Riding a late-inning rally over TCU Feb. 11, UCF gets back to work with a three-game set vs. Maryland Friday-Sunday at Jay Bergman Field. With other events going on around campus and at the UCF Arena, fans are encouraged to arrive early for the first two games to avoid traffic issues.

TCU at UCF Series Recap

It did not take long for TCU to jump ahead in the all three games vs. UCF last weekend. The Horned Frogs posted three runs in the first inning and four in the third en route to a 10-1 triumph Feb. 9, then scored 11 runs in the first four innings for a 12-1 victory Feb. 10. Brandon Romans was 2-for-3 with the Knights' lone RBI in the first loss, while Dwayne Bailey also shined, swiping two

bases and notching a base hit. In game two, Ryan Richardson pounded out two doubles and Ryan Williams added a solo shot to left field for UCF's only run.

But the tide turned Feb. 11. After TCU took a 6-1 lead in the fourth, Chadd Hartman and Tim Russell each drove in two runs in the fifth, which led up to a wild eighth inning. The Golden Knights batted around even though they did not hit the ball out of the infield, scoring three runs to seal an 8-6 victory. Brandon Romans tied it with a bases-loaded walk, Tyson Auer put UCF ahead thanks to an RBI single to third base and Dwayne Bailey scored on a passed ball.

Maryland led 5-3 before giving up four in the eighth. It bounced back to post a 12-inning 1-0 victory over Gardner-Webb and a 10-4 triumph over Creighton.

Maryland sent out Casey Baron vs. Winthrop, and he allowed three runs in 5.0 innings. Ryan Moorer was then brilliant against Gardner-Webb, lasting 5.0 scoreless innings and giving up just two hits. Kevin Biringier fared even better in the win over Creighton, limiting the Bluejays to only one hit and five strikeouts in 5.0 innings.

The Series

UCF and Maryland get together for the first time ever this weekend. This will be the only occasion that the Terrapins play a C-USA school in 2007. Last year, they lost a three-game series to East Carolina, 2-1.

Maryland and Virginia Tech are the only two programs UCF has never faced from the Atlantic Coast Conference. Out of the eight other non-Florida teams, the Golden Knights have a winning record against all of the them. However, Florida State (19-4) and Miami (20-5) all own a considerable advantage over UCF.

Great Crowds

At least 900 fans gathered for each game of the TCU series Feb. 9-11. In all, a combined 2,727 people ventured to Jay Bergman Field that weekend, marking the fifth-largest attendance for a baseball series ever at the ballpark.

Interviews

Photographers

Radio

All radio stations must follow the procedure above for obtaining media passes. UCF provides two lines for radio stations from visiting schools wishing to broadcast from Jay Bergman Field. Lines for conference opponents are provided on a reciprocal basis.

Parking

Due to a new parking garage being erected next to Jay Bergman Field, media parking will be available on the baseball practice field at the beginning of the season. Once the area closes due to construction, parking is available in the East Garage (levels 4-5).

Doesn't Happen Too Often

UCF's first home run of 2007 came off the bat of Ryan Williams against TCU Feb. 10. However, what made it special was that it was the first UCF pinch-hit homer since Drake Wade belted one vs. LSU Feb. 15, 2004. For Williams, it was the sophomore's second-career dinger.

Shutting Them Down

Junior righty Matt McClung was brilliant out of the pen against TCU Feb. 9, setting a personal-high of 4.2 scoreless innings. He gave up just one hit in the process.

Some Nice Debuts

In the season opener vs. FIU Feb. 3-4, catcher Brandon Romans started his first UCF game and as the clean-up hitter, provided the Golden Knights with the team's first hit and run scored in the second inning. He finished the series by going 1-for-3 with two RBI in game two.

Also shining for the Knights, Nick Choto saw just one pitch but made it count in a pinch-hitting situation, successfully sacrificing Kiko Vazquez over to second in the eighth inning Feb. 3. Second baseman Dwayne Bailey combined to score three runs on the weekend, Ryan Richardson pounded out three hits in the No. 2 hole and Eric English tossed 3.1 innings of relief to grab the win Feb. 4.

Handling the Golden Panthers

With four hits against Florida International Feb. 3-4, Kiko Vazquez loves opening the season against the Golden Panthers. Combined with his freshman campaign, the first baseman is 7-for-16 with five RBI and a homer vs. FIU.

What's New for 2007

The Golden Knights had a few holes to fill at the conclusion of 2006. They suffered the loss of a starting pitcher (Tim Bascom), a catcher (Ryan Bono), a third baseman (Matt Ray) and a right fielder (Dave DiNatale). Ray served as the leadoff hitter in 46 games last season, while Bono batted third in 36 contests.

To remedy these issues, UCF has already begun to use a mix of newcomers and returning players. Freshman Chris Duffy has started four games at third base. Behind the plate, Steve Stropp and Birmingham-Southern transfer Brandon Romans are splitting time as the catcher. And in the outfield, Ryan Richardson, who comes to UCF from Seminole C.C., Ryan Williams and Chadd Hartman have all received playing time in the corner outfield positions.

The Closer

UCF also lost its closer, Dominic Petracca, who saved eight games last year. The 2007 pitching staff has a combined nine career saves, led by Brian Brooks' five. Derek Abriola is the only other Golden Knight to have more than one save in his career (two).

Silver Anniversary

Head coach Jay Bergman enters his 25th season as skipper of the UCF baseball team. With a career record of 1,158-659-3, he needs just two victories to jump into a tie for 20th on the NCAA Division I coaching list for career wins.

A New Man in Charge

Assistant coach Bryan Peters joined the UCF staff in the fall, and has already made big strides with the Golden Knight hitters. He will be looking to improve a team that went .275 at the plate in 2006, its lowest team batting average since 1994 (.250). On the basepaths, the Golden Knights tied for the second-lowest amount of stolen bases in program history by swiping just 59 a year ago. Since UCF has hit 31 or fewer home runs in four of the last five seasons, Peters will help the Golden Knights focus on the little things in order to score their runs.

Getting Back on Track

For the first time under head coach Jay Bergman, UCF finished with a record under .500 in 2006. The Golden Knights were forced to play with numerous injuries and freshmen in the lineup, all while making their first appearance in one of the toughest conferences in the nation. They completed the year by placing ninth in C-USA.

Threatening the Career Charts

Many current Golden Knights rank in the top 10 of at least one career UCF statistical category. Brian Brooks sits in fourth in relief appearances (60), tied for sixth in overall appearances (65) and tied for ninth in saves (five). After just one year, Mitch Houck is fourth in strikeouts per nine innings (9.97). Offensively, Matt Horwath has been hit by a pitch 19 times to place eighth on the career leaderboard.

A Dynamic Schedule

With the first 25 of 28 games on its home turf, UCF has put together a schedule that is sure to please Golden Knight fans. After welcoming FIU and then-No. 15 TCU the first two weekends, UCF is now set to tangle with Maryland to conclude an eight-game

home stand. After the team travels to LSU for three contests Feb. 23-25, UCF will play 16-straight games at Jay Bergman Field Feb. 27-March 26.

UCF Baseball Broadcasts

Every home game in 2007 will be aired live on 740-AM The Team or streamed over the internet at www.UCFathletics.com. In all, 740-AM will broadcast 19 regular-season contests, including five road games, as well as every pitch of the postseason.

Baseball America's Preseason Thoughts

In *Baseball America's* college baseball season preview, John Manuel predicted UCF to finish in seventh place this season, ahead of Marshall and UAB. He also listed LHP Carmine Giardina as the third best newcomer in the league.

C-USA Preseason Announcement

Along with all of the main national polls, Rice earned the top spot in the 2007 Conference USA Preseason Baseball Coaches Poll. The Owls received all nine first-place votes to finish ahead of second-place Tulane. Houston, Southern Miss and East Carolina rounded out the top five. Rice's Joe Savery was selected as the Preseason Player of the Year, and teammate Cole St. Clair earned Preseason Pitcher of the Year honors.

In all, Rice had five players named to the All-Conference Team, with Tulane trailing closely behind with four players. Houston and Memphis each placed two players on the team, while Southern Miss and Marshall nabbed one spot apiece.

Head Coach Jay Bergman



Celebrating his 25th season as the head coach of the UCF baseball program, Jay Bergman has seen it all at UCF. And as he enters his second season in Conference USA, Bergman and the 2007 Golden Knights should provide even more excitement on the diamond for fans to experience.

By moving into C-USA last year, Bergman continued to take his program to the next level. The Golden Knights are now on a memorable road to becoming one of the top programs in the nation, all while playing in one of the top five conferences in Division I.

The dean of all UCF coaches, Bergman has the most wins of any coach at UCF as he has been coaching baseball for 37 years. Upon entering his 38th collegiate season in 2007, Bergman has qualified for 12 NCAA Regional berths (nine at UCF, three at Florida), won six Atlantic Sun titles (the most of any coach or conference team) has been named the 1995 Atlantic Region Coach of the Year and was a two-time Atlantic Sun Coach of the Year (2001, 2002).

In 2001 Bergman received the greatest gift of all for all his hard work and dedication, a brand new state-of-the-art facility which bears his name. In 2001, UCF dominated its opponents at the new ballpark going 30-7, including a 19-1 start, with a .331 batting average and a 2.95 ERA inside the friendly confines of Jay Bergman Field.

Bergman began his coaching career with a seven-year stint at Seminole Community College in nearby Sanford, where his teams posted an overall record of 180-79 (.695). Beginning in 1968, Bergman's teams qualified for six consecutive state tournaments and he was a three-time Division II coach of the year. He departed SCC after the 1973 season for a three-year assistant coaching stint at Florida before taking the reins in 1976.

The University of Florida can thank Jay Bergman for their baseball program's success, as he brought the Gators into the national spotlight with their first ever NCAA Regional appearance during his tenure at UF. Bergman left Florida with the highest winning percentage in school history (216-113, .657). In his first 13 years of coaching, 57 of his former players went on to the professional ranks (21 SCC, 36 Florida).

Over Bergman's 37-year head coaching career, many of his former players have earned national, regional and conference honors for academic and athletic excellence. More than 100 of Bergman's former players have signed professional contracts and 10 of those players, including five first-round selections, have played in the major leagues.

Fourteen UCF players had been recognized as All-Americans in one form or another. In 2004, Matt Fox, Kyle Bono, Taylor Meier and Clay Timpner all collected All-America honors.

Bergman's players are recognized off the field as well as on. Last season, 14 Golden Knights earned a spot on Conference USA Commissioner's Honor Roll, which included Tyler Bunnell and Kiki Vazquez receiving the C-USA Commissioner's Academic Medal for having a GPA of 3.75 or higher. In 2002, 13 players were named to the Atlantic Sun all-academic team. In 2001, Chad Ehrnsberger became the first athlete in UCF sports history to earn first team Academic All-American status. Ehrnsberger and Bill Oakley were also regionally recognized. In 1998, Matt Lubozynski was a second team Academic All-American.

Bergman received his Master of Science degree in sociology from Appalachian State in 1966 and his undergraduate degree in history/government from Rollins College in 1963.

A member of the Rollins College, UCF, Winter Park High School and Richmond County (Va.) Baseball Coaches Halls of Fame, Bergman is a popular clinician at various camps and events around the country and has also participated in the NCAA Youth Education through Sports baseball clinic at the College World Series in Omaha.

Bergman has a wife Sherry, and four children: Jay, Jr., Catherine, Michael and Tiffany. Jay, Jr. played for the Golden Knights from 1983-84 during his father's first two seasons at UCF.

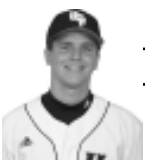
