## 2012 CAMPAIGN GETS UNDERWAY AS MASSACHUSETTS HEADS TO ARMY

- The 2012 season officially gets underway on Friday afternoon as the #11 UMass men's lacrosse team heads to Army for a 1 PM opening face-off at iconic Michie Stadium. Last season saw the Minutemen win a tight one over the Black Knights in Amherst as the rivalry between the two programs was renewed for the first time since 1998.
- Fans can listen to the game on 91.1 FM WMUA as Pat O'Neil and Norm Smith call the action. Links to the broadcast online can be found at UMassAthletics.com along with live stats via GameTracker.
- A live video stream of the game will also be available through UMass All-Access which is a subscription based service. The streaming video works best on a high-speed internet connection. Monthly packages begin at \$9.95 which includes all games from sponsored CBS College Sports-affiliated schools.

### LAST TIME VS. ARMY

- UMass outshot Army 50-22 in the season-opener for both teams last year en route to an 8-5 win at Garber Field. Colin Fleming scored twice, while Anthony Biscardi and Will Manny each posted a goal and two assists. The Minutemen defense held the Black Knights to just one goal for a 38 minute stretch spanning the second to fourth quarters. Army goalie Tom Palesky made 18 saves to keep Army in the game despite facing the high volume of shots.

### UP NEXT: VS. BUCKNELL

- UMass opens the home slate next Saturday as Bucknell visits Garber Field at 1 PM. The game will be televised in Western Mass on CBS3 Now and in Eastern Mass on WBIN TV.

### MINUTEMEN PICKED 2ND IN CAA

- On the heels of a 10-5 season in 2011 which saw the Minutemen advance to the CAA Championship game, UMass was picked to finish 2nd in the CAA Preseason Coaches Poll - just one point behind favorite Delaware which won the league title last season. Hofstra was picked third - just one point behind UMass in what could shape up to be a terrific CAA season.

### MANNY PICKED AS CAA PRESEASON CO-PLAYER OF THE YEAR

- Junior attack Will Manny was named the CAA Preseason Co-Player of the Year alongside Penn State goalie Austin Kaut. Manny is UMass' top returning scorer from last season where he earned All-CAA Second Team and NEILA All-New England First-Team honors.

## BISCARDI, CELENTANI HAUL IN PRESEASON ACCOLADES

- Entering the season, Anthony Biscardi and Tom Celentani have both been in the forefront of preseason accolades from various outlets. The duo were both named to the CAA Preseason All-Conference Team alongside Will Manny. Both were also named to the Inside Lacrosse Preseason All-America Team. In the Major League Lacrosse Draft, Biscardi was taken by the Ohio Machine in the 2nd round, while Celentani was picked up by the Denver Outlaws in the 4th round.
- Biscardi was UMass' third leading scorer a year ago with 20 goals and 10 assists. Of those 20 scores, three served as game-winners, while four came in man-up situations.
- A close defenseman, Celentani started all 15 games last year causing 22 turnovers while picking up 34 groundballs. As one of the top defensive players in the CAA, he earned second team honors.

## IN THE POLLS

- UMass enters the season ranked No. 11 in the USILA Coaches Poll and No. 13 in the Nike/Inside Lacrosse Media Poll. Six of UMass' opponents are ranked to start the season, while Army, Hartford and Ohio State are receiving votes in both polls.

## THE LEGACY OF OVERTIME

- The Minutemen were heart-stoppers over the last month of the 2011 season winning back-to-back overtime games in April as sophomore Kyle Smith scored two OT winners for the Minutemen. Then, Anthony Biscardi netted the game-winner in the CAA Semifinals to send UMass to the CAA Championship game vs. Delaware.
- Smith scored in triple overtime as the Minutemen rallied to beat Drexel (4/16), 11-10. UMass scored the final five goals of the game and held the Dragons off the board for the final 26:28. Will Manny had a hand in all five goals, scoring three -- including the game-tie to send it to overtime.
- Smith scored the game-winner at Towson, 1:55 into overtime, giving UMass a 9-8 win over the Tigers.
- UMass has won eight of its last nine games that have gone to overtime, winning every one since a 9-8 double-overtime loss to Yale (4/17/04) except a 10-9 loss to Albany (3/13/07).
- Smith continued the history of UMass legacy players scoring overtime winners. Of UMass' last eight overtime wins, five goals have been scored by players with family connections to UMass.

- The most memorable was that 2006 NCAA Quarterfinal win over Hofstra as Jim Connolly -- who's father Steve Connolly was a captain of the 1969 UMass undefeated team -- scored the game-winner off a pass from Brett Garber, the son of former UMass coach Ted Garber and grandson of Dick Garber -- the former UMass coach, who was the first to win 300 games as a college lacrosse coach.
- In 2007, Brett Garber scored the overtime winner to beat Penn State, 6-5 on March 30, at Garber Field, his grandfather's field.
- In 2009, Connolly scored the game-winner to beat Hobart, 7-6 at Geneva.
- Last season, Kyle Smith, son of former UMass All-American in the late 1970s Norm Smith, has scored two game-winners in overtime to beat Towson and Drexel.
- UMass played and won back-to-back overtime games -- the April 9-16 games -- for the first time since April 22-25, 1992 when UMass beat Harvard (7-6) and Rutgers (9-8).
- The three-overtime win over Drexel was UMass' longest game since a five-overtime win over Cornell on March 30, 1988. That game equalled the longest in UMass history. UMass beat Cortland in 5OTs in 1974.

## OFFENSIVE FIREPOWER

- Junior Will Manny has points in 28 of his 29 career games and is the top returning scorer for UMass with 43 points on 20 goals and a team-best 23 assists last season. He had scored in the first 25 games of his career to mark the longest streak on UMass among all active players before the streak was ended vs. Hofstra (4/23) in the ESPNU Warrior Classic.
- Junior Anthony Biscardi had points in 12 of 15 games last year. He had multiple points in the first 10 games he has points this year. Biscardi was third on the team in points with 30 on 20 goals and 10 assists. He had eight games with at least two goals in 2011.
- Sophomore Connor Mooney tallied five goals, the most by any UMass player this season, against Delaware (4/29). That came after he had just one goal in a span of seven games. Mooney had 14 goals and 16 total points after a tally at Penn State (5/4) in the CAA Semifinals.
- Junior Kyle Smith scored at least one goal in eight of the last nine games -- that includes his two game-winners in overtime. He has 11 goals and four assists in his second college season.

**TOUGH DEFENSE**

- UMass posted a stout 8.41 GAA last season, backstopped by senior captain Tim McCormack. The goalie had an 8.33 goals against average and a 54.8 save percentage. He posted a season-best 17 saves, second-most in a game in his career at Harvard (3/29). He allowed a season-low five goals on two occasions -- in the season opener vs. Army (2/12) and the regular-season finale vs. Delaware (4/29). He was also strong in the CAA Semifinal at Penn State (5/4) with 14 saves, including 12 in the first half.
- Fellow close defenders Tom Celentani (34 groundballs, 22 caused turnovers) and Greg Anderson (17 groundballs, 13 caused turnovers) return to anchor the defense.
- Long-pole Ryan Hollenbaugh was a key all season last year with 15 groundballs and 14 caused turnovers.
- UMass' man-down defense was strong in 2011, allowing just 21.2 percent on the year. Opponents had just 11 goals on 52 opportunities. That ranked 10th in the NCAA.

**FACE-OFF ACES**

- UMass' tag-team duo of seniors Greg Rushing and Anthony Toresco have been stellar on face-offs. UMass has won 51.7 percent of its draws last season to rank 21st in the NCAA.
- Rushing was the starting face-off man most of the season, winning 70-of-136 for 51.5 percent. He was also a vacuum on groundballs with 77.
- Toresco won 85-of-158 for 53.8 percent. He had a career game winning 13-of-15 against Delaware (4/29), including 12-of-13 in the second half. Toresco was second on the team in groundballs with 42. In the last two third quarters, vs. Delaware and at Penn State, Toresco has won 15-of-16 face-offs.

**BIG WINNERS FOR LAST 10 YEARS**

- UMass has established itself as one of the top programs in the nation. Since 2001, UMass is tied with Georgetown for seventh-most wins of any program in college lacrosse with 109 victories.
- The Minutemen have the eighth-best win mark among all teams in the NCAA since 2001 with a 109-56 record for a 66.1 win percentage mark. That includes five seasons with 12 or more wins including a school record 13 wins in 2002, 2003, 2005 and 2006. The Minutemen were second on the list coming into the 2007 season.
- Virginia leads the way (132-43, 75.4) in most wins and highest percentage. Duke (132-51, 72.1) is tied in terms of wins, Syracuse third at (131-38, 77.5) with No. 4 Johns Hopkins (124-40, 75.6), No. 5 Maryland (121-51, 70.3), No. 6 Cornell (119-42, 73.9), No. 7 is Georgetown (109-48, 69.4) and UMass is ahead of No. 9 Princeton (107-52, 67.2).

**LUCKY NUMBERS 10, 11, 13**

- UMass has won 73 of its last 74 games when scoring 13 goals (98.6 win percentage), with three wins last season -- all on the road: 16-9 at Saint Joseph's (4/2), 14-6 at Providence (3/15) and 14-10 at Hartford (2/19). UMass was 3-1 in 2010 year when tallying 13 or more.
- When scoring 11 goals or more, UMass won 56 of its last 58 games, a 96.7 win percentage. Last season, UMass had six games with 11-plus goals, all wins. The Minutemen had at least 11 goals in the first eight games of the 2010 season with a 6-2 record.
- UMass had won 45 games in a row when scoring 11 or more goals until falling at Yale, 13-12 on March 5, 2010. The Minutemen also lost to Harvard, 14-13 last season on March 13, marking the most goals UMass scored in a loss since a 16-15 defeat to Delaware on April 15, 1995. UMass had won 67 games in a row when scoring 13 or more goals.
- UMass is 47-3 in its last 50 games when scoring double-figures, (94.0 win percentage). UMass was a perfect 7-0 last year when reaching 10, with wins over Hartford, Ohio State, Providence, Saint Joseph's, Drexel, Delaware and Penn State. In 2010, UMass posted an 8-2 when scoring 10 or more. UMass had won 29 games in a row when scoring 10 or more goals, but that streak was snapped with a 11-10 loss to Hofstra on Feb. 21, 2009. The Minutemen were 29-0 when scoring 10 or more goals from 2004-09. Prior to the loss at Hofstra, the last loss when scoring 10 goals came on May 1, 2004, a 17-10 loss at Syracuse.).

AMHERST, Mass. - The #11 UMass men's lacrosse team moved to 3-0 with a solid 11-9 win over #13 Ohio State at Garber Field. Four different Minutemen scored two goals including freshman Connor Mooney, who scored the first two goals of his career in the final five minutes to seal the win. Anthony Biscardi, Colin Fleming and Art Kell also added a pair. Greg Rushing won sensation on face-offs winning 12-of-17 and scooped up a career-high 11 groundballs. Ohio State (3-1) suffered its first loss, a week after upsetting then-No. 3 North Carolina.

AMHERST, Mass. - For the second straight week, Kyle Smith scored the game-winning goal in overtime, this time giving the UMass men's lacrosse team an 11-10 win over Drexel (6-6, 2-3 CAA) in triple overtime on Garber Field. With both teams trading chances throughout the extra sessions, Smith gave the Minutemen (8-3, 3-1 CAA) the win with 2:37 left in the third session.

Massachusetts trailed the Dragons by as many as four on two occasions -- and 10-7 after the third quarter before a 3-0 run in the fourth quarter to force extra time. UMass scored the final five goals of the game to comeback from a 10-6 deficit with 51 seconds left in the third quarter.

It was the longest UMass game since March 30, 1988 when UMass knocked off Cornell, 8-7 in Ithaca. This was the longest game at UMass since April 4, 1974, when the Minutemen lost 10-9 to Cortland.

Will Manny lead all scorers with six points on the day (3g, 3a), including two goals in the fourth quarter. Kyle Bergman had three goals and added an assist for the Dragons, while Mark Manos made 11 saves between the pipes.

UMass' defense was sensational as Jake Smith pestered Drexel's top scorer Scott Perri (CAA-best 29 goals coming into the game) all afternoon forcing him to three turnovers and limiting him to just one goal. Robert Church (19 goals entering game), also only had one goal. Fellow close defensemen Tom Celentani, Greg Anderson, Travis Tripucka along with long-pole Ryan Hollenbaugh were stifling down the stretch as Drexel was held off the board for nearly the final 27 minutes of the game. The group forced the Dragons into 23 turnovers, with Hollenbaugh collecting four caused turnovers himself.

The Minutemen battled back from an early Drexel goal to take a 3-2 lead after the first quarter, thanks to a goal from Anthony Biscardi with 44 seconds left in the stanza. After the Dragons knotted the score at three just four minutes into the second quarter, UMass responded with back-to-back goals from Colin Fleming before taking a 5-4 lead into halftime.

The Dragons owned the third quarter, outscoring the Minutemen 6-2 to take a 10-7 lead as Bergman and Nick Trizano combined for two goals apiece, including a man-up tally from Bergman with 7:36 left in the quarter. Manny kept the Massachusetts hopes alive as he buried a buzzer beater off a feed from Biscardi with less than a second left in the quarter.

Manny stayed hot during the fourth quarter by potting two goals and adding an assist as the Minutemen outshot the Dragons 17-5 in the final frame. Art Kell nearly ended the game as time expired in the fourth quarter with a bounce shot off the right post to send the game into overtime.

It wasn't until the third overtime when Massachusetts began to take control, outshooting Drexel 3-0 before Smith ended it with a bullet past Manos for his second of the game and eighth of the season.

AMHERST, Mass. - Freshman Connor Mooney stole the show on Senior Night as the rookie tallied a career-high five goals to lead No. 19 UMass to a dominating 11-5 win over Delaware under the lights at Garber Field. This was the first UMass home night game since 2004.

The Minutemen are now 9-4 overall and finish the CAA season at 4-2. Delaware is also 4-2 in the league and 9-6 overall.

On Friday night, the Minutemen took over the game in the third quarter as Mooney tallied three of his five goals in a 6-2 stanza for UMass. The Minutemen led 3-1 at halftime thanks to goals by Art Kell, Mooney and a man-up goal by Colin Fleming.

The second half saw UMass explode as Mooney tallied back-to-back goals in a 33-second span to give UMass a 6-2 lead with 7:38 left in the third. Delaware's Nick Elsmo ended a 27:35 scoreless drought for the Blue Hens. UMass came right back for more ripping off the next three goals as Kyle Smith, Mooney and face-off man Anthony Tresco scored.

Tresco was another major story of the night. In addition to his first-career goal, the junior won a career-high 13-of-15 on face-offs as the Minutemen dominating

the "X" taking 15-of-19.

Mooney polished off his night with his fifth -- the most goals by a UMass player this season -- with 9:57 left in the fourth. Will Manny netted his 20th goal of the season to wrap the scoring for the Minutemen off a pretty pass from Art Kell with 2:33 left in the fourth and an 11-4 lead.

Manny also handed out three assists for a four-point night. Mike Fetterly returned from injury to assist a pair of Mooney goals as well.

Defense was a major story in addition to the offensive outburst as the top three Delaware goal scorers (who came into the game tallying 48 goals were held to a single goal by Eric Smith -- the first of the game. Goalie Tim McCormack made 10 saves including several show-stoppers.

The defense was stellar including close defenseman Travis Tripucka, Jake Smith, Tom Celentani and Greg Anderson. D-Middies, many playing their final regular-season game at Garber Field were strong as well including seniors Casey Rahn, Stephen Zorkers, Mael Walkowiak and Brett Newgaard.

Greg Rushing also had six groundballs as he was key on the face-off wing next to Toresco.

The last UMass player to score five goals in a game was Art Kell vs. Providence on March 16, 2010.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - Junior Anthony Biscardi scored 1:37 into overtime to cap a furious comeback by the #15/16 UMass lacrosse team on Wednesday night to give the Minutemen a 10-9 win at Penn State.

The game had so many twists and turns. Perhaps the biggest play of the game came in the final seconds of regulation as freshman Reed Goodhue made his first save of the season with just seconds remaining after starter Tim McCormack (14 saves) was penalized. That came shortly after UMass had been penalized twice with 1:46 left in regulation.

The Minutemen rallied back with nine goals in the second half and overtime, including a season-quarter-best seven in the third quarter. Art Kell had three of his game-best four goals in that third quarter.

The thriller improves UMass' overtime record to 3-0 on the season, all coming in the last month. The prior two matchups came against Towson on Apr. 9 (9-8) and Drexel on Apr. 16 (11-10) when Kyle Smith scored the game-winner each time. Overall, the Minutemen have won eight of their last nine overtime games dating back to 2005.

The Minutemen came out of halftime firing, scoring seven of the nine third-quarter goals to turn a 4-1 halftime deficit into an 8-6 lead. Kell scored his first of the night at 14:19 while Smith and Connor Mooney followed with goals at 11:35 and 10:38. Penn State's Danny Henneghan

answered only six seconds later, but UMass responded with three of the quarter's final four scores, capped off by Ryan Hollenbaugh's second of his career with two seconds remaining in the third quarter.

Penn State responded with three of the first four in the fourth to even the score at nine after a Jack Forster goal at 6:37. Both teams continued to have chances down the stretch, including one golden opportunity with 1:46 remaining in regulation after a pair of penalties were assessed to the Minutemen. One was to McCormack, forcing Goodhue to come in for only his third appearance of the season.

After UMass killed off the initial 30-second push, Goodhue denied Matthew Mackrides on the doorstep with 43 seconds remaining for the clutch save to keep the score knotted at nine. The Minutemen had a final chance at the buzzer, but a Biscardi shot went wide to force overtime.

The Nittany Lions won the opening draw of the extra session, but Tom Celentani forced a turnover after McCormack made a save. That gave UMass its first offensive opportunity. It was Biscardi who was the hero this time, making a move to the center of the field and unleashing a bounce shot which went high past Kaut and into the back of the net.

Jake Smith and Celentani were sensational defensively, holding Penn State's two leading scorers Shane Sturgis and Mackrides to a combined two points. Sturgis had a goal while Mackrides posted an assist.

Penn State jumped out to a 4-1 lead at halftime and it could have been worse if not for McCormack, who made 12 saves in the first 30 minutes. Tom Lacrosse, Kyle VanThof, Nick Dolik and Sturgis gave PSU the three-goal bulge. Ryan Hantverk extended his 14-game point scoring streak with UMass' only goal of the first half, coming with 2:23 left in the first quarter.

UMass led the final shot count, 45-36 and in groundballs, 33-32. The Minutemen won 11-of-22 faceoffs, led by 10-of-18 from Anthony Toresco. McCormack finished with 15 saves, across Kaut's 20. That marked Kaut's second 20-save performance against the Minutemen this season after he made an NCAA-best 25 in the regular season meeting.

With the win, UMass advances to its first-ever CAA Championship Game and will look to become the third straight No. 3 seed to win the CAA Tournament.

AMHERST, Mass. - With the score tied at three at halftime, Delaware scored six goals over the final 30 minutes to defeat the No. 16 UMass men's lacrosse team in the CAA Championship game, 9-7, at Garber Field. Tournament Most Outstanding Player Kevin Kaminski scored three goals for the Blue Hens (11-6) while Noah Fossner made nine saves to help Delaware claim its second straight conference crown and berth to the NCAA Tournament. Will Manny had two goals and an assist for the Minutemen and Tim McCormack made seven stops.

Faceoffs were the key to the night for Delaware, which won 13-of-19 draws throughout the game to secure possession for much of the contest. The Blue Hens also held an edge in shots at 31-26 and groundballs at 35-22. Dan Cooney, who won just four face-offs in the regular-season meeting between the teams last Friday, was sensational on the draw on Saturday, winning 13-of-19. Will Manny and Art Kell each had two goals for UMass. The other tallies came from Ryan Hantverk, Kyle Smith and Mike Fetterly.

On defense, Tom Celentani and Jake Smith were stellar in limiting UD's starting attack to just one goal. Both Minutemen were named to the CAA All-Tournament Team. They combined for five groundballs and six caused turnovers in the game. Kell joined them on the All-Tournament team as he had six goals in the two postseason games.

In addition to Kaminski, Fossner, Cooney and Grant Kaleikau were named to the All-Tournament team.

The Blue Hens bolted out to a 2-0 lead in the first quarter on a pair of goals from John Mills on shots from the left side of the cage. The Massachusetts offense came alive in the second quarter when Manny and Kell hooked up for UMass' first goal just 92 seconds into the quarter. Kell was then on the receiving end of a goal two minutes later to knot the score at two on a goal from in tight.

Delaware retook the lead with seven minutes to play on a goal from Nick Diachenko before Fetterly made it a 3-3 game with his sixth goal of the season to close out the first half scoring.

UMass took its only lead of the game early in the third quarter when Hantverk buried a shot past Fossner for his 18th goal of the year, but Delaware quickly silenced the Minutemen with three straight tallies to end the quarter on goals from three different scorers.

Despite Massachusetts notching back-to-back goal from Manny and Kell midway through the fourth quarter, the Blue Hens once again scored three consecutive goals over a five minute span to maintain control. Kaminski scored two of his three tallies to give Delaware the lead for good.

Recognized as one of the nation's top lacrosse coaches, Greg Cannella finished his 17th year at the helm of the University of Massachusetts program. Cannella has brought his Minutemen to seven NCAA Tournaments, winning seven tournament games since 1997, claiming six New England championships including 2006, won the 2001, 2002, 2005 and 2009 ECAC Lacrosse titles. He was named CAA Co-Coach of the Year in 2011, his fifth conference coach of the year. He was ECAC Coach of the Year in 2009, 2004, 2002, and 2001 and New England Coach of the Year four times including the last two seasons. He was named the 2006 USILA National Coach of the Year after leading UMass to its first-ever lacrosse NCAA Championship game.

In 2009, Cannella led UMass back to the NCAA Tournament for the seventh time in his tenure and 18th in program history as the Minutemen won the ECAC with a 6-1 league record.

Cannella led UMass to its most memorable season in 2006. As an unseeded team, UMass had the most difficult path to a lacrosse championship game in history, beating the No. 2, 3 and 4 ranked teams in the nation. UMass topped No. 2 seed Maryland, 8-5 in the semifinals after advancing it its first Final Four with a stunning 11-10 overtime win over Hofstra on May 20, 2006. The miracle comeback saw the Minutemen rally from a 10-5 deficit with 8:03 left in the fourth quarter as UMass won its quarterfinal game at Stony Brook.

The 2006 season saw UMass produce two first-team USILA All-Americans for the first time in school history with Sean Morris on attack and Jack Reid being honored on defense. Jake Deane was also named an honorable mention All-American.

For the second year in a row, Morris was named a finalist for the Tewaaraton Trophy as the top player in all of college lacrosse.

UMass had the second-winningest program in all of college lacrosse over six years from 2001-06 with a 70-24 record since. Only Johns Hopkins had won at a better rate than UMass' 75-percent win mark. Over six years (2001-07), UMass was an amazing 43-6 at home at Garber Field (88 percent).

Cannella won his 100th career game on March 11, 2006, when UMass beat Harvard, 12-7. He led UMass to the NCAA Quarterfinals with a 10-9 win over No. 6 seed Cornell on May 13, 2006. Cannella led UMass to 58 wins over the last five years (2002-2006), the winningest five-year span in the program's history.

A 1988 UMass graduate Cannella took the reigns of the UMass lacrosse program in the fall of 1994 with a great understanding of the program's storied history. He was a two-time letterwinner under the legendary Dick Garber in the mid-1980s and an assistant coach for two seasons with the Minutemen. Cannella is just the fourth head coach in the program's history.

The 2005 season will go down as one of the most successful in school history as the Minutemen tied the school record for wins a 13-3 record. UMass advanced to the NCAA Quarterfinals for the 10th time in school history while winning the ECAC and New England Championships.

The season was historic as UMass knocked off Syracuse twice in a three-week span including a 16-15 win in the NCAA First Round to end the Orange's 22-year run of reaching the NCAA Semifinals. UMass was featured on ESPN's SportsCenter as well as in Sports Illustrated after the monumental win.

Cannella continued to coach some of the nation's top players as attackman Sean Morris was selected as UMass' first-ever finalist for the Tewaaraton Trophy as the sport's top college player. Morris was one of four All-Americans on the 2005 team which also featured seven All-New England selections.

The 2003 UMass squad tied a school record with 13 victories, advanced to the NCAA quarterfinals for only the fifth time in school history and was ranked as high as No. 3 in the country, the highest ranking ever for the Minutemen. In addition, the Minutemen ended a 24-game losing streak to Syracuse, becoming the first UMass team to defeat the Orangemen in over two decades.

Prior to returning to his alma mater, Cannella spent four years as an assistant coach at Stony Brook from 1988-92. Cannella served as the offensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator on John Espey's staff. He earned a master's degree in liberal studies while coaching at Stony Brook.

Cannella earned a bachelor's degree in physical education while playing at Massachusetts from 1986-87. He was a two-year starter for the Minutemen and a member of two NCAA Tournament teams. Cannella scored 64 points (33 goals, 31 assists) in his UMass career.

Prior to playing at UMass, Cannella spent one year at Nassau (N.Y.) Community College, where he was a first team All-America selection and led Nassau to the 1985 Junior College national title.

A native of Lynbrook, N.Y., Cannella played for three years at Lynbrook High School. One of the most prolific scorers in Lynbrook history, Cannella was a high school All-America selection and still ranks among Lynbrook's all-time leading scorers.

Cannella served as the President of the New England Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association in 1998, 1999 and 2000, and served as the Vice President in 1997. Cannella is currently the chairman of the annual NEILA Scholar Athlete Team, which he started in 1999. He has also served on the NCAA Championships Regional Advisory Committee that selected the teams for the NCAA Tournament in 1997, 1998, 1999, 2002, 2003, and 2004. Cannella was a regional voter in the USILA/STX weekly poll from 1997-2001, as well as a USILA regional voter for All-Americans since 2003. He now serves on the prestigious committee to help select the Tewaaraton Award, a honor given to the nation's top player.

Cannella was born on Sept. 2, 1965, in Rockville Centre, N.Y. He and his wife, Laurie, reside in Hadley with their son Vance (8), and daughter Virginia (6).
