**July 10, 2003**

### **WON SHOOTS 76 AT US WOMEN'S AMATUER SECTIONAL QUALIFYING**

Irvine, CA -- UC Irvine's Angela Won shot a 76 at the sectional qualifying for the US Women's Amateur at the Mission Viejo Country Club, missing the automatic qualifying score by one shot. She is now an alternate.

The US Women's Amateur is August 4-9 at the Philadelphia Country Club in Gladwyne, Pennsylvania.

### **LEE, LOVEJOY HONORED AS SCHOLAR-ATHLETES**

Stella Lee and Channing Lovejoy were among a school record 170 student-athletes honored as 2002-03 Big West Conference Scholar-Athletes at the program's annual banquet Monday night (May 19) at the Crowne Plaza Hotel.

This year's list of scholar-athletes brings UCI's total to 2,221 since 1984. The 170 honorees bests the old mark of 148 set in 1998-99. Requirements for this award include maintaining a 3.0 grade-point average (GPA) over three quarters or a 3.2 GPA over two quarters for freshmen. Student-athletes must also earn letters in their sports.

The Scholar-Athlete award was implemented by the Big West Conference to honor those student-athletes that have maintained a high level of scholastic excellence while participating in intercollegiate athletics. UCI expanded the award to include teams that do not participate in Big West-sponsored sports.

**May 12, 2003**

**STELLA LEE ENDS SEASON AT NCAA WEST REGIONAL:** UCI sophomore Stella Lee finished 61st at the NCAA Women's Golf West Regional last weekend at the Karsten Golf Course in Tempe, Ariz.

Lee, who qualified for the regional as an individual, shot a 6-over par 78 in the final round to finish with a 54-hole total of 235. UNLV's Sunny Oh won the individual title with a 5-under total of 211. The sophomore ends the season with a team-leading 75.63 scoring average. She had seven top 10 finishes this season.

**SEASON IN REVIEW:** UCI finished third at the Big West Conference Championships at Serrano Country Club in El Dorado Hills, Calif.

The Anteaters captured the Anteater Invitational at the Coto de Caza Golf and Racquet Club. The Anteaters shot a third round total of 310 to finish the tournament with a score of 925 (313-302-310) two shots ahead of Cal State Northridge 927 (308-311-308). It was the only tournament victory of the season and the third overall for the UCI women's program.

Stella Lee had UCI's top finish, placing second at both the Big West Championships (145) and the Anteater Invitational (220).

Lee and freshman Angela Won were named to the All-Big West first team. This is Lee's second All-Big West first team selection.

The Anteaters ended the season with a team scoring average 313.10.

**May 5, 2003**

#### **STELLA LEE PARTICIPATES IN NCAA WEST REGIONAL**

Irvine, CA -- UCI sophomore Stella Lee will compete at the NCAA West Regional as an individual player Thursday-Saturday (May 8-10) at the Karsten Golf Course in Tempe, Ariz. She is one of three individuals who will compete with 21 teams. The top eight teams will advance to the NCAA Championships with the top two individual players not from those eight teams also qualifying for championship competition. Lee is a two-time first-team All-Big West selection. She leads the team with a 75.34 scoring average and had seven top 10 finishes this season.

**April 22, 2003**

#### **UC IRVINE PLACES THIRD AT BIG WEST CHAMPIONSHIPS**

**EL DORADO HILLS, Calif.** --- The UC Irvine women's golf squad, in only its second year as a sport at the university, finished third in the Big West Conference Championships that concluded Tuesday at Serrano Country Club in El Dorado Hills, Calif.

Cal State Northridge won the title with a 36-hole total of 617, Idaho was second at 621 and UCI had a total of 638. Elizabeth Allen of Northridge won the individual title with a 36-hole score of two-under par 142 (72-70). UCI sophomore Stella Lee was second at 145 (75-70) and freshman Angela Won placed fourth at 153 (79-74).

Sophomore Shelly Raworth was 16th at 166 (84-82), junior Channing Lovejoy finished 25th at 174 (89-85) and freshman Reana Yun was 29th at 184 (91-93).

**LAST WEEK:** UCI began the week at the BYU/Dixie Classic where they finished in a tie for 10th at the Sunbrook Golf Course in St. George, UT. The Anteaters shot a 54-hole total of 934 (299-308-327).

Stella Lee led the Anteaters, placing third with a score of 222 (72-71-79). She shot a second round-low of 71. Angela Won was ninth, carding a 226 (71-79-76). She shot a career-low 71 on the first round, the third time she has done that this season. Shelly Raworth tied for 42nd with a three-round total of 236 (75-79-82), tying her season-low of 75 on the first 18. Channing Lovejoy was 93rd with a 251 (82-79-90), while Reana Yun placed 108th at 267 (81-91-95).

The Anteaters shot rounds of 322 and 318 to finish in a tie for eighth at the Peg Barnard Collegiate at the Stanford Golf Course with a 640 total to end the week. Lee again paced UCI with a 10th place finish on a 154 total (75-79), her sixth top 10 finish of the season. Won was 31st with a two round total of 161 (81-80), while Lovejoy was 37th at 162 (83-79). Raworth carded a 163 (83-80) for 41st place and Yun had a 36-hole total of 172 (90-82) for 62nd place.

**April 13, 2003**

#### **UC IRVINE FINISHES EIGHTH AT THE PEG BARNARD COLLEGIATE**

Stanford, Calif. - The UC Irvine women's golf team shot rounds of 322 and 318 to finish in a tie for eighth at the Peg Barnard Collegiate at the Stanford Golf Course Sunday with a 640 total.

Denver won the tournament with a 621. Stanford was second (622), San Jose State took third (623), followed by San Francisco (626) and Portland State (628). The Anteaters tied Oregon State for eighth.

Stanford's Wendra Liang won top individual honors at the tournament, shooting a two-round score of 148 (75-73).

Stella Lee paced UCI with a 10th place finish on a 154 total (75-79). Angela Won was 31st with a two round total of 161 (81-80), while Channing Lovejoy was 37th at 162 (83-79). Shelly Raworth carded a 163 (83-80) for 41st place and Reana Yun had a 36-hole total of 172 (90-82) for 62nd place.

Next, UCI will participate in the Big West Championships April 21-22 at the Serrano Country Club in El Dorado Hills, CA. The Anteaters are the Big West Championship defending champions.

Irvine, CA -- The UC Irvine women's golf team will travel to the Peg Barnard Collegiate hosted by Stanford on the Stanford Golf Course Saturday and Sunday (Apr. 12-13).

The tournament field includes defending champion Washington, Oregon State, Montana State, Nevada, Long Beach State, San Jose State, Hawaii, San Francisco, Washington State, Scottish Institute and the host Cardinal.

**April 8, 2003**

#### **UC IRVINE FINISHES 10TH AT BYU/DIXIE CLASSIC**

Irvine, CA - The UC Irvine women's golf team finished in a tie for 10th at the BYU/Dixie Classic at the Sunbrook Golf Course in St. George, UT.

The Anteaters shot a 54-hole total of 934 (299-308-327), tying Washington State for 11th. UNLV won the 22-team tournament with a three shot advantage (906) over San Francisco (909).

Stella Lee led the Anteaters, placing third with a score of 222 (72-71-79). She shot a second round-low of 71, on her way to her fifth top 10 finish of the season. Angela Won was ninth, carding a 226 (71-79-76). She shot a career-low 71 on the first round, the third time she has done that this season. Shelly Raworth tied for 42nd with a three-round total of 236 (75-79-82), tying her season-low of 75 on the first 18. Channing Lovejoy was 93rd with a 251 (82-79-90), while Reana Yun placed 108th at 267 (81-91-95).

### **UC IRVINE WINS ANTEATER INVITATIONAL**

Irvine, CA - The UC Irvine women's golf team won the Anteater Invitational by two stroke over Cal State Northridge at the Coto de Caza Golf and Racquet Club in Coto de Caza, CA Tuesday.

The Anteaters shot a third round total of 310 to finish the tournament with a score of 925 (313-302-310) , two shots ahead of Cal State Northridge 927 (308-311-308). It is the first tournament victory of the season and the third overall for the UCI women's program. Michigan finished fourth at 930 (314-302-313), while Texas Tech, the first day leader shot a final round of 316, to fall to fourth place with a 930 (306-308-316).

Cal State Northridges's Elizabeth Allen shot even par for the tournament (216) to earn medalist honors. UCI's Stella Lee shot a two-under Tuesday to finish in second at 220 (74-76-70).

UCI's Angela Won finished fifth carding a 224 (77-73-74), her third consecutive top five finish. Shelly Raworth placed 10th with a three day total of 231 (75-75-81), the highest finish in her career. Reana Yun was 42nd at 250 (87-78-85), while Channing Lovejoy finished 54th at 255 (89-80-86).

### **UC IRVINE FINISHES SEVENTH AT THE SPARTAN INVITATIONAL; ANGELA WON FINISHES THIRD ([Tournament Results](#))**

Irvine, CA - The UC Irvine women's golf team finished seventh at the Spartan Invitational at the Corral de Tierra Country Club in Salinas, Calif.

Pepperdine won the 14-team tournament with a 846 (275-292-279) followed distantly by UCLA who shot a 882 (283-302-297). The Anteaters were seventh after shooting a 915 (303-304-308) for the 54-hole tournament.

UCI freshman Angela Won (Irvine, CA/University HS) finished in third place for the second consecutive tournament, shooting an even par 72 Wednesday for a three-round total of two-under 214 (71-71-72) Pepperdine's Katherine Hull earned medalist honors after firing a 16-under 200 (63-71-65), including a 63 on the first round and 65 on the final round. Hull's teammate Lindsay Wright was second with a 208 (65-72-71).

UCI's Stella Lee was sixth carding a one-over 73 on each round of the tournament (219). Channing Lovejoy was 55th with a 239 (78-80-81), while Shelly Raworth was 61st after carding a 243 (81-80-82). Freshman Reana Yun was 68th in her first collegiate tournament with a two-day total of 257 (89-81-87).

UCI will host the Anteater Invitational March 10-11 at the Coto de Caza Golf and Raquet Club.

## **November 12, 2002**

### **UC IRVINE FINISHES EIGHTH AT LAS VEGAS COLLEGIATE SHOWDOWN**

HENDERSON, Nev. --- Freshman Angela Won shot an even par 72 to lead UC Irvine to an eighth place finish at the Las Vegas Collegiate Showdown at the Anthem Country Club in Henderson, Nev.

16th-ranked New Mexico won the tournament with a three-day score of 880, nine shots ahead of host UNLV. The Anteaters shot a 302 Wednesday to move up two-spots and finish eighth in the 15-team field with a total of 939 (319-318-302).

New Mexico's Kristi Larsen (75-71-69) won a three-way play-off with Texas A&M's Nicole Melton (76-71-68) and UNLV's Sunny Oh (75-70-70) to earn medalist honors.

Won had three birdies on the day, including one on the final hole to end the tournament with a career-low 72. She shot 232 (83-77-72) over 54 holes to place 23rd. UCI sophomore Stella Lee was three-over Wednesday to end in a tie for 16th place at 229 (76-78-75). Freshman Sara Huber finished in 40th place at 239 (79-82-78), while junior Channing Lovejoy (83-81-78) finished 46th, her highest finish of the year, with a 242. Sophomore Shelly Raworth ended the tournament in 65th position with a three-day total of 248 (81-83-84).

This concludes UCI's fall schedule. The Anteaters return to action February 17-18, 2003 at the Bay Area Classic in Vallejo, Calif.

## **October 30, 2002**

### **UC IRVINE WOMEN'S GOLF FINISHES NINTH AT KENT YUDEL INVITATIONAL**

IRVINE, CA ---The UC Irvine women's golf team finished ninth out of 17 teams at the Kent Youel Invitational at the Kapolei Golf Course in Oahu, HI.

The Anteaters shot 305 Wednesday and ended the 54-hole total with a score of 924 (315-304-305). California won the tournament with a three round score of 870, 18 shots ahead of second place UCLA (888).

After shooting two rounds of even par, Stanford's Kim Rowton shot a one-under 71 Wednesday on her way to earning medalist honors with a 215 (72-72-71).

UCI was led by sophomore Stella Lee who finished in 21st place with a score of 225 (76-73-76). Freshman Angela Won had the low round of the day for the Anteaters shooting a 74 on the final 18. For the tournament, she placed 26th with a 227 (78-75-74). Freshman Sara Huber placed 55th with a score of 236 (81-76-79), sophomore Shelly Raworth finished 61st with a three-day total of 238 (80-80-78) and junior Channing Lovejoy placed 76th with a score of 246 (86-83-77).

The Anteaters close out the fall schedule, traveling to the UNLV Invitational November 11-13.

**ALOHA:** The Anteaters participate in the Rainbow Golf Invitational hosted by the University of Hawaii October 29-30 at the Kapolei Golf Club in Honolulu, HI. The tournament field includes BYU, Texas A&M, San Francisco, New Mexico, UCLA, Southern Illinois, Stanford, Kansas, Texas Tech, California, Northern Arizona, New Mexico State, Oregon, San Diego and Long Beach State. No. 7 New Mexico defends its 2001 title.

**October 8, 2002**

#### **UC IRVINE WOMEN'S GOLF FINISHES SIXTH AT HEATHER FARR MEMORIAL**

Irvine, CA - Sophomore Stella Lee carded a second round low of 70 to help UC Irvine to a sixth place finish at the Heather Farr/University of Colorado Memorial at the Omni Interlocken Resort in Broomfield, CO.

The Anteaters moved up two spots after shooting a 299 Tuesday, the second best score of the day behind champion Denver who totaled a 296 over the last 18 holes and 603 for the tournament. UCI tallied a two-day total of 614 to place sixth. Denver won the 16-team tournament with a one-stroke advantage over Nevada (298-306-604).

Lee finished in fifth place with a two-day total of 148 (78-70), four shots behind medalist Nicole Keller of Idaho (144) who beat Colorado's Erin Kerr in a playoff.

Freshman Angela Won placed 16th at 152 (78-74), while Shelly Raworth was 49th with a 161 (82-79). Freshman Sara Huber ended the tournament at 53rd with a 162 (77-85). After posting an 87 Monday, junior Channing Lovejoy shot a season-low 76 Tuesday to finish 58th with a two day total of 163.
