TULSA OFF TO NCAA GREENSBORO REGIONAL . . .

√ The Tulsa men's golf team will participate at the NCAA Greensboro Regional, May 17-19, at the Grandover Resort East Course in Greensboro, North Carolina.

A total of 81 teams will participate in six 54-hole regional tournaments as the low five teams and the low individual not on those teams from each regional will advance to the NCAA championship finals.

Fourteen teams will be competing in the Greensboro Region. Tulsa will be represented by juniors Chris Worrell and Mark Mumford, sophomore John Young Kim and freshmen Matt Mabrey and Colton Staggs.

Since the regional competition began in 1989 Tulsa has made 22 of the 24 regional events. Tulsa will be looking to advance to the NCAA Championship Finals for the first time since 2007.

The championship finals will be held May 29-June 3 at The Riviera Country Club in Pacific Palisades, California and is hosted by the University of Southern California.

TULSA PLACES SEVENTH AT C-USA CHAMPIONSHIP . . .

√ Tulsa finished in seventh place at the Conference USA Men's Golf Championship, April 22-24, at the Texarkana Country Club in Texarkana, Arkansas.

The Hurricane carded rounds of 301-296-291 for an 888 total at the par-72 course. Memphis led from wire-to-wire to claim the team title.

Tulsa freshman Matt Mabrey placed 13th overall to lead the Hurricane with rounds of 77-77-69 for a 219 total, while junior Mark Mumford had a 21st place finish after beginning the tournament with a round of 80, but finished with rounds of 71-70 for his 221 total. Freshman Colton Staggs placed 36th, while junior Chris Worrell and sophomore John Young Kim finished in a tie for 39th place.

TULSA HAS TWO SECOND-PLACE PERFORMANCES . . .

√ Tulsa has turned in two second-place performances this season. The Hurricane claimed second place in its first tournament of the year at the Northern Intercollegiate.

Tulsa carded rounds of 292-294-294 for a 54-hole total of 880, 10 strokes behind medalist UCF to finish in the 16-team field, September 10-11, in Chicago, Illinois.

The Hurricane had its second runner-up finish this season by claiming second place in a field of 15 teams at the Louisiana Classics in Lafayette, Louisiana, March 5-6.

Tulsa carded rounds of 290-284-287 for a three-under par total of 861 to tie SMU for second place at the par-72 Oakbourne Country Club course.

TU GOLFERS EARN C-USA HONORS . . .

√ Tulsa freshman Matt Mabrey was named to the Conference USA All-Freshman team, while junior Chris Worrell earned C-USA All-Academic team honors.

Mabrey has a team-best 73.2 stroke average and has finished among the top-20 five times.

Worrell has maintained a 3.84 GPA in business management, while turning in a 73.5 stroke average this year.

FIVE TULSA GOLFERS HAVE SUB-74 STROKE AVERAGE . . .

√ Five Tulsa golfers have totaled sub-74 stroke averages after 11 tournaments this year. Freshman Matt Mabrey has a team-best 73.2 stroke average in eight tournaments and 24 rounds.

Freshman Cody Kent has played in only one tournament and has turned in a 73.3 stroke average for those three rounds. Junior Chris Worrell has an average of 73.5 through 10 tournaments and 30 rounds of golf this year, and is closely followed by sophomore John Young Kim, who has a 73.8 stroke average in 30 rounds as well.

Junior Mark Mumford has also tallied a 73.8 average through eight tournaments and 24 rounds. Senior Stephen Carney has a 74.0 stroke average through seven tournaments and 21 rounds.

TULSA FROSH MATT MABREY HAVING SOLID SPRING . . .

√ In just his fifth collegiate tournament, freshman Matt Mabrey had his best finish with a fourth-place performance in a field of 84 golfers at the Louisiana Classics. He carded rounds of 73-68-71 for a four-under par total of 212 to pace the Hurricane.

In six spring tournaments, Mabrey has carded a team-best 72.6 stroke average in 18 rounds. In addition to his career-best fourth place finish, Mabrey has also placed 10th at The Woodlands All-American, 13th at the Conference USA Championship and 17th at the Desert Shootout to lead the Hurricane at all three events.

Mabrey has an overall 73.2 stroke average in eight tournaments and 24 rounds this entire season. His best fall performance in two events was 15th place at his first collegiate tournament, the Northern Intercollegiate.

WORRELL, KIM TOPS DURING FALL SEASON . . .

√ Tulsa's Chris Worrell and John Young Kim played in all five fall tournaments for the Hurricane and finished one-two for best stroke average through 15 rounds of golf.

Worrell had a fall-best 73.2 stroke average with a low round of 70 three times, while Kim had a 73.4 stroke average and shot a low round of 68, which came on his first round of the year at the season opening Northern Intercollegiate.

Worrell finished among the top-40 in all five fall tournaments, including three top-15 finishes. He had a season-best ninth-place finish at the Northern Intercollegiate.

Kim turned in a team-best fifth-place performance with a one-over par 214 at the Northern Intercollegiate. He also had a sixth place finish at the David Toms Invitational and placed 14th at the Rod Myers Invitational, all coming in the fall campaign.

JENKS STANDOUT COLTON STAGGS TRANSFERS TO TU . . .

√ A true freshman from Jenks (Okla.) High School, Colton Staggs transferred to Tulsa from Oklahoma State at mid-semester. Staggs did not participate at OSU last semester. He was a four-time all-conference selection at Jenks (Okla.) High School, and an all-state selection as well. Staggs was named the Tulsa World All-Metro Golfer of the Year and won seven times during his senior season.

In his first collegiate tournament, Staggs carded rounds of 74-73-77 to finish with a 48th-place score of 224 at the UTSA Oak Hills Invitational. He has played in a total of four spring tournaments for the Golden Hurricane and has turned in a season-best performance of 36th place at the Conference USA Championship.

THE TULSA ROSTER . . .

STEPHEN CARNEY . . . has played in 36 career tournaments . . . has 11 top-20 career performances . . . has a 74.0 stroke average in 21 rounds this season . . . best performance this year is sixth place at the Rod Myers Invitational . . . had five top-20 finishes in 2010-11, while playing in 11 tournaments . . . best season performance was second place at the National Invitational . . . also had a 10th place performance at the Wolf Run Intercollegiate . . . finished in 16th place at the C-USA Championships . . . played in 10 of 12 tournaments in 2009-10 . . . had a 74.0 stroke average in 30 rounds as a sophomore . . . turned in five-top-20 performances in 2009-10 . . . had his best career finish of fourth place in 2009-10 at the UTSA Invitational . . . also placed seventh at the Louisiana Classic . . . played in six tournaments in 2008-09 . . . had a 76.4 stroke average in 18 rounds as a freshman . . . played prep golf at Union High School . . . was the 2008 Oklahoma Class 6A state champion with rounds of 73-69-70 . . . also placed first at the Class 6A regional championship with rounds of 68-69 . . . was the Metro Player of the Year as a senior.

ARIE FAUZI . . . has played in 37 career tournaments . . . has 13 top-25 career performances . . . has played in three tournaments this year, all coming in the fall, and has a 76.2 stroke average . . . had four top-20 finishes in the 2010-11 season, including a career-best 5th place performance at the Rod Myers Invitational . . . was a Cleveland Golf/Srixon All-America Scholar in 2010-11 . . . also placed seventh at the Louisiana Classics . . . had a 74.8 stroke average in 33 rounds . . . played in all 12 tournaments in 2009-10 and had eight top-25 finishes . . . placed among the top-15 three times in 2009-10 . . . had a 73.9 stroke average in 36 rounds in 2009-10 to share the team lead . . . placed 20th at the NCAA South Central Regional as a sophomore . . . played in nine tournaments as a freshman in 2008-09 . . . had a 76.1 stroke average in 27 rounds as a freshman . . . earned C-USA All-Freshman Team honors in 2009 . . . prior to Tulsa, he captured the Malaysian Amateur Stroke Play Championship in 2008 . . . sank a 30-foot putt on the first playoff hole in a five-man playoff to qualify for the 2008 US Amateur . . . won medalist honors at the Perak Amateur Open in 2007.

MARK HICKS . . . a red-shirt freshman . . . has not seen action yet for Tulsa . . . did not play in the 2010-11 season as a true freshman . . . qualified for the 2010 U.S. Amateur and the 2009 U.S. Junior Amateur . . . tied for first at the U.S. Amateur Sectional Qualifier in Mission Viejo, Calif. . . . was named the Desert Valley League MVP as a sophomore and junior . . . was a three-time all Desert Valley League performer . . . won the DVL Individual Championships as a sophomore and a junior.

CODY KENT . . . a red-shirt freshman . . . saw his only action this year at the Desert Shootout as he averaged 73.3 strokes and finished in 48th place playing as an individual . . . did not play in 2010-11 season . . . qualified for the U.S. Amateur in 2010 . . . placed third at the U.S. Amateur Sectional Qualifier in Aurora, Colo. . . . placed fourth at the 2010 Colorado State Amateur . . . tied for second at the Colorado AJGA tournament in 2009 . . . in high school, was a three-time first team Colorado All-State selection and two-time state individual runner-up . . . was a two-time team state champion, two-time Continental League Low Player of the Year . . . was a four-time first-team All-Continental League selection.

JOHN YOUNG KIM . . . has played in 22 career tournaments . . . has placed among the top-25 nine times . . . has placed among the top-15 six times . . . has a 73.8 stroke average in 30 rounds this year . . . has four top-15 performances in 10 tournaments this season . . . best performances were 5th place at the Northern Intercollegiate and 6th place at the David Toms Invitational . . . played in 12 tournaments in 2010-11 . . . had a 74.8 stroke average in 36 rounds in 2010-11 . . . had a career-best fourth-place performance at the Conference USA Championships . . . had Tulsa's best finish at the 2011 NCAA Regional in 24th place . . . also finished in 14th place at the National Invitational Tournament . . . finished in 21st place at the UTSA Oak Hills Invitational . . . qualified for the 2010 U.S. Amateur . . . won the U.S. Amateur Sectional Qualifier in Newport Beach, Calif. . . . was the Orange County Dream Team Player of the Year as a high school senior.

MATT MABREY . . . a true freshman . . . earned C-USA All-Freshman Team honors this year . . . has played in eight tournaments and has finished among the top-20 five times with four top-15 performances . . . leads the team with a 73.2 stroke average in 24 rounds. . . . turned in a season-best 4th place performance at the Louisiana Classics . . . also had a 10th place performance at The Woodlands All-American and 13th finish at the Conference USA Championship . . . had a 15th place finish in his first career tournament at the 2011 Northern Intercollegiate . . . has a team-best 72.6 stroke average in 18 rounds during the spring season.

MARK MUMFORD . . . has played in 10 career tournaments, including eight this year and two in the 2009-10 campaign . . . has placed among the top-30 in five tournaments this year — 29th at the Rod Myers Invitational, 26th at the Royal Oaks Intercollegiate, 22nd at the John Hayt Invitational, 27th at the Desert Shootout and 21st at The Woodlands All-American . . . did not play in the 2010-11 season . . . played in two tournaments in 2009-10 . . . his best finish in 2009-10 was 59th place at the Baylor Intercollegiate . . . had a 77.5 stroke average as a freshman in 2009-10 . . . was a Future Collegians World Tour All-American . . . was a New York all-state selection as a junior and senior.

COLTON STAGGS . . . a true freshman . . . has played in four events and has a 76.8 stroke average in 12 rounds . . . his best finish was 36th place at the Conference USA Championship . . . placed 48th at the UTSA Oak Hills Invitational in his first collegiate event . . . transferred at mid-semester from Oklahoma State . . . was a four-time all-conference selection at Jenks (Okla.) High School . . . was an all-state selection for the Trojans as well . . . also named the Tulsa World All-Metro Golfer of the Year . . . captured Class 6A regional titles in 2007 and 2008 . . . won the PGA South Central Junior Championship in 2008 and 2009 . . . won the 2009 OGA Men's State Amateur to become the youngest winner in the history of the event.

ANDRE' TOURINHO . . . has played in 37 career tournaments . . . has three career top-15 performances . . . has played in seven tournaments this year and has a 74.4 stroke average in 21 rounds . . . best finish was 12th place at the Northern Intercollegiate in the first tournament of the season, as he played as an individual . . . played in eight tournaments in 2010-11 and had a 76.1 stroke average . . . his best finish last year was 15th place at the Wolf Run Intercollegiate . . . played in all 12 events in 2009-10, and as a freshman in 2008-09 played in 10 tournaments . . . had a career-best performance of 14th place at the ORU Shootout in 2009-10 . . . had a 75.8 stroke average in 36 rounds as a sophomore . . . had a 77.2 stroke average as a freshman . . . was a member of the Brazilian Under-15 South American Championship Team . . . placed sixth at the Junior South American Championship in March 2007 . . . was a two-time participant at the Callaway Junior World Golf Championship. . . was a two-time champion of the Itanhanga Open, a nationally-ranked Tier One Tournament, winning in 2006 and 2007.

CHRIS WORRELL . . . has played in 34 of 40 career tournaments . . . has 10 top-20 career performances . . . has a 73.5 stroke average in 30 rounds this year . . . earned C-USA All-Academic team honors for two straight years, 2010-11 and 2011-12 . . . had a season-best 9th place finish at the Northern Intercollegiate . . . also placed 13th at the Golfweek Conference Challenge and 14th at the David Toms Invitational . . . played in all 12 tournaments in 2010-11 and had a team-leading 73.5 stroke average in 39 rounds . . . was named second-team all-C-USA in 2010-11 . . . had seven top-20 finishes in the 2010-11 season, while turning in a career-best sixth place finish in back-to-back tournaments at the Desert Shootout and the National Invitational . . . also finished in 11th place performance at the John Hayt Collegiate and 12th at the Louisiana Classics . . . had a career-best round five-under par 67 in the second round at the Desert Shootout last year . . . played in 11 of 12 tournaments in 2009-10 . . . had a 75.6 stroke average in the 2009-10 season.

BROGDEN IN 26th SEASON AT TULSA . . .

√ Bill Brogden in his 26th year as the men's golf coach and assistant athletic director at The University of Tulsa in 2010-11.

In 43 years as a collegiate golf coach, Brogden has enjoyed many successes. At four different Universities, Brogden has taken teams to national prominence.

During that time, his teams have now qualified for national competition 33 times, including 18 times to the national championship round. Brogden has earned conference coach of the year accolades 11 times, has been inducted into the GCAA Hall of Fame, has coached 22 All-Americans and has won 16 conference championships.

Under Brogden's guidance, Tulsa has won seven Missouri Valley Conference titles and captured the Western Athletic Conference Championship in 2002. Tulsa finished as the WAC runner-up in 2001, 2003 and 2004, and in 2005 tied for the school's second WAC title.

In 2006-07, Brogden led the Hurricane to the 2007 Conference USA crown and the NCAA Central Regional title. He was named C-USA and the Central Regional Coach of the Year.

Tulsa made its sixth appearance at the NCAA Championships under Brogden in 2007.

In 2002, Brogden's team placed third at the NCAA Central Regional and advanced to the NCAA Championships. The Hurricane entered the final round in second-place and finished with the school's highest national finish with a ninth place performance. Brogden was named the Central Region Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2007 as selected by the Golf Coaches Association of America.

Brogden was named as the TU coach on September 2, 1986 following 10 seasons as the head coach at Oral Roberts University. At ORU, Brogden's teams made seven NCAA Championship appearances, captured six Midwestern Collegiate Conference titles and won 15 tournaments. He was named the National Coach of the Year in 1980 and added the District V Coach of the Year honors in '80, '81 and '85.

Before his appointment at ORU, Brogden coached for five years at LSU and two years at Memphis.
