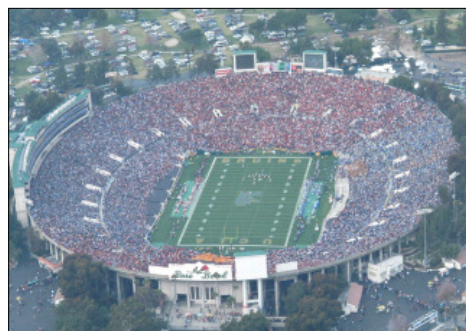

ROSE BOWL: THE 30TH YEAR

The 2011 season marks the 30th year that the Rose Bowl will serve as the home of the Bruins. UCLA moved from the L.A. Coliseum in the summer of 1982 and went 6-0-1 in that first year, capping the season with a victory over Michigan in the Rose Bowl game. The 2006 season-opening win against Utah was UCLA's 100th at the Rose Bowl. The Bruins own a record of 119-55-2 since moving to Pasadena, including a 3-2 record in Rose Bowl games. In July of 2007, the Rose Bowl was selected the No. 1 sports venue by SI.com/SlonCampus.

ROSE BOWL RENOVATION

The Rose Bowl is currently undergoing a \$152 million renovation that is scheduled to be completed prior to the 2013 season. Phase I of the project is well underway and fans will notice some definite changes. Included in these changes are a new, state-of-the-art LED video board measuring 30 feet tall by 78 feet long on the north end of the stadium. There will also be a new clock on the south end, reminiscent of the historical Rose Bowl clock of the 1950s and '60s and a new, smaller scoreboard installed on the east end of the stadium. Fans will also notice that a great deal of work has been done on the west side of the stadium around the press box area. Structures and land have been cleared for the pouring of footings for the new press box. The Rose Bowl has set up higher-end portable restroom facilities on the west side of the stadium to take the place of the regular wash rooms during the season. Note --- General Parking lots at the Rose Bowl will open six hours prior to game time. SEASON OPENER — UCLA opens its 93rd season of football with a Sept. 3 game at Houston. Kickoff is set for 2:30 p.m. CT/ 12:30 PT and the game will be televised nationally by FSN with Craig Bolerjack, Joel Klatt in the booth and Petros Papadakis on the sideline. AM 570 (KLAC) and the Bruin IMG Radio Network (Chris Roberts, Matt Stevens and Wayne Cook) will radio broadcast the contest. The game will also be broadcast nationally on SIRIUS XM (Ch. 92). It will be the season-opening contest for each team.

UCLA leads the series with Houston 3-2, having the last three meetings, including a 31-13 victory last season in the Rose Bowl. The Bruins, ranked #4 in the nation at the time, won the last contest played in Houston, 42-24, in the 1998 season. Houston captured the only other battle contested in the state of Texas, 17-13, in 1977. The Bruins are 60-27-5 overall in season-opening games. UCLA had a five-game season-opening game win streak snapped a year ago at Kansas State in a 31-22 setback. In 2009, it scored a 33-14 victory over San Diego State in the Rose Bowl. In 2008, it knocked off Tennessee in overtime, 27-24, in Pasadena. (2007, won 45-17 at Stanford; 2006, won 31-10 over Utah in Rose Bowl; 2005, won 44-21 at San Diego State). UCLA is 3-2 in its last five road openers (2010 loss at Kansas State, 2007 win at Stanford, 45-17; 2005 win at San Diego State, 44-21). The last season-opening road loss came at Colorado in 2003 (14-16). The Bruins posted a 20-17 win at Alabama in the 2000 season-opener.

A LOOK AT 2011 — There are six home games, four against Pac-12 opponents, and six road matchups on the 2011 schedule. This will be the first year of play in the new Pac-12 Conference as Utah, from the Mountain West Conference, and Colorado, from the Big 12 Conference, join the mix. The Bruins will meet both new conference members. UCLA hosts newcomer Colorado on Nov. 19 and plays at Utah on Nov. 12.

Four contests have been pre-selected for national television -- the opener at Houston (FSN); the Sept. 17 home game against Texas will kickoff at 12:30 and be broadcast on ABC; the Oct. 20 game at Arizona will be played on Thursday night on ESPN; the regular season-ender at USC will be on FSN at 7 pm.

UCLA is opening a second-straight season on the road. UCLA bested Houston at home in the Rose Bowl a year ago. The 2011 home opener is on Sept. 10 with San Jose State and will mark the first time ever the Bruins and Spartans have squared off. The Bruins bested Texas a year ago in Austin and welcome the Longhorns to the Rose Bowl for the first time since 1998. A couple of road contests at Oregon State (Sept. 24) and at Stanford (Oct. 1) kick off the Pac-12 conference schedule. Washington State comes to the Rose Bowl on Oct. 8 in the first Pac-12 home conference contest. The annual homecoming game will be on Oct. 29 against California.

BRUINS MUST REPLACE - Junior safety **Rahim Moore** (Denver Broncos) was named a **first-team All-American** by *Sporting News*. Junior linebacker **Akeem Ayers** (Tennessee Titans) was named a **second-team All-American** by the Walter Camp Football Foundation. Ayers and Moore were each named third-team All-Americans by *Associated Press*. Ayers was one of five Butkus Award finalists (he finished third in the voting). He was also a Lott IMPACT Trophy quarterfinalist. Ayers was a second-team Phil Steele All-American while Moore and senior long snapper **Christian Yount** (Tampa Bay Bucs) were named fourth-team All-Americans. Ayers and Moore earned first-team All-Pac-10 honors from the league's coaches. Senior kicker **Kai Forbath** (Dallas Cowboys) earned second-team All-Pac-10 acclaim. Senior center **Ryan Taylor** (New Orleans Saints) earned honorable mention All-Pac-10 accolades. Senior defensive tackle **David Carter** was drafted by the Arizona Cardinals.

A LOOK AT THE 2011 SCHEDULE — The combined record of UCLA's opponents was 71-78 (.477) in 2010. A closer look at the non-conference opponents reveals some interesting numbers. Houston (5-7 record last season) finished 11th in the nation in total offense in 2010 (480.50 yds/g). The Cougars were 4-4 and third in the Conference USA West while ranking fifth in the nation in passing offense (327.25 yds/g). San Jose State (1-12) ranked 45th in passing offense last season with a total of 236.54 yds/g. Texas (5-7, but three wins on the road a year ago) led the Big 12 in total defense and ranked sixth in the nation, allowing 300.17 yds/g. The Longhorns finished sixth in the Big 12 South with a 2-6 mark.

MID-WEEK GAME — UCLA will play this season at Arizona on Thursday night Oct. 20 in a game to be broadcast on ESPN. In 2010, the Bruins played three non-Saturday games - Oct. 21 at Oregon, Nov. 18 at Washington and Nov. 26 at Arizona State.

Prior to 2010, the last time the Bruins played a regular-season non-Saturday game was Friday, Nov. 28, 2008 at Arizona State, dropping a 34-9 decision. The Bruins also played a Monday night game that year, defeating

Tennessee, 27-24 in overtime on Labor Day night (Aug. 30). Before 2008, UCLA had not played on a week night since Thurs., Sept. 30, 1993, a 52-13 victory at San Diego State.

FRANKLIN ON THE RUN — Redshirt junior tailback **Johnathan Franklin** led the Bruins in rushing with 1,127 yards (5.3 ave) in 2010, the 10th-best season mark in school history. He was **fifth in the Pac-10** and **27th in the NCAA** with his average of 93.92 yards /g. He led the team with eight touchdowns. He was also **ninth in the Pac-10 in all-purpose yards (99.17)** and 14th in the conference in total offense (93.92). He had a streak of three straight 100-yard rushing games (158-Houston/118 Texas/ 216 Washington State), the first time for a Bruin since Maurice Drew in 2004 (Illinois, Washington and San Diego State).

Franklin became the first Bruin 1,000-yard rusher since Chris Markey in 2006. Here are recent Bruin 1,000-yard rushers: 2006: Chris Markey 1,107; 2004: Maurice Jones-Drew 1,007; 2001: DeShaun Foster 1,109; 2000: DeShaun Foster 1,037.

FRESHMEN OVER THE YEARS — A school-record 17 true freshmen played for the Bruins in 1977. Thirteen played in 1975, 12 in 1978, 1980 and 2004 and 10 played in 1979. In recent years, nine played in 2005, eight in 2006, two in 2007 and 11 in 2008. UCLA played 10 freshmen in 2009 (eight saw action in the opener against SDSU). The Bruins played 10 freshman in 2010 (four saw action in opener at Kansas State).

QB *Richard Brehaut* made his first career start vs. Washington State. At Cal, *DE Owamagbe Odighizuwa* made his first start. *F-back Anthony Barr* received the starting nod at Oregon. *WR Jerry Johnson* made his first start against Arizona. Against Oregon

State, *WR Randall Carroll, DT Cassius Marsh and LB Jordan Zumwalt* made the first starts of their careers. DE Reginald Stokes made his initial start versus USC. (*note---players returning for 2011 in italics*):

GAMES MISSED — Due to various reasons such as pre-season or in-season injuries, transfers from other schools, redshirts or other issues, UCLA completed the 2010 season with just 60 scholarship players available - 27 on offense, 29 on defense and four on special teams. This number included injured players who were expected back from injury during the season.

NEW COORDINATORS ON BOARD — **Mike Johnson**, who has 10 years of NFL coaching experience and three at the collegiate level, is set to begin his first season with the Bruin program. Johnson comes to the Bruins after serving as first, quarterbacks coach and then offensive coordinator of the San Francisco 49ers in 2009 and 2010. Prior to joining the 49ers, Johnson worked alongside Rick Neuheisel on the offensive coaching staff of the Baltimore Ravens where he was the receivers coach. From 2002-2005, Johnson served as quarterbacks coach of the Atlanta Falcons. In 2000-2001, he worked on Mike Riley's staff as the quarterbacks coach for the San Diego Chargers. Johnson also served on Riley's staff at Oregon State from 1997-1999 as coach of the quarterbacks and wide receivers.

Joe Tresey, who has served a defensive coordinator at both the University of Cincinnati and the University of South Florida, was named the Bruins defensive chief in February of 2011. He spent the 2010 season as defensive backs coach of the Omaha Nighthawks of the United Football League. In 2009, Tresey's South Florida defense ranked 24th nationally in total defense (321.8 yds) and 19th in scoring defense (19.8 pts). His unit produced 23

At Cincinnati in 2008, Tresey "D" ranked 31st nationally in total defense (321.9) and 25th in scoring defense (20.1) while winning the Big East championship and advancing to the Orange Bowl. In 2007, his UC Bearcat defense led the nation by forcing 42 turnovers and totaled 26 interceptions. UC finished 13th in scoring defense (18.8). He worked at Central Michigan in 2006 and his defenders forced 29 turnovers on the way to capturing the Mid-American Conference championship. Tresey has also coached at Georgia Southern (2004-05), Akron (2002-03), Virginia Military Institute (1999-2001) and Otterbein University in Ohio (1995-98). Prior to that, Tresey had a highly successful tenure as a high school football coach.

ACADEMICS — Junior **Jeff Locke** was voted the punter for the **ESPN 2010 Academic All-District 8 team**. Locke earned a 3.57 gpa in his Economics major and has been listed on the Athletics Director's honor roll at UCLA following five academic quarters.

All seven of the redshirt seniors on the 2011 team are scheduled to graduate by the end of the current quarter.

RICK NEUHEISEL

- *Owns a record of 81-52 in 11 years as collegiate head coach
- *Led teams to three Top 10 finishes and eight bowl games
- *Coached three seasons in the National Football League

Rick Neuheisel, who quarterbacked UCLA to victory in the 1984 Rose Bowl owns a record of 81-52 as a collegiate head coach.

Neuheisel returned to the collegiate ranks in January of 2008 after spending the previous three seasons in the NFL. In his eight years as a college head coach at the University of Colorado and the University of Washington, he fashioned a record of 66-30, winning at least 10 games on three occasions and finishing in the Top 10 three times, while leading his teams to seven bowl games. He was also recognized as one of the nation's top recruiters.

Neuheisel spent the 2005-2007 seasons as an assistant coach for the NFL's Baltimore Ravens. He served as quarterbacks coach in 2005 and 2006 and in January of 2007, was promoted to offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach.

During his four seasons (1999-2002) as head coach at the University of Washington, Neuheisel led the Huskies to a record of 33-16 (.673) and four bowl games (one Rose Bowl, two Holiday Bowls and one Sun Bowl). His Pac-10 record was 23-9 (.719) and Washington won one league title and finished second twice in those four seasons.

In 2000, Neuheisel led the Huskies to an 11-1 record, a first-place finish in the Pac-10 and a victory in the 2001 Rose Bowl.

During his four seasons (1995-98) as head coach at the University of Colorado, Neuheisel won 33 of 47 games (.702), including all three bowl appearances. His 20-4 record in his first two seasons at Colorado were the fifth-most wins at the time for a first-time head coach in the Football Bowl Subdivision (Division IA).

Neuheisel spent the 1994 season as a Colorado assistant coach under Bill McCartney after going to CU from UCLA.

Neuheisel spent six seasons (1988-93) as a Bruin assistant coach. During his final four years he tutored the wide receivers, helping to develop some of UCLA's all-time great receivers, such as J.J. Stokes, Kevin Jordan and Sean LaChapelle.

Neuheisel joined the UCLA staff full-time in 1988 and coached quarterbacks for two seasons, including NFL Hall of Fame quarterback Troy Aikman's senior year (1988). Aikman earned consensus All-America honors and finished third in the Heisman Trophy race, completing a school-record 228 passes (since broken) for 2,771 yards, a 64.4 percentage and a school-record 24 touchdowns (since broken). Aikman was the No. 1 selection in the 1989 NFL Draft.

In 1986, Neuheisel served as a volunteer coach and his major assignment was to teach the offense to a transfer from Oklahoma who had to sit out the 1986 season -- Aikman.

Neuheisel began his collegiate career at UCLA (1979-83) as a walk-on, holding for place kicker John Lee, and earned the starting quarterback job during his senior season (1983). In his final game as a Bruin, he overcame food poisoning to lead UCLA to a 45-9 victory against Illinois in the 1984 Rose Bowl. He was named the game's MVP after throwing for 298 yards and four touchdowns.

DID YOU KNOW...

Three Bruin coaches and 10 players, including 2010 inductee Randy Cross and 2008 inductee Troy Aikman, are enshrined in the National Football Foundation Hall of Fame.

Coach Rick Neuheisel still holds the UCLA single season record for completion percentage. Neuheisel completed 185 of 267 passes (69.3%) for 2,245 yards in the 1983 season. He set a then-NCAA record when he completed 25 of 27 passes (92.6%) in a game that season against Washington.

UCLA has 13 former players currently working in the broadcast media - Troy Aikman, Charles Arbuckle, Wayne Cook, Randy Cross, Terry Donahue, Danny Farmer, David Norrie, Ron Pitts, Tom Ramsey, Matt Stevens, J.J. Stokes, Rick Walker, James Washington.

Twenty-two UCLA players have been selected to CoSIDA Academic All-America teams a total of 27 times. Offensive lineman Chris Joseph (2006, 2007) and wide receiver Cormac Carney (1981, 1982) were two-time first-team selections.

UCLA is the only school to produce six quarterbacks — Troy Aikman, Steve Bono, Billy Kilmer, Tommy Maddox, Tom Ramsey, Jay Schroeder — to have played that position on a Super Bowl team.

During the last 29 years (including 2010), UCLA has been ranked in the final Associated Press Top 25 on 12 occasions, second only to USC (16) among Pac-10 schools. Washington is next with 10 rankings.

The selection of tight end Mercedes Lewis by the Jacksonville Jaguars in the first round of the 2006 NFL draft marked the 29th time a UCLA player has been taken in round one.

Quarterback Drew Olson finished eighth in the 2005 Heisman Trophy balloting. It marked the 21st time that a Bruin has finished in the top 10 of the Heisman Trophy voting.

UCLA has had at least one former player participate in 28 of the last 31 Super Bowl games.

The only three-time consensus All-Americans in Pac-10 history are Bruins (LB Jerry Robinson and S Kenny Easley).

In the decade of the 2000's, UCLA had 12 finalists / winners of the National player awards --- 2009 Kai Forbath - Groza Award winner; 2005 Mercedes Lewis-Mackey Award winner; 2004 M. Lewis, Mackey finalist; 2002 Mike Seidman-Mackey finalist; 2004 Chris Kluwe-Ray Guy Award finalist; 2003 Dave Ball-Bronco Nagurski Award finalist; 2001 Robert Thomas-Dick Butkus Award finalist; 2000 Freddie Mitchell-Fred Biletnikoff Award finalist; 2003 D. Ball-Vince Lombardi Award finalist; 2006 Justin Hickman-Ted Hendricks Award finalist; 2003 D. Ball-Ted Hendricks Award finalist; 2003 D. Ball-Chevrolet National Defensive Player of the Year Award.

On May 13, 2007 UCLA became the first school in history to win 100 NCAA team championships. The Bruins currently have 107 NCAA titles to their credit (winning women's golf in 2010-11).

UCLA ON THE RADIO

The 2011 season is UCLA's 15th with Clear Channel and the games are aired on AM 570 KLAC in Southern California. The games are produced by IMG, UCLA's corporate and media-rights holder.

The Los Angeles all-sports station's broadcast includes a two-hour pre-game show (one hour local, one hour network) and a post-game show. Chris Roberts, a four-time Golden Mike Award winner, is in his 20th season as the voice of the Bruins. Former Bruin quarterback Matt Stevens is in his 15th year on the broadcast team and his 11th as the analyst in the booth. Former Bruin quarterback Wayne Cook is in his 10th season as sideline reporter.

Stevens, Cook and David Vasseggh host the one hour local pre-game show while Roberts, Stevens and Cook host the hour network pre-game and network post-game shows. Vasseggh also hosts a post-game call-in show.

AM 570 KLAC also provides ancillary programming, including head coach and player interviews during game weeks. The half-hour Bruin Report, which highlights UCLA athletics, airs each Saturday following the post-game show (except for night games, when it airs prior to the pre-game show).

UCLA IMG network affiliates include KWDJ 1360 AM - Ridgecrest, KCTC 1320 AM in Sacramento. UCLA Sports Network from IMG games are also available nationally through an agreement with Sirius XM Satellite Radio, the Official Satellite Radio Partner of UCLA Athletics.

Games can also be heard via the internet at uclabruins.com (a UCLA All-Access pass is needed). The home games are also broadcast in Spanish on www.uclabruins.com with Armando Aguayo and Mario Amaya.

Entering the 2011 season, 210 of UCLA's last 219 games have been televised live, including 78 of the last 79.

True senior **SEAN WESTGATE (#11)** --- on the watch list for Rotary Lombardi Award Watch List (nation's college lineman of the year) --- is a standout on special teams who moved into the starting lineup last season. He finished second on the team with 90 tackles (his 7.5 ave ranked eighth (tied) in Pac-10). He led the team with 11.0 tackles for loss (T-10th in Pac-10, 0.92 ave) and tied for the lead with 4.0 sacks (T-20th in Pac-10). He earned All-Pac-10 honorable mention from the league's coaches.

THE PUNTER

Redshirt junior punter **JEFF LOCKE (#18)** enjoyed an outstanding 2010 season and helped UCLA lead the nation in net punting (41.27). He ranked first in the Pac-10 and fourth in the NCAA with his 45.84 average. His two-year career average of 44.69 would rank No. 1 in UCLA history and his season average ranked No. 2.

Locke earned third-team All-America acclaim from Rivals.com and was the punter on the ESPN Academic All-District 8 team as well as Pac-10 All-Academic first team. He was selected second-team All-Pac-10 for a second straight season.

In 2009, Locke was a semifinalist (only freshman) for the Guy Award, presented to the nation's top punter. He was selected second-team All-Pac-10 by the league's coaches and was a first-team Pac-10 All-Academic selection. He was named first-team Freshman All-America by Collegefootballnews.com and second-team by *Phil Steele Publications*. Steele also selected him first-team All-Pac-10 and he made *Sporting News'* Pac-10 All-Freshman team. THE OFFENSE

QUARTERBACKS — True junior **RICHARD BREHAUT (#12)** appeared in nine games, with seven starts, in 2010. He started the final six games of the season. On the year, Brehaut ranked ninth in the Pac-10 in passing yards (144.00) and passing efficiency (110.22) and 10th in total offense (150.78).

He saw his first action of 2010 when he came off the bench in game two versus Stanford. Brehaut made his first career start versus Washington State and completed 12 of 23 passes for 128 yards and was not sacked nor intercepted. On the day, he engineered seven scoring drives - five tds and two fgs. He also scored the go-ahead touchdown on a one-yard run to cap off a 99-yard drive. All five touchdown drives covered at least 67 yards.

At Oregon, he started his first road contest. Against Arizona, he threw for his first two career touchdown passes. His 68-yard scoring toss to Randall Carroll was the team's longest since Ben Olson and Brandon Breazell hooked up on a 69-yard scoring play versus Oregon State in 2007. Brehaut also connected on a 49-yard touchdown pass with Josh Smith on a flea-flicker play.

In the win over Oregon State, Brehaut led a last-second game-winning field goal drive. UCLA started its final possession on its own 17-yard line with 48 seconds remaining and he moved the Bruins 49 yards, setting up Kai Forbath's game-winning kick. He completed four of six passes (37 yards) on that drive.

At Arizona State, he set school records with his 33 pass completions (old record, 32 by Troy Aikman v. USC in 1988) and 56 pass attempts (old record, 51 by Dennis Dummit v. Cal in 1970). He also set personal bests with 321 passing yards and three touchdown passes. His three touchdown passes measured 46, 21 and four yards. He also ran for a 12-yard touchdown.

Redshirt junior **KEVIN PRINCE (#4)** appeared in five games in 2010, all starts. He was sidelined for the balance of the season after undergoing arthroscopic surgery on his knee on Oct. 23.

Prince started and played every snap in the opener at Kansas State despite missing the bulk of pre-season camp with a muscle strain (oblique). He scored UCLA's first touchdown (11-yd run) and threw a 29-yard touchdown to Ricky Marvray with 1:19 remaining to bring the Bruins to within two points, 24-22. Against Houston, he directed five scoring drives (four tds, one fg). He passed for 99 yards and was the team's second-leading rusher with 60 net yards, including a dash of 24 yards and a two-yard touchdown. At Texas, he ran for 50 net yards and threw a one-yard scoring pass to Ricky Marvray.

Prince's knee was sore and swollen the week following the Texas game and he did not see action versus WSU. He returned to the lineup at Cal. He did not play at Oregon due to the injury and decided to undergo surgery.

In 2009, Prince started all 11 games in which he played. He became just the second Bruin freshman (redshirt) quarterback to open a season under center, and the first to win a season-opener, when he took the first snap in the San Diego State game. He became the *second freshman quarterback in UCLA history* to pass for over 300 yards three times in a season (Tommy Maddox, 1990). He was third on the team in rushing (165 yards) and his 2,229 yards of total offense rank No. 14 on UCLA's single-season list (No. 2 among freshmen behind Maddox), his 179 completions rank T-No. 11 (No. 2 among freshmen) and his 2,050 passing yards rank No. 18 (No. 2 among freshmen).

In 2009 at Oregon State, he passed for a career-high 323 yards and rallied the Bruins from a 19-3 deficit. He led touchdown drives of 70 and 94 yards and threw scoring passes of 58 yards to Nelson Rosario (8:06) and seven yards to Taylor Embree, on fourth-and-seven, with 2:06 remaining. He also passed for a pair of two-point conversions. In the final quarter, he completed nine of 13 passes for 198 yards and the two touchdowns.

In the first half against Washington, he completed 13 of 17 passes for 212 yards with one touchdown. However, with 5:07 remaining in the half, he was injured on a helmet-to-helmet hit at the end of an eight-yard run and did not return. At Washington State, he recorded his third 300-yard passing game. He completed a career-high 27 passes and led the Bruins in rushing with 76 yards, including a 68-yard touchdown scamper, the longest run by a Bruin quarterback since John Sciarra had a 71-yard non-scoring run against Tennessee in 1971. His 390 yards total offense rank No. 9 (tied) on the single-game total offense list.

RUNNING BACKS — Redshirt junior tailback **JOHNATHAN FRANKLIN (#23)** --

on the watch lists for the Maxwell Award (most outstanding college football player), Doak Walker Award (nation's top running back) --- appeared in all 12 games and made 10 starts last season. Franklin led the Bruins in rushing with 1,127 yards (5.3 ave), the 10th-best season mark in school history. He was fifth in the Pac-10 and 27th in the NCAA with his average of 93.92 yards per game. Franklin also topped the team with eight touchdowns. He was ninth in the Pac-10 in all-purpose yards (99.17) and 14th in total offense (93.92).

Franklin became UCLA's first 1,000-yard rusher since Chris Markey in 2006 (1,107), and totaled the highest yardage total by a Bruin since Skip Hicks ran for 1,282 in 1997 and his 1,584 career yards moved him into No. 25 on UCLA's rushing list. Franklin has rushed for 100 or more yards seven times in his career (five times in '10) and he did it in three straight games (Houston, Texas, WSU). The last time a Bruin had rushed for over 100 yards in three consecutive games was Maurice Jones-Drew versus Illinois, Washington and San Diego State in 2004.

Versus Houston, Franklin ran for 158 yards on 26 carries. He scored three rushing touchdowns (11, one, 12 yds). Thirteen of his runs gained at least five yards. At Texas, his 11-yard touchdown run capped an 80-yard drive to open the second half. He accounted for 56 yards on four carries on that drive.

In the win over Washington State, he rushed for a career-high 216 yards (13th on UCLA list) and one touchdown (3 yds) on 30 carries. His 216 yards were the most by a Bruin since Jones-Drew ran for 322 at Washington in 2004. Sixteen of his runs measured at least five yards. He ran for 118 yards against USC to become the first Bruin back to hit the century mark versus the Trojans since DeShaun Foster in 1998.

Franklin saw action in all 13 games in 2009, making eight starts. He led the team with 566 rushing yards, 12th in the Pac-10. Franklin ranked No. 6 on UCLA's freshman rushing list. He recorded two 100-yard games (Kan. St.-119 and Cal-101).

True senior **DERRICK COLEMAN (#33)** appeared in 11 games in 2010 and made two starts. WIDE RECEIVERS — True senior **TAYLOR EMBREE (#82)** saw action in all 12 games in 2010 and made 11 starts. On the year, he made a team-best 32 receptions. He also led the team with his 409 receiving yards. He ranked sixth in the Pac-10 with a 6.93 punt return average.

True senior **NELSON ROSARIO'S (#83)** 82 career receptions rank No. 26 on that UCLA list entering his senior season. He saw action in nine games in 2010 and made eight starts. Rosario finished second on the team with 29 receptions and 309 receiving yards. He had two receptions (15) at Texas and broke the 1,000-yard barrier for career receiving yardage.
