FRIDAY NIGHT LIGHTS! #12 UMass AT YALE LAX

- The UMass lacrosse team will play its first night game in six seasons on Friday night as the No. 12 Minutemen travel to New Haven to face the Yale Bulldogs at Reese Stadium. Face-off is set for 7 p.m. Live audio of the game will be available on UMassAthletics.com.
- The Minutemen are chomping at the bit to get back on the field after having their game at Ohio State postponed last Saturday as the team was unable to travel to Columbus due to weather conditions.
- UMass stands at 2-0 and ranked No. 12 in the USILA Coaches Poll and No. 16 in the Nike/Inside Lacrosse Media Poll. The Minutemen have picked up a 20-10 win over Hartford and a 15-12 season-opening victory at Sacred Heart.
- Yale is 1-0 with a 14-7 win over Holy Cross in their season opener last Saturday at home. The Bulldogs are receiving votes in the latest USILA Coaches Poll.

UNDER THE LIGHTS

- This will be UMass' first night game since April 9, 2004, a 16-4 win over Manhattan at Garber Field in Amherst.
- UMass has not played a road night game since April 26, 2002 at Syracuse, an 18-10 defeat.
- Last season, UMass' NCAA Tournament game at Princeton on May 10, 2009 began at 5 p.m., and finished under the lights, but began in daylight.

UMass Lax Facts

- UMass and Yale will play for the 25th time on Friday with the Minutemen holding an 18-6 edge in the series.
- Yale head coach Andy Shay was an assistant at UMass from 2000-03.
- UMass ranks second in the NCAA in goals per game with 17.5.
- UMass is playing its first night game since April 9, 2004 a 16-4 win over Manhattan at Garber Field.
- UMass' last road night game was at Syracuse on April 26, 2002.
- Bobby Hayes and Ryan Hantverk are tied for 19th in the NCAA in points per game with 4.5 points per game.
- Will Manny is 11th in the NCAA in assists per game with 2.5.
- Sophomore Tom Celentani is third in the NCAA in caused turnovers with seven (3.5 per game).
- Sophomore Greg Rushing has won 22-of-36 face-offs for 61 percent.
- UMass has its most goals in its first two games since 1990, with 35 total goals.
- Over the last 10 years, UMass has the eighth-most wins among lacrosse programs. The Minutemen are 93-46 (.667) since 2001.
- UMass has won 45 games in a row when scoring 11 or more goals including both this season.
- The Minutemen have won 34 of their last 35 games when reaching double-figures.
- Coming into 2010, UMass returned just 41 of its 143 goals from last season, just 28.7 percent.
- This is UMass' first year in the CAA after playing in the ECAC since 2000.

- UMass has scored 15 and 20 in its two wins this season. The 20-goal showing vs. Hartford was the most since 2002.

FAMILIAR FACE ON YALE SIDELINES

- UMass will be taking on former Minuteman assistant coach Andy Shay, who worked under Greg Cannella in Amherst from 2000-03. Shay is in his sixth year with the Bulldogs. Shay, a two-time captain at LeMoyne College, was part of two UMass NCAA Quarterfinals teams as an assistant coach before coming to Yale. Shay worked for Cannella, who is in his 16th year as the Minutemen's head coach. Cannella (133-84) has taken his squad to seven NCAA tournaments and has seven wins from those appearances.

THE SERIES WITH YALE

- UMass holds an 18-6 lead in the all-time series with Yale. The Bulldogs have won the last two of the last three meetings and the teams have split the last six.
- UMass rebounded from two losses in a row with an 18-6 win last season at home on Feb. 28.
- They took the last game in New Haven against the No. 14 Minutemen, 7-4. Two years ago, Yale pulled off a 7-6 win at Garber Field on March 3, 2007. It was just Yale's second-ever win in Amherst and first since 1990, when the Bulldogs reached the NCAA Final Four.
- In games played in New Haven, UMass leads 9-4 including a 14-11 comeback victory in 2006.
- The teams played 14 consecutive times, from 1983 to 1996, in which the Minutemen were victorious 12 times. UMass won six contests in a row from 1991 to 1996.
- UMass has won 11 of the last 15 games.

**LAST YEAR VS. YALE: FEB. 28, 2009
 #20 UMASS 18, YALE 6**

AMHERST, Mass. - The UMass men's lacrosse team rode a career-high seven goals from Jim Connolly and strong goaltending from Doc Schneider to a convincing 18-6 win over Yale at Garber Field. Connolly's seven tallies were the most since Jeff Zywicki had seven in 2003 and one shy of the school record. Tim Balise added four goals and an assist while Schneider finished with 14 saves.

UMass avenged consecutive losses to Yale (7-6 in 2007 and 7-4 in 2008) with its high scoring game in four years since an 18-8 win over Penn State on (4/2/05) and its largest margin of victory +12 since a 16-4 win over Manhattan (4/9/04). The Minutemen have scored 43 goals in their first three games, the most they have tallied in the first three games of the season since 2001, when they netted 45 in the first trio of action.

The Minutemen got contributions from many different players on both ends of the field in opening a 12-2 halftime lead. Overall, eight different players scored goals including a pair by sophomore Ryan Marcus and single tallies by Ryan Bagnasco, Anthony Biscardi, Evan Blum, Ryan Hantverk and Art Kell, who scored his first-career goal. The defense was equally stout as Schneider equalled his career-best, allowing just four goals.

UMass jumped all over the Bulldogs from the opening whistle as the Minutemen scored the first four goals, all in the first 10 minutes. Yale's Matt Gibson scored to end the run, but Connolly's second of the game gave UMass a 5-1 lead after the first period.

The second quarter was total domination by the Minutemen as they scored seven goals in the period with Connolly scoring three in that period including one with seven-tenths of a second in the fist half for the 12-2 bulge.

The Minutemen had a run of eight goals in a row spanning 25 minutes from the second through the fourth quarter. Balise wrapped the spurt with UMass' third-man up goal of the game, 21 second in the fourth quarter, putting the Minutemen up 15-2.

In front of Schneider, the defense was impressive led by starting close defensemen Brennan Mack, Diogo Godoi and Travis Tripucka, making his first-college start. Also, short-stick defensive midfielder Stephen Zorkers scored up three groundballs and caused four turnovers.

OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION EARLY ON

- The offense has been headed up a pair of midfielders in senior captain **Bobby Hayes** (7 goals, 2 assists) and junior **Ryan Hantverk** (6 goals, 3 assists). Both players have nine points (4.5 per game) to rank tied for 19th in the nation in points per game. Hayes is 16th in goals per game (3.5) and Hantverk is 18th (3.0).
- Fellow middle junior **Anthony Biscardi** (4 goals, 4 assists) has eight points (4.0 per game). On attack, sophomore **Art Kell** has five goals and two assists while CAA Rookie of the Week freshman **Will Manny** leads the team with five assists to go along with two goals for seven points. Manny's 2.5 assists per game ranks 11th in the NCAA.
- Freshman **Kyle Smith** has two goals and three assists and fellow attackers **Ryan Liebel** and **Ryan Smith** each have three goals.

20-GOAL OUTBURST VS. HARTFORD

- UMass had its highest scoring game in eight years with a 20-10 win over Hartford in the home opener on Feb. 20. The 20 goals were the most since a 21-9 win over Rutgers on May 4, 2002. **Ryan Hantverk** led the way with a career-high four goals while **Ryan Smith** scored the first three goals of his career for a hat trick. **Bobby Hayes** also had a hat trick for the second game in a row.
- The Minutemen jumped out to a 13-7 halftime lead, marking the most goals in a half since that same Rutgers game in 2002. Against the Scarlet Knights, UMass had a 14-goal second half including an 11-goal fourth quarter. Against Hartford, UMass led 8-2 after the first 15 minutes with five goals in the game's first 6:34.

BEST SCORING START IN 20 YEARS

- With 35 goals in the first two games, UMass has its best offensive start to a season since 1990, when the Minutemen tallied 55 goals in its first two games. In a trip to Arizona, UMass beat the Wildcats, 27-8 and Whittier College, 28-7 in back-to-back games. That was followed up with a 16-15 loss to Cornell, for a total of 70 goals in the first three games.
- Last season, UMass opened the season with 25 goals in the first two games and 43 in the first three games after a season-best 18-6 win vs. Yale.

MANNY NAMED CAA ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

- Freshman attacker **Will Manny** was named the CAA Rookie of the Week on Feb. 22 after a seven-point effort in the first two games of the season. Manny is among the national leaders in assists with five, ranking fifth in the country.

BIG WINNERS OVER LAST 8 YEARS

- UMass has established itself as one of the top programs in the nation. Since 2001, UMass has the seventh-most wins of any program in college lacrosse with 92 victories.
- The Minutemen have the ninth-best mark among all teams in the NCAA since 2001 with an 93-46 record for a 66.7 win percentage mark. That includes five seasons with 12 or more wins including a school record 13 wins in 2002, 2003, 2005 and 2006. The Minutemen were second on the list coming into the 2007 season.

LUCKY NUMBER 11

- UMass has won **45 games in a row when scoring 11 or more goals** with the two wins this season. That includes four 11-plus efforts in 2009. UMass beat Rutgers 11-10 in overtime in the regular-season finale to go along with 12-6 wins over Fairfield (4/21) and St. John's (4/4) and a 18-6 win over Yale (2/28).
- The streak goes back over the last eight years in 2002 – meaning the last four senior classes have never lost when scoring 11 or more goals. UMass' last loss when they had more than 11 came in the 2002 NCAA Quarterfinals, a 13-12 loss at Johns Hopkins.
- UMass is 34-1 in its last 35 games when scoring double-figures, starting 2-0 this year and a 5-1 mark last year. UMass had won 29 games in a row when scoring 10 or more goals, but that streak was snapped with a 11-10 loss to Hofstra on Feb. 21, 2009. The Minutemen were 29-0 when scoring 10 or more goals from 2004-09. Prior to the loss at Hofstra, the last loss when scoring 10 goals came on May 1, 2004, a 17-10 loss at Syracuse.

THUMBNAIL SKETCH OF THE MINUTEMEN

- Coming off the program's 18th NCAA Tournament appearance, the UMass men's lacrosse team is in its 57 season, starting in 1954. All-time, UMass has a 472-245-3 record.
- The Minutemen are ranked 14th in this week's USILA Coaches Poll and 18th in the Inside Lacrosse Media Poll.
- Last season, the Minutemen finished 9-6 overall and captured the ECAC Championship with a 6-1 league record. UMass fell to Princeton in the NCAA Tournament First Round, 10-7, in New Jersey.
- Head coach **Greg Cannella** is in his 16th season as head coach at his alma mater. Overall, the 1988 UMass grad has a 133-84 career record, winning more than 61.3 percent of the games he has coached. He ranks

among the Top 15 among active coaches in the NCAA in career wins and win percentage.

- The Minutemen are beginning play in a new league in 2010, the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA). UMass made the move to the league after a national shuffle caused by the formation of the Big East Conference in lacrosse. The Minutemen joined the CAA along with former ECAC member Penn State and will compete in a six-team league along with longtime CAA members Delaware, Drexel, Hofstra and Towson.
- Coming into 2010, UMass will have plenty of new faces in key positions. The Minutemen graduated All-Conference players including ECAC Goalie of the Year and Second-Team All-American **Doc Schneider** (7.43 GAA and 65.3 Save Pct.) along with its two leading scorers in **Tim Balise** (31 goals, 5 assists for 36 points) and **Jim Connolly** (39-5=44). Also, graduated were the fourth and fifth leading scorers in **Evan Blum** (14-8-22) and **Rory Pedrick** (12-6=18). Overall, UMass returned just 41 goals of its 143 goals from last season, just 28.7 percent. The leading returning scorer is senior captain midfielder **Bobby Hayes** (12-14=26), who led the team in assists in 2009. Fellow senior captain attackman **Ryan Smith** is expected to pick up some of the load in his first season as a starter. Sophomore **Art Kell** was the top rookie scorer a year ago with 11 goals and three assists and will be back to start on attack.
- The goalie position will have a new face for the first time in four years as Schneider graduated as one of the all-time greats in UMass history. He finished second in career saves with 753 and is now serving as an assistant coach with the Minutemen. Redshirt sophomore **Tim McCormack** and freshman **Steve Mahle** battled for the starting role in preseason camp with McCormack getting the nod to start the year. McCormack redshirted last season to retain three years of eligibility while Mahle was starring at West Genesee High School in upstate New York.
- An area with experience heading into 2010 is the close defense, as UMass returns 2009 All-American and 2010 Preseason All-American **Diogo Godoi** as a senior captain. Godoi will team with returning sophomore **Greg Anderson** and junior **Travis Tripucka**. That duo shared starting duties last season along side Godoi and graduated **Brennan Mack**. Sophomore **Tom Celentani** has also seen extended playing time on close defense. Junior long-pole **Casey Rahn** and junior short-stick **Stephen Zorkers** will also be key to the defense's success.

GODOI A PRESEASON SECOND-TEAM ALL-AMERICAN

- Senior captain defenseman **Diogo Godoi** was named an Inside Lacrosse Face-Off Magazine Preseason All-American. He was an Honorable Mention USILA All-American last season. He will return for his senior year with numerous honors as has been also named an All-ECAC First Team defender and an All-New England pick. He anchored a UMass defense that finished the season 11th nationally in fewest goals allowed (7.93). He shut down the opponent's top scorer on numerous occasions, including in the NCAA Tournament contest at Princeton when he held the Tigers' top scorer Jack McBride (a Second-Team All-American) pointless. He started all 15 games while recording 28 groundballs and 21 caused turnovers, tied for most on team. He was twice named to Inside Lacrosse Team of the Week on March 23 and April 6.

UMASS PICKED SECOND IN CAA; TRIO EARN HONORS

- UMass was picked to finish second in the CAA based on the preseason lacrosse coaches poll. Hofstra was selected to win the league in the coaches' vote. The Minutemen placed three players on the preseason All-CAA team in senior midfielder **Bobby Hayes**, junior long-stick midfielder **Casey Rahn** and senior defenseman **Diogo Godoi**. The three selections was the second most in the league behind Delaware's four picks. This is UMass' first year in the CAA after playing in the ECAC, a league UMass captured the crown in last season.

UMASS WINS 2009 ECAC CHAMPIONSHIP

- UMass won its fourth ECAC Championship in its final season in the league, before moving to the CAA in 2010. The Minutemen won the league in thrilling fashion as **Tim Balise** scored the game-winning overtime goal, his fifth of the game for the 11-10 victory at Rutgers (5/2). Balise and classmate **Jim Connolly** (3) combined for eight goals in the win. **Doc Schneider** made 19 saves including one off the opening face-off win by the Rutgers.
- The Minutemen also captured the league crown in 2001, 2002 and 2005. In 2002 UMass also claimed the league's automatic qualifier. The Minutemen lost the tiebreaker to Georgetown in 2001 and in 2005, the league did not have an AQ.
- UMass ended in a tie with Loyola atop the ECAC at 6-1, but claimed the crown by virtue of its 8-6 win at Loyola on March 21.

UMASS CLAIMS 2009 ECAC HONORS

- ECAC Lacrosse Champion UMass collected three of the top honors in the conference on Tuesday as **Greg Cannella** was named the Coach of the Year, senior attacker **Jim Connolly** was named the Offensive Player of the Year and senior **Doc Schneider** was named the Goalie of the Year. Connolly and Schneider were joined on the ECAC First-Team by senior attacker **Tim Balise** and junior defenseman **Diogo Godoi**. Junior midfielder **Bobby Hayes** was named to the second team.

UMASS IN THE NCAA TOURNEY

- Last year was the Minutemen's 18th NCAA appearance, the ninth-most of any program in NCAA history.
- In 2006, with wins over No. 6 seed Cornell, No. 3 seed Hofstra, No. 2 seed Maryland UMass was the first unseeded team to reach the NCAA Finals since the 1997 Maryland team -- and just the fourth team all-time to reach the final as an unseeded team.
- UMass has made the NCAA's five times in the 2000s (2002, 2003, 2005, 2006 and 2009). UMass is 9-17 all-time in NCAA Tournament games. The Minutemen have won at least one game in five NCAA postseason appearances in a row winning first round games in 1997, 2002, 2003, 2005 and 2006. In addition to the 2006 NCAA Finals run, the Minutemen advanced 11 times in their history.
- 2006 was the first time UMass won two games in an NCAA Tournament. Prior to 2006 UMass had been to the most NCAA Tournaments without a berth in the NCAA Semifinals. In addition to last year, the Minutemen reached the quarterfinals in 2002 after defeating Fairfield, 17-4 in the first round but lost to Johns Hopkins 13-12 in overtime. In 2003 after beating Hofstra, 9-6 in the first round, UMass fell to Maryland, 13-7 at Syracuse.

ATTENDANCE RECORD SETTERS

- With a UMass record 13,722 in attendance at McGuirk Stadium for the Syracuse game on April 25, 2009 the school moved to fifth in 2009 average attendance leaders. UMass averaged 2,930 fans per game in 2009 behind No. 1 Syracuse (6,287), Ohio State (5,762), Navy (5,263) and Johns Hopkins (3,706).
- The mark of 13,722 broke the former UMass record of 12,143 set in 1989, also against Syracuse. That crowd was the 25th-largest regular-season lacrosse crowd all-time in the NCAA and 19th-largest at an on-campus facility. In 2009, UMass' mark was the seventh-highest as Ohio State set a new regular-season record with 30,192, also on April 25.
- Most of the biggest crowds for UMass lacrosse have been against the Orange. The second-largest showing was on May 8, 1987 when 9,325 came out for SU at McGuirk. The largest crowd on record at Garber Field (called Boyden Field at the time) was 7,500 for an April 26, 1986 game against Army. That overflow crowd led to some games being moved to McGuirk in 1987.
- Prior to April 25th game, the most recent lacrosse game at McGuirk Stadium on May 4, 1997 drew 5,675. The previous game at McGuirk on May 6, 1991 brought in 5,631.
- The largest crowds ever to watch UMass play came in the 2006 NCAA Semi-final and Finals at Lincoln Financial Field in Philadelphia. The 2006 Final Four, where UMass beat Maryland, 8-5, drew 49,562 on May 27. For the final against Virginia, 47,062 came out to watch on Memorial Day May 29.

FAIRFIELD, Conn. - After seeing a five-goal halftime lead evaporate early in the fourth quarter, UMass scored four of the game's final five goals to knock off Sacred Heart, 15-12 in the season opener for both teams. Bobby Hayes notched a career-high four goals as five different players had multi-goal efforts, all signifying career-bests. Art Kell had his first hat trick and added an assist for four points. Ryan Hantverk and Ryan Liebel along with Anthony Biscardi all tallied a pair.

Sacred Heart's tenacious comeback was keyed by Timmy Katz and Matt Ferrino, who each had three goals.

UMass outshot the Pioneers, 55-32 and outgroundballed them, 39-31. Both teams were aggressive as the game saw a combined 19 penalties and eight man-up goals (five by Sacred Heart). Hayes had all three of UMass man-up tallies,

With the game tied at 11, Kell scored his third goal of the game on a wraparound the left post to regain the lead for UMass at 12-11 with 8:50 left in the fourth and they would lead the rest of the way. Liebel notched the first of his UMass career to give the Minutemen a 13-11 advantage with 7:00 left in the fourth.

Ferrino tallied his third of the game with 5:58 left to cut the UMass lead to 13-12. Freshman Will Manny scored just inside the right post with 4:40 left to take a 14-12 lead then Liebel scored his second in a 3-minute span off a Manny feed for a 15-12 win.

Down by five at halftime, Sacred Heart tied the game at 11 on Katz third goal of the game, on a man-up, with 10:15 left in the fourth. They had gotten back to within one at 11-10 as Ferrino scored on a man-up opportunity where the Minutemen had three players in the penalty box with 10:43 left in the fourth.

The Minutemen took early control of the game midway through the second quarter scoring six of the final eight goals of the quarter to lead 9-4 at halftime. Hayes notched three goals in the second quarter as he started the scoring with a top shelf shot 53 seconds into the quarter and finished the tallying with a man-up goal with 26 seconds left in the second.

In between the Hayes' initial and final goal, he also scored on a pretty quick stick off a pass from Manny on a man-up opportunity with 2:39 left in the quarter. UMass' specialty teams were strong with Hayes' two man-up goals in the quarter. Biscardi also scored his second of the game on a man-down situation with 6:53 left in the second on a fast-break chance off a pass from Stephen Zorkers.

The prettiest goal of the quarter came from Christian Hain as he scooped in a low backhand off a pass from Biscardi with 1:02 left in the quarter.

Sacred Heart made a nice comeback in the third quarter with the final four goals of the quarter. Katz netted back-to-back goals and Chris Casey added another to cut the deficit to 10-9 with 2:02 left in the third.

Hayes ended the bleeding with his third goal of the game less than two minutes into the fourth quarter, giving the Minutemen an 11-9 lead.

AMHERST, Mass. - The UMass men's lacrosse team scored the most goals in a game in eight seasons, as the Minutemen pounded Hartford 20-10 on a sunny afternoon at Garber Field. In the season's home opener, junior Ryan Hantverk scored a career high four goals, as six different Minutemen had multi-goal games. UMass also tied its school record for man-up goals in a game with six. The Minute-men improve to 2-0 overall while the Hawks fall to 0-1.

Senior captains Bobby Hayes and Ryan Smith each scored three goals in the win. For Smith, the goals were the first three of his career. Hayes now leads UMass with seven goals. Art Kell, Kyle Smith, and Anthony Biscardi all scored a pair.

Seven different Minutemen had at least three points as Hantverk added two assists for a career-high six points. Hayes also had two helpers for a career-high five points. Will Manny scored a goal and added three assists for four points.

Hartford was led by Jared Franze, who had four goals. Justin Bearse had two goals and two assists.

UMass jumped out to a 5-0 lead just 6:34 into the game and never looked back.

The six man-up goals equaled the mark set in 1999 vs. Fairfield and in 2005 at Johns Hopkins. Kyle Smith and Biscardi each scored two on EMO.

The first half was 30 minutes with a total of 20 goals, eight scorers for UMass, and the most goals in a half in eight seasons for the Minutemen. The last time the Minutemen scored 13 goals in a half was in a 21-9 victory at Rutgers on May 4, 2002. That was also the last time that UMass cracked the 20-goal barrier in a game, for its most goals in eight years.

UMass took a 13-7 lead into intermission as Hantverk tallied a first-half hat trick. The trio of Hayes, Kell, and Ryan Smith all added two goals a piece to round out the multi-goal scorers for the Minutemen in the first 30 minutes of play. Adding single goals in the first-half were Christian Hain, Biscardi, Will Manny, and Kyle Smith. Both Ryan and Kyle Smith notched their first career goals in the first half.

Highlighting the first half for Hartford was Franze who had the hat-trick to lead the way. Bearse also added two goals for the Hawks in the first half.

The second half did not cease action as UMass added seven goals, while holding Hartford to a three. The Minutemen had seven different scorers in the second as Kyle Smith, Biscardi, Hayes, Hantverk, K.R. Jurgelevich, Ryan Liebel, and Ryan Smith all tallied a goal. The goal for Jurgelevich was also the first of his career.

CANNELLA

Recognized as one of the nation's top lacrosse coaches, Greg Cannella is in his 16th year at the helm of the University of Massachusetts program. Cannella has brought his Minutemen to seven NCAA Tournaments, winning seven tournament games since 1997, claiming six New England championships including 2006, won the 2001, 2002, 2005 and 2009 ECAC Lacrosse titles. He was named ECAC Coach of the Year for the fourth time in 2009, joining his selections in 2009, 2004, 2002, and 2001 and New England Coach of the Year four times including the last two seasons. He was named the 2006 USILA National Coach of the Year after leading UMass to its first-ever lacrosse NCAA Championship game.

In 2009, Cannella led UMass back to the NCAA Tournament for the seventh time in his tenure and 18th in program history as the Minutemen won the ECAC with a 6-1 league record.

Cannella led UMass to its most memorable season in 2006. As an unseeded team, UMass had the most difficult path to a lacrosse championship game in history, beating the No. 2, 3 and 4 ranked teams in the nation. UMass topped No. 2 seed Maryland, 8-5 in the semifinals after advancing its first Final Four with a stunning 11-10 overtime win over Hofstra on May 20, 2006. The miracle comeback saw the Minutemen rally from a 10-5 deficit with 8:03 left in the fourth quarter as UMass won its quarterfinal game at Stony Brook.

The 2006 season saw UMass produce two first-team USILA All-Americans for the first time in school history with Sean Morris on attack and Jack Reid being honored on defense. Jake Deane was also named an honorable mention All-American.

For the second year in a row, Morris was named a finalist for the Tewaaraton Trophy as the top player in all of college lacrosse.

UMass had the second-winningest program in all of college lacrosse over six years from 2001-06 with a 70-24 record since. Only Johns Hopkins had won at a better rate than UMass' 75-percent win mark. Over six years (2001-07), UMass was an amazing 43-6 at home at Garber Field (88 percent).

Cannella won his 100th career game on March 11, 2006, when UMass beat Harvard, 12-7. He led UMass to the NCAA Quarterfinals with a 10-9 win over No. 6 seed Cornell on May 13, 2006.

Cannella led UMass to 58 wins over the last five years (2002-2006), the winningest five-year span in the program's history.

A 1988 UMass graduate Cannella took the reigns of the UMass lacrosse program in the fall of 1994 with a great understanding of the program's storied history. He was a two-time letterwinner under the legendary Dick Garber in the mid-1980s and an assistant coach for two seasons with the Minutemen. Cannella is just the fourth head coach in the program's history.

The 2005 season will go down as one of the most successful in school history as the Minutemen tied the school record for wins a 13-3 record. UMass advanced to the NCAA Quarterfinals for the 10th time in school history while winning the ECAC and New England Championships.

The season was historic as UMass knocked off Syracuse twice in a three-week span including a 16-15 win in the NCAA First Round to end the Orange's 22-year run of reaching the NCAA Semifinals. UMass was featured on ESPN's SportsCenter as well as in Sports Illustrated after the monumental win.

Cannella continued to coach some of the nation's top players as attackman Sean Morris was selected as UMass' first-ever finalist for the Tewaaraton Trophy as the sport's top college player. Morris was one of four All-Americans on the 2005 team which also featured seven All-New England selections.

The 2003 UMass squad tied a school record with 13 victories, advanced to the NCAA quarterfinals for only the fifth time in school history and was ranked as high as No. 3 in the country, the highest ranking ever for the Minutemen. In addition, the Minutemen ended a 24-game losing streak to Syracuse, becoming the first UMass team to defeat the Orangemen in over two decades.

Prior to returning to his alma mater, Cannella spent four years as an assistant coach at Stony Brook from 1988-92. Cannella served as the offensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator on John Espey's staff. He earned a master's degree in liberal studies while coaching at Stony Brook.

Cannella earned a bachelor's degree in physical education while playing at Massachusetts from 1986-87. He was a two-year starter for the Minutemen and a member of two NCAA Tournament teams. Cannella scored 64 points (33 goals, 31 assists) in his UMass career.

Prior to playing at UMass, Cannella spent one year at Nassau (N.Y.) Community College, where he was a first team All-America selection and led Nassau to the 1985 Junior College national title.

A native of Lynbrook, N.Y., Cannella played for three years at Lynbrook High School. One of the most prolific scorers in Lynbrook history, Cannella was a high school All-America selection and still ranks among Lynbrook's all-time leading scorers.

Cannella served as the President of the New England Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association in 1998, 1999 and 2000, and served as the Vice President in 1997. Cannella is currently the chairman of the annual NEILA Scholar Athlete Team, which he started in 1999. He has also served on the NCAA Championships Regional Advisory Committee that selected the teams for the NCAA Tournament in 1997, 1998, 1999, 2002, 2003, and 2004. Cannella was a regional voter in the USILA/STX weekly poll from 1997-2001, as well as a USILA regional voter for All-Americans since 2003. He now serves on the prestigious committee to help select the Tewaaraton Award, a honor given to the nation's top player.

Cannella was born on Sept. 2, 1965, in Rockville Centre, N.Y. He and his wife, Laurie, reside in Hadley with their son Vance (8), and daughter Virginia (6).
