Mo' Experience, Mo' Points for Ro'

Barnes' six points vs Illinois State were one shy of the seven points she totalled all of last season as a freshman. In her first 12 games last season, primary as backup point guard to Ashley Langford, Barnes attempted just eight shots. Friday, she came off the bench as a shooting guard, sharing the floor with Langford.

In just two games in 2008-09, Barnes has topped her 2007-08 season totals for: points, field goals, steals, rebounds, and free throws.

Valicevic's Victory Dance

Senior Megan Valicevic scored all of her 12 points in the second half of Tulane's win over Illinois State, including the back-breaker: a three-pointer with the shot clock expiring. With Roshanda Barnes tied up in a scramble at the free throw line, Barnes regained possession on the floor and found Valicevic as the shot clock reached three seconds. Valicevic drained the trey, putting the Wave up comfortably, 66-54, with two minutes to play. She hit five of six free throws, all down the stretch, as Tulane held on to the win.

She added 13 points in Tulane's loss to VCU, and another 12 in a win over Louisiana-Lafayette before striking for a career-best 21 at Nicholls State.

Tulane in the Preseason WNIT

The Green Wave finished their third Preseason WNIT appearance with a 1-2 record. Tulane is now

2-4 all-time in the tournament, and 0-4 on the road. Tulane lost at Louisiana Tech in the first round of the 1996 tournament. In 2000, the Wave defeated Grambling at home before falling in the second round at Texas.

Deuce's Dimes: Langford is Fifth to 500 in Conference USA

Senior PG **Ashley Langford** now ranks third all-time in C-USA career assists with 580 in 97 games (5.94 APG), taking over that position with seven assists at VCU. Only Sara Nord (852 at Louisville, 2000-04) and K.B. Sharp (623 at Cincinnati, 1999-03) have more in the history of the conference.

She became Tulane's career assist leader in only 69 games and ranked 26th in the NCAA in assists per game (5.33) last season. She owns the top three single-season assist marks in school history, as her junior campaign (160) ranked behind only her freshman and sophomore seasons.

In 97 career games, Langford has had at least three assists in 95. She recorded one assist against Arizona State, the lowest number in her career until she was held without a helper at LSU. Tulane is 55-26 all-time when Langford hands out four or more assists, and 6-10 when she has three or fewer.

Pre-Season Prognostication

The Green Wave, 16-14 last season, were picked fifth in Conference USA in the preseason poll of the C-USA coaches. Southern Miss was predicted to win C-USA, followed by SMU, 2008 champion UTEP, and East Carolina. After the Wave in fifth, the coaches tabbed Marshall to place sixth. The bottom half of the projection was not released as per league guidelines.

Lifted By Langford

Senior PG **Ashley Langford** is now eighth all-time in career steals at Tulane with 184, including the second six-steal performance of her career last Valentine's day against Rice.

Langford Sets C-USA Longest Free Throw Streak

Ashley Langford made 43 consecutive free throws, the eighth longest streak in NCAA history and longest in C-USA history. It began with her final throw against Kansas State on Nov. 21, and ended 11 games later with her first free throw against UTEP on Jan. 12. The NCAA record is 66 by Richmond's Ginny Doyle (1991-92).

Ashley's Single-Season & Single-Game Assists Records

Ashley Langford owns the top three single-season marks in Tulane history. The 5-5 point guard set Tulane's single-season assist mark with 171 as a freshman and broke that mark this season with 207 as a sophomore. She tied her own school record for assists in one game against UTEP on January 20, with 14 dimes against the Miners. Her performance ties her mark at SMU on February 26, 2006. She now has 10 games with 10 or more assists in her career. Those 10 games are all in the top 12 marks in school history. Her performance is also tied for the second-most ever in Conference USA history, and the most ever in a C-USA league game.

Final Four Comes To New Orleans

Tulane could be considered Tourney Town USA by the end of 2013. Tulane University will host the NCAA Men's Basketball First & Second Rounds in 2010, the Men's Basketball Regionals in 2011, the Men's Basketball Final Four in 2012, and the Women's Basketball Final Four in 2013.

Tulane Adds Pair of Commitments for 2009-10

Head Coach Lisa Stockton received a pair of commitments for her 2009-2010 Tulane women's basketball team as forward Brittany McDonald and guard Olivia Grayson signed National Letters of Intent.

"Brittany and Olivia each fit in well with what our needs for the future," Stockton said. "Both have a great work ethic, are excellent students, and come from highly competitive, winning programs."

McDonald will fill a position coveted by the Green Wave: a true power forward. At 6-1, she led her team and was one of the top rebounders in the state of Georgia. The Gwinnett Daily Post named the Berkmar High School senior to their preseason Super Six on Thursday, as she led Berkmar to the state tournament, ending a 30-year drought for the school.

The two-time all-county player also excelled off the court as a two-year all-academic team honoree.

"Brittany's a player we need: She can step out and hit the outside shot, really runs the floor well, and is an excellent rebounder. She plays in a very tough high school league and they've been successful, making the state tournament last season."

Grayson, a 5-8 guard from Chapelle High School in Metairie, La., was the Louisiana High School 5A Most Valuable Player last season. The all-district, all-Metro and all-state selection led Chapelle to the state championship game and carries a career scoring average of 16.2 points per game to go with 8.3 rebounds and 4.2 assists per contest.

"Olivia is one of the best guards in the state. She is someone we've been watching for years, so it's quite rewarding to receive her commitment," Stockton said. "Olivia (a.k.a. "Turtle") can score, defend, and she is also a great passer - she can play both the point and shooting guard positions. Olivia will be a very successful player in C-USA."

Grayson also has a history with Tulane, as her half brother, Andrew Niermann, is the starting right guard on the Green Wave football team.

The duo will join Danielle Nunn, a transfer from TCU sitting out this season due to NCAA transfer rules, as newcomers for next season. Nunn will be junior with two years of eligibility remaining. The Green Wave are slated to lose three players to graduation at the end of the season: forward Kendra Barnes, guard Ashley Langford, and guard/forward Megan Valicevic.

Third Commitment to Tulane Women's Basketball Signs NLU

Head Coach Lisa Stockton received her three commitment to the 2009-2010 Tulane women's basketball team as guard Tyria Snow signed a National Letter of Intent.

Snow is a 5-8 true point guard out of Southwood High School. The Shreveport, La. native has won two 5A state championships in the last three seasons, bookended around a state runner-up finish in 2007. The All-District selection dished out 158 assists last season.

"She is a true point guard with great court vision, good defensive skills, and has the right mentality to lead her team," Stockton said. "She's been to three state championships, so she knows how to win. Coming from one of the strongest high school programs in the state, she's very well coached and extremely competitive. Tyria's background will help her make the transition from high school to college basketball."

Snow rounds out the three-person class for Tulane, which announced two other signees on Saturday.

Two of the three signees for Tulane already have a previous history on the court. In the Louisiana 5A State Championship game, Chapelle High School's Oalivia Graystone attempted a game-winning drive in the waning seconds, but Snow stepped in and drew a charge, sealing the win for Southwood.

"It's great to get players out of Louisiana, especially one of this caliber," Stockton added. "Our incoming class is full of winners. They have been highly competitive in high school and had great success. They are the type of student-athlete we are looking for at Tulane: skilled on the court, smart both on the court and in the classroom, and bringing a strong work ethic and winning attitude to our program."

Last Time Out: Tulane 108, Nicholls State 66

Megan Valicevic scored a career-high 21 points as Tulane cruised to a 108-66 win over Nicholls State at Stopher Arena. Tulane scored its most points since 2001, when the Green Wave scored a 109-39 win over Puerto Rico-Mayaguez in San Juan. The 108 points was the fourth-most in school history, and the 42-point margin of victory was the 15th highest in the program's history.

Junior guard Indira Kaljo added a season-high 21 with five three-pointers. Senior guard Ashley Langford recorded her 10th career game with double-digit assists, handing out 10 dimes. Sophomore forward Brittany Lindsey chipped in 15 points, while freshman forward Brett Benzio added 10 to go with a team-high seven rebounds.

Benzio's streak of four-straight games with double-digit rebounds came to an end... mainly because Tulane rarely missed. The Green Wave connected on a season-best .643 from the field (45-of-70), including 14-of-23 from the field.

Tulane scored its most points since 2001, when the Green Wave scored a 109-39 win over Puerto Rico-Mayaguez in San Juan. The 108 points was the fourth-most in school history, and the 42-point margin of victory was the 15th highest in the program's history. Junior guard Indira Kaljo added a season-high 21 with five three-pointers. Senior guard Ashley Langford recorded her 10th career game with double-digit assists, handing out 10 dimes. Sophomore forward Brittany Lindsey chipped in 15 points, while freshman forward Brett Benzio added 10 to go with a team-high seven rebounds.
