### GAME DAY INFORMATION

The Texas State football team looks to win its fourth straight game overall and sixth straight road game when the Bobcats travel to Missoula, Montana, and play the University of Montana in the first round of the 2008 NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) playoffs. The game kicks off at 1:05 p.m. at the Washington-Grizzly Stadium (25,200-capacity).

Texas State is ranked 23rd nationally and enters the game after winning the 2008 Southland Conference championship and earning the league's automatic berth into the FCS playoffs. Montana is ranked No. 5 nationally with an 11-1 record after defeating intrastate rival Montana State 35-3 last Saturday and improving its Big Sky Conference record to 7-1. The Grizzlies have also won all seven of their home games this season.

The Bobcats have won their last three games of the regular season games against Southeastern Louisiana, Nicholls and Sam Houston State. Texas State beat Southeastern Louisiana 38-24 in Hammond, La., on Nov. 8. They also beat Nicholls State 34-10 in their final home game of the 2008 season on Nov. 15 and came from behind to edge Sam Houston State 48-45 in overtime in Huntsville last Saturday. In addition to its wins at Southeastern Louisiana and Sam Houston State, Texas State also won road games at Northern Colorado, McNeese State and Stephen F. Austin.

### THE COACHES

**Brad Wright** is in his second season at the helm of the Texas State football program and enters the Montana game with a 12-11 career record after leading the Bobcats to an 8-4 mark this season. Wright was named head coach in 2007 after serving three seasons as the assistant head coach, running backs coach and special teams coordinator for the Bobcats. In his first season as head coach he guided the Bobcats to a 4-7 mark. He came to Texas State after serving as a high school head coach at Canyon High School, East Bernard and Karnes. He also was a high school assistant at El Campo, Klein Oak and Pearland.

**Bobby Hauck** is in his sixth season as the head coach at Montana with a career record of 63-15 after leading the Grizzlies to a combined 34-4 record the last three seasons. Montana has also won 23 of its last 24 Big Sky Conference games under his direction. Hauck went to Montana after serving on the coaching staffs at Washington, Colorado, Northern Arizona and UCLA. He began his collegiate coaching career as a graduate assistant coach at Montana after coaching one season at Sweet Grass High School.

### BOBCATS NATIONALLY RANKED

Texas State enters the NCAA Division I FCS playoffs ranked 23rd nationally in *The Sports Network's* latest poll. It marks the first time that the Bobcats have been ranked in the Top 25 this season.

### THE SERIES

This will mark the first time that Texas State will play against Montana. The Bobcats have a 3-8 against teams from the Big Sky Conference after winning 38-35 at Northern Colorado earlier this year to begin their five-game winning streak in road games.

## BOBCAT NOTES

The Bobcats have won 11 Conference championships during their history, including the 2005 and 2008 Southland Conference titles.

### CARDIAC BOBCATS

The Bobcats overcame a 21-point deficit at Sam Houston State marked the fifth time this season the Bobcats have come from behind to win a game. The Bobcats trailed 7-0 at both Northern Colorado and McNeese State before they rallied with first-half comebacks. Texas State trailed 3-0 after the first quarter against Nicholls State and opened the season scoring two fourth quarter touchdowns to come back and beat Angelo State 21-14.

### LEADING FROM THE OUTSET

Texas State's victory at Southeastern Louisiana was the third time that the Bobcats never trailed while winning a game. The Bobcats also beat Stephen F. Austin and Texas Southern and never trailed in the game.

### QUICK STRIKING BOBCATS

In two road games at both Southeastern Louisiana and Stephen F. Austin, the Bobcats have scored a touchdown on the very first offensive play from scrimmage with touchdown passes.

The Bobcats opened the game with a 71-yard touchdown pass from Bradley George to Mishak Rivas. Texas State opened the Southeastern Louisiana game with a 68-yard TD pass from Bradley George to Cameron Luke.

Texas State also has scored touchdowns on their opening drives versus Angelo State, Northern Colorado, Texas Southern and McNeese State.

### TEXAS STATE IN OVERTIME

Texas State's 48-45 overtime victory at Sam Houston State gives the Bobcats a 1-1 record in overtime this season. The lone loss was a 34-31 overtime setback against Northwestern State. The victory was the first overtime victory for Texas State since beating Sam Houston State on Nov. 19, 2005. The last time the Bobcats played an overtime game before this season was on Dec. 9, 2005 against Northern Iowa when Texas State suffered a 40-37 loss. Texas State enters the NCAA FCS playoffs with an all-time record of 3-5 record in overtime games.

### CLOSE ENCOUNTERS

The Bobcats enter Saturday's game with a 3-1 record in games decided by three points. Texas State defeated Northern Colorado 38-35, McNeese State 45-42 and Sam Houston State 48-45 in overtime this year. The only loss was the overtime loss against Northwestern State.

### EARLY STARTS

The August 30 game against Angelo State equaled a school record for the earliest date in which the Bobcats have opened a season dating back to 1971. The Bobcats also opened the 2001 season with a 52-7 victory over Arkansas-Monticello on August 30 and suffered a 72-8 loss at New Mexico to open the 2003 season campaign on that date.

### TEAM CAPTAINS IN 2008

The Texas State football team elected Morris Crosby, Donovan King, Bradley George and John Gilley to serve as team captains in 2008. Crosby, King and Gilley are seniors, while George begins his third year as a starting quarterback. The captains were announced following practice on August 26.

### NATION'S FIFTH-RANKED OFFENSE

Texas State enters Saturday's game at Montana ranked fifth nationally and second in the Southland Conference in total offense with 460.25 yards in its first 12 games after gaining 427 yards at Sam Houston State. The Bobcats have gained over 400 yards of total offense in five of their last six games. In addition to the 427 yards at Sam Houston State, Texas State gained 407 yards against Nicholls, 465 yards at Southeastern Louisiana and a season-best 678 at Stephen F. Austin. The Bobcats also gained 610 yards at McNeese State and 599 yards against Texas Southern.

Texas State also ranks among the nation's top four teams and first among Southland Conference squads in scoring offense after averaging 38.33 points per game. The Bobcats scored 48 points at Sam Houston State, 34 points against Nicholls, 38 points at Southeastern Louisiana and 31 points versus Northwestern State after scoring 45 points in three of the previous four games with 63 points against Texas Southern, 62 points at Stephen F. Austin and 45 points at McNeese State.

### BALANCED OFFENSE

In each of the last two seasons, Texas State has featured a very balanced offensive attack. The Bobcats enter the Montana game with the third-best rushing offense and fourth-best passing offense among Southland Conference teams. Texas State has gained 191.2 yards per game on the ground and thrown for an average of 269.1 yards per game. The Bobcats have thrown for 33 touchdowns and run for 26 TD's.

Bradley George has thrown for 2,401 yards and 25 touchdowns, and Cameron Luke has caught 68 passes for 1,193 yards and 16 touchdowns. Karrington Bush has 1,039 yards rushing and this marks the second straight year that he has run for over 1,000 yards, George has thrown for 2,000 yards and Luke has over 1,000 receiving yards in the same season.

### TOUGH IN THE RED ZONE

Texas State enters Saturday's game leading the Southland Conference and ranking ninth nationally in Red Zone Defensive Efficiency after holding opponents to a scoring percentage of 70 percent this season. Bobcat opponents have scored 30 touchdowns (14 rushing and 16 passing) and converted 5-of-13 field goal attempts after advancing the ball to the red zone.

### BIG PLAYS ON DEFENSE

Texas State's defensive unit has collected 11 turnovers in the last five games. The Bobcats intercepted two passes at Sam Houston State, recovered two fumbles against Nicholls, intercepted three passes and recovered a fumble at Southeastern Louisiana after intercepting two passes against Northwestern State and one pass at Stephen F. Austin. In other games this season, Texas State also recovered two fumbles at McNeese State, recovered one fumble against Texas Southern.

The defensive unit also forced some key and decisive turnovers in the 38-35 victory at Northern Colorado when the Bobcats recovered two fumbles and intercepted three passes.

### NINE BOBCATS NAMED TO ALL-SLC TEAMS

After winning their first outright Southland Conference championship, Texas State placed nine players on the All-Southland Conference teams in a poll of the league's coaches and sports information directors.

Heading the list were All-SLC First-Team selections: wide receiver Cameron Luke, running back Karrington Bush, fullback Blake Burton and offensive center Jeff Bowen.

In addition, offensive lineman D.J. Hall, placekicker Andrew Ireland, defensive end Donovan King and defensive

back Morris Crosby were All-SLC Second-Team selections. Bush also was an All-SLC Second-Team selection as a punt returner.

Besides the nine First and Second-Team selections, quarterback Bradley George, tight end John Gilley, defensive end Travis Houston, linebackers Joe Bell and Courtney Smith, along with defensive back Kenneth Hampton were Honorable Mention selections.

**BURTON EARNS ALL-SLC HONORS A SECOND TIME**

This marks the second time in the last three years that senior fullback Blake Burton has been named an All-Southland Conference First-Team selection. Burton earned the honor this season after rushing for a career-best four touchdowns and gaining 64 yards on 24 carries.

Burton scored a game-winning touchdown against Angelo State to open the season and ran for a one-yard TD at McNeese State. Burton also ran for two-yard touchdowns against Northwestern State and Texas Southern.

Entering this season, Burton had scored two touchdowns in his first three years as a Bobcat. He also averaged 4.1 yards per carry in 2007 when he was named an Honorable Mention All-SLC selection after missing the first four games with an ankle injury.

In 2006, Burton was an All-SLC First-Team fullback while serving primarily as a blocking back. That season, he caught six passes for 38 yards and two touchdowns and threw a three-yard touchdown pass.

**BUSH SEVENTH IN ALL-PURPOSE YARDS NATIONALLY**

Sophomore Karrington Bush ranks third nationally in all-purpose yards with an average of 185.50 yards per game. He has gained 1,039 yards rushing on 129 carries, caught 21 passes for 207 yards and returned 37 kicks for 980 yards.

Bush gained 284 all-purpose yards at Sam Houston State after gaining 169 all-purpose yards against Nicholls State and a combined 378 all-purpose yards in the three previous games. Bush amassed 260 yards against Southern Utah, 219 yards versus Texas Southern, 213 yards at McNeese State and 208 yards against Central Arkansas.

**BUSH SECOND AMONG NATIONAL RUSHING LEADERS**

Karrington Bush also ranks second in the nation with 8.2 yards per carry this season after gaining 43 yards on nine carries against Nicholls, 91 yards on 18 carries at Southeastern Louisiana and 92 yards on 16 carries against Northwestern State. Bush also rushed for 121 yards on 10 carries at Stephen F. Austin, a season-best 127 yards on 13 carries at McNeese State, 112 yards on five carries against Texas Southern and 100 yards on eight carries at SMU.

**TEN GAMES WITH 100-YARDS RUSHING**

Sophomore running back Karrington Bush enters the Southeastern Louisiana game as one of the nation's two sophomore FCS running back to have rushed for 100 yards in 10 games during in his career. Bush gained 121 yards on 10 carries at Stephen F. Austin, 127 yards on 13 carries at McNeese State, 112 yards on 5 carries against Texas Southern, 100 yards on 8 carries against Southern Utah and 111 yards on 15 carries against SMU this season.

Bush has four 50-yard runs this season after a 52-yard carry at McNeese State. He also rushed for touchdown runs of 63 and 41 yards against Texas Southern and a 52-yard touchdown against Southern Utah.

He had five 100-yard rushing games as a redshirt freshman in 2007. Below is a list of his ten 100-yard games.

**1,000-YARD RUSHER**

Karrington Bush has joined Claude Mathis as the only two Bobcats to run for over 1,000 yards in two straight seasons after becoming the first Texas State running back and second player since 1999 to rush over 1,000 yards as a redshirt freshman in 2007. Bush has run for 1,039 yards and 11 touchdowns on 129 carries in the first 12 games this season.

Last season, Bush was named the SLC Freshman of the Year and an All-SLC Second-Team selection last year after running for 1,039 yards and three touchdowns on 137 carries. His 1,039 is the eighth-highest single-season total in school history as well.

**BUSH NAMED SLC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

Karrington Bush was named the Southland Conference Special Teams Player of the Week as voted by the league's information directors. It marks the first time this season that Bush has been named the Southland Conference player of the week and he is the fourth Bobcat to earn the honor in 2008.

Bush averaged 35.99 yards on five kick returns in the 38-35 overtime win at Sam Houston State the clinched the Southland Conference championship. The Whitewright, Texas native registered the longest kick return of his career and first touchdown on a kick return when he returned a kick 79 yards in the third quarter to pull Texas State to within 28-20 after Sam Houston opened the second half with a touchdown run. He finished the game with 284 all-purpose yards after gaining 97 yards rushing on 14 carries and catching one pass for 8 yards.

**ZWINGGI GOES OUT IN STYLE**

Senior running back Stan Zwinggi led Texas State when he ran for 72 yards and one touchdown on 12 carries against Nicholls in the final home game of his career at Texas State. Zwinggi enjoyed his best performance against a Southland Conference team at Southeastern Louisiana when he gained 82 yards and scored one touchdown on 11 carries.

Zwinggi recorded his first 100-yard rushing performance of the season with 109 yards and one touchdown on 16 carries at Northern Colorado. He opened the season as Texas State's starting tailback, marking the third straight year that he has opened a season as a starting running back. He has run for 584 yards on 101 carries this season.

**CANADY IN THE END ZONE**

The third tailback in Texas State's arsenal is junior Alvin Canady and he gave the Bobcats a boost against Nicholls State

when he gained 54 yards on nine carries. Canady rushed for a season-high 78 yards and one touchdown on nine carries against Texas Southern. Canady scored his fourth touchdown of the year against the Tigers. He also scored his first three touchdowns of the year against Northern Colorado. Canady gained 36 yards and scored two touchdowns on 11 carries against the Bears. He also caught four passes for 50 yards, including a 30-yard touchdown reception.

Canady has recorded 70 carries for 313 yards this season after running for 377 yards as a sophomore in 2007. He also has caught 12 passes for 93 yards and a touchdown after finishing the 2007 campaign as the Bobcats' second-leading receiver with 37 receptions for 264 yards and three TD's.

#### GEORGE NAMED SLC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Texas State junior quarterback Bradley George was selected as the Southland Conference Player-of-the-Week on Oct. 13 after completing 30-of-47 passes for 355 yards and four touchdowns in Texas State's 48-45 victory at No. 3 McNeese State on Oct. 11. George tied his own school record with his 30 completions and the 365 yards passing and four TDs are season best performances. The 365 yards passing are the most by a Bobcat this season, and rank as the sixth-highest total in school history. His four-touchdown passes also ties Clint Toon for the best single-game total this year.

#### A TALE OF TWO SEASONS

After getting off to a slow start in which he completed just three of his 11 passes for 26 yards and one touchdown against Angelo State and SMU, Bradley George has returned to Texas State's starting lineup in impressive fashion. During the last nine games, George has rebounded to throw for 2,375 yards and 24 touchdowns.

After sitting out the Northern Colorado game, George started his comeback in the fourth quarter against Southern Utah when he came off the bench to complete nine of his 18 passes for 129 yards and one touchdown. He also came off the bench to complete 14 of his 17 passes against Texas Southern for 281 yards and three touchdowns.

He returned to the starting lineup at McNeese State to complete 30 of 46 passes for 365 yards and four touchdowns while throwing just one interception. He also completed 19 of 32 passes for 250 yards and two TD's against Central Arkansas, before setting a school record with 418 yards passes and four touchdowns at Stephen F. Austin. He also completed 17 of 36 passes for 201 yards and three touchdowns against Northwestern State, and 16 of 29 passes for 276 yards in two TDs at Southeastern Louisiana.

In the last two games, George completed 10 of his 14 passes for 136 yards and three touchdowns against Nicholls and was 17 of 30 for 319 yards and two TDs at Sam Houston State.

#### BACK-TO-BACK 2,000-YARD SEASONS PASSING CHARTS

Bradley George became the first Texas State quarterback to throw for 2,000 yards in back-to-back seasons. His 2,401 passing yards this season ranks third on Texas State's single season list for most yards passing.

Barrick Nealy (2003-05) is the only Bobcat quarterback to throw for 2,000 yards twice in their career, but he accomplished the feat in 2003 and 2005. He only had 1,202 yards while playing in nine games during the 2004 campaign.

Last season, George joined Nealy and David Williams as the only three quarterbacks in school history to throw for 2,000 yards.

#### GEORGE RATED AMONG NATION'S TOP SIX PASSERS

Junior quarterback Bradley George enters Saturday's game as the sixth most-efficient passer in the nation with an efficiency rating of 162.0 after completing 160 of his 268 passes for 2,401 yards and 25 touchdowns this season. George has thrown just five interceptions and been sacked just nine times this year.

#### LUKE AMONG NATIONAL LEADERS

Senior wide receiver Cameron Luke enters the Montana game having caught 68 passes for 1,193 yards and 16 touchdowns in Texas State's first 12 games this season. He leads the Southland Conference and ranks fourth nationally in receiving yards with 1,193 yards after catching three passes for 41 yards at Sam Houston State.

He also is tied for third nationally and is second among Southland Conference leaders with 16 touchdown catches this season. The only two receivers with more touchdown catches than Luke's 16 TD catches are John Matthews of San Diego with 21 and Stephen F. Austin's Dominique Edison, who has 18. He is tied with Ramses Barden of Cal Poly.

#### LUKE ADDS TO HIS HISTORIC ACHIEVEMENTS

Cameron Luke added another Texas State school record to his resume with his five catches against Nicholls. Luke enters the Montana game with 68 receptions, which broke the same record of 60 that he tied last season. He already set Texas State and Southland Conference records for most touchdown receptions in a career with 31.

He also holds the Texas State school record for most touchdown catches in a season with 16 this season. In addition to those three records, Luke is the first Texas State and Southland Conference receiver to record 10 or more touchdown receptions two straight years. Last season, Luke set a school record with 12 touchdown receptions.

He also eclipsed his own school record in receiving yards with 1,193 this season after setting a school record with 1,035 in 2007. He is the only Texas State and first Southland Conference receiver since 1970 to record 1,000 receiving yards in back to back seasons. Ronnie Vinson of Abilene Christian had 1,214 yards in 1969 and 1,042 in 1970. Louisiana Tech had two di-

ent receivers record 1,000 yards in 1976 and 1977. They were Billy Ryckman with 1,382 in 1976 and Rod Foppe with 1,274 in 1977.

#### LUKE NAMED SLC PLAYER OF THE WEEK SEPT. 8

Senior wide receiver Cameron Luke was named the Southland Conference Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 8 after he caught six passes for 121 yards and three touchdowns at SMU. It was his first 100-yard receiving game of the season after he recorded five 100-yard games in 2007.

#### TOON ON THE RUN

Senior quarterback Clint Toon recorded his first rushing touchdown of his career at Texas State when he ran for a three-yard touchdown in the first quarter at Stephen F. Austin. He enters the Sam Houston State game having gained 45 yards on 30 carries after gaining 16 yards on three carries against Nicholls. His best rushing game this season was at SMU when he gained 33 yards on seven carries.

#### TOON THROUGH THE AIR

In addition to running for a touchdown, Clint Toon has thrown for eight TDs this season. Toon has completed 71 of his 122 passes for 822 yards. He has thrown for over 200 yards at SMU and Northern Colorado. Toon completed 19 of 27 passes for 225 yards and four touchdowns at SMU. He also threw for 227 yards and one touchdown when completed 18 of his 36 passes at Northern Colorado.

#### SMITH LEADS BOBCATS

Courtney Smith earned Honorable Mention All-Southland Conference honors after leading Texas State in tackles during six of the last eight games and recording 10 tackles in five contests this season.

against Nicholls. A senior linebacker from Statesboro, Ga., Smith also recorded a career-best 14 stops against Central Arkansas. He also had 13 tackles against Texas Southern, 12 at Northern Colorado and 10 tackles at McNeese State. He had seven stops at Sam Houston State.

Smith leads the Bobcats with 105 tackles this season, including 65 solo stops, which also leads the team. He entered his senior campaign with 45 career tackles in his first three years at Texas State.

**SMITH NAMED SLC PLAYER OF THE WEEK SEPT. 22**

Courtney Smith was named the Southland Conference Defensive Player of the Week on Monday, Sept. 22. Smith led Texas State with 12 tackles, including nine solo stops, in the 38-35 victory at Northern Colorado. The senior from Statesboro, Ga., also registered one sack (-8 yards) and intercepted a pass and returned it 9 yards.

**CLARK AMONG TACKLES LEADERS A SECOND SEASON**

Sophomore linebacker Marcus Clark is among Texas State's leading tacklers for a second straight season. Clark enters the Montana game with 74 tackles, which ranks second on the team after recording six tackles at Sam Houston State, seven stops against Nicholls, nine tackles at Southeastern Louisiana and a season-best 10 tackles against Northwestern State.

Clark has 39 solo stops and eight tackles for lost yardage. In addition, Clark has three quarterback sacks and leads the team with eight quarterback hurries.

**RING MY BELL**

Junior linebacker Joe Bell ranks fourth among team leaders in tackles with 64, including 33 solo stops after recording six stops at Sam Houston State, nine tackles against Nicholls and seven tackles at Southeastern Louisiana.

Bell has five tackles for losses, including one at Southeastern Louisiana and he grabbed his second interception of the season against the Lions. He also returned an interception 24 yards for a touchdown at Northern Colorado. A junior from Houston, Bell has broken up five other passes and forced two fumbles this season.

**TURNING UP THE HEAT**

Junior defensive end Travis Houston recorded 12 tackles for the second straight week at Sam Houston State after he led the Bobcats with 12 stops, including three tackles for lost yardage, and recovered two key fumbles against Nicholls. Houston leads Texas State in quarterback sacks this season with seven after recording one sack in two of the last three games against Nicholls and Southeastern Louisiana. Houston registered a team season-best two sacks at Stephen F. Austin.

He also has 15 tackles for losses to lead the Bobcats after recording two tackles for losses at Sam Houston State and a season-best three tackles for losses against Nicholls. His previous single game best was two against Southeastern Louisiana, Texas Southern and Angelo State.

**J. WILLIAMS MAKES SUCCESSFUL TRANSITION**

Senior safety Jamal Williams is third among Texas State's leaders in tackles with 66 after recording a season-best 14 tackles at Sam Houston State. Williams registered four tackles in each of the Nicholls and Southeastern Louisiana contests af-

ter making 10 stops against Northwestern State. Williams also ranks third in solo tackles this year with 39 after moving to the secondary this season. He was a running back for the Bobcats last year.

Williams also had nine tackles against Central Arkansas and six tackles at Northern Colorado. Last season, Williams gained 63 yards on 14 carries after transferring to Texas State from Reedley College.

**THOMPSON NAMED PRESEASON ALL-SLC**

Texas State junior cornerback Will Thompson has played the last six games after sitting out two games against Texas Southern and McNeese State. Thompson returned to Texas State's secondary against Central Arkansas, and played against Stephen F. Austin, Northwestern State, Southeastern Louisiana, Nicholls and Sam Houston State.

Thompson was the only Bobcat defensive player named to the preseason All-Southland Conference teams by the league's coaches and SID's. Thompson has 29 tackles this season, including 26 solo stops.

**CROSBY NAMED SECOND TEAM ALL-SLC**

Texas State senior cornerback Morris Crosby was named a All-Southland Conference Second-Team selection after recording 42 tackles this season. Crosby is also a co-leader on the team with Kenneth Hampton with three interceptions in his first season at cornerback.

He missed four games with a leg injury this year, but has played in the last five Southland Conference games. Crosby was leading the Bobcats in tackles through the first three games this season with 20 before he injured his leg in the Southern Utah contest. He had nine tackles at Sam Houston State, five at Southeastern Louisiana, four stops at Stephen F. Austin, three stops against Northwestern State and two tackles against Nicholls. He also intercepted his third pass this season against Southeastern Louisiana.

**SUDDEN IMPACT**

Texas State junior cornerback Drenard Williams enters the Montana game with 36 tackles, including 24 solo stops this season. He also has broken up eight passes as a first-year starter. Williams transferred to Texas State after playing two seasons at Iowa State.

**KING IN DOUBLE FIGURES**

Senior defensive end Donovan King recorded a career-best of 10 tackles against Northwestern State, including five solo stops against the Demons. He had seven tackles at Sam Houston State, including one for a three-yard loss in the overtime period that forced the Bearcats to kick a field goal before Texas State scored the winning touchdown.

King enters the Montana contest with 48 tackles overall this season. He has eight tackles for lost yardage and is tied for second among team leaders with three sacks. His previous single game high in tackles this season was six stops against Central Arkansas.



**BRAD WRIGHT**  
**Head Coach**  
**Second Season as Head Coach**  
**Fifth Season at Texas State**  
**Texas State, 1981**

Brad Wright is in his second season as the head coach at Texas State University, the school from which he graduated in 1981, and from where he launched his coaching career.

He enters the Montana game with an 12-11 career record at Texas State after leading the Bobcats to a 8-4 mark this season. He also has an 8-6 record against Southland Conference teams.

In his first two seasons as head coach, Wright's offensive attack produced a 2,000-yard passer, 1,000-yard rusher and a 1,000-yard receiver in the same season. The Bobcats also posted one of the school's top eight attendance averages for the fourth straight year in 2007.

Senior punter Chris MacDonald earned First-Team All-American honors, while record-setting wide receiver Cameron Luke earned All-Southland Conference First-Team honors. Running back Karrington Bush was named the SLC Freshman of the Year and a All-SLC Second-Team selection. In addition, Crawford May was a All-SLC Second-Team choice.

Nick Clark was named Texas State's first-ever Draddy Award Finalist, National Football Foundation National Scholar-Athlete, and a CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine Academic All-American Second Team selection.

Since the 2007 season ended, Wright instilled an improved work ethic into his team that carried over into spring workouts and he is hopeful these efforts will result in an improved record.

Wright was named head coach in the spring of 2007 after serving the three previous seasons as an assistant head coach, running back coach and special teams coordinator. During that span, the Pearsall native played a significant role in the resurgence of Texas State's football program.

Prior to Wright returning to his alma mater, the Bobcats suffered 15 losing records in the 19 years of playing football as a member of the NCAA Division I Football Championship Sub-division. But in his three years as an assistant head coach, Texas State posted a 21-15 record, won its first-ever Southland Conference championship in 2005 and advanced to the semi-finals of the NCAA Division I football playoffs.

Wright's association with winning at Texas State dates back to the late 1970s when he walked on to the Bobcat football program and went on to have a career in which he played on both sides of the ball for legendary coaches Bill Miller and Jim Wacker.

His coaching career began as a student assistant coach for Wacker's 1981 NCAA Division II national championship team.

After a stint as a graduate assistant at Louisiana-Lafayette and moves up the ladder in the Texas high school coaching ranks, Wright returned to his alma mater and has been a part

of a program which has taken on the field, at the turnstiles and in the community.

In addition to the 2005 playoff run, Texas State finished strong in 2006, winning four of its last six games including a 28-21 road victory at Sam Houston State. The win at Sam Houston State knocked the conference rival out of contention for a league title.

Texas State set attendance records for the second straight year in 2006, averaging 12,886 fans per game. The Bobcats have been active in the community too, taking part in campus projects such as Bobcat Build and serving mentorships at area elementary schools.

No other Southland Conference team won more league games than Texas State from 2004-06. The Bobcats were 11-6 (.647) during those three seasons in the highly competitive league.

Wright served as a running backs position coach for a unit which led the Southland Conference in total offense the past two seasons. His running backs in 2006 included Stan Zwinggi, who rushed for 735 yards, third-most in the Southland Conference.

In 2005, Wright's corps of running backs played a major role in the Bobcats being ranked 11th nationally in total offense (439.07 ypg), 15th in rushing yards (228.43 ypg) and eighth in scoring (37.00 ppg) among NCAA championship teams. Wright also served as Texas State's special teams coordinator and coached the All-Southland Conference First-Team punter three straight years (Cory Eloff in 2004 and 2005 as well as Chris MacDonald in 2006) and 2005 All-SLC First-Team place kicker Stan Jones.

In fact, Texas State also had 17 players named First-Team All-Southland Conference while 13 players were named to the All-SLC Second-Team during those three seasons.

In 2006, Texas State led the NCAA's Football Championship Subdivision by having five players named to CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District VI Team. Texas State also led the way with seven student-athletes being selected for the Capital One All-Southland Conference Academic Team.

Prior to joining the Texas State staff, Wright spent the previous four seasons as the director of athletics and head football coach at New Braunfels Canyon High School. He helped turn around a struggling Cougar football program. After two, one-win seasons his first two years at the school, Canyon went 7-2 in 2002 and advanced to the state quarter finals in 2003, finishing with an 11-2 mark.

Wright also coached at East Bernard, where his squad was an area finalist in 1999 as well as at Karnes City which posted back-to-back third-place district finishes. He was also an assistant coach at El Campo for five years, helping the pro-
