UTA-CENTRAL ARKANSAS SERIES

UT Arlington leads the overall series 23-14. This is the second meeting of the season between the teams. Lamar rallied from a 41-28 deficit for a 67-63 win at UT Arlington on Jan. 13. Jenna Plumley led Lamar with 26 points, Brittney Williams added 17. Tamara Simmons led UT Arlington with 19 points.

LAST GAME - UT ARLINGTON 59, CENTRAL ARKANSAS 67

Meghan Herbert's 23 points and 15 rebounds led Central Arkansas to a 67-59 win over the Mavericks Saturday at Texas Hall... Tamara Simmons led the Mavs with 14 points while Meghan Nelson poured in 13 points... for the game, UT Arlington shot 34.3 percent to the Sugar Bear's 45.2 percent.

AT THIS POINT

The Mavericks are currently in fourth place in the West Division behind leader Lamar (10-2), A&M-Corpus Christi (9-3), and UTSA (8-4)... UT Arlington fell to (12-13, 7-5) after a 59-67 loss over East Division leader Central Arkansas... the Mavericks have three games remaining in their regular season and still must face two teams in which they suffered losses to earlier in the season... Meghan Nelson (17.6), Tamara Simmons (12.8) and Shalyn Martin (11.6) are all scoring in double figures for UTA.

INJURY REPORT

Freshman Kiara Parker continues to nurse her injured knee and is not scheduled to play this week. Parker went down during an afternoon workout last week... Parker has made 19 appearances and one start this season... she's averaging 2.5 points and 2.9 rebounds per game.

Head Coach ^ 3rd Year ^ 41-21 Overall

- 2008-09 Southland Conference Title**
- 2008-09 WNIT Appearance**
- Has led seven players to All-SLC honors**

Head women's basketball coach Samantha Morrow enters her third season at the helm of the Mavericks and is coming off a 22-11 overall record, a Southland Conference title and the schools second appearance in the WNIT since the 1998-99 season.

Morrow guided all five starters to All-SLC honors and all five finished the season averaging in double figures. The Mavericks were led by seniors Candice Champion and Erin Dixon who were at the top of the SLC in scoring and rebounding.

Champion led the conference with her 19.9 points and 10.8 rebounds per game and was named to the All-SLC First Team. Champion's other accomplishments include three separate all-tournament team honors, 16 double-doubles and career-highs of 34 points against A&M-Corpus Christi and 22 rebounds at Central Arkansas.

The standout senior was also the 14th player in UTA women's basketball history to record over 1,000 career points. Champion finished her Maverick career with 1,100 points which ranks ninth in UTA history and her 604 points in her final season ranks first in single-season history. Champion was also honored by the Southland Conference with three SLC Player of the Week selections.

Fellow senior-Dixon finished her senior season averaging 11.2 points and 9.9 rebounds per game. She ranked second in conference in rebounding behind Champion and was named to the All-SLC Second Team. She recorded a career-high 23 points against Midwestern State and followed that performance with a career-high 19 rebounds against Morehead State.

Other Mavericks earning All-SLC honors were third team recipients-Shalyn Martin and Tamara Simmons and Meghan Nelson selected to the honorable mention team.

The Mavs fell short of their third NCAA Tournament berth after falling 74-63 to UTSA in the SLC Tournament championship game.

UTA moved into the postseason as they made an appearance in the Women's National Invitational Tournament for the second time in school history.

Despite a 22-point, 16-rebound performance by senior Candice Champion and the sharp shooting of sophomore Tamara Simmons, the Mavericks suffered a hard-fought 82-72 setback at Oklahoma State in the first round of the tournament.

In the conference, the Mavericks finished first in scoring offense, scoring margin, field-goal percentage, field-goal percent defense, rebounding offense, rebounding margin, and defensive rebounds.

The Mavs finished the 2008-09 season with the programs third most wins in program history.

In her first season Morrow led the Lady Mavericks to an impressive 19-10 overall record and a 13-3 mark in the SLC. The Lady Mavericks finished with a 9-2 record at Texas Hall and captured five of their last six games of the season.

The Lady Mavericks finished first in six categories in the Southland Conference, including field goal percentage, field goal defense, three-point field goal percentage defense, rebounding margin, assists and defensive rebounds.

Under the guidance of Morrow, seniors Maryann Abanobi averaged a team-high 12.7 points per game en route to earning All-Southland Conference Second Team accolades while Tiffeny Riles led the Lady Mavericks in rebounding with 7.6 rebounds per game and was named to the All-Southland Conference Second Team.

Morrow led the Lady Mavericks to their 19th Southland Conference appearance where they defeated McNeese State but fell in the second round to UTSA.

Morrow began her coaching career with UTA on May 17, 2008, as she was selected as the eighth head women's basketball coach in school history.

Morrow comes to UT Arlington after winning four consecutive Class 5A state championships at Mansfield High School from 1999 to 2002. She was named the 2002 National Federation of High Schools Coaches Association's National Coach of the Year and completed her prep career with 413 wins in 14 seasons.

Morrow's high school background does not scare UT Arlington Athletics Director Pete Carlon, who ventured into the prep ranks to hire previous coach Donna Capps who compiled two NCAA Tournament appearances and the program's first two Southland Conference titles in the past three seasons.

Morrow earned a scholarship to Ranger Junior College and later to Texas Wesleyan University where she earned a bachelor's degree in 1981. She completed her master's degree at Tarleton State University in 1987 while coaching at Stephenville High School.

She won the Class B state girls golf championship as a sophomore in 1975, and was a participant in the 2002 Olympic torch relay for the Salt Lake City Games. A member of the region-qualifying relay team in track and field, she continues to be an avid runner.

Morrow's decision to leave an assistant athletic director position within the Mansfield ISD was due in part because "UT Arlington is a gold mine (for women's basketball).

THE CARDINALS

Lamar (20-6 overall, 10-2 conference) holds a one-game lead over Texas A&M-Corpus Christi, Central Arkansas and Stephen F. Austin with four games remaining... A first-place finish would give the Lady Cardinals the No. 1 seed in the upcoming State Farm Southland Conference Basketball Tournament and would also guarantee Lamar a postseason berth in either the NCAA Tournament or the Women's NIT... Lamar comes into the game off an 84-67 win over Northwestern State on Saturday. This will be the second meeting of the season between Lamar and UT Arlington. Lamar rallied from a 13-point deficit for a 67-63 win in Arlington on Jan. 13... The Lady Cardinals are on the verge of setting the school single-season record for 3-point field goals. Lamar has drained 192 treys this season, one shy of the 193 made by last season's squad.

MEGHAN NELSON RECORDS CAREER-HIGH 33 POINTS IN SFA WIN

UT Arlington senior guard Meghan Nelson scored a career-high 33 points to lead the Mavs to their second conference win of the season in an 85-79 decision over the visiting Stephen F. Austin Ladyjacks. A native of Cedar Hill, Texas, Nelson's 33 points are the most points scored in a conference game this season.

SIMMONS HITS A NEW CAREER HIGH

Junior Tamara Simmons recorded a career-high 27-points on Saturday (Jan. 23) in an overtime loss against Sam Houston State... Simmons went 9-of-24 from the field, including 4-of-9 from three-point range and 5-of-5 from the line... her previous career high was 24 points against Kansas State last season.

NELSON EARNS ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM HONORS IN BACK TO BACK TOURNAMENTS

Meghan Nelson finished the week scoring in double-figures in all four games for the Mavs... led the Mavericks in scoring against Texas Tech and San Francisco at the Basketball Traveler's Classic in Lubbock, Texas... finished the tournament the with 43 points, 10 rebounds, three assists and three steals... was selected to the four man all-tournament team... best performance of the weekend came against Texas Tech, collecting 16 points on 7 of 13 shooting from the field in 23 minutes of action... Nelson added another piece of hardware to her trophy case on Sunday, December 20 at the St. John's Holiday Invitational in Jamaica, NY... against St. John's, Nelson finished with a game high 18 points on 7-of-14 shooting from the floor, including 4-of-5 from the free throw line and added five rebounds and two steals... Nelson followed that performance with 12 points and four boards against UAB on Sunday.

NELSON LEADS THE WAY

Offensively the Mavericks are being led by senior Meghan Nelson... Nelson has scored in double-figures in all of the Mavericks 24 games and has scored 15 or more points in 19 games... leads the team with 17.8 points per game and is first in the Southland Conference in scoring with 20.5 per game.

MAVERICKS PICKED TO FINISH 2ND IN LEAGUE

The Mavericks received 53 points and three first-place votes in the coaches' poll. The Mavs tallied 55 points and five first-place votes in the SID poll. Overall UT Arlington was picked second behind Lamar, who finished third in the West Division last season. The Cardinals received 59 points and six first-place votes for the top spot. Last year's defending champion UTSA earned 50 points and two first-place votes while A&M-

Corpus Christi collected 34 points and one first-place vote.

MARTIN OWNS THE BOARDS

Junior Shalyn Martin has done her part for the Mavericks on the defensive end, leading the team with 8.2 boards per game... Martin has recorded 10 or more rebounds in 11 games this season, including three consecutive double-double performances... Martin has recorded double-doubles against Rice, Prairie View A&M, Southeast Missouri, St. John's, UTSA, SFA, Sam Houston State and UTSA.

SIMMONS & MARTIN EARN PRESEASON HONORS

Tamara Simmons was named to the SLC preseason first-team while Shalyn Martin was named to preseason second team... Simmons finished second on the team with 11.5 points per game and led the squad in assists for the second consecutive season with 124.. Martin, the Mavs top defensive player and leading blocker finished last season with 40 blocks and 44 steals. Martin, a native of Arlington, Texas, was named third-team all-conference and was selected to the SLC Tournament and Bahamas Sunsplash All-Tournament team...Joining Martin on the second team were UTSA guard Amber Gregg, A&M-Corpus Christi center Elisa Beagle, Lamar transfer Jenna Plumley, and Texas State guard Victoria Davis.

NELSON COLLECTS 1,000 CAREER POINT

With only 12 points shy heading into Wednesday nights contest against McNeese State (Feb. 10), Meghan Nelson notched her 1,000 career point on a pair of free throws... Nelson finished the game with 1,004 points.

NELSON SECOND IN SLC IN SCORING

Meghan Nelson continues to be on top of her game leading the conference in scoring with 19.9 points per game... in conference alone, Nelson has recorded 239 points and has finished with 15 or more points in all but one game in league play... Nelson leads the Mavericks with 17.6 points per game.

UT ARLINGTON SIGNS THREE TO NLI

UT Arlington head women's basketball coach Samantha Morrow announced today the program has signed three players to national letters of intents to begin playing for the Mavericks in the fall of 2010.

UTA signed guard Malaika Green (Coppell, Texas/Coppell HS), forward Chevan Goins (Carrollton, Texas/Hebron HS) and center Desherra Nwanguma (Katy, Texas/Cinco Ranch HS).

Green, a 5-5 guard from Coppell High School earned honorable mention honors last year and is the Cowgirls starting point guard this season.

Goins is a two-time all-district recipient and is an Adidas National Junior Phenom Top 20 player. Goins is a member of the Junior National Team and was a Dallas ISD Coke, Lake Dallas ISD and Abilene ISD All-Tournament Team selection.

Nwanguma finished last season with 5.1 points and 5.1 rebounds per game and led the Cougars to a 23-14 record as a junior.

REBOUNDS HURT MAVS IN ROAD LOSS

The Mavericks have struggled all season on the defensive end and Wednesday night it couldn't be more obvious, as UT Arlington was out-rebounded by a 53-31 margin against Texas A&M-Corpus Christi.

In 20 games, the Mavs have been out hustled on the defensive end eight times and of those eight they have only won two games.

UTA is lead defensively by Shalyn Martin with 8.2 boards per game while Veronica Mergerson and Donna Dike follow with 6.3.

LIVING AT THE LINE

Meghan Nelson's attack the basket attitude has gotten her to the foul line 144 times and has converted 107 of her 440 total points... Nelson leads the team in free throws and free throw attempts... she is a 72 percent shooter from the line.

SHOFNER HITS CAREER-HIGH IN ROAD WIN
