SERIES VS. ST. JOHN'S

This is just the 10th meeting between UCLA and St. John's with the Red Storm leading the series 6-3. UCLA is 2-3 all-time at St. John's with the two road wins coming in the first two games of the series in 1955 (93-86) and 1968 (74-56). The Bruins have lost the last three meetings at St. John's, including in 1984 (69-88), 1986 (63-70) and in 2004 (55-71). UCLA won last year's meeting in Pauley Pavilion, 66-59, on Feb. 5, 2011. The game marked the return of former Bruin Head Coach Steve Lavin to UCLA. Joshua Smith led the Bruins with a then-career-high 19 points and added eight rebounds. Reeves Nelson had a double-double of 12 points and a career-best 17 boards. St. John's was led by Dwight Hardy's 32 points. He was the only member of the Red Storm to reach double figures in scoring. UCLA used a 40-28 rebounding edge and a 27-5 made free throw advantage to seal the victory. Head Coach Ben Howland is 2-2 all-time against St. John's.

HEAD COACH BEN HOWLAND ON THE NATIONAL CHARTS

Ben Howland earned his 300th victory of his career with the 72-54 win over DePaul in the 15th Annual John R. Wooden Classic (Dec. 13, 2008). He is currently 372-192 (.660), which ranks 35th on the winningest active coaches list by percentage and 50th on the active list by victories. Howland's first career victory was his first game at Northern Arizona in 1994, a 71-69 victory over New Mexico Highlands. His 100th career victory came in his second season at Pittsburgh in the 77-65 win at home over Seton Hall (Jan. 13, 2001). His 200th win came in his third season at UCLA with the 56-37 home win over Delaware State (Nov. 19, 2005). Howland is 19-9 (.679) in the NCAA Tournament (15-6 (.714) at UCLA).

BRUINS' INJURY REPORT

Sophomore center Anthony Stover missed practice on Feb. 10 and the California game (Feb. 11) with tendonitis in his left foot. He was able to practice for an hour on Monday (Feb. 13) and complete a full practice on Tuesday. He didn't play against USC (Feb. 15) due to a coaches decision and is listed as probable for the Bruins' game on Feb. 18 at St. John's.

YOU SHOULD KNOW ...

UCLA has four McDonald's All-Americans on its 2011-12 roster in senior guard Larry Drew II (2008), sophomore forwards Travis and David Wear (2009) and sophomore center Joshua Smith (2010).

UCLA is the all-time leader (since 1948) in NBA Draft picks with 108, followed by Kentucky (102), North Carolina (101) and Duke (77).

The Bruins have had at least one NBA Draft pick in 14 of the last 15 years (none in 2010) and 22 overall picks during that span, including eight first-round selections.

UCLA has produced 12 NBA Draft picks in Ben Howland's eight seasons (entering his ninth year), including six first-rounders. Additionally, Howland has had multiple draft picks in the same year in four of his eight seasons, including a high of three (two lottery picks in Russell Westbrook and Kevin Love and a second-round selection in Luc Richard Mbah a Moute) in 2008.

The Bruins were ranked in the Associated Press Poll for 75 straight weeks (from the 2005-06 preseason poll to the final poll of the 2008-09

season). That streak was the longest in the nation at the time. The Bruins were never ranked at any time during the 2009-10 and 2010-11 seasons. UCLA was ranked No. 17 in the AP Poll and at No. 20 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll to start the 2011-12 campaign.

In the last seven years in Pacific-12 Conference play, UCLA is 37-24 (.607) on the road (37-17 everywhere, excluding Seattle) and 49-11 (.817) at home.

In the last seven years, Head Coach Ben Howland and UCLA are 46-8 (.852) in the first game of a two-game Pac-12 weekend series and 32-22 (.593) in the second game (this doesn't include USC and non-conference weekends). The Bruins had won 32 consecutive games opening a Pac-10 weekend series until a loss at Arizona State (Feb. 12, 2009). Overall, UCLA is 56-14 (.800) in the opening game of a weekend series, but just 38-32 (.543) in the second game.

UCLA has held 101 opponents under 60 points in the Ben Howland era (in 9th season) and is 98-3 (.970) in those contests.

UCLA's scoring defense of 66.3 ppg in 2010-11 was the second highest only to the 2009-10 season's average of 68.6 ppg in the last six years. UCLA allowed fewer than 60 points per game in the three seasons it reached the Final Four (59.0 in 2008, 59.9 in 2007 and 58.7 in 2006).

Ben Howland was the first UCLA coach since John Wooden to win three straight conference championships (2006-08) and is the only other coach at UCLA other than Wooden (nine) to make three straight trips to the Final Four.

UCLA set a school record for most wins in a three-year span with 97 from 2005-08 (35 in 2007-08, 30 in 2006-07 and 32 in 2005-06). UCLA compiled a record of 97-17 (.851) over that span (2005-06 to 2007-08). The previous high was 89 wins set in 1970-71 to 1972-73.

With its win over Texas A&M in the second round of the 2008 NCAA Tournament, UCLA won its 33rd game, which was the most in school history (UCLA ended the season with 35 wins). The old mark of 32 was set by the 1995 national championship team and was later tied in 2006.

NOTES AND STREAKS

UCLA became one of only three schools in the history of college basketball to win 30 or more games in three straight seasons (2006-08). The Bruins join Kentucky (1947-49/Adolph Rupp), Kentucky (1996-98/Rick Pitino (2)/Tubby Smith (1)) and Memphis (2006-08/John Calipari) as the only programs to accomplish that feat. This also means that head coach Ben Howland is just one of three coaches in college basketball history to win at least 30 games in three consecutive seasons (joining Rupp and Calipari).

UCLA became the Pacific-10 Conference's 7th No. 1 seed for the NCAA Tournament in 2008 and became the first one seed from the Pac-10 to reach the Final Four.

In 2008, UCLA became the first school to make three consecutive trips to the Final Four since Michigan State accomplished the feat from 1999-2001.

UCLA is 16-4 (.800) all-time in games in Honda Center. The Bruins are 11-4 (.733) in Honda Center in Wooden Classic games (1994-2010). UCLA is also 2-0 in Honda Center in NCAA Tournament games (2008).

Since UCLA's 13-year streak ended, winning three straight league titles in the Pac-10 has occurred just five times - Oregon State in 1980-81-82, Arizona in 1988-89-90-91, UCLA in 1995-96-97, Stanford in 1999-00-01 and UCLA in 2006-07-08. Only three of those (Oregon State, UCLA and UCLA) had three straight outright titles.

2010-11 PACIFIC-10 CONFERENCE MEDIA POLL

The UCLA men's basketball team has been picked to finish first in the Pac-12 Conference this season, according to a poll of media members who cover Pac-12 men's basketball.

The annual preseason poll was released in conjunction with Pac-12 men's basketball media day, hosted in downtown Los Angeles at L.A. Live.

"Our team always has high expectations," said Howland, who enters his ninth season as the Bruins' head coach. "The expectations that we put on ourselves matter the most. It's always nice to be picked high, but that doesn't guarantee anything. It's all about where you finish. We've got to go out and prove it, and part of it is being healthy. Hopefully, if we stay healthy and focused on what we are trying to do, it will take care of itself."

In the preseason poll, UCLA tallied 14 first-place votes and narrowly edged out California and Arizona. In addition to Jones, the Bruins return junior forward Reeves Nelson, who led last season's team with 13.9 ppg and 9.1 rpg.

California, paced by senior guard Jorge Gutierrez (14.6 ppg, 4.5 apg) and senior forward Harper Kamp (14.2 ppg, 5.6 rpg) picked up 13 first-

place votes and is tabbed for second. Arizona, the reigning regular-season conference champion, pulled in the remaining 11 first-place votes and are picked to finish third.

Washington, the defending Pac-12 Tournament champion, is slotted fourth, followed by Oregon (fifth) and Stanford (sixth). USC, Oregon State, Arizona State, Colorado and Washington State (tied) and Utah round out the conference's remaining 12 teams, respectively.

Media have correctly picked the conference's regular-season champion 12 times in 19 tries. The media were successful with their choice in five of the previous seven times UCLA was slated to capture the league crown.

THE END FOR PARKER

Junior guard De'End Parker, who has missed the last 18 games with patellar tendinitis, is out for the rest of the season, Head Coach Ben Howland announced at his weekly press conference on Jan. 17, 2012. Parker will petition the NCAA at the end of the year for a medical hardship and will look to transfer at the end of the season to play somewhere closer to home, so he can be near his mother, who has had major health problems in the last six months.

REEVES NELSON DISMISSED

UCLA Men's Basketball Coach Ben Howland dismissed junior forward Reeves Nelson from the team, on Dec. 9, 2011.

Nelson was suspended for conduct unbecoming a member of the UCLA basketball team on Nov. 14 and missed the Bruins home loss to Middle Tennessee State on Nov. 15. He was reinstated on Nov. 16, but suspended again on Dec. 6, again for conduct unbecoming.

"After much thought and deliberation, I have made the decision to dismiss Reeves Nelson from the UCLA Men's Basketball Team effective immediately," said Howland. "This decision is not one that I take lightly, but it is in the best interest of both the program and the student-athlete."

Nelson was UCLA's lone returning first team All-Conference selection from the 2010-11 season, when he led the Bruins in scoring (13.9 ppg) and rebounding (9.1 rpg).

Chris Roberts (talk@chrisrobertsonline.net) is in his 20th year as the "Voice of the Bruins" and his 31st season broadcasting NCAA Division I sports in Los Angeles. Since 1982, Roberts has broadcast more NCAA Division One games in Los Angeles radio than anyone. Prior to joining the Bruins in the Fall of 1992, he served as the voice of the Long Beach State 49ers for 10 years and one with Cal State Fullerton. During that time, he was the sports director at KFI/KOST 103FM. A four-time Golden Mike winner, he also handles the play-by-play duties for UCLA football. He has also authored two books, Stadium Stories: UCLA Bruins and UCLA Football Vault, which he co-authored with Bill Bennett.

A six-time nominee for the Southern California Broadcasters Association "Play-by-Play Broadcaster of the Year" award, Roberts is a voter for both the Heisman Trophy and the Wooden Award. He was inducted into the Southern California Sports Broadcasters Association Hall of Fame on January 30, 2012.

Don MacLean, the all-time leading scorer in UCLA and Pac-10 history (2,608 points, 1989-92) and a nine-year NBA standout, will be in his 10th year as the color analyst. Tracy Murray, another former Bruin standout (averaged 18.3 ppg at UCLA) and a 12-year NBA veteran, will be in his fourth year serving as analyst when MacLean is fulfilling television obligations.

SMITH NAMED TO NAISMITH PRESEASON WATCH LIST

UCLA's Joshua Smith has been named to the 2011-12 Naismith Trophy preseason watch list, as announced Monday (Nov. 7) by the Atlanta Tipoff Club.

Smith represented one of the Pac-12 Conference's two selections to this season's preseason watch list. Washington's Terrence Ross was the only other player from a Pac-12 program selected to the preseason list.

Smith secured Pac-10 All-Freshman Team acclaim in 2010-11 after averaging 10.9 points and 6.3 rebounds per game while shooting 55.5 percent from the field (132-for-238).

The watch list was compiled by the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors, which based its criteria on player performances from the previous year and expectations for the 2012 college basketball season. The Naismith Trophy will be awarded at the 2012 NCAA Men's Final Four in New Orleans.

The Board of Selectors will compile a midseason team of the top 30 players in the nation in late February. In March, the Naismith Trophy voting academy will vote to narrow the list to the four finalists.

RANKING UCLA

UCLA returned to the top of the Associated Press poll for the first time in 12 years on Nov. 27, 2006. Prior to that ranking, the last time the Bruins were ranked number one was in the final AP poll of the 1995 season, the year the Bruins won their 11th national title.

The Bruins have spent a total of 134 weeks ranked first in the AP poll (12 weeks longer than second-place Duke, 124 weeks at number one).

BRUINS AGAINST NATIONALLY RANKED TEAMS

The UCLA Bruins are 21-15 (.583) against ranked teams in the last six seasons. UCLA was 11-2 against ranked teams in 2006-07, 7-2 versus ranked foes in 2007-08, 1-4 against ranked teams in 2008-09, 0-2 in 2009-10, 2-3 in 2010-11 and 0-2 in 2011-12.

HONORING COACH WOODEN

UCLA honored its late legendary Coach John R. Wooden last season on the jerseys with a patch of his Pyramid of Success (seen in a close-up below on Tyler Lamb's photo) with his initials JRW in white across the pyramid. The Bruins will do so again this season. Coach Wooden passed away on June 4, 2010 at the age of 99. Wooden guided UCLA to 10 national championships including seven consecutive titles from 1967 to 1973.

UCLA AND THE PAC-12 CONFERENCE RANKS SECOND IN ACTIVE NBA PLAYERS ON OPENING-DAY ROSTERS

There were 15 UCLA Bruins on opening-day NBA rosters on Dec. 25, 2011 which ranked second nationally. The 15 Bruins in the NBA included: **Arron Afflalo**, Denver; **Trevor Ariza**, New Orleans; **Matt Barnes**, Los Angeles Lakers; **Darren Collison**, Indiana; **Baron Davis**, New York; **Jordan Farmar**, New Jersey; **Jrue Holiday**, Philadelphia; **Ryan Hollins**, Cleveland; **Tyler Honeycutt**, Sacramento; **Jason Kapono**, Los Angeles Lakers; **Malcolm Lee**, Minnesota; **Kevin Love**, Minnesota; **Luc Richard Mbah a Moute**, Milwaukee; **Earl Watson**, Utah and **Russell Westbrook**, Oklahoma City. UCLA led the nation with 14 former players on NBA payrolls last season. Duke currently has the most active NBA players with 16. Kentucky is tied with UCLA with 15 Wildcats in the NBA while Texas ranks fourth with 13. Rounding out those teams with double-digit players in the NBA are Kansas and North Carolina with 12 each, Connecticut with 11 and Florida and Arizona with 10 each. The ACC heads the list of conferences with 61 active NBA players. The Pac-12 Conference ranks second with 50 players in the NBA, followed by the Big East with 46 and the SEC with 45. The Big 12 Conference rounds out the top five with 43. The Big Ten brings up the rear of the BCS conferences with 27 players in the NBA, which ranks sixth among all conferences.

HOWLAND HITS MILESTONES

Head Coach Ben Howland attained his 200th career victory at UCLA with the win over Utah (Jan. 26, 2012) and currently sits at 204-94 (.685) in his ninth season at the helm of the Bruins. With the win over Eastern Washington (Dec. 14), Howland passed Jim Harrick for second place on the all-time UCLA career victories list. Harrick posted a 192-62 record in his eight seasons (1988-89 to 1995-96) as the Bruins' mentor. Coach John R. Wooden is the all-time leader at 620-147 (.808) in his 27 seasons (1948-49 to 1974-75).

LAZERIC JONES LEADS UCLA

Senior point guard Lazeric Jones had his career-best eight straight games in double figures snapped in the loss at Cal (Dec. 31). He has scored in double figures in 15 of the last 19 games. The Bruins are 13-6 in the last 19 contests after starting the season 2-5. In the last 19 games, Jones has averaged 14.2 points, 4.8 assists, 3.6 rebounds and 1.7 steals while shooting 47.1 percent (97-for-206) from the field and 40.6 percent (28-for-69) from three-point range.

TWIN PEAKS

The Wear twins (David and Travis) have scored in double figures in the same game nine times this season and they have done so in seven of the last 15 contests. Additionally, they both posted double-doubles in the home win over USC (Feb. 15) with David registering 16 points and a career-high 13 rebounds and Travis recording 14 points and a career-high 11 boards. In the last 13 games, Travis has averaged 13.1 points while David is averaging 12.4 points per game. David has shot 55.4 percent from the floor (62-for-112) while making 72.7 percent (8-for-11) of his three-point shots and draining 29-for-36 (.806) from the free-throw line. Travis has shot 55.8 percent (63-for-113) from the field while sinking 31-for-37 (.838) of his free throw attempts. Combined, they are 125-for-225 (.556) from the field and 60-for-73 (.822) from the charity stripe.

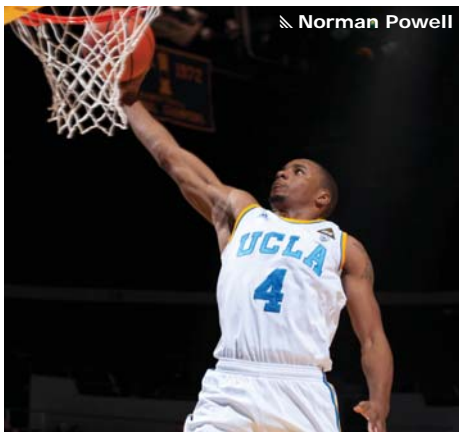

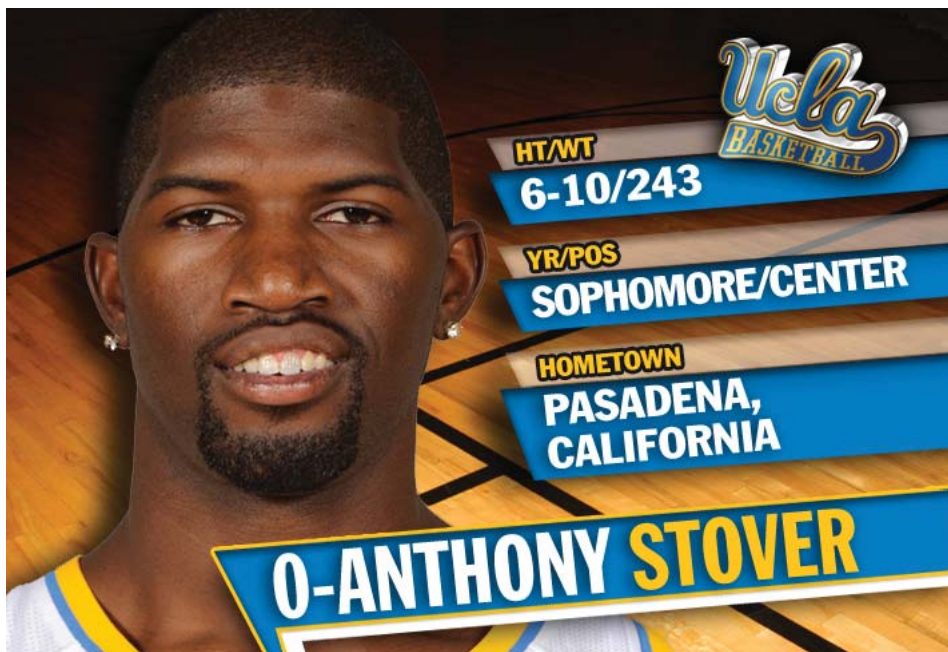

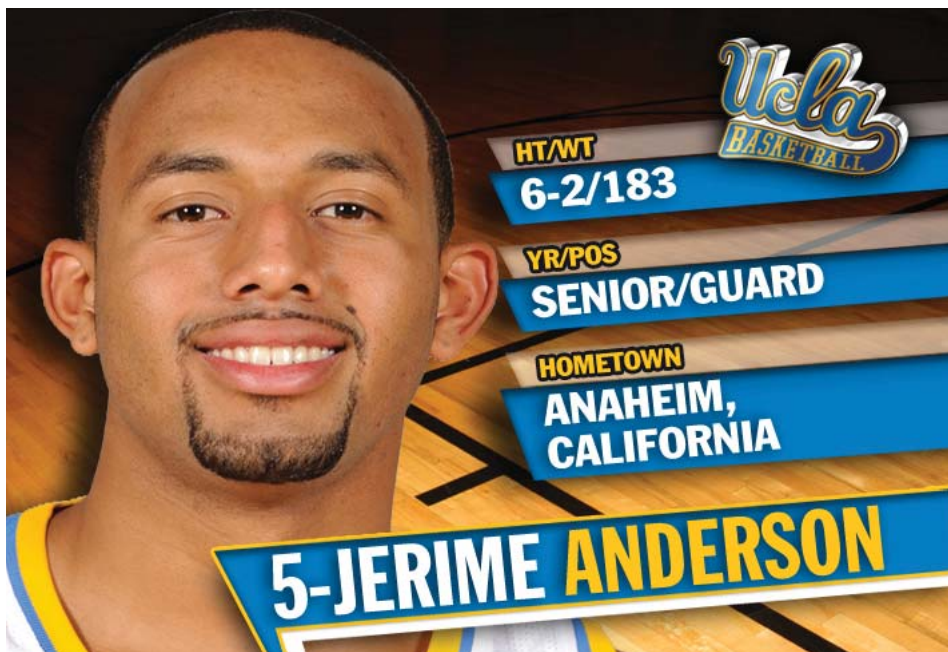

HEAD COACH BEN HOWLAND



Ben Howland knows how to rebuild a collegiate basketball program. He did it at Northern Arizona and again at Pittsburgh. And Howland's done it at UCLA. In his ninth year as the Bruins' head coach in 2011-12, Howland led UCLA to back-to-back-to-back Pacific-10 titles (2006-08) and back-to-back-to-back Final Four appearances (2006-08). He also guided the Bruins to a school-record 35 victories in 2008. Additionally, he won more games in a three-year span (97 from 2006-08) than any other coach in UCLA history. In 2006, he guided the Bruins back to the NCAA Championship Game (for the first time since the Bruins' 1995 national title). UCLA also won the 2008 and 2006 Pac-10 Tournament Championships (first since 1987). He garnered two National Coach of the Year honors in 2006 – the Jim Phelan Award (CollegeInsider.com) and from Collegehoops.net. Howland was the 2006 Pac-10 Coach of the Year and earned numerous other Conference Coach of the Year honors as well as being named the USBWA Dist. IX and *Basketball Times* All-West Coast Coach of the Year.

In 2006, he guided UCLA to the NCAA Championship game and to an NCAA Regional Championship, 32 victories (tying the school record 32 wins set in 1995) and a 12-game winning streak (longest since 1997) entering the NCAA title contest. He just concluded his 17th year as a collegiate head coach (he's been a Conference Coach of the Year selection in three different leagues – 2006, Pac-10 Coach of the Year at UCLA/2002, Big East Coach of the Year at Pittsburgh/1997, Big Sky Coach of the Year at Northern Arizona) and his 28th season of collegiate basketball (as an assistant and head coach), he's 204-94 (.685, 298 games) at UCLA, including 175-64 (.732, 239 games) in the last five-plus seasons as the Bruins' head coach.

He has led a team to the "Sweet 16" five times in the last nine years – Pittsburgh in 2002 and 2003 and UCLA in 2006, 2007 and 2008. Howland recorded his 100th Bruin win vs. Idaho State (Dec. 15, 2007), his 200th career win vs. Delaware State (Nov. 19, 2005) and won his 300th career win in the 72-54 victory over DePaul on Dec. 13, 2008. Howland's career mark is 372-192 (.660, 564 games).

UCLA AT THE L.A. SPORTS ARENA

UCLA AT THE LOS ANGELES SPORTS ARENA

The L.A. Sports Arena was UCLA's home court from 1959-65 (6 years), as the Bruins amassed a record of 60-10 (.857) and ended their run in the Sports Arena on a 36-game winning streak. During those years, the Bruins also played "home" games in the Men's Gym, Santa Monica City College, Long Beach Arena and Bakersfield JC. UCLA is currently 68-14 (.829) as the home team at the Sports Arena.

UCLA defeated USC 47-45 in the first collegiate game in the "new" Sports Arena on Dec. 1, 1959, before a crowd of 6,880.

Highlight seasons under Coach Wooden at the Sports Arena included - 1961-62 (18-11 overall, 10-2 in AAWU (first place), advanced to school's first NCAA Final Four); 1962-63 (20-9 overall, 8-5 in AAWU (tied for first place), lost two games in NCAA Tournament); 1963-64 (30-0 overall, first unbeaten team in school history, 15-0 in AAWU (first place), won school's first-ever NCAA Men's Basketball Championship; 1964-65 (28-2 overall, 14-0 in AAWU (first place), won school's second consecutive NCAA Championship).

LOS ANGELES - The No. 17 UCLA men's basketball team fell to Loyola Marymount, 69-58, on Friday night in both teams' season-opening game, the Bruins' first in their temporary home at the Los Angeles Sports Arena.

LMU (1-0) received a game-high 23 points from Ashley Hamilton and netted 21 points from Anthony Ireland. The visiting Lions nailed 10-of-15 three-point shots, limiting UCLA (0-1) to just 2-of-15 shots from behind the three-point arc.

Reeves Nelson and David Wear each scored 13 points for UCLA. Travis Wear totaled 11 points, rounding out the Bruins' list of double-digit scorers. Nelson and Travis Wear each grabbed a game-high eight rebounds.

The Lions led by one point at halftime and controlled most of the second half, building their first double-digit lead, 53-42, on a pair of free throws by Hamilton that capped a 12-0 run.

UCLA reduced LMU's lead to five points twice in the final seven minutes. A layup by Nelson trimmed the Lions' margin to 55-50. After LMU's Godwin Okonji scored a basket to put LMU ahead 60-52, the Bruins responded with a layup from Joshua Smith followed by a free throw from Lazeric Jones, cutting the Lions' cushion to 60-55.

LMU's lead never fell under 10 points after Hamilton nailed a three-point basket in the game's final minutes.

"That was a very disappointing way to start our season off," said Howland, whose only other loss in an opener during his UCLA tenure was to Cal State Fullerton in 2009. "It's a bad loss for us. I've been saying it, we have a long way to go."

The last time UCLA dropped its season-opening contest was in a double-overtime game against Cal State Fullerton on Nov. 16, 2009. The Titans downed UCLA, 68-65, in that meeting.

LOS ANGELES - Joshua Smith scored a team-leading 15 points and recorded nine rebounds as the UCLA basketball team lost to Middle Tennessee State, 86-66, at the Los Angeles Sports Arena on Tuesday evening.

LaRon Dendy led five Blue Raiders in double figures with 16 points as MTSU rode its hot shooting to improve to 3-0 on the season.

UCLA (0-2) trailed at halftime, 40-32, and was outscored in the second half by a 46-34 margin. The Bruins last opened a season with two losses in 2002-03.

"We broke down a lot of times on defense and left open a lot of shooters," UCLA head coach Ben Howland said. "To start the season 0-2 is obviously disappointing, but I have a lot of confidence in these guys, that they are going to get better and it's a long season."

The Blue Raiders made their first nine three-point field goal attempts, missing their first shot from behind the arc with 1:39 to play in the game. Dendy nailed his only three-point field goal attempt of the game with 37 seconds remaining, helping Middle Tennessee State finish the evening having nailed 10 of its 11 three-pointers.

Travis Wear was the only other UCLA player to score in double figures, totaling 10 points. Jerime Anderson and Norman Powell each tallied nine points, as Anderson dished a game-high six assists in his first contest since returning from a two-game suspension.

MTSU nearly doubled its halftime cushion in the first five minutes of the second half, using a 10-3 run to gain a 50-35 advantage with 16:21 remaining. The Blue Raiders led by as many as 17 points - 58-41 at the 12:32 mark - before UCLA trimmed its deficit to 10 points (61-51) with 10:20 to play.

UCLA trailed by at least 10 points throughout the second half.

LAHAINA, Hawaii (AP) - Travis Wear had 16 points, Joshua Smith and Jerime Anderson 12 each for UCLA which fell to No. 15 Michigan 79-63 on Wednesday in the Maui Invitational (third-place game).

"We'll start to make a comeback and dig ourselves out of the 1-4 hole that we're in right now," UCLA coach Ben Howland said.

Michigan (5-1) played well at both ends to build a modest lead in the first half and ran away with it in the second. The Wolverines made 15 of 23 shots in the second half and hit 62 percent overall to bounce back from a tough loss to No. 6 Duke in the semifinals.

"We are taking probably too many 3-point shots," Howland said. "I don't know how much of that was forced by their defense, but we're not shooting the ball well from 3."

Michigan didn't give the Bruins much of a chance to try another comeback, dropping in 3-pointers, dunks and scoring on backdoor cuts to push the lead to double digits.

David Wear and freshman Norman Powell added 10 points each for the Bruins (2-4), who are playing at the Los Angeles Sports Arena this season while Pauley Pavilion is renovated.

Travis Wear finished with eight points and a game-high 10 rebounds for the Bruins.

UCLA raced to a 28-11 lead by halftime and outscored the Waves by a 34-28 margin in the second half. UCLA head coach Ben Howland passed Jim Harrick on the program's all-time head coaching victories list, pushing his career record at UCLA to 193-87.

The Bruins (4-5) gained separation in the second half with an 11-1 scoring run. After Eastern Washington (5-5) trimmed its deficit to just two points (32-30) with 14:35 left in the game, UCLA extended its advantage to 43-31. Norman Powell scored the team's first four points on the second half scoring run.

Collin Chiverton scored 15 points and Tremayne Johnson added 12 for Eastern Washington in the first-ever meeting between the two programs.

UCLA starting forward Travis Wear missed the game while hospitalized with a skin infection on his left foot.

Chiverton hit three straight 3-pointers as part of a 12-2 spurt that got the Eagles within 32-30 six minutes into the second half.

Lamb hit five straight foul shots in the second half on his way to a career high in free throws made, with six (out of seven). Lamb's 14 points were one short of his career high of 15 (against Chaminade on Nov. 21).

Through his last four games, Jones has averaged 18.8 points per game, shooting 26-of-41 from the field (63.4 percent). In addition, he has hit 11 of 16 three-point shots (68.8 percent).

ANAHEIM, Calif. - Joshua Smith recorded his first double-double of the season, scoring a team-high 18 points and collecting 10 rebounds, to lead the UCLA men's basketball team past UC Davis, 82-39, at Honda Center on Saturday afternoon.

UCLA's 43-point win over the Aggies (1-9) marked the team's largest margin of victory since a 51-point victory against Wyoming (113-62) on Dec. 23, 2008.

Sophomore David Wear added 15 points and senior Lazeric Jones netted 12 points and seven assists for the Bruins (5-5).

UCLA led from the start, staking a 10-0 lead in the first three minutes. The Bruins held the visiting Aggies scoreless through the first 6:24. A jump shot from Eddie Miller at the 14:36 mark put UC Davis on the board, cutting UCLA's margin to 10-2.

The Bruins opened the second half with a 7-0 scoring run to secure a 31-24 advantage. UCLA did not trail after halftime, but never pushed its lead to double digits until the game's final 17 seconds.

"We're getting some confidence, and that's huge," Jones said. "Everyone is rooting for each other. It feels good to get some wins. We have to build on this."

After Stanford called a timeout with 49 seconds to play, Bright missed a shot near the hoop and UCLA's David Wear grabbed the rebound, giving the Bruins one final chance to win the contest in regulation. Jerime Anderson missed a three-point attempt, and UCLA regained possession on a jump ball with nine seconds left before Jones' final shot attempt was blocked.

Jonathan Gillling scored a career-high 17 points and made five 3-pointers for the Sun Devils (4-10, 1-2), who led for most of the first half, when they shot 55 percent from the floor.

UCLA trailed by 10 points early in the first half, as Arizona State gained an 18-8 cushion with 12:31 left before halftime. The visiting Sun Devils maintained their 10-point cushion, taking a 24-14 lead with 10:06 left on a three-pointer by Gillling.

The Bruins surged in the final minutes of the first half, using a 14-4 run over the final 6:05 before intermission to secure a 33-30 advantage at the break.

Ruslan Pateev, a 7-foot Russian, scored 10 points for Arizona State before fouling out with 9:54 remaining, leaving 7-2 Jordan Bachynski to try and challenge Smith and twin brothers David and Travis Wear in the post.

UCLA registered 46 of its 75 points in the paint, outscoring ASU in that category by a 46-18 margin. The Bruins shot at a 54.4 percent clip against the Sun Devils.

Lazeric Jones finished with eight points and 10 assists, while Tyler Lamb netted nine points, four rebounds and two assists. David Wear grabbed a game-high nine rebounds and added eight points.

LOS ANGELES (AP) - Travis Wear had 19 points and eight rebounds, and UCLA built an 18-point halftime lead en route to a 66-47 victory over Southern California on Sunday night at the Trojans' Galen Center.

Lazeric Jones added 15 points for the Bruins (10-7, 3-2 Pac-12), who captured their third consecutive win.

Maurice Jones was the only player in double figures with 13 points for the Trojans (5-13, 0-5), who have not lost this many games in a row since dropping seven straight in 2003.

"That was our first true road win of the year," UCLA head coach Ben Howland said. "We have been on the road all year, but we were playing in front of their fans. With this rivalry, it is always a tough game."

UCLA snapped a 9-9 tie on a tip-in by Anthony Stover with 9:52 left in the first half and led the rest of the game. The Bruins used a 15-1 scoring run over the next 5:22 to secure a 24-10 lead with 4:30 to play before halftime.

UCLA owned a 37-19 advantage at halftime, closing the first half on a 11-3 scoring run.

The Bruins' 19-point win marked the program's largest margin of victory at USC's home arena since an 82-52 win in 1974. UCLA had defeated USC by 18 points in a Pac-10 road game on Jan. 20, 1999.

UCLA won the rebounding battle by a 44-19 tally. The 25-rebound margin was the largest of the Howland era at UCLA and the largest since the Bruins grabbed 30 more rebounds than Northern Arizona in 2002.

USC never got closer than 14 points in the second half. The Trojans cut UCLA's margin to 50-36 on a layup by Aaron Fuller with 6:22 to play in the game before Travis Wear scored the Bruins' next seven points to put UCLA ahead, 57-36.

"Oregon State hurt us by speeding up the tempo," Howland said. "We let the pressure get to us a little bit, which led to turnovers. We have been pretty good at not turning the ball over this year. We also didn't get to the line enough tonight."

EUGENE, Ore. (AP) - E.J. Singler scored a career-high 26 points and Oregon rallied from a 13-point halftime deficit to defeat UCLA 75-68 on Saturday in Matthew Knight Arena.

Garrett Sim added 16 points for the Ducks (15-5, 6-2 Pac-12), including a pair of 3-pointers early (one was part of a four-point play) in the second half to spark the comeback. Devoe Joseph had 10 for Oregon, which has won four straight conference games for the first time since winning six straight in 2007.

Singler scored 20 points in the second half and was 16 of 17 from the free-throw line, making six more attempts than the entire UCLA squad.

Travis Wear led the Bruins (10-9, 3-4) with 17 points, and Lazeric Jones added 14. UCLA was swept on the Oregon trail for the first time since 2004, Head Coach Ben Howland's first season.

David Wear added 10 points and nine rebounds and left the game with two minutes to go with a left knee injury. An MRI (upon return to Los Angeles) on Jan. 23 was negative and didn't show a significant injury.

The Ducks shot 23 percent from the floor in the first half and trailed 37-24 at the break. But Oregon opened the second half on a 15-2 run and took the lead for good on a 3-pointer by Johnathan Loyd that made it 55-52 with 6:49 to play.

The Bruins led by as many as 15 points (33-18 with 2:44 left in the first half) after shooting 51.5 percent (17-for-33) in the opening period. The 15-point lead was the largest lead UCLA has lost this season. It also marked the second consecutive game that UCLA has outshot its opponent in a losing effort.

"We had a 15-point lead at halftime, so in the locker room I told them to build on that in the second half, especially in the first five minutes. Our senior guards played very well tonight. Jerime Anderson had one of his best games as a Bruin. He really controlled things out there."

LOS ANGELES (AP) - Jerime Anderson and Lazeric Jones each scored 16 points for UCLA, which dropped a 73-63 decision to California in a Pac-12 contest at the Los Angeles Sports Arena on Saturday afternoon.

David Wear added 11 points for the Bruins (14-11, 7-6), who lost at home for the first time in six games against California.

Justin Cobbs scored 18 points, including 12 in the second half, and California (20-6, 10-3) withstood UCLA's late rally to win. The Golden Bears moved into sole possession of first in the Pac-12 with their 20th victory of the season.

Allen Crabbe tallied 14 points and Jorge Gutierrez 13 for the Bears, who shot 52 percent from the floor in completing their first season sweep of the Bruins since 1993-94.

"That was a disappointing loss," UCLA head coach Ben Howland said. "I thought that three that Jerime [Anderson] hit at the end of the first half would give us momentum, but [Jorge] Gutierrez made some big shots. He really played like a senior today."

Anderson made a three-point basket before halftime, slicing California's lead to 32-26. The Golden Bears pushed their advantage to as many as 17 points in the second half before UCLA responded.

Trailing 64-47 with 8:42 left in the second half, the Bruins used 15-2 scoring run over the next 5:27 to cut California's cushion to 66-59 at the 3:15 mark.

UCLA was never able to get its deficit under seven points in the final three minutes of the contest.

The loss to California snapped the Bruins' 12-game home winning streak in league play and a 10-game home winning streak overall.

LOS ANGELES - David Wear had 16 points and 13 rebounds and twin brother Travis Wear registered 14 points and 11 boards, helping UCLA beat USC, 64-54, on Wednesday night to sweep the season series between the crosstown rivals.

UCLA (14-11, 8-6 Pac-12) earned its first season sweep in the series since 2006-07.

"I'm really happy with the win," UCLA head coach Ben Howland said. "We knew USC would play inspired. We got a commanding lead early on, but they fought back. You have to give them credit for continuing to fight through adversity this late in the season."

Jerime Anderson tallied 14 points and dished five assists for UCLA, which led by double-digits for most of the night. The Bruins pushed their advantage to as many as 23 points with 11:28 to play in the second half.

UCLA held a 46-25 rebounding edge, recording its third consecutive victory over the Trojans (6-21, 1-13).

Byron Wesley scored 16 points and Garrett Jackson had 15 for USC, which put together a late push to make the final score more respectable.

Travis Wear recorded his first career double-double.

UCLA never trailed in the win over USC, staking a 6-0 lead in the game's first 2:30 and opening its first double-digit lead on a jump shot from Anderson that put the Bruins ahead, 17-6, with 11:11 left in the first half. UCLA twice led by as many as 15 points in the opening half.

The Bruins owned a 31-16 cushion at halftime after Anderson nailed a basket with two seconds to play before intermission.
