August 3, 2005

ANGELA WON MISSES CUT FOR MATCH PLAY AT U.S. WOMEN'S AMATEUR

Irvine, Calif. – UC Irvine senior Angela Won (Irvine/University HS) lost in a playoff to miss the cut for match play at the U.S Women's Amateur at the Ansley Golf Club in Roswell, Georgia Wednesday.

Won tied for 60th after shooting a 154 (80-74) during stroke play to finish in an eight-person playoff for the final five match-play spots. Two competitors were eliminated after the first hole before Won was eliminated following the second hole.

July 13, 2005

HENDERSON; WON FALL IN ROUND OF 64 AT US WOMEN'S AMATEUR PUBLIC LINKS

Irvine, Calif. -- UC Irvine sophomore Selaneé Henderson and senior Angela Won advanced to the round of 64 match play at the U.S. Women's Amateur Public Links Championship held July 11-16 at Swope Memorial Golf Course in St. Louis, MO.

Henderson, who shot a two-over 144 to finish 12th during the 36-hole stroke play, lost to Karen Quinn of Australia 3 and 2, while Won lost to Tiffany Chudy from Miramar, Florida (University of Florida) 3 and 2.

July 8, 2005

UCI'S JANE CHIN WINS TITLE OF LONG BEACH WOMEN'S CITY CHAMPIONSHIP

UC Irvine's Jane Chin won the title of the Long Beach Women's City Golf Championship June 22-24. Chin, who will be a sophomore in the fall, had a 54-hole total of 222 (72-76-74) in the tournament that was played at the El Dorado Park, Skylinks and Recreation Park courses.

Anteater seniors-to-be Carling Cho (83-70-73) and Angela Won (80-70-76) tied for third place at 226 while Kim Lorenzana, who will be a sophomore, finished 12th at 236 (80-76-80). UCI's Reana Yun placed 18th at 244 (81-80-83).

UCI won its second Big West Conference title in the past four years in April and finished 18th at the NCAA Championship.

May 20, 2005

UC IRVINE FINISHES 18TH AT NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP; HENDERSON PLACES 27TH

SUNRIVER, Ore. --- The UC Irvine women's golf team, in just its fourth year of existence, finished 18th in the NCAA Championship that concluded Friday at the Sunriver Resort Meadows Course in Sunriver, Ore.

The Anteaters shot 299 Friday and finished with a four-round total of 1,211. Duke won the team title with a total of 1,170, five shots ahead of runner-up UCLA.

UCI freshman Selaneé Henderson shot a 2-over 73 in the final round for a tournament total of 297 and tied for 27th place. Junior Angela Won also fired a 73 Friday and finished 45th at 300. Freshman Jane Chin, with a 76 in the last round, placed 60th at 303, junior Carling Cho had a 77 Friday and finished 103rd with a total of 311, while freshman Kim Lorenzana finished with a round of 82 and a four-day total of 322 for 124th place. Anna Grzebien of Duke was medalist with a total of 2-over 286.

"This was our first time at nationals and we had a top-20 finish. That's quite an accomplishment for our program," UCI head coach Kelly Crawford said. "I am proud of my team, we had an awesome year and the icing on the cake is that they are all coming back."

The Anteaters advanced to the national tournament after winning their second Big West title in four years and placing sixth at the NCAA West Regional.

May 16, 2005

ANTEATERS PARTICIPATE AT NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS: The UC Irvine women's golf team will participate in the NCAA Championships May 17-20 at the Sunriver Resort in Sunriver, Oregon.

The tournament will be played at the Sunriver Resort -The Meadows course.

UCI will join Ohio State, Duke, Furman, Pepperdine, Virginia, Tulane, Florida, Washington, Auburn, Texas A&M, Missouri, Arizona State, Tulsa, Purdue, Michigan State, Arkansas, UCLA, Tennessee, California, USC, Oklahoma State, Brigham Young, Stanford in the tournament field.

The Anteaters will be participating in the NCAA women's golf finals for the first time in school history.

STATE OF MIND: California has six representatives (UC Irvine, UCLA California, Southern California, Pepperdine and Stanford) in the tournament field, the most of any state. Oklahoma (Tulsa and Oklahoma State) is the only other state with more than one team.

ANTEATERS FINISH SIXTH AT WEST REGIONAL: UC Irvine finished in a tie for sixth place at the NCAA West Regional held at the New Mexico State Golf Course to qualify for the NCAA Championship finals.

The Anteaters shot 906 (308-300-298) for the three-day tournament, ending with the team's best round of 298 on the final 18 to move into sixth. The team's round of 300 on the second day was the second best total of the day.

Junior Carling Cho placed 20th with a score of 225 (75-76-74) to lead the Anteaters. Freshman Jane Chin (78-74-74) and freshman Selaneé Henderson (79-74-73) tied for 26th with a 226 total. Junior Angela Won (76-76-77) was 40th after carding a 229, while freshman Kim Lorenzana placed 95th with a score of 242 (84-77-81).

IN THE RANKINGS: UCI is currently ranked 26th in the nation by Golfstat.com. Angela Won is ranked 95th individually by Golfweek.

STATISTICALLY SPEAKING: Freshman Selaneé Henderson is ranked 10th in par 5 scoring (4.86), while the team is seventh (5.01) in the latest Golfstat rankings. UCI is also ranked 10th in

subpar strokes per round (2.08). UCI's freshman class (Henderson, Chin, Lorenzana) are ranked second nationally in freshman class impact.

THREE TITLES IN 2005: UCI won three tournaments in 2005, the most by a team in program history. The Anteaters won the Nittany Lion Invitational in October, the Anteater Invitational in March and the Big West Championship in April. It was the second league title for UCI. Freshman Selaneé Henderson won the Nittany Lion Invitational, becoming the third player in UCI history to take home medalist honors. Stella Lee and Walailak Satarak each won tournaments when they were freshmen in 2002.

WON LEADS: Junior Angela Won, a first team All-Big West selection, leads the team in scoring average at 74.93. Freshmen Selaneé Henderson (75.14) and Jane Chin (76.21) follow Won. Junior Carling Cho owns a 76.89 average, while freshman Kim Lorenzana has a 78.48 mark. Henderson was also a first team All-Big West choice, while Chin and Cho were second team honorees.

UCI GOES LOW IN LAS VEGAS: In November, the Anteaters finished fourth at the Las Vegas Founders Showdown with a final round of 289, the lowest 18-hole score in school history. The team finished the tournament with a 54-hole total of 892 (307-296-289), the best 54-hole total all-time for the Anteaters.

April 19, 2005

FOUR EARN ALL-CONFERENCE HONORS: Selaneé Henderson and Angela Won were named to the All-Big West first team, while Jane Chin and Carling Cho were selected to the second team. It is Won's third consecutive first team honor, becoming the only Anteater player to earn the distinction three times. She is one of seven Big West players all-time to earn three first team honors.

April 19, 2005

UC IRVINE WINS BIG WEST CHAMPIONSHIP

Rancho Santa Margarita, Calif. – The UC Irvine women's golf team won the Big West Championship title by 20 strokes Tuesday at the Tijeras Creek Golf Club.

UCI had a three-round total of 894 (299-296-299) and was the only team to stay under 300 on every round. The Anteaters bested second place Long Beach State by 20 strokes as the Forty-Niners ended the tournament with a score of 914 (306-308-300). Idaho was third (924), Cal Poly was fourth (966), Cal State Northridge finished fifth (966) while UC Riverside was sixth (1000). Idaho's Renee Skidmore won the individual title with a score of 214 (70-69-75).

It's is UCI's second Big West women's golf title, as the Anteaters also won the 2002 crown. It is the third tournament victory of the year for UCI, capturing the Nittany Lion Invitational in October and the Anteater Invitational in March.

All five Anteaters finished in the top 10 led by freshman Selaneé Henderson's second place finish. She shot a 3-over 219 (70-75-74) for the tournament. Junior Angela Won finished fourth with a two-day total of 224 (75-75-74), while freshman Jane Chin (82-74-74) and junior Carling Cho (78-72-80) tied for seventh, carding three-round totals of 230. Freshman Kim Lorenzana recorded a score of 233 (76-80-77) to place 10th, her best finish of the season.

Henderson and Won were named to the All-Big West first team, while Chin and Cho were selected to the second team. It is Won's third consecutive first team honor, becoming the only Anteater player to earn the distinction three times.

March 16, 2005

UC IRVINE WINS ANTEATER INVITATIONAL

Irvine, Calif. -- UC Irvine had four golfers in the top 10 to help capture the third annual Anteater Women's Golf Invitational at the Coto de Caza Golf Club in Coto de Caza Wednesday.

The Anteaters led from start to finish, posting a three-round total of 905 (295-308-302) to claim the team title. UCI also won the title in 2003. It is the second tournament win of the year for UCI as they won the Nittany Lion Invitational in October.

The Anteaters finished eight shots ahead of Boise State who had a score of 913 (306-305-302). Colorado State was third with a 924 (304-313-307), while Colorado was fourth at 943 (322-308-313) and Long Beach State was fifth with a two-day total of 946 (315-317-314). Boise State's Ashley Hogg earned medalist honors after carding a tournament record 69 on the final round. She had a three round total of even par 216 (73-74-69).

UCI placed four golfers in the top 10 led by sophomore Angela Won who was second at 221 (74-74-73). It is Won's best finish of the year after placing third at the Bay Area Classic. Freshman Selanee Henderson was third with a score of 224 (71-79-74). Freshman Jane Chin was seventh, her third top 10 finish of the year. She shot a 229 (72-79-78) for the tournament. Sophomore Minnie Choi had her best showing of the year at ninth with a score of 231 (78-76-77). Junior Carling Cho was 37th with a 246 (84-79-83).

Playing individually, UCI freshman Kim Lorenzana was 14th at 233 (76-79-78), while Shelly Raworth was 31st (80-83-77-240) and Reana Yun was 55th at 256 (86-80-90).

March 3, 2005

WON NAMED BIG WEST GOLFER OF MONTH

IRVINE, Calif. --- UC Irvine junior Angela Won has been selected as the Big West Conference Female Golfer of the Month for February.

Won shot the lowest round in the Bay Area Classic at Boulder Ridge in San Jose with a 3-under 69 to tie for third in the tournament. The round of 69 tied her career-best mark.

November 17, 2004

JANE CHIN NAMED BIG WEST FEMALE GOLFER OF THE MONTH

Irvine, Calif. -- UC Irvine golfer Jane Chin has been named Big West Female Golfer of the Month for November.

The freshman shot a career and tournament-low 67 on the final round of the Las Vegas Founders Collegiate Showdown, ending the tournament with a career-best 219 (76-76-67). She finished seventh at that event, her second top 10 showing of the fall. Her 67 was a team low for the season and matches the program's all-time low of 67 set by Walailak Satarak in 2001. Chin led UCI to a fourth place finish at the Las Vegas Showdown and helped the Anteaters to a final round

of 289, the lowest 18-hole score in school history. The team ended the tournament with a 54-hole total of 892 (307-296-289), the best 54-hole total all-time for UCI.

The league announced the award early due to the completion of fall competition for all schools.

November 11, 2004

UCI CRACKS TOP 25; FRESHMAN CLASS RANKED THIRD BEST

Irvine, Calif. -- The UC Irvine women's golf team is currently ranked 24th nationally by Golfstat.com, while the freshman class of Selanee Henderson, Jane Chin and Kim Lorenzana are ranked third in Golfstat's Freshman Class Impact Ranking.

UCI junior Angela Won ranks third in fairways hit with a .929 average.

ANTEATERS WIN NITTANY LION INVITATIONAL; HENDERSON IS MEDALIST: The UC Irvine women's golf team won the Nittany Lion Invitational at the Penn State Blue Course. The Anteaters won the tournament with the second best 54-hole score in the event's history, a 296-298-303-897. It is the first tournament title of the season and the fourth in UCI history. UCI's last tournament win was in 2003 when the team captured the Anteater Invitational on March 11. UCI finished five strokes ahead of second place College of Charleston (902).

Freshman Selanee' Henderson shot a 4-over par 220 (75-72-73), including a team-low 73 on the final round to win her first individual title. The freshman becomes the third Anteater player to win an individual title and is the first since Stella Lee won the Big West Championships on April 23, 2002. Walailak Satarak won three tournament titles in 2002 for UCI's most career tournament wins. Lee and Satarak were also freshmen when they won medalist honors.

Four of the five Anteaters finished in the top 10 as junior Carling Cho was fifth, carding a 225 (73-76-76) and junior Angela Won (73-74-79) and freshman Jane Chin (75-76-75) tied for sixth with a total of 226. It is Cho and Chin's first top 10 finishes at UCI and Won's eighth consecutive top 10 ranking. Freshman Kim Lorenzana had her first career top 20 finish, placing 12th with a three-round total of 231 (75-76-80).

November 3, 2004

CHIN LEADS UC IRVINE WOMEN'S GOLF TO FOURTH PLACE FINISH AT LAS VEGAS FOUNDERS COLLEGIATE SHOWDOWN ON RECORD-SETTING DAY

Henderson, Nevada-- The UC Irvine women' golf team finished fourth out of 17 teams with a record setting performance at the Las Vegas Founders Collegiate Showdown at the Anthem Country Club in Henderson, Nevada.

"It was really fun to play our best golf," head coach Kelly Crawford said. "We are close to really breaking through. We left some things out on the course today and there are some things we can work on, but we look forward to keeping the momentum going into the spring and then hopefully on to post-season play."

Freshman Jane Chin shot a career and tournament-low 67 on the final round to help the Anteaters move into fourth place with a 54-hole total of 892 (307-296-289), the best 54-hole total all-time for the Anteaters. The team's final round of 289 is the lowest 18-hole score in school history.

Chin tied USC's Veronica Felibert who also shot a 67 on the final round. The freshman shot a career-low 219 (76-76-67), finishing seventh, her second career top 10 showing. Chin's 67 is a team low for the season and matches the program's all-time low of 67 set by Walialak Satarak Oct. 9, 2001 at the Omni Interlocken Golf Course in Broomfield, Colo.

UNLV won the tournament with a three-day score of 875 (296-292-287), holding off fourth-ranked Washington, who shot an eight-under 280 Wednesday to end the tournament five shots off the pace at 880 (294-306-280). No. 18 Stanford was third (301-298-291-890). The 47th-ranked Anteaters finished in front of No. 10 Missouri (8th,900), No. 24 USC (9th,902) and No. 28 California (13th, 920).

Freshman Selanee Henderson placed 17th with a score of 223 (74-72-77), while junior Angela Won shot a one-under 71 on the final 18 to move to 20th with a total of 224 (79-74-71). Junior Carling Cho was 27th after carding a 226 (78-74-74) and freshman Kim Lorenzana was 73rd with a score of 240 (84-78-78).

UNLV's Hwanhee Lee was the only player to shoot under par for the tournament with a 215 (74-71-70), earning medalist honors.

GOLFWEED RANKS ANTEATERS 30TH IN PRESEASON POLL

Irvine, Calif. -- The UC Irvine women's golf team was ranked 30th in Golfweek's pre-season top 30, while Selanee Henderson was tabbed as a "Freshman to Watch". Henderson, from Apple Valley, was a quarterfinalist at the 2004 U.S. Girls' Junior and advanced to the second round of the U.S. Women's Amateur Public Links.

Junior Angela Won had the 26th best scoring average (73.63) among the nation's top returnees. She ended the year ranked 48th in the Golfweek/Sagarin College Ranking and was a first team All-Big West honoree. Won became the second UCI player to qualify for the NCAA Championships.
