TRIP TO NU, BRIGHT OUT NIGHT IN MULLINS VS. MERRIMACK ON THE DOCKET THIS WEEKEND

- Closing out one season series and beginning another, the Mass Attack will head to Northeastern on Friday for its season finale against the Huskies before returning home on Saturday to play its first of the year against No. 4 Merrimack. Saturday night is Bright Out Night at Mullins, as the first 1,000 students let in the building will get a free white t-shirt courtesy of UMass Dining.
- Since December, UMass has gone 5-3-2 leading into tonight's game with three wins against Top-20 teams. The Minutemen will be looking to bounce back from their two-game skid by taking the season series with the Huskies, heading to Northeastern with a 1-0-1 mark against NU this year. The teams played to a 3-3 tie in Boston in the season opener, while UMass won the meeting in Amherst, 4-2 on Nov. 12.
- Heading into Saturday's game vs. #4 Merrimack, the Mass Attack will be looking for its fifth win of the season against a ranked foe.

ICE SHAVINGS

- UMass is now 5-3-2 since the start of December with the win over Vermont on Jan. 20, its second straight over the Catamounts, including the overtime victory at Frozen Fenway.
- Conor Allen scored in three straight games from Jan. 27-27 and has four points in the past four games.
- Steven Guzzo has an assist in each of the past three games. He was the lone Minuteman to record multiple points two games vs. #11 UMass Lowell last weekend.
- UMass took the series with Boston College for the first time 2006-07, 2-1, after shutting out the #4 Eagles for the first time ever, 4-0 at the Mullins Center on Jan. 13.
- T.J. Syner has at least one point in 20 of 24 games this season and 6 multi-point games. He registered his second career multi-goal game in the 4-0 blanking of Boston College on Jan. 13.
- Danny Hobbs recorded UMass' third hat trick of the season in the 4-3 victory over Vermont on Jan. 20. Since the start of December, Hobbs has 11 points (6g, 5a) in 10 games. He recently had a six-game point streak.
- Steve Mastalerz recorded a season-high 35 saves and recorded UMass' first shutout of the season, his first of his career, last Friday vs. Boston College. He also registered an assist on the game-winning tally, the first Minuteman netminder to do so since Jon Quick in 2006. The freshman hit the same mark once again with 35 stops against Vermont on Jan. 20.
- With his tally against B.C., Peter DeAngelo became the first Minuteman to score a shorthanded goal since Will Ortiz vs. Northeastern on Feb. 13, 2009.
- The crowd of 38,456 to watch Frozen Fenway 2012 was the largest in program history for a single-game ... The attendance was also the largest for any UMass sporting event this season - surpassing the 30,176 for UMass football game at Boston College - and the most for any event since UMass played football at Michigan (110,187).

THE SERIES WITH NORTHEASTERN

- Northeastern holds a 40-24-11 advantage in the all-time series against the Minutemen, including a 6-2-2 mark the past 10 games.
- The Huskies have taken the past two season series over UMass. The Mass Attack is 1-0-1 against Northeastern in 2011-12 after playing to a 3-3 tie in the season opener on Oct. 7 in Boston. The Minutemen then won the squads' Amherst meeting 4-2 on Nov. 12.

THE SERIES WITH MERRIMACK

- UMass is 34-34-5 all-time against Merrimack, including a 24-13-1 mark in Amherst heading in to Saturday's matchup in the Mullins Center.
- The meeting is the first of the season between the squads who will play a home-and-home the final weekend of the regular season, March 2-3.
- Two of the three games between the Minutemen and the Warriors last season were decided by one goal, though Merrimack has won five straight in the series and seven of the last 10 against UMass.
- The Mass Attack last win over the Warriors came at home on Dec. 12, 2009 by a 4-1 margin.

UP NEXT: BOSTON UNIVERSITY / PROVIDENCE

- UMass will play at Boston University next Friday before hosting Providence on Saturday. Both games will be the Minutemen's series finales against the two squads. The Mass Attack is 0-1-1 against the Terriers this season and 0-1-1 vs. the Friars.

STORY LINES: NORTHEASTERN / MERRIMACK

- UMass is now 5-3-2 since the start of December despite dropping both games to #11 UMass Lowell last weekend.
- UMass has now won the season series against the both Vermont and Boston College and will be looking to secure a series win over Northeastern this Friday.
- The Minutemen are 2-for-3 on the power play over the past two games, including a pair of man advantage tallies last Friday at home against UMass Lowell.
- UMass' 7-1-3 record at home this year marks UMass' best home start since going 9-1-2 in 2006-07 ... UMass' best home record for a season was 13-2-0 in 1993-94 (11-0-0 home start) which was the program's first year after being dormant since 1979
- With four of the next six games on the docket against ranked foes, UMass is 4-4-1 against ranked teams this season
- Conor Allen scored in three straight games from Jan. 27-27 and has four points in the past four games. He leads all UMass defensemen with seven goals on the year.
- Steven Guzzo has an assist in each of the past three contests, including one each in both setbacks to UMass Lowell last weekend. Eleven different players combined for 12 points over two games vs. the River Hawks.
- When allowing 4 or more goals this year, UMass is 0-9-1, however, when cutting that to 3-or-fewer, UMass is 9-1-3.
- Holding a lead or being tied after 2 periods has also been a good omen for UMass this year as the Minutemen are 9-1-3 (0-9-1 when trailing).
- The crowd of 38,456 to watch Frozen Fenway 2012 was the largest in program history for a single-game ... The attendance was also the largest for any UMass sporting event this season - surpassing the 30,176 for UMass football game at Boston College - and the most for any event since UMass played football at Michigan (110,187) ... The all-time attendance record for a UMass hockey game was 17,565 set twice against New Hampshire in the 2003 and 2004 Hockey East Tournaments at the TD Garden in Boston.
- Conor Allen posted 3 goals and 1 assist in the pair of wins over Holy Cross and Northeastern with a +3 rating. He became just the 3rd defenseman in UMass' Division I history to score a hat trick with all three of his goals coming vs. Holy Cross.
- The line of T.J. Syner, Michael Pereira and Danny Hobbs combined for 10 points (4g, 6a) in the win over Bentley. All told for the Bentley/Providence weekend, the trio tallied 16 points (6g, 10a).

TEAM NOTES VS. NORTHEASTERN / MERRIMACK

SPECIAL TEAMS

- UMass struggled last season on the power play converting 21-of-163 chances (12.9%). The power play unit has returned largely intact for the 2011-12 season and has shown improvement. Of the 76 goals scored this year, 20 have been on the power play.
- The penalty kill was 5-for-6 (83.3%) at Northeastern - a performance which included killing off a pair of 5x3 power plays totaling just over 90 seconds, 4-for-4 against Boston University and Holy Cross, 5-for-5 at Providence and a season-best 6-for-6 vs. Boston College on Jan. 13.
- In 2011-12, UMass is converting 17.2% of its power play chances (20-of-116) and has killed off 89 of its 120 penalties (74.2%).

SCORING BREAKDOWN

- After 24 games this year, UMass has 50 goals in 5x5 situations, 19 goals on a traditional 5x4 power play, one shorthanded goal (4x5) and one with an extra skater (6x5).
- 56 of UMass' goals last year were scored in 5x5 situations, the remainder of the 32 goals came in penalty situations. UMass had 18 power play goals, three 5x3 goals, 7 4x4 goals and 3 goals with the extra skater (6x5). UMass did not score a shorthanded goal last year.

YOUNG GUNS

- With 13 freshmen on the team last year's team, it was a fair assessment to say the Minutemen were a young team. The average age for the team was 20.7 years old. Six of UMass' 30 players were under the age of 20.
- UMass freshmen scored 39 of 88 goals last season and had 64 of 149 assists.
- Entering 2011-12, UMass has a roster of 13 sophomores and eight freshmen to pair with four juniors and four seniors.

LOOKING FOR A LEAD

- UMass and Northeastern went into the first intermission tied 2-2 in the season-opener after the Minutemen jumped on the scoreboard first. UMass held a 2-0 lead at home over Boston University after one period only to end with a tie. In the second Boston University meeting, the Minutemen held a 3-0 lead after the first period, but were stuck with an overtime loss.
- This year, when UMass is ahead or even after the second period, the Minutemen are 9-1-4 while going 0-9-1 when trailing.
- When UMass was able to jump out to a first period lead last year, the Minutemen were 5-5-2. If the Minutemen carried that past the second period, they were 5-1-0. Trailing after two periods was not a good omen, however, as UMass was 0-17-4 for the year.

OFFENSE, DEFENSE CLICK IN UMASS WINS

- When UMass wins this year, the Minutemen play well on both sides of the ice. Offensively, they average 4.4 goals per game while allowing 1.8. The power play unit has converted at 24.3% which is nearly 10 points higher than all games combined.
- In games lost, UMass averages 2.2 goals per game, while allowing 4.6 goals. The power play unit is just 8-for-48 (16.7%) in losses as well.

MULLINS MAGIC IN 2011-12

- Over the last 102 games at the Mullins Center, UMass is 54-34-14 (.598) including a 14-3-4 mark in 2006-07. All-time, UMass is 141-131-33 in the Mullins Center including a 85-114-26 record among Hockey East foes. Under Don Cahoon, UMass sports a 97-77-21 record at home.
- The 2011-12 campaign has gotten off to an especially good start as the Minutemen began 7-0-3 at home prior to the Jan. 27 loss to #11 UMass Lowell. The last such start to a season was in 2007-08 when the Minutemen were 4-0-3 to start the season before falling on Dec. 8 to No. 7 New Hampshire.
- UMass was 4-8-4 last season at the Mullins Center.

HARD TO BEAT WHEN SCORING 3'S

- Over the last several years, UMass has been nearly unbeatable when scoring three or more goals in a game. The 2010-11 season started on a different note, however, as the Minutemen were able to score three and four goals at Minnesota and three against Boston University New Hampshire and Maine, yet were unable to get the 'W'. UMass was 6-9-4 last year when scoring three or more goals.
- UMass was 17-5-0 when scoring three-or-more goals in 2009-10 and 1-13 when failing to.
- UMass was 15-4-0 in 2008-09 when lighting the lamp three times or more in a game and 10-13 when they scored fewer than three goals.

FOUR-OR-MORE IS BEST

- Over the last 97 games where UMass scores four-or-more goals, the Minutemen are an amazing 85-8-4.

VS. RANKED TEAMS

- UMass is 4-4-1 this year against ranked teams with wins over No. 1 Boston College, No. 17 Yale, No. 13 Cornell and No. 4 Boston College. In 2010-11, UMass posted an 0-16-3 record against ranked teams.
- UMass was 9-8-0 vs. ranked teams in 2009-10 which was the program's best all-time record against ranked teams. UMass had wins over #2 Boston University (Oct. 18), #9 Yale (Nov. 19), #18/17 Vermont (Nov. 24, Jan. 23), vs. #18 Union (12/29), a pair over #15 UMass Lowell (1/15-16), and a pair of wins at #17 Maine (3/5-6).
- All-time, UMass is 58-204-24 against ranked opponents including a 6-7-2 record at neutral sites and a 9-25-4 record against non-conference teams.
- UMass posted its third-ever win over a No. 1-ranked team on Saturday, Nov. 5, 2011 with a 4-2 win over Boston College in the Mullins Center. Previously, UMass had defeated then No. 1-ranked Boston University, 5-1, on Nov. 14, 2008 - also at the Mullins Center. The first game in 1994-95 with a 4-2 win over No. 1 Maine on Jan. 28. In the modern era, UMass is 3-13-1 against team's ranked No. 1.

FANS SET ATTENDANCE RECORD IN 2009-10

- The 2010-11 season started off on a good note attendance-wise as a home-opening record 7,021 fans came to the Boston University game on Oct. 22. The previous record for a home-opener was 5,862 against UMass Lowell in 2007.
- UMass averaged a school record 5,313 fans in 15 home games at the Mullins Center last year - a mark which ranked 12th nationally. In those 15 games, 79,690 fans came through the turnstiles.
- A Mullins Center record 8,389 fans turned out to see UMass defeat Boston College on Nov. 22, 2008 - a mark that also ranks as the ninth-best UMass hockey attendance for all venues. Fans tied that record on Feb. 5, 2009 against Boston College as well.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES VS. NORTHEASTERN / MERRIMACK

SYNER LEADING UMASS OFFENSE

- Co-captain T.J. Syner finished 2010-11 second on the team in scoring with 9 goals and a team-best 18 assists in 35 games. For his career, he is the active team leader as well with 123 games played, 35 goals, and 53 assists. This season, he leads the way with 28 points (11 goals, 17 assists).
- In 24 games this season, he is tied for 20th nationally in points per game and is 28th in the country in assists (17, 0.71/game). In Hockey East action, Syner is 6th in points in the league, tied for 11th in goals scored, and is tied for 9th in assists.
- Along with regular shifts, the Springfield native plays on UMass' top penalty kill, power play, 4x4 and 5x3 units. He is referred to as a "world class skater" and one of the fastest skaters in the country.

HOBBS LOOKS TO BUILD OFF BREAKOUT YEAR

- Co-captain Danny Hobbs had his best season of his career last season. Hobbs scored 12 goals along with 16 assists for 28 points in 31 games - all career best totals.
- Hobbs had eight multi-point games last season and had a six-game point streak in place (2g, 6a) from Dec. 30-to-Jan. 15.
- In 2011-12, Hobbs is fourth on the team in points (9g, 9a, 18 pts) and is tied for second on the team in goals (9).
- After suffering through injuries during much of the first half of the season, Hobbs is healthy once again and since December has 3 goals and five assists with a point in seven of the last 10 games. His goal with 11 seconds left at Providence (1/5) forced overtime and an eventual tie after the Friars took the lead in the final minute of play. He also assisted on Michael Marcou's overtime game winner against Vermont at Fenway Park the very next game.

PEREIRA ONE OF NATION'S TOP FORWARDS

- Michael Pereira quickly established himself as one of the top rookie scorers in Hockey East and in the nation last season. Pereira finished the year tied for the team lead in goals with 12, third on the team in assists (13) and third in overall points (25). *Pereira finished the regular-season ranked second in Hockey East in Rookie Scoring. Nationally, he was 22nd in rookie scoring (0.78 p/gm).*
- In 2011-12, Pereira is tied for second on the team in goals (9) and is third in points (21). He recorded his first collegiate hat trick earlier this season against Bentley (10/14). He has five multi-point games this year and leads the team in power play goals (4).

SHEARY CARVING UP POINTS

- Conor Sheary is having a great sophomore campaign in 2011-12 with 26 points through 24 games (8 goals, 18 assists) which exceeds his point total from last season. He ranks second on the team in points, leads the squad in assists and leads the team with a +12 rating for the year. He has at least one point in every game but five and factored into all three goals in UMass' earlier loss at New Hampshire.
- In Hockey East, Sheary ranks 8th overall in points, tied for 7th in assists and tied for 8th in plus-minus.
- Last season, Sheary had a total of 14 points (6 goals, 8 assists) in 34 games ranking seventh on the team in points.

GUZZO HAVING POSITIVE IMPACT

- Redshirt freshman Steven Guzzo missed all of last season with an injury suffered just prior to the 2010-11 season opener at Minnesota. The native of Oakville, Ontario has returned to the line-up fully healthy in 2011-12 and has been making an impact. In 23 games, he has 15 points on 7 goals and 8 assists and is fourth on the team with a +7 rating. His 7 goals are fifth most on the team. His +7 rating ranks tied for 30th among all skaters in Hockey East.

FILIOU, GRACEL TOP FACEOFF SPECIALISTS

- Sophomore Branden Gracel is the top UMass faceoff man thus far this season. Gracel leads the team going 157-of-294 (.534) at the dots. Steven Guzzo (.510) and Eric Filiou (.490) are two of the Minutemen's other top faceoff winners.

MARCOU ANCHORS DEFENSE

- Michael Marcou is the top returning defensive veteran entering the year. Marcou, who is an excellent two-way blueliner, finished last year with four goals and seven assists. Marcou is a two-year assistant captain as well.
- In 2011-12, Marcou has 14 points with 5 goals and 9 assists. Of those, his most memorable may well be his overtime game-winner against Vermont in Frozen Fenway 2012. It marked his first career-overtime game-winning goal and the first such goal since his brother James scored the game-winner at Yale in 2009. It was a fitting way to end the game in a baseball park with a walk-off winner.
- Marcou got the season started with a four-game scoring streak.

CONOR ALLEN TURNS THE HAT TRICK

- In the win over Holy Cross, Conor Allen put his name beside All-American Thomas Pock and all-star Marvin Degan as one of the three defensive skaters in UMass Division I history to post a hat trick in a game. Allen, normally known for his physical presence, also added an assist for a four point night. He earned Hockey East Player of the Week honors and INCH National Player of the Week Runner-Up accolades for the accomplishment.

BIG PHIL HAS A BIG SHOT

- Sophomore blueliner Adam Phillips not only made an impact on the defensive side of the ice, but his booming shot from the point on the power play and instinct on when to crash the net yielded 10 goals last year - the second most on the team. Of his 10 goals, Phillips led the team with five power play tallies alongside Danny Hobbs. Phillips was previously a forward before being converted to a defenseman in his year with the Indiana Ice.
- *Phillips was the only defenseman in Hockey East to have double digit goals, and was one of only six blueliners in the nation to reach 10 scores.*

NO LONGER ROOKIE BLUELINERS

- With as much offense that was lost following the 2009-10 season, the losses of Justin Braun, Martin Nolet and Matt Irwin on defense were overshadowed a bit. Sophomores Conor Allen, Joel Hanley, Colin Shea and Adam Phillips contributed right away - not just on regular shifts, but also on special teams. Shea finished the year with a goal and 4 assists, while Hanley had 3 goals and 15 assists. At 6-foot-1, 203 pounds, Allen provided a strong physical presence on the ice, while Phillips at 6-foot-6, also provided size on the blueline and had 10 goals and 5 assists.

BOYLE, MASTALERZ EARN FIRST CAREER WINS

- Of the three goalie rotation that UMass is sporting, both Kevin Boyle and Steve Mastalerz earned their first collegiate wins earlier this year. Boyle's first win came 5-3 over Bentley, while Mastalerz won 7-2 over Holy Cross.
- Boyle leads the trio in terms of wins with 5 and minutes played with 664:13.
- Mastalerz missed part of the beginning of the season due to injury, but has started six games with a team-best 2.94 GAA and a .910 save percentage. He made a season-high 35 saves against #4 Boston College and recorded his first career shutout, the program's first ever against the Eagles, en-route to first star of the game, Hockey East Defensive Player of the Week and co-UMass Athlete of the Week honors.

TEGLIA IMPROVING BETWEEN THE PIPES

- Sophomore Jeff Teglia learned a lot last season as the understudy to Paul Dainton who left UMass as one of the all-time great goalies. That has helped the Chicago native as Teglia has cut his goals-against-average by 1.4 goals per game. This season he has a 3.32 GAA and a .886 save percentage.
- Teglia earned his first career win this year in grand fashion with a 3-2 overtime victory over Vermont at Fenway Park as part of Frozen Fenway 2012. 'Tegs' made 24 saves including 10 in a scoreless third period and two from point-blank range in overtime. He was named the game's second star for his efforts.

ONE MOORE MINUTE TAKES YOU BEHIND THE SCENES OF UMASS HOCKEY

HOCKEY'S A FAMILY LEGACY

- For Eddie Olczyk, hockey is truly a family tradition. He grew up around NHL rinks as his father Ed, played 16 seasons in the NHL, was head coach of the Pittsburgh Penguins, and currently serves as an announcer for NBC and NBC Sports.

BATTLE OF THE BROTHERS

- Minuteman sophomore defenseman Colin Shea again faced his older brother Edwin this season UMass faces Boston College. Both Shea's played for the Boston Junior Bruins of the EJHL before attending college.

CAHOON BECOMES ALL-TIME WINNINGEST COACH IN UMASS HISTORY

- Head coach Don "Toot" Cahoon became the all-time winning head coach in UMass history on Dec. 12, 2008 with a 4-0 win over American International. The win over AIC gave Cahoon 121 career wins which surpassed UMass Hall of Famer Jack Canniff who had 120 wins in his career from 1967-79. He earned his 300th overall win as a head coach on Dec. 5, 2008 in a 5-1 win over Connecticut.
- Under Cahoon's tenure, UMass made its first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance (2007) and played for the Hockey East Championship title in 2003-04.
- Cahoon now has a 164-219-42 record at UMass in 11+ seasons. Overall, in 25 years as a head coach, Cahoon is 344-388-78.

CAHOON AMONG TOP 10 ACTIVE COACHES IN NCAA WINS

- With 344 career wins, UMass head coach Don "Toot" Cahoon ranks 10th among active NCAA coaches. Among the top 10 active coaches, Hockey East boasts four with Jerry York (BC, No. 1), Jack Parker (BU, No. 2), and Dick Umile (UNH, 7th) joining Cahoon.

- Fans in Boston will be able to listen to UMass hockey along with Coach Don Cahoon's weekly radio show on WWZN AM 1510 "The Zone" this season. The Zone joins WRNX 100.9 FM in Springfield - the flagship radio station of the UMass Sports Network - in carrying the Minutemen again this season.

OFFENSIVE OUTLOOK

- UMass returns seven of its top eight scorers from the 2010-11 season highlighted by Danny Hobbs, T.J. Syner and Michael Pereira who led the Minutemen in point production.
- Hobbs enjoyed a breakout year with a team-high 28 points on 12 goals (5 PP, 2 GWG) and 16 assists. Syner finished the year just a point behind (27) on the strength of a team-high 18 assists to go with nine goals.
- Pereira finished the year as a member of the Hockey East All-Rookie Team finishing second in newcomer scoring for the league - 25 points on 12 goals and 13 assists.
- All told, UMass returns 200-of-237 points from last season.

DEFENSIVE OUTLOOK

- Seven of eight blueliners return for 2011-12 led by senior and assistant captain Michael Marcou. For his career, Marcou has played in 83 games with 11 goals and 11 assists.
- Sophomores Joel Hanley, Adam Phillips, Conor Allen and Colin Shea played in nearly every game last season - experience that will translate into the upcoming season.
- Jeff Teglia is the incumbent goalie after backing up Paul Dainton a year ago. He played in nine games with four starts. Rookies Kevin Boyle and Steve Mastalerz will factor into playing time between the pipes as will senior Kevin Moore.

MINUTEMEN IN THE PROS UPDATE

JON QUICK - L.A. KINGS

- Quick earned his 100th career NHL win earlier this season and is 20-11-8 overall. He is allowing a 1.95 goals-against-average while posting a .934 save percentage. He currently has six shutouts on the year, including 3 straight which is a new L.A. Kings record.
- *Quick was named an 2011-12 NHL All-Star, the first ever from UMass and is the first goalie to represent the Kings organization in the All-Star Game in 30 years.*

JUSTIN BRAUN - SAN JOSE SHARKS

- *Named to the 2010-11 AHL All-Star Team*
- Throughout 2010-11, split time between the AHL Worcester Sharks and the NHL San Jose Sharks. Played in 28 games with 2 goals and 9 assists with San Jose. Also made one appearance in the NHL Playoffs last year.
- In 2011-12 has played in 6 games with AHL-affiliate Worcester before being called up on Oct. 22 by San Jose. Has dressed in 30 games with the NHL Sharks posting a goal and four assists.

CASEY WELLMAN - MINNESOTA WILD/HOUSTON AEROS

- Has split time between the AHL Houston Aeros and the NHL Minnesota Wild in 2011-12. Has played in 13 games with the Wild with 2 goals and 5 assists and in 20 games with the Aeros (11g, 8a).
- Also split time between Houston and Minnesota in 2010-11.
- Last season, helped the Aeros to the Calder Cup Finals playing in 66 total games scoring 20 goals with 26 assists.
- Also played in 15 games with the Wild making 15 appearances with one goal and one assist.

GREG MAULDIN - LAKE ERIE MONSTERS

- Currently playing for the AHL Lake Erie Monsters where he has 7 goals and 10 assists in 27 games this season.

In his tenure, he has teamed to win two Massachusetts Broadcaster awards and a MA/RI Associated Press award for Best Sports Broadcast.

Hines is the president of the Albert B. Allen Insurance Agency in Greenfield. He and his wife Laurie reside in Montague.

Don "Toot" Cahoon enters his 12th season at the helm of the University of Massachusetts hockey program, and his 25th overall. Under his guidance, UMass achieved its best season in school history in 2006-07 capped by a berth to the NCAA Tournament and the Minutemen's first NCAA win - a 1-0 overtime victory over Clarkson in the tournament's first round. Perhaps the most impressive statistic in Cahoon's eight years, however, has been the 78 Hockey East Academic All-Conference performers that have played under him, including six Distinguished Scholars and six Academic All-Star Team Members. He has also coached members of the University's prestigious Commonwealth College.

As head coach of the Minutemen, Cahoon has taken the program to new levels nationally and in Hockey East. In 2007-08, UMass earned its highest national ranking ever, No. 5, after a terrific start to the season and wins over Notre Dame and Colorado College for the Lightning College Hockey Classic Championship. It was the second time under Cahoon that the Minutemen had been ranked among the top seven teams in the country (the previous high ranking was No. 7 in 2003). Along with that, the Marblehead, Mass., native took UMass to its first ever NCAA Tournament in 2006-07 where the Mass Attack defeated Clarkson in the first round.

Part of the success that Cahoon has brought to UMass is in part to several All-American players during his tenure. Four of the seven All-Americans in program history have come during Cahoon's 11 years in Amherst: Thomas Pock (2004), Jon Quick (2007), James Marcou (2009) and Justin Braun (2010). Additionally, Pock and Quick also represented the program as participants in the Winter Olympics. Pock played for Austria in 2002, while Quick earned a spot on Team USA in 2010.

The 2006-07 campaign was one for the record books under Cahoon that fans will never forget. UMass posted its highest win total ever for a season (21) as part of the NCAA Tournament run. All told, 10 of those wins were against ranked teams. Cahoon guided the Minutemen to the Hockey East Tournament and to the program's second-ever berth to the HEA Semifinals. Another highlight of the unforgettable season was goaltender Jon Quick becoming just the fifth-ever All-American player (second in the modern era) for UMass when he was named to the RBK Division I Second-Team. With the team's success came a special honor for Cahoon as well as he was named the Coach of the Year by the New England Hockey Writers Association - his second such honor.

The 2008-09 campaign started with a 5-2-1 record including wins over No. 5 North Dakota and No. 1 and eventual National Champion Boston University, but the Minutemen struggled to find consistency throughout the year. The Mass Attack finished with a 6-6 mark against teams ranked in the nation's top-5 proving the Minutemen could play against the nation's elite. Sophomore James Marcou became just the sixth player in program history to earn All-America honors after he led the league in scoring - the first time a UMass player has led Hockey East in points.

The 2005-06 Minutemen gave fans some of the most memorable wins over ranked opponents in the program's history. UMass defeated then-No. 3 Boston College, No. 3 Colorado College, No. 5 Vermont, No. 9 New Hampshire, No. 13 Vermont and No. 14 Boston University. Marvin Degon also became one of the most prolific defensemen in the nation, heading to the AHL after the season concluded.

In the three seasons prior, the Minutemen registered a 41-52-9 overall record and they were ranked for most of the 2003-04 season and reached the Hockey East title game, falling in an epic three-overtime battle against Maine. The 2002-03 squad advanced to the Hockey East Semifinals for the first time in school history and recorded the highest Hockey East finish in school history. For his efforts, Cahoon was named Hockey East Coach of the Year and New England Coach of the Year.

The 2001-02 edition of the UMass hockey team was a young squad that earned eight wins throughout the season. However, the Minutemen were ex-

tremely competitive, appearing in 13 one-goal games. The 2001-02 team also captured Hockey East's prestigious Charles E. Holt Team Sportsmanship Award for the first time in school history.

In his first year with the Minutemen, he guided UMass to an 8-22-4 record, including seven Hockey East wins, which was the second-most league wins in school history.

Cahoon came to UMass from Princeton, where he rebuilt the Tigers struggling hockey program. He led the Tigers to their first-ever ECAC Tournament title, as well as the school's first NCAA Tournament appearance in 1998, and produced five seasons of 18-plus wins over the last nine years.

Cahoon made an immediate impact when he took over the coaching reins at Princeton in 1991. During his first season as the head coach, he led the Tigers to a 12-14-1 overall record and the ECAC quarterfinals. In 1994-95, Cahoon's Tigers beat then-top-ranked and unbeaten Maine in Orono in the Dexter Classic championship game en route to their first winning season in over a quarter century. It also marked the first time in school history that Princeton advanced to the ECAC finals. Following the season, Cahoon was named a finalist for American Hockey Coaches Association Division I Coach of the Year honors. In 1997-98, Cahoon guided Princeton to its first-ever ECAC title and first-ever appearance in the NCAA Tournament. His teams have also enjoyed success in regular season tournaments. While at Princeton, the Tigers won the Dexter Classic (1994), the Capital District Christmas Classic in Ottawa (1995) and the Mariucci Classic (1998).

Prior to his head coaching position at Princeton, Cahoon served as an assistant under Jack Parker at Boston University, helping guide the Terriers to the 1990-91 NCAA national championship game, which they eventually lost in three overtimes. The 1990-91 season at Boston University marked Cahoon's third stint as an assistant with the Terriers. He was also an assistant there from 1974-79 and during the 1987-88 season. Cahoon was primarily responsible for recruiting the players on the 1977-78 team that won the NCAA championship.

He began his coaching career as the head coach at Lehigh University (1973-74) where he guided the Engineers to the Mid-Atlantic Conference title with a 10-5-2 record before moving on to Boston University.

Cahoon then became the head coach at Norwich University from 1979-82, where he compiled a 48-35-2 record while leading Norwich to the ECAC Division II playoffs in each of his three seasons. In 1982, Cahoon went overseas to serve as the director of hockey operations and head coach of the Vienna Ice Club in the Austrian Ice Hockey Federation where he led the team to a 23-12-2 record. He returned to the United States the following season as an assistant at the University of Lowell, where he stayed until 1986.

Cahoon has scouted for the then-Minnesota North Stars of the National Hockey League and the 1984 U.S. Olympic Team. He also served as head coach of the 1990 U.S. Select 16 Team. Cahoon has coached two U.S. Olympic Festival teams in 1982 and 1990 and was an assistant for the U.S. Junior National Team in 1991 and 1995.

A 1972 graduate of Boston University with a B.S. in education, Cahoon played left wing for the Terriers, earning two national championship rings as an instrumental part of both the 1971 and 1972 NCAA championship teams. Following his career with the Terriers, Cahoon represented the United States at the 1972 World Championships, helping the national team to capture the silver medal in Bucharest, Romania. He then signed a contract with the New England Whalers of the World Hockey Association after graduation.

Cahoon was born April 13, 1949, in Lynn, Mass. He graduated from Marblehead High School before attending Kimball Union Academy in Meriden, N.H.

He and his wife, Cindy, have two children, Christopher (32) and Heidi (31), and three grandkids, Jason (15), Makayla (12) and Shaun (7). The Cahoons reside in Amherst.

Former Niagara and UMass Lowell head coach Blaise MacDonald was named assistant coach for the University of Massachusetts men's ice hockey team as announced on Tuesday, July 19, 2011 by head coach Don "Toot" Cahoon.

The addition of MacDonald makes UMass the only program in Hockey East where both assistant coaches have NCAA Division I head coaching experience. Returning assistant coach Len Quesnelle, former head coach at Princeton, enters his eighth season behind the bench for the Minutemen.

The Billerica, Mass., native joins UMass after spending 10 seasons leading UMass Lowell - a span which included three 20-win seasons and a 19-win showing in 2009-10. The River Hawks advanced to the Hockey East Tournament semifinals twice (2002, 2009) in his tenure including an appearance in the championship game in 2009 - just the second-ever appearance in the league title game for UMass Lowell.

He finished his stint in Lowell with an overall record of 150-178-44 which included a mark of 93-126-33 in Hockey East play.

MacDonald came to Lowell after a five-year head coaching stint at Niagara University where he founded the ice hockey program and brought the Purple Eagles to the NCAA Tournament quarterfinal in only four seasons. He compiled an all-time record of 91-58-17 in five seasons with the Purple Eagles (.548), highlighted by a 30-8-4 overall clip and a 15-0-2 finish in College Hockey America in 1999-00.

A 1985 graduate of Rochester Institute of Technology, MacDonald was an All-American defenseman in his senior season. He led the Tigers to the NCAA Division II championship in 1983 and 1985. He helped RIT defeat UMass Lowell, 5-1, in the 1983 Tournament semifinal at Tully Forum. During his career, MacDonald set former RIT records for career assists (106) and points (119) by a defenseman. He was inducted into the RIT Hall of Fame in 1991.

MacDonald holds dual citizenship with Canada as his parents hail from Nova Scotia. He and his wife, Carol, are the parents of four children - sons Cameron, Joseph, and Jacob, and daughter Carly.

Len Quesnelle is in his eighth season as an assistant coach of the Minutemen after serving as the head coach at Princeton for four seasons.

During Quesnelle's four years at Princeton, he holds the distinction of being the only coach in school history to lead the Tigers to consecutive winning seasons in the Eastern College Athletic Conference. Princeton posted a 9-9-4 conference record in 2000-01 and played to a 10-10-2 mark in 2001-02.

Quesnelle spent 12 years as an assistant coach at Princeton before being named the program's 14th head coach in the spring of 2000. He spent the previous nine years as the senior assistant coach on Don Cahoon's staff.

In Quesnelle's second season as head coach, the Tigers put together a late-season run to finish in a three-way tie with Brown and Colgate for sixth place in the conference standings. Princeton earned the sixth seed going into the playoffs, bettering the predictions of both the preseason coaches and media polls. The coaches had the Tigers pegged to finish 11th, while the media picked them to finish seventh.

In his inaugural season as head coach, Quesnelle led the Tigers to a 10-16-5 overall record, including a 9-9-4 ECAC mark. It was only the sixth time since 1961-62 that the Tigers finished with a .500-or-better ECAC record.

Following his graduation from Princeton in 1988, Quesnelle remained with the Tigers as an assistant coach on Jim Higgins' staff while pursuing a business career with a consulting firm in Princeton.

In 1991 his familiarity with team personnel and the recruiting process at Princeton helped to ease the transition into the Cahoon era.

A native of Bramalea, Ontario, Quesnelle was a standout defenseman at Princeton, appearing in 106 games and earning All-Ivy League honors as well as the Class of 1941 Championship Award for winning spirit. He played junior hockey for the Bramalea Blues from 1982-84.

Quesnelle has served as director of the Princeton University Hockey Camp and is a frequent speaker and instructor at camps throughout North America.

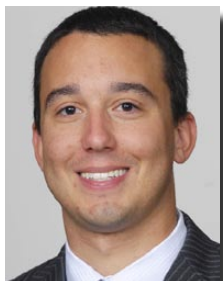
