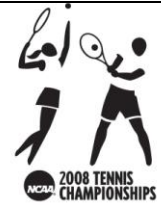

CHECK-IN

Upon arrival, teams should check-in at the tournament registration desk in the main lobby of the Michael D. Case Tennis Center (east entrance). At this time you will receive player and coach's credentials, parking passes, banquet tickets, etc. For the individual portion of the Championships, coaches should also check-in at the registration desk at the Michael D. Case Tennis Center to pick up credentials, parking passes, etc.

During play in the individual tournament, players are required to check-in at the registration desk at the Michael D. Case Tennis Center (east entrance).

TRAVELING TO THE CHAMPIONSHIPS

All transportation arrangements to and from the championships site shall be coordinated by the competing institutions. Participants located within **350** miles of the championships will be reimbursed for ground transportation only (please review NCAA travel policies on the NCAA website at www.ncaa.org for complete travel information). Further, arrangements to transport teams or individuals via commercial or charter aircraft must be made through the NCAA travel service, **SHORT'S TRAVEL (866/ 655-9215)**. **Travel arrangements through SHORT'S TRAVEL can also be conducted via the internet at www.shortstravel.com/ncaachamps.**

Only the NCAA is authorized to issue exceptions to travel arrangements and must be approved prior to traveling. Contact the NCAA Travel Department with any questions, (317/ 917-6757).

DIRECTIONS FROM AIRPORTS TO THE MICHAEL D. CASE TENNIS CENTER

From Tulsa International Airport:

Head northeast on Airport Dr and turn right on Virgin St. Turn left to merge onto OK-11 E toward I-244/Tulsa/Joplin. Take exit onto I-244/US-412 W toward Downtown. Take exit for Harvard Avenue and turn left onto Harvard. Turn right at E. 8th St. S and continue through campus. Turn right onto Delaware Ave, Michael D. Case Tennis Center is on your immediate left. Approximate driving time is 11 minutes.

From Will Rogers World Airport (OKC):

Head south on Terminal Dr and slight right at Meridian Ave. Slight right onto the ramp to Downtown/I-44. Merge onto Airport Rd/OK-152 and then take the exit onto I-44 E toward Downtown/Tulsa. Take the exit onto I-44 E toward Tulsa/I-35/Wichita. Merge onto I-35 N. Take exit 138A for I-44 E/Turnpike toward Tulsa and merge onto TOLL ROAD. When in Tulsa: slight left at I-244 E then take the exit onto I-244 E/US-412 E. Stay on highway as it takes you around downtown toward campus. Take Exit at Delaware Ave and turn right onto Delaware. Go through campus, Michael D. Case Tennis Center is on your right immediately after Sixth St. Approximate driving time is 1 hour and 49 minutes.

DIRECTIONS TO CAMPUS/MICHAEL D. CASE TENNIS CENTER

Arriving from points northeast (including the airport)

Follow I-244 West to Exit 8, Delaware Avenue. After exiting, follow the service road to the light at Delaware. Turn left (south) and travel approximately one mile. The Michael D. Case Tennis Center is on the right (west) side of Delaware, just before 8th Street.

Arriving from points southeast

Follow Routes 64/51 West (Broken Arrow Expressway). Exit at 15th Street. Turn right on 15th Street. Turn left (north) at the first stoplight (Delaware Avenue). Follow Delaware north to the Michael D. Case Tennis Center, which will be on the left (west) side of Delaware, just past 8th Street.

Arriving from the west

Follow I-44 to I-244 East. Follow I-244 East to Exit 8, Delaware Avenue. After exiting, follow the service road to the light at Delaware. Turn right (south) and travel approximately one mile. The Michael D. Case Tennis Center is on the right (west) side of Delaware, just before 8th Street.

DRUG TESTING

Student-athletes who compete in these championships may be subjected to drug tests in accordance with Bylaws 18.4.1.5 and 31.2.3, and may be determined to be ineligible as a result thereof. Only student-athletes who have consented in writing to such testing are initially eligible for these championships; and thereafter, student-athletes who are tested shall remain eligible only if they test negative.

NCAA policy now precludes any prior notification regarding drug testing. If an athlete is selected for drug testing, the athlete will be notified at the conclusion of their play that day. Refer to the NCAA General Championships Handbook for more details.

CHAMPIONSHIPS FORMAT

The NCAA Division I Men's and Women's Tennis Championships features separate team, singles and doubles championships.

TEAM – The team portion of the championships consists of sixty-four (64) teams playing a single elimination tournament at sixteen (16) first-and-second round sites (four teams at each site). The advancing sixteen (16) teams compete in bracket style competition to determine the national champions. Matches will be regulation dual matches- (three(3) eight-game, pro-set doubles played for one point, followed by six(6) singles matches, each valued at one team point, played best of three sets). Regular scoring will be used and a 12-point tie-breaker will be played at eight games all in doubles and six games all in singles. The team winning four or more points advances in the championships bracket.

During the championships, all matches will be stopped after the doubles point is decided. All remaining individual matches will be stopped once a team winner (four points won) has been determined. The score will only reflect completed matches.

INDIVIDUAL – A sixty-four (64) player singles championship and a thirty-two (32) doubles championship will be conducted. All matches shall be the best of three sets. Regular scoring and a (12) twelve point tiebreaker at six games all will be used for all matches.

OFFICIAL LINEUP FORM

The Division I Tennis Committee has approved online submission of lineup forms. Hard copies of the lineup forms are no longer sent to institutions. Access to the online lineup forms will be through the ITA Web site used for score reporting or the NCAA Web site (www1.ncaa.org/membership/champadmin/tennis/index) and will require the same institutional password used for the score-reporting process.

All automatic-qualifying teams and any team desiring consideration for at-large selection to the championships are required to submit the official online NCAA lineup form to the NCAA no later than 1 p.m. (Eastern Time), **Monday, April 28, 2008**. Coaches may list 15 student-athletes, including any doubles specialists, in order of singles play strength on the lineup form.

The lineup that is presented to the referee at the coaches meeting prior to the start of competition must consist of only **eight** player's total (including doubles specialists). For first- and second-round play, coaches only have access to the eight players on the lineup card submitted prior to the first-round contest. For those

teams traveling to the championships finals site, coaches will only have access to the eight players on the lineup card submitted prior to the round-of-16 competition.

The NCAA will reimburse each institution advancing to the finals site for a maximum of eight student-athletes (and a total travel party of 13 individuals). The institution bears the cost if the decision is made to take any additional members of the original 15 members listed on the lineup form to the championship finals site.

CHALLENGE PROCEDURES

Coaches will have the opportunity to review other teams' lineups on the NCAA Web site and submit any challenges to the NCAA national office beginning 30 minutes after the completion of the selection show, **Tuesday, April 29** and noon (Eastern time), **Thursday, May 1** (the deadline for submitting a lineup challenge). The subcommittees will conduct conference calls at 11 a.m. (Eastern Time) on Friday, May 2 to rule on any appeals and finalize the lineups. Coaches should note that they may need to make themselves available during this conference call if the committee has questions about their lineup or if their lineup has been challenged. Final lineups will be posted on the NCAA's Web site by 6 p.m. (Eastern Time) on Friday, May 2.

SEEDING AND DRAW INFORMATION

SEEDING – The Division I Tennis Committee will seed using the selection criteria. The selection criteria includes a review of team results obtained beginning January 1 through April 27, 2008. The committee will seed teams 1-16 in order. No.'s 17-32 will be banded in order. No.'s 33-48 will be banded alphabetically as a group of 16. No.'s 49-64 will be banded alphabetically as a group of 16. Teams will not be re-seeded after the first and second rounds.

The Division I Tennis Committee will seed individuals for the singles and doubles championships using the selection criteria. The selection criteria includes a review of individual results obtained beginning **September 7, 2007** (or the first day of classes, whichever is earliest), through **April 27, 2008**. For the singles championships, the committee will seed the top eight players in order and place the next eight alphabetically. For doubles competition, the committee will seed the top four teams in order, based on the selection criteria, and place the next four teams alphabetically by institution. The seeding for the singles and the doubles championships will be announced Wednesday, April 30th.

PAIRINGS - The committee will start with the No. 1 seed and pair it with any team in the 17-32 band, starting at the bottom of the group of 16 teams, taking into consideration geographic proximity. In other words, the process begins by examining the top-seeded team with the No. 32 seed. If the No. 32 seed is not a logical geographical partner for the No. 1 seed, the committee will review the next team (No. 31). This process will continue until each of the top-16 seeds are paired with a team seeded 17-32.

Based on geographic proximity, teams banded 33-48 and 49-64 are then added to each pair of higher-seeded teams to complete the four-team first-and second-round match-ups. Conference match-ups will be avoided in the first-round.

The pairings for the individual championships are the responsibility of the Division I Tennis Committee. The following parameters will be utilized to create the singles and doubles draws. The draw for the individual championships will be announced at the coaches meeting on Tuesday, May 20th.

- A. No. 1 seed is placed on the top line of the bracket.
- B. No. 2 seed is placed on the bottom line of the bracket.
- C. No. 3 and 4 seeds are randomly drawn to determine placement in the top half or the bottom half of the bracket (and cannot be in the same half of a No.1 or No. 2 teammate).
- D. No. 5, 6, 7 and 8 seeds are randomly drawn (i.e., No. 1 seed could play the No. 5, 6, 7 or 8 seed in the quarterfinals).
- E. Conference opponents do not play each other in the first round.
- F. Two teammates – separated into opposite halves of the bracket.
- G. Three or four teammates – the top two teammates (via ITA rankings) are separated into opposite halves, the other two are placed in the remaining halves randomly.
- H. Five or more teammates – see item “f” above with the remaining teammate(s) placed as far away from their teammates as possible in a quadrant.

SELECTION CRITERIA AND PROCEDURES

All selections to the NCAA Tennis Championships shall be the responsibility of appropriate subcommittees of the NCAA Men's and Women's Tennis Committee. Selections shall be based on the criteria outlined in the championships handbook.

Also, a television selection show will be conducted for the team championship. ESPNNews will announce the selections for the Men's and Women's Tennis Championships on Tuesday, April 29 from 2:00p.m.- 2:30p.m. (Eastern Time). Individual selections will be released Wednesday, April 30 by 6:00 p.m. (Eastern Time) on the NCAA website.

BANNERS/TEAM SIGNS

No banners or team signs other than those approved by the NCAA may be posted at NCAA Championships. Additionally, no flags/banners on poles will be permitted into the facility. Coaches should alert fans of this policy.

HOSPITALITY

A hospitality area will be provided for student-athletes and coaches *ONLY*. This area will be located in the southeast corner of the facility.

Concessions will also be available on site in multiple locations.

AWARDS

The team champions, runners-up and semi-finalists will be presented a team trophy at the championships. Each team semifinalist will be recognized on court during the break between doubles and singles of the team final and will be presented their team trophy. Coaches and players of both teams are encouraged to participate in this ceremony. Team champions and runners-up will be presented their individual awards and team trophies following the championship match.

Individuals in the singles and doubles portion of the championships that reach the quarterfinal round will receive an award. Athletes that reach the quarterfinal and semifinal rounds will be given their award at the end of their last match. The champion and runner-up of the singles competition will be presented their award after the singles final. The doubles champion and runner-up will be presented their award after the completion of the doubles final.

INCLEMENT WEATHER PLAN

The University of Tulsa is committed to providing a safe site of competition for participants and spectators. The following inclement weather policies will be enacted should circumstances dictate.

Lightning/Inclement Weather Policy

The following policy will be enacted should the event be impacted by inclement weather. These protocols adhere to suggested guidelines established by the NCAA.

Tournament Director Responsibilities

1. Obtain a weather report approximately 2 hours prior to scheduled event start time. In situations that indicate inclement weather potentially could move into the area, this weather report should be reviewed every ½ hour leading up to the event. Weather reports can be obtained by contacting the National Weather Service at 918/832.4115 or 918/832.4116. In addition, weather reports can be viewed on-line at NOAA.org.
2. In the event that inclement weather is in the area or approaching, the Tournament Director will establish contact with the head referees and the two head coaches (if on site). Ultimate decision making on whether or not the event should have a delayed start time, postponed play or discontinued play rests with the DI Tennis Committee, NCAA Representatives, Head Referees and Tournament Director.
3. The Tournament Director will continue to advise the DI Tennis Committee, NCAA Representatives and Head Referees of impending weather conditions.

Lightning protocol

1. The first flash of lightning or clap of thunder is immediate cause for awareness.
2. As stipulated by the NCAA the “flash to bang” method of lightning precautions should be immediately evoked.

Flash to Bang Protocol

1. A flash to bang count of 30 seconds indicates that all individuals should vacate the athletic site and reach a safe structure or location. At this time the event has been temporarily suspended.
2. Play will not resume until a minimum of 30 minutes after the LAST flash of lightning or sound of thunder before returning to the field of activity.

Evacuation/Shelter

In the event that severe inclement weather moves into the vicinity without warning, the Michael D. Case Tennis Center interior hallways will serve as the shelter location. Player Interviews. Participant interview requests will be made to the Tulsa Athletic Communications department and relayed to each team through the school's Sports Information representative or a member of the Tulsa staff. If an athlete is playing two matches in a single day, he/she has the opportunity to wait until after the completion of the second match to fulfill any interview requests.

Television News. Unless the NCAA has awarded live television rights for a championship, the games committee of that championship may permit single television stations or broadcast and/or cable networks to air action footage of the championship on a live or delayed basis on their regular television news programs. If live rights to the championship have been awarded, coverage may be presented only after the matches being documented have been completed. Unless otherwise approved by the NCAA, such coverage shall not exceed three minutes of action footage of the championship, unless broadcast rights have been secured from the NCAA by payment of a rights fee. Such a “news program” shall be a regularly scheduled program devoted exclusively to general news and/or sports news. Sports entertainment programs do not qualify under this provision. The NCAA president shall be authorized to interpret and apply these provisions as necessary.

The Men’s and Women’s Team Finals will be broadcast live on ESPNU, on Tuesday, May 20, 2008. ESPNU will air the women’s team finals live starting at 3:00 p.m. (Eastern Time), followed by the live broadcast of the men’s team finals at 7:00 p.m. (Eastern Time). The Men’s and Women’s Team Finals will also be shown on ESPN2 on a tape delayed basis on May 22, 2008, with the women’s action beginning at 2:00 p.m. (Eastern Time), followed by the men’s team finals at 3:30 p.m (Eastern Time).

The men’s and women’s singles and doubles finals will be shown on a tape delayed basis by the Tennis Channel, dates and times to be announced.

Videotapes, Films & Still Photographs. Institutions are permitted to videotape championships competition by their teams or their individual student-athletes for archival, coaching or instructional purposes. Each institution is permitted to use one camera and may tape only that portion of the competition in which it participates. The videotapes may not be used for any commercial purposes. Please see tournament staff for the designated filming locations.

MERCHANDISE

Official tournament merchandise will be available for your teams and fans to purchase throughout the championships. The merchandise booth is located adjacent to the Men’s Tennis Clubhouse at the main entrance to the facility. Payment can be made by either cash or credit card.

PRACTICE

The competition tennis courts and/or practice courts are available to each team for practice two days prior to competition.

On Wednesday, each women's team will be allowed one hour on three courts at the competition site and 90 minutes on three courts at the practice sites. Each men's team will be allowed 90 minutes on three courts at the competition site and 90 minutes at the practice sites.

Practice times for each team are pre-determined based on match times. **A chart indicating these times is included in this packet as Appendix A.** Practice times may be adjusted on a case-by-case basis due to travel arrangements. If you have questions regarding assigned times, you may call Layne Fisher at 918/740-4365 – beginning at 8:00 a.m. Central Time on Monday, May 12.

Singles and doubles participants may not practice at the competition courts or practice courts until Monday, May 19. Reservations for singles and doubles participants can be made beginning on Monday, May 12 with Layne Fisher at 918/740-4365– beginning at 8:00 a.m. Central Time.

PRACTICE BALLS

Each participating institution must bring their own practice balls. Balls will be available for purchase on site.

STRINGERS

There will be stringers available at the Michael D. Case Tennis Center in the Mayo Club Lounge. Cost will be \$15.00 per racket, with teams providing their own string. A very limited selection of string will be available to purchase.

All team coaches will be required to tab out at the end of each day. Cash will be the only form of payment accepted.

TOWELS, ICE and ICE BUCKETS

The University of Tulsa is pleased to provide ice buckets on each court throughout the Championships. Towels will be available and can be checked out for a \$3.00 per towel deposit. The deposit will be refunded upon return of the towel.

RULES

Play will be governed by United States Tennis Association rules and modifications adopted by the NCAA DI Tennis Committee and the Intercollegiate Tennis Association.

COACHING AND PLAYING COURT RESTRICTIONS--Coaching is permitted by the head coach and two designated coaches, who may be an assistant coach and/or a registered volunteer coach and/or player, provided it does not interfere with play. Two coaches may coach on the same court at one time. These are the only individuals who will be permitted to coach or be on the court. For the team championships, these

individuals shall be designated when the team lineup is submitted at the start of each team match. Coaches may be re-designated before the singles matches.

DEFAULTS--All matches will be scheduled at definite times. Any player not ready to play after the match is called is subject to the USTA penalty for delay of match. Also, any player who acts in a way that is not in the best interest of the game may be defaulted. Additionally, misconduct by a coach will result in a first warning and further misconduct will warrant removal from the match. The decisions will be made by the head referee and/or games committee.

OFFICIALS—Jane Goodman and Jim Russell will be the Tournament Referees. The following officials will be used at the NCAA Division I Tennis Championships.

- a) *Team Competition*: Solo chairs will be used for each match, beginning with the first round.
- b) *Individual Competition*: Chairs will be used for all matches. A full complement of officials and ball runners shall work the semifinals and finals.

REST PERIODS AND INJURY TIME-OUTS--When changing sides, a maximum rest period of 90 seconds may be taken by the players. After a two-set match, players will be provided a rest period of at least 45 minutes. After a three-set match, players will be provided a one-hour rest period before resuming play.

Team championship singles play will begin 10 minutes after the doubles point has been decided.

In the event of an injury, USTA rules will be modified. In particular, whenever an athletics participant suffers a laceration or wound where oozing or bleeding occurs, the practice or match should be stopped at the earliest time and the player should be given the appropriate medical treatment. The student-athlete should not return to the match or practice without the approval of medical personnel. The time needed for the procedure necessary to treat this type of injury will not be charged as an injury timeout.

SCORING—The regular scoring system and 12 point tiebreaker will be used in the championships.

SQUAD SIZE—The official squad size for the team championships shall be limited to eight players.

REPLACEMENT/SUBSTITUTION—Head coaches are required to inform the referee of any changes in the lineups. In the case of injury, illness or extenuating circumstances (as determined by the coach, to be approved by the games committee), a replacement can be made in the lineup. In such cases, the lineup must remain in order of strength, with athletes moving up one place in singles and the new player placed in the No. 6 singles position. For doubles competition, any replacement is a straight-line replacement. The three doubles teams must remain in order of strength as determined by their respective competition records. The games committee has the right to review and, if necessary, overrule a coach's decision regarding a lineup change, based on the ability of the players and matches during the season.

In team competition, if a player is injured during the pro-set doubles and that player is in the singles lineup, substitutions may be made for singles play but the lineup must follow the order of strength submitted on the lineup.

In the singles and doubles championships, in case of injury, illness or extenuating circumstances before the opening round, alternates selected by the subcommittee shall be substituted in numbered order if available. The substitution of alternates will be dictated by the maximum field size. If an athlete withdraws immediately before the start of the championships and the next alternate on the list is not on site, the committee may select a player(s) from those available at the championships site in order to fill the bracket.

A match is considered underway once the individual players begin their warm-up on the court.

TEAM LINEUP—The lineup for championships play is submitted to the referee at the mandatory coaches meeting before the start of competition. The lineup must consist of:

- athletes listed on the official NCAA entry form submitted no later than April 28;
- a minimum of six players present and physically capable of competing; and
- a maximum of eight players, including any doubles specialists.

In singles competition, position Nos. 1-5 shall remain the same for the duration of the championships. Position No. 6 may be filled with any of the three remaining players on the lineup, and may change from match to match.

The athletes listed on a team's lineup for the first-round will remain the same for the second-round. Teams advancing to the championships finals site may change the eight athletes on their lineup for the round-of-16. The athletes listed on a team's lineup for the round-of-16 will remain the same for the quarterfinals, semifinals and finals. Any athlete listed on a lineup must have been listed on the team's original entry form.

Lineups for the 64 teams selected to the championships will be posted on the NCAA's Web site immediately following the selection show, Tuesday, April 29.

TENNIS BALLS—Wilson is the official ball of the NCAA Tennis Championships and will be used during all rounds of team and individual competition. During championship competition balls shall be changed at the start of each set.

Effective with the 2008 Division I Tennis Championships, the women's tournament will use the Wilson U.S. Open regular duty ball. The men's tournament will continue to use the Wilson U.S. Open extra duty ball.

UNIFORMS—All competitors in the NCAA Division I Tennis Championships should wear exclusively the official uniform of their institution in competition, warm-up for competition, interviews and during the awards ceremonies. All players on each team are expected to wear the same team uniform at the start of the match. In the event official uniforms are not available, wearing apparel with institution emblems or initials and/or name may be worn and are recommended as alternate uniforms. Apparel, bearing professional sports team logos cannot be worn.

LOGOS—Uniforms (including warm-ups) and all other items of apparel (e.g., socks, headbands, T-shirts, wrist bands, visors or hats, and towels) may only bare a single manufacturer's or distributor's normal label or trademark not to exceed 2 ¼ square inches, including any additional material (e.g., patch) surrounding the normal trademark or logo. The logo or trademark must be contained within a four-sided geometrical figure (e.g., rectangle, square, and parallelogram).

In addition, an institution's official uniform cannot bare a design element similar to the manufacturers that is in addition to another logo or that is contrary to the size restriction.

A student-athlete representing an institution in intercollegiate competition is limited to wearing apparel items that include only the logo (not to exceed 2 ¼ inches) of an apparel manufacturer or distributor. The student-athlete may not wear any apparel that identifies any other entity, other than the student-athlete's institution.

These restrictions apply to all apparel worn by student athletes during the conduct of competition, which includes any pre-match or post match activities. The logo restrictions on student-athletes' apparel set forth in Bylaw 12.5.5 shall apply to all team personnel (e.g., coaches, trainers, managers) who are the bench or court for practices and matches or who participate in NCAA news conferences. It should be noted that those contracts between institutions and apparel manufacturers or distributors that include logo specifications may be honored, provided such contracts were in effect before August 11, 1998. Additionally, the logo restriction on student-athletes' set forth in Bylaw 12.5.5 shall apply to commercial logos on uniforms worn by band members, cheerleaders, dance team members and the institution's mascot during NCAA championships events.

MISCONDUCT – The Division 1 Tennis Committee has set guidelines for post match code assessments.

Team Championship. The committee confirmed that if a post match code cannot be applied during the team match:

- (1) Any post match code is carried over to the offending student-athlete's next opportunity during that championship.
- (2) If the offending student-athlete has completed play in the championship, any post match code will be assessed at the first opportunity to the offending student-athlete's teammate(s) playing/continuing in the championships.
- (3) The assessment will be applied at the start of the next game or, if in a tiebreaker, then immediately (per ITA Friend of Court).

Individual Championships. The committee confirmed that during the singles or doubles championships:

- (1) Any post match code is carried over to the offending student-athlete's next opportunity during that championship.
- (2) If the offending student-athlete has completed play in the championship, any post match code will be assessed at the first opportunity to the offending student-athlete's teammate(s) who is also in the singles/doubles draw.
- (3) If the offending student-athlete has more than one teammate playing/continuing at the time of assessing the post match code, then the code will be assessed at the first opportunity to the higher seeded/ranked teammate.
- (4) The assessment will be applied at the start of the next game or, if in a tiebreaker, then immediately (per ITA Friend of Court).

REST PERIODS AND INJURY TIME-OUTS – When changing sides, a maximum rest period of 90 seconds may be taken by the players. After a two set match, players will be provided a rest period of at least 45 minutes before their next match. After a three set match, players will be provided a one-hour rest period before resuming play. Team championship singles play will begin 10 minutes after the doubles point has been decided.

In the event of an injury, USTA rules will be modified. In particular, whenever an athletics participant suffers a laceration or wound where oozing or bleeding occurs, the practice or match should be stopped at the earliest possible time and the players should be given the appropriate medical treatment. The student-athlete should not return to the match or the practice without approval of medical personnel. The time needed for the procedure necessary to treat this type of injury will not be charged as an injury timeout.

WARM-UP—Players will have a maximum of five minutes for warm-up prior to a match. However, if the teams have not been able to take their 30 minute warm-up before the start of the team match, a 10 minute warm-up is permitted. The umpire is the timekeeper.

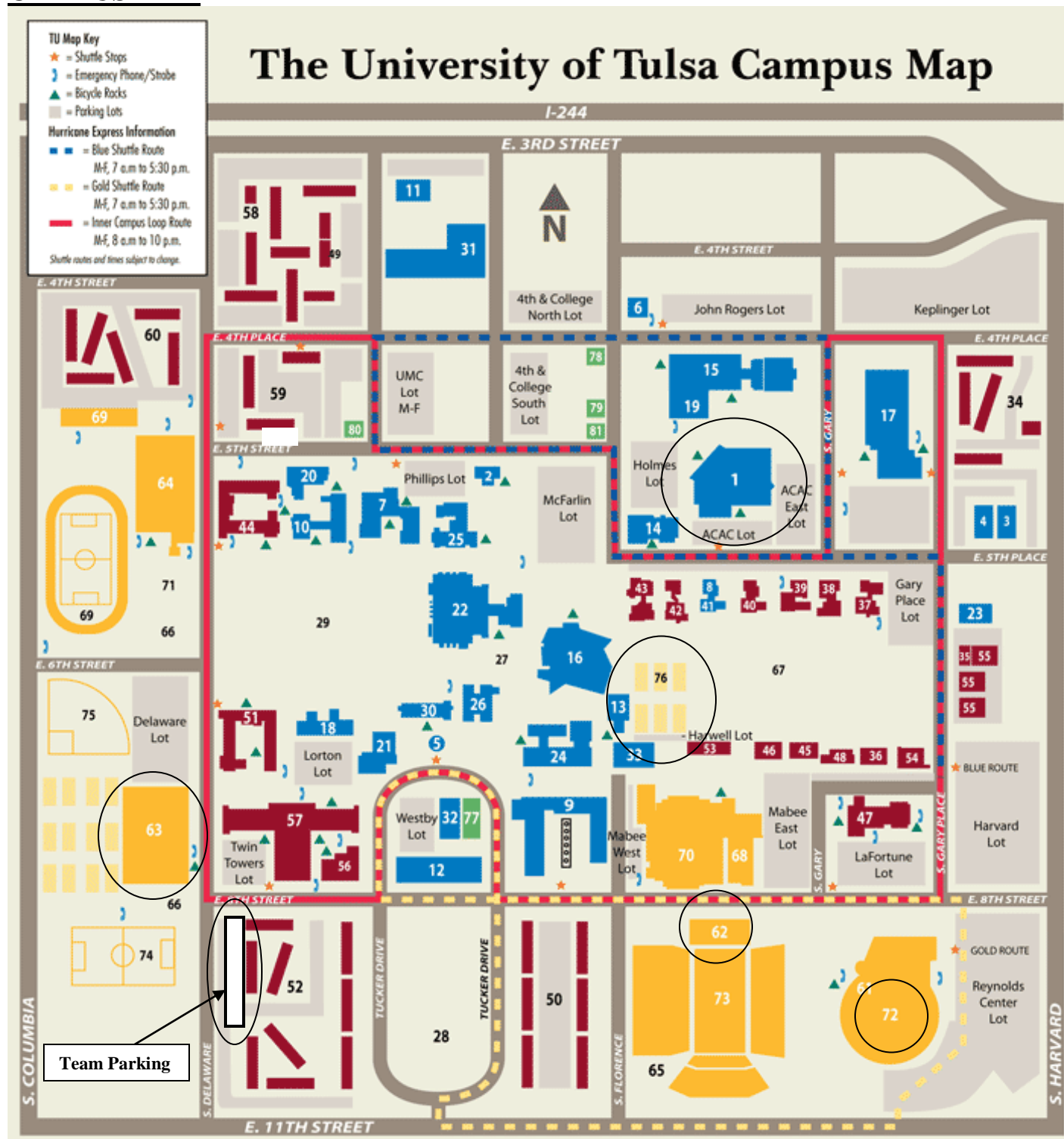
