A Glance At The Green Wave

• Tulane vs UCF

The Wave are 3-4 all-time against the Knights, falling last season in Orlando. Tulane won at home in 2007.

• Senior Day Streak

Tulane is 14-0 under Lisa Stockton on Senior Day. **Kendra Barnes**, **Ashley Langford** and **Megan Valicevic** hope to join the last 39 Tulane seniors to win on Senior Day. Tulane will host the C-USA tournament at Fogelman, March 5-8.

• Brit Soars Over Eagles

Brittany Lindsey scored a career-high 31 points in Tulane's win over Southern Miss. Her 14-of-19 field goals were the seventh-most field goals made in Tulane history. She ranks eight on Tulane's career field goal list at .497 (270-543).

• Led By Lindsey

Brittany Lindsey has reached double-figures in scoring in 21 of 27 games this season. She leads the Green Wave in scoring at 12.4 PPG.

• Langford's Longevity

Ashley Langford is started her 115th-straight game vs Southern Miss, the most starts of any Tulane player ever.

• Hair Apparent at Point Guard?

Center **Brett Benzio** handed out a career-high eight assists vs Southern Miss to go with 10 rebounds.

• Getting Defensive

Tulane leads C-USA in scoring defense (60.0 PPG). In 23 of Tulane's 27 games, the Wave have held opponents to 70 points or less in regulation. Only #18 Arizona State, #23 Georgia Tech, South Florida (the nation's highest scoring team) and UTEP reached over 66 in 40 minutes.

• Getting More Defensive

Tulane held C-USA's top shooting team, Southern Miss (.465 entering) to a season-low .354 field goal percentage. In nine of Tulane's 13 conference games, the Wave have held opponents 60 points or less. Four teams have been held under 52 points.

• Makin' Miscues

Tulane has forced 185 turnovers in the last eight games and lead C-USA play in turnover margin, and takeaways with 278 forced turnovers (21.4/G)

• Deuce Hits A Grand

Ashley Langford ranks 20th on the Green Wave scoring list with 1,015 for her career.

• Forty-Point-Five

Tulane is 13-0 this season when the Green Wave connect on a field goal percentage of 40.5 or higher.

• 33 For 3

Indira Kaljo's 56 three-pointers made are the seventh-most in a single season. Her .424 three-point percentage would rank first in a single-season at Tulane if it holds up. She debuted on Tulane's career three-point percentage leaders in the top spot with 56 threes on 132 attempts.

• Lifted by Langford

Ashley Langford ranks sixth in school history in steals with 219. Earlier this season, she tied a Tulane record with eight steals against Temple and added seven against UAB.

• Benzio's Boardin' as Top Rebounding Freshman

Brett Benzio's 9.7 rebounds per game leads all NCAA freshmen. She ranks fourth in C-USA in RPG. She's reached double-figures in rebounding in 15 of 27 games.

• Deuce's Dimes

Ashley Langford is the undisputed holder of second place on the C-USA all-time assist list with 689 in 115 games.

• Out Shoot 'Em

Tulane is 23-3 dating back to last season when connecting at a higher field goal percentage than its opponent, 13-3 this year. Tulane outshot USF and Houston, but each time shot under 50% FT in a loss. Tulane is just 7-23 (2-9 this year) when posting a lower FG percentage (1-0 same).

• Alive For a Bye

At 7-6, Tulane is still mathematically alive for a top four seed and a bye in to C-USA tournament quarterfinals. The Green Wave would need to win out, have Southern Miss and SMU to each beat UTEP, and UCF to fall next weekend to either ECU or UAB. Tulane, UTEP and UCF would then be tied for fourth at 10-6, with the Green Wave taking the tie-breaker if Southern Miss finishes ahead of Houston.

• Next Up: At SMU Thursday, Feb 26

Tulane meets the Mustangs in Dallas in a 7 pm tip-off.

Head Coach Lisa Stockton

The winningest coach in Conference USA, Lisa Stockton concluded her 13th season at Tulane much like her first: with a conference Coach of the Year award and a trip to the post-season. The 2006-07 Conference USA Coach of the Year led her team to the regular season title, and a 26-7 overall record, and a trip back to the post-season with a second round appearance in Women's National Invitational Tournament.

In 14 seasons as a head coach of the Green Wave, Stockton has compiled a 282-141 overall record, including a 114-66 Conference USA mark. Her lifetime record of 345-168 in 17 seasons as a head coach is good for a winning percentage of .681 entering 2008-09.

Her teams have made nine NCAA Tournament appearances (1995-2003). She guided the Green Wave to C-USA regular season titles during the 1996-97, 1998-99 and 2006-07 seasons, and won C-USA Tournament crowns in 1997, 1999, 2000 and 2001.

With 282 wins at Tulane, Stockton has more wins than the previous five Green Wave coaches earned in 19 years.

Five Tulane players have gone on to play in the WNBA, including two -- Barbara Farris with the Detroit Shock in 2003 and Janell Burse with the Seattle Storm in 2004 -- who have earned WNBA championships. Others have joined the professional ranks in other leagues, most recently 2007 graduate Jami Montagnino.

Blending athletic achievement and academic success, every student-athlete to play all four years with the Green Wave has completed their degree.

In 1994-95, Stockton took the reigns of the Tulane program and led her first team to a 19-10 record and the first NCAA appearance in school history while earning Metro Conference Coach of the Year honors.

That season kicked off a string of nine consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances, as her 1995-96 squad turned in her first of eight 20+ win seasons at Tulane. In 1996-97, her squad set a school record with 27 wins, earning its first C-USA title, and winning the program's first-ever NCAA Tournament

game as the Green Wave advanced to the second round. The Green Wave tied its school record with a 27-5 mark in 1999-2000, winning the Conference USA tournament and advancing to the NCAA Second Round again. Stockton's 2000-01 squad finished 22-10, won the C-USA tournament again and the Green Wave won 24 games in 2001-02. The ninth-straight NCAA Tournament trip followed in 2002-03.

Stockton began a three-year term serving on the Division I Women's Basketball Issues Committee in 208-09.

Tulane to Host 2009 Conference USA Women's Basketball Championship

Fogelman Arena, the storied venue of the Tulane basketball programs, will play host to the 2009 Conference USA Women's Basketball Championship on March 5 through March 8.



The Green Wave will be hosting the tournament for the second time in the 14-year history of C-USA. Tulane played host to the C-USA tournament in 1999, when the Green Wave won the tournament while seeded third to win their second of four C-USA tournament crowns. Tulane is the only team ever to win the tourney on its home floor.

Tulane also won the C-USA tournament in 1997, 2000 and 2001. The Green Wave were regular season champions in 1997, 1999 and 2007.

Fogelman Arena, which opened in 1933, has been the host facility for over 20 women's basketball tournaments, in the post-season and regular season, including conference tournaments (including the 1981 women's Metro Conference Tournament), the Tulane DoubleTree Classic, and the pre- and post- season Women's NIT.

ting Tulane's career record for games started, one more than Mary Ann Marino and Barbara Farris. Only four active players in Division I have started more consecutive games for their teams: UConn's Renee Montgomery, followed by Shalee Lehning of Kansas State, Kendra Reed of Southern Miss, and Sha Brooks of Florida.

Heir Apparent?

With senior **Ashley Langford** graduating at the end of the year, freshman **Brett Benzio** made her case to switch to point guard next year, as she handed out a career-high eight assists vs Southern Miss. With 10 rebounds against USM and a 9.7 RPG average, the 6-3 center is likely to remain in the paint.

Getting Defensive

Tulane leads C-USA in scoring defense (60.0 PPG). In 23 of Tulane's 27 games, the Wave have held opponents to 70 points or less in regulation. Only #18 Arizona State, #23 Georgia Tech, South Florida (the nation's highest scoring team) and UTEP reached over 66 in 40 minutes.

Getting More Defensive

Tulane held C-USA's top shooting team, Southern Miss (.465 entering) to a season-low .354 field goal percentage. In nine of Tulane's 13 conference games, the Wave have held opponents 60 points or less. Four teams have been held under 52 points. The Green Wave are holding teams to just 53.8 PPG in their last eight games.

Indira Drains It

Indira Kaljo's 56 three-pointers made this season are the eighth most in a single-season at Tulane with at least five games to play. Her .424 three-point percentage would rank first in a single-season at Tulane. She debuted on Tulane's career three-point percentage leaders in the top spot with 56 threes on 132 attempts.

Conference Criminals

Tulane has forced 185 turnovers in the last eight games and lead C-USA play in turnover margin, and takeaways with 278 forced turnovers (21.4/G)

Tulane is averaging 12.5 steals in C-USA play, leading the league in C-USA action, and up from the 7.7 the Green Wave ripped in non-conference play.

Lifted by Langford

Ashley Langford tied a Tulane record with eight steals against Temple, one of five Wave players to do so. She added seven vs UAB and ranks sixth in Tulane with 219 steals in her career.

Chassity's Scoring Virtue

Chassity Brown sprung for a season-high 20 points against Rice, connecting on 7-of-11 field goal attempts. She followed that up with 19 points against Southern Miss. She is averaging 11.5 PPG in her last six games. Her 10 points, all in the second half, against East Carolina were instrumental to Tulane's 72-69 win.

All About The Benzio, Baby

Brett Benzio is the highest rebounding freshman in all of Division I, with 9.7 rebounds per game. She ranks fourth in C-USA in rebounds per game.

Benzio has reached double-figures in rebounding in 15 of 27 games with eight double-doubles. She was the lone freshman in Division I averaging a double-double (10.0 PPG/10.4 RPG) before coming down with mono prior to Jan. 18's game vs UTEP. In a five-game stretch, she averaged 6.3 PPG and 7.8 RPG, before posting a double-double against East Carolina.

Benzio scored a career-high 19 points and a career-high tying 15 boards at UTEP. She equaled her career-high in points with 19 against Houston with seven blocked shots.

Deuce's Dimes

Ashley Langford ranks second in C-USA history with 689 career assists. Only Sara Nord (852 at Louisville, 2000-04) has more in the history of the conference. She recorded her 10th career game with double-digit assists, handing out 10 in Tulane's win over Nicholls State. She is 16th in the NCAA in assists per game this season.

She became Tulane's career assist leader in only 69 games and owns the top four single-season assist marks in school history.

Point Production

In her 115 career games, **Ashley Langford** has scored 1,011 points herself, and her 689 assists have led to 1,608 Tulane points (265 layups, 205 jumpers, 219 three-pointers), for a total of 2,619 points accounted for. That's 33.7 percent of all Tulane's points (7,780) in her 115 games. Here's the breakdown of where her assists went:

Brett's Boards

Brett Benzio has grabbed 263 rebounds this season, the sixth most in a single-season in Tulane history and most by a freshman. With 10 against Southern Miss, she broke Evendra Barnes 261 in 1988-89 for the most by a freshman. At 9.7 per game, she is on pace for 302 through guaranteed games remaining, which would rank the fourth most rebounds in a single-season at Tulane.

Indira From Deep, the Rookie of the Week

Indira Kaljo connected on 11-of-15 (.733) from three-point range to be named Conference USA Rookie of the Week for Feb. 2-8. She averaged 22.5 PPG with 22 points against Marshall and 23 against ECU. She connected on 6-of-7 from three-point range with the game-winning three-pointer against ECU. She added 5-of-8 from three against Marshall and Kaljo sparked a 14-0 Tulane run with 10 of the 14 points as Tulane seized control and never trailed again en route to a 58-45 win.

Rolling Pink Wave

Tulane is now 1-0 all-time in pink jerseys following a 72-69 win over East Carolina Sunday in Tulane's Pink Zone game. The hero was junior **Indira Kaljo** with 23 points. Full details of the Pink Zone initiative are on page 9.

Indira's Near and Dear

Indira Kaljo was the story Feb. 8, scoring 23 points on six-of-seven from three-point range, including the game-winning trey with 0.1 seconds left. Kaljo, who lost her mom Almadina to breast

cancer, turned in an emotional performance on a day devoted to victims of breast cancer.

She was five-for-five from three point range to start the game, and her lone miss came with six seconds to go. **Brittany Lindsey** grabbed the offensive rebound and split two defenders with a pass back to Kaljo, who drained the game-winner.

“Something told me ‘you’re going to hit winner tonight,’” Kaljo said. “So when I missed that one, I was like ‘Dang, what was that?!’ and two seconds later, her comes Brittany with this pass - I don’t even know from where - and I was thinking ‘Put. This. One. Down.’ And I did. You don’t understand how happy, and how emotional I am right now. For my mom, for my team. We just never gave up and that’s why we won this game tonight.”

Owning the Glass

Tulane owned a 43-31 advantage on the glass over East Carolina, including 23 offensive rebounds. Tulane was one **Megan Valicevic** rebound shy of having three players with 10 rebounds. **Brittany Lindsey** grabbed a career-high 11 rebounds including seven on the offense end. **Brett Benzio** also brought down 11, with six on the offense glass. Valicevic finished with nine rebounds. Tulane has not had three players with double-figure rebounds since Dec. 21, 2000 against Boston University when Janell Burse, Gwen Slaughter and Teana McKiver all posted double-doubles.

Takin’ From Tulsa

Tulane forced 34 turnovers against Tulsa, the second most for Tulane ever in C-USA play, and the eighth most in a C-USA game. The Wave recorded 19 steals.

Trio Translates To Wins

The Green Wave are 12-2 this season when three or more players reach double-figures, and just 3-10 when two or fewer hit the 10-point plateau.

Forty Percent Does It, Too

Tulane is 14-2 this season when the Green Wave connect on a field goal percentage of 40.0 or higher. In the two losses, Tulane shot 40.0% even (versus number 23 Georgia Tech) and 40.4% (against Houston), making them 14-0 when shooting 40.5% or higher.

Out Shoot ‘Em

Tulane is 22-3 dating back to last season when connecting at a higher field goal percentage than its opponent, 12-3 this year.

Tulane outshot USF and Houston, but each time shot under 50% from the free throw line in a loss. Tulane is just 7-23 (2-9 this year) when posting a lower FG percentage (1-0 when same).

The Green Wave are 14-0 when shooting higher than 40.5 percent from the field this year.

Megan Mixes It Up

Megan Valicevic grabbed a season-high 10 rebounds against UAB, one short of her career high. It was her third 10+ rebound game of her career. She added nine more in Tulane’s win over East Carolina.

Brett’s Block Party

Brett Benzio’s seven blocks vs Houston (1/9) set a new record for a Tulane freshmen in a game, topping teammate Brittany Lindsey’s six versus Louisiana-Lafayette last season, and the six posted by Tulane’s all-time shot blocker Teana McKiver. Benzio’s seven blocks is a C-USA season high for a player in a game this season.

Brit Can Block, Too

Brittany Lindsey moved into Tulane’s all-time top 10 in blocked shots as just a sophomore. She now sits in eight with a career-total of 56.

Brett Benzio recorded her fifth career double-double vs UTEP, with a career-high 19 points and a career-high tying 15 boards, earning her C-USA Rookie of the Week Honors for Dec. 29-Jan. 4.

DoubleTree Roundup

Tulane won the DoubleTree Classic for the 10th time in 13 events with wins over Alabama State and Providence. **Brett Benzio** was named MVP after posting 19 pts and 20 rebs in two games. **Megan Valicevic** (20 pts, 11 reb, 6 asst) and **Ashley Langford** (18 pts, 14 asst) were also named to the All-Tournament Team.

Tulane Explodes for 108 vs Nicholls

Tulane's 108 points vs Nicholls State was the fourth-highest point total in school history, and the Green Wave's first 100-point game since a 109-39 win over Puerto Rico-Mayaguez in San Juan in November of 2001.

Field Goals' Up and Good!

Tulane's .643 (40-of-75) field goal percentage against Nicholls State was its fourth-highest in program history.

Power Drain

The Green Wave shot a blistering 59-percent in the first half, at Louisiana-Monroe, literally shooting lights out: just after halftime, a power outage delayed the game for over two hours. Following the delay, Tulane shot 31.8 percent, and saw its 12-point lead disappear before holding on for the 62-60 victory.

Tulane in the Preseason WNIT

The Green Wave finished their third Preseason WNIT appearance with a 1-2 record. Tulane is now 2-4 all-time in the tournament, and 0-4 on the road. Tulane lost at Louisiana Tech in the first round of the 1996 tournament. In 2000, the Wave defeated Grambling at home before falling in the second round at Texas.

Pre-Season Prognostication

The Green Wave, 16-14 last season, were picked fifth in Conference USA in the preseason poll of the C-USA coaches. Southern Miss was predicted to win C-USA, followed by SMU, 2008 champion UTEP, and East Carolina. After the Wave in fifth, the coaches tabbed Marshall to place sixth. The bottom half of the projection was not released as per league guidelines.

Langford Sets C-USA Longest Free Throw Streak

Ashley Langford made 43 consecutive free throws, the eighth longest streak in NCAA history and longest in C-USA history. It began with her final throw against Kansas State on Nov. 21, and ended 11 games later with her first free throw against UTEP on Jan. 12. The NCAA record is 66 by Richmond's Ginny Doyle (1991-92).

Ashley's Single-Season & Single-Game Assists Records

Ashley Langford owns the top four single-season marks in Tulane history. The 5-5 point guard set Tulane's single-season assist mark with 171 as a freshman and broke that mark this season with 207 as a sophomore. She tied her own school record for assists in one game against UTEP on January 20, with 14 dimes against the Miners. Her performance ties her mark at SMU on February 26, 2006. She now has 10 games with 10 or more assists in her career. Those 10 games are all in the top 12 marks in school history. Her performance is also tied for the second-most ever in Conference USA history, and the most ever in a C-USA league game.

Final Four Comes To New Orleans

Tulane could be considered Tourney Town USA by the end of 2013. Tulane University will host the NCAA Men's Basketball First & Second Rounds in 2010, the Men's Basketball Regionals in 2011, the Men's Basketball Final Four in 2012, and the Women's Basketball Final Four in 2013.

Tulane Adds Pair of Commitments for 2009-10

Head Coach Lisa Stockton received a pair of commitments for her 2009-2010 Tulane women's basketball team as forward Brittany McDonald and guard Olivia Grayson signed National Letters of Intent.

"Brittany and Olivia each fit in well with what our needs for the future," Stockton said. "Both have a great work ethic, are excellent students, and come from highly competitive, winning programs."

McDonald will fill a position coveted by the Green Wave: a true power forward. At 6-1, she led her team and was one of the top rebounders in the state of Georgia. The Gwinnett Daily Post named the Berkmar High School senior to their preseason Super Six on Thursday, as she led Berkmar to the state tournament, ending a 30-year drought for the school.

The two-time all-county player also excelled off the court as a two-year all-academic team honoree.

"Brittany's a player we need: She can step out and hit the outside shot, really runs the floor well, and is an excellent rebounder. She plays in a very tough high school league and they've been successful, making the state tournament last season."

Grayson, a 5-8 guard from Chapelle High School in Metairie, La., was the Louisiana High School 5A Most Valuable Player last season. The all-district, all-Metro and all-state selection led Chapelle to the state championship game and carries a career scoring average of 16.2 points per game to go with 8.3 rebounds and 4.2 assists per contest.

"Olivia is one of the best guards in the state. She is someone we've been watching for years, so it's quite rewarding to receive her commitment," Stockton said. "Olivia (a.k.a. "Turtle") can score, defend, and she is also a great passer - she can play both the point and shooting guard positions. Olivia will be a very successful player in C-USA."

Grayson also has a history with Tulane, as her half brother, Andrew Niermann, is the starting right guard on the Green Wave football team.

The duo will join Danielle Nunn, a transfer from TCU sitting out this season due to NCAA transfer rules, as newcomers for next season. Nunn will be junior with two years of eligibility remaining. The Green Wave are slated to lose three players to graduation at the end of the season: forward Kendra Barnes, guard Ashley Langford, and guard/forward Megan Valicevic.

Third Commitment to Tulane Women's Basketball Signs NLI

Head Coach Lisa Stockton received her third commitment to the 2009-2010 Tulane women's basketball team as guard Tyria Snow signed a National Letter of Intent.

Snow is a 5-8 true point guard out of Southwood High School. The Shreveport, La. native has won two 5A state championships in the last three seasons, bookended around a state runner-up finish in 2007. The All-District selection dished out 158 assists last season.

"She is a true point guard with great court vision, good defensive skills, and has the right mentality to lead her team," Stockton said. "She's been to three state championships, so she knows how to win. Coming from one of the strongest high school programs in the state, she's very well coached and extremely competitive. Tyria's background will help her make the transition from high school to college basketball."

Snow rounds out the three-person class for Tulane, which announced two other signees on Saturday.

Two of the three signees for Tulane already have a previous history on the court. In the Louisiana 5A State Championship game, Chapelle High School's Olivia Grayson attempted a game-winning drive in the waning seconds, but Snow stepped in and drew a charge, sealing the win for Southwood.

"It's great to get players out of Louisiana, especially one of this caliber," Stockton added. "Our incoming class is full of winners. They have been highly competitive in high school and had great success. They are the type of student-athlete we are looking for at Tulane: skilled on the court, smart both on the court and in the classroom, and bringing a strong work ethic and winning attitude to our program."

Last Time Out: Tulane 77, Southern Miss 60

Brittany Lindsey scored a career-high 31 points and five Tulane players scored double-figures as the Green Wave knocked off first place Southern Miss 77-60. Chassity Brown added 19 points with

On February 8, Tulane kicked off the WBCA Pink Zone campaign as women's basketball teams around the country joined in to fight against breast cancer. The Green Wave will be making a donation to the Kay Yow/WBCA Cancer Fund, which is a partnership for the Jimmy V Fund (The two N.C. State basketball coaches lost their battles with cancer; Kay Yow in January of 2009 and Jim Valvano in 1993), comprised of ticket sales, fan donations and proceeds from the auction of three pink jerseys.

Tulane wore pink jerseys for the first time in school history and defeated East Carolina 72-69. The story of the day was **Indira Kaljo** (pictured), who's mother Almadina passed away due to breast cancer in 2a001. Indira scored a career-high 23 points, including the game-winning three-pointer with 0.1 seconds left. She hit 6-of-7 three-point attempts on the day, tying her career high.

"Coach said 'You don't need to score 50 points to pay honor to your mom.' I've been living for this moment for years now. I told her 'Don't worry about this, I got this.'"

"Something told me 'you're going to hit winner tonight.' Her comes Brittany with this pass - I don't even know from where - and I was thinking 'Put. This. One. Down.' And I did. You don't understand how happy, and how emotional I am right now. For my mom, for my team. We just never gave up and that's why we won this game."

THE PINK ZONE PROGRAM

The WBCA Pink Zone initiative is a global, unified effort for the Women's Basketball Coaches Association's (WBCA) nation of coaches to assist in raising breast cancer awareness on the court, across campuses, in communities and beyond.

The WBCA began the WBCA Pink Zone™, formerly known as "Think Pink", in 2007 as an initiative to raise breast cancer awareness in women's basketball, on campuses and in communities. In 2007, more than 120 schools unified for this effort and helped make the inaugural year a success. In 2008, over 1,200 teams and organizations participated, reaching over 830,000 fans and raising over \$930,000 for breast cancer awareness and research.

five steals. Center Brett Benzio handed out a career-best eight assists and grabbed 10 rebounds, while Indira Kaljo chipped in 12 points.

Tulane used a 17-5 run over 5:10 in the second half to turn a 31-30 ball-game into a double-digit lead. The Green Wave held the top field goal shooting team in C-USA (.465 entering) to a season-low 35.4 percent (23-for-65).

Lindsey connected on 14-of-19 field goal attempts, the sixth-most field goals made in Tulane player history.

Senior point guard Ashley Langford dished out five assists to go with 11 points. Tulane shot 49 percent from the field (26-of-53), including 54 percent in the second half.

The game was a match-up of the two top post-games in C-USA, as USM's Pauline Love and Stephanie Helgeson entered the game averaging 26.4 PPG to go with 17.0 rebounds per game.

But Tulane out-scored the Eagles in the paint, 32-22, and owned a 41-38 edge in rebounding. The Green Wave also blocked seven shots to USM's one. Lindsey and Benzio combined for 33 points, 14 rebounds four blocks, four steals and nine assists.

Love led Southern Miss with 21 points, with nine boards, while Helgeson scored 15 points and added 14 rebounds.

Alive For a Bye

At 7-6, Tulane is still mathematically alive for a top four seed and a bye in to C-USA tournament quarterfinals. The Green Wave would need to win out, have Southern Miss and SMU to each beat UTEP, and UCF to fall next weekend to either ECU or UAB. Tulane, UTEP and UCF would then be tied for fourth at 10-6, with the Green Wave taking the tie-breaker if Southern Miss finishes ahead of Houston.

Next Up: At SMU Thursday, Feb 26

Tulane meets the Mustangs in Dallas in a 7 pm tip-off. The Green Wave wrap the 2009 regular season on Saturday, Feb. 28 at Tulsa before returning home for the 2009 Conference USA Women's Basketball Championship, March 5-8, at Tulane's Fogelman Arena
