UC Davis leads 17-16-2

#### Last Game

The Aggies never trailed against North Dakota, scoring on their first drive of the game and going on for a 35-16 Great West Conference victory at Grand Forks, N.D.

#### National Rankings

UC Davis is not receiving votes in either The Sports Network/Fathead.com or FCS Coaches polls... Cal Poly is ranked 19th by The Sports Network and 18th by the FCS Coaches.

#### Head Coaches

BOB BIGGS is in his 18th year as UC Davis head coach and owns a 134-71-1 overall record. Biggs is in his 33rd year with the Aggies overall... TIM WALSH is 11-10 and in his second year at Cal Poly... He is 128-92 overall.

#### Weather

Early-week forecasts are calling for sunny skies and a high of 74 degrees and a low of 46 in San Luis Obispo on Saturday... Winds from the NNE at 8 mph are expected.

#### OPENING KICKOFFS

• News, notes and headline items to get things started... Many will be expanded later on in these notes.

• UC Davis plays the first of its two traditional "rivalry" games with The Battle for the Golden Horseshoe on tap first with Saturday's matchup against Cal Poly.

• Besides bragging rights, the game will also decide the second-place finisher in the Great West Conference with the other three positions already determined.

• UC Davis will be trying to snap a two-game losing streak at Alex G. Spanos Stadium... The Aggies' last win there came with a 36-33 victory in 2004, a game decided when QB JON GRANT hit WR TONY KAYS for a 14-yard TD pass with 13 seconds left.

• Cal Poly is the first NCAA Div. I Football Championship Sub-division (FCS) top-25 team the Aggies will play this year and the first since playing No. 4/5 Montana (L, 17-10) early last season.

• Both the Aggies and Mustangs announced a move for their football programs to join the Big Sky Conference beginning in 2012... Fellow GWC members North Dakota and Southern Utah announced last week their entire programs will make the move as well.

• Saturday's head coaches: BOB BIGGS for UC Davis and TIM WALSH for Cal Poly have combined for 262 career victories.

• WR SEAN CREADICK has four consecutive 100-yard receiving games, the first Aggie to do that in the same season since WR TONY KAYS opened the 2005 season with four straight... Kays had 47 catches for 597 yards and two touchdowns in that run... Creadick has 32 catches for 483 yards and five scores... Two more 100-yard efforts will match Kays's seven from that year.

• With 59 receptions for 812 yards, Creadick is also just three grabs and 84 yards from reaching the top-10 single-season list in those departments... He's 12th in the FCS for yards (90.2 pg) and 13th for receptions (6.6 pg).

• LB DOZIE AMAJOYI has either led or shared the team lead for most tackles in a game in all but two contests this season... He has a career-best 77 stops so far this season.

• The Aggies have three straight 100-yard rushing games for the first time in two years... They have improved their per-game average to 92.7 yards, ranking them 102nd among FCS teams.

• QB RANDY WRIGHT has helped push UC Davis to No. 22 nationally in passing... The Aggies are averaging 224.7 ypg., second-best in the Great West Conference behind Southern Utah... He needs just three yards to reach 2,000 this season.

• UC Davis has posted back-to-back games with at least 400 yards of offense for the first time since road games at Portland State (483) and Southern Utah (473) last year.

• The Aggies are +7 in takeaway/giveaways over their past six games after opening the season -4... UC Davis has lost just two fumbles during that span.

• RB CORBIN CUTSHAW has been productive while starting the last two games, gaining 139 yards on 26 carries and averaging 5.4 yards an attempt... He has 181 yards on the year.

• UC Davis has returned just 14 punts this year for a total of 27 yards (1.9 avg.)... WR TOM HEMMINGSEN has a long of 24 yards for a big chunk of that total.

• DT BROCK GALVIN's fumble recovery for a TD last week was the Aggies' first defensive touchdown of the year and first since last season.

• The Aggies are 3-0 this season when holding opponents to fewer than 20 points.

• With two wins over its last two games, UC Davis will secure its second straight winning season and its 39th over the past 41 seasons... This year marks the 40th anniversary of the Aggies' start of 37 straight winning campaigns.

#### ALL-TIME SERIES VS. CAL POLY

• The Battle for the Golden Horseshoe is in its 36th year this season with the Aggies holding a slim 17-16-2 all-time lead.

• Cal Poly has won the three of the past four games after UC Davis rattled off wins in six of the previous eight.

• UC Davis is 7-10 in San Luis Obispo and has lost its past two trips there.

• The Aggies won five straight from 1982-86, the longest streak by either team in the series which started in 1939 (UCD, 39-0).

• UC Davis snapped a three-game losing streak to the Mustangs with a 23-10 victory at Aggie Stadium last year... The 10 points from Cal Poly was the lowest total for either side since the Mustangs beat the Aggies 19-0 in 1990... That was the last shutout recorded against UC Davis until Fresno State blanked it 51-0 last year, ending a scoring string of 212 straight games.

#### HEAD COACHES

• BOB BIGGS (UC Davis '73) is in his 18th season at the helm of the Aggies and his 33rd with the program overall.

• He owns a 134-71-1 (.653) overall record and is 60-46 (.566) on the road... Biggs is 41-18 (.695) in the month of November.

• Biggs is the second-winningest coach in the history of the UC Davis program, trailing only Jim Sochor whose 156-41-5 record between 1970-88 led to his enshrinement into the College Football Hall of Fame.

• Four of Biggs' QB's have gone on to play professional football, including current San Diego backup QB J.T. O'SULLIVAN (1998-2001) and former San Jose SaberCats (AFL) starter MARK GRIEB (1994-96)... Others include KHARI JONES (1991-93) who had a standout career in the Canadian Football League and KEVIN DAFT (1995-98) who was a reserve on the Tennessee Titans when they went to the Super Bowl XXXIV.

• TIM WALSH (UC Riverside '77) is 11-10 and in his second year at Cal Poly while carrying a 128-92 overall record in his 20th season overall.

• Walsh and the Aggies have a long history... He holds tenures at Sonoma State (1989-92) - a former Aggie rival in the Northern California Athletic Conference - and at Portland State

(1993-2006).

• His 1991 Sonoma State team won the NCAC title, ending the Aggies' run of 20 straight championships in the league.

• Walsh joined Cal Poly after serving as an assistant at Army... Ironically, that's where his Mustang predecessor, RICH ELLERSON, moved on to, creating the opening that Walsh has assumed.

#### BRIEF CAL POLY SCOUTING REPORT

• The Mustangs enter the game on a season-best three-game winning streak, owning wins this year over then-No. 1 Montana (35-33) and No. 19 McNeese State (40-14) while enduring five straight road games with a 2-3 record.

• Cal Poly is looking for a berth in the FCS Playoffs for the third time in the past five years after having also appeared in 2005 and 2008.

• The Mustangs look to a potent running attack that is ranked No. 4 among FCS teams (255.4 ypg.) and is coming off a game at South Dakota last week in which it gained 379 yards on the ground, T-15th for the most in FCS this year.

• A big part of that display came from RB MARK RODGERS who rushed for 238 yards and 2 TDs on 15 carries... His yards are 8th-best nationally for a single game and helped push his yards per carry average to 7.1.

• Cal Poly has gained at least 200 rushing yards in seven games, and 300 yards in three... It's rushed for 27 touchdowns including eight from Rodgers, six from RB JAKE ROMANELLI (408 yds) and four from JORDAN YOCUM (432 yds)... Five players have gained at least 350 yards on the ground this season.

• The Mustangs' offense is ranked 40th nationally with its passing on the other end of the statistical spectrum, ranked 110th at 115 yards per game.

• QB TONY SMITH (441 yds, 2 TDs) and QB ANDRE BROADUS (510 yds, 4 TDs) have shared the passing duties this year with Smith attempting just 12 passes (2 completions) for 34 yds last weekend.

• WR DOMINIQUE JOHNSON's 41 catches for 521 yards are by far the most on the team while his four receiving touchdowns are also a team-high... Rogers is next with 19 catches for 198 yards.

• Cal Poly has scored at least 34 points in five games including its last two and is ranked 34th nationally (28.5 ppg.) in scoring and 40th for total yards (370.4).

• While the Mustangs are tough carrying the ball, they are just as tough stopping it that way... Their rushing defense allows just 115.1 yards per game, ranked 21st nationally, and held South Dakota below that (112 yds).

• Cal Poly has held five teams below 100 rushing yards including Montana (49), McNeese State (52), Southern Utah (93) and North Dakota (59).

• The Mustangs are ranked 107th (248.5) against the pass and just twice have allowed less than 200 in a game... Montana (416) and Old Dominion (327) have had the most success.

• LB MARTY MOHAMED has 80 tackles to lead the team while LB KENNY JACKSON has 9.0 TFLs among his 60... The Mustangs have 21 sacks including 5.0 from DL GAVIN COOPER who had two last weekend at South Dakota and was named the Great West Defensive Player of the Week.

• Mohamed is among seven players who have picked off passes with his three leading the way... CB ASA JACKSON and CB NICO MOLINO each have two.

• Rodgers, who has 11 touchdowns this year, is among the best in FCS returning kickoffs (17th, 27.5 avg.) while Asa Jackson is among the leaders in punt returns (16th, 13.0 avg.).

#### NEWS AND NOTES FROM THE NORTH DAKOTA GAME

• UC Davis gained 124 rushing yards, surpassing 100 yards for the third straight game... That marks the first time it's done that

#### Aggie Media Services

**PRACTICE DAY INTERVIEWS** - Media are requested to provide at least 24 hours notice to help ensure player/coach availability and to confirm practice times. Players will return phone calls when requested. Home phone numbers will not be given out under any circumstances. Media are highly encouraged to conduct in-person interviews at the end of practice sessions as player availability is better than before. Players are not available for interviews once they step onto the playing field.

**PRACTICE LOCATION** - The Aggies practice Monday through Thursdays at Aggie Stadium. This is a change from previous seasons. Parking is available in Lot 56, adjacent to the south end of the stadium. Park in non-metered spots and place a media business card on dashboard.

**HOME GAME CREDENTIALS** - Credentials must be requested by noon on Thursday prior to each home game. Credentials will be left at Media Will Call entrance on west side of Aggie Stadium (entrance behind pressbox). Media with sideline credentials are requested to stay outside of 25-yard lines.

**PRESSBOX SERVICES** - Statistics will be provided each quarter along with a full stats packet at the end of the game. LB guides, game programs and other info will also be provided. Depth charts will be updated prior to the game. Food and beverages will also be available.

**GAMEDAY PARKING** - General media parking is in Lot 53 (at UC Davis Genome Center) which is located approximately a three-minute walk from the west entrance to Aggie Stadium. Credentialed media will have names on a list with parking lot attendants. However, lot is first-come, first-serve and may fill up on gameday so media are encouraged to arrive early.

**HOME POSTGAME INTERVIEWS** - Requested UC Davis players and coaches will be available for interviews 10 minutes after conclusion of the game. Interviews will be conducted in the north end zone and coordinated by UC Davis Athletics Media Relations. Media will be escorted to the field with three minutes remaining in the game. Opponent interviews are at the discretion of the visiting SID but will likely be held near the team's lockerroom or on the field. **Lockerrooms are not open to the media.**

**ON THE ROAD** - Asst. AD/Media Relations Director Mike Robles travels with the Aggies and can help arrange player/coach interviews. No interviews will be granted on gameday prior to kickoff. He can be reached on the road via cell at (530) 979-1747.

since the middle of the 2008 season when it did it against Northern Colorado (115), Southern Utah (185) and Iona (295).

- The Aggies held North Dakota to just 17 rushing yards in the third quarter and 31 in the second half after it had 111 in the first half.

- UC Davis held North Dakota to three field goals and just one touchdown in its four trips into the red-zone.

- QB RANDY WRIGHT's passing efficiency was a season-high 193.66... His previous high was 147.7 against South Dakota... Wright's 286 yards are a career-high as are his four touchdown tosses.

- The Aggies only had one drive longer than seven plays, a 12-play, 38-yard possession that lasted nearly six minutes at the start of the second quarter.

- P COLTON SCHMIDT averaged 46.6 yards on seven punts, including a program-best 78-yarder in the fourth quarter... He put three inside the 20 and had a 54-yard effort earlier.

- Consistency? How about holding the ball for 16:59 of the first half and 16:47 of the second?

- UC Davis converted its only fourth-down attempt of the game, that coming on the game's final drive when RB NICK APRILE went six yards to help run out the clock.

- The Aggies were just 4 of 13 (.307) on third down, right on their season average, but they averaged 6.5 yards a play over the course of the game which helped countered being in that position.

- WR ANTHONY SOTO posted career-highs for both catches (6) and yards (70) including a long of 21 yards.

- RB MARQUIS NICOLIS also had career-bests with seven car-

ries for 35 yards.

- Wright's 50-yard TD pass to WR SEAN CREADICK in the fourth quarter was the team's first pass play for a score of at least that distance since QB GREG DENHAM hit WR BAKARI GRANT for a 59-yard score against San Diego in the 2008 season finale.

- S KEVYN LEWIS' interception was the first of his Aggie career while LB DOZIE AMAJOYI had his team-high third of the season... Both came in the fourth quarter with UND trying to come back from a 35-16 deficit.

- DT BROCK GALVIN's fumble recovery in the endzone was the Aggies' first score off a fumble since DE ERIC SOBOTKA returned one 34 yards against Winston-Salem State last season.

### FRESHMAN WRIGHT GETTING SENIOR SNAPS

- The departure of QB GREG DENHAM after spring practice this year opened the door for a competitive battle for starting duties which was eventually won by redshirt freshman QB RANDY WRIGHT.

- Wright made his Aggie debut in the opener at Cal, the first freshman to get the signal-calling nod in a season-opener since RYAN FLANIGAN started in 2000. (Flanigan started just one game that season).

- Wright has enjoyed a productive season for the Aggies, averaging 221.9 ypg through his nine starts and throwing 13 TD's against just seven interceptions.

- He has completed 20 passes in five games and thrown for at least 260 in four, including setting career-bests the last two weekends including 286 at North Dakota.

- Wright went 126 consecutive passes without an intercep-

tion including three full games (Weber State, San Jose State and South Dakota) and parts of two others.

- He's compiled 1,997 yards and completed 58.8 percent of his passes.

### CREADICK PUTTING UP CAREER NUMBERS

- Despite being the primary target for defenses in the Aggies' aerial attack, WR SEAN CREADICK continues to put up a strong senior season which has already seen him post five 100-yard games, four of them with at least seven catches.

- His 100-yard games:

- Sept. 25 (Weber St.) - 9 rec., 100 yds

- Oct. 9 (So. Dakota) - 7 rec., 100 yds

- Oct. 23 (So. Alabama) - 12 rec., 147 yds.

- Oct. 30 (So. Utah) - 9 rec., 134 yds, 1 TD

- Nov. 6 (No. Dakota) - 4 rec., 102 yds, 3 TD's

- Creadick's catches and yards against South Alabama both marked career-best totals... His TD's at North Dakota are his best.

- His previous best for catches were 10 against Montana last year (the same game that WR CHRIS CARTER set a school record with 18) while his previous high for yards were 100 against both Weber State and South Dakota.

- Creadick has 47 receptions for 773 yards in his six games, including the five 100-yard efforts...

- The standout senior has at least 35 more receptions than the next two Aggies on this year's list - TE DEAN ROGERS (24) and WR ANTHONY SOTO (22).

- For his career, he has 126 receptions for 1,693 yards... He needs one catches and 239 yards to break into the program's

- Creadick is three receptions and 84 yards from cracking single-season Aggie lists in those areas as well... His four straight 100-yard games mark the first an Aggie has done that since WR TONY KAYS did to start 2005.

- Creadick is ranked 13th in the FCS for catches (6.6 pg) and 12th for yards (90.2 pg).

- He was named on Monday as the Great West's top wide receiver for Week 10 by College Performance Awards.

### GLASS BREAKING IN WELL WITH UC DAVIS

- LB JORDAN GLASS is in his first year with the UC Davis defense after transferring from Utah State where he played two years.

- He played just three games as a sophomore there but had 26 tackles, including 2.5 TFLs during his limited action before missing the remainder of the season with an injury.

- Since joining UC Davis, he's moved into a starting linebacker role where he is third with 57 total tackles, including 3.5 TFL's.

- Glass, from nearby Elk Grove, has three times posted eight tackles including last weekend against Southern Utah, leading the team in stops for the second straight week.

- His 28 solo stops rank third on the team.

### BIGGS MOVES TO TOP OF COACHING LADDER

- UC Davis head coach BOB BIGGS has served as head coach for for 206 games, more than any coach in UC Davis history... JIM SOCHOR was mentor for 202 games between 1970-88 and holds the program record with 156 wins.

- Biggs, who played for Sochor and served as an assistant coach with him, is second all-time with 133 victories... IRVING "CRIP" TOOMEY is third on the list with 74 coached games between 1928-36.

### AGGIES PLAY TWO NCAA FBS GAMES IN 2010

- For the second straight year, UC Davis has played two NCAA Division I FBS opponents, posting its second win over a "higher" team since 2005.

- The Aggies faced Cal (L,52-3) and San Jose State (W,14-13) this year after playing at Fresno State (L,51-0) and highly ranked Boise State (L,34-16) in 2009.

- UC Davis is 2-7 against the FBS since 2005.

### CAREER RECORDS UPDATE

- Junior K SEAN KELLEY has 31 career field goals, tying him RAY SULLIVAN (1981-84) and putting him just one back of RAFAEL HERNANDEZ (1981-84)... EDDIE LORETTO (1985-88) holds the school record with 47.

- Kelley is also 7th in attempts (38), 6th for PAT's made (97) and attempted (98).

- RB JOE TROMBETTA is 8th with 391 career rushing attempts and 9th with 1,622 rushing yards.

- Defensively, three underclassmen (DE TOMMY GRILLO, DT BROCK GALVIN, DT ANDREW BENJAMIN) occupy the line while a secondary spots is held by sophomore CB JONATHAN PERKINS.

- A total of 23 starting and backup spots on the Aggies' two-deep going into this week's game are filled by underclassmen.

### GREAT WEST PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

- RB JOSH REESE was named the Great West Conference Offensive Player of the Week for his performance against San Diego on Sept. 18.

- Reese rushed 13 times for 104 yards (8.0 avg.), scoring from 12 yards in the first quarter and from 17 yards in the fourth... It was his first career game with two touchdowns.

- It was also his second career 100-yard rushing game, the other coming at Southern Utah last year when he had 101... That was also the last such game for the Aggies overall.

- The award was Reese's first conference honor and also the first of the season for the team... For the year, he leads UC Davis with 137 rushing yards and has caught 10 passes for 71 yards... His receptions rank second on the team.

- LB MARSHALL CONGDON earned Defensive Player of the Week honors on Sept. 26 after a career-high 14 tackle (8 solo) against Weber State... Included were 2.0 TFL's for seven yards.

- P COLTON SCHMIDT averaged 39.1 yards on seven punts at San Jose State, including booting a 62-yarder, earning Special Teams Player of the Week accolades on Oct. 3... His program-best 78-yarder and a 46.6 average at North Dakota helped him repeat on Nov. 7... He earned the award as a freshman in 2009 as well.

### TOS ANCHORS YOUNG OFFENSIVE LINE

- T MARK TOS has been a mainstay on the offensive line for UC Davis, starting all 11 games at right tackle last year and pushing his consecutive starting streak to 43 consecutive games after picking up eight more this year.

- That durability has helped earn him All-Great West Conference second-team accolades in 2008 and first-team honors last year... It's also helped put him on the national radar with Phil Steele's College Football Preview and The Sports Network each naming him to their preseason All-America third teams.

- The Sports Network also selected him as one of its Top 10 returning offensive linemen for 2010.

- Tos, a senior, leads an offensive line that currently starts three sophomores (C RAY WILBURN, G SEAN DAVIES, G TIM KETAILY) and a junior (T ROBERT AYOTTE).

- Longevity on the line is not a stranger at UC Davis... C TOMMY HERNANDEZ, who was mini-camp last spring with the Minnesota Vikings, finished his career last year with 34 straight starts... G JONATHAN COMPAS, most recently with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, started all 40 of his career games before finishing in 2008, while G MARIO GONZALEZ ended his career at the same time with 34 straight starts.

### PRESEASON ACCOLADES FOR UC DAVIS

- OT MARK TOS was named to third-team preseason All-America squads by both Phil Steele's College Football Preview and the Sports Network.

- Phil Steele's honored several Aggies on its preseason All-GWC team: TE DEAN ROGERS, G SEAN DAVIES, DE ERIC SOBOTKA and K SEAN KELLEY were on the first team... WR SEAN CREADICK, RB JOE TROMBETTA, G RAY WILBURN, DT ANDREW BENJAMIN, DT JACOB MAXSON, LB DOZIE AMAJOYI, SS DANNY HART and P COLTON SCHMIDT received second-team honors.

- Kelley was selected the GWC Preseason Special Teams Player

of the Year.

- UC Davis was also the coaches pick to win the Great West title during its preseason poll.

### STREAKS OF NOTE

- UC Davis saw its streak of 212 games in which it had scored a point come to an end at Fresno State (L,51-0) in last year's season-opener... The last shutout prior to that was a 19-0 defeat to Cal Poly in 1990... The streak nearly ended in 2001 when the Aggies faced North Dakota in the postseaso but UND took a safety late in the game, helping the Aggies' preserve the streak... North Dakota won 14-2.

- They have, however, not been shut out in 112 straight home games. (includes "home" games at Hughes Stadium during Causeway Classic).

- A long streak came to an end in this year's opener at Cal after the Aggies were held to just 81 total yards... It's believed to be the first time they had less than 200 yards in total offense since a 30-12 loss to Nevada in 1969, a streak that ends at 442 games... UC Davis had 130 in that game.

### UC DAVIS TO MOVE TO BIG SKY CONFERENCE

- UC Davis announced on Sept. 7 it had accepted an offer to join the Big Sky Conference for the sport of football only with anticipated competition in the newly expanded league to start for the Aggies in 2012.

- The move will benefit the football program in scheduling (an expected eight games - at least - will be provided with Big Sky competition), travel will be mostly regional, helping with cost-containment concerns, and rivalries will either be created or strengthened.

- The Big Sky also offers an automatic berth to the NCAA Div. I FCS Championships, marking the first time that UC Davis has been in a league with an automatic qualification.

- The Aggies joined the Big Sky with current Great West Conference member Cal Poly... Both institutions are joining for football only and remain committed members of the Big West Conference which is home to a majority of their other sports.

- It was announced last week that fellow GWC members North Dakota and Southern Utah will also join the Big Sky in 2012 but do so in all sports.

- Causeway Classic rival Sacramento State - which UC Davis has played annually since 1954 - is a member of the Big Sky which will consist of 11 of the 13 scholarship football programs in the West once it expands.

- It'll be the fourth conference in the 92-year history of the program: Far Western (1925-81), Northern California Athletic Conference (1982-92), American West Conference (1993) and its current Great West Conference (since 2004).

- UC Davis is 11-9 versus Big Sky competition since the start of the 2004 season and has games scheduled this year against Portland State (L,41-33), Weber State (Sept. 25) and Sacramento State (Nov. 20).

- Current members of the Big Sky are: Eastern Washington, Idaho State, Montana, Montana State, Northern Arizona, Northern Colorado, Portland State, Sacramento State and Weber State.

### AGGIE COACHING TREE INCLUDES BIG NAMES

- Besides becoming the all-time winningest coach at UC Davis, former mentor JIM SOCHOR has several former players and assistants who have gone to notable college or pro coaching careers, including:

- MIKE BELLOTTI (Oregon, former head coach), who played for Sochor in 1969-72 and was a subsequent assistant coach.

- DAN HAWKINS (Colorado, former head coach) played for UC Davis in 1981-82, was later an assistant with the Aggies and sub-

sequently was head coach at Boise State .

- CHRIS PETERSEN (Boise State, head coach), who played for UC Davis in 1985-86 and was also an assistant... He has led Boise State to national prominence including unbeaten years in 2006 and 2009.

- PAUL HACKETT (Oakland Raiders, asst. coach), who played from 1966-68, was an assistant at UC Davis as well a head coach at USC, Pittsburgh and an assistant with the New York Jets and Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

### ALL-TIME RECORD

- UC Davis owns an all-time record of 482-361-33 (.569) as it plays its 92nd season of football... The Aggies started playing in 1915 and have played continuously except for 1918, and 1943-45.

- A total of 15 head coaches, beginning with R.E. HARMON (1915-16) have directed the Aggies' program with College Football Hall of Fame Inductee JIM SOCHOR (1969-88) winning a program-best 156 games.

- Since opening Aggie Stadium in 2007, the Aggies have gone 12-7 including a 4-1 mark last season... Portland State's win earlier this season snapped a modest four-game winning streak at the facility.

### BEND BUT DON'T BREAK DEFENSE

- Opponents have been into the Aggie red-zone 36 times this season, scoring on 32 of them (.889)... However, outside of Southern Utah which scored touchdowns five times, UC Davis has been stingy with the TD's.

- North Dakota had four visits to the red-zone but was held to three field goals while Portland State, Weber State and San Jose State each made no more than three trips but each had to settle for a pair of field goals.

- For the season, UC Davis has held the opposition to field goals 41 percent of the time it's been inside the Aggies' 20.

### AGGIE QUARTERBACK LEGACY HAS LONG LIST

- The Aggies' coaching tree is just one trademark of the football program... The other is its ability to turn out prolific quarterbacks.

- Despite being a Div. II program until 2007, UC Davis has had six signal-callers chosen in the NFL Draft since 1979: MIKE MOROSKI (Falcons, '79), KEN O'BRIEN (Jets, '83), SCOTT BARRY (49ers, '85), JEFF BRIDEWELL (Cardinals, '91), KEVIN DAFT (Titans, '99) and J.T. O'SULLIVAN (Saints, '02).

- O'Sullivan has played with several teams and is currently a backup with San Diego, Moroski is in his 23rd year on the Aggies' coaching staff and Daft is an assistant coach at Cal.

- O'Brien was a member of the famed NFL QB class of '83 that also included Dan Marino, John Elway, Todd Blackledge, Jim Kelly and Tony Eason being drafted in the first round.

- In addition to the draftees, QB KHARI JONES (1991-93) enjoyed a prolific career in the Canadian Football League and was named the CFL's Most Outstanding Player in '01.

- QB MARK GRIEB (1994-96) was an ArenaBowl MVP and champion with the San Jose Sabercats and holds several league passing records.

- QB JON GRANT (2003-06) was a member of the Berlin Adler whose team won the 21st German Bowl in 2009... He was the Aggies' signal-caller when they drove for the winning touchdown against Stanford in 2005.

- Even current coach BOB BIGGS played some professional football spending some time in the CFL and the WFL before joining the Aggies' staff.

### TEAM CAPTAINS

- UC Davis has four captains this season in LB DOZIE AMAJOYI,



## BOB BIGGS

Head Coach  
18th year as head coach  
33rd year overall

Ask anyone close to the UC Davis football program about its head coach and you'll tend to get the same response: "Not your typical football coach."

The compliment fits Bob Biggs. Despite running a program that played at the highest levels nationally at the NCAA Division II level and one that is quickly rising among the ranks of the Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS), Biggs has remained an accessible and engaging leader of the Aggies.

Biggs' stamp on the football program at UC Davis is one of success, intensity and intelligence that carried his teams to eight playoff appearances and an average of nine wins per year during his first decade.

Now the second-winningest football coach in UC Davis history, Biggs trails only his mentor, Jim Sochor, on the all-time coaching victories list. His first win in the 1999 season was his 50th, making him one of the quickest coaches to reach that plateau in the nation regardless of division. With a win over former Great West Conference rival Northern Colorado in 2004, Biggs hit his 100th career win in just his 12th year.

In 1993 and 2000, he was named American Football Coaches Association's Region 5 College Division Coach of the Year. In 2002, he won Coach of the Year honors for the inaugural Independent Football Alliance. Then in 2009, Biggs was selected as the Great West Conference Coach of the Year while earning one of just 20 bids for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award.

Additionally, Biggs earned a new position of leadership when he was selected as president of the AFCA FCS Executive Committee in 2009.

Biggs has created an atmosphere in the Aggie football program that has maintained a level of relative continuity at UC Davis. Two assistants — offensive coordinator Mike Moroski and special teams/running backs coach Greg Chapla — are amidst their third decade on the Aggie coaching staff. A third coach, defensive coordinator Mark Johnson, enters his 11th season with the program.

On the field, the offensive system developed by Biggs and Moroski has dumbfounded opponents and attracted top recruits who are seeking a balanced, intricate pro-style offense. Biggs, previously the quarterbacks coach, has seen four of his protégés enter the professional ranks. Khari Jones (1991-93) earned Canadian Football League MVP honors in 2001, Mark Grieb (1994-96) earned Arena Bowl MVP for the San Jose Sabercats in 2007, and Kevin Daft (1996-98) was a fifth-round draft choice of the Tennessee Titans in 1999.

Most recently, J.T. O'Sullivan (1999-2001) was selected in the sixth round by the New Orleans Saints in 2002 and was chosen as Co-Offensive MVP of NFL Europe in 2007. In 2008, he was named as starting quarterback for the San Francisco 49ers. Currently, O'Sullivan is a member of the Cincinnati Bengals.

Under Biggs' guidance, the Aggies consistently ranked among the top Division II teams in the nation in total offense. In 2000, UC Davis averaged almost 520 yards per game, ranking among the national leaders during the regular season.

Biggs had similar success as a UC Davis quarterback. His legend was sealed in 1971 when he was the quarterback for the Aggies' "Miracle Win" over Cal State Hayward. In that game, he directed a comeback that featured 16 points in the final 20 seconds and resulted in a 30-29 victory. That win paved the way for the first of UC Davis' national-record 20 straight league titles.

During his senior year in 1972, Biggs averaged 272.8 yards per game in total offense and was the leading passer in the nation at Division II (then known as the College Division). That year, he also became the Aggies' first 2,000-yard passer, while setting the school record for attempts with 387, a mark that stayed intact for 21 years. He had four 300-yard passing games that fall, including a 399-yard day at San Francisco State.

In his final game as a collegian, Biggs led UC Davis to Atlantic City, N.J., for the NCAA's Boardwalk Bowl and a clash with Massachusetts. Playing the entire game with a broken finger, he set two national records in the Aggies' 35-14 loss. His record 59 passes that day established a Division II postseason record.

Biggs, a member of the Cal Aggie Athletics Hall of Fame, was an Associated Press Little All-American that season. He graduated in 1973 with a double major in political science and history.

Biggs played professionally with the Winnipeg Blue Bombers of the Canadian Football League and the Portland Storm of the World Football League. He also spent time in the training camp of the NFL's Denver Broncos.

Biggs came back to his alma mater to join the coaching staff in 1978. He became the offensive coordinator in 1987 and was the assistant head coach in 1991 and 1992 before taking the head coaching position in 1993.

In his first year as head football coach, the Aggies went 10-2, were co-champions of the American West Conference and reached the second round of the NCAA Playoffs for the first time in 10 years. He was also named AFCA Region Coach of the Year.

Biggs also served as head men's tennis coach from 1979 through 1988. In that span, he guided the Aggies to five NCAA Championships appearances, including a third-place finish in 1986.

Bob and his wife Diane have two sons, Ryan and Kyle.

# GAME-BY-GAME RECAPS

## GAME 1

### Cal 52, UC Davis 3

September 4, 2010

Memorial Stadium - Attendance: 58,040

Shane Vereen rushed for two touchdowns and quarterback Kevin Riley threw for another to help Cal score 28 points in the second quarter on Saturday and pull away from UC Davis in a 52-3 season-opening win before 58,040 fans at Memorial Stadium in the first football meeting between the programs in 71 years.

UC Davis, which trailed just 7-0 after a competitive first quarter, was held to just 81 total yards. Junior Sean Kelley had a 43-yard field goal in the third quarter, making him 5 for 5 from beyond 40 yards in his career.

Vereen finished with three touchdowns after opening the scoring with a 23-yard pass from Riley with 4 minutes, 11 seconds left in the first quarter. A 13-yard touchdown pass from Riley to receiver Marvin Jones early in the second quarter made it 14-0, sparking a big second period in which Vereen followed an 18-yard TD pass from Riley to Keenan Allen with a pair of seven-yard touchdown scampers in the final 2:13 before half.

The Aggies, meanwhile, struggled to get an offensive rhythm going, punting on their first seven possessions, including six straight when they were held to just three plays. The Bears outgained UC Davis 332-31 in the first half and had 16 first downs to the Aggies' one. Riley completed 13 of 19 passes for 210 yards before halftime - while Vereen had 70 rushing yards.

Trailing 42-0 in the third quarter, UC Davis put together its only scoring drive. Redshirt freshman quarterback Randy Wright - the first freshman to start an Aggie season-opener in a decade - hit sophomore Anthony Soto for five yards and tight end Cameron Sentance for 15 more to help the Aggies move to the Bears' 25. Kelley followed shortly later with a 43-yard field goal into the endzone containing more than 5,000 UC Davis fans.

Keenan Allen caught a 48-yard touchdown pass from Riley on the Bears' first drive of the second half while backup quarterback Beau Sweeney ran in from four yards late in the third. Giorgio Tavecchio capped the scoring with a 23-yard field goal late in the game.

## GAME 2

### Portland State 41, UC Davis 33

September 11, 2010

Aggie Stadium - Attendance: 8,235

Tory McCaffrey rushed for 116 yards including a 40-yard touchdown, Connor Kavanaugh passed for 178 yards and ran for 56 more, and Portland State held off UC Davis down the stretch as the Vikings snapped a three-game losing streak to their hosts with a nonconference football victory.

Redshirt freshman quarterback Randy Wright threw for 261 yards and a pair of scores to help lead the Aggies while sophomore Nick Aprile carried the ball 12 times for 47 yards and touchdowns covering 1 and 2 yards.

UC Davis led just once in the game, trailed 21-16 at halftime and 35-30 entering the fourth quarter. The teams exchanged fourth-quarter fumbles and the Aggies' last opportunity in the final minute ended with an interception on their half of the field.

The Vikings also got four field goals from Zach Brown. He was good for 36 and 42 yards in the first half and then added kicks of 48 and 46 yards in the fourth quarter. His only miss came from 53 yards in the second quarter.

UC Davis forged an early 3-0 lead thanks to a 36-yard field goal from Sean Kelley who extended his streak to 11 straight made. But Portland State scored the next 14 points on two field goals and Joel Sisler's 33-yard interception return of Wright's pass early in the second quarter. Aprile scored from a yard, Griffin answered from eight yards and Sean Creadick hauled in a 6-yard TD pass Wright late in the half to make it 21-16 at intermission.

UC Davis had an opportunity to take the lead following Kelley's second field goal that made it 38-33 with 5:48 to go after the Vikings' AJ Powell fumbled the ensuing kickoff at the 18. However, defensive tackle Travis Beckley forced Joe Trombetta to fumble two plays later and Portland State got it back. The Vikings then moved down the field, picking up a key third down that allowed Brown to make his final field goal with 46 seconds remaining.

# GAME-BY-GAME RECAPS

## GAME 3

### UC Davis 38, San Diego 24

September 18, 2010

Torero Stadium - Attendance: 2,562

Josh Reese rushed for 104 yards and two touchdowns, Sean Kelley made his 12th straight field goal, and the UC Davis defense held the University of San Diego to just 31 rushing yards, as the Aggies picked up their first football win of the season with a nonconference victory at Torero Stadium.

Tight end Dean Rogers caught two touchdowns passes, the first a 38-yarder from quarterback Randy Wright midway through the first quarter, and the second coming from running back Nick Aprile in the fourth. Stephen Dunstan hauled in a 22-yard TD grab from Wright just before halftime.

Kelley's field goal was good from 35 yards early in the fourth quarter, putting the Aggies up 31-17. He hasn't missed since having one blocked at Boise State last October.

UC Davis outgained San Diego, 390 yards to 296, including rushing for a season-high 186 yards. That snapped a string of five straight games without eclipsing 100 rushing yards. Reese was also the first Aggie to go over the century mark individually since he picked up 101 at Southern Utah last season.

The defense, meanwhile, put together a strong effort, holding San Diego to just 31 rushing yards on 32 attempts. They also picked up a pair of sacks, including one by Eric Sobotka against Mills that resulted in a fumble and gave the Aggies the ball inside the the Toreros' 10.

Linebacker Dozie Amajoyi had a team-high nine tackles - and a fumble recovery - for UC Davis while cornerback Dre Allen and safety Danny Hart each had eight. Linebacker Jordan Glass pitched in with seven stops. Defensive end Tommy Grillo joined Sobotka with a sack.

The Aggies took a 21-10 lead into the half, extending it on their first drive of the third quarter when Reese ran in from 17 yards, giving him his first career two-touchdown game. Mason Mills brought San Diego back to within 28-17 on a five-yard pass to Jon Harris later in the quarter before Kelley's field goal made it a two-touchdown lead with 12:28 left in the fourth.

Using their version of the "Wildcat" offense, UC Davis tacked on its final score with 8:17 to go as Aprile rolled right to find Rogers. A short three-yard pass from Mills to Sam Ricucci capped the game's scoring at 38-24.

## GAME 4

### Weber State 20, UC Davis 9

September 25, 2010

Stewart Stadium - Attendance: 10,221

Quarterback Cameron Higgins threw for 207 yards in the second half - including a 60-yard touchdown pass to Joe Collins in the fourth quarter - as host Weber State beat in a nonconference football game played before 10,221 fans at Stewart Stadium.

UC Davis, which got three field goals from junior Sean Kelley including a pair from 42 yards, was also led by receiver Sean Creadick who caught nine passes for 100 yards. Josh Reese rushed for 75 yards and linebacker Marshall Congdon finished with a game-high 14 tackles including two tackles-for-losses.

Behind a pair of field goals from Kelley, UC Davis led 6-3 at halftime while also holding Weber State to just 87 yards of total offense. However, the Wildcats erupted for 319 yards after intermission, taking a 10-6 lead on backup quarterback Mike Hoke's short 2-yard run with 6 minutes, 53 seconds left in the quarter.

Kelley's second long field goal made it a 10-9 game early in the fourth quarter but Weber State scored 10 points over the final 10 minutes on a short field goal by Shaun McClain and Higgin's long TD pass, pulling away for the win.

UC Davis' defense - which had injuries in the secondary entering the game and picked up another early on - held Weber State in check for the first 30 minutes. The Wildcats got a 22-yard field goal from McClain midway through the first quarter for a 3-0 lead but that 41-yard drive was their longest of the half. Their next four drives ended with punts.

Congdon had seven stops in the first half as the Aggies allowed just 46 yards on the ground. The Wildcats were equally stifled through the air with prolific quarterback Cameron Higgins limited to just six completion and 41 yards. The UC Davis offense, meanwhile, racked up 186 yards of offense including 89 on the ground but were turned away three times before Kelley's field goal.

Weber State came alive on its first drive in the third quarter, moving 70 yards to the UC Davis 10 before linebacker Dozie Amajoyi picked off Higgins on the goal line, thwarting the threat. An 11-play, 92-yard drive on the Wildcats' next possession was capped by Hoke's short score, putting Weber State back in front 10-6.

UC Davis got its final score early in the fourth quarter, driving 49 yards on 10 plays to the Wildcats' 24 before Kelley was good again from 42 yards, extending his consecutive-made streak to 15. Weber State answered with McClain's short field goal on its next drive to make it 13-9 before Higgins found a streaking Collins for a 60-yard score with 6:25 remaining to extend the lead to 11 points. The Aggies were held scoreless the remainder of the game.

## GAME 5

### UC Davis 14, San Jose State 13

October 2, 2010

Spartan Stadium - Attendance: 17,844

Tom Hemmingsen's 4-yard touchdown pass from Randy Wright late in third quarter proved to be the winning score as UC Davis rallied from a 13-point halftime deficit to stun Western Athletic Conference member San Jose State in a nonconference football game at Spartan Stadium.

The win was the Aggies' second over an NCAA Division I Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) since the start of the 2005 season. The UC Davis defense held the Spartans to just 108 total yards in the second half after San Jose State piled up 231 before intermission. The Aggies also finished with three sacks including one that helped lead to their first points of the game.

The Spartans turned away UC Davis with a goal-line stand just before halftime, taking a 13-0 lead into the break. However, running back Nick Aprile, operating out of the Aggies' version of the Wildcat, dove in from a yard out on fourth down midway through the third to cut it to 13-7.

UC Davis then drove 78 yards on eight plays later in the quarter, capping the drive with Wright's touchdown pass to Hemmingsen in the back of the end zone with 1 minute, 26 seconds to go that put the Aggies in front for the first time, 14-13.

The Spartans had a chance to take the lead late in the game but kicker Harrison Waid's 52-yard field goal was wide left and the Aggies were able to run out the final 3:31 of the game.

San Jose State forged its 13-point halftime lead scoring on three straight possessions after punting on its first. Jalal Beauchman hauled in a 25-yard pass from backup quarterback Matt Faulkner late in the first quarter, extending the Spartans' lead to 10-0 after Harrison Waid's 36-yard field goal opened the scoring earlier.

UC Davis picked up a big break in the third quarter when quarterback Jordan La Secia fumbled on a sack by Andrew Benjamin at the 13. Defensive end Tommy Grillo pounced on it at the 9, leading to Aprile's dive in from a yard out with 8:30 left in the third.

The defense then forced a punt and UC Davis moved from its 22 to the San Jose State 6, highlighting the drive on a 44-yard pass completion from Wright to Creadick. Hemmingsen's touchdown catch came on third down after Wright rolled to his right and found Hemmingsen in the back of the end zone.

Jonathan Perkins picked off La Secia at the UC Davis 34 to end a threat at the end of the third quarter, setting up a fourth quarter when the teams traded punts before Waid's long miss.

## GAME 6

### UC Davis 17, South Dakota 13

October 9, 2010

Aggie Stadium - Attendance: 10,352

Randy Wright threw for 260 yards and a touchdown, Sean Creadick caught seven passes for 100 yards and the defense turned away South Dakota in the final seconds, as UC Davis beat the Coyotes in a Great West Conference matchup before 10,352 homecoming at Aggie Stadium.

UC Davis took the lead for good early in the fourth quarter on a 39-yard touchdown pass from Wright to tight end Dean Rogers.

South Dakota took over on its own 32 with just under two minutes remaining and trailing 17-13. Quarterback Dante Warren found receiver Tom Flanagan for a 13-yard gain and then later rushed for 16 more as USD moved into UC Davis territory. The Coyotes eventually moved to the Aggies' 27 but a penalty and two incomplete passes - one of them broken up by cornerback Dre Allen - set up 4th-and-9.

Perkins, however, stopped the threat there, breaking up Warren's pass intended for Flanagan and giving the Aggies the ball for the final 10 seconds.

South Dakota got on the scoreboard first, capitalizing on UC Davis' first turnover in three games, a fumble at UC Davis' 45 on the game's opening possession. Ganious ran for 24 yards to the 21-yard line with Kevin Robb eventually adding a 37-yard field goal just over two minutes into the game and a quick 3-0 lead.

The Aggies responded later in the quarter, moving 64 yards in six plays, including completions of 29 and 14 yards on back-to-back plays to Creadick that put UC Davis in business at the 1. Nick Aprile ran it in from there - his fourth rushing touchdown of the year - and the Aggies went in front 7-3.

The teams exchanged 28-yard field goals the rest of the half; Robb's coming late in the first quarter and the Aggies' Sean Kelley converting with a single tick left in the half - as UC Davis took a 10-6 halftime lead.

South Dakota put together its longest drive of the game, a 10-play, 90-yard effort, to start the second half, highlighted by 45 rushing yards from Warren and 29 from Ganious. Warren's 27-yard run put the ball at UC Davis' four before his four-yard jaunt helped push the Coyotes into a 13-10 lead.

South Dakota had the ball early in the fourth quarter and was driving to midfield but Warren fumbled at the USD 39 and the Aggies' Danny Hart recovered. Wright then found Rogers in the left side of the end zone on the ensuing play for a touchdown, returning the lead to UC Davis, 17-13.

## GAME 7

### South Alabama 24, UC Davis 21

October 23, 2010

Aggie Stadium - Attendance: 6,853

Courtney Smith caught a 45-yard go-ahead touchdown pass with less than six minutes remaining and South Alabama survived a last-second potential game-tying field goal attempt from UC Davis as the undefeated Jaguars beat UC Davis in a nonconference football game at Aggie Stadium.

Receiver Sean Creadick had career-highs with 12 catches for 147 yards while also hauling in a seven-yard touchdown pass from Randy Wright who threw for 238 yards and two scores. Linebacker Dozie Amajoyi had nine tackles, including a half-sack, and a fumble recovery to help lead the Aggie defense.

UC Davis had a chance to regain the lead, or at least tie with a field goal, after the Jaguars fumbled on their own 33 with 1:53 left in the fourth quarter. Creadick had an impressive one-handed catch for a 22-yard reception on that final drive to push the ball to the South Alabama 17 but UC Davis wasn't able to move any closer, setting up a 34-yard field goal attempt from Sean Kelley who missed just right as time expired.

UC Davis made it close game after falling behind 14-0 in the first nine minutes of the game after South Alabama scored on its first two drives. The Aggies, however, held South Alabama in check the rest of the half, tying the game on a short three-yard touchdown run to finish off a 65-yard drive late in the first quarter and then Creadick's seven-yard TD reception with just 15 seconds left in the half.

Tom Hemmingsen had a 14-yard catch and Creadick brought one in for 26 yards to help highlight the first drive while Creadick's 22-yard gain kick-started the latter drive which started with just under two minutes left. Troy Yudin also had a 22-yard catch on that scoring drive which began with 1:53 left in the quarter.

Tied 14-14 in the third quarter, UC Davis took the lead with a strong 7-play, 79-yard drive that resulted in Wright's 17-yard TD strike to Hemmingsen with 4:12 to go. South Alabama's Jordan Means kicked a 39-yard field goal on the final play of the quarter, making it 21-17 heading to the fourth.

The Jaguars got the ball with 6:55 to play, picking up a 14-yard connection from quarterback C.J. Bennett to Jerome Jones and a 16-yard rush from Santuan McGee to help get the ball to the Aggies' 45 where Smith put USA ahead with his long touchdown reception.

Starting on its own 15, UC Davis moved inside the Jaguars' territory on the ensuing drive but was forced to punt with just over two minutes left. The Aggies took a pair of timeouts before Bennett fumbled on third down at the 32, setting up the final drive of the game.

## GAME 8

### Southern Utah 55, UC Davis 24

October 30, 2010

Aggie Stadium - Attendance: 5,368

Brad Sorensen threw for 397 yards and five touchdowns, three of them to Tysson Poots who had 12 catches for 191 yards, as the Southern Utah football team beat UC Davis at Aggie Stadium, clinching the Thunderbirds' first-ever Great West Conference championship.

UC Davis was led by nine catches and 134 yards from receiver Sean Creadick and 278 passing yards from quarterback Randy Wright. Linebacker Jordan Glass had eight tackles to pace the defense.

Sorensen was on target throughout the night, completing 30 of 36 passes while tying a school record for most touchdown passes in a game. Poots caught scoring passes of 18 yards in the second quarter, 13 yards in the third, and then closed the scoring with a 42-yard TD reception in the fourth.

Southern Utah's defense got the Thunderbirds on the scoreboard first as Blake Fenn picked off Wright and raced 73 yards up the near sideline for a touchdown. Trailing 10-0 after a 38-yard field goal from SUU's Brock Miller, UC Davis countered with a 44-yard strike from Wright to Creadick to make it 10-7.

Sean Kelley made a 36-yard field goal with 9:49 left in the second quarter, bringing the Aggies to 17-10 before Sitake and Sorensen's each scored touchdowns over the final 3:27 of the first half gave Southern Utah a 21-point intermission lead.

Nick Aprile's first touchdown, from two yards, made it 34-17 while his second, a one-yard dive early in the fourth quarter, made it 48-24 after Sitake and Poots scored from seven and 13 yards over the last half of the third quarter. Poots' 42-yard scoring reception with 7:17 left completed the scoring.

Wright completed 22 of 35 passes while Creadick posted his third straight 100-yard receiving game and fourth this season overall. Corbin Cutshaw had 79 yards on 14 carries while tight end Dean Rogers added five catches for 78 yards

## GAME 9

### UC Davis 35, North Dakota 16

November 6, 2010

Alerus Center - Attendance: 6,633

Randy Wright threw for 286 yards and four touchdowns, three of them to receiver Sean Creadick, while the Aggie defense picked up four turnovers including one for a touchdown, as UC Davis beat North Dakota in a Great West Conference football game at The Alerus Center.

Wright connected with Creadick on scoring passes covering 18 yards in the second quarter, 50 yards in the third, and 30 in the fourth. He opened the scoring with a 39-yard strike to Stephen Dunstan early in the game, setting a career-high for passing touchdowns. Creadick's three scores are also a career-best.

The Aggie defense scored the team's final touchdown when defensive tackle Brock Galvin pounced on a loose ball after a fumble in the endzone late in the third quarter that helped make the score 28-16.

UC Davis rolled up 410 yards of total offense, including 124 on the ground. Corbin Cutshaw had 60 yards on 12 carries. The defense picked up five TFLs, recovered two fumbles and picked up interceptions from safety Kevyn Lewis and linebacker Dozie Amajoyi who had his team-leading third.

North Dakota got to within a point at 14-13 midway through the third quarter when Marcus Hendrickson ran in from three yards. However, Creadick hauled in his 50-yard TD pass three minutes later and - after Zeb Miller's third field goal, this one from 24 yards, - made it 28-16 after Galvin fell in the endzone on a fumble that bounded there from the 13 where Hendrickson lost it.

Leading by 12, the Aggies got the ball back midway through the fourth quarter and scored four plays later when Creadick - whose four catches for 102 yards gave him his fourth straight 100-yard game - streaked past the defense and hauled in Wright's fourth scoring pass.

Lewis made a big interception on UND's next drive, thwarting it after just two plays while Amajoyi turned away its final possession with his diving pick at the 50 late in the game.

Amajoyi had eight solo stops to lead the UC Davis defense which held North Dakota to just 131 total yards in the second half, including just 31 rushing yards on 17 carries. UND ran the ball 11 times in the third quarter, gaining only 17 yards.
