Top-Seeded UCLA to Host Fourth-Seeded USC in NCAA Round of 16

In a rematch of last year's College Cup Semifinals, the top-seeded and undefeated UCLA women's soccer team (20-0-2) hosts fourth-seeded USC (16-4-2) in an NCAA Round of 16 clash this Saturday at Drake Stadium beginning at 6:30 p.m. The winner advances to the quarterfinals to face either second-seeded Duke or third-seeded Virginia next week. Tickets for Saturday's match are \$10.00 for adults and \$8.00 for youth/students.

UCLA vs. USC Take II

A series record 7,804 fans turned out to watch the first meeting between the two teams this season at the Los Angeles Coliseum on Oct. 24. A pair of goals by UCLA forward Kristina Larsen proved to be the difference, as the Bruins notched a 2-1 road victory to remain atop the conference standings.

UCLA/USC Series History

UCLA has dominated the series with its cross-town rival, leading the all-time series 16-3-1. Prior to the Women of Troy's win at last year's NCAA College Cup, the Bruins had won eight straight in the series. UCLA has also outscored USC, 51-21 in the 20 total meetings between the two teams. USC has never beaten UCLA in Westwood, as the Bruins take an 11-0 home record against the Women of Troy into this week's match.

How They Got Here

UCLA advanced to this week's round of 16 following a pair of shutouts in the first two rounds of the tournament. The Bruins defeated Fresno State, 5-0 in its opener last Friday night, as senior McCall Zerboni led the Bruins with a hat trick in that match. UCLA then defeated No. 17 San Diego, 1-0 on Monday, following an own goal by the Toreros in the 78th minute. USC was a 2-0 winner over Boston University in the first round, and followed that up with a 1-1 tie against BYU, eventually winning in penalty kicks.

Gauntlet Points Up for Grabs

Although the Bruins already own the five Lexus Gauntlet points awarded for women's soccer in the UCLA-USC all-sport's race, a win for UCLA on Saturday is still very important in terms of the final outcome. A USC win would gain 2.5 of those points back for the Trojans, who currently lead the race 15-5. The Trojans won the Lexus Gauntlet Trophy last year by a score of 67.5 to 42.5.

School Shutout Record Could Fall

With its next shutout, UCLA will break the school record for shutouts in a season, as this year's team will have 19 - one more than the 2000 team that reached the NCAA Final.

Bruins Eyeing Two More Records

Although it won't be determined until the end of the season, UCLA will likely break the current single-season school records for goals allowed and goals against average. The Bruins have only surrendered four goals this season, well below the record of 10 given up by the 2000 squad. In addition, the Bruins' goals against average of 0.18 is on pace to break the 0.41 mark also posted by the 2000 team.

Did You Know?

UCLA owns a 3-0 record against the teams still alive in the NCAA Tournament. The Bruins' wins have come over USC (2-1), Stanford (1-0) and Portland (1-0).

Three Olympians Highlight Saturday Showdown

UCLA's Lauren Cheney and Kara Lang will join USC's Amy Rodriguez on the field this Saturday as players who participated in the recent Beijing Olympic Games. Cheney and Rodriguez were teammates on Team USA's run to the gold medal, while Lang was a member of Canada's squad which did not advance out of group play.

UCLA Earns a No. 1 Seed for the Second Year in a Row

For the second year in a row - and third time in program history - the UCLA women's soccer team has earned a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament. The other top seeds this year are Notre Dame, North Carolina and Stanford. Below is the Bruins' seeding history in NCAA Tournament play.

Bruins Win a Sixth Straight Pac-10 Title

With its 2-1 double-overtime victory over Oregon State on Nov. 9, UCLA guaranteed itself at least a share of its sixth straight Pac-10 Championship. The Bruins then won the title outright two days later, defeating Oregon, 2-0 to end the conference season with a perfect 9-0 record. It marks the third time in program history that UCLA has not lost a match in conference play (1997, 2007 and 2008).

Bruins End Regular Season at No. 2

UCLA checks in at No. 2 in the final NSCAA/adidas Coaches' Poll of the regular season. The Bruins are also ranked No. 2 in rankings issued by *Soccer America*, *Soccer Times* and *Soccer Buzz*. New rankings will not be issued again until the conclusion of the NCAA Tournament.

DiMartino Named Pac-10 Player of the Year

Led by Pac-10 Player of the Year Christina DiMartino, the UCLA women's soccer team had a total of eight players recognized by the conference for their efforts during the 2008 season. The Bruins had more first-team selections (4) than any other school in the Pac-10. DiMartino, a senior midfielder from Massapequa, N.Y., has helped the Bruins claim the Pac-10 title in each of her four seasons. One of her highlights this season was scoring the game-winning goal against No. 2 Stanford, leading the Bruins to an eventual 1-0 victory. That win put UCLA in sole possession of first place in the Pac-10 with just three matches remaining. In addition to her 16 points (5g, 6a) on the year, she is the Bruins' top playmaker, involved in nearly every one of UCLA's scoring opportunities.

DiMartino currently ranks second at UCLA in career assists (30), and 10th in career scoring (72 points). She is UCLA's fifth Pac-10 Player of the Year, joining Traci Arkenberg (1997), Tracey Milburn (2000), Nandi Pryce (2003) and Lauren Cheney (2007).

Joining DiMartino on the first team were Cheney (F), Erin Hardy (D) and Ashley Thompson (GK). Lauren Wilmoth (D) and Kylie Wright (MF) were named to the second team, while McCall Zerboni (MF) was an honorable mention selection. Newcomer Sydney Leroux (F) was named to the All-Freshman Team.

Lang's Time to Shine

No current UCLA player has done better in the post-season than Kara Lang, who ranks second all time at UCLA in career NCAA Tournament scoring with 22 points (10g, 2a). Her best season came in 2005 when she scored seven goals to lead UCLA to the NCAA Final that year. Lang entered this year's tournament just two points behind Iris Mora (21 pts.), but ended up surpassing her with a goal and an assist in the Bruins' 5-0 win over Fresno State in the first round. Danesha Adams is the Bruins' career NCAA Tournament scoring leader with 41 points (19g, 3a).

20 Wins Again in '08

UCLA's victory over San Diego on Monday gave the Bruins 20 wins for the fourth straight season. UCLA has had a total of six 20-win seasons in its 16-year history. All have come under head coach Jillian Ellis, who has averaged just over 17 wins in 10 seasons at UCLA.

Big Time Goals

UCLA's first-ever undefeated regular season hasn't been easy, and the Bruins have had several players score big time goals in pressure situations this year. Below is a list of five players who have come through in the clutch this season:

Sydney Leroux - Nets game winner in her first college match to help UCLA down UC Santa Barbara, 2-1 in season opener.

Lauren Cheney - Scores game's only goal in a 1-0 win over No. 6 Portland on Aug. 30. Also nets game-tying goal in 90th minute to help UCLA reach overtime (and eventually win) against Washington State on Oct. 10.

Kristina Larsen - Golden goal in 102nd minute downs Washington State, 2-1 on Oct. 10. Scores both goals in a 2-1 victory over cross-town rival USC on Oct. 24.

Christina DiMartino - Broke a scoreless tie on a 35-yard shot (77th min.) to help UCLA upset No. 2 Stanford, 1-0 on Oct. 31.

Catherine Calvert - Scores her first career goal in double-overtime, giving UCLA a 2-1 victory over Oregon State on Nov. 7. The win clinches a sixth straight Pac-10 Championship for the Bruins.

Zerboni Notches Season's First Hat Trick

Midfielder McCall Zerboni registered UCLA's first hat trick of the season last week, scoring three goals in a 5-0 victory over Fresno State in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. Zerboni, who had three goals all season heading into that match, vaulted up to fourth on the team in scoring with 17 points (6g, 5a). It marked the 22nd hat trick in program history and first since Lauren Cheney scored four goals in a 6-0 win over Hawaii on Sept. 23, 2007.

UCLA's Dominating Defense

UCLA's defense has been spectacular this year, as the Bruins have been ranked No. 1 in the nation in goals against average (0.18) for most of the season. UCLA has also given up the fewest goals of any team in the country, surrendering just four in 22 matches. In addition, the Bruins' 18 shutouts this year is tops in the country.

Leroux Off to Chile

Freshman Sydney Leroux played her final two matches for the Bruins two weeks ago in Oregon, as the forward has joined the U.S. Under-20 National Team for the FIFA U-20 World Cup, Nov. 19-Dec. 7, in Chile. Leroux played in 19 of the Bruins' 20 regular-season matches, making 18 starts. She ranks third on the team in scoring with 16 points (5g, 6a). She was recently honored as one of the best freshman in the Pac-10.

Frontrunners

UCLA was forced to come from behind just once this season, as Washington State scored the first goal of the match in an Oct. 10 showdown at Drake Stadium. After giving up a goal in the fifth minute of play, UCLA scored in the 90th minute to send the match to overtime. A golden goal in the 102nd minute eventually gave the Bruins the come-from-behind victory. UCLA, which has not trailed an opponent other than WSU this season, is 19-0 when scoring first.

Four Bruins Make Top Drawer Soccer Teams

UCLA's Christina DiMartino, Erin Hardy, Lauren Cheney and Sydney Leroux were all honored by *Top Drawer Soccer* in its recent Teams of the Season list. Hardy and DiMartino were second-team selections, while Cheney was on the third team. Leroux was a second-team All-Rookie selection.

Thompson Ranks No. 1

Senior goalkeeper Ashley Thompson continues to rank No. 1 nationally in both goals against average (0.19) and save percentage (0.945). If she continues at the current pace, she could break several UCLA single-season records, including the marks for wins, goals against average and shutouts.

UCLA Has No. 1 RPI

Although Notre Dame is the unanimous No. 1 team in the country, it's UCLA's that ranked No. 1 in the final ratings percentage index (RPI) of the regular season on Nov. 3. The Index is comprised by taking into account several factors, including a team's winning percentage (25%), its opponents' winning percentage (50%), and the winning percentage of those opponents' opponents (25%). UCLA ended last season with the No. 1 RPI in the nation.

Zerboni, Wilmoth Start All 22

Only two players - McCall Zerboni and Lauren Wilmoth - have started all 22 matches for the Bruins this year. There were three players until last week, as midfielder Kylie Wright did not play against San Diego due to illness.

Bruins Break Consecutive Shutout Streak

This year's team broke the school record for consecutive shutouts, posting 10 in a row from Aug. 30 - Oct. 5. The old record was six, set in both 2000 and 2005. This year's streak was snapped when the Bruins surrendered just their second goal of the year in a 2-1 win over No. 25 Washington State on Oct. 10. The Bruins had played nearly 1,000 minutes (982 to be exact) of scoreless soccer until giving up that goal.
