She averaged 9.3 points per-game as a freshman in 2008-09 and is one of two returning starters along with senior Diatiema Hill (5.3 ppg, 2.9 apg in '08-'09). UMass was tabbed 11th in the A-10 preseason poll.

### About The Richmond Spiders

- The Spiders finished out the regular season with a 67-59 win against Saint Louis. Junior Brittani Shells dropped 25 points while junior Crystal Goring and sophomore Abby Oliver also scored in double-digits.
- Shells, who leads the A-10 in points (17.0) and the Spiders in assists (2.5) and steals (2.7), is one of 12 nominees for the Nancy Lieberman Award, which is awarded to the nation's best Division I point guard in women's basketball. Junior Katie Holzer leads the team with 4.9 rebounds while Goring has 1.1 blocks.
- Richmond is coming off a 24-10 season, 9-5 in the conference. They advanced to the finals of the 2009 A-10 Championship, only to lose to Charlotte. Shells was named to the All-Championship team, as well as the All-Conference first and defensive teams last season. The Spiders earned a berth into the WNIT, advancing into the third round before losing to Georgetown.

## AGAINST RICHMOND

### Series History

- In a series that began on Dec. 28, 1998, Richmond holds a 9-2 edge over the Minutewomen. UMass' two victories in the series came in the Atlantic 10 Tournament in 2002 (85-73) and at home on Jan. 19, 2006 (81-67).

### Last Time Against Richmond

- A strong second half and a career-high 19 points for freshman Jasmine Watson was not enough to help the UMass women's basketball team past Richmond as the squad fell, 73-62 at the Mullins Center on Jan. 16, 2010. With the loss, the Minutewomen are now 1-2 in Atlantic 10 play and 7-11 overall, while the Spiders move to 2-0 in the A-10 and 13-4 on the season.
- Watson, who shot 8-for-14 from the floor and a perfect 3-for-3 at the free throw line, was UMass' top scorer and rebounder on the afternoon. She hauled in eight boards and recorded two assists one block and one steal, as well. Sophomore Kristina Danella followed with 12 points coming off the bench, including 10 in the second half, and shot 5-for-10 on the day.
- Redshirt junior Megan Zullo also reached double figures with 11 points and dished a career and game-best seven assists to go along with three steals. Senior Kim Benton tallied six points and four assists, while classmate Diatiema Hill had five assists and five boards.
- The Minutewomen held a brief 3-2 lead early in the first half, but a 16-1 run by Richmond quickly put UMass down by 14 with 13:39 remaining in the period. Then with 5:22 on the clock, a Benton three began a stretch of eight straight points for the Minutewomen to cut the deficit to seven at 34-27.
- However, the Spiders bounced back after calling timeout and outscored UMass 14-2 in the final 3:04 of the frame. Richmond took a 19-point lead into the locker room at halftime, 48-19, after shooting a blistering 20-for-29 (69.0%) in the first half, including 7-for-10 (70.0%) from beyond the arc. The Minutewomen were limited to 11-for-30 (36.7%) overall and 5-for-14 (35.7%) from three in the opening period.
- Fortunes reversed in the second half, as UMass shot 59.1% (13-for-22) to the Spiders' 31% (9-for-29) and 23.1% (3-for-13) from three-point range, but the deficit from the first proved too much to overcome. The Minutewomen outscored Richmond 33-25 in the second half, but could not draw any closer than 11 the rest of the way.
- UMass finished the afternoon at 24-for-52 (46.2%) from the floor, 9-for-21 (42.9%) from three and 5-for-7 (71.4%) at the free throw line, while out-rebounding the Spiders, 30-26. Richmond shot 29-for-58 (50.0%), 10-for-23 (43.5%) from three and 5-for-6 (83.3%) at the charity stripe.
- Leading the way for the Spiders, Brittani Shells totaled 22 points and had three steals, while Joyous Tharrington registered 13 points and a squad-best eight boards. Danielle Bell had 10 points and Rachael Bilney contributed eight points, five rebounds, four assists and four steals.

#### One To Watch

- Freshman Jasmine Watson has been named Atlantic 10 Rookie of the Week four times this season and was also tabbed UMass Athlete of the Week on Feb. 8.
- After posting three blocks in her collegiate debut, Watson found her scoring touch in her second game with the Minutewomen, pouring in 14 points in 24 minutes against St. John's on Nov. 18. Watson shot 5-for-10 from the field against the Red Storm and was a perfect 4-for-4 at the free throw line.
- Watson has scored seven or more in 20 of the past 25 games and has grabbed five-plus rebounds in 21 of the last 25.
- She ranks 11th in the conference in field goal percentage at 44.7% (113-for-253).

#### Elite Company

- Jasmine Watson is just the sixth player in program history to log 250+ points and 150+ rebounds as a freshman as she is currently has 298 and 169 respectively. She joins Crystal Carroll, Melissa Gurile, Jean Michaelson, Nekole Smith and Octavia Thomas in that elite group. Four of the five finished their UMass careers with 1,100+ points and 500+ rebounds. Only Gurile and Thomas had 300+ points and 150+ rebounds as freshmen.

## TEAM NOTES

### More On Watson

- In her first collegiate start on Jan. 6 against Harvard, Jasmine Watson posted a double-double with 10 points and a career-high 13 rebounds.
- Nine of her team-leading 13 rebounds came on the offensive end of the floor, the most offensive rebounds in a game by a Minutewoman this season. She had six offensive boards vs. Fordham, five at La Salle and currently ranks seventh in the Atlantic 10 with an average of 2.6 offensive rebounds per-game (76 in total).
- Watson is averaging 12.8 points per-game and 6.8 rebounds per-game as a starter, including a team-leading 13.0 points per-game in Atlantic 10 play. She has scored in double figures in 13 of the past 16 games.
- In Atlantic 10 games, Watson is the top scoring freshman (tied for 10th overall) and is fifth in blocks per-game (1.5). She ranks 11th in rebounds (6.4), 10th in field goal percentage (48.4%) and is third in offensive rebounds (3.0).

### Sophomore Standout

- Sophomore Kristina Danella has led the Minutewomen in scoring in 11 of the 27 games she has played in thus far with a season-high 21 points coming against BU. She was the top point-producer eight times in 2008-09 as a freshman.
- Danella grabbed a squad-best seven rebounds at La Salle on Feb. 17, the 10th time in her career she has been the leading rebounder for the Minutewomen and fifth this season.
- In career rebounds, Danella is second among active players behind Diatiema Hill with 294. She scored her 500th career point on Jan. 9 vs. Rhode Island, her 600th career point on Feb. 20 at Xavier and grabbed her 200th career board vs. Vermont on Dec. 9.
- Danella scored in double figures in eight consecutive games this season, the longest streak of her career. She has tallied at least 10 points 19 times in 28 games.
- As the team's leading scorer, Danella is 14th in the Atlantic 10 with an average of 11.9 points per-game.

### Getting To 600 Before Junior Year

- With 612 career points, Kristina Danella is the leading scorer among active Minutewomen players and is tied for 34th all-time. She is the only player in the top-35 with 60 or less games played as she is currently at 58 for her career.
- Currently at 325 points for the season, Danella has passed her freshman year total of 279. She is the seventh Minutewoman in program history to reach 600 points in their first two seasons. The previous six UMass players to reach that mark have all gone on to score 1,400+ points in their careers.

### 33 From 3

- At the 16:28 mark in the second half of UMass' win over Fordham on Feb. 6, sophomore Kristina Danella drained her 100th career three-pointer. She is the sixth player in program history to reach the milestone.
- Danella already holds the single game record for three pointers made (seven) and the record for threes in a season (58). She ranks second in career three-point percentage (.397) and her name appears on the single season list twice.
- In the Atlantic 10, Danella ranks seventh in three-point field goal percentage (.387, 48-124) and eighth in three-point field goals made (48, 1.7 per-game).
- Danella is shooting 45.8% from beyond the arc in conference play (22-for-48) to rank fourth in the A-10 and is seventh in threes made.

### Block Party

- With eight blocks at Duquesne on Jan. 20, sophomore Nicole Jones tied a UMass single game record with eight against the Dukes to set a new career high.
- The mark had been reached twice previously, by Kate Mills vs. George Washington (2/13/08) and by Helen Freeman vs. Rhode Island (3/3/88).
- That performance helped vault Jones into sixth in the Atlantic 10 in blocks with an average of 1.3 per-game (37 in total), while freshman Jasmine Watson is fifth in the conference with an average of 1.3 blocks per game (38 total). Watson recently swatted a career-high six blocks against Dayton on Feb. 13.
- Watson is one block shy of cracking the top-10 for a single season in the UMass record book, while Jones is two away. Jones is currently 11th all-time in career blocks with 52.
- Jones is tied for the most blocks in a single game by any A-10 player this season as Sara Mostafa of George Washington had eight earlier this season at North Texas (11/17/09).

### On Best Behavior

- UMass is called for an average of 14.4 fouls per-game and is ranked 21st nationally in fouls per-game.
- Foul trouble has been rare for the Minutewomen this season, having multiple players with four fouls only three times in 29 games (two vs. Boston University, three vs. Vermont, three at Rhode Island) and just one foul out.

### Extra Minutes

- The Minutewomen have played extra basketball three times this season and are 2-1 when going to overtime. Three overtime games is the most for the program since the 2002-03 season when the squad played extra basketball on three occasions. The most overtime games in a season for a UMass team came the year before, seven in 2001-02.
- When the squad picked up an OT win over Saint Louis, 62-59, on Jan. 13, it marked the team's first overtime win on the road since claiming a 71-66 victory at St. Bonaventure on Feb. 21, 2002.
- UMass' 79-73 overtime win against Boston University was the first overtime game for the Minutewomen since Jan. 9, 2007, at Rhode Island (71-69 Loss) and the first at the Mullins Center since Jan. 16, 2003, an 89-80 win over Temple.
- The longest game in UMass history (three overtimes) was a 65-60 loss to Rice at home on Nov. 23, 2001

### Doubling Up

- Four UMass players have recorded a combined eight double-doubles this season, the most recent being Diatiema Hill's 20 points and 11 rebounds vs. Saint Joseph's on Feb. 25.
- Three other Minutewomen, Jasmine Watson, Kristina Danella, and Nicole Jones have posted double-doubles this season.
- Danella's 16 points and 11 rebounds against Rhode Island on Jan. 9 marked her third career double-double, all which have come in Atlantic 10 play, and second against URI.
- Hill now has four on the year (21 pts., 14 reb. vs. Quinnipiac, 13 pts., 10 reb. vs. NJIT, 26 pts. and 10 reb. at Saint Louis, 20 pts., 11 a vs. Saint Joseph's).
- Jones' came against Villanova (22 pts., 12 reb.) and Watson had 10 points and 13 rebounds vs. Harvard and totaled 16 points, 10 boards against George Washington.

### Solid At The Stripe

- Sophomore Kristina Danella and senior Diatiema Hill both rank in the top-four in the conference in free throw percentage as Danella is second at 86.3% (107-for-124) and Hill is fourth at 85.3% (58-for-68). Danella's mark is currently 25th in the nation.
- Danella is currently ranked first all-time in program history with an 81.6% (164-201) career free throw percentage (min. 150 made), while

her percentage this season stands second. Hill's mark from this season is currently fourth on the program's single season list for free throw percentage.

- Danella made 27 straight free throws in a streak that spanned four games (11/20 vs. New Hampshire-11/28 vs. Miami), the second longest by a Minutewoman in program history. Kathy Coyner made 31 consecutive free throws from Nov. 14, 1998 (St. John's) to Dec. 15, 1998 (Texas A&M).
- Danella was a perfect 12-for-12 at the line against Rice, tying a school record for single game free throw percentage (minimum 10 attempts), last achieved 16 years ago by Melissa Gurile (15-for-15) on Dec. 11, 1993 vs. Providence. She has been perfect at the line in 11 games this season, most recently going 2-for-2 at Xavier.
- Danella went 10-for-14 at the line in UMass' overtime win against Boston University in the season opener, including sinking three to tie the score at 67 with 17 seconds remaining in regulation. She then made five of her six free throws in the extra period, accounting for nearly half of the squad's points.
- Just four games later, the individual free throw percentage single game mark was matched again as Diatiema Hill was flawless at the line against Quinnipiac on Dec. 6, making 11-of-11.
- Another Minutewoman, Kim Benton, began the season a perfect 22-for-22.
- UMass finished the regular season second in the Atlantic 10 with a 74.6% team free throw percentage (402-539), good for 30th nationally.

### 20-20 Vision

- For the first time since Jan. 2, 2008, two UMass players had 20-point games on the same night as Diatiema Hill and Megan Zullo poured in 21 and 20, respectively in the Minutewomen's 82-66 victory over Quinnipiac on Dec. 6.
- The last two players to accomplish the feat were Pam Rosanio (21) and Kate Mills (20) against Longwood.
- Zullo shot a remarkable 6-for-8 (.750) from three-point range against the Bobcats, accounting for 18 of her 20, and was 2-for-2 at the charity stripe.
- Five different Minutewomen have logged at least one 20-point game this year, Nicole Jones, Hill, Zullo, Kristina Danella and Jasmine Watson. Danella, Jones and Watson have reached the 20-point mark twice on the year. Hill has recorded 20+ points three times.

### Hill Reaching New Heights

- Senior Diatiema Hill had a career game against Quinnipiac in the Brown Classic championship on Dec. 6 as she posted 21 points and a career-high 14 rebounds for her first career double-double, first career 20-point game and first career 10-rebound game. She also had a double-double on Dec. 20 with 13 points and 10 rebounds at NJIT and logged another with 20 points and 11 assists vs. Saint Joseph's on Feb. 25.
- With her third double-double of the season, Hill surpassed her career high in points at Saint Louis, pouring in 26 (the highest total by a Minutewoman this season), on 10-for-20 shooting and a 5-for-6 clip at the free throw line to go along with 10 rebounds.
- Hill played a career-high 43 minutes at Saint Louis, stayed on the floor for all 40 minutes against Richmond and played 40 in the squad's overtime game at Duquesne. She ended the regular season fourth in the Atlantic 10 in average minutes played (33.8), third in conference games with an average of 35.5 minutes per-game.
- Hill has been a big factor in the Minutewomen's success as she has averaged 12.2 points and 7.3 rebounds per-game in UMass victories and just 5.7 points and 4.7 rebounds in the squad's losses.

### Set Up Stars

- On Jan. 16, the Minutewomen totaled a season-high 22 assists vs. Saint Joseph's, 20 assists on 24 baskets against Richmond and had 19 assists on 20 baskets vs. Fordham on Feb. 6. The squad ranks fifth in the Atlantic 10 with 13.5 assists per-game, fourth in conference play with an average of 14.8 per contest.
- Four different Minutewomen (Diatiema Hill, Kim Benton, Megan Zullo and Stephanie Lawrence) have posted five-assist games this season.

Hill has done it 13 times, Benton five times, Zullo four times and Lawrence once. Hill, Benton and Zullo had five assists apiece vs. Dayton on Feb. 13. Hill has logged five-plus assists nine times in the past 13 games. Hill ranks first in conference play with an average of 4.9 assists per-game.

- With 119 on the year, Hill sits second in the Atlantic 10 with a 4.1 assists per-game average. She has passed her previous career high for assists in a season, 87 set in 2008-09 (30 games).
- Hill also ranks first in the conference with a 1.9 assist-to-turnover ratio. The UMass record for assist to turnover ratio, 1.9, (149 assists to 78 turnovers) was set by Mary Hallaren during the 1978-79 season.
- In conference play, three Minutewomen are ranked in the top-six in assist to turnover ratio as Hill is first (2.1), Zullo second (2.0) and Benton sixth (1.6).

### Hill Sets Mullins Record

- With her 11 assists against Saint Joseph's, senior Diatiema Hill not only set a personal best, but also broke the record for the most assists by a Minutewoman at the Mullins Center. The previous mark, 10, was last set by Katie Nelson against Saint Joseph's on Feb. 5, 2006.
- Hill's 11 helpers is tied for fourth-most by a UMass player in program history for a single game.
- It is also the highest assists total by any Atlantic 10 player this season.

### Meg Z. For Three

- Redshirt junior Megan Zullo, along with Kristina Danella, had a team-high 14 points against New Hampshire, her first time scoring in double figures as a Minutewoman.
- Zullo drained four three-pointers, all in the first half, against the Wildcats and shot 4-for-7 from beyond the arc in the contest. As a team, UMass ended the evening shooting 11-for-24 (45.8%) from three-point range, including 8-for-14 (57.1%) in the first half.
- Zullo also shot 5-for-8 from beyond the arc at NJIT and at Delaware, finishing as the squad's leading scorer on both occasions with 17 and 15 points respectively.
- She is sixth in the Atlantic 10 in threes per-game with 1.9 and has 54 in total over 29 games. Zullo is third on the UMass single season list, as well. The single season record of 58 was set by Kristina Danella in 2008-09 (30 games) and Katie Nelson in 2004-05 (29 games).
- Zullo has drained five or more threes in a game three times this season. Twenty-one of her threes on the year came in the month of December as she averaged 12.0 points per-game over seven games in the final month of 2009.

### Benton Reaches Century Mark

- Senior Kim Benton played in her 100th career game on Dec. 11 vs. Providence, the 34th individual in program history to reach the milestone. She leads all active Minutewomen in games played with 118.
- With her 118th career game last Sunday at Charlotte, Benton tied the program record set by Sabriya Mitchell in a career that spanned 1994 to 1998.

### Twice As Nice

- For the second straight year, UMass captured the title at the Brown Bear Classic, posting wins over Brown (69-54) and Quinnipiac (82-66). Kristina Danella (14.5 ppg, 6.5 rpg) and Diatiema Hill (11.0 ppg, 8.5 rpg, 3.0 apg) were named to the Brown Bear Classic All-Tournament Team.
- Earlier this season, The Minutewomen took home the runner-up trophy at the Wyndham Miami Thanksgiving Tournament after defeating

Rice, 71-57, to advance to the championship game where the squad was narrowly defeated by the host Hurricanes. Danella (17.5 ppg, 8.0 rpg) and Nicole Jones (11.0 ppg, 5.5 rpg, 3.0 bpg) both represented UMass on the All-Tournament team.

- Over the past two seasons, UMass holds a 6-2 record when playing at in-season tournaments.

### Sharp Shooters Beyond The Arc

- It was a record-breaking year beyond the arc for women's basketball in 2008-09 as the squad shattered the program's all-time mark for three-point field goals with 195 (previous mark was 117 in 2002-03). For the first time in school history, three Minutewomen registered 40 or more three-pointers in a season. The 2009-10 returnees accounted for 141 of those 195 treys, including Kristina Danella and Cerie Mosgrove whose final 2008-09 totals rank tied for first (58) and fifth (51), respectively, on the UMass single season list.
- Three current Minutewomen, Kim Benton (fourth, 126), Kristina Danella (fifth, 106) and Cerie Mosgrove (ninth, 91) are among the all-time leaders for career three-point field goals.
- The Minutewomen set the program record for three-pointers in a game last season with 14 against Northeastern on Dec. 20, 2008.
- UMass ranks second the Atlantic 10 in three-pointers per-game with an average of 6.4 (187 total).

### Fab Five

- UMass' starting five (Kristina Danella, Nicole Jones, Cerie Mosgrove, Kim Benton and Diatiema Hill) played a huge role in the win over Boston University on Nov. 15, combining for 73 of the team's 79 points and contributing 29 of 44 rebounds.
- Four of the five (Danella, Jones, Benton and Hill) scored in double figures, while Mosgrove was just shy with seven points.
- A different starting lineup (Danella, Jones, Benton and Megan Zullo) also came up big against NJIT with Zullo, Danella, Hill and Jones all reaching the 10-point plateau. The starting five accounted for 58 of 70 points and 28 of 37 rebounds against the Highlanders.
- UMass had four scorers in double figures four times in 2008-09 (New Hampshire, NJIT, Temple and La Salle) and posted a 4-0 record in those contests. The Minutewomen are 6-1 over the past two seasons when four players score 10 or more. In UMass' wins this season (10 games), three players are averaging double figures (Danella 13.4, Hill 12.2 and Jasmine Watson, 10.9), while two more (Jones and Zullo) are just shy at 9.0 and 8.0, respectively.
- In the win over Saint Louis on Jan. 13, UMass starters accounted for 54 of the 62 points and 33 of 45 rebounds.

- Against Dayton on Feb. 13, the Minutewomen were one point shy of having five players in double figures for the first time since 2005 as four of five starters logged 10 or more points (Hill 15, Danella 12, Watson 12, Benton 10) and the fifth, Zullo, had nine. The starting five accounted for 58 of 60 points in that contest.

### Jones Has Breakout Game Against Villanova

- Sophomore Nicole Jones helped carry UMass to victory against Villanova, totaling 22 of the squad's 55 points and leading all rebounders with 12.
- It marked career highs in both points and rebounds for the center, was her first career double-double, first career 20-point game, first career 10-rebound game and first time as UMass' top scorer.
- Jones shot 9-for-11 (.818) in the contest, the best single-game shooting percentage for a Minutewoman since Pam Rosanio went 9-for-11 against Longwood on Jan. 3, 2008.
- On Jan. 6 against Harvard, Jones posted her second 20-point game of the season, tying her career high with 22 to lead the squad. She has been the team's top scorer on three occasions this season.
- Jones surpassed her freshman year scoring total (43 points in 23 games) just five games into her sophomore campaign.

### First 10

- Not only did freshman Dee Montgomery score her first collegiate points on Dec. 2 at Northeastern, but managed to reach double figures for the first time as well, pouring in 10 points in just 13 minutes on the floor.
- At the 4:37 mark in the second half, Montgomery sunk a three and made a free throw to successfully complete a four-point play.
- Montgomery saw the most time in her young career thus far against Vermont on Dec. 9, playing a career-high 16 minutes.

### New Faces

- Three of UMass' four newcomers saw action in the season opener against Boston University on Nov. 15, Megan Zullo, Shakia Robinson and Jasmine Watson all played their first games in a Minutewoman uniform. Robinson contributed six rebounds and Watson had three blocks, in 16 and 15 minutes on the floor, respectively. The fourth newcomer, Dee Montgomery, saw her first collegiate action against St. John's on Nov. 18.

## RECENT NEWS

### Watson Picks Up Pair Of Honors

- For the second week in a row, UMass women's basketball freshman center Jasmine Watson was named the Atlantic 10 Rookie of the Week on Mar. 1. This marks her fourth time receiving the award, having previously earned the accolade on Jan. 18, Feb. 8, and Feb. 22, and matching teammate Kristina Danella's and former Minutewomen Octavia Thomas' total, the most weekly honors for a first-year player in program history.
- Watson put up 17 points in the team's upset victory over Saint Joseph's on Feb. 25. The win marked the first win over the Hawks since 1996, as well as the ninth win in the two teams 51 meetings. Watson had a career-high of four assists in Thursday's game, as well.
- In the team's Feb. 28 contest at Charlotte, Watson recorded 10 points for the Minutewomen. She also grabbed seven rebounds in both games. On the week, she averaged a team best of 13.5 points and 7.0 rebounds.

### Benton To Take Part In WBCA Program

- UMass senior guard Kim Benton has been selected as one of 80 candidates participating in the eighth annual Women's Basketball Coaches Association's So You Want To Be A Coach program, the WBCA announced on Feb. 22. The two-and-a-half day workshop will be held April 2-4 in conjunction with the WBCA National Convention in San Antonio, Texas.
- The program was created to increase the amount of women in the coaching profession and the workshop is based on helping those interested in the coaching field with educational and professional principles. Benton, who will graduate this May with a degree in Sociology, will be one of seven student-athletes from Atlantic 10 teams in attendance. All participants will be provided the opportunity to meet and learn from professional coaches.
- The invitees are selected based on their academics, contributions to women's basketball on and off the court, professional resume, an exhaustion of their basketball career at a four-year institution, as well as a nomination and recommendation from their head coach.
- A co-captain for the 2009-10 Minutewomen squad, Benton has appeared in all 27 games this season, starting 26, and plays an average of 29.5 minutes per-game. The point-guard has posted career highs in assists and rebounds this season and is averaging 3.8 points-per game. In the season opener, Benton tied her career high putting up 18 points in an overtime victory against Boston University. She also posted a personal best with seven assists against Harvard on Jan. 6.

### #2 Emilie Teuscher

- Limited by injury for much of 2008-09, Emilie Teuscher played in 14 games for a total of 44 minutes as a freshman. Her season high in minutes played (9) came against Manhattan.

### #10 Megan Zullo

- Megan Zullo, who sat out 2008-09 after transferring from N.C. State, will see her first action in a Mint-utewomen uniform. She averaged 5.4 points, 1.3 rebounds and 2.2 assists as a redshirt freshman for the Wolfpack in 2007-08 and led the squad with a 1.5 assist-to-turnover ratio.
- Zullo is the first player in UMass history to hail from North Carolina (Greenville) and has a twin sister, Kim.
- She is the niece of former UMass standout, the late Christel Zullo, whose 23-year-old record for assists in a game (15) still stands. Megan has chosen to wear #10 (Christel's number) in her aunt's honor. Christel Zullo finished her career with 533 assists, which ranks second all-time.

### #12 Cerie Mosgrove

- Cerie Mosgrove had a breakout sophomore season, which included seven games scoring in double figures, and led the team in scoring in four games in 2008-09. Her three-point field goal total (51) from last season ranks fourth in program history. She is currently sixth all-time in career three-point percentage (.348).
- Mosgrove started the first 11 games of 2008-09, her first of her career coming in the season opener at Vermont.

### #15 Shakia Robinson

- Shakia Robinson averaged 16.4 points and 9.1 rebounds per-game at North Penn High School. She enjoys photography and aspires to major in Chemical Engineering at UMass.
- Robinson is the sixth player in program history to wear #15. Two of the previous five (Keyburn McCukser and Kathy Coyner) finished their careers at UMass as 1,000-point scorers.

### #21 Kim Benton

- Kim Benton is the most experienced member of the 2009-10 Minutewomen squad as she entered her senior season with 89 career games played and 38 starts. No other Minutewoman had played over 60 career contests entering this year.
- Benton earned a spot in the UMass single season top-10 as a freshman in 2006-07 with 50 treys, which is now tied for fifth on the list. She hit her 100th career three-pointer against URI on Feb. 22, 2009 and enters her senior campaign fourth all-time in career threes with 102.

### #22 Stephanie Lawrence

- Stephanie Lawrence, a native of Rigaud, Quebec, is the lone international player on the UMass roster.
- Lawrence made her first career start in the 2008-09 season opener at Vermont. She scored in double figures three times as a sophomore, including 11 points in a win over Temple.

### #23 Diatiema Hill

- After missing all of 2007-08 with an injury, Diatiema Hill returned to the UMass lineup last season and started all but one of the squad's 30 contests.
- Hill was UMass' leading rebounder on three occasions in 2008-09 and narrowly missed a triple-double against Northeastern with 11 points, eight boards and eight assists.

### #25 Dee Montgomery

- Dee Montgomery finished her career at Tennessee High School with over 1,700 points and four Big 9 Conference Championships. She helped Tennessee High to its first-ever state tournament.

### #32 Jasmine Watson

- Jasmine Watson comes to UMass out of South Bend Washington High School that earned a No. 2 ESPN RISE FAB 50 national ranking in 2008-09. Individually, Watson was rated as the No. 23-ranked forward nationally by Hoopgurlz.com.

### #33 Kristina Danella

- Kristina Danella enjoyed an outstanding freshman campaign, playing all 30 games and starting the final 19 of the season, on her way to Atlantic 10 All-Rookie team honors.
- Danella tied the school record with a team-leading 58 three-pointers in 2008-09 and shot .406 from beyond the arc, good for fifth all-time.
- In Atlantic 10 play, Danella averaged 13.3 points per-game, which led all A-10 freshmen. Overall, she scored in double figures 11 times with four 20-point games. She was named the Atlantic 10 Rookie of the Week four times in 2008-09, matching former Minutewoman Octavia Thomas' total from 1992-93, the most weekly honors for a first-year player in program history.

### #44 Nicole Jones

- In her collegiate debut, the 2008-09 season opener against Vermont, Nicole Jones just missed a double-double with eight points and eight rebounds. She finished the year with eight boards against Duquesne in the A-10 tournament to tie her career high. In total, Jones brought down 5+ rebounds on seven occasions in 2008-09 coming off the bench.

# RECAPS AND BOX SCORES

## Minutewomen Down BU, 79-73, In OT Thriller

**Four UMass players score in double figures, led 21 points from Danella.**

AMHERST, Mass. - Three clutch free throws by sophomore Kristina Danella helped send the season opener into overtime where the UMass women's basketball team went on to defeat Boston University by the score of 79-73 on Sunday afternoon in the Mullins Center. The Minutewomen, who never led during regulation, outscored the Terriers (0-2), 12-6 in the extra period to begin the year at 1-0.

Four players scored in double figures for the Minutewomen with Danella leading the balanced attack with 21 points on 5-10 shooting from the field and a 10-14 performance at the free throw line. She posted her fifth 20-point game of her career, while also contributing eight rebounds. Senior Kim Benton followed with 18 points, aided by 4-8 shooting from beyond the arc, tying her career high set during her sophomore campaign.

Sophomore Nicole Jones had a career day, as well, contributing 13 points and a team-best nine rebounds, both career highs for the center who made her first collegiate start. She also added three blocks and four steals.

Senior Diatiema Hill was one off her personal best with 14 points and finished with six boards and four assists. In her UMass debut, freshman Shakia Robinson brought down six rebounds in 16 minutes on the floor.

Boston University opened up with the first points of the day on a three by Chantell Alford. Though Benton would tie things up for the Minutewomen with an answering trey, the Terriers followed up with a 7-0 run to build a 10-3 advantage.

Hill brought UMass back to within a one-possession deficit at 10-8 as she scored five straight points for the Minutewomen, capped off by a jumper at 14:34. However, BU used a trio of three pointers to stretch its lead 11. The 9-0 run gave the Terriers their biggest lead of the opening half and went BU into the intermission with a 38-30 edge.

After beginning the second half with four free throws but no field goals, UMass pulled to within three at 42-39 as Benton hit her fourth three-pointer of the afternoon. She then assisted on a layup by Hill to prompt a timeout by the Terriers.

On BU's next possession, the momentum shifted again as Kat Briggs came up with a four point-play to push the margin back to seven at 46-39.

After coming within three of the Terriers on several occasions, the Minutewomen finally closed the gap to one with under two minutes remaining on a pair of free throws by Benton. Then with 17 seconds remaining in the period and BU holding a 67-64 lead, Danella was fouled on a three-point attempt from the top of the arc.

After Danella drained all three of her shots from the charity stripe, Briggs and Caroline Stewart missed a pair of layups at the opposite end of the floor in the closing seconds to send the game to overtime.

Hill's bucket seven seconds into the extra period gave UMass its first lead of the day at 69-67. After the Terriers managed to tie the score at 70, Jones answered with a basket to put the Minutewomen back on top by two, an advantage the squad would not relinquish in the remainder of the contest. Danella put the game out of reach for BU, making 5-of-6 free throw attempts in the closing 53 seconds.

The team stat lines for the day were nearly identical as UMass shot 38.3% (23-60) from the field and BU 38.2% (26-68), while each squad totaled 44 rebounds. The biggest difference came at the free throw line where the Minutewomen finished 28-37 (75.7%) and the Terriers were just 11-for-19 (57.9%).

## Women's Basketball Falls To St. John's, 82-52

**Danella led the Minutewomen with 16 points, while Mosgrove added a career-high six rebounds.**

AMHERST, Mass. - Despite another strong performance by sophomore Kristina Danella, the UMass women's basketball team dropped an 82-52 decision to St. John's on Wednesday evening in the Mullins Center. The Minutewomen are now 1-1 on the year following the setback, while the Red Storm improves to 2-0.

For the second straight game to open the season, Danella led UMass in scoring with 16 points and contributed a team-best seven rebounds. Freshman Jasmine Watson followed with 14 points, aided by 5-for-10 shooting and 4-4 at the free throw line. Junior Cerie Mosgrove and senior Diatiema Hill added eight and six, respectively. Mosgrove pulled down a career-best six rebounds, as well, and junior Stephanie Lawrence posted her first career five-assist game.

With five quick points from Danella and a basket by Hill, UMass took an early, 7-4 lead. St. John's fired back with a 9-0 run, however, climbing on top, 13-7 with 13:56 left in the opening half. The Red Storm then made it a double-digit deficit for the Minutewomen on a three by Shenneika Smith at 8:53, bringing the score to 25-14. Danella hit a three and made a pair of free throws in the remainder of the period to increase her total to 10, but UMass entered the intermission trailing 40-23.

The Minutewomen would draw no closer than 13 in the second. St. John's went on to expand its cushion to 21 with 10 minutes to play in the contest on a three-pointer from Kelly McManmon that increased the score to 60-39.

The Red Storm shot 35-for-78 (45%) from the field to UMass' 18-for-50 (36%), including 5-for-13 from three point range, while the Minutewomen were 4-for-13 from beyond the arc. St. John's finished with a 42-35 edge in rebounds, as well.

Da'Shena Stevens was the top point producer for the Red Storm with 17 to go along with nine boards. Cenhya Hart totaled 14 points, while Smith had 12 and Eugenia McPherson registered 11 points. Joy McCorvey added a game-high 11 rebounds and Britney Murphy led all players with six assists.

## RECAPS AND BOX SCORES

### UNH Slips Past Women's Basketball, 58-57

*Despite hot-shooting first half for the Minutewomen, last second free throws give the Wildcats the win.*

DURHAM, N.H. - After shooting a blistering 57 percent from three-point range in the first half, the UMass women's basketball team was unable to keep up the pace in the second as New Hampshire eked out a 58-57 victory over the Minutewomen (1-2) on Friday evening at Lundholm Gym. Jill McDonald made a pair of free throws with 12.5 seconds remaining to seal the victory for the Wildcats (2-1).

Sophomore Kristina Danella and redshirt junior Megan Zullo each posted a team-best 14 points for UMass. Danella finished a perfect 6-for-6 at the free throw line, while Zullo made four of the seven three-pointers she attempted. Junior Cerie Mosgrove was the third Minutewoman to record a double-figure point total as she scored 12, shooting 4-for-7 from beyond the arc. Freshman Jasmine Watson brought down a squad-best seven rebounds and senior Kim Benton had three steals.

After Danella opened the scoring with a layup at 19:19, UNH hit the next three baskets to take a 7-2 lead. UMass caught fire shortly after as Zullo had the next nine points for the Minutewomen, draining three treys to give the squad a 19-12 advantage. UMass led by as many as 15 in the first half as Watson made her second of two free throws with 2:43 in the period.

The Minutewomen shot 50% (11-22) in the first half, including 8-for-14 from beyond the arc (57.1%) and made 5-of-6 at the free throw line to hold a 35-26 edge at the intermission. The Wildcats were limited to 9-28 shooting from the field, 2-for-9 (22.2%) from three-point range, in the period.

After hitting three more threes to help expand the UMass advantage to 18 with 17:39 to play in the second half, the offense went cold for the Minutewomen. UMass made just two field goals in the remainder of the contest as New Hampshire outscored the Minutewomen 30-11 the rest of the way.

UNH chipped away at its deficit until finally pulling ahead, 49-48 with 6:22 left in the period. Even though Danella hit two free throws with 39 seconds on the clock to give UMass a 57-56 lead, McDonald was fouled at the other end of the court with 12 seconds left. She made her pair from the charity stripe before the Wildcats' defense came up with a stop at the buzzer.

### Jones Leads UMass Past Villanova, 55-47

*Sophomore posts first career double-double with 22 points, 12 rebounds to lead the Minutewomen.*

AMHERST, Mass. -The UMass women's basketball team came out on top, 55-47, in a defensive battle with Villanova on Sunday afternoon in the Mullins Center. Led by sophomore Nicole Jones' first career double-double, the Minutewomen leveled their record at 2-2. The Wildcats, coming off a 2008-09 NCAA Tournament appearance, fell to 2-1 to start the season.

Jones led all scorers with her first career 20-point game, pouring in 22 on 9-11 shooting and was the top rebounder with 12, as well. Senior Diatiema Hill followed with 12 points and eight boards for UMass, while sophomore Kristina Danella added seven points, six rebounds, three assists and two steals.

The Minutewomen led from the opening basket, but were not able to pull out in front by more than four as their largest lead of the first half came at 12-8, courtesy of a three-pointer from Megan Zullo at 13:42.

Villanova fought back by draining four straight threes, part of a 14-4 run for the Wildcats, and went up by eight, 22-14, on a trey by Kyle Dougherty with 7:56 remaining in the period for its largest lead of the afternoon.

The Minutewomen responded by closing the gap to a one-possession margin. A three-pointer by Danella and a layup by Hill closed out the half and sent UMass into the intermission down by three at 24-21.

Carrying their momentum into the second period, the Minutewomen quickly overtook Villanova with an 8-0 run, which included six from Jones. Her third basket of the period, a layup with 16:13 on the clock, gave UMass a 29-24 advantage. However, Villanova eventually pulled even at 31-31 on a bucket by Laura Sweeney.

At the 8:02 mark, another layup by Sweeney gave the Wildcats back the lead, 39-38, for the final time. Jones then continued her stellar afternoon as she made a free throw to complete a three-point play at 6:26 that put the Minutewomen back up by two. She followed up with a fast break bucket and another free throw to expand the UMass lead to 44-39 with less than five minutes to play.

A Tia Grant three brought Villanova to within two points, 46-44 at 2:47, but Hill answered at the opposite end for the Minutewomen with the final field goal of the contest for the Minutewomen. UMass then put the game away by making seven free throws in the final 45 seconds.

The Minutewomen bounced back from an 8-for-30 (26.7%) showing in the first half by shooting 10-for-17 (58.8%) in the second to finish the contest 18-for-47 from the field (38.3%). UMass limited Villanova to 17-for-60 (28.3%) shooting overall, including 9-for-38 (23.7%) from three-point range. Points in the paint were 24-14 in favor of the Minutewomen, who finished with a 39-34 edge in rebounding.

Grant, Sweeney and Heather Scanlon registered 12 points apiece for the Wildcats, while Scanlon had nine boards and Sweeney brought down eight.

### Free Throw Shooting Helps UMass Past Rice, 71-57

*Danella shoots a perfect 12-for-12 at the charity stripe and leads all scorers with 21.*

CORAL GABLES, Fla. - With a near-perfect evening at the free throw line on Friday at the BankUnited Center, the UMass women's basketball team defeated Rice, 71-57, to advance to the championship game of the Wyndham Miami Thanksgiving Tournament. The victory was the second straight for the Minutewomen who move to 3-2 on the year, while the Owls drop to 0-5.

Sophomore Kristina Danella led all scorers with 21 points and chipped in with seven rebounds for UMass, making 12-of-12 free throws. Her 1.000% free throw percentage matched a program single game record (minimum 10 attempts), last set by Melissa Gurile who was 15-for-15 at the charity stripe against Providence in 1993.

Redshirt junior Megan Zullo had her second double-digit scoring game in a Minutewoman uniform, totaling 10 points and four assists. Sophomore Nicole Jones followed with nine points and added four blocks and five rebounds. Junior Stephanie Lawrence recorded eight points in 12 minutes on the floor, while freshman Jasmine Watson contributed eight points and five rebounds. Senior Diatiema Hill was UMass' top rebounder with eight and registered seven assists and four steals, as well.

After the teams traded baskets over the first seven minutes of the contest, Zullo hit a jumper at 13:28 that sparked a 16-6 run for the Minutewomen. Five straight points by Lawrence gave UMass its first 10-point lead of the contest, capped off by a layup with 9:10 on the clock. The Minutewomen maintained its double figure edge for the remainder of the period and went into halftime holding a 40-27 advantage. UMass shot 15-for-29 (51.7%) in the first half and made all seven free throws attempted.

Rice came out and hit the first four field goals of the second half to trim its deficit to six at 42-36 with 14:14 remaining. However, the Minutewomen responded with treys from junior Cerie Mosgrove and Danella to push the margin back above 10.

Another Danella three gave UMass a 53-39 lead at the 12:23 mark, but the Owls refused to fade. Over the next five minutes, Rice held the Minutewomen to just one field goal and crept back to within seven at 59-49 with 7:24 on the clock. Lawrence ended the draught with a trey at 4:54, making it a 59-49 advantage for UMass.

That would be the final field goal of the game for the Minutewomen, but the squad's defense and impeccable free throw shooting was all the team required the rest of the way. The Owls came no closer than six points of UMass the rest of the way as the Minutewomen drained 12 free throws in the final two minutes of the contest.

Tara Watts and Morgan Mayse both finished in double figures for Rice with 13 and 12 points, respectively. Mayse also pulled down a team-high eight boards.

UMass shot 21-for-50 (42%) overall, 7-for-23 (30.4%) from three and 22-for-23 (95.7%) at the free throw line. Rice finished 21-for-63 (33.3%) overall, 6-for-22 (27.3%) from three and made 9-of-10 (90%) free throws.

### Despite Strong Effort, Women's Basketball Falls To Miami, 63-57

*Danella and Jones represent the Minutewomen on the Wyndham Miami Thanksgiving All-Tournament team.*

CORAL GABLES, Fla. - In a gritty defensive effort, the UMass women's basketball team was edged out by Miami, 63-57, in the championship game of the Wyndham Miami Thanksgiving Tournament. Sophomores Kristina Danella and Nicole Jones totaled 14 and 13 points, respectively for the Minutewomen (3-3) and represented UMass on the all-tournament team. The Hurricanes remain undefeated at 7-0 after taking the tournament title.

Danella's 14 for UMass included a 7-for-7 performance at the line along with nine rebounds. She has now made 27 consecutive free throws, dating back to Nov. 18 against St. John's. Jones added six boards and two blocks, while freshman Jasmine Watson came off the bench and narrowly missed a double-double with nine points and eight rebounds. Junior Cerie Mosgrove contributed eight points and six rebounds to tie a career high on the glass. Senior Diatiema Hill dished six assists and grabbed three steals.

A pair of free throws from Danella gave the Minutewomen the first points of the night as the squad led for nearly the entire first half. With 13:32 on the clock, Danella was fouled from three-point range and sunk all three attempts to push the UMass advantage to five at 11-6. However, Miami fought back and closed the gap to one with threes from Shenise Johnson and Stefanie Yderstrom.

The Minutewomen came close to breaking away from the Hurricanes once again as an 8-3 run gave the squad its largest lead of the night, seven, with 4:09 remaining in the first half. The stretch was capped off by a Mosgrove trey that moved the score to at 23-16.

Miami responded by scoring the final eight points of the half and climbed on top for the first time, 24-23, with 52 seconds left before the intermission.

Even though the Minutewomen only overtook the Hurricanes on one more occasion, 30-28 at 15:52, courtesy of a jumper by Jones, the second half was more tightly-contested than the first. UMass tied the score on four occasions and kept the deficit below five until Johnson added free throws with seven seconds left to push the final margin to six points. Over the final five minutes of the contest, only one field goal was made by either team, a basket by Yderstrom at 1:19.

Riquna Williams paced Miami with 17 points, while Johnson, the tournament MVP, followed with 15 and four steals and Yderstrom tallied 11. Diane Barnes was the top rebounder on the night with 11, including five on the offensive glass.

UMass shot 18-for-48 (37.5%) overall, 6-for-19 (31.6%) from three and made 15-of-20 (75%) at the foul line. The Hurricanes finished 21-for-67 (31.3%) from the field, 7-for-22 (31.8%) from three and converted 14-of-21 (66.7%) free throws. UMass held a 20-14 edge in points in the paint. Miami outscored the Minutewomen 11-0 on fast break points and 9-2 in points off turnovers.

BOSTON, Mass. - Despite shooting 47.2% from the field, the UMass women's basketball team dropped a 73-64 decision at Northeastern on Wednesday afternoon at Solomon Court. The loss leaves the Minutewomen at 3-4 on the season, while the Huskies improve their record to 4-2.

Sophomore Nicole Jones led UMass with 15 points on 7-for-9 shooting, including 13 in the second half, while classmate Kristina Danella went 5-for-10, contributing 12 points. Freshman Dee Montgomery had her best performance of her young collegiate career, adding 10 points off the bench. Redshirt junior Megan Zullo totaled nine points, senior Kim Benton grabbed four steals and senior Diatiema Hill pulled down a team-best five rebounds.

Brittany Wilson dropped in the first eight points of the game for Northeastern and gave the Huskies an early 5-0 lead. UMass would tie the score at eight on Montgomery's first career points, a layup at 13:41, but that was as close as the squad would come to overtaking the Huskies.

A 7-0 run, capped off by a basket from Kashaia Cannon at 6:21, expanded Northeastern's advantage to double figures for the first time on the afternoon at 22-12. The Huskies' largest lead of the opening period, 11, came on a three by Cannon at 3:28. An answering trey by Zullo brought the Minutewomen back within eight at 30-22 entering the intermission.

Two quick buckets by Danella and Cerie Mosgrove closed UMass' deficit to three at 30-27 early in the second half. Within four minutes time, however, Northeastern regained its double-digit cushion with the help of back-to-back three-pointers from Deanna Kerkhof and Kendra Walton.

At 4:34, Montgomery drained a three and was fouled. The freshman went to the line to complete the four-point play with a free throw, bringing the Minutewomen back within reach of the Huskies at 59-55, but a layup by Kim Carr followed to push the NU lead to six.

Then in the final two minutes, 12 free throws iced the victory for the Huskies who shot 25-for-63 (39.7%) overall, 8-for-31 (25.8%) from three and made 15-of-21 (71.4%) foul shots. UMass finished 6-for-13 (46.2%) beyond the arc and 8-for-11 (72.7%) at the charity stripe. Points off turnovers were 20-7 in favor of Northeastern.

Wilson led the way for the Huskies with 23 points and contributed seven rebounds and three steals. Walton and Cannon scored in double figures as well with 15 and 13, respectively. Carr grabbed a game-high eight rebounds and added seven points, four steals and three blocks.

## All-Around Effort Carries UMass Past Brown, 69-54

*Several Minutewomen post career highs, including eight rebounds by senior Kim Benton.*

PROVIDENCE, R.I. - With a balanced effort, the UMass women's basketball team rolled to a 69-54 victory over Brown on Saturday afternoon at the Brown Bear Classic. For the fourth time in the past two seasons, the Minutewomen (4-4) advance to the championship game of an in-season tournament and will play Quinnipiac on Sunday at 1 p.m. The Bears drop to 2-6 on the year following the loss.

Sophomore Kristina Danella totaled 16 points to lead three UMass scorers in double figures and pulled down six rebounds. Freshman Jasmine Watson followed with 13 points, aided by perfect 4-for-4 shooting from the floor, and had seven rebounds and two blocks. Redshirt-junior Megan Zullo added 10 points, five boards and five steals and senior Kim Benton posted a career-best eight rebounds, a team-high. Also contributing off the bench for the Minutewomen, sophomore Emilie Teuscher chipped in with nine points to set a career high and went 3-for-3 from three-point range. Sophomore Nicole Jones played 15 minutes and had seven points.

Through much of the first half, the teams were evenly matched as neither side led by more than four. Then with 6:36 left in the period, Danella drained a three to spark an 18-5 run for UMass, which included 11 points from the sophomore forward. With the score tied at 17, Danella hit another trey at the 4:18 mark that put the Minutewomen in front for good. She followed up with a pair of free throws for the squad's next two points and hit two more with 2.6 seconds remaining to give UMass a 32-21 edge at halftime.

A three by Hanna Passafuime at the 13:21 mark of the second half brought the Bears back to within eight, but that was as close as Brown would come. The Minutewomen led by as many as 25 and no fewer than 15 over the final 10 minutes of the contest.

UMass, shot 47.6% (10-21) in the opening half, including 5-13 (38.5%) from three after rebounding from an 0-5 start beyond the arc. The Minutewomen finished 18-for-42 (42.9%) overall, 10-for-27 (37.0%) from three and 23-for-36 (63.9%) at the free throw line. Brown shot 19-for-52 (36.5%), 7-for-19 (36.8%) from three-point range and 9-for-14 at the charity stripe. UMass' bench contributed 46 points, compared to 14 for the Bears.

Passafuime totaled a game-high 25 points on 8-for-12 shooting and was the lone scorer for Brown with more than 10. Natalie Bonds logged nine rebounds and Courtney Lee compiled eight points and four assists.

### UMass Wins Brown Classic, 82-66 Over Quinnipiac

*Hill shatters career highs for points and rebounds, named to all-tournament team along with Danella.*

PROVIDENCE, R.I. - Led by a career-high 21 points and 14 rebounds from senior Diatiema Hill, the UMass women's basketball team captured its second straight Brown Classic title with an 82-66 win over Quinnipiac on Sunday afternoon at the Pizzitola Sports Center. The Minutewomen are now 5-4 following the victory, while the Bobcats fall to 2-4 on the year.

Hill was a perfect 11-for-11 at the free throw line and 5-for-7 from the field for UMass on her way to all-tournament team honors. She logged her first career double-double and first career 20-point game, chipping in six assists, as well. Redshirt junior Megan Zullo shot a blistering 6-for-8 from three-point range and totaled a career-best 20 for the Minutewomen. Sophomore Kristina Danella was the third UMass player in double figures with 13 points to go along with seven boards and earned a spot on the all-tournament team.

Also contributing for the Minutewomen, freshman Jasmine Watson added nine points and six rebounds, while sophomore Nicole Jones totaled eight points. Senior Kim Benton corralled six rebounds, as well.

Play was even through the first 10 or so minutes of the opening half as Quinnipiac led, but was unable to gain more than a one-possession advantage. UMass hit a cold stretch, going without a field goal for nearly seven minutes, which allowed the Bobcats to stretch the margin to eight, 31-23, at 2:23 on a pair of free throws by Jacki Mann. However, Zullo broke the draught for the Minutewomen with a trey at 2:06. She followed up by hitting two more from beyond the arc as UMass ended the period with a 10-0 run and went to the locker room on top, 33-31.

The teams traded buckets through the first four minutes of the second period and Quinnipiac took its final lead on a free throw by Jacinda Dunbar at 16:36 that brought the score to 39-38.

Once again sparked by a three from Zullo, the UMass offense came alive. The Minutewomen scored the next 11 straight points to race out to a 49-39 advantage with 12:55 remaining. Following a Bobcats' trey by Felicia Barron at 8:04, an answering three by Danella on the next UMass possession expanded the squad's cushion to 12. The Minutewomen led by double figures the rest of the way.

UMass shot 26-for-58 (44.8%) in the contest, including 15-for-27 (55.6%) in the second half. From three-point range, the Minutewomen went 11-for-29 (37.9%), making 5-of-8 (62.5%) after the intermission. At the free throw line, the squad went 15-for-26 (73.1%), with a 14-for-15 (93.3%) performance in the second.

Mann recorded a team-best 15 points and eight rebounds for Quinnipiac, while Courtney Kaminski tallied 14 points and seven boards and Kathleen Neyens contributed 13 and six. The Bobcats shot 22-for-60 (36.7%) overall, 5-for-17 (29.4%) from three and 17-for-26 (65.4%) at the foul line.

For a second straight game, the Minutewomen saw significant contributions from reserves as the squad held a 38-10 edge in bench points. UMass out-rebounded Quinnipiac, 41-37, as well.

### Vermont Tops Women's Basketball, 57-38

AMHERST, Mass. - Despite a strong outing by freshman Jasmine Watson, the UMass women's basketball team came up short against Vermont, falling 57-38, on Wednesday evening at the Mullins Center. The loss leaves the Minutewomen at 5-5 on the season, while the Catamounts improve to 7-1.

Watson totaled 14 points and nine rebounds to lead UMass, both career highs for the center. Senior Kim Benton added seven points, while redshirt junior Megan Zullo and sophomore Nicole Jones totaled six apiece. Sophomore Kristina Danella contributed six rebounds, as well.

A 1-for-5 start from the field for the Minutewomen allowed Vermont to take a 10-point lead seven minutes into the opening period, 14-4. UMass managed to cut its deficit to single digits on several occasions, but was unable to come any closer than eight of the Catamounts, who held a 27-15 advantage at the intermission.

Vermont shot 10-for-27 (37%) in the first half to the Minutewomen's 4-for-18 (22.2%) and held an 8-0 edge in points off turnovers.

A three-point play for Jones gave UMass some momentum to start the second half, trimming the Catamounts' lead to nine at 27-18. However, Vermont responded by scoring 10 straight points over a span of 4:24 and held a double-digit cushion the rest of the way.

Though the Minutewomen won the battle of the boards with a 37-28 edge in rebounding, turnovers were 22-4, against UMass. The Catamounts finished 20-for-56 (35.7%) overall, 3-for-17 (17.6%) from three and 14-for-21 (66.7%) at the foul line. Despite a stellar 17-for-19 (89.5%) performance by the Minutewomen at the charity stripe, the squad was just 1-for-12 (8.3%) from beyond the arc and shot 10-for-39 (25.6%) overall.

May Kotsopoulos tallied a game-best 19 points to pace Vermont and had three assists and two steals. Kendra Seto and Alissa Sheftic each chipped in with 10 points and grabbed nine and seven rebounds, respectively.

### Providence Runs Past UMass, 72-54 Danella's 17 points and Jones' 11 rebounds lead the Minutewomen.

AMHERST, Mass. - The UMass women's basketball team outscored Providence in the second half, but cold shooting in the opening period proved to be too much to overcome as the squad fell to the Friars, 72-54 on Friday evening in the Mullins Center. With the loss, the Minutewomen are now 5-6 on the year, while the Providence moves to 8-2.

Sophomore Kristina Danella totaled a squad-best 17 points and contributed eight rebounds for UMass, while senior Diatiema Hill followed with nine points and nine boards. Sophomore Nicole Jones chipped in a team-leading 11 rebounds and had eight points, while freshman Jasmine Watson and redshirt junior Megan Zullo added seven points apiece. Zullo and senior Kim Benton each dished a game-high four assists, as well.

In her first career start, Zullo drained an early three, helping the Minutewomen to a 5-0 lead. With the score tied at 11, Providence proceeded to go on a 16-4 run over the next 5:32 to build a 27-15 advantage. Then UMass hit a dry spell, with 7:21 between field goals, which allowed the Friars to pull away even further and take a 19-point lead into the intermission at 42-23.

The Minutewomen went 8-for-10 (80%) at the foul line in the first half, but was just 7-for-29 (24.1%) from the field, compared to 16-for-33 (48.5%) for Providence.

With 31 points to the Friars' 30, the UMass offense fared better in the second. The Minutewomen shot 10-for-32 (31.3%), and finished 17-for-61 (27.9%), but could not overcome the first period deficit. Providence was 26-for-56 (46.4%) on the night, including 6-for-16 (37.5%) from three-point range. Both teams fared extremely well at the foul line as UMass was 15-for-17 (88.2%) and the Friars were 14-for-17 (82.4%).

Chelsea Marandola paced Providence with 17 points on 6-for-13 shooting, while Jess Clark and Brittany Dorsey followed with 13 apiece. Clark also logged a team-high seven rebounds, while Dorsey had four assists.

### Women's Hoops Rolls To 70-59 Win Over NJIT Zullo, Danella, Hill and Jones all score in double figures for the Minutewomen.

NEWARK, N.J. - Four UMass starters scored in double figures, helping the Minutewomen basketball squad roll to a 70-59 victory over NJIT on Sunday afternoon at the Fleisher Athletic Center. UMass levels its record at 6-6 heading into the holiday break, while the Highlanders fall to 3-7 on the year.

Redshirt junior Megan Zullo poured in a team-best 17 points for the Minutewomen, aided by 5-for-8 shooting from beyond the arc. Sophomore Kristina Danella followed with 16 points, seven rebounds, three assists and two blocks, while senior Diatiema Hill posted her second double-double of the season with 13 points and 10 boards. Hill was 9-for-10 at the charity stripe and dished a game-high six assists, as well.

Sophomore Nicole Jones chipped in 10 points and six rebounds and, off the bench, junior Stephanie Lawrence and freshman Jasmine Watson contributed six points apiece.

Aided by a 5-0 advantage from the start on a layup by Jones and a three from Zullo, UMass never trailed in contest. Then with 4:54 remaining in the first half, the Minutewomen began to pull away from NJIT, leading by eight at 30-22. However, the Highlanders reeled UMass back in, cutting its deficit to 33-31 with a 9-3 run to end the period.

Though NJIT's Jessica Gerald would tie the score for the fourth time at 33-33 with a free throw in the opening minute of the second half, the Minutewomen went on to outscore the Highlanders, 37-28 in the frame. UMass shot 47.1% (8-for-17) from the field following the intermission and 18-for-21 (85.7%) from the foul line compared to a 10-for-37 (27.0%) performance by NJIT.

With 9:47 left in the contest, Gerald's layup brought the Highlanders back within a possession of the Minutewomen at 50-47, but UMass responded by scoring the next 11 straight points to expand their advantage out to 14. The Minutewomen did not score a field goal in the final 7:03 of the game, but maintained their double-digit cushion by draining 11-of-12 free throws in that span.

UMass finished 17-for-38 (44.7%) overall, including a 9-for-18 (50%) clip from beyond the arc, and shot 79.4% (27-for-34) at the free throw line. NJIT went 23-for-70 (32.9%) from the field, 6-for-27 (22.2%) from three and 7-for-8 (87.5%) at the charity stripe.

Gerald led all scorers with 24 points, while Melanie Griffin totaled 13 and Katie Piekelski had 10 for NJIT. Rayven Johnson was the squad's top rebounder with eight, while Griffin handed out six assists and grabbed three steals.

### Late Layup Lifts Delaware Past UMass, 57-55

Zullo and Danella score in double figures for the Minutewomen against the Blue Hens.

NEWARK, Del. - Despite erasing a seven-point lead in the second half, the UMass women's basketball team was unable to complete the comeback as the squad fell to Delaware, 57-55, on Wednesday evening at Acierno Arena. Freshman Elena Delle Donne dropped in the game-winning layup with 4.3 seconds remaining in the contest to help the Blue Hens improve to 8-3 on the season. The Minutewomen fall to 6-7 overall following the setback.

Redshirt junior Megan Zullo shot 5-for-8 from three-point range and finished with 15 to pace UMass, while sophomore Kristina Danella had 13 points, including a 5-for-5 showing at the free throw line. Danella also chipped in a team-best nine rebounds, three steals and two blocks. Junior Cerie Mosgrove added nine points off the bench and sophomore Nicole Jones had seven. Seniors Kim Benton and Diatiema Hill had five rebounds and three assists apiece, as well.

Early on, neither side was able to gain more than a four-point lead until Danella sunk a layup at 10:22 to give the Minutewomen a 17-12 first half advantage. Then with 6:38 on the clock, Danella converted a pair of free throws to make it a six-point edge, UMass' largest lead of the night.

However, the Minutewomen did not make a field goal in the final 8:30 of the opening period as the Blue Hens crept back in front and led 26-23 at the intermission. UMass took full advantage of Delaware miscues in the opening period, with a 13-4 margin in points off turnovers.

Zullo broke up the drought with three straight threes to begin the second half and put the Minutewomen on top once again, 31-32 with 16:39 remaining. A basket by Jones tied the score for the sixth time moments later, but the Blue Hens proceeded to go on an 11-6 run and built their largest lead of the night, seven, with 7:36 on the clock.

In the final five minutes, the Minutewomen proceeded to chip away at the deficit. Then Zullo drained a dramatic trey to bring UMass within one at 54-53 and 1:05 remaining. Jones had a layup to tie the score at 55 with 31 seconds left, but Delle Donne hit the game winning shot for the Blue Hens on the next possession.

Delle Donne finished with a team-best 21 points and 11 rebounds for Delaware, on 8-for-18 shooting. Tesia Harris followed with 17 points and eight rebounds, while Kayla Miller contributed six points and five assists.

UMass recovered from shooting 6-for-25 (24.0%) in the first half by making 10-of-25 (40.0%) in the second and was 16-for-50 (32.0%) on the night overall, 9-for-26 (34.6%) from three and 14-for-18 (77.8%) at the free throw line. The Blue Hens were 20-for-60 (33.3%) overall, 6-for-22 (27.3%) from three and 11-for-17 (64.7%) at the charity stripe.

Delaware out-rebounded the Minutewomen, 43 to 35 and led in points in the paint, 24 to 10.

### Minutewomen Come Up Short Vs. Maine, 65-49

AMHERST, Mass. - Despite three players scoring in double figures, the UMass women's basketball team was unable to stop Maine's offensive efforts as the squad fell 65-49 on Sunday afternoon at the Mullins Center, the first of three straight at home to begin the New Year. With the loss, the Minutewomen fall to 6-8 on the season, while the Black Bears improve to 4-8.

Sophomore Kristina Danella was the top point-getter for UMass, totaling 12 along with four rebounds and one block. Classmate Nicole Jones followed with 11 points, aided by 3-for-6 shooting and a 5-for-6 performance at the free throw line, and also brought down a squad-best seven rebounds. The final Minutewomen in double figures, freshman Jasmine Watson, tallied 10 points, five boards, two steals and one block.

Redshirt junior Megan Zullo contributed nine points and three assists, senior Diatiema Hill handed out four assists and senior Kim Benton passed out three helpers and notched two steals.

Maine led 5-0 from the start of the contest and went up by as many as eight in the first half, on a basket by Amanda Tewksbury with 6:21 remaining in the period. Before the Black Bears could pull away any further, five straight points by Danella kick-started a 10-1 UMass run over a span of 2:32. Zullo then capped off the stretch with a three from the top of the arc, giving the Minutewomen their first and only lead of the afternoon, 23-22 with 3:36 left in the opening half. Maine then responded by closing out the game with eight unanswered points to take a 30-23 lead into the intermission.

The Black Bears expanded its margin to 16 over UMass in the first six minutes of the second period. Then with 13:55 on the clock, the Minutewomen caught fire as a layup by Danella began a stretch of 7:51 that saw the squad outscore Maine, 17-2. Hill drove to the basket for a layup with 5:36 remaining to pull the Minutewomen to within one of the Black Bears at 48-44. However, that was as close as UMass could get to overtaking Maine, who responded by scoring the next 13 straight to put the game away.

The Black Bears shot 46.9% (23-49) on the afternoon, including 6-for-13 (46.2%) from three point range, compared to 31.4% (16-51) from the field for the Minutewomen and 25.0% (5-for-20) from three-point range. Uncharacteristically, UMass shot 66.7% (12-for-18) at the free throw line, while Maine sunk 13-for-16 (81.3%) from the charity stripe. The Black Bears finished with a 37-31 edge in rebounds, 12-7 in second chance points, 19-14 in points off turnovers and 26-20 in points in the paint.

Tewksbury shot 7-for-13 and was 6-for-6 at the line to lead Maine with a game-high 24 points and also chipped in nine rebounds. Kristin Baker tallied 15 points, six assists and four steals. Samantha Wheeler and Katia Bratishko added eight points apiece, along with totals of 10 and nine rebounds, respectively.

### Minutewomen Fight, But Fall To Harvard, 72-60 Watson logs double-double in first career start at UMass.

Jan. 6, 2010

AMHERST, Mass. - Despite outscoring Harvard in the second half, the UMass women's basketball team was unable to overcome an early 17-point deficit and dropped its non-conference finale, 72-60, on Wednesday evening at the Mullins Center. The Minutewomen fall to 6-9 on the year following the setback, while the Crimson moves its record to 8-4.

Sophomore Nicole Jones led all scorers with 22 points for UMass, aided by 7-for-12 shooting, and collected five rebounds and two steals. Her classmate Kristina Danella scored in double figures for a fifth consecutive game with 19 points to go along with seven rebounds and two steals.

In her first collegiate start, freshman Jasmine Watson logged a double-double with 10 points and 13 rebounds, including nine on the offensive glass. Senior Kim Benton dished out a career-best seven assists and grabbed six boards, while Diatiema Hill totaled six rebounds.

Aided by an 8-of-9 start from the field, Harvard raced out to a 21-4 lead with 13:28 left in the first half. Then with a free throw and a layup from Jones and a three from Danella, UMass scored the next six straight and went on a 25-12 run over a span of 8:39. Danella's three free throws at 4:17 brought the Minutewomen to within four at 33-29. However, the Crimson closed out the half with 13 unanswered points and went into the intermission with a 46-29 advantage. Harvard shot 17-for-28 (60.7%) in the opening period, including 10-for-17 (58.8%) from three-point range.

After going down by as many as 21 early in the second half, UMass fired up its offense and out-scored Harvard 21-4 over a 10:40 stretch that began with a free throw by Jones at 17:44. Just as in the first half, Danella sunk two at the line to close the gap to four, 58-54 with 7:04 remaining. The Minutewomen were unable to draw any closer, though. The Crimson responded with seven straight points to help ice the victory.

Harvard shot just 2-for-10 (20%) from three in the second half and 10-for-33 (30.3%) overall, but still finished the night above 40% in both categories at 12-for-27 (44.4%) and 27-for-61 (44.3%), respectively. UMass shot 20-for-63 (31.7%) overall, 2-for-17 (11.8%) from three and 18-for-25 (72.0%) at the free throw line.

The Minutewomen out-rebounded the Crimson, 46 to 33, led in points in the paint, 30-16, and second chance points, 13-3. Harvard held a 18-6 edge in points off turnovers.

Brogan Berry led the Crimson with 16 points and seven assists, while Emma Markley and Christine Matera added 14 points apiece. Matera also brought down a squad-best nine rebounds and had four blocks and three steals. Victoria Lippert was just shy of double figures with nine points.

### URI Edges Women's Basketball, 58-57

Danella logs third career double-double, while Watson and Hill score in double figures for UMass.

Jan. 9, 2010

AMHERST, Mass. - A layup by Anisha Wilson with 33 seconds remaining proved to be the game-winner as the UMass women's basketball team was unable to counter in the final seconds, falling to Rhode Island, 58-57 in the squads' Atlantic 10 opener on Saturday afternoon at the Mullins Center. The setback leaves the Minutewomen at 6-10 on the year (0-1 A-10), while the Rams level their record at 8-8 (1-0 A-10).

Sophomore Kristina Danella, who scored her 500th career point in what was just her 46th career game, finished with a game-high 16 for UMass. She completed her third career double-double with a team-leading 11 rebounds and grabbed two steals, as well.

Freshman Jasmine Watson followed with 13 points, five boards and three blocks. Senior Diatiema Hill was the third UMass player in double figures with 10 points and chipped in five rebounds and three steals. Sophomore Nicole Jones shot a perfect 4-for-4 from the floor and totaled nine points and senior Kim Benton handed out six assists.

In a first half that featured two ties and four lead changes, neither side was able to pull away. The Minutewomen held their largest margin over the Rams with 9:25 on the clock as six straight points by Danella gave the squad a 20-14 advantage. Rhode Island answered with a 10-0 run over a span of 1:53 to climb on top, 20-24, but UMass outscored URI 8-2 over the final 5:34 of the period to hold a 28-26 edge at halftime.

The Minutewomen shot 11-for-27 (40.7%) in the first half and 4-for-6 (66.7%) from three. Despite the Rams shooting 32.1% (9-for-28) and 36.4% (4-for-11) from beyond the arc in the first, 12 points off 13 UMass turnovers helped keep the Rhode Island within striking distance.

With a one-possession advantage at 43-40 with 11:30 remaining in the second period, the Minutewomen strung together a 9-4 run to take their largest lead of the afternoon, eight, at 52-44 with 7:59 to play. However, URI responded with a 12-2 run of its own to climb on top, 56-54 with 3:33 left in regulation.

Danella hit a pair of free throws with 2:20 on the clock to tie the score at 56, but turnovers on the next two UMass possessions, followed by a layup from Wilson, resulted in the Rams going back on top by two. Watson was fouled and went to the line with 10 seconds remaining for the chance to tie the score again, but managed to sink only one of her two free throws, leaving the Minutewomen at a one-point deficit.

UMass grabbed the rebound on Watson's missed free throw and sent up two shot attempts in the final seconds, but was not able to get the would-be winning basket to fall.

The Minutewomen finished 22-for-49 (44.9%) overall on the afternoon, 5-for-11 (45.5%) from three and 8-for-13 (61.5%) at the free throw line, compared to 22-for-55 (38.2%), 4-for-11 (36.4%) and 12-for-15 (80%) for Rhode Island. The Rams held a 29-11 advantage in points off turnovers and an 8-2 edge in fast break points.

Lindsay Harris was the top scorer and rebounder for URI with 14 and 11 respectively, while also chipping in six assists and four steals. Wilson tallied 11 points, four assists and five steals and Megan Shoniker and Ashley Rivera added nine points apiece.

### Hill Carries Women's Hoops Past Saint Louis In OT, 62-59

Hill pours in 26 points and adds 10 rebounds, five assists and four steals for the Minutewomen.

ST. LOUIS, Mo. - Led by an impressive all-around effort from senior Diatiema Hill, the UMass women's basketball team outlasted Saint Louis in overtime, 62-59, on Wednesday evening at Chaifetz Arena. With their second overtime win of the season, the Minutewomen are now 7-10 overall and 1-1 in the Atlantic 10, while the Billikens fall to 6-11 overall and 0-2 in conference play.

Hill poured in a career-high 26 points for UMass, shooting 10-for-20 from the floor and 5-for-6 at the free throw line. She added a game-best 10 rebounds, as well, and had five assists and four steals. Freshman Jasmine Watson continued her stellar performance in A-10 games with a career-high 16 points along with six rebounds and two blocks.

Junior Stephanie Lawrence chipped in nine points and six rebounds, sophomore Nicole Jones had eight points and junior Cerie Mosgrove corralled a career-high seven boards.

Following an extremely evenly-played first half that featured three ties and four lead changes, Saint Louis took a slim 22-21 edge into the locker room at halftime. A three by Katie Paganelli at 11:21 gave the Billikens their largest advantage of the period, 16-12, with 11:21 on the clock. However, UMass fought back with an 8-2 run and eventually went up by three with 4:47 remaining. The go-ahead bucket came courtesy of Watson, off a pretty dish from Hill, to move the score to 21-18 in favor of the Minutewomen. Then with 29 seconds left in the period, Amanda Kemezys hit the jumper that put Saint Louis up by one.

After Paganelli drained a three to open the scoring in the second half, UMass rattled off 15 straight points to go in front by double digits at 37-27 with 13:32 on the clock. Though the Billikens brought their deficit back below 10 shortly after, the Minutewomen maintained a lead of three or more until Paganelli hit a free throw at the 1:30 mark that closed the gap to 53-51.

The teams traded free throws in the final minute and, following a 1-for-2 trip to the line for Lawrence, Paganelli sunk a desperation trey with three seconds remaining in regulation to send the game into overtime.

In the extra period with the score tied for the sixth time, 58-58, Hill knocked down a three with the shot clock winding down to put UMass on top with 2:30 remaining. Woods went 1-for-2 at the charity stripe for Saint Louis' final point of the night and Hill sealed the Minutewomen victory with one of her own at the line.

UMass finished the contest shooting 20-for-56 overall (35.7%), 3-for-15 (20.0%) from three and made 19-of-22 (86.4%) free throws, compared to 20-for-60 (30.0%), 7-for-21 (33.3%) and 12-for-15 (80.0%) for the Billikens. The Minutewomen held a 45-31 edge in rebounding and led in points in the paint (26-18) and points off turnovers (18-13).

### Strong Second Half Not Enough For Minutewomen In 73-62 Loss To Richmond

Watson records career high for second straight game with 19 points to lead all UMass scorers.

AMHERST, Mass. - A strong second half and a career-high 19 points for freshman Jasmine Watson was not enough to help the UMass women's basketball team past Richmond as the squad fell, 73-62 at the Mullins Center on Saturday afternoon. With the loss, the Minutewomen are now 1-2 in Atlantic 10 play and 7-11 overall, while the Spiders move to 2-0 in the A-10 and 13-4 on the season.

Watson, who shot 8-for-14 from the floor and a perfect 3-for-3 at the free throw line, was UMass' top scorer and rebounder on the afternoon. She hauled in eight boards and recorded two assists one block and one steal, as well. Sophomore Kristina Danella followed with 12 points coming off the bench, including 10 in the second half, and shot 5-for-10 on the day.

Redshirt junior Megan Zullo also reached double figures with 11 points and dished a career and game-best seven assists to go along with three steals. Senior Kim Benton tallied six points and four assists, while classmate Diatiema Hill had five assists and five boards.

The Minutewomen held a brief 3-2 lead early in the first half, but a 16-1 run by Richmond quickly put UMass down by 14 with 13:39 remaining in the period. Then with 5:22 on the clock, a Benton three began a stretch of eight straight points for the Minutewomen to cut the deficit to seven at 34-27.

However, the Spiders bounced back after calling timeout and outscored UMass 14-2 in the final 3:04 of the frame. Richmond took a 19-point lead into the locker room at halftime, 48-19, after shooting a blistering 20-for-29 (69.0%) in the first half, including 7-for-10 (70.0%) from beyond the arc. The Minutewomen were limited to 11-for-30 (36.7%) overall and 5-for-14 (35.7%) from three in the opening period.

Fortunes reversed in the second half, as UMass shot 59.1% (13-for-22) to the Spiders' 31% (9-for-29) and 23.1% (3-for-13) from three-point range, but the deficit from the first proved too much to overcome. The Minutewomen outscored Richmond 33-25 in the second half, but could not draw any closer than 11 the rest of the way.

UMass finished the afternoon at 24-for-52 (46.2%) from the floor, 9-for-21 (42.9%) from three and 5-for-7 (71.4%) at the free throw line, while out-rebounding the Spiders, 30-26. Richmond shot 29-for-58 (50.0%), 10-for-23 (43.5%) from three and 5-for-6 (83.3%) at the charity stripe.

Leading the way for the Spiders, Brittani Shells totaled 22 points and had three steals, while Joyous Tharrington registered 13 points and a squad-best eight boards. Danielle Bell had 10 points and Rachael Bilney contributed eight points, five rebounds, four assists and four steals.

**OT At Duquesne Ends In 63-54 Loss For Minutewomen**

PITTSBURGH, Pa. - The UMass women's basketball team erased a double-digit deficit in the second half, but Duquesne outscored the Minutewomen 12-3 in overtime to come away with the 63-54 decision on Wednesday night at the A.J. Palumbo Center. The setback leaves UMass at 7-12 on the year, 1-3 in the Atlantic 10, while the Dukes remain undefeated in conference play (4-0) and move to 14-5 overall.

Sophomore Kristina Danella was the top scorer on the evening for the Minutewomen, totaling 18 points on stellar 5-for-6 shooting from three-point range and a 3-for-3 performance at the free throw line, to go along with five rebounds and three steals. Senior Diatiema Hill followed with 11 points, seven rebounds and three assists, while freshman Jasmine Watson logged eight points, seven rebounds and two blocks.

Nicole Jones matched a UMass single-game record with eight blocks and contributed a team-best eight rebounds and five points, as well. Redshirt junior Megan Zullo registered six assists, five points and five rebounds and junior Stephanie Lawrence chipped in with seven points.

In the first 10 minutes of the opening half, there were four ties and three lead changes as neither side was able to gain more than a four-point advantage. Then a three from the corner by Alex Gensler at 10:00 capped off a 7-0 stretch for Duquesne, giving the Dukes their largest lead to that point, 20-14. With less than three minutes to play in the period, a pair of treys from Danella helped the Minutewomen pull back within a possession and the squad went into the intermission down 30-27.

Back-to-back buckets from beyond the arc by Gensler and Samantha Pollino put the Dukes up by double figures for the first time early in the second, 40-30. Duquesne led by as many as 11, on a jumper by Diana Voynova at 14:09, and still held an eight-point cushion with 4:02 remaining in regulation.

Coming out of the final media time out, UMass began its rally with a pair of free throws by Hill. Zullo knocked down a three at 2:46 and Lawrence drained another from the corner at 2:06, the final basket by either team in regulation, which tied the score at 51.

Watson opened up the extra frame with a layup to put the Minutewomen in front, 53-51, but Gensler hit a three-pointer on the next possession to begin a 12-1 run that sealed the victory for the Dukes.

Pollino finished with a double-double on 18 points and 11 rebounds to lead Duquesne, while Gensler had 14 points and five assists. Rachel Frederick added 10 points and six rebounds, while Vanessa Abel dished five assists.

**Minutewomen Fall To GW, 64-54, On Field Trip Day**

*Freshman Jasmine Watson records her second career double-double with 16 points and 10 rebounds.*

AMHERST, Mass. - Freshman Jasmine Watson posted her second career double-double, but her efforts were not enough to help the UMass women's basketball team past George Washington, as the squad fell, 64-54, on Field Trip Day in front of a crowd of 2,521 at the Mullins Center. With the setback, the Minutewomen fall to 7-13, 1-4 in the Atlantic 10, while the Colonials move to 5-14, 2-4 in the A-10.

Watson totaled a team-best 16 points and 10 rebounds to lead UMass, while sophomore Nicole Jones followed with 10 points on 5-for-9 shooting and added three blocks. Redshirt junior Megan Zullo contributed nine points, six rebounds and four assists and senior Diatiema Hill registered eight points, five rebounds and seven assists.

The Minutewomen led by as many as four over the first seven minutes of the opening half, aided by a pair of treys from Zullo. Then at 10:59, Tiana Myers hit a jumper that kick-started a 10-1 run for George Washington and ended the stretch with a three at 7:22 that put the Colonials up by five, 22-17. Three baskets by Watson and two by Shakia Robinson in the final seven minutes of the period brought UMass back to within one at 28-27, but Megan Nipe's shot from beyond the arc with 43 seconds left increased GW's lead to 31-27 heading into halftime.

A free throw from Watson cut the deficit to three at 19:24 in the second, the closest the Minutewomen would come to overtaking the Colonials the rest of the way. Kay-Kay Allums knocked down a pair of free throws with 18:00 on the clock as George Washington outscored UMass, 5-1, over a one-minute span to increase its advantage to seven at 36-29. It was Allums again at 7:58 with a steal and a layup to give the Colonials their largest lead of the contest, 12, at 49-37.

Senior Kim Benton drained a three-pointer with 5:06 remaining, followed by a bucket by Jones to bring the Minutewomen back within four, but GW made seven of eight free throws down the stretch to seal the win.

UMass shot 21-for-48 (43.8%) overall, 6-for-17 (35.3%) from three and 6-for-13 (46.2%) at the free throw line, compared to 24-for-54 (44.4%) overall, 4-for-15 (26.7%) from three and 12-of-14 (85.7%) for the Colonials. Points off turnovers were pivotal for George Washington, outscoring the Minutewomen by a 22-2 margin. UMass held a 34-24 edge in rebounds and led in points the paint (28-22) and second chance points (11-7).

Nipe paced three GW scorers in double figures with 18 points, while Myers added 17 and five assists. Brooke Wilson contributed a double-double on 12 points and 10 boards, to go along with six assists and four steals.

KINGSTON, R.I. - Behind 44.4% shooting, the UMass women's basketball team rolled to a 71-61 victory over Rhode Island on Saturday afternoon at the Ryan Center. Sophomore Kristina Danella led a balanced effort for the Minutewomen (8-13, 2-4 A-10), with 17 points. The Rams drop to 9-13 and 2-5 in the conference following the loss.

Joining Danella in double figures for UMass was redshirt junior Megan Zullo with 13 points, six rebounds, four steals and three assists. Senior Diatiema Hill and sophomore Nicole Jones followed with nine points apiece, while Hill added a team-high seven rebounds and six assists, as well. AMHERST, Mass. - A second half push for the UMass women's basketball team was not enough as the squad fell to St. Bonaventure at home in the Mullins Center on Tuesday evening, 69-54. The setback leaves the Minutewomen at 8-14 on the season, 2-5 in the Atlantic 10, while the Bonnies improve to 17-6, 5-3 in the conference.

Junior Stephanie Lawrence and freshman Jasmine Watson paced the Minutewomen with 12 points apiece, while Lawrence logged a team-high six rebounds. Junior Cerie Mosgrove added seven points and sophomore Kristina Danella totaled six. ### Minutewomen Roll To 60-50 Victory Over Fordham

Watson posts first career 20-point game to lead the Minutewomen.

Feb. 6, 2010

AMHERST, Mass. - Behind a career-high 21 points from freshman Jasmine Watson, the UMass women's basketball team rolled to a 60-50 win over Fordham at the Mullins Center on Saturday. The Minutewomen, who had 19 assists on 20 baskets in the contest, improve to 9-14 overall and 3-5 in the A-10 with the victory, while the Rams drop to 8-16 overall and 2-7 in conference play.

Watson's career day was aided by 9-for-12 shooting from the floor, while she contributed eight rebounds and three blocks, as well, including six boards on the offensive glass. Sophomore Kristina Danella followed with 16 points and six rebounds. Senior Diatiema Hill had eight rebounds, four assists and four steals, her classmate Kim Benton dished five assists and redshirt junior Megan Zullo tied her career best by handing out seven assists and also added five rebounds and three steals.

UMass began the afternoon with an 8-0 lead while holding Fordham to 0-for-13 shooting from the field to start the contest. Randall Hurst eventually put the Rams on the board with a layup at 10:30, but Watson hit one of her four first half baskets at 7:22 to put the Minutewomen ahead by double-digits for the first time, 14-3. Danella later drained a three at 2:12 that gave UMass its largest lead of the half, 14, at 24-10. Fordham ended the period on an 8-3 run and pulled back to within nine at the intermission, 27-18.

That was as close as the Rams would come to overtaking UMass as Watson continued her dominance by converting a three-point play to start the second half. She started the contest 7-for-7, capped off by a bucket with 15:22 remaining that increased the Minutewomen's advantage to 20 for the first time. Danella did her part to help the squad pull away as well, as she poured in 13 second half points, which included her 100th career three at the 16:28 mark.

Later at 10:28, junior Cerie Mosgrove drained a trey from the corner that gave UMass its largest lead of the game, 25, at 49-24. An answering layup by Tiffany Stokes on Fordham's next possession began a stretch of 13 straight points for the Rams over a span of 4:02, but the Minutewomen maintained their double-digit cushion for the duration of the contest.

UMass finished the afternoon shooting 20-for-50 (40.0%), 6-for-14 (42.9%) from three and 14-for-20 (70.0%) at the free throw line. The Rams recovered from shooting 6-for-27 (22.2%) in the first half by going 12-for-21 (57.1%) in the second, to level off at 37.5% (18-for-48) overall. Fordham shot 6-for-19 (31.6%) from beyond the arc and 8-for-12 (66.7%) at the charity stripe.

UMass held a decisive edge in rebounding, 42-24, and led in points in the paint, 26-16, and second chance points, 9-2.

Tyonna Willingham was the lone Rams player to reach double figures as she had 16 points. Stokes recorded nine points and four steals, while Charlotte Stoddart led the squad with five rebounds.

### Women's Basketball Falls To Temple, 66-54

Hill and Watson score in double figures for the Minutewomen against the Owls.

PHILADELPHIA, Pa. - Despite shooting over 60% from three-point range, the UMass women's basketball team was unable to solve Temple, falling 66-54 on a snowy Wednesday evening in Philadelphia. The setback leaves the Minutewomen at 9-15 overall and 3-6 in the Atlantic 10, while the Owls move to 18-6 on the year and 7-2 in the conference.

Senior Diatiema Hill paced the UMass offense with 18 points on 7-for-10 shooting from the floor to go along with five assists and three steals. Freshman Jasmine Watson followed, reaching double figures for a third consecutive game, with 10 points and had a squad-best five rebounds and four steals. Junior Stephanie Lawrence added nine points and Megan Zullo registered eight points.

Zullo hit the opening shot of the game, a three at 19:12 for the Minutewomen's lone lead of the night. Temple responded by scoring the next eight straight points and later strung together a 7-0 run to increase its advantage to 11 at 25-14, its largest lead of the opening period. Before the Owls could pull away any further, UMass closed the half with an 8-2 stretch over the final 3:35 to come within five at the intermission, 27-22.

Another trey from Zullo opened the second, cutting the deficit to two, but Temple quickly increased its cushion to 12 with a 15-5 run. A layup by Natasha Thames at 8:25 gave the Owls their biggest advantage of the evening, 58-37 and the squad led by 12 or more the rest of the way.

The Minutewomen finished the contest shooting 19-for-51 (37.3%) from the field, 7-for-11 (63.6%) from three and 9-for-10 (90.0%) at the free throw line. Temple shot 43.6% (24-55) overall, 45.0% (9-for-20) from beyond the arc and 50.0% (9-for-18) at the charity stripe. On the boards, the Owls held a commanding margin, out-rebounding UMass, 42-26.

For Temple, Shaqwedia Wallace led the way with 22 points on 8-for-14 shooting, while LaKeisha Eaddy totaled 14 points and four assists. Kristen McCarthy was the third Owl in double figures with 13 points. She also added a game-high nine rebounds and five assists. Natasha Thames grabbed eight boards and Kristie Watkins-Day handed out six assists.

### Dayton Surges Past Women's Basketball, 74-60

Four starters reach double figures for the Minutewomen.

AMHERST, Mass. - The UMass women's basketball team had four starters score in double figures, but the balanced attack was not enough as the squad fell to Dayton 74-60, on Saturday afternoon at the Mullins Center in a nationally-televised contest. With the setback, the Minutewomen are now 9-16 on the season, 3-7 in the Atlantic 10, while the Flyers improve to 20-5, 8-2 in conference play.

Senior Diatiema Hill paced the Minutewomen with 15 points and added five assists. Sophomore Kristina Danella and freshman Jasmine Watson followed with 12 points apiece. Danella had five rebounds, while Watson grabbed a team-high seven boards and had a career-best six blocks. Senior Kim Benton totaled 10 points and five assists and redshirt junior Megan Zullo, the fifth UMass starter, was just shy of double figures with nine points. Zullo dished five helpers, as well.

The Minutewomen led early, 4-3, as Danella sunk a pair of free throws at the 17:25 mark, but Dayton sprinted out to a nine-point lead after an 11-3 run put the Flyers in front, 16-7. A three from Benton with 9:20 on the clock brought UMass to within five, but the squad hit a dry spell, not scoring for the next six minutes. During that stretch, Dayton pushed its advantage out to 12 at 26-14. Then, following a bucket by sophomore Nicole Jones that broke up the Minutewomen draught at 3:20, the Flyers scored five straight points to build their largest lead of the half, 30-16.

However before Dayton could pull away any further, UMass closed the final 2:02 with an 11-1 run to trim the deficit to four at the half, 31-27, capped off by a three-pointer at the buzzer by Zullo. The Minutewomen drained three from beyond the arc in that span, two by Zullo and one from Hill.

UMass continued the comeback in the second half as a pair of layoffs by Watson in the first 1:08 of the period tied the score at 31. That was as close as the Minutewomen would come, however, as the Flyers stung together nine straight points between 16:10 and 13:45 to push the margin back to double figures, 44-34. Dayton led by five or more the rest of the way, expanding the cushion to 18 with two minutes to play in the contest.

Five Flyers scored 10 or more on the afternoon, including 10 from Kristin Daugherty who notched her 1,000th career point. Patrice Lalor had a team-high 13 points and chipped in six rebounds four assists and two steals, while Justine Raterman totaled 12 points and a squad-best seven boards. Casey Nance and Elle Queen recorded 10 points apiece in the contest, as well.

UMass shot 22-for-52 (42.3%) overall, 9-for-21 (42.9%) from three and 7-for-8 (87.5%) at the free throw line. Dayton finished 25-for-65 (38.5%) overall, 9-for-25 (36.0%) from three and 15-for-19 at the charity stripe, while out-rebounding the Minutewomen, 40-30. The rebounding margin helped the Flyers to a 27-7 advantage in second chance points.

### Women's Basketball Pulls Out Gritty Win At La Salle, 62-57

Watson pours in 20 points, Benton adds nine to lead the Minutewomen.

PHILADELPHIA, Pa. - UMass women's basketball senior Diatiema Hill knocked down a free throw to complete a three-point play with 46.3 seconds remaining in regulation, helping the Minutewomen pull out a gritty 62-57 victory at La Salle on Wednesday. The Minutewomen, who trailed by 10 with less than 10 minutes to play in the contest, move to 10-16 on the year and 4-7 in the A-10 following the comeback victory, while the Explorers drop to 6-20 overall and 1-10 in the conference.

UMass freshman Jasmine Watson led all scorers, shooting 8-for-15 and 4-for-4 at the free throw line for 20 points in just 26 minutes on the floor. The center, who reached double figures for the fifth straight game, also chipped in six rebounds (five offensive) and three assists. Playing in her final game in front of a hometown crowd, senior Kim Benton knocked down three treys for nine second half points and had five rebounds and five assists, as well. Hill finished with nine points and six assists, sophomore Nicole Jones contributed eight points and sophomore Kristina Danella recorded seven points and a team-best seven rebounds.

The Minutewomen began the night with a 5-0 advantage and increased the margin to nine, their largest lead of the contest, as Watson sank a pair of free throws to bring the score to 16-7 with 12:05 on the clock. However, the Explorers slowly began to chip away and eventually pulled in front, 27-25, on a three by Jaime Wash at the 1:28 mark, her fourth of the evening. UMass then quickly tied things up at 27 as Danella went to the line on the next possession and drained her pair from the charity stripe, the final points before the intermission.

Watson knocked down four baskets within the first six minutes of the second half to help put the Minutewomen on top, 37-36, but La Salle made seven threes before the nine-minute mark to build a double-digit advantage at 50-40. Benton answered Walsh's trey at 9:13 with one of her own at 8:45 to bring the deficit back to seven and then cut it to four with another at 7:05.

The teams traded buckets around the six-minute mark before hitting a scoring draught over the next 3:25, which was broken up by another Benton three that closed the gap to one with 2:28 on the clock.

Walsh connected for her sixth trey of the night at 2:08 to push the Explorers' lead back to four, 57-53. However, the Minutewomen closed out the contest with nine unanswered points. Hill's layup at 46.3 tied the score at 57 before she completed the three-point play to put UMass back in front. Watson converted her pair from the charity stripe with 24 seconds remaining to give the Minutewomen some breathing room, while Jones hit a fast break layup at the buzzer.

UMass finished shooting 22-for-50 (44.0%) overall, 6-for-12 (50.0%) from three and 12-for-15 (80.0%) at the charity stripe. La Salle shot 21-for-46 (45.7%) overall, 12-for-20 (60.0%) from beyond the arc, which included a 8-for-9 clip in the second half (88.9%). The Minutewomen won the battle of the boards, 36-20, and held the Explorers to just five free throw attempts as the squad went 3-for-5 (60.0%) at the line.

Wash totaled a team-best 18 points for La Salle, while Antonia Gale contributed 12 points and Tara Lapetina logged nine points and seven assists. Ashley Gale added eight points and a squad-leading five rebounds.

### Women's Basketball Downed By #6 Xavier, 75-41 The Minutewomen drained eight threes against the Musketeers.

Feb. 20, 2010

CINCINNATI, Ohio - The UMass women's basketball team made eight three-pointers, but the squad's effort beyond the arc was not enough against nationally-ranked #6 Xavier, 75-41, on Saturday afternoon at the Cintas Center. Following the setback, the Minutewomen are now 10-17 overall and 4-7 in the Atlantic 10, while the Musketeers move to 22-3 on the season and remain undefeated in conference play at 12-0.

Junior Stephanie Lawrence was the top point producer for UMass as she totaled nine and four rebounds, coming off the bench for the Minutewomen. Senior Diatiema Hill had a squad-best eight rebounds and had two assists and two steals, while freshman Jasmine Watson grabbed six boards. Junior Cerie Mosgrove chipped in eight points, Megan Zullo had seven and senior Kim Benton added six points and four assists.

After Xavier took a 4-0 lead with baskets from Ta'Shia Phillips and Amber Harris, sophomore Kristina Danella knocked down a fast break three to bring the Minutewomen within one at 17:33. UMass remained within a few possessions reach of the Musketeers at the 11:35 mark as Benton hit a trey, but Xavier scored the next 11 straight points to open up a 16-point advantage, 22-6, with 8:23 left in the period and led by as many as 18 in the frame. Another three for UMass by Mosgrove, followed by a layup from freshman Dee Montgomery decreased the deficit to 13 with 3:10 remaining, but three made free throws for the Musketeers in the final 25 seconds before the intermission pushed the margin back to 16 for Xavier at halftime, 29-13.

The Minutewomen would draw no closer the rest of the way as the Musketeers hit three threes in the first four minutes of the second period to help increase their advantage to 23 at 40-17 with 16:03 to play in the contest. Xavier recovered from shooting 34.5% (10-for-29) in the first half by shooting 57.6% (19-for-33) in the second and finished the afternoon, 29-for-62 (46.8%). The Musketeers were 11-for-32 (34.4%) from three and 6-for-8 (75.0%) at the free throw line.

More than half the UMass field goals were from beyond the arc, where the Minutewomen were 8-for-25 (32.0%). Overall, the squad shot 15-for-57 (26.3%) and made 3-of-7 (42.9%) at the charity stripe.

Pacing three Xavier players in double figures, Tyeasha Moss totaled 12 points. Ta'Shia Phillips followed with 11 points and 10 rebounds, Harris had 10 points and nine boards and April Phillips was just shy of a double-double with nine points and 11 rebounds. Dee Dee Jernigan handed out a game-high eight assists and pulled down six boards.

### Women's Hoops Cruises To 75-62 Win Over St. Joe's Hill pours in 20 and hands out 11 assists on Senior Night at the Mullins Center.

AMHERST, Mass. - Behind senior Diatiema Hill's fourth career double-double, the UMass women's basketball team rolled to a 75-62 victory over Saint Joseph's on Senior Night at the Mullins Center on Thursday. The win moves the Minutewomen to 11-17 on the year and 5-8 in the Atlantic 10, while the Hawks drop to 15-13, 8-5 in conference games.

Hill poured in a game-best 20 points on 9-for-13 shooting to go along with a career-best 11 assists, four rebounds and two steals to pace UMass. Freshman Jasmine Watson followed with 17 points, going 8-for-14 from the floor, and contributed a team-leading seven rebounds as well as four assists. Juniors Cerie Mosgrove and Stephanie Lawrence chipped in nine points apiece coming off the bench, while Lawrence corralled five rebounds, as well. Playing in her final home game of her career, senior Kim Benton tallied seven points, three assists, three rebounds and two steals.

Watson hit the opening bucket to put the Minutewomen in front early, but the lead was short-lived as Amy Gillespie responded with a three to give Saint Joseph's the advantage. A basket by Michelle Baker at 12:42 capped off a 9-2 run for the Hawks and pushed the margin to nine at 17-8, the largest lead of the night for the squad.

UMass responded with seven straight points to reel Saint Joseph's back in, including six from Hill during that stretch, and closed the gap to two with 8:19 left in the first period. It was Hill again who kick-started a 10-0 run for the Minutewomen in the final 5:38 of the half. A layup by freshman Dee Montgomery in that span gave UMass back the lead at 3:09 and the squad went to the intermission with a 29-23 advantage.

The Minutewomen continued to hold the Hawks off the board to start the second period. Three straight UMass buckets increased the run to 16-0 as the Minutewomen widened the margin to 12 with a Watson layup at 17:57.

Mariame Djouara and Baker strung together a 6-0 stretch for Saint Joseph's that closed the gap to seven, 40-33, with 14:24 remaining, but the Hawks were unable to draw any closer the rest of the way. Mosgrove's trey from the corner at 11:00 made it a 14-point game, 49-35, as UMass led by double figures for the duration of the contest.

The Minutewomen finished the night shooting 29-for-53 (54.7%), including an eye-popping 61.5% (16-for-26) in the second half. UMass went 6-for-14 (42.9%) from three and made 11-of-15 (73.3%) at the foul line. The Hawks shot 25-for-65 (38.5%) overall, 6-for-25 (24.0%) from beyond the arc and converted 6-of-11 (54.5%) free throw attempts.

Ashley Logue led three Saint Joseph's players in double figures with 12 points. Dominique Bryant and Djouara followed close behind with 11 apiece. Ashley Prim brought down a team-best six rebounds and had nine assists, as well.

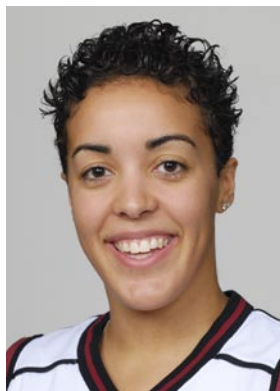
