### **REANA YUN HONORED AS A SCHOLAR-ATHLETE**

Irvine, Calif. -- Reana Yun was among the 152 student-athletes honored by UC Irvine as 2005-06 Big West Conference Scholar-Athletes at the program's annual banquet at the Crowne Plaza Hotel.

This year's list brings UCI's total to 2,731 conference scholar-athletes since 1983.

Requirements for this award include maintaining a 3.0 grade-point average (GPA) over three quarters or a 3.2 GPA over two quarters for freshmen. Student-athletes must also earn letters in their sports. The Scholar-Athlete award was implemented by the Big West Conference to honor those student-athletes that have maintained a high level of scholastic excellence while participating in intercollegiate athletics.

### **UC IRVINE FINISHES 9TH AT NCAA WEST REGIONAL; JUST MISSES ADVANCING TO NCAA FINALS**

**AUBURN, Wash.** --- The UC Irvine women's golf team finished ninth in the NCAA West Regional that concluded Saturday at Washington National Golf Club in Auburn, Wash.

UCI finished with a 54-hole total of 913, just two strokes shy of eighth-place Arkansas (911). The top eight teams advance to the NCAA Finals at Ohio State May 23-26. Purdue won the regional with a three-round total of 881, UCLA was second at 887 and Washington finished third at 888.

Washington's Paige Mackenzie won medalist honors by eight shots as she finished with a 54-hole total of 8-under par 208 (68-69-71).

UCI senior Angela Won finished 24th at 226 (75-75-76), sophomore Jane Chin was 32nd at 228 (74-78-76) and sophomore Selaneé Henderson placed 37th at 230 (76-81-73). Senior Carling Cho finished 40th at 231 (76-80-75) and sophomore Kim Lorenzana was 81st at 240 (77-79-84).

**May 8, 2006**

**UC IRVINE COMPETES AT NCAA WEST REGIONAL:** The UC Irvine women's golf team competes in the NCAA West Regional Thursday-Saturday (May 11-13) at the Washington National Golf Club in Auburn, Wash.

Live scoring for the NCAA West Regional will be available at [www.golfstat.com](http://www.golfstat.com).

The Anteaters are one of 21 teams in the West Regional. UCI earned an automatic berth with its Big West title last week. This is the Anteaters' second consecutive trip to the regional and third in the five-year existence of the program at UCI.

The top eight teams, plus the top two individuals not on those teams, from the three regional sites advance to the NCAA Championships May 23-26 hosted by Ohio State on the Scarlet Course. UCI finished sixth in last year's West Regional and went on to finish 18th at the NCAA Finals.

**May 1, 2006**

**UC IRVINE PREPARES FOR NCAA WEST REGIONAL:** The UC Irvine women's golf team will travel to the NCAA West Regional May 11-13 at the Washington National Golf Club in Las Auburn, Wash. The Anteaters are one of 21 teams in the West Regional as the selections were announced Monday. UCI earned an automatic berth with its Big West title last week.

The top eight teams, plus the top two individuals not on those teams, from the three regional sites advance to the NCAA Championships May 23-26 hosted by Ohio State on the Scarlet Course. UCI finished sixth in last year's West Regional and went on to finish 18th at the NCAA Finals.

**ANTEATERS WIN BIG WEST CHAMPIONSHIP IN BIG WAY:** UC Irvine won its second consecutive Big West Conference title with a dominant 43-shot victory at Tijeras Creek Golf Club April 24-25. The championship was UCI's third in the five years of the program's existence.

The Anteaters finished with a 54-hole total of 886 (294-297-295), 43 strokes ahead of second place Long Beach State (929). UC Riverside was third (941), Cal State Northridge was fourth (957) and Cal Poly finished fifth (962).

It is UCI's third tournament win of the year, capturing the title at the Nittany Lion Invitational in October and the Fresno State Invitational in February. It is the ninth tournament win in program history.

Head coach Kelly Crawford was honored as the 2006 Big West Coach of the Year. Crawford was also named Coach of the Year in 2002.

All five UCI players finished in the top 10, led by Selanee Henderson, who won the tournament with a score of 219 (69-75-75). She is the second UCI player to win the Big West Championship individual title, following Stella Lee who earned medalist honors in 2002. It is Henderson's second tournament win of the year and third in her career. The sophomore ties Walialak Satarak for the most individual titles (3) in program history.

Sophomore Jane Chin finished second, one shot behind Henderson at 220 (76-74-70). Chin carded a 70 on the final round, the best score of the day. Senior Carling Cho was fourth with a two-day total of 225 (75-73-77), while senior Angela Won was tied for fifth with a three round score of 226 (78-75-73). Sophomore Kim Lorenzana finished 10th with a score of 233 (74-80-79).

**HENDERSON NAMED PLAYER OF THE YEAR:** Selanee Henderson was named Big West Women's Golfer of the Year. Henderson joins Walialak Satarak as the only two UCI players to have received Player of the Year distinction. Henderson leads the team with a 74.11 scoring average and was named Big West Co-Player of the Month twice this season.

Senior Angela Won and sophomore Kim Lorenzana were named first-team All-Big West, while Jane Chin and Carling Cho were second team All-Big West honorees. Won becomes only the second player in Big West women's golf history to be named to the first team four consecutive years.

**April 25, 2006**

**UC IRVINE DOMINATES BIG WEST CHAMPIONSHIPS; SELANEE HENDERSON EARNS MEDALIST HONORS AND PLAYER OF THE YEAR AWARD**

Rancho Santa Margarita, Calif. -- The UC Irvine women's golf team won its second consecutive Big West Conference title with a dominant 43-shot victory in the tournament that concluded

Tuesday at Tijeras Creek Golf Club in Rancho Santa Margarita. The championship was UCI's third in the five years of the program's existence.

The Anteaters finished with a 54-hole total of 886 (294-297-295), 43 strokes ahead of second place Long Beach State (929). UC Riverside was third (941), Cal State Northridge was fourth (957) and Cal Poly finished fifth (962).

It is UCI's third tournament win of the year, capturing the title at the Nittany Lion Invitational in October and the Fresno State Invitational in February. It is the ninth tournament win in program history.

Head coach Kelly Crawford was honored as the 2006 Big West Coach of the Year. Crawford was also named Coach of the Year in 2002.

All five UCI players finished in the top 10 led by Selaneé Henderson who was named Big West Player of the Year and won the tournament with a score of 219 (69-75-75). She is the second UCI player to win the Big West Championship individual title, following Stella Lee who won medalist honors in 2002 and joins Wailalak Satarak (2002) as the only two Anteaters to be named Player of the Year. It is Henderson's second tournament win of the year and third in her career.

Sophomore Jane Chin finished second, one shot behind Henderson at 220 (76-74-70). Chin carded a 70 on the final round, the best score of the day. Chin was named second team All-Big West.

Senior Carling Cho was fourth with a two-day total of 225 (75-73-77), while senior Angela Won was tied for fifth with a three round score of 226 (78-75-73). Cho was named to the All-Big West second team and Won was named to the first team. Won becomes only the second player in Big West women's golf history to be named to the first team four consecutive years.

Sophomore Kim Lorenzana finished 10th with a score of 233 (74-80-79). Lorenzana was named first-team All-Big West, her first conference honor.

### **April 18, 2006**

**ANTEATERS AT BIG WEST CHAMPIONSHIPS:** UC Irvine is will participate in the Big West Championships next Monday and Tuesday (April 24-25) at the Tijeras Creek Golf Course in Rancho Santa Margarita, CA.

The Anteaters are the defending champions. UCI also won the conference title in 2002.

Last year, all five Anteaters finished in the top 10 led by Selaneé Henderson's second place finish. Angela Won finished fourth, while Jane Chin and Carling Cho tied for seventh. Kim Lorenzana was 10th.

UC Irvine has won two tournament titles this season, claiming the Nittany Lion Invitational in October and the Fresno State Invitational in February. Selaneé Henderson earned medalist honors at the Fresno Invitational, her second career win. Henderson has been named Big West Co-Golfer of the Month twice this year.

**April 9, 2006**

#### **UC IRVINE FINISHES SEVENTH AT PEG BERNARD COLLEGIATE**

Stanford, Calif. -- The UC Irvine women's golf team carded a 36-hole total of 612 to finish seventh at the Peg Bernard Collegiate at the Stanford Golf Course Sunday.

The Anteaters shot a 303 on the final round to finish with a two day total of 612 (309-303) and seventh place.

USC won the tournament with a score of 588 (298-290), two shots ahead of California (590). Host Stanford was third (592), Ohio State fourth (601), Washington State fifth (606) and San Jose State sixth (608).

UCI senior Angela Won was tied for 13th after firing a 149 (74-75). Sophomore Selanee Henderson shot a 74 on the final 18 and moved up to 26th with a total of 152 (78-74). Sophomore Jane Chin finished in 38th place with a score of 155 (77-78), while sophomore Kim Lorenzana was 42nd with a score of 156 (80-76). Senior Carling Cho carded a 162 (80-82) for 63rd place.

The Anteaters await the Big West Championships April 24-25 at Tijeras Creek.

**April 6, 2006**

#### **UC IRVINE TRAVELS TO PEG BARNARD COLLEGIATE**

Irvine, Calif. -- The UC Irvine women's golf team will travel to the Peg Barnard Collegiate Saturday and Sunday (Apr. 8-9) at the Stanford Golf Course.

The 14-team field will play 18 holes each day on the 6,168 yard, par 72 course. Both days will feature a shotgun start for the squads, beginning at 8:30 a.m. on Saturday and 8 a.m. on Sunday.

Joining host Stanford are California, Hawaii, Fresno State, Denver, Long Beach State, Ohio State, San Francisco, Oregon State, Portland State, San Jose State, Washington State and Santa Clara.

**April 4, 2006**

#### **UC IRVINE WOMEN'S GOLF FINISHES SIXTH AT NORTHWESTERN INVITATIONAL**

Rancho Mirage, Calif. – The UC Irvine women's golf team finished sixth at the Northwestern Invitational held at the Gary Player Signature Course at the Westin Mission Hills Resort.

The Anteaters shot a final round of 298 to end with a 54-hole score of 889 (301-290-298). Kent State won the title with a two day total of 847 (279-276-292), 11 shots in front of Southern Methodist (288-291-279-858). Kent State's Tara Delaney and Kira Meixner finished with 7-under 209's, but Delaney on the strength of her final-round 71 was declared the tournament champion.

Sophomore Jane Chin shot even par 72 Tuesday and led UCI with a 222 (77-73-72) good for 24th place. Sophomore Kim Lorenzana placed 27th with a three-round score of 223 (75-72-76), while sophomore Selanee Henderson (74-75-75), senior Angela Won (77-72-75) and senior carling Cho (75-73-76) all tied for 30th after carding a 224.

UCI will travel to Stanford this weekend for the Peg Barnard California Collegiate Saturday and Sunday.

### **April 3, 2006**

**ANTEATERS AT NORTHWESTERN INVITATIONAL:** UC Irvine will participate in the inaugural Northwestern Invitational Monday and Tuesday (Apr. 3-4) at the Westin Mission Hills Resort in Rancho Mirage, Calif. The tournament will be played on a Gary Player Signature Course.

The tournament field consists of Baylor, Colorado, Iowa State, Kent State, Michigan, Michigan State, Northern Illinois, Penn State, SMU, TCU, Texas, Western Michigan and host Northwestern.

**ANTEATERS PLACE SECOND AT ANTEATER INVITATIONAL:** UC Irvine finished second at the Anteater Invitational at the Santa Ana Country Club last time out.

Host UC Irvine shot the best round of the tournament on the final 18 posting a 308, but it was not enough to catch BYU who won the event with a score of 942. The Anteaters had a three round total of 947 (317-322-308).

BYU's Rachel Newren earned medalist honors after shooting a 229 (78-76-75).

UC Irvine's Selanné Henderson (75-80-77) and Jane Chin (78-79-75) tied for second at 232. Newren and Chin were the only two players to score in the 70s in each round.

Senior Angela Won was 10th with a three round total of 240 (83-80-77), while Kim Lorenzana was 13th with a score of 244 (82-83-79). Senior Reana Yun shot an 82 on the first round then inadvertently turned in an incorrect scorecard on the second round and was disqualified from the individual competition. She carded an 85 on the final round. Playing as an individual, senior Carling Cho was tied for 13th with a score of 244 (85-74-85).

### **March 21, 2006**

#### **BYU CAPTURES ANTEATER INVITATIONAL; UCI FINISHES SECOND**

Irvine, Calif. – The Brigham Young women's golf team captured the 2006 Anteater Invitational at the Santa Ana Country Club Tuesday.

The Cougars shot a 312 on the final round and finished with a score of 942 (315-315-312) over 54 holes. Host UC Irvine shot the best round of the tournament Tuesday posting a 308, but it was not enough to catch BYU. The Anteaters finished second with a score of 947 (317-322-308). Nevada was third with a score of 974 (320-328-326) and Penn State was fourth with a three-round total of 979 (325-327-327). Georgetown moved up to fifth place after posting a 317 on the final round and ended the tournament with a score of 990 (345-328-317). Montana was sixth at

996 (328-329-339), Northern Colorado was seventh with a total of 1039 (347-342-350) and Dartmouth was eighth at 1044 (353-340-351).

BYU's Rachel Newren earned medalist honors after shooting a 229 (78-76-75). UC Irvine's Selanne Henderson (75-80-77) and Jane Chin (78-79-75) tied for second at 232. Newren and Chin were the only two players to score in the 70s in each round. BYU's Juli Wightman carded a 72 on the final round, the only player to shoot par for the tournament and finished fourth with a score of 234 (81-81-72).

For UCI, senior Angela Won was 10th with a three round total of 240 (83-80-77), while Kim Lorenzana was 13th with a score of 244 (82-83-79). Senior Reana Yun shot an 82 on the first round then inadvertently turned in an incorrect scorecard on the second round and was disqualified from the individual competition. **ANTEATERS PLACE SECOND AT SPARTAN INVITATIONAL:** UC Irvine finished second at the Spartan Invitational at the Castlewood Country Club last week.

The Anteaters moved from fourth to second after shooting a 299, the low round of the final day, to end with a 36-hole total of 615 (316-299). UCI finished four shots behind host San Jose State who recorded a two-day score of 611 (309-302).

Sophomore Selaneé Henderson shot even par 72 on the final 18 to place second with a two day total of 149 (77-72). Henderson was the only player other than medalist Laura Luethke of Fresno State to match or go under par on the final round. Senior Angela Won tied for third with a score of 151 (78-73), while sophomore Kim Lorenzana was 13th, her best showing of the year with a 156 (79-77). Senior Carling Cho rebounded after shooting an 85 on the first 18 to post a 77 on the final day and finish 28th with a score of 162. Sophomore Jane Chin carded a pair of 82s and finished 37th with a total of 164.

**GOLFWEK RECOGNIZES ANTEATERS:** Following UCI's title at the Fresno State Invitational, sophomore Selaneé Henderson was named Golfweek's Women's Player of the Week, while the Anteaters were also honored as Women's Team of the Week. Henderson was also honored as Big West Golfer of the Month for February.

## **UCI FINISHES SECOND AT SPARTAN INVITATIONAL**

San Jose, Calif. -- The UC Irvine women's golf team shot a 299, the low round of the day, to finish in second place at the Spartan Invitational at the Castlewood Country Club Tuesday.

The Anteaters moved from fourth to second after shooting the 299 Tuesday, ending with a 36-hole total of 615 (316-299). UCI finished four shots behind host San Jose State who recorded a two-day score of 611 (309-302). Fresno State finished third (620), San Francisco was fourth (625) and UC Davis was fifth (629).

Laura Luethke of Fresno State shot the low score of the final round and of the tournament with a two-under par 70 to earn medalist honors in the 58-player field.

Sophomore Selaneé Henderson shot even par 72 on the final 18 to place second with a two day total of 149 (77-72). Henderson was the only player other than Luethke to match or go under par on the final round. Senior Angela Won tied for third with a score of 151 (78-73), while sophomore Kim Lorenzana was 13th, her best showing of the year with a 156 (79-77). Senior Carling Cho rebounded after shooting an 85 on the first 18 to post a 77 on the final day and finish 28th with a score of 162. Sophomore Jane Chin carded a pair of 82s and finished 37th with a total of 164.

UCI has competed in two tournaments this spring finishing with a first and a second. The Anteaters will host the Anteater Invitational March 20-21 at the Santa Ana Country Club.

## **UC IRVINE WOMEN'S GOLF WINS FRESNO STATE INVITATIONAL; HENDERSON EARNS MEDALIST HONORS**

Fresno, Calif. – The UC Irvine women's golf team captured the 19-team Fresno State Invitational with two-round total of five-under 571 (285-286) at the Copper River Country Club Tuesday.

The 36-hole total of 571 is a school record, with Monday's round of 285, the lowest 18-hole total in program history and Tuesday round of 286 the second lowest. The scores beat the previous school mark of 289 set last year in Las Vegas.

It is the second tournament win of the season for the Anteaters (Nittany Lion Invitational in October) and eighth overall for the program.

Long Beach State came in second (296-284-580) and New Mexico State (294-302 - 596) placed third.

UCI sophomore Selaneé Henderson won the individual title with a score of 137 (67-70). Her first round score of 67 was tied for the best in school history with Jane Chin (2004) and Waiialak Satarak (2001). It is her second career tournament win.

Senior Angela Won finished in a tie for third with a score of 145 (71-74), her best finish of the season. Sophomore Jane Chin, who had a hole in one on the eighth hole Monday, placed sixth with a two round total of 146 (73-73). Sophomore Kim Lorenzana carded a 150 (74-76) to finish 27th, while senior Carling Cho posted a team-low and career best 69 Tuesday and finished with a 36-hole score 152 (83-69) in 39th place.

Next, the Anteaters will travel to the Spartan Invitational March 6-8 in Monterey, Calif.

## **UC IRVINE TRAVELS TO FRESNO STATE TOURNAMENT TO OPEN SPRING SCHEDULE**

Irvine, Calif. -- The UC Irvine women's golf team starts the spring schedule participating in the Kitahara Fresno State Invitational on Monday and Tuesday (Feb. 27-28) at Copper River Country Club. Monday's play begins with 9:30 a.m. tee times while Tuesday's tee times start at 8 a.m. for the second and final round.

The tournament field consists of Boise State, Cal Poly, Colorado, Colorado State, Denver, Fresno State, Hawaii, Idaho, Long Beach State, Nevada, New Mexico State, Oregon, Oregon State, Sacramento, San Diego State, San Francisco, San Jose State, UC Davis and UC Irvine. Individuals from UCLA and Fresno State will also compete.

### **November 12, 2005**

**ANTEATERS CONCLUDE FALL SCHEDULE:** UC Irvine concluded the fall schedule going 0-2 at the Match Play Championship at the Mission Inn Golf and Tennis Resort in Howey-in-the Hills, Fla.

The Anteaters lost 3-1-1 to UCLA in the first match then fell to Washington 4-1-0 in the second match.

Sophomore Jane Chin was the only UCI player to win a match, defeating UCLA's Ryann O'Toole and Washington's Sung Ea Lee. Chin won both matches 3-2.

**NEXT:** The Anteaters will participate in the Fresno Invitational Feb. 27-28 to begin the spring season. UCI is the defending Big West Champion.

**TOURNAMENT WIN HIGHLIGHTS FALL:** UC Irvine won the Nittany Lion Invitational for the second consecutive year. UCI trailed Penn State by one stroke after the first day and shot a 298, the low round of the tournament on the final 18 to capture the title with a 36-hole total of 600.

It was UC Irvine's seventh tournament title all-time and first of the 2005-06 season.

Sophomore Selaneé Henderson finished second at the Nittany Lion Invitational, the team's best individual showing of the year. It was Henderson's seventh career top 10 finish. She also placed third at the Ron Moore Intercollegiate and 10th at the Oregon State Invitational this fall and leads the squad in scoring average at 74.00.

### **HENDERSON NAMED BIG WEST CO-PLAYER OF THE MONTH FOR OCTOBER**

Irvine, Calif. -- Sophomore Selaneé Henderson was named October's Big West co-Golfer of the Month with Long Beach State's Kay Hoey.

Henderson placed second at the Nittany Lion Invitational while leading the Anteaters to a second consecutive tournament title. Henderson also placed third earlier in the month at the Ron Moore Intercollegiate in Highlands Ranch, Colorado.

**UCI CAPTURES NITTANY LION TITLE:** UC Irvine won the Penn State Nittany Lion Invitational at the Penn State White Course.

The Anteaters successfully defended their title with a 36-hole total of 600 (302-298), one stroke ahead of host Penn State (601). UCI trailed the Nittany Lions by one stroke after the first day and shot a 298, the low round of the tournament on the final 18 to capture the title.

It was UC Irvine's seventh tournament title all-time and first of the 2005-06 season.

Penn State's Maggie Lester won medalist honors shooting a 144 (74-70). Lester, who shot a 70 on the final 18 holes, the low round of the tournament, finished two shots ahead of UCI's Selaneé Henderson who carded a 146 (73-73). It was Henderson's best finish of the season and her seventh career top 10 finish. The sophomore led the tournament field with six birdies.

Senior Angela Won tied for fourth after shooting a 148 (73-75) and senior Carling Cho tied for eighth with a score of 150 (77-73). Sophomore Kim Lorenzana finished in a tie for 30th with a score of 158 (79-79) and senior Reana Yun was tied for 34th with a total of 159 (82-77). Sophomore Jane Chin played as an individual and shot a 155 (75-80) and tied for 22nd.

### **October 10, 2005**

**ANTEATERS DEFEND TITLE NEXT:** The UC Irvine women's golf team will travel to the Nittany Lion Invitational October 15-16 at the Penn State White Course.

Due to a scheduling conflict, this year's event will only be 36 holes, playing 18 on Saturday and 18 on Sunday.

Participating teams include Maryland, Western Michigan, Bucknell, Indiana, Princeton, Georgetown, Rollins, William & Mary, James Madison, Yale, Marshall, St. Francis, Monmouth and host Penn State.

The Anteaters look to defend last year's title, winning the tournament with the second best 54-hole score in the event's history, a 296-298-303-897.

Selaneé Henderson shot a 4-over par 220 (75-72-73), including a team-low 73 on the final round to win her first individual title. She is the third Anteater women's player to win medalist honors. Other Anteater finishes included Carling Cho in fifth place (225-73-76-76), Angela Won (226-73-74-79) and Jane Chin (226-75-76-75) tying for sixth and Kim Lorenzana recording her first career top 20 finish, placing 12th (231-75-76-80).

**UCI FINISH FOURTH AT RON MOORE INTERCOLLEGIATE:** UC Irvine finished fourth at the Ron Moore Intercollegiate held at the Highlands Ranch Golf Club in Highlands Ranch, Colo.

The Anteaters shot a final round of 310 to end the two day tournament with a score of 905 (291-304-310). Tournament host Denver ran away with the title, shooting a 289 on the final round to finish with an 880 total.
