## TULSA COMPLETES SEASON AT THE NCAA-SAN DIEGO REGIONAL . . .

√ The Tulsa men golfers completed its season at the NCAA San Diego Regional, May 19-21, with an 11th place performance. Tulsa shot a final round 17-over par 305 and finished the 54-hole event with a total of 891 at the par-72 Farms Golf Club.

Tulsa's 305 was its worst round of the tournament after turning in an opening round 300 and a two-under par 286 in second round action.

The top five teams — UCLA, Southern Cal, San Diego, Ohio State and Texas — advanced to the NCAA Championship, May 31-June 5, at Karsten Creek in Stillwater, Okla.

For the Hurricane, freshman John Young Kim finished on 24th place with a score of 219, while sophomore Chris Worrell turned in three round total of 224 for 46th place. Junior Stephen Carney finished in 51st place with a 227 score, while fellow junior Arie Fauzi placed 54th overall with a score of 228. Freshman Johannes Veerman finished in 61st place with a score of 230.

## TULSA PLACES THIRD AT C-USA CHAMPIONSHIPS . . .

√ Tulsa finished in third place at the Conference USA Men's Golf Championships, April 24-26, at the par 72, 6,935-yard Texarkana Country Club.

Tulsa carded rounds of 289-288-291 for a four-over par total of 868. Tulsa was leading the tournament by three strokes after second round action, but defending champion UCF took the third round lead and held on for the victory, while Memphis finished in second place.

Tulsa freshmen John Young Kim and Johannes Veerman finished in fourth and fifth place, respectively. Kim finished the 54-hole event with a four-under par score of 212, while Veerman ended the tournament with a three-round total of two-under par 214.

## TWO TULSA GOLFERS EARN C-USA HONORS . . .

√ Tulsa sophomore Chris Worrell was named to the Conference USA second-team this year, while freshman Johannes Veerman earned all-freshman team accolades.

Worrell has a team-leading 73.4 stroke average in 36 rounds, while Veerman has a 74.1 stroke average, also in 36 rounds.

Worrell was also named to the C-USA All-Academic Team with a 3.75 grade point average in business management.

## GOLFERS WIN NATIONAL INVITATIONAL . . .

√ The Tulsa men's golf team captured the team championship at the National Invitational Tournament, March 21-22, at the Omni Tucson National Country Club in Tucson, Arizona.

The Hurricane carded rounds of 302-282-283 to finish the 54-hole tournament with an 11-over par score of 867. Tulsa outdistanced second-place SMU by seven strokes.

Tulsa junior Stephen Carney turned rounds of 72-70-69 to finish in second place overall with a three round total of three-under par 211. Sophomore Chris Worrell had rounds of 74-70-70 for a final score of even par 214 for sixth place.

### **WORRELL TURNS IT ON . . .**

√ In his first three tournaments of the season, sophomore Chris Worrell's best finish was 28th place in the season opener. In the next six tournaments, Worrell placed among the top-20 in each of those events, including two sixth-place performances.

His first top-20 performance came at the Memphis Intercollegiate with a 17th place finish. Worrell then placed 18th at the UTSA Oak Hills Invitational, 11th at the John Hayt Collegiate and 12th at the Louisiana Classics. He then had back-to-back sixth-place performances at the Desert Shootout and the National Invitational.

Worrell placed among the top-20 seven times this year, while his final top-20 finish was 18th place at The Aggie Invitational.

### **CARNEY HAS FIVE TOP-20 FINISHES . . .**

√ Junior Stephen Carney turned in five top-20 performances this year. He had his first top-20 finish with a 10th place finish in his first event of the year at the Windon Memorial Classic.

Carney closed out the fall campaign with a 17th place finish at the Memphis Intercollegiate. He began the spring season with a 12th place performance at the Oak Hills Invitational. She also placed 16th at the C-USA Championships.

His best finish was second-place at the NIT.

### **HURRICANE TURNED IN SIX TOP-5 FINISHES THIS YEAR . . .**

√ The Tulsa Golden Hurricane opened the fall season with a pair of fourth place performances, and began the spring campaign with another fourth place finish. The Hurricane placed among the top-five in six tournaments this year, including a team title at the National Invitational Tournament in a field of 15 teams.

In the season opener, Tulsa placed fourth in a field of 15 teams at the Wolf Run Intercollegiate as the Hurricane carded a 54-hole total of 880. In the next tournament, the Hurricane finished in fourth place in a 17-team field with a score of 862 at the Windon Memorial Classic.

Tulsa opened the spring season with its third fourth-place performance of the year. The Hurricane carded a 54-hole score of 855 at the UTSA Oak Hills Invitational. Also in the spring campaign, Tulsa placed third at the Conference USA Championships and fifth at the Desert Shootout.

**Stephen Carney** . . . has played in 29 career tournaments . . . has 10 top-20 career performances . . . has a 74.0 stroke average in 33 rounds this season . . . had five top-20 finishes in 2010-11 . . . best season performance was second place at the National Invitational . . . also had a 10th place performance at the Wolf Run Intercollegiate . . . finished in 16th place at the C-USA Championships . . . played in 10 of 12 tournaments in 2009-10 . . . had a 74.0 stroke average in 30 rounds as a sophomore . . . turned in five-top-20 performances in 2009-10 . . . had his best career finish of fourth place in 2009-10 at the UTSA Invitational . . . also placed seventh at the Louisiana Classic . . . played in six tournaments in 2008-09 . . . had a 76.4 stroke average in 18 rounds as a freshman . . . played prep golf at Union High School . . . was the 2008 Oklahoma Class 6A state champion with rounds of 73-69-70 . . . also placed first at the Class 6A regional championship with rounds of 68-69 . . . was the Metro Player of the Year as a senior, while also earning all-state accolades.

**Arie Fauzi** . . . has played in 34 career tournaments . . . has 13 top-25 career performances . . . had four top-20 finishes this season, including a career-best 5th place performance at the Rod Myers Invitational . . . also placed seventh at the Louisiana Classics . . . had a 74.8 stroke average in 33 rounds . . . played in all 12 tournaments in 2009-10 and had eight top-25 finishes . . . placed among the top-15 three times in 2009-10 . . . had a 73.9 stroke average in 36 rounds in 2009-10 to share the team lead . . . placed 20th at the NCAA South Central Regional as a sophomore. . . played in nine tournaments as a freshman in 2008-09 . . . had a 76.1 stroke average in 27 rounds as a freshman . . . earned C-USA All-Freshman Team honors in 2009 . . . prior to Tulsa, he captured the Malaysian Amateur Stroke Play Championship in 2008 . . . sank a 30-foot putt on the first playoff hole in a five-man playoff to qualify for the 2008 US Amateur. . . won medalist honors at the Perak Amateur Open in 2007.

**Mark Hicks** . . . a true freshman . . . did not play in the 2010-11 season . . . qualified for the 2010 U.S. Amateur and the 2009 U.S. Junior Amateur . . . tied for first at the U.S. Amateur Sectional Qualifier in Mission Viejo, Calif. . . . was named the Desert Valley League MVP as a sophomore and junior . . . was a three-time all Desert Valley League performer . . . won the DVL Individual Championships as a sophomore and a junior.

**Cody Kent** . . . a true freshman . . . did not play in 2010-11 season . . . qualified for the U.S. Amateur in 2010 . . . placed third at the U.S. Amateur Sectional Qualifier in Aurora, Colo. . . . placed fourth at the 2010 Colorado State Amateur . . . tied for second at the Colorado AJGA tournament in 2009 . . . in high school, was a three-time first team Colorado All-State selection and two-time state individual runner-up . . . was a two-time team state champion, two-time Continental League Low Player of the Year . . . was a four-time first-team All-Continental League selection.

**John Young Kim** . . . a true freshman . . . played in 12 tournaments in 2010-11 . . . had a 74.8 stroke average in 36 rounds . . . had a career-best fourth-place performance at the Conference USA Championships . . . had Tulsa's best finish at the NCAA Regional in 24th place . . . also finished in 14th place at the National Invitational Tournament . . . finished in 21st place at the UTSA Oak Hills Invitational . . . qualified for the 2010 U.S. Amateur . . . won the U.S. Amateur Sectional Qualifier in Newport Beach, Calif. . . . was the Orange County Dream Team Player of the Year as a high school senior.

**Mark Mumford** . . . a sophomore . . . did not play in the 2010-11 season . . . played in two tournaments in 2009-10 . . . his best finish was 59th place at the Baylor Intercollegiate . . . had a 77.5 stroke average as a freshman in 2009-10 . . . was a Future Collegians World Tour All-American . . . was a New York all-state selection as a junior and senior.

**Andre' Tourinho** . . . has played in 30 career tournaments . . . has two career top-15 performances . . . played in eight tournaments in 2010-11 and has a 76.1 stroke average . . . his best finish this year was 15th place at the Wolf Run Intercollegiate . . . played in all 12 events in 2009-10, and as a freshman in 2008-09 played in 10 tournaments . . . had a career-best performance of 14th place at the ORU Shootout in 2009-10 . . . had a 75.8 stroke average in 36 rounds as a sophomore . . . had a 77.2 stroke average as a freshman . . . was a member of the Brazilian Under-15 South American Championship Team . . . placed sixth at the Junior South American Championship in March 2007 . . . was a two-time participant at the Callaway Junior World Golf Championship. . . was a two-time champion of the Itanhanga Open, a nationally-ranked Tier One Tournament, winning in 2006 and 2007.

**Johannes Veerman** . . . in his first season at Tulsa . . . played in all 13 tournaments in 2010-11 . . . had seven top-25 performances . . . was named to the C-USA all-Freshman team . . . best performance was fifth place at the Conference USA Championships . . . also finished in 11th place at the Desert Shootout . . . had a 12th place finish at the UTSA Oak Hills Invitational . . . has a 74.3 stroke average in 39 rounds in 2010-11.

**Chris Worrell** . . . has played in 24 of 25 career tournaments . . . played in all 12 tournaments in 2010-11 and had a team-leading 73.5 stroke average in 39 rounds . . . was named second-team all-C-USA in 2010-11 . . . also earned C-USA All-Academic team honors in 2010-11 . . . has seven top-20 career performances, all coming in 2010-11 . . . turned in a career-best sixth place finish in back-to-back tournaments at the Desert Shootout and the National Invitational . . . also finished in 11th place performance at the John Hayt Collegiate and 12th at the Louisiana Classics . . . had a career-best round five-under par 67 in the second round at the Desert Shootout this year . . . played in 11 of 12 tournaments in 2009-10 . . . had a 75.6 stroke average in 33 rounds in the 2009-10 season.

#### **BROGDEN IN 25th SEASON AT TULSA . . .**

√ Bill Brogden completed his 25th year as the men's golf coach and assistant athletic director at The University of Tulsa in 2010-11.

In 42 years as a collegiate golf coach, Brogden has enjoyed many successes. At four different Universities, Brogden has taken teams to national prominence.

During that time, his teams have now qualified for national competition 33 times, including 18 times to the national championship round. Brogden has earned conference coach of the year accolades 11 times, has been inducted into the GCAA Hall of Fame, has coached 22 All-Americans and has won 16 conference championships.

Under Brogden's guidance, Tulsa has won seven Missouri Valley Conference titles and captured the Western Athletic Conference Championship in 2002. Tulsa finished as the WAC runner-up in 2001, 2003 and 2004, and in 2005 tied for the school's second WAC title.

In 2006-07, Brogden led the Hurricane to the 2007 Conference USA crown and the NCAA Central Regional title. He was named C-USA and the Central Regional Coach of the Year.

Tulsa made its sixth appearance at the NCAA Championships under Brogden in 2007.

In 2002, Brogden's team placed third at the NCAA Central Regional and advanced to the NCAA Championships. The Hurricane entered the final round in second-place and finished with the school's highest national finish with a ninth place performance. Brogden was named the Central Region Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2007 as selected by the Golf Coaches Association of America.

Brogden was named as the TU coach on September 2, 1986 following 10 seasons as the head coach at Oral Roberts University. At ORU, Brogden's teams made seven NCAA Championship appearances, captured six Midwestern Collegiate Conference titles and won 15 tournaments. He was named the National Coach of the Year in 1980 and added the District V Coach of the Year honors in '80, '81 and '85.

Before his appointment at ORU, Brogden coached for five years at LSU and two years at Memphis.
